AMENDMENT—STORES AND TRANSPORT REGULATIONS, 8th JANUARY 1886.

THIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the following amendments in the Stores and Transport Regulations, dated 8th January 1886:—

Delivery—Clause 12a.—Add—That from the first July next delivery of paper, parchment, and envelopes shall be stipulated for in the annual contracts to be made to the Government Printer.

Requisitions—Clause 83.—Add—Officers forwarding requisitions for the approval of the Minister must specify therein the particulars and prices published in the *Government Gazette* for the information of the officers concerned.

Orders—Clause 16.—Add—Orders for the departmental supplies of paper, parchment, and envelopes shall be forwarded to the Secretary to the Tender Board, and by him sent to the Government Printer to be executed.

Accounts—Clause 36.—Add—Accounts for paper, parchment, and envelopes supplied by the Government Printer shall be rendered by that officer to the several departments to be checked and certified, and then transmitted to the Treasury for payment.

And generally to govern the supply of paper, parchment, and envelopes, as far as may be applicable thereto, under the altered circumstances.

BOARD OF TRADE INSTRUCTIONS RELATING TO SURVEY FEES.

THE following extract from instructions issued by the Board of Trade, relating to survey fees, is published for general information.

MEASUREMENT OF TONNAGE. 36 & 37 Vict. c. 85 s. 30.

Fees for this duty are chargeable in accordance with the following scale and regulations:—

Tons (gross register).	Amount.

Note.—(1.) The fees are to be charged on the gross register tonnage of the vessels measured.

(2.) In the case of vessels measured under Rule 2 of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, the fee to be charged will be one-fourth of the fee applicable to the case in the above scale; but not less than 10s. is to be charged in any case. When a vessel previously measured under Rule 2 is re-measured under Rule 1, the fee to be charged is to be such as will make up, with the sum previously paid for measurement under Rule 2, the full fee applicable to the case in the above scale.

(3.) In the case of alterations in a space or spaces on the upper deck or engine-room, the fee to be charged will be one-fifth of the fee in the above scale, according to the tonnage of the vessel; but not less than 10s. is to be charged in any case.

A fee of 10s. is to be charged in all cases of minor inspections (e.g., alteration of rig, port of registry, description of engines, &c.).

(4.) In the case of foreign vessels holding "certificates of British tonnage," no fee is to be charged if the certificate has been issued within three years; if issued previously, the principal dimensions are to be re-tried, and, if they are found correct, a fee of 10s. only is to be charged. If these dimensions do not practically agree with the certificate of tonnage, the vessel must be re-measured throughout under Rule 1 or 2, as the case may be, and the proper fees must be charged.

Where a copy of the "certificate of British tonnage" is required by the owner or master, a fee of 2s. 6d. is to be charged for it.

17 and 18 Vict. c. 104 s. 27.

(6.) In cases of the measurement of vessels registered before the passing of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, a fee at the rate of 7s. 6d. for each transverse section is to be charged.

The fee paid in accordance with the above scale covers any number of visits that the surveyor may find it necessary to make before he is able to fill up the formula of tonnage and grant his certificate to enable a vessel to obtain registry. It also covers the inspection of crew spaces and lights and fog signals if the surveyor is able to make these inspections on the occasion on which the measurement is performed, but not otherwise. For any further visits necessary for the inspection, or completion of inspection, of crew spaces and lights and fog signals, further fees in accordance with the scale below (div. f. and g.) will be charged.

The fee for measurement of tonnage also covers inspection of marking if the vessels are about to be registered or re-registered.

BIRDS TO BE DEEMED "NATIVE GAME."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in the thirty-first year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled *An Act to protect Game* (31 Vict. No. 311), it is amongst other things enacted that for the purposes of the said Act the term "game" shall mean and include all birds and other animals mentioned in the first schedule to the said Act; and the term "native game" shall mean and include all birds and other animals mentioned in the second schedule to the said Act; provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, at any time after the passing of the said Act, by proclamation to name any other bird or animal which shall be included in such first or second schedule respectively, and after the publication of any such proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, and the expiration of the period mentioned in such proclamation for the time of its coming into operation, the birds or other animals so named shall be deemed and considered as being thenceforward included in such schedule: And it is also enacted that the period of the year during which the said Act shall be in operation as regards all or any of the birds and other animals mentioned in the second schedule shall be from and after the first day of August until the thirtieth day of November in each year, or such other period as the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* from time to time direct: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby name each of the birds named in the schedule hereto annexed as a bird which shall be included in the second schedule to the said Act upon the expiration of the period hereafter mentioned for the coming into operation of this proclamation, and that the period of the year during which the said Act shall be in operation as regards each of the birds named in the aforesaid schedule hereto annexed shall be the period set forth opposite the name of each bird respectively: And, with the advice aforesaid, I do appoint that this my proclamation shall come into operation upon the first day of July One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

1. The Volunteer Ambulance Corps will consist of—
 - 1 Surgeon from the unattached list of medical officers, who will be in command
 - 1 Sergeant-Major
 - 1 Sergeant Compounder
 - 2 Sergeants
 - 3 Corporals
 - 42 Privates

Total, 50.

2. No member of the Volunteer Ambulance Corps shall be classed as effective unless he shall have completed 12 daylight drills and 24 night drills during the twelve months between the 1st of July and the 30th of June in each year.

Recruits passed into the ranks between the 1st of July and the 30th of September must attend 12 daylight drills and 24 night drills.

Recruits passed into the ranks between the 1st of October and the 31st of December must attend 6 daylight drills and 12 night drills.

Recruits passed into the ranks between the 1st of January and the 31st of March must attend 3 daylight drills and 6 night drills.

Recruits passed into the ranks between the 1st of April and the 30th of June must attend 2 daylight drills and 4 night drills.

