PROCLAMATION

TONNAGE MEASUREMENT OF VESSELS OF THE KINGDOM OF THE NETHERLANDS.

THE following copy of an Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, respecting the tonnage measurement of Vessels of the Kingdom of the Netherlands, is published for general information.

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the *Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1902*, it is enacted that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that the Rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships for the time being in force under the principal Act have been adopted by the Government of any foreign country, and are in force in that country, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by Order in Council to direct that the ships of such foreign country shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their Certificates of Registry or other national papers, and thereupon it shall no longer be necessary for such ships to be re-measured in any port or place in Her Majesty's Dominions, but such ships shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their Certificates of Registry or other papers in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the Certificates of Registry of British ships is to be deemed the tonnage of such ships:

And whereas by the *Merchant Shipping Act 1876* it is enacted that "where Her Majesty has power, under the *Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, or any Act passed or hereafter to be passed amending the same, to make an Order in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty from time to time to make such Order in Council, and by Order in Council to revoke, alter, or add to any order so made:"

And whereas it was made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships in force under the *Merchant Shipping Act 1854* had been adopted by the Government of His Majesty the King of the Netherlands, with the exception of a difference in the mode in certain steamers of estimating the allowance for engine-room, and such rules were in force in that country, and came into operation on the 1st day of January 1876:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 26th day of October, 1875, Her Majesty was pleased to direct as follows:—

1. As regards sailing ships, that merchant sailing ships of the said Kingdom of the Netherlands, the measurement whereof should, after the said 1st day of January 1876, have been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such sailing ships, testified by the date thereof, should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers and other national papers in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the Certificate of Registry of British sailing ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships.
2. As regards steamships, that merchant ships belonging to the said Kingdom of the Netherlands which are propelled by steam or any other power requiring engine-room, the measurement whereof should, after the said 1st day of January 1876, have been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such steamships, testified by the dates thereof, should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted on such registers or other national papers in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the Certificate of Registry of British ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships. Provided nevertheless, that should the owner or master of any such Dutch steamship desire the deduction for engine-room in his ship to be estimated under the rules for engine-room measurement and deduction applicable to British ships instead of under the Dutch rule, the engine-room should be measured and the deduction calculated according to the British rules:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that a new Royal Ordinance, which came into operation on the 6th day of January 1888, stipulates that the owners of Dutch steamships may have the net tonnage of their vessels calculated according to British as well as according to Dutch rules, and shall have issued to them a separate certificate to be used in foreign countries showing the net tonnage calculated according to British rules:

And whereas it has been made to appear desirable to Her Majesty that the provisions of the said recited Order in Council of the 26th day of October 1875 should be revoked, and a new Order in Council made and substituted in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Acts, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that the said recited Order of the 26th day of October 1875 shall be and the same is hereby revoked, and in lieu thereof and in substitution therefor Her Majesty is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct as follows:—

1. As regards sailing ships, that merchant sailing ships of the said Kingdom of the Netherlands, the measurement whereof after the said 1st day of January 1876 has been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such sailing ships, testified by the date thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers and other national papers in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the Certificate of Registry of British sailing ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships.

2. As regards steamships, that merchant ships belonging to the said Kingdom of the Netherlands which are propelled by steam or any other power requiring engine-room, the measurement whereof shall, after the said 1st day of January 1876, have been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such steamships, testified by the dates thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted on such registers or other national papers in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the Certificate of Registry of British ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships. Provided nevertheless, that if the owner or master of any such Dutch steamship desires the deduction for engine-room in his ship to be estimated under the rules for engine-room measurement and deduction applicable to British ships instead of under the Dutch rule, the engine-room shall be measured and the deduction calculated according to the British rules, and that in the event of any such steamship possessing a certificate of tonnage or other national paper issued as aforesaid on or after the 6th day of January 1888, denoting the net registered tonnage of such ship under the British rules, the ship shall be deemed to be of the tonnage so denoted thereon.

DISSOLUTION OF AN UNION UNDER "THE WEIGHTS AND MEASURES STATUTE 1864."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, called *The Weights and Measures Statute 1864*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might, at any time, if he thinks fit, and should, at the request of not less than half the Councils or Boards constituting any Union proclaimed under the said Act, dissolve the same by proclamation: And whereas the Shires of Bairnsdale, Maffra, Rosedale, Avon, Traralgon, and the Borough of Sale were proclaimed an Union on the seventeenth day of October One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five: And whereas the Councils of the Shires of Maffra, Rosedale, and Traralgon, which respectively represent the Shires of Maffra, Rosedale, and Traralgon, have requested that the said Union may be dissolved: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation dissolve the Union of the Shires of Bairnsdale, Maffra, Rosedale, Avon, Traralgon, and the Borough of Sale for the purposes of the said Act.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC GARDEN AND WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES IN THE TOWN OF DIGBY.

WE, Angus McDonald, George Lyntone Simkin, and John Wilks, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Garden and Water Supply purposes in the town of Digby, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the trees or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

Regulation for the management of the undermentioned Commons within the Shire of Maldon, viz.:—The Maldon United Town and Goldfield Common, Bradford Common, Ravenswood Common, Baringrup West Farmers' Common, Baringrup East Loader Downs and Laanecoorie United Farmers' Common, Walmer Farmers' Common, and Muckleford Farmers' Common.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, contained in Part IX., Land Act 1884, the Council of the Shire of Maldon have drafted the following regulations for the management of the above-named Commons in lieu of the regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Commons:—

Regulations.

1. No sheep, entire horse, or bull shall be allowed to depasture or run on the above-named Commons without the written consent of the Managers of the said Commons.

2. Persons wishing to depasture cattle on the said Commons shall forward to the Secretary of the Shire Council, or other person appointed to receive the same, a statement in writing of the correct brands and description of the cattle they intend to depasture.

3. All unbranded cattle over six months old found on the said Commons will be considered as trespassing, and will be dealt with accordingly.

4. All cattle depasturing upon the said Commons shall be branded with the distinguishing brand of the said Commons, and cattle not so branded will be impounded.

5. Owners of diseased cattle shall, immediately on receipt of a written notice signed by the Secretary of the Council or other person appointed by the Council for the purpose, remove such cattle from off the said Commons at their own cost, in order that diseased cattle may be kept separate from the herd; and such cattle after removal shall, if they require attendance, be looked after and provided for by their owners. The carcasses of cattle dying on the said Commons shall be, at their owner's expense, removed, burned, or buried.

6. Fees as follow shall be paid half-yearly in advance, commencing on the first day of May and the first day of November in each year, viz.:—Large cattle, three shillings per head per annum; small cattle, one shilling and sixpence per head per annum.

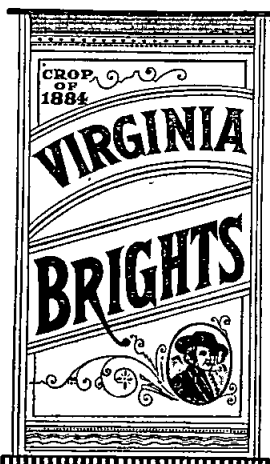
