## CHAPTER 67.

An Act to amend the Superannuation Acts 1834 and 1859, and for other purposes. [16th September 1887.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same as follows:

1. *Grant of gratuity or allowance to injured civil servant.*—(1.) Where a person employed in the civil service of the state is injured—

- (a) in the actual discharge of his duty; and
- (b) without his own default; and
- (c) by some injury specifically attributable to the nature of his duty.

the Treasury may grant to him, or, if he dies from the injury, to his widow, his mother, if wholly dependent on him at the time of his death, and to his children, or to any of them, such gratuity or annual allowance as the Treasury may consider reasonable, and as may be permitted by the terms of a warrant under this section.

(2.) The Treasury shall forthwith after the passing of this Act frame a warrant regulating the grant of gratuities and annual allowances under this section, and the warrant so framed shall be laid before Parliament.

(3.) Provided that a gratuity under this section shall not exceed one year's salary of the person injured, and an allowance under this section shall not, together with any superannuation allowance to which he is otherwise entitled, exceed the salary of the person injured, or three hundred pounds a year, whichever is less.

2. *Power to grant retiring allowance to persons removed.*—

(1.) Where a civil servant is removed from his office on the ground of his inability to discharge efficiently the duties of his office, and a superannuation allowance cannot lawfully be granted to him under the Superannuation Acts 1834 and 1859, and the Treasury think that the special circumstances of the case justify the grant to him of a retiring allowance, they may grant to him such retiring allowance as they think just and proper, but in no case exceeding the amount for which his length of service would qualify him under sections two and four of the Superannuation Act 1859, without any addition under section seven of that Act.

(2.) A minute of the Treasury granting an allowance under this section to any civil servant shall set forth the amount of the allowance granted to him, and the reasons for such allowance, and shall be laid before Parliament: Provided that the Treasury before making the grant shall consider any representation which the civil servant removed may have submitted to them.

3. *Reckoning of temporary services.*—Where a person at the time he becomes a civil servant within the meaning of this Act is serving the State in a temporary capacity, the Treasury may, if in their opinion any special circumstances of the case warrant such a course, direct that his service in that capacity may be reckoned for the purposes of the Superannuation Acts 1834 and 1859, and this Act, as service in the capacity of civil servant, and it shall be so reckoned accordingly.

4. *Compassionate gratuity on retirement of person not entitled to superannuation.*—If a person employed in any public department in a capacity in respect of which a superannuation allowance

cannot be granted under the Superannuation Act 1859 retires, or is removed from his employment, and

- (a) the employment is one to which he was required to devote his whole time, and
- (b) the remuneration for the employment was paid entirely out of moneys provided by Parliament, and
- (c) he has served in the employment for not less than seven years, if he is removed in consequence of the abolition of his employment, or for the purpose of facilitating improvements in the organisation of the department by which economy can be effected, or for not less than fifteen years if his retirement is caused from infirmity of mind or body, permanently incapacitating him from the duties of his employment,

the Treasury may, if they think fit, grant to him a compassionate gratuity not exceeding one pound or one week's pay, whichever is the greater, for each year of his service in his employment.

5. *Provision against double pensions.*—A person shall not be entitled to reckon the same period of time both for the purpose of a superannuation allowance under the Superannuation Acts 1834 and 1859 and this Act, and also for the purpose of naval or military non-effective pay.

6. *Regulations as to officers receiving half-pay or retired pay.*—

(1.) The Treasury may, within one month after the passing of this Act, frame rules as to the conditions on which any civil employment of profit under any public department as defined by this Act, or any employment of profit under the Government of any British possession, or any employment under the Government of any Foreign State may be accepted or held by any person who is in receipt of or has received any sum granted by Parliament for the pay, half-pay, or retired pay of officers of Her Majesty's naval or land forces, or otherwise for payment for past service in either of such forces, or who has commuted the right to receive the same, and as to the effect of such acceptance or holding on the said pay or sum, and the Treasury may in such rules provide for the enforcement thereof by the forfeiture, suspension, or reduction of any such pay or sum as aforesaid, or of any commutation money or remuneration for such employment.

(2.) Such rules shall also provide for the returns to be laid before Parliament of such officers accepting employment as are affected by the rules, and shall come into operation at the date of the passing of this Act.

(3.) The rules shall be laid before both Houses of Parliament forthwith.

(4.) For the purposes of this section "British possession" means any part of Her Majesty's dominions out of the United Kingdom, and this section shall apply to Cyprus as if it were a British possession.

