## FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by *The Constitution Act* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," did stand prorogued until Friday the twentieth day of January 1888, and it is expedient to prorogue the same further: Now therefore I, the Governor of the Colony of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Friday the twentieth day of January 1888 until Tuesday the sixth day of March now next ensuing.

Given under my hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this tenth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and in the fifty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the 29th section of *The Factories and Shops Act 1885* (49 Vict. FACTORY OF MESSRS. EDWARDS AND CONROY, YOUNG AND VICTORIA STREETS, FITZROY,

for a period of three months from the 1st January instant, upon these express conditions, that is to say :-

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory more than thirty females for more than fifty-six hours in any one week, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That none of such females who are paid weekly wages shall be so employed without receiving overtime payment for the extra work they are called upon to perform.
3. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
4. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

**REGULATIONS UNDER "THE EDUCATION ACT 1872" AMENDED.**

WHEREAS by the 18th section of *The Education Act 1872* it was enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that section V. of the Regulations under *The Education Act 1872* be amended by the addition thereto of the following clause, that is to say:—

**GYMNASTICS.**

24. Certificates in gymnastics will be granted upon examination in the following programme:—

- (1) *Theory of gymnastics*, including so much anatomy and physiology as is required for explaining generally the uses of the various exercises, and the muscles and organs affected by them.
- (2) *Practice of gymnastics*.—To perform exercises on any gymnastic apparatus, free exercises, exercises with dumb bells and rods, running and jumping. (Female candidates will not be required to perform exercises on the horizontal and parallel bars.)
- (3) *Teaching*.—To be able to teach a class satisfactorily any gymnastic exercises.

## PRIZES FOR MACHINERY FOR THRASHING PEASE.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the disposal of One hundred and fifty pounds (£150) of the vote for "Rewards for invention of Improvements in Agricultural Implements and Machinery, &c.," Division 101, No. 10, for the financial year 1887-88.

## REGULATIONS.

1. A sum not exceeding One hundred and fifty pounds (£150), may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, produce a machine capable of thrashing, within twelve hours, eight hundred bushels of pease without injury thereto.
2. The reward shall be paid only to the inventor, or his agent, of such machine as shall most cheaply, efficiently, and rapidly perform the work required, and within the time aforesaid.
3. One or more trials of the machine shall be made at such place or places, and at such times as the Minister may direct.
4. All cost and expenses of forwarding, attendance, and working the machines at the times to be appointed, shall be paid by the persons entering the machines for competition.
5. The Minister may appoint three or more judges to report upon the merits of the competing machines, and a decision of a majority of such judges shall be final.
6. The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts, the total of which shall not exceed One hundred and fifty pounds (£150) to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful machine or machines, such amounts to be apportioned to the value to the colony of the said invention or inventions.

## No. XI.

## REGULATIONS OF THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

**W**HEREAS by "The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883" it is enacted that the Victorian Railways Commissioners shall make Regulations for prescribing the qualifications required in all candidates for permanent employment in each of the various branches of the Railway Service, and, if necessary, in each grade of such branches, and that such Regulations, when confirmed by the Governor in Council, shall have the same force and effect as if they had been contained in "The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883": Now therefore, in pursuance of the said enactment, the said Victorian Railways Commissioners hereby repeal Regulation No. 1 and make the following Regulations:—

QUALIFICATIONS OF CANDIDATES FOR PERMANENT APPOINTMENT IN THE VARIOUS BRANCHES OF THE RAILWAY SERVICE.

## ENGINEERING BRANCHES.

*Lithographic Draughtsmen*

Must not be under 21 nor over 40 years of age; and must pass an examination in tracing drawings (specially of bridges, land plans, sections, &c.) on lithographic transfer paper; also in writing and printing suitable for plans. They must also be able to read and write with facility.

*Lithographic Printers*

Must not be under 21 nor over 25 years of age. They must prove to the Examiners that they have served apprenticeship of 7 years to their trade, or if they have served for 5 years they must have worked as journeymen the additional time required to complete the term of 7 years. They must read and write with facility.

*Students*

Must not be under 15 nor more than 18 years of age, and must pass an examination by the Examiners appointed in that behalf in the following subjects, viz:—English, writing, geography, arithmetic (including mensuration), euclid (first three books), algebra (to simple equations), trigonometry (as far as the solution of plain triangles), and drawing.

*Permanent Way Repairers*

Must not be under 21 nor over 35 years of age, and be at least 5 feet 6 inches in height. They must read and write fairly.

