## GRANT OF ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY POUNDS (£150) AS PRIZES FOR THE BEST MANAGED FARMS IN VICTORIA.

REGULATIONS.

- Two first prizes of Fifty pounds each will be awarded, one for the best farm in the Northern districts of the colony, and one for the best farm in the Southern districts. A second prize of Twenty-five pounds will be awarded for the second best farm in each of the above districts.
- The work of selecting the most suitable farms for competition will be entrusted to the Agricultural Societies.
- Notice of nomination must be forwarded to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne, not later than the 3rd October 1888.
- The notice must contain full particulars as to the name of the owner, and where the farm is situated.
- The competition is to be restricted to freeholders in occupation and Crown tenants.
- Upon receipt of information as to the farms selected for competition, the Minister of Agriculture may appoint three judges to decide the merits of such farms, and a decision of a majority of such judges shall be final.
- The judges will be required to communicate to the Minister of Agriculture their decisions; also to report on the merits of the whole of the farms selected for competition.

That Bye-law No. 7, as at present in the Gippsland Mining District Bye-laws be repealed, and the following Bye-laws substituted in lieu thereof:—

Bye-law No. 7—Prospecting Quartz Claim.

Any person on the discovery of a quartz reef not less than four hundred yards from the nearest occupied quartz claim, may occupy an area not exceeding one hundred yards in length for one man, or two hundred yards in length for two men, by two hundred and fifty yards in width. He shall within fourteen days from the date of such discovery register the same with the Mining Registrar, and shall within seven days after such registration proceed and continue to work, and except as hereinafter provided for in Bye-laws No. 12, 21, and 22; if the claim does not exceed one hundred yards in length, one man shall be continuously employed on such claim, and if exceeding one hundred yards in length at least two men shall be so employed.

Any person or persons taking possession of any such claim shall do so by causing to be erected a post at each corner of the claim, with a written notice thereon setting forth that it is a prospecting claim, and stating the name or names of the man or men registered for the claim, such posts to be at least three inches in diameter, and showing four feet above the surface, and firmly fixed in the ground, and to be kept erected and kept in proper repair during the occupation of such claim.

That Bye-law No. 37 of the Gippsland Mining District Bye-laws be amended as follows:—

37a. That the words "one quarter of an acre in the first paragraph, and wherever it occurs in this Bye-law, be repealed, and the words one acre substituted."

**No. 19.—URBAN DISTRICT OF DONALD.**

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust within the Urban District of Donald—that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements if not on such streets are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

- (1.) For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

- (2.) For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds per annum, the sum of Ten pounds per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.

- (3.) For all tenements in the said Urban District situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half a mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

- (5.) Such rate is hereby made for the year 1888, commencing on the 1st of January 1888, and terminating on the 31st of December 1888, and shall be payable—the one moiety on the 1st of January, and the other moiety on the 1st of July of such year.

**No. 20.—URBAN DISTRICT OF DIMBOOLA.**

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE CHILTERN PUBLIC PARK.**

**T**HE Council of the Shire of Chiltern, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Chiltern Public Park, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*.

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve (12) in any one year) as the park may be set apart for the holding of fêtes or sports as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the park, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, or other property in the park, nor leave, throw, or roll stones therein, nor pollute the water in the lake, nor remove any soil, sand, or manure from the park.
5. No person shall put in the park any cattle, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the park any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the park, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
8. No persons, except laborers or workmen employed by the committee of management, shall enter any plots in the park which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. The following shall be the scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the park on such days as the same may be set apart for fêtes or sports:—

- For the admission of every adult, a sum not exceeding 1s.
- For the admission of every saddle horse, exclusive of the rider, a sum not exceeding 1s.
- For the admission of every carriage, cart, or vehicle drawn by one horse, exclusive of passengers, a sum not exceeding 2s. 6d.
- For the admission of every additional horse, 6d.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit as shown above in bank notes, or a bank draft in favor of the Secretary of the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

Security will be required either in Government debentures, bank deposit-receipt in favor of the Secretary of the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security is calculated at Ten per cent. upon contracts not exceeding £1,000, and at Five per cent. over that sum; but no deviation will be allowed from the amounts above stated.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Persons failing to take up their contracts will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be according to sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labor may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods, and be transmitted through the Stores and Transport Department, except in the case of supplies for the Local Military Department, the Naval Forces, the Harbor Department, and for Works and Buildings. From these departments the order will be sent direct to the contractor. All orders must accompany the goods on delivery, otherwise the goods will not be received. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and, in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form simultaneously with delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being rendered with the order to which it relates. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officers issuing the orders. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods.

10. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 13 of these conditions.

11. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. All articles rejected must be immediately replaced by the contractor, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in condition 7.

12. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the colony for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 7.

13. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 7, or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

14. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

15. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

16. #### BOROUGH OF SALE.

*A Bye-law of the Borough of Sale, made under sections 213 and 447 of The Local Government Act 1874, and numbered seven, for regulating the supply and distribution of water, and making a rate for water supply purposes.*

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by The Local Government Act 1874, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Sale order as follows:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Council of the Borough of Sale, that is to say:—

a On every house or tenement of Twenty pounds rateable annual value or under, Twenty shillings per annum.

b On every house or tenement above the annual rateable value of Twenty pounds a rate of Five pounds per cent. per annum on the amount of the municipal valuation.

c On each allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate separately from any building the annual rate of Five pounds per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same; provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Three shillings per annum.

d For every water trough supplied with water by the Council the sum of Twenty shillings per annum, unless such water be supplied by measurement.

e For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Council the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse power of such steam boiler.

f For water supplied by the said Council by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Council) One shilling and sixpence per one thousand gallons.

g Water supplied to Government departments, hospitals, cricket clubs, bowling greens, and for ornamental purposes, shall be charged for by measurement; provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be not less than thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

h Water supplied for irrigation of gardens, nurseries, and to manufactories, aerated water and cordial makers, breweries, livery and coach horse stables, and to hotel premises, shall be charged for by measurement.

i For water supplied from standpipes One shilling per load of 150 gallons or less.

j For water supplied temporarily to buildings in the course of progress Twenty shillings per centum on the amount of the contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or in the absence of a contract of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or the said Council may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure, excepting in the case of Government departments, hospitals, cricket clubs, and bowling greens, and for ornamental purposes, shall be—

a If for domestic and other than domestic purposes the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

b If for other than domestic purposes only thirty thousand gallons per half-year.  
Syphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.



3. The Council shall from time to time after pipes have been laid for the supply of any street or part thereof cause notice to be given in three consecutive numbers of one or more newspapers circulating in the Borough of Sale in the following form or to the like effect:—

Notice to owners of tenements in \_\_\_\_\_ street and the private streets, lanes, courts, and alleys opening thereto.—  
The main pipe in the said street being laid down, the owners of all tenements situated as above are hereby required on or before the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ next to cause a proper pipe and stopcocks to be laid so as to supply water from the main pipe within such premises.

And the owner of each tenement referred to in such notice shall forthwith cause a proper pipe and stopcocks to be laid so as to convey a supply of water within such tenement, and after four weeks from the last publication of such notice the owner or occupier of such tenement shall, unless the Council refuse to supply such owner or occupier with water, be liable to pay the rates and charges for the supply of water as directed by this bye-law, notwithstanding that no such pipe and stopcocks be laid and that no such water is used in such tenement.

4. The rates and charges for water and all sums due to the Council under this bye-law shall be paid by and be recoverable from the owner of the premises or the occupier or person requiring, receiving, or using the supply of water.

5. Where several houses or parts of houses in the separate occupation of several persons are supplied by one common pipe, or where water is supplied to courts, alleys, and rights-of-way by standpipes, the several owners or occupiers of such houses or parts of houses or of the several houses or parts of houses in every such court, alley, or right-of-way shall be liable to the payment of the same rates for the supply of water as they would have been liable to if each of such several houses or parts of houses had been supplied with water from the works of the Council by a separate pipe.

6. The said rates and charges shall be payable in advance by equal instalments on the first day of April and the first day of October in each year (except in the case of water supplied by meter or by agreement, which shall be payable at such time or times as may be determined by the Council from time to time), and the first payment shall be made at the time when the owner or occupier shall become liable to pay the rates and charges for the supply of water as hereinbefore mentioned.

7. It shall not be compulsory on the Council to supply or to continue to supply any water to any person whomsoever.

8. The Council shall not be liable to any penalty or damages for not supplying water if the want of such supply arises from unavoidable cause or accident.

