## FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," did stand prorogued until Tuesday the twenty-fourth day of April 1888, and it is expedient to prorogue the same further: Now therefore I, the Governor of the Colony of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Tuesday the twenty-fourth day of April 1888 until Tuesday the twenty-second day of May now next ensuing.

Given under my hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and in the fifty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.

PENSIONS (COLONIAL SERVICE) ACT 1887 AND  
BRITISH SETTLEMENTS ACT 1887.

(50 & 51 Vict. chs. 13 and 54.)

CHAPTER 13.

An Act to extend, in certain cases, the provisions of the Superannuation Act 1859, and to extend and otherwise amend the provisions of the Colonial Governors (Pensions) Acts 1865 and 1872. [5th July 1887.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. *Short title and construction.*—This Act may be cited as the Pensions (Colonial Service) Act 1887, and shall be construed as one with the Superannuation Act 1859, and with the Colonial Governors (Pensions) Acts 1865 and 1872.

2. *Application of Superannuation Acts to Colonial civil service.* 22 Vict. c. 26, 23 & 29 Vict. c. 113, 35 & 36 Vict. c. 29.—Where a person who has been employed in any office in the permanent civil service of a colony has been employed also in some Imperial civil capacity, his service in the said office shall for the purposes of the Superannuation Act 1859, and the Colonial Governors (Pensions) Acts 1865 and 1872, and the Acts amending the said Acts, be deemed to be service in the permanent civil service of the State, and the said office shall be deemed to be an office in a public department, and the said person shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be qualified to receive a pension accordingly.

Provided that the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury shall determine the portion of every such pension which shall be paid from the Consolidated Fund of the United Kingdom or moneys voted by Parliament, but no payment shall be made therefrom in respect of any employment in the permanent civil service of a colony.

The expression "Imperial civil capacity" in this section means the permanent civil service of the State, and also the administration of the government of a colony within the meaning of the Colonial Governors (Pensions) Act 1865.

3. *Provision as to pensions under 23 & 29 Vict. c. 113, and 35 & 36 Vict. c. 29.*—A person shall not receive by way of pension, under the Colonial Governors (Pensions) Acts 1865 and 1872, an amount which, together with any pension for service in the permanent civil service of the State or of a colony, exceeds the sum of One thousand pounds a year, or two-thirds of the salary and emoluments of his office in that service, whichever is greater. But his pension under the said Acts shall not be reduced by reason of his pension in respect of the said service being an emolument within the meaning of section seven of the Colonial Governors (Pensions) Act 1865.

4. *Mode of computing superannuation allowance to be granted in certain cases.*—Any pension to be granted in pursuance of section ten of the Colonial Governors (Pensions) Act 1865, as amended by this Act, to a person who has administered the government of any colony or colonies shall be computed, according to the provisions of the Superannuation Act 1859, on the salary and emoluments of his office in the permanent civil service of the State or of a colony, and not on the salary received by him in respect of the administration of the said government.

5. *Application of 23 & 29 Vict. c. 113, and 35 & 36 Vict. c. 29, to High Commissioner in Cyprus.*—Whereas by the Colonial Governors (Pensions) Acts 1865 and 1872, provision is made for retiring pensions to persons who have administered the government of any of Her Majesty's Colonies, and it is expedient to extend the said Acts to Her Majesty's High Commissioner in Cyprus: Be it therefore enacted as follows:

A pension may be granted in pursuance and subject to the provisions of the Colonial Governors (Pensions) Acts 1865 and 1872, as amended by this or any other Act, to a person who has, either before or after the passing of this Act, administered the government of Cyprus as Her Majesty's High Commissioner, and those Acts shall apply as if Cyprus were a colony within the meaning thereof, and were within Her Majesty's dominions.

6. *Definition of permanent civil service of a colony.*—For the purposes of this Act a person shall be deemed to be employed in the permanent civil service of a colony if he holds any such permanent office in the service of Her Majesty in the government of any colony as qualifies him to receive a pension out of the revenues of such colony.

7. *Provision against double pensions.*—A person shall not receive a pension under the Colonial Governors (Pensions) Acts 1865 and 1872, or this Act, and also under section twelve of the Superannuation Act 1859.

8. *Explanation of terms.*—The expressions "permanent civil service of the State," "permanent civil service of Her Majesty," and "permanent civil service of the Crown" are hereby declared to have the same meaning, and this Act and any enactment relating to salaries and pensions shall be construed accordingly.

In this Act "pension" includes superannuation allowance.



CHAPTER 54.

An Act to enable Her Majesty to provide for the Government of Her Possessions acquired by Settlement.