7. *Provision as to lunatics.*—(1.) Where any sum in respect of pay, pension, superannuation, or other allowance or annuity is due in respect either of service as a civil servant, or of military or naval service, to a person who is a lunatic, whether so found by inquisition or not, such sum may be from time to time applied for his benefit by the prescribed public department in such manner as the department think expedient.

(2.) Where any annuity, whether pension, superannuation, or other allowance, is payable out of moneys provided by Parliament to a person in respect either of service as a civil servant or of military or naval service, and such person is or becomes a lunatic towards whose maintenance a contribution is made out of money provided by Parliament, then as long as the contribution is made his annuity shall be reduced by an amount equal to that contribution, and if the amount of the contribution exceeds the amount of the annuity, the annuity shall cease to be payable.

8. *Distribution of money not exceeding £100 without probate.*—On the death of a person to whom any sum not exceeding one hundred pounds is due from a public department in respect of any civil pay, superannuation, or other allowance, annuity, or gratuity, then, if the prescribed public department so direct, but subject to the regulations (if any) made by the Treasury, probate or other proof of the title of the personal representative of the deceased person may be dispensed with, and the said sum may be paid or distributed to or among the persons appearing to the public department to be beneficially entitled to the personal estate of the deceased person, or to or among any one or more of those persons, or in case of the illegitimacy of the deceased person or his children, to or among such persons as the department may think fit, and the department shall be discharged from all liability in respect of any such payment or distribution.

9. *Decision of Treasury.*—The decision of the Treasury on any question which arises as to the application of any section of this Act to any person, or as to the amount of any allowance or gratuity under this Act, or as to the reckoning of any service for such allowance or gratuity, shall be final.

10. *Saving for existing interests.*—Nothing in this Act shall be construed so as in any way to interfere with the rights existing at the passing of this Act of any civil servant then holding office.

11. *Laying of warrant and minutes before Parliament.*—Every warrant and minute under this Act which is required to be laid before Parliament shall be laid before both Houses of Parliament in manner provided by section thirteen of the Superannuation Act 1859.

12. *Definitions* (22 Vict. c. 29).—In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires—

The expression "civil servant" means a person who has served in an established capacity in the permanent civil service of the State within the meaning of section seven-teen of the Superannuation Act 1859:

The expression "Treasury" means the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury:

The expression "public department" means the Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral, and any of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State; and any other public department of the Government; and the expression "prescribed public department" means, as respects any matter, the department prescribed for the purpose of that matter by the Treasury.

13. *Short titles.*—The Act of the session of the fourth and fifth years of the reign of King William the Fourth, chapter twenty-four, intituled "An Act to alter, amend, and consolidate the laws for regulating the pensions, compensations, and allowances to be made to persons in respect of their having held civil offices in His Majesty's service," is in this Act referred to and may be cited as the Superannuation Act 1834, and that Act and the Superannuation Act 1859 are together in this Act referred to as the Superannuation Acts 1834 and 1859.

The said Acts and this Act may be cited together as the Superannuation Acts 1834 to 1887, and this Act may be cited separately as the Superannuation Act 1887.

14. *Repeal.*—The Acts set forth in the schedule to this Act are hereby repealed to the extent in the third column of that schedule mentioned as from the passing of this Act, without prejudice to anything previously done or suffered in pursuance of the enactments hereby repealed.

RULES UNDER SECTION 6 OF THE SUPERANNUATION ACT 1887.

*Preamble.*—Whereas by the Superannuation Act 1887 the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are authorized to frame rules as to the conditions on which any civil employment of profit under any public department, or any employment of profit under the Government of any British Possession, or any employment under the Government of any foreign State, may be accepted by any person who is in receipt of any sum granted by Parliament

for the pay, half-pay, or retired pay of officers of Her Majesty's naval or military forces, regular or auxiliary, or otherwise, for past services in such forces; or who has commuted the right to receive the same, or has retired with a gratuity; and otherwise, as in the said Act mentioned:

And whereas the general principle adopted by Parliament has been that where any person receiving non-effective pay on account of service to the State accepts fresh State employment, the State should benefit by some saving upon the sums otherwise payable to such person on account of his non-effective pay and of the emoluments of his fresh employment:

And whereas such saving has been heretofore effected by means of a reduction of the non-effective pay, and it appears to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury expedient that in the case of officers accepting certain civil employments of profit, such saving should be effected by reduction of the emoluments of the fresh employment instead of by reduction of the non-effective pay:

Now therefore the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Superannuation Act 1887, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby make the following rules:—

In these rules:—

1. *Definitions.*—(a) The expression "non-effective pay" shall mean any half-pay or retired pay, or other payment granted by Parliament for officers in Her Majesty's naval or land forces, on account of past service in some portion of those forces, but does not include rewards for distinguished or meritorious service, nor pensions for wounds.