*Boys to assist Artisans, &c.*

Must not be under 14 nor over 16 years of age. They must produce a State-school certificate that they can read, write, and have a knowledge of arithmetic; or must pass an examination up to the standard of such certificate by the Examiners appointed in that behalf.

## TRAFFIC BRANCH.

*Porters*

Must not be under 18 nor over 25 years of age, and be at least 5 feet 6 inches in height. They must read and write with facility.

*Carriage Cleaners*

Must not be under 30 nor over 40 years of age, and be at least 5 feet 6 inches in height. They must read and write fairly.

*Junior Porters*

Must not be under 15 nor over 18 years of age. They must produce the State-school certificate that they can read, write, and have a knowledge of arithmetic; or must pass an examination up to the standard of such certificate by the Examiners appointed in that behalf.

*Labourers*

Must not be under 21 nor over 35 years of age, and be at least 5 feet 6 inches in height. They must read and write fairly.

## LOCOMOTIVE BRANCH.

*Engine Cleaners*

Must not be under 20 nor over 23 years of age, and be at least 5 feet 6 inches in height. They must read and write with facility.

*Drilling and Screwing Machinists*

Must not be under 21 nor over 35 years of age. They must prove to the Examiners that they have satisfactorily worked drilling and screwing machines for 5 years at least, and be able to read and write fairly.

*Workshop Boys*

Must not be under 14 nor over 16 years of age. They must produce the State-school certificate that they can read, write, and have a knowledge of arithmetic; or pass an examination up to the standard of such certificate by the Examiners appointed in that behalf.

*Boilermakers' Helpers, Strikers, Greasers, and Labourers*

Must not be under 21 nor over 35 years of age, and be at least 5 feet 6 inches in height. They must read and write fairly.

## TELEGRAPH BRANCH.

*Operators*

Must not be under 18 nor over 26 years of age. They must be competent in the manipulation and management of telegraph instruments, and know how to set up and work galvanic batteries, and to localize faults which may occur either inside or outside Telegraph Offices. They must also produce the State-school certificate that they can read, write, and have a knowledge of arithmetic; or pass an examination up to the standard of such certificate by the Examiners appointed in that behalf.

*Junior Operators*

Must not be under 15 nor over 18 years of age. They must have a knowledge of Morse operating and be able to send and receive messages with Morse instruments, and must also have the educational qualifications required in Junior Clerks.

*Fitters*

Must not be under 21 nor over 40 years of age. They must have served at least 4 years to fitting, and be able to read and write with facility.

*Mechanical Engineers and Instrument Makers*

Must not be under 21 nor over 40 years of age. They must have served apprenticeship of 7 years to mechanical engineering or telegraph or mathematical instrument making with recognised firms, or they must have worked as journeymen the full term of 7 years.

*Linemen*

Must not be under 21 nor over 35 years of age, and be at least 5 feet 6 inches in height. They must read and write fairly.

## VARIOUS BRANCHES.

*Artisans*

Must not be under 21 nor over 40 years of age. They must have served apprenticeship of 7 years to their respective trades, or if they have served for 4 years they must have worked as journeymen the additional time required to complete the term of 7 years. They must read and write fairly.

*Junior Clerks*

Must not be under 15 nor over 21 years of age, and must produce a certificate of having passed an examination by the Examiners appointed in that behalf in the following subjects, viz:—Reading and explanation, dictation, writing, arithmetic, grammar, geography, as taught in the Sixth class of State Schools.

*Apprentices*

Must not be under 14 nor over 16 years of age. They must produce the State-school certificate that they can read, write, and have a knowledge of arithmetic; or must pass an examination up to the standard of such certificate by the Examiners appointed in that behalf.

## VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

## No. XII.

## REGULATIONS OF THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

**W**HEREAS by "*The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*" it is enacted that the Victorian Railways Commissioners shall make Regulations for limiting by lot the number of candidates to be examined to a number not more than three times the number of persons to be appointed, and for the examination of such persons and the granting of certificates to them, and that such Regulations, when confirmed by the Governor in Council, shall have the same force and effect as if they had been contained in "*The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*": Now therefore, in pursuance of the said enactment, the said Victorian Railways Commissioners hereby repeal Regulation No. II. and make the following Regulations:—

## CANDIDATES FOR EMPLOYMENT IN THE PERMANENT RAILWAY SERVICE.

2. The Secretary to the Commissioners, hereinafter called "the Secretary," shall arrange for publication in the *Government Gazette*, and by posters exhibited at all railway stations for a period of not less than ten clear days, a notice to persons desiring to present themselves as candidates for employment, stating the number of persons to be employed, the qualifications required in such persons, and the branches for which they are required; and also that in case the number of candidates be more than three times the number of additional persons to be employed such number of candidates will be reduced by lot to three times the number of persons to be appointed. Such notice shall also state the place, day, and hour when and where candidates' letters will be opened, and that, if the number of such candidates shall be in excess of the number required, they will be reduced by lot as hereinafter provided.