[16th September 1887.]

WHEREAS divers of Her Majesty's subjects have resorted to and settled in, and may hereafter resort to and settle in, divers places where there is no civilized government, and such settlements have become or may hereafter become possessions of Her Majesty, and it is expedient to extend the power of Her Majesty to provide for the government of such settlements, and for that purpose to repeal and re-enact with amendments the existing Acts enabling Her Majesty to provide for such government:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same as follows:

1. *Short title.*—This Act may be cited as the British Settlements Act 1887.

2. *Power of the Queen in Council to make laws and establish courts.*—It shall be lawful for Her Majesty the Queen in Council from time to time to establish all such laws and institutions, and constitute such courts and officers, and make such provisions and regulations for the proceedings in the said courts and for the administration of justice, as may appear to Her Majesty in Council to be necessary for this peace, order, and good government of Her Majesty's subjects and others within any British settlement.

3. *Delegation of power by the Queen.*—It shall be lawful for Her Majesty the Queen from time to time, by any instrument passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, or by any instructions under Her Majesty's Royal Sign Manual referred to in such instrument as made or to be made, as respects any British settlement, to delegate to any three or more persons within the settlement all or any of the powers conferred by this Act on Her Majesty in Council, either absolutely or subject to such conditions, provisions, and limitations as may be specified in such instrument or instructions.

Provided that, notwithstanding any such delegation, the Queen in Council may exercise all or any of the powers under this Act: Provided always, that every such instrument or instruction as aforesaid shall be laid before both Houses of Parliament as soon as conveniently may be after the making and enactment thereof respectively.

4. *Power to the Queen in Council to confer jurisdiction on certain courts.*—It shall be lawful for Her Majesty the Queen in Council to confer on any court in any British possession any such jurisdiction, civil or criminal, original or appellate, in respect of matters occurring or arising in any British settlement as might be conferred by virtue of this Act upon a court in the settlement, and to make such provisions and regulations as Her Majesty in Council may think fit respecting the exercise of the jurisdiction conferred under this section on any court, and respecting the enforcement and execution of the judgments, decrees, orders, and sentences of such court, and respecting appeals therefrom; and every Order of Her Majesty in Council under this section shall be effectual to vest in the court the jurisdiction expressed to be thereby conferred, and the court shall exercise the same in accordance with and subject to the said provisions and regulations: Provided always, that every Order in Council made in pursuance of this Act shall be laid before both Houses of Parliament as soon as conveniently may be after the making thereof.

5. *Making of Orders in Council, &c.*—It shall be lawful for Her Majesty the Queen in Council from time to time to make, and when made to alter and revoke, Orders for the purposes of this Act.

6. *Definitions.*—For the purposes of this Act, the expression "British possession" means any part of Her Majesty's possessions out of the United Kingdom, and the expression "British settlement" means any British possession which has not been acquired by cession or conquest, and is not for the time being within the jurisdiction of the Legislature, constituted otherwise than by virtue of this Act or of any Act repealed by this Act, of any British possession.

7. *Repeal.*—The Acts mentioned in the schedule to this Act are hereby repealed: Provided that—

(a.) Such repeal shall not affect anything done or suffered previously to such repeal in pursuance of any such Act, or in pursuance of any Order in Council, commission, instructions, law, ordinance, or other thing made or done in pursuance of any such Act; and

(b.) All Orders in Council, commissions, and instructions purporting to be made or given in pursuance of the Acts hereby repealed, or either of them, shall continue in force in like manner as if they had been made and given in pursuance of this Act, and such commissions had originally been instruments authorised by this Act, and shall be subject to be revoked or recalled accordingly.

**REGULATIONS UNDER "THE EDUCATION ACT 1872."**

**W**HEREAS by the 18th section of *The Education Act 1872* it was enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that section IX. of the Regulations under *The Education Act 1872* be rescinded from the 31st December 1888, and that the following Regulations, to take effect from the 1st January 1889, be substituted therefor, that is to say :—

**EXHIBITIONS.**

The Minister of Public Instruction will annually award twelve Exhibitions in the manner and on the conditions hereinafter mentioned :—

1. Exhibitors will be selected upon competitive examinations held in the month of January of each year. Candidates must have been holders of State School Scholarships during the three years immediately preceding the date of the examination; must have obtained from the authorities of the school they have been attending the good report prescribed in the regulations as to Scholarships; and must have passed the Matriculation Examination of the University of Melbourne.