9. Every person who shall have agreed with the Council for a supply of water by measure shall at his own expense provide a meter and keep and maintain the same in good working condition to the satisfaction of the Council; and in the event of any repairs thereto being required, notice in writing shall be immediately given by such person to the Council. If any person who has provided any meter as aforesaid shall fail to give the notice hereinbefore mentioned of any repairs required for such meter, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding £5.

10. If any person who under the provisions herein contained ought to provide any meter neglect or refuse, after having been required by the Council so to do, to provide such meter, he shall for every day during which such neglect or refusal continues forfeit a sum not exceeding £1.

11. The Council may cause meters to be provided and fixed in any case where they may consider it necessary at the expense of the consumer, who shall keep and maintain the same in good working order; and the water supplied shall be charged for at the rates and charges hereinbefore mentioned or by special arrangement as the Council shall determine.

12. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same shall be capable of registering one million gallons and unless the same is approved in writing by the duly authorized officer of the Council. If any meter should cease registering or be reported by the Waterworks Inspector as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the Council shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it shall have been repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous half-year or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Council may insert a check meter on the service pipe.

13. No person shall remove or alter the position of any meter when fixed without the written consent of the duly authorized officer of the Council.

14. Every meter shall be placed according to the direction of the duly authorized officer of the Council, and so as to be open to inspection at all times, and as far as practicable in a situation where it cannot be affected by frost or injured by any other means, and shall be provided with means of access thereto. A meter shall not be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet pipe leading from the service pipe or other pipe of the Council unless permitted by a memo. in writing under the hand of the duly authorized officer of the Council. A meter shall not be continued to be used if it is found on being attested by the Council's officer to be inaccurate.

15. If any person refuse or delay to have such meter properly repaired and put in correct working order after having been required by any officer of the Council so to do, the Council may shut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the service pipe or otherwise until such meter shall have been properly repaired and certified by some officer of the Council as being in proper working order.

16. If any plumber or other person fix or refix any meter upon any premises supplied with water by the Council without having first obtained a certificate from the Council that the said meter has been examined and found in correct working condition, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

17. If any person remove or alter the position of or in any way interfere with any meter without giving such notice as aforesaid,

he shall for each such offence forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds over and above the damage which he may be found liable to pay in any action at law at the suit of the Council.

18. Fireplugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them be allowed in writing by the Council, and they shall at all times be under the control of the officers of the Council.

19. No cock or tap with any connection for attaching hose shall be affixed to any service pipe, connection, or fitting, and no hose or pipe shall be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground or trees or plants, or washing housewalls or vehicles or animals, or for any similar purpose, unless where the water is charged for by meter, without the written authority of the Council.

20. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water for livery or carriers' stables, or a supply for any manufacturing purpose, or for irrigation, or for water power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose, and the supply of water for other than domestic purposes solely shall in all cases be by measure. The Council may supply any person with water for domestic or for domestic and for other than domestic purposes by measure at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Council and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

21. Any person receiving water from the Council who shall take or carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

22. Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Council who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, water trough, or private or public service pipe shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

23. Before any person shall affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Council, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Council, or any service pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Council, he shall obtain from the Council a license in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

24. Licenses to affix and lay on, alter, or repair service pipes, to tap mains and sub-mains, and to do and execute generally the plumbing and other work necessary for laying on and maintaining water services, may be granted to persons who shall satisfy the Council of their competency to perform such plumbing and other work upon payment of an annual fee of £1.

25. It shall not be compulsory on the Council to grant a license to every or any applicant who shall prove his competency.

26. In all and every case a licensee shall be responsible for the acts, errors, and omissions of his employés, and the Council shall have the power to cancel the license of any person at any time.

27. The Council may contract with any owner or occupier of any house, tenement, or land who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works for the provision and laying of a service pipe from the pipes of the Council to the boundary or to any other part of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are laid the pipes of the Council.

28. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Council without giving two days' notice to the Council of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Council without the permission in writing of the Council being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe work, or engine the property of the Council, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

29. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Council without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Council, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the direction of some officer of the Council, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipe of the Council of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Council, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day the offence is continued after notice of the offence from the Council.

30. Wrought galvanized iron or lead piping of approved quality only will be allowed for external and internal services; ordinary connections with mains and sub-mains must be made with approved brass stop cock ferrules, all connections with lead and iron pipes must be made with approved brass union couplings. All joints connecting lead pipes must be wiped joints, and in no case will bolt or copper bit joints be allowed either in the interior or exterior of any building. One service pipe only to each house, tenement, or land will be permitted.