3. Any person desiring to become a candidate for any position in the Railway Service, for which the Commissioners shall have invited candidates by public notice, must prepare a letter in his own handwriting stating that he is a candidate for the office he desires to obtain, and describe on the envelope of such letter the office for which he is a candidate: for example—

Candidates in all branches must be strong, healthy and active, and must produce to the Examiners satisfactory written testimony to the effect that they are of respectable character, and must furnish the names of any persons or firms with whom they may have been employed during the previous two years. They must also produce a certified extract from the register of their birth, or a statutory declaration of their age; and before being finally approved they must pass the examination of a Railway Medical Inspector as being free from bodily ailments, defects, and colour-blindness or defective sight of any kind. The age of candidates shall be reckoned to the date fixed by the Commissioners for opening applications, as provided in clause 3, Regulation XII.

"Candidate for the office of Junior Clerk," or "Candidate for the office of Porter," or such other office as such person may desire to obtain, being an office included in such notice. He must address such letter to the Secretary for Railways, Spencer-street, Melbourne, and post it duly stamped so that it will reach that officer before the time fixed by the public notice of the Commissioners for opening and dealing with such letters as hereinafter provided.

Every candidate must confine himself to an application for one position, otherwise he will be disqualified.

4. The Secretary shall cause letters addressed to him with the words "*Candidate for the office of Junior Clerk*," or "*Candidate for the office of Porter*," or such other office as aforesaid, to be deposited in a locked box provided for each and every description of such letters, by dropping them in a cleft therein. Each of such boxes shall bear a label corresponding with the words on the letters deposited therein; and the Secretary shall have the care and safe custody of all such boxes, which shall not be opened until the day and hour fixed in the public notice aforesaid for opening candidates' letters.

5. The Secretary shall invite the attendance of a police magistrate to be present on the day and hour fixed for the opening of such box or boxes (as the case may be), and to superintend the dealing with the contents thereof in the manner hereinafter described, and it shall be the duty of such police magistrate to attend when so requested.

6. The Secretary shall, on the day and hour named in the public notice hereinbefore mentioned, proceed, in the presence of the said police magistrate and of such persons as may choose to attend, to unlock such box or boxes (as the case may be), and to open the letters therein contained.

7. The Secretary shall cause the name and address of the writer of each of such letters to be then and there registered in a book provided for that purpose, and hereinafter called the "Register." A consecutive number, of which the first number shall be one, shall

be placed opposite the registration of the name of the writer of each of such letters in the Register, and when the whole of the letters contained in such box or boxes (as the case may be), shall have been opened, registered, and numbered respectively as aforesaid, the Secretary shall, if the number of candidates do not exceed three times the number of persons to be employed, inform each of such candidates of the time and place when and where he must present himself for examination by the Examiners appointed in that behalf.

8. In case the number of candidates be more than three times the number of persons to be employed, the Secretary shall take as many cards of uniform size as there are candidates registered in the Register, and each of such cards shall bear a number corresponding with the number placed opposite the name of each candidate in such Register, so that the cards will have consecutive numbers upon them, commencing with the number one, and that there will be as many cards as there are candidates registered.

9. The Secretary shall then and there place such cards in a box provided for the purpose, in the presence of the police magistrate aforesaid and of all persons who may choose to attend. The police magistrate shall direct some person other than the Secretary to turn the said box for a convenient time and to draw out one of such cards at a time, and read aloud the number marked thereon, and to continue to draw out thereafter cards until as many cards have been drawn as shall be equal in number to three times the number of persons to be employed, when such drawing shall cease and be determined.

10. A list of the names of the persons opposite to whose names in the Register book aforesaid shall be found the numbers corresponding with the numbers on the cards so drawn shall then be prepared, and shall be certified to by the police magistrate as the names of candidates which shall have been determined by lot, and such candidates shall be entitled to present themselves for examination by the Examiners.

11. The Secretary shall inform each of the candidates named on such certified list of the time and place when and where he must present himself for examination by the Examiners appointed in that behalf.