2. The subjects for examination will be :—

3. Each Exhibition will be of the annual value of £40, tenable for four years, upon the following conditions :—

- (a.) That the exhibitor shall, at the commencement of the February Term following the award of the exhibition, enter as a student of the Melbourne University, and that he shall, during the whole term of his tenure, be enrolled as attending lectures, and in each year keep courses of lectures in as many subjects as he must pass in to complete his year.
- (b.) That at the end of the second year of his tenure he shall have passed the first ordinary examination for a degree, and at the end of the third year the second ordinary examination for a degree.

If at any time the Minister be satisfied that the conduct of any exhibitor has been disorderly or immoral, the exhibition and all the advantages connected therewith shall thereupon cease and determine.

4. Exhibitors who shall be candidates for a degree in Laws or Medicine, and shall, at the end of the fourth year of their tenure, have passed the fourth ordinary examination for such degree, will have their exhibition continued for another year.

5. Payments will be made quarterly. All payments, however, by the Minister will be conditional on moneys being placed at his disposal by the Legislature.

6. The first examination under these regulations will be held in the month of January 1890.

**REGULATIONS UNDER "THE EDUCATION ACT 1872."**

**W**HEREAS by the 18th section of *The Education Act 1872* it was enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that the existing Regulations as to Scholarships be rescinded, and that the following Regulations be substituted therefor, that is to say :—

**SCHOLARSHIPS.**

The Minister of Public Instruction will annually award Scholarships to two hundred pupils of State schools in the manner and on the conditions hereinafter mentioned :—

1. Scholars will be selected upon competitive examinations held during the last three months of each year. No competitor will be permitted to attend any such examination unless he shall have been classified in the sixth class of his school from at least the first day of July immediately preceding, and shall have produced a certificate of birth showing that he will not have completed his fourteenth year before the first day of January succeeding the examination; and no competitor will be selected unless he shall, during the two years immediately preceding the latter date, have been continuously on the rolls of, and in attendance at, a State school.

2. The subjects for examination will be :—

3. Each scholarship will be of the annual value of £10, tenable for three years, upon the following conditions:—

(a.) That the scholar shall, at the commencement of the session following the award of the scholarship, become a student in one of the following public grammar schools:—Church of England Grammar School, St. Patrick's College, Scotch College, or Wesley College, all of Melbourne; or in the Church of England Grammar School of Geelong; or in one of such other schools as may be approved of by the Minister; or in one of the Schools of Mines at Ballarat, Sandhurst, or Geelong; or in an Agricultural College.

(b.) That he shall continue to attend one of the above schools, and shall obtain at the end of each year a report from the authorities of the same. If no report or an unfavorable report be received, or if at any time the Minister be satisfied that the conduct of any scholar has been disorderly or immoral, the scholarship and all the advantages connected therewith shall thereupon cease and determine.

4. Where a scholar does not reside within three miles of an approved place of education, the Minister may, at his discretion, allow him such sum as will cover the cost of transit to and fro, if the school is easily accessible by rail or coach; or may commute the scholarship for one of forty pounds tenable for a year.

5. Students whose scholarships have been commuted may be examined again at the end of the year, when the best thirty will have the scholarship renewed for another twelve months. Holders of such renewed scholarships may be again examined at the end of the second year, when the best fifteen will have the scholarship renewed for a further period of twelve months. But no renewed scholarship shall be awarded to any competitor who fails to obtain at least 30 per cent. of the maximum number of marks obtainable.

6. Six scholarships will be allotted to each single inspectorial district, and twelve to each double district. When these have been assigned, the remainder will be allotted to the best in order of examination, without regard to their place of residence.

7. Payments will be made quarterly. All payments, however, by the Minister will be conditional on moneys being placed at his disposal by the Legislature.

8. The foregoing condition as to the age of competitors shall not apply to the examination to be held during the last three months of 1888; but candidates otherwise qualified will be admitted to that examination provided they will not have completed their fifteenth year before the first day of January 1889.

## REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF BEREEMBOKE COMMON.

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to commons, made by the Governor in Council on the 17th March 1885, the Managers of the Beremboke Common, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council.