3. Every member of the Volunteer Ambulance Corps on being passed into the ranks will be supplied, free of charge, with the following articles, which must be kept in good order, remain the property of the Government, and be returned whenever called for:—

- 1 great-coat
- 1 jacket
- 1 pair trousers
- 1 helmet
- 1 forage cap
- 1 waist-belt and frog
- 1 bayonet.

4. The Volunteer Ambulance Corps shall serve under the regulations for Rifle Volunteers, so far as they may be applicable, and not inconsistent with the foregoing regulations.

REGULATION NO. 6.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the

powers and authorities conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, make the following Regulation, viz.:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said urban district:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, used either partly or wholly as a domicile, an amount of five per cent. per annum on the annual value of such property.

3. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, not being a domicile, an amount of $\frac{3}{4}$ per cent. per annum on the annual value of such property. Provided that in any case the charge shall not be less than the sum of One pound.

4. For every water-trough One pound per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs shall be 8,000 gallons.

5. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.

Exceeding half an acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre.

For every additional acre, and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale for every fractional part of an acre.

In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses.

In open sheds used for the above purposes each space of five feet shall be charged for as a stall.

6. For water supplied to cricket and bowling clubs, sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the first day of January 1888, and ending on the thirty-first day of December 1888, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the first of January and on the first of July 1888. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time approve of for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, and receive, and collect, and recover the said rate.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF ROTHESAY.

WE, George Dodd, James Dennis, Patrick Larkin, Frederick Powell, Charles John Wallace, Alexander McIntosh, and William Andrew Drummond, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved, by Order of 21st November 1887, as a site for Public Recreation in the parish of Rothesay, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

 6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
 7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
 8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding (£10).

BYE-LAW No. 8.

For the protection of fish, made by the Shire Council of Rodney on the 26th day of March 1888.

1st. That no person shall use in any tank, dam, water reserve, running stream, or other water-right under the control of this municipality, any net, implement, device, or contrivance fixed to the soil, or made stationary in any way or manner for the purpose of taking fish.

5th. That all persons catching any fish in the said places under four ounces in weight shall forthwith return the same to the water whence it was taken.

6th. That no person shall remove or take away, or cause to be removed from the said places, any ova or spawn without the consent of the council of the shire of Rodney being first obtained.

7th. That no person shall angle for, or by any other means endeavour to take, fish from the said places on any Sunday.

8th. That each and every violation of this bye-law shall be deemed an offence, and for every such offence a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) shall be inflicted.

BACCHUS MARSH RACECOURSE RESERVE.

REGULATIONS.

WE, Molesworth Richard Greene, William Hamilton McFarland, Thomas Cain, James Elijah Crook, Christopher Crisp, and John Simpson, junior, the duly appointed Trustees of the reserve for a racecourse and other purposes of public recreation in the parish of Parwan, being allotment one of section two, and allotment twenty of section one, and known as "The Bacchus Marsh Racecourse Reserve," have, in pursuance of the provisions of *The Land Act 1834* and of the powers contained in the grant issued by the Crown in respect of the same, framed and hereby publish the following regulations for the maintenance, use, care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon:—

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission in writing of the trustees first obtained.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, sheep, horses, or pigs, without the permission in writing of the trustees first obtained.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission in writing of the trustees first obtained.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale, nor shall bring into the reserve for the purpose of sale, or sell therein, any article without the permission in writing of the trustees first obtained.

8. No person except labourers or workmen employed in the reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. No person shall erect any circus or other tent, merry-go-round, or any kind or sort of stand in the reserve, or be allowed to conduct or carry on any game for profit in or upon the reserve, without the permission in writing of the trustees first obtained.

10. No person shall without the like permission enter the reserve for the purpose of occupying, residing in, or sleeping in any of the buildings or other erections thereon, or the enclosures surrounding them.

11. No person shall carry on the business of a bookmaker within the enclosure called or known as "The Grand Stand Reserve," except in the portion thereof set apart for that purpose, nor until he shall have complied with the following conditions:—

First. That he be approved of by the committee of the Bacchus Marsh Racing Club, and registered by the Victorian Racing Club.

Second. That he pay to the committee of the Bacchus Marsh Racing Club, in advance, an annual fee of £2 2s.

Third. That during the time he shall be in or upon the portion of the said enclosure so set apart as aforesaid, he shall wear a badge upon his right arm, to be supplied by the said committee, which badge shall be visible to the public, and shall have engraved or written thereupon his name and address.

12. No person shall carry on the business of a bookmaker within the enclosure called or known as "The Outside Reserve," except in the portion thereof set apart for that purpose, nor until he shall have complied with the following conditions:—

First. That he be approved of by the committee of the Bacchus Marsh Racing Club, and registered by the Victorian Racing Club.

Second. That he pay to the committee of the Bacchus Marsh Racing Club, in advance, an annual fee of £1 1s.

Third. That during the time he shall be in or upon the portion of the said enclosure so set apart as aforesaid, he shall wear a badge upon his right arm, to be supplied by the committee, which badge shall be visible to the public, and shall have engraved or written thereupon his name and address.

13. No person shall carry on the business of a bookmaker upon any other portion of the said reserve than aforesaid without the permission in writing of the committee first obtained.

14. No person shall smoke upon the Grand Stand or in any portion of the reserve where smoking may from time to time be prohibited by notice in writing posted in such reserve.

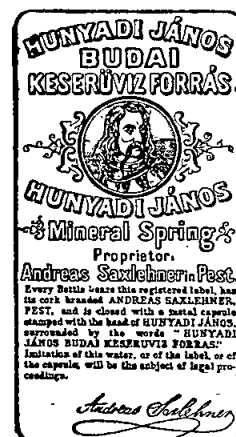