12. The Examiners appointed for each branch will meet at such times and places within the district in which the candidates to be examined reside as may be required, on receiving due notice from the Secretary.

13. Each candidate is to produce to the Examiners an extract from the register of his birth, or in default a statutory declaration of his age, and the Secretary shall forward to such Examiners for their consideration and verification, if necessary, the letter sent in by such candidate.

14. The Examiners will not allow any person who has already been examined and rejected for some permanent physical defect, which in their opinion incapacitates him for employment, to present himself again for examination.

15. The Examiners will, immediately after the completion of the examination, forward to the Secretary the examination papers of each candidate, together

with a certificate that the provisions of Regulation No. I., except as to the medical examination, have or have not been complied with.

16. The Examiners shall, in the case of each candidate examined, fill up and sign a certificate in the following form, to be placed at the end of each set of examination papers:—

17. Should a greater number of candidates obtain certificates from the Examiners than are required for appointment, the Secretary shall call such successful candidates together, who shall then and there in his presence draw lots, in accordance with the following method, for the determination of the order of precedence for appointment in which their names shall be placed, viz:—

Two boxes will be provided by the Commissioners, numbered 1 and 2 respectively, in each of which will be deposited as many numbers in arithmetical progression, commencing with the number one, as there are candidates present.

The candidates will then draw first from No. 1 box and afterwards from No. 2 box in the numerical order ascertained by their first drawing. For instance, the candidate drawing No. 4 out of No. 1 box will be the fourth in order for drawing out of No. 2 box, and the number drawn from the latter will fix his position amongst the candidates.

The candidates in excess of the number required by the Commissioners shall be eligible for appointment in like order for a period of twelve months then next ensuing from the date of such determination without further examination.

18. All persons who have successfully passed the necessary examinations, and who are selected for immediate employment, are to be informed that their appointments are only probationary for a period of six months. After the period of such probation, and upon production of a certificate of fitness from the officer at the head of the branch in which such probationer was employed, and upon proof, to the satisfaction of the Commissioners, that all the provisions of the said recited Act have been complied with (including an insurance on their lives under existing Regulations) such appointment may be confirmed by the Commissioners.

19. Each candidate, before presenting himself for medical examination, will be required to pay a fee of Ten shillings and sixpence to the Secretary.

# "THE FISHERIES ACT AMENDMENT ACT 1878."

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Fisheries Act Amendment Act 1878* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, impose and prescribe conditions and restrictions for the regulation of fishing, and fix the times and places or the manner at and in which any trammel, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing should be used: And whereas it is expedient to prohibit the use of any trammel, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed or unfixed, in fishing within the periods and waters specified below: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit the use of any trammel, trawl, or other net, whether fixed or unfixed, within the periods and waters following, that is to say :—

Between the first day of January and the thirty-first day of March, both inclusive, in each year, and between Thursday at midnight and Sunday at midnight inclusive, in each week, from the first day of April to the thirty-first day of December inclusive in each year, in any of the waters of the Gippsland Lakes, between the entrance of the sea and a straight line drawn in Lake King, from Tambo Head to Ludrick Point in Boolle Boolle.

# "Fisheries Act 1873." NATURAL OYSTER BEDS AT PORT ALBERT.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Fisheries Act 1873* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, close any natural oyster bed, and during the duration of such Proclamation it shall not be lawful for any person to take any oysters or oyster brood from such bed: And whereas it is deemed expedient to close the natural oyster beds in Port Albert: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby close the natural oyster beds in Port Albert, and during the duration of this Proclamation render it illegal for any person to take any oysters or oyster brood from the beds mentioned, excepting the lessees of any oyster beds under section 22 of the above-named Act, who are excepted from the operation of this Proclamation as regards the areas leased to them.

WHEREAS by *The Passengers Harbors and Navigation Statute 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and may from time to time in like manner alter, amend, or repeal any such limits and boundaries, and substitute others in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby define the limits and boundaries of the Port of Snowy River to be as follow, that is to say :—

The Port of Snowy River shall consist of all rivers, lakes, bays, creeks, and inlets, contained within a line running E. by N. and W. by S. through the entrance to the Snowy River.

## PUPIL SURVEYORS.

APPLICATIONS will be received, addressed to the Secretary to the Board of Examiners, up to Friday the 20th January next, from Candidates desirous of being appointed as Pupil Surveyors and Draughtsmen in connection with this department. Two vacancies.