(b) The expression "civil employment of profit under any public department" means any employment the profits of which are derived from any of the following funds which are hereby declared to be public funds, viz:—

(a) The Consolidated Fund.

(b) Money voted by Parliament, or receipts taken in reduction of such money.

(c) Land or hereditary revenues of the Crown.

(d) Crown revenue of the Channel Islands.

(e) Mercantile Marine Fund.

(f) Funds of Greenwich or Chelsea Hospital.

(g) Any other fund which, either from its being administered by a public department, or from its receiving a contribution out of any of the above-mentioned funds, the Treasury may from time to time determine to be a public fund;

but does not include any such employment as the Treasury, having regard to the regulations of the Admiralty and the War Department, determine to be a naval or military employment.

(c) The expression "naval" shall include "marine," and the expression "navy" shall include the marines.

(d) The expression "officer" shall mean any officer who holds or has retired from a commission in any of the Imperial forces, or who has retired with a gratuity or upon non-effective pay, whether he have commuted such non-effective pay or not.

(e) The expression "Imperial forces" means Her Majesty's Imperial, naval, or land forces.

(f) The expression "Colonial Government" means the government of any colony, and includes the Government of Cyprus.

(g) Other expressions have the same meaning as in the Superannuation Act 1887.

I.—ACCEPTANCE OF OFFICE.

2. *Consent to be obtained for civil or any colonial or foreign employment.*—An officer who is on the half-pay or retired list, or who has commuted his non-effective pay, or retired from the Imperial forces with a gratuity, before accepting any civil employment of profit under any public department, or any employment of profit under the government of any British possession, or any employment under the government of any foreign state, shall obtain the consent of the Admiralty or the War Department, as the case may be, and the continuance of such consent shall be a condition of his holding such employment; and such consent, when given, and with a withdrawal of such consent, shall be communicated by the giver to the Treasury.

3. *Penalty for non-observance of condition of Rule 2.*—If any officer fail to obtain such consent, or if he continues to hold such employment after the consent is withdrawn, he shall be liable to have his non-effective pay suspended or reduced, either permanently or temporarily, according as the Treasury may direct, and if he have commuted such pay or retired with a gratuity, shall be liable to pay to Her Majesty the amount of commutation money or gratuity, or such portion thereof as the Treasury may direct.

II.—RECEIPT OF NAVAL OR MILITARY NON-EFFECTIVE PAY BY AN OFFICER HOLDING A CIVIL EMPLOYMENT OF PROFIT.

4. *Abatement from civil emoluments.*—If any such officer, as is mentioned in Rule 2, accept any civil employment of profit under any public department (other than in Her Majesty's Household), and such officer either continues, whilst holding the said employment, to draw any non-effective pay, or has commuted such pay, or has retired with a gratuity from Navy or Army funds, the profits of his civil employment shall be subject to abatement under the following conditions:—

(a) If the annual amount of his non-effective pay, whether in actual course of payment or commuted or represented by a gratuity valued as hereinafter mentioned, and the profits of his civil employment together exceed £400 per annum, the profits of his civil employment shall be abated by such amount, not being less than 10 per cent. thereof, as may be determined by the Treasury in concert with the department employing the officer; provided that no abatement shall be made by reason of this rule, which exceeds the amount of the officer's non-effective pay or reduces his total emoluments to less than £400 per annum.

(b) For the purposes of sub-section (a) the annual value of non-effective pay which has been commuted shall be the amount of such pay at the time of commutation, and the value of a gratuity shall be determined, actuarially, according to the prospects of life of the officer at the date of his receipt of such gratuity.

5.—(1.) *Exemptions from abatement*.—It shall be competent to the Treasury, on the recommendation of the Admiralty or War Department, as the case may be, from time to time to exempt any civil employment under a naval or military department from the operation of Rule 4, or to bring the same back within its operation.

(2.) It shall be competent to the Treasury from time to time to exempt any other civil employment from the operation of Rule 4, for such time as they may deem fit, on the ground of such employment being of a temporary or casual character, or of its profits being petty or uncertain, or of the nature of fees for piecework.

6. *Treasury to decide doubtful cases*.—In case of doubt arising either as to whether the funds from which the profits of a civil employment are derived are public funds, or as to what is, for the purposes of Rule 4, the annual value of non-effective pay, or of a gratuity, or of the profits of a civil employment, the decision on the point shall rest with the Treasury.

