  2. That none of such females or boys who are paid weekly wages shall be so employed without receiving overtime payment for the extra work they are called upon to perform.

  3. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.

  4. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

Whereas by the Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862, it is enacted that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that the Rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships for the time being in force under the principal Act have been adopted by the Government of any foreign country, and are in force in that country, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by Order in Council to direct that the ships of such foreign country shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their Certificates of Registry or other national papers, and thereupon it shall no longer be necessary for such ships to be re-measured in any port or place in Her Majesty's Dominions, but such ships shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their Certificates of Registry or other papers in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the Certificates of Registry of British ships is to be deemed the tonnage of such ships:

And whereas by the Merchant Shipping Act 1876 it is enacted that "where Her Majesty has power, under the Merchant Shipping Act 1854, or any Act passed or hereafter to be passed amending the same, to make an Order in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty from time to time to make such Order in Council, and by Order in Council to revoke, alter, or add to any order so made:"

And whereas it was made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC GARDEN AND WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES IN THE TOWN OF DIGBY.

WE, Angus McDonald, George Lyntone Simkin, and John Wilks, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Garden and Water Supply purposes in the town of Digby, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of The Land Act 1884.

REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

2. No person shall enter or romain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the trees or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any service, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of The Land Act 1834, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such allift or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

3. All unbranded cattle over six months old found on the said Commons will be considered as trespassing, and will be dealt with accordingly.

4. All cattle depasturing upon the said Commons shall be branded with the distinguishing brand of the said Commons, and cattle not so branded will be impounded.

5. Owners of diseased cattle shall, immediately on receipt of a written notice signed by the Secretary of the Council or other person appointed by the Council for the purpose, remove such cattle from off the said Commons at their own cest, in order that diseased cattle may be kept separate from the herd; and such cattle after removal shall, if they require attendance, be looked after and provided for by their owners. The carcases of cattle dying on the said Commons shall be, at their owner's expense, removed, burned, or buried.

6. Fees as follow shall be paid half-yearly in advance, commencing on the first day of May and the first day of November in each year, viz.:—Large catrle, three shillings per head per annum; small cattle, one shilling and sixpence per head per annum.