## Conditions.

An applicant for appointment must be not more than twenty years or less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession. He will also be required to produce satisfactory evidence of having received a good general education, including a competent knowledge of euclid, algebra, and arithmetic, also a specimen of his plan drawing.

## Competitive Examination.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements; he will undergo a competitive examination on a date of which he will be duly notified—subjects, plane trigonometrical computation, plotting, and plan drawing—when the competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Board of Examiners will be recommended for appointment in the order of merit, subject to the regulations of the department as to probation.

## Term of Service.

The pupil's service in the department shall be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where he will be engaged in drawing and computing. He will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction of traverse surveys, also plotting from field-book and plan drawing. If his progress up to this time is not deemed satisfactory he will be liable to be dispensed with, but, if satisfactory, he will be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice.

Afterwards he will have the privilege of attending for two months at the Melbourne Observatory, where he will be instructed in such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary for the duties he may be called on to perform as a qualified surveyor.

He will be allowed to present himself at the next ensuing examination for land surveyors (without payment of fees), for the purpose of obtaining the formal certificate of the Board of Examiners as to his qualifications.

## Remuneration.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupilage :—1st year, £52; 2nd year, £58; 3rd year, £66; 4th year, £72.

## Subject to Regulations.

During the whole term of his pupilage and service in the department he shall be subject to the Regulations for the Public Service of Victoria dated 31st December 1884, or any subsequent substituted or additional regulations.

## Bonds required.

Each successful candidate for appointment as pupil surveyor and draughtsman will be required to find two approved sureties, who shall enter into bonds for £150 each for the faithful performance of his duties.

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in that portion of the Shire of Yarrawonga which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Yarrawonga and constituted a new shire, under the name or title of "The Shire of North Yarrawonga."

Area described in the petition:-

Commencing at the south-west corner of the parish of Burramine; thence due north to the River Murray; thence along the said River Murray to the intersection of the Ovens River; thence along the said Ovens River to the south-east corner of parish of Peechelba; thence due west along the southern boundary of said parish of Peechelba; thence due north to the southern boundary of Bundalong; thence due west along the southern boundaries of Bundalong, Yarrawonga, and Burramine to the starting point.

**REGULATIONS.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of *The Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1883-4*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1883-4*, repeal the Regulations numbered 1 and 2 of the Regulations made by the said Waterworks Trust dated the twentieth day of January 1887, and approved by the Governor in Council on the eighth day of March 1887, and do hereby make the Regulations following in lieu thereof:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said urban district (that is to say):—

1. (1.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.
- (2.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual value, an amount equal to five per cent. on the amount of the municipal valuation.
- (3.) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs shall be 16,000 gallons for any trough not exceeding twelve feet in length, and 8,000 gallons for every additional five feet or fractional part thereof.
- (4.) Every trough situated in a paddock shall be supplied through a meter affixed by the consumer according to the directions of the Trust, provided nevertheless that the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall not be less than that charged for troughs supplied under the preceding clause.
- (5.) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 8,000 gallons for every inch of the diameter of the cylinder.
- (6.) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons; exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons; exceeding one-eighth of an acre but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons; exceeding one-quarter of an acre but not exceeding half an acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons; exceeding half an acre but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre; for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses.

In open sheds used for the above purposes each space of five feet shall be charged for as a stall.

2. That each syphon pump must have a meter affixed, and that Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons be charged for all water registered at such meter.

The before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and ending on the thirty-first day of December One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance fourteen days after demand. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect and recover the said rate.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* it was, amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything therein before contained, the Governor might by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such Proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part VIII. of the said Act: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, made in pursuance of the said Act, and bearing date the twenty-third day of August One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, it was declared that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber on or from the Crown lands in the township of East Murchison, comprised within the boundaries therein specified: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this tenth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and in the fifty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.

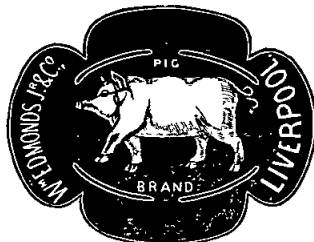

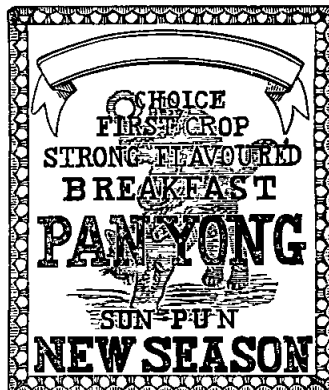