7. *Limitation of civil pension*.—No such officer as is mentioned in Rule 2 shall accept any civil employment of profit under any public department, otherwise than on condition that no pension shall be granted to him in respect of that employment, which, when added to his non-effective pay, shall exceed two-thirds of the emoluments of that employment, or a total of £1,000 a year, whichever may be the greater.

But, if such officer's civil employment have been declared, by order under Section 4 of the Superannuation Act 1859, to be a professional office, he may, subject to the above limitation of the amount of pension, elect on his retirement:

(a) Either to retain his non-effective pay, together with a pension calculated on his actual service in the professional office; or

(b) To relinquish his non-effective pay, and to receive a pension calculated on his actual service in the professional office, together with the addition of years granted by the order.

8. *Other powers of abatement reserved*.—Nothing in these rules shall abridge or supersede any power of abatement of an officer's non-effective pay or emoluments possessed in other respects by the Treasury, or by any other public department.

9. *Annual return to Parliament*.—A return shall be laid before Parliament in every year of the number of officers who, having non-effective pay, or having commuted their non-effective pay, or having retired on a gratuity from navy or army funds, have been granted by the Admiralty or War Department permission, under Rule 2, to hold any civil employment of profit under a public department, specifying the names of such officers and the respective amounts of their non-effective pay and their emoluments, and the abatement, if any, made therefrom, and distinguishing the officers to whom such permission has been granted since the conclusion of last return.

### III.—EMPLOYMENT OF NAVAL OR MILITARY OFFICERS BY COLONIAL GOVERNMENTS (EXCLUSIVE OF THE GOVERNMENT OF INDIA).

10. *Officers on active list to draw no Imperial pay*.—If an officer on the active list now holds, or shall hereafter accept any employment of profit under any Colonial Government, not remunerated out of Imperial funds, he shall draw no pay, effective or non-effective, from Imperial funds so long as he holds that employment; but if his employment appears to the Admiralty or War Department to be of a nature to afford practical experience likely to be afterwards of public advantage in the event of his return to Imperial service, his service under the Colonial Government may, if the Admiralty or War Department think fit, count towards promotion and retirement, as though it were service in the Imperial forces, and in that case the retired pay earned by his colonial service, whilst he remains on the said active list, will, in due course, be chargeable on Imperial funds.

11. *Duration of employment*.—An officer on the active list shall accept and hold any employment of profit under a Colonial Government on condition only that the employment does not, in the absence of exceptional circumstances, last for a period exceeding five years, and is not renewed.

12. *As to officers retiring whilst in colonial service*.—If an officer retire from the Imperial forces whilst he holds an employment of profit under a Colonial Government, he may at once draw so much of his retired pay as was earned by Imperial service before his entering the colonial service; and upon his retirement from the colonial service he may also draw the retired pay earned by so much of his colonial service as preceded his retirement from the Imperial forces.\*

13. *As to officers on retired list who accept colonial employment*.—If an officer on the retired list now holds, or shall hereafter accept, an employment of profit under a Colonial Government, his retired pay, even though earned by mixed Imperial and colonial service, shall not be suspended in whole or in part, by reason of such employment, unless the Admiralty or War Department think fit otherwise to order; and any such order may be carried into effect.

14. *Check on increase of retired pay*.—Service under a Colonial Government subsequent to an officer's retirement from the Imperial forces shall not increase the charge for his non-effective pay upon Imperial funds.

### IV.—SAVING CLAUSES.

15. *Saving for certain officers*.—If any officer who is on the half-pay or retired list, or who has commuted his non-effective pay, or retired from the Imperial forces with a gratuity, accepts or holds any civil employment of profit under any public department, or any employment under the Government of any British Possession, and is not subject to Rule 4, or is not subject to Rules 10 to 14, both inclusive, he shall accept and hold such employ-

ment on condition that he does not receive any part of any sum granted for non-effective pay for any time during which he holds such employment, except as hereafter mentioned, that is to say:

(a) If the appointment is in Her Majesty's household, he may receive the full amount of his non-effective pay:

(b) If the annual emoluments of the employment do not exceed three times the amount of the highest rate of the non-effective pay attached to the rank, by virtue of which he claims to receive non-effective pay, such person may, with Her Majesty's pleasure to that effect, signified by the Treasury through one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, receive the non-effective pay to which he would be entitled if he held no such employment of profit:

(c) Where the annual emoluments of the employment exceed three times the amount of such highest rate of non-effective pay as aforesaid, but fall short of four times such amount, the holder of such employment may, with Her Majesty's pleasure, signified in the manner aforesaid, receive so much non-effective pay as, added to the emoluments of his employment, will together make up four times the amount of such non-effective pay.