31. No service pipe of a larger bore than  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch will be permitted, unless by the special consent of the Council, and for houses rated at £20 per annum and under the bore of the service pipe shall not exceed  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch.

32. If any person shall neglect to repair any service pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Council into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Council that such service pipe requires repairing, the Council may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service pipe or otherwise as to the said Council may seem fit until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The occupier (if any) and if none the owner shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service pipes being leaky or otherwise out of repair, or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds for each day such offence is continued after notice thereof from the Council.

33. Any person supplied with water by the Council who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing such offence to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds for each day the offence is continued after notice thereof from the Council.

34. Any person whether licensed as aforesaid or not connecting any service pipe or branch service pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the action of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds for each day the offence is continued after notice thereof from the Council.

35. To prevent overflow, all water troughs and cisterns must be fitted with approved self-acting taps, which shall be at all times maintained in good working order.

36. All boilers or hot-water apparatus must be supplied from cisterns, as in no case will they be permitted to be fed directly from the pipes of the Council.

37. In every bath the inlets must be distinct from and unconnected with the outlet, and the inlet pipes must be visible and accessible and be attached to the bath above the bottom thereof, and such bath shall be provided with a proper well-fitted and perfectly water-tight ground outlet plug or cock. Overflow pipes to private baths or other vessels will not be permitted except where the supply is taken by measure.

38. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

39. The officers of the Council may at all reasonable hours enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Council, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water; and if any person hinders any such officer from entering or making such inspection or examination, the Council may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises and cease to supply the same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.

40. If any person supplied with water by the Council does or causes to be done anything in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Council may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

41. Any person (excepting where water is supplied by measure) watering any street or footpath by means of a hose except under the direction of the officers of the Council shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2 for each such offence.

42. The following regulations shall be observed by all persons in connection with the laying of services, &c.:-

1. The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., shall be sound and free from all defects, and all ends of pipes, bends, &c. shall be properly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c. All delivery cocks shall be high pressure and of the best quality in workmanship, all jointing between pipes, thimbles, bends, couplings, elbows, meters, and cocks shall be made with red lead and flux.

2. No service pipe shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground of less than ten inches. After service pipes have been laid, the trench or trenches shall be properly filled in and thoroughly rammed, and any subsidence therein which may appear within three months shall be immediately made good by the owner or occupier of the premises supplied by such service pipe. No trench made for the purpose of receiving, altering, repairing, or extending a service pipe shall be left open after sunset.

3. Every person previous to being licensed to lay services shall deposit with the Town Clerk the sum of Five pounds sterling, as security for the strict observance and performance of the regulations and conditions contained in this bye-law; and in case of the non-observance or non-performance of any of such stipulations and conditions at any time by such licensed person, the Council shall be entitled to declare his deposit absolutely forfeited, and the same shall thereupon become and be absolutely forfeited as liquidated damages, and the name of such person shall at once be struck off the roll of licensed plumbers. On surrender of license to the Council, the Five pounds deposit, if not forfeited, shall be refunded.

4. No private services whatsoever shall be laid or extensions made by any licensed person, unless he has ascertained at the Council's office that the person for whom such work is intended has received the consent of the proper officers of the Council to have such work executed.

5. Within 24 hours after the completion of each service the licensed person by whom such service shall have been laid shall report at the office of the Council the completion of such service.

6. If at any time any such licensed person wilfully acts contrary to any of the provisions of this bye-law, either by himself or his workmen, or refuses to communicate any needful and proper information required of him in regard to any work connected with the works of the Council done by him or his workmen or under his superintendence or upon his responsibility, his name may be erased by the Council from their list of licensed plumbers.

7. Each licensed person shall be held solely responsible to the Council for such service pipes being laid and completed by him or his workmen in a sound, workmanlike, and durable

manner, and maintained in that condition (sound and water-tight) for a period of three months after such service pipe has been completed.

8. 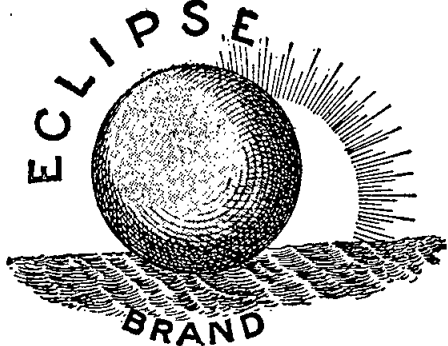