## REGULATIONS.

- In the construction and for the purposes of these Regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, horses, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules, and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.
- Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within five (5) miles of the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.
- The following shall be the scale of fees, payable quarterly in advance, on the fifth day of March, the fifth day of June, the fifth day of September, and the fifth day of December in every year, for depasturing stock on the common:—  
For every horse ... 10s. per annum.  
For every head of other cattle ... 6s. per annum.  
Cattle under six months old, the progeny of stock legally depasturing on the common ... Free.
- No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.
- The managers shall not be responsible for stock placed on the common, beyond supervising the duties of the herdsman.
- Persons desirous of removing stock from the common shall give twenty-four (24) hours' notice to the herdsman before doing so.
- All stock found trespassing on the common shall be liable to be impounded.
- Stock affected with any contagious disease shall, in no case, be allowed to remain on the common; and if, after due notice has been given to the owner to remove such stock, he fail to do so within a reasonable time, named in such notice, the managers may cause all such diseased stock to be destroyed at the owner's risk.
- The managers, or some person appointed by them in writing, shall attend at the yards on branding days to receive fees and give receipts therefor on behalf of the managers; and no stock shall, at any time, be taken in charge by the herdsman until the owner produces such receipt.
- The herdsman shall muster all stock found on the common on the first Monday in every quarter. He shall provide branding material, and shall brand all registered stock with the common brand "(B)." He shall release, at his own expense, all registered stock which may be impounded. If, at mustering time, any stock duly registered for the previous quarter are not produced, the herdsman shall be responsible for their full value to the owners should he not be able to show that he had given to the owners at least six days' notice in writing of the loss thereof, and had otherwise used all due diligence for their recovery.

11. The herdsman shall lay poisoned grain for the destruction of rabbits on any or all parts of the common where directed by the managers.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty (20) pounds for each offence.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All charges must be paid when the order is given.
2. Any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, and upon payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep such vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their representatives, for ever. Application for permission must be made to the trustees.
3. A certificate of permission in the form set out in Schedule A will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.
4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.
5. Orders for interments must be given six working hours prior to the hour fixed for the funeral, if not an extra charge will be made. No free interment will be allowed without the above notice.
6. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but parties wanting vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of such person or persons as the trustees may appoint.
7. The name, age, date, place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order. (See Schedule B of *The Registration of Births, Deaths, and Marriages Statute 1865*.)
8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owners.
9. Drawings or plans of every stone, tomb, or monument to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription must be submitted to the trustees for approval before being admitted into the cemetery.
10. No catacombs or any wooden fencing allowed round graves without the approval of the trustees.
11. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.
12. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the graves, will be kept at the office, and may be inspected at all reasonable hours. Registers of all grants will be kept by the secretary.
13. The trustees reserve the right to make alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

The Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; Williamstown District will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra, and all Government vessels which may be in Hobson's Bay during the currency of the contract; the Ararat and Beechworth Districts will include the Lunatic Asylums at these places; the Ballarat District includes the Industrial and Reformatory Schools; and the Geelong District embraces a radius of two miles from the Post Office.

The lock-ups at City Watch-House, Carlton, Collingwood, Fitzroy, Fitzroy North, Hotham Hill, King street, Little Bourke street, North Melbourne, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Richmond, St. Kilda, St. Kilda road, and South Melbourne are included in the contracts for the Melbourne District.

Samples of the sago, soaps, rice, teas, and sugars required at Yarra Bend, Kew, Sunbury, and Ararat, can be seen at the respective lunatic asylums; and samples of the teas, sugars, soaps, and tobacco required at Geelong, Ballarat, Beechworth, Castlemaine, Maryborough, Sale, Sandhurst, and Portland can be seen on application to the governors of the respective gaols. Samples of the whole of the above-mentioned articles can also be seen at the offices of the Secretary to the Tender Board.

The prices must be expressed, without alterations or erasures, in words as well as in figures, and the total amount of tender stated.

Printed forms of tender, showing the estimated monthly consumption, and conditions of contract, may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Melbourne; and for the respective districts from the Receivers and Paymasters at Geelong, Ararat, Ballarat, Beechworth, Castlemaine, Maryborough, Sale, Sandhurst, and Portland; the Medical Superintendent, Lunatic Asylum, Sunbury; and the Inspector of Forests, Macedon, by whom also information will be afforded to persons tendering.

Security will be required, either in Government debentures, bank deposit-receipt, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect. The security is calculated at Ten per cent. on contracts under £1,000, and Five per cent. over that sum; and the preliminary deposit at Ten per cent. of the security; but no deviation will be allowed from the amounts above specified.

Bank deposit-receipts to be in favor of the Secretary, Tender Board.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenders enclosed in a separate envelope, and *having the words "Tender for at" (as the case may be) written thereon*, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, or (if sent by post) must be prepaid, and addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c.

2. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

3. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheds, butter firkins, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed at the contractor's expense.

4. Bread.—A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality. Third quality (that issued to prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, fine sharps, the produce of prime, strong, thin-skinned, good colored wheat, to be perfectly free from coarse pollard or other offal.