16. *Saving for existing officers*.—In the case of any officer who has accepted any employment before the passing of the Superannuation Act 1857, the foregoing rules shall not, without his consent, apply to him so far as respects that employment, and if he does not so consent, the law and regulations applying to such officer immediately before such passing shall continue to apply to him so far as respects that employment.

**T**HE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*, do hereby make the following Bye-law for fixing the Charges and Regulations for the Carriage of Wool, and all previous Bye-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

All wool is carried at owner's risk as to condition, and will be signed for accordingly. If detailed weight lists are furnished by the Commissioners for the use of consignees, the charge for weighing will be Fourpence per bale; if weighed by the owners, One penny per bale will be charged for the use of the scales. Consignors requiring weight lists must pay for same at sending station. Unless rebate sheets are rendered within two months of date on which wool is consigned no claim will be recognised.

The births of 1,227 children, viz., 595 boys and 632 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of March. In the month of February 1,065 births were registered, or 162 fewer than in the month under review. The births were 303 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 64 above that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in March numbered 747, viz., 413 of males and 334 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 480, or 64 per cent. The deaths outnumbered those in February by 18, and exceeded the average of March during the previous ten years by 154. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, the number will be found to have been identical with that average.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.13, and of deaths registered 1.91.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 94.0° on the 28th, and the lowest was 42.0° on the 22nd. The mean temperature of the month (60.0°) was more than three and a half degrees (3.6°) below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (43.4°) took place on the 28th, viz., from a maximum of 94.0° to a minimum of 50.6°. The least range (4.2°) was on the 4th, viz., from a maximum of 59.2° to a minimum of 55.0°. The mean daily range was 17.3°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.289 inches on the 20th, and the lowest was 29.456 inches on the 15th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.973 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 11 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.16 inches. The average rainfall in March during the previous ten years was 2.57 inches, or four-tenths of an inch above that in the month under notice. Fog occurred on one day during the month.

Males contributed 55 per cent., and females 45 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 44 per cent. to that mortality, as against 44 per cent. in March 1887, 46 per cent. in March 1886, 41 per cent. in March 1885, 42 per cent. in March 1884, 37 per cent. in March 1883, 43 per cent. in March 1882 and March 1881, 47 per cent. in March 1880 and March 1879, and 49 per cent. in March 1878.

Thirty-seven deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month:—Of these, a female, aged 75, died of hepatitis; two females, each aged 75, a female and a wood merchant, each aged 78, of heart disease; a female, aged 76, of apoplexy; a laborer (a patient in the Kew Lunatic Asylum), aged 76, of softening of the brain; a laborer (an inmate of the Immigrants' Home), aged 76, of paralysis; a female, aged 76, of bronchitis; a female, aged 78, of diarrhoea and exhaustion; a female, aged 79, and another female, aged 80, of cholera; a female, aged 81, of syncope; a gentleman, aged 82, of cystitis; a female, aged 84, of epilepsy; another female, aged 84, of fracture of the hip; a gentleman, aged 86, of anæmia; a carpenter and a female, each aged 75, a laborer (an inmate of the Immigrants' Home) and a nurse (an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum), each aged 77, two females, and a school-mistress (an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum), each aged 79, a female, aged 80, a hawker, aged 81, an engineer (an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum), aged 82, a carpenter, a gentleman, and a female, each aged 84, a female, aged 85, a female, aged 86, a female, aged 87, two females, each aged 88, a female, aged 92, and a civil engineer, aged 96, of old age.

Twenty-seven deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 24 were set down to accident, 2 to homicide, and 1 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A female child, aged 3, died of fracture of the skull, resulting from the kick of a horse; a barrister-at-law, aged 66, of injuries received through being struck whilst riding on a tram-car;

a carter, aged 26, of fracture of the skull, consequent upon being thrown from a horse; a grocer, aged 25, of fracture of the spine, and a male, of occupation unstated, aged 64, of injury to the head, both occasioned by falls from carts; a laborer, aged 28, of fracture of the skull, caused by falling from a railway bridge; a female, aged 30, of fracture of the spine, occasioned by falling into a cellar; a gentleman, aged 75, of fracture of the neck of the femur, caused by falling in the street; a female, aged 84, of intra-capsular fracture of the hip, attendant on a fall down stairs. A laborer, aged 41, and a platelayer, aged 46, were passed over by railway trains; a saw-maker, aged 61, died of injuries caused by getting out of a train while in motion; a female child, aged 4, of injury to the head and spine, occasioned by falling backwards on an iron safe whilst playing; a boy, aged 8, of a wound in the leg, terminating in tetanus, caused by being passed over by a cart; two female children, each aged 2 years, and a female, aged 23, of burns, caused by their clothes catching fire; a male child, aged 3, of scalds; a stonebreaker, aged 60, of sunstroke. A male child, aged 4, and a male of occupation unknown, aged 30, were drowned, the former in a tank; a station overseer, aged 48, was found drowned in the River Yarra, near the Botanical Bridge; a female, aged 64, was suffocated; and a solicitor, aged 65, was choked—a piece of meat becoming impacted in his throat. The homicidal deaths were those of a dealer, aged 28, who died of injuries received in a fight; and of a female, aged 41, of pyæmia and injuries inflicted on the vagina. In the former case a verdict of manslaughter, and in the latter of wilful murder, was returned. The suicidal death was that of a clerk, aged 20, who shot himself.

