SATURDAY THE 17TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday at Ballarat, Casterton, Malmsbury, Merino, Nagambie, Sandford, and Sandhurst, within the Borough of Koroit and the Shires of Bet Bet, Grenville, Huntly, St. Arnaud, and the Eastern and Central Ridings of the Shire of Kowree; and as a Bank Holiday at Tatura and within the Shire of Bright;

WEDNESDAY THE 21ST DAY OF MARCH INSTANT to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday at Heathcote\* and within the Borough of St. Arnaud;

#### ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERATION.

THE Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies has, in a Despatch bearing data the 25th Tonne 1998 Despatch bearing date the 25th January 1888, intimated to the Governor of Victoria that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise Her power of disallowance with respect to the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the 51st year of Her Majesty's reign, the numbers, titles, and dates of which are hereunto subjoined, viz.:—

#### 51 VICTORIÆ.

No. 916.—"An Act to authorize Municipalities to expend money in celebrating the Queen's Jubilee." [Assented to 18th July 1887.]

180. 917.—"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million eight hundred and eighty-three thousand seven hundred and twenty pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven and eight." [Assented to 27th July 1887.]

No. 918.—"An Act for granting to Her Majesty certain duties of Customs in lieu of certain other duties." [Assented to 5th September 1887.]

No. 919.—"An Act to amend 'The Local Government Amending Act 1884." [Assented to 8th September 1887.]

And whereas it hath been made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of the Republic of Paraguay will be given, under a Treaty between the Covernments of Great Britain and Paraguay, signed at Assumption, on the 16th October 1884.

For the obverse impression our effigy with the inscription "Victoria Doi Gratia Britt: Regina F.D.," and for the reverse the words "Six Pence" placed in the centre of the piece, having an olive branch on one side and an oak branch on the other, surmounted by the Royal Crown, and the date of the year between and below the branches, and a graining upon the edge.

And whereas coins of the above description have been coined at our mint, and will be coined there in pursuance of orders which we have given for that purpose, we have, therefore, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, thought fit to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, and we do hereby ordain, declare, and command that the said coins so coined, and to be coined as aforesaid, shall be current and lawful money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and that this Our Royal Proclamation shall come into operation forthwith on the date thereof.

5. The competition is to be restricted to freeholders in occupation and Crown tenants.

6. Upon receipt of information as to the farms selected for competition, the Minister of Agriculture may appoint three judges to decide the merits of such farms, and a decision of a majority of such judges shall be fnal.

7. The judges will be required to communicate to the Minister of Agriculture their decisions; also to report on the merits of the whole of the farms selected for competition.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF WANUER, KNOWN AS THE PINE GROVE RECREATION RESERVE.

WE, Patrick McIntyre, George Greer, William Smith, Thomas Watson, and Sanuel Sims, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for Public Recreation in the parish of Wanurp, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of The Land Act 1884:—

#### Regulations.

- 1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for race meetings, &c., as hereinafter provided.
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
- 5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, except as hereinafter provided.
- 6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.
- 7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained.
- No person, except laborers or workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- 9. No person shall remove any earth from the reserve, or deposit manure or rubbish thereon.
- 10. The committee of management shall be at liberty to allow any part of the reserve to be depastured by quiet stock: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
- 11. The following shall be the scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve and special enclosures therein on such days as the reserve may be set apart for race meetings, &c .:-
  - For admission at the gates of every person on foot, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.
  - For admission at the gates of every person on horseback, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.
  - For admission of every vehicle, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding Five shillings.
  - For admission to the special enclosures in the reserve, such as saddling paddock (including grand stand), such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding Ten shillings.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the

peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

THE subjoined Rules and Regulations have been submitted to the Governor in Council, in accordance with section 9 of The Cemeterics Statute 1864 (27 Vict. No. 201).

#### RULES AND REGULATIONS.

- 1. All the charges must be paid to the sexton when orders are given, or before the ground is broken, or a vault re-opened.
- On application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery being made to the trustees, a certifi-cate of permission will be granted on payment of the fees set forth in the schedule.
- 3. Charges may be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, and that the relatives of the deceased were unable to pay the usual fees.
- 4. Order for interment to be given to the sexton on the previous day, when a form of instruction must be filled up and given to the sexton.
- 5. The sexton shall dig all ordinary graves, unless otherwise specially ordered, on payment of the proper fee. Parties requiring brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees or any two of them.
- 6. The time fixed for the funeral must be the time the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
- 7. The usual hours for the performance of funerals shall be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. from September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other four months.
- 8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
- 9. Plan of every monument or headstone must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.
- 10. All persons destroying the fences or in any manner injuring the cometery will be prosecuted as the law directs.
- 11. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in, or cemented, or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
- 12. A plan of the ground and a register will be kept, which
- 13. The ground will be open daily from sunrise to sunset.
- 14. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alteration from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.
- 15. No interments shall be less than six feet in depth for adults and children over seven years of age, nor less than four feet in depth for children under seven years of age.