5. Milk.—The milk must be fresh, pure, and of the best quality, and subject to test when required by the department. Should the supply prove to be not of contract quality, any expense incurred will be charged to the contractor.

6. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quality admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately, also buttocks only when ordered. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than ten inches, must have been cut off. The sticking pieces must be removed from the fore quarters of beef.

7. Potatoes to be dry and free from dirt. Contractors to supply 105 lbs. of potatoes for each cental credited to them, and, in addition, to take back all rejected before being cooked.

8. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned.

9. The order issued by the head of department must accompany the goods, and the account is to be rendered simultaneously with the delivery of the supplies. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

10. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account.

11. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the

board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

12. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

13. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

14. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the deputy medical superintendent) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the colony for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor.

15. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

16. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board to survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge of the station, will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

17. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivery or replacing them when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the whole or any part of the security.

18. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 17 of these conditions.

19. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

20. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board on behalf of the Government, or the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months; it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made; and under no other circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. It will also be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, for the breach or neglect of the same, or should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate improperly with a prisoner.

21. 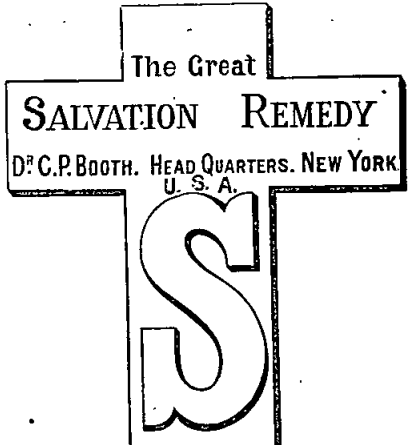

A BILL TO AMEND THE LAW RELATIVE TO ATTORNEYS, SOLICITORS, AND PROCTORS.

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made in the next session of the Parliament of Victoria for leave to bring in a bill for the following purposes:—

- To amend the law relating to attorneys, solicitors, and proctors, and for that purpose to repeal section 32 of Act 15 Victoria No. 10, so far as the same relates to attorneys, solicitors, and proctors, sections 24 and 25 of Act 27 Victoria, No. 223, and section 336 of Act 27 Victoria, No. 233.
- To form the attorneys, solicitors, and proctors now or hereafter practising in Victoria into a corporate body by the name of the Law Society of Victoria.
- To define the powers and regulate the management of the said society and of a council thereof, and to provide for the making of bye-laws.
- To prohibit the admission, suspension, or striking from the roll of any attorney, solicitor, or proctor, except under the provisions hereof.
- To license attorneys, solicitors, and proctors for the practice of their profession, and for that purpose to provide for the issue to them of annual certificates, and the payment and disposal of fees in respect thereof, and to prevent unlicensed persons from practising or maintaining actions in respect of professional work.
- To regulate the admission of attorneys, solicitors, and proctors, and for that purpose to make provision for the examination of and service under articles of clerkship by persons desiring admission, and for the partial or total exemption from such examination and service of persons who have obtained certain academical degrees or who had been admitted to practise in other parts of the empire, and to provide for the registration of contracts of service.
- To limit the number of clerks to be articled at one time to any attorney, solicitor, or proctor, and to prohibit such clerks from engaging in any other employment except under prescribed conditions.
- To provide for the examination of persons desiring to be admitted, and for that purpose to constitute a board of examiners and to define their duties and powers.
- To provide for the issue by the board of examiners of certificates of competency to persons desiring to be admitted, and for an appeal from the decision of the board to the council and thence to the Supreme Court.

10. To provide for the payment of fees by persons desiring to be admitted and for the disposal thereof.

11. To provide for the admission and enrolment of persons as attorneys, solicitors, and proctors on the certificate of the Council that such persons are duly qualified hereunder, and to provide for the cancelling of any certificate obtained by fraud or misrepresentation, and the striking off the rolls of persons procuring themselves to be admitted or enrolled by such means.

12. To provide for the removal from the roll of any attorney, solicitor, or proctor convicted of felony.

13. To give powers to an absolute majority of the council, subject to an appeal to the Supreme Court, to strike from the roll or otherwise punish any attorney, solicitor, or proctor convicted of misdemeanour or guilty of dishonourable or dishonest conduct, and to cancel or annul such punishment.

14. To provide for the punishment of unqualified persons practising as attorneys, solicitors, and proctors, and of attorneys, solicitors, and proctors acting as agents for such persons, or assisting or enabling such persons so to practice.

15. To provide for the admission in evidence of extracts from books and other documents certified under the common seal of the society.