One hundred and forty-three deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.—70 in the Melbourne Hospital, 16 in the Alfred Hospital, 3 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 6 in the Children's Hospital, 3 in the Women's Hospital, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 12 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 10 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Austin Hospital, 5 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, and 1 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 325, of which 182, or 56 per cent., were of males, and 143, or 44 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 224 were under one year of age, 65 were between one and two, 14 were between two and three, 10 were between three and four, and 12 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 422. Of these, 231, or 55 per cent., were males, and 191, or 45 per cent., were females; 22 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 19 were between fifteen and twenty, 29 were between twenty and twenty-five, 52 were between twenty-five and thirty, 27 were between thirty and thirty-five, 31 were between thirty-five and forty, 23 were between forty and forty-five, 27 were between forty-five and fifty, 26 were between fifty and fifty-five, 25 were between fifty-five and sixty, 36 were between sixty and sixty-five, 38 were between sixty-five and seventy, 22 were between seventy and seventy-five, 18 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 19 were upwards of eighty.

In March, as compared with the previous month, under the head of specific febrile or zymotic diseases, there was an increase in deaths from diphtheria, which rose from 2 to 13. On the other hand, there was a slight decrease in deaths from typhoid fever, viz., from 63 to 54, and in those from diarrhoeal diseases, viz., from 65 to 60. Nine deaths of child-bearing women occurred during the month, as against only 3 in February. Comparing these with the births, it is found that one mother died to every 355 children born alive in February, and to every 136 such children in March.

The following deaths were set down to typhoid or enteric fever in the first three months of the year under notice and of each of the previous three years:—

The Italian Government has given notice, dated 22nd December 1887, that the commander of the Italian vessel-of-war, *M. A. Colonna*, reports the existence of a bank, situated eastward of Ras Makauwar, Asab bay:—

This bank, composed of sand and shells, is about half a cable long in a north-east and south-west direction, and about a quarter of a cable broad, with a depth of 6 feet; its position not being marked by any discoloration of the water. It is reported to lie with the following bearings:—

Western extreme of islet near Ras Dumeirah, S. 22° E.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* (No. 812, sec. 16) it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might subdivide any county into parishes and townships, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* might define the boundaries of such parishes or townships, and might distinguish each by a name; after such Proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions should thenceforward be recognised as a parish or township by the name so given as aforesaid; the Governor in Council might from time to time at the request of the council of any shire or borough alter, by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, the name of any such shire or borough, and might also from time to time by proclamation as aforesaid alter the name of any county, parish, city, town, township, land, area, goldfield, river, harbor, lake, bay, lagoon, swamp, mountain, glen, or other place or locality whatsoever within Victoria: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, do hereby alter the name of the street or road in the city of South Melbourne, and municipal district of St. Kilda, hitherto known as Queen's Terrace to Queen's Road.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this first day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and in the fifty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.

## PUBLIC HEALTH.—SHIRE OF AVON.

## BYE-LAW No. 1.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Avon, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being bye-law No. 1 of the said local board of health, that is to say:—

1. This bye-law shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire, excepting Parts I. and III., sections 4, 5, 6, 7, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, which shall apply to and have operation only in the township of Stratford within the said shire.

3. *Definitions*.—In the construction and for the purposes of this bye-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—

“House” shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging houses, or other buildings or premises.

“Cesspool” shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground; and “earth-closet” shall include a pan closet of any description.

“Street” shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word “person” shall include a corporation.

## Part I.—General Cleanliness.

4. The occupier of every house and premises shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connexion therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all dust, filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be, once at least in every week, removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, occupation, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon, to be effectually deodorized and to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

6. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter in any street, road, lane, right-of-way or place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health, or in any way contrary to the directions of the local board or officer of health.

7. No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water, or drinks, or milk, or other produce of such dairy.

## Part II.—As to Manure.

8. Nothing herein contained shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil (not being night-soil), or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any bye-law of the local board of health, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or contrary to any directions of the local board or officer of health.

