Harbour and Shore Lights. Buoyage.

WITH reference to "Notice to Mariners," Batavia, 5th January 1887, notice is hereby given of the amended particulars of the undermentioned lights, which will be exhibited in the night of the 31st December next on the east coast of Sumatra.

## Harbour Lights:

a. A fixed red light of the sixth order on the beach at the left shore of the Langkat River.

## Shore Lights:

a. A red lamp, hoisted from a stake on the beach, at the right shore of the Serdang River.

b. Two white lamps, placed vertically, hoisted from a stake in a kampong, visible from seaward, at the right shore of the Bedagei River.

c. A fixed red light in a fisher kampong, visible from seaward, at the left shore of the Padang River.

d. Two white lamps, placed vertically, hoisted from a stake near the Custom House, at the right shore of the Pagarawan River.

e. A red lamp, hoisted from a stake near the Custom House, on the beach at the right shore of the Si Pareh-Pareh River.

f. A fixed white light, on wooden structure in the kampong Besar, at the left shore of the Asahan River.

The intended 6th order harbour light of the Deli River, will probably be exhibited in the beginning of the year 1888.

## Buoyage:

The inlets of the Langkat, Deli, Asahan, and Panei Rivers, as also the entrance of the Kompa Bay, are respectively marked by 16, 12, 10, 10, and 10 small iron nunbuys, as usual painted white and black. Besides a black H. B. buoy, outer buoy, with the name of the place painted on it, is moored in 5 fathoms water before each of the entrances of the rivers and of the Kompa Bay.

On the north and south edge of the Boenja-banks a H. B. buoy is moored, with the word "Boenja-banken" painted on it in white letters.

The first one is white and black, vertically; the other horizontally striped.

Due notice will be given of the exact bearings of the outer buoys and of the two last-mentioned buoys.

## 1. Intended exhibition of light on the Brill shoal, Java Sea.

Notice is hereby given that in the course of the month December next a fourth order F. and Fl. light (showing a fixed white light and every 30 seconds a flash, preceded and succeeded by a short eclipse) will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on the S.W. edge of the Brill shoal.

The light illuminates entire horizon at a distance respectively of at least 6 and 14 miles for the fixed light and for the flashes.

The structure is of iron, and has the shape of a truncated regular octagonal pyramid, surrounded by three balconies.

The height of the light above high water is 68 feet, and the total height of the lighthouse 75.5 feet.

## 2. Intended exhibition of light on the W. point of the island Sapodi.

It is intended to exhibit, in the beginning of the year 1888, a fixed second order white light from a recently-erected lighthouse on the west point of the island Sapodi; it will illuminate the entire horizon at a distance of at least 20 miles.

The tower is a cylinder of cast iron, supported by eight cross-beams of drawn iron, giving the whole the appearance of a truncated regular octagonal pyramid.

The height of the light is 192.2 feet, and the total height of the structure 205 feet, whilst the height above the base is respectively 179 and 191.9 feet.

## REGULATION No. 3.

*Alteration and amendment of Clause 6 of Regulation No. 2, relating to sale of water for irrigation purposes.*

THE Commissioners of the Loddon United Water Trust, in pursuance of powers conferred by section 44 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, do hereby alter and amend clause 6 of regulation No. 2, made by them; and approved by the Governor in Council on the 1st of November 1886, as published in the *Government Gazette* of the 5th of November 1886, page 3117; and clause 6 of regulation No. 2, as altered and amended shall, in place of that published in the *Government Gazette* of the 5th of November 1886, read as follows:—

The rates or prices to be paid for water taken from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes shall be—  
For water that can be taken by gravitation, Sixpence per inch per acre.

For water that any person will have to raise by lift, pump, &c.:

To a height of Four feet, Fivepence per inch per acre.

To a height of from Four to Eight feet, Fourpence per inch per acre.

To a height of from Eight to Twelve feet, Threepence per inch per acre.

To any height exceeding Twelve feet, Twopence per inch per acre.

The foregoing alteration and amendment was made by the Commissioners of the Loddon United Water Trust, under and by virtue of section 44 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, this 19th day of November 1887.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. Telegrams will not be entertained.

Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise directed by the police; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Botanic and Domain Gardens may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September 1888, and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

###### BYE-LAW No. 4.

*A Bye-law of the Shire of Oakleigh made under the 213th Section of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered Four, for the Suppression of the Nuisance occasioned by Cattle wandering on the roads of this Shire.*

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," and "The Local Government Act Amendment Act 1883" the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Oakleigh order as follows:—

1st. That from and after the date of this bye-law coming into operation if any cattle shall be found upon any land not being a common, and such that there is no fence whether upon the same land or any other dividing such first-mentioned land from any street or road, whether public or private, without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and the proper officer of the council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody; and any Justice, if such owner be not known upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form addressed to such owner, as "Owner" only, without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood, may, after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear then as in other cases; and the Justice may order the cattle to be sold, and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the Justice, of seizing keeping and selling the said cattle, shall be paid if demanded within one month to the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded then to the Municipal fund; and if the said money shall not be sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner, if and when known, in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by Justices are to be recovered.

2nd. If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings, and if such cattle shall by reason of having been so found at large have been impounded by the Council the amount of such penalty and costs, if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper, shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle shall not be sufficient after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs shall have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle, the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by Justices are by law to be recovered. And if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known, then the provisions of the last preceding section so far as necessary to give the adjudicating Justice jurisdiction shall apply.

*A Bye-Law of the Shire of Oakleigh, made under section 213 of the Local Government Act 1874, and numbered five, for regulating traffic through and over the roads and streets of the shire, and for preserving order therein.*

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Oakleigh order as follows:—

1st. Where a number of persons congregate together on any street or footpath, or any street musician or vocalist, they shall, when required so to do by any member of the police force, or by any householder or his servant, disperse from such street or footpath, or depart from the neighborhood of the premises of such householder.

2nd. No procession of persons or of vehicles or both, for other than funeral purposes, shall parade or pass through any of the streets or roads unless with the previous consent, in writing, of the President, or, in his absence, the Secretary of the Shire, and only by the route specified in such consent, nor unless and until the recipient of such consent shall have given at least twenty-four hours' notice, with particulars, of such consent and route to the officer in charge at the police station.

3rd. Whenever, for the prevention of accident or the maintenance of order and for such time as by notice in writing under the hand or by direction of the President, or in his absence, or the case of sudden emergency, under the hand of the Shire Secretary, or the officer in charge stationed at Oakleigh, any carriage-way, foot-way, street, or other public place shall be declared to be closed against traffic of vehicles or persons or both, the drivers of vehicles and all persons contemplated by such notice shall, when so required by any member of the police force, obey and conform to such notice by abstaining from going or by withdrawing and removing from where mentioned therein. And the drivers of all vehicles, whether private or public, which may



be there, whether plying for hire on any appointed stand or otherwise, shall, when so required by any member of the police force, remove their vehicles thence, and if desiring to remain in the vicinity, shall proceed to any other carriage-way, street, or public place which may be indicated by the police for that purpose, and there arrange and order their vehicles in the manner directed by any member of the police force.