9. Every person placing, depositing, or spreading, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any liquid manure of which night-soil, urine, or any similar offensive matters form a part, night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same or cause the same to be covered and shall keep the same covered with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness, and shall keep and use the same in such a way only as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health. And before doing so such person shall obtain the written permission of the local board or officer of health, subject however to any general regulation or directions which the Central Board, by publication in the *Government Gazette*, may make or give. But such permission shall be no defence in any complaint or prosecution for having kept or used such liquid manure, night-soil, offal, blood, or other matter in such a way as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

## Part III.—As to Earth-closets, &amp;c.

10. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor of which is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and very such building shall be constructed with proper openings or

flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the content whereof does not exceed three cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

11. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

12. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be water-tight and with handles thereto and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet, and provided with a closely-fitted cover of pattern to be approved by the inspector of nuisances.

13. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

14. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of eleven p.m. and five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, sulphate of iron, chloride of lime, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quantity and quality to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

15. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

16. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

17. Where in any municipality any nightman is licensed by the municipal authorities, such nightman shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for the removal of night-soil therefrom, and no other person shall remove the same.

18. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and finally placed in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

19. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of eleven p.m. and five a.m., unless otherwise permitted by the local board (of which the proof shall lie on such person), or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed as soon as the same is emptied.

20. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any drain or sewer.

## Part IV.—Prevention of Pollution of Water.

21. No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed, in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

22. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any water supplied, used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into such water.

23. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within twenty-four hours of notice given by the local board or by one of its officers.

## Part V.—Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairy-men, and Purveyors of Milk.

24. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairy-man, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of January in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an

application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of One shilling.

25. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary of the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

26. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said Local Board, or by any person authorized in writing by the Chairman or Secretary of the said Local Board; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said Local Board may, by an order in writing signed by the Secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling-place, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said Local Board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

27. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

28. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

29. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

30. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the Local Board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Local Board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such Local Board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

31. If at any time disease exists in the dairy, or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered

person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the Local Board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force; and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatever.

32. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

#### Part VI.—Penalties.

33. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

#### "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883."

#### UNITED SHIRE OF BEECHWORTH.

#### BYE-LAW No. 11.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, the Local Board of Health for the United Shire of Beechworth, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, doth make the following Bye-law :—

##### 1. Disposal and Removal of Dead Stock.

Every person (being the owner or the person properly responsible for the same) knowingly allowing or permitting any dead stock, beast, or animal to be or remain in or upon any land (private or public), public road, place or thoroughfare within the boundaries of the United Shire of Beechworth, or who shall after notice that any dead stock, beast, or animal is on or upon any land, place, road, or thoroughfare aforesaid, and after the expiration of twelve hours from the date of such knowledge or notice fails to remove and burn, bury or otherwise effectually dispose of and destroy any such dead stock, beast, or animal, shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter mentioned and provided.

##### 2. Inspection of Dairy Cattle and Grazing Ground.

Every person shall allow and permit the proper officer of the Local Board of Health to inspect any land used or occupied by him for the purpose of grazing dairy cattle, and of all cattle in or about any dairy or dairies; and in the event of any such inspection being unsatisfactory, and on the receipt of a written notice from such officer or the Local Board of Health prohibiting the sale of milk from any such dairy or dairies, or of any milk the produce of cattle fed on such grazing ground or the produce of any such dairy cattle, shall at once cease to sell or otherwise dispose of any such milk aforesaid.

##### 3. Slaughtering, &c., not to be carried on within a certain distance.

No person shall, by himself, or his servant, or agent, slaughter any beast or boil down any bones, blood, offal, or other refuse matter or dry any skins or hides within a distance of fifty yards of any road or dwelling.

##### 4. Earth-closets.

Every dwelling-house shall be provided with an earth-closet, to be constructed in such way as the Local Board of Health shall from time to time direct; and no such closet shall be erected at a less distance than 20 feet from any other adjoining main building on premises or any part of such building; and such closet shall be emptied not less than once every week, and the night-soil therefrom to be removed and buried or otherwise effectually disposed of in such a way as to avoid creating a nuisance or being injurious to health.

##### 5. Extent of application of Bye-law.

This Bye-law No. 11 shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the United Shire of Beechworth.

##### Penalties.

If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this bye-law, he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. Provided that the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid. And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether

such Local Board of Health have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of the powers vested in them, the trustees of the Euroa Public Cemetery do now, on this twenty-ninth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, rescind all rules and regulations relative to this cemetery published previously in the *Government Gazette*, and make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. That all fees and charges are payable on demand. The charge for digging of any grave, and for re-opening of any grave, and the interment fee, must be paid or satisfactory guarantee given for payment of them when application is made for the interment, or before the ground or vault is opened. All proper charges or fees must be paid promptly to the secretary.
2. The name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other information required as per Schedule A, must be stated to the secretary of the trustees at the time of making the application for any burial in the cemetery.
3. Orders for, or notices of, interment must be given to the sexton of the cemetery at least eight working hours prior to the hour fixed for the funeral, otherwise an extra charge must be paid. No free interment is exempt from this rule except by special consent of the trustees.
4. Any person desiring to hold ground in this cemetery for a private grave or private graves must apply to the trustees or to their manager for the same. If approved of by the trustees and payment is made of the proper fees or charges, the trustees will issue to the applicant a certificate of exclusive right of burial, in the form contained in Schedule B, or to the like effect, subject to any Acts of the Victorian Parliament in relation to cemeteries now or hereafter brought into force.
5. The trustees will, when required, cause all ordinary grave-digging and refilling to be executed at the proper charge or charges; parties desiring a grave to be dug and refilled by their own assistants, or a brick grave, or a vault to be made ready by their own workman or workmen, must dig and refill, or construct under the direction or the approval of the trustees or their agent.
6. In the case of an application for or notice of interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner of said grave or vault shall be given into the custody of the secretary of the trustees, or of the sexton of the cemetery, previous to the opening of the grave or vault, if so desired by the said secretary or the manager of the cemetery; and no interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault without satisfactory evidence being shown that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so.
7. The hours fixed for burials shall be as follows:—On week days—September to April inclusive, from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m.; May to August inclusive, from 8 a.m. until 4 p.m.; on Sundays throughout the year, from 2 o'clock until 5 o'clock p.m.

8. Every new private grave must be at least six feet deep, and no additional interment shall be allowed anywhere that will not allow of at least three feet of depth of earth from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground after such interment.

9. No burial shall be allowed to take place out of the hours fixed per Rule No. 7, except by special permission of the trustees.

10. Every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance of the cemetery, and no vehicle, excepting the hearse and proper mourning coaches, shall then be permitted to enter the cemetery, nor to remain opposite to the entrance gate; and no person is to be allowed to enter (nor remain if accidentally in) within the cemetery on horseback.

11. No child under ten years of age shall be allowed to be in the cemetery, except in the charge of a responsible person.

12. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass in the cemetery, or injuring wilfully any authorized erection there, or otherwise infringing any rule, regulation, or bye-law made for protecting this cemetery and for the maintenance of good order there, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.

13. No smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery, nor any fireworks to be discharged therein, and no dogs shall be allowed loose in this cemetery; those found loose in the cemetery are liable to be destroyed.

14. Any person desiring to place any monument, headstone, or raised tomb, with or without an inscription or epitaph thereon, in any part of this cemetery shall apply to the trustees (or their manager) for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a sketch-copy thereof to the manager of the cemetery; if it is approved of, a certificate of permission will be given on payment of the prescribed charge for the same.

15. No person shall put up or cause to be put up any erection, nor place nor cause to be placed any epitaph or inscription, in any part of this cemetery without the permission of the trustees or their manager.

16. Every monument, raised tomb, headstone, private grave, and fence must be kept in repair and proper condition and subject to the provisions of the Act 45 Victoria No. 677, by and at the expense of the owner or owners.

17. Every new grave for a child shall be dug four feet in depth at the least, and every new grave for any person above twelve years of age shall be dug six feet deep at the least.

18. The secretary to the trustees, as manager of the cemetery also, is authorized hereby for and shall exercise a general supervision and control, under the trustees, over all matters pertaining to this cemetery.

19. A plan of the cemetery, showing the distribution of the land into compartments, and the relative situation (by numbers) of all private graves, and a registry of certificates of right of private graves, also a registry of all burials in this cemetery, shall be kept at the office of the trustees.

20. The trustees reserve to themselves the right to make any further improvements or alterations from time to time in these rules and regulations and in the charges.

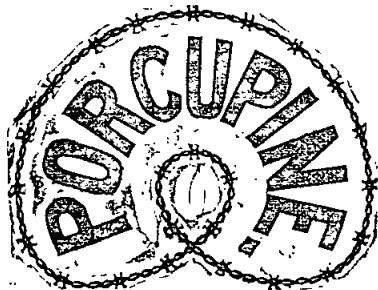

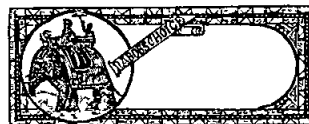
