The births of 1,377 children, viz., 686 boys and 691 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of June: In the month of May 1,326 births were registered, or 51 less than in the month under review. The births were 454 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 216 above that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in June numbered 630, viz., 345 of males and 285 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 747, or 119 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in May by 31, but exceeded the average of June during the previous ten years by 166. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by 46 only.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.52, and of deaths registered 1.61.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 66.9° on the 29th, and the lowest was 36.2° on the 27th. The mean temperature of the month (52.0°) exceeded the above average by over 3 degrees. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (23.9°) took place on the 27th, viz., from a maximum of 60°1 to a minimum of 36°2. The least range (47°) was on the 19th, viz., from a maximum of 50°2 to a minimum of 51°5. The nean daily range was 12.0°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30°497 inches on the 27th, and the lowest was 29°383 inches on the 19th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29°999 inches) was slightly below the average.

Rain fell on 13 days, the amount of rainfall being 1 19 inches. The average rainfall in June during the previous ten years 206 inches, or nearly an inch (87) above that in the month under notice. Fog prevailed on 2 days during the month.

Males contributed 55 per cent., and females 45 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 34 per cent. to that mortality, as against 33 per cent. in June 1887, 30 per cent. in June 1885, 32 per cent. in June 1884, 28 per cent. in June 1883, 35 per cent. in June 1882, 32 per cent. in June 1884, 36 per cent. in June 1880, 27 per cent. in June 1879, and 20 per cent. in June 1878.

Twenty-eight deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month: Of these, a female, aged 76, died of apoplexy; a female servant (an immate of the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor), aged 75, and a female, aged 76, of paralysis; a tinsmith, aged 76, of phthisis; a minister of religion, aged 76, of uramia; a female (an immate of the Benevolent Asylum), aged 76, another female, aged 76, and a female, aged 77; of bronchitis; a laborer (a patient in the Kew Lunation Benevolent Asylum), aged 76, of the brain and heart; a mason (an immate of the Benevolent Asylum), aged 76, of semile gangrene; a female, aged 78, a sailor, aged 79, and a farmer, aged 85, of disease of the heart; a bootmaker, aged 79, of hemplegia and congestion of the lungs; a soldier, aged 82, of disease of the liver; a gentleman, aged 82, of injuries sustained through being run over by a butcher's cart; a farmer, aged 87, of paraplegia; a female, aged 92, was burnt to death; and a horse-dealer (an immate of the Benevolent Asylum), aged 76, a butcher, aged 78, a clockmaker, aged 80, a blacksmith and 2 females (one an immate of the Benevolent Asylum), each aged 82, a gentleman, aged 88, a female, aged 89, and a miner, aged 91, died of old age.

Twenty-seven deaths were ascribed to external causes, of which twenty-two were set down to accident, three to homicide, and two to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A laborer, aged 26, died of concussion of the brain, occasioned by falling from a ladder; a carter, aged 27, and a laborer, aged 66, of fracture of the skull, caused, the one by falling down stairs whilst intoxicated, the other by falling into a quarry; a carter, aged 23, of injuries received from a stone projected by a blast; a laborer, aged 37, was crushed to death, a piece of timber falling on him; a laborer, aged 52, died of injuries consequent on being thrown from a spring cart; a boy, aged 6, a cab-driver, aged 25, and a gentleman, aged 82, of injuries resulting from being passed over by vehicles; and three laborer, aged 29, 48, and 55 years respectively, from being passed over by railway trains. A male child, aged 1, died of burns; a laborer, aged 42, of delirum tremens, complicated by a shock received by burns; and a female, aged 92, was burnt to death in a conflagration. Two male infants, aged 2 weeks and 1 month respectively, were overlain; and a female, aged 24, and a plastorer, aged 34, were suffected, the latter whilst intoxicated; 2 male infants and 1 female infant, all under 1 month died of umbilical hemmorrhage. The homicidal deaths were those of 2 male infants and 1 female infant, who were smothered at or shortly after birth. Of the suicidal deaths—a baker, aged 67, cut his throat; and a carter, aged 39, hanged himself, the latter whilst laboring under temporary insanity.

One hundred and thirty-four deaths, or 21 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—56 in the Melbourne Hospital, 16 in the Alfred Hospital, 4 in the Homocopathic Hospital, 5 in the Children's Hospital, 3 in the Women's Hospital, 9 in the Immigrants' Home, 16 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 9 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Austin Hospital, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Protestant Refuge, 1 in the Infant Asylum, 2 in the Couvent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 215, of which 126, or 59 per cent., were of males, and 89, or 41 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 150 were under one year of age, 27 were between one and two, 20 were between two and three, 2 were between three and four, and 16 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 415. Of these, 219, or 53 per cent., were males, and 196, or 47 per cent., were females; 23 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between fifteen and twenty, 29 were between twenty and twenty-five, 49 were between twenty-five and thirty, 32 were between thirty and thirty-five and 82 were between forty and forty, 28 were between forty and forty, 20 were between forty and fifty-five, 29 were between fifty and sixty, 36 were between sixty and sixty-five, 22 were between sixty-five and seventy, 24 were between seventy and seventy-five, 15 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 13 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the previous month, deaths from specific febrile or zymotic diseases decreased from 70 to 57. Under this head, deaths from diphtheria fell from 19 to 16, but the chief decrease was in deaths from typhoid fever and diarrhoad diseases, which fell from 32 to 20 and from 12 to 6 respectively. As many as 16 deaths of child-bearing women occurred during the month, which is the largest number ever registered in the district during a similar period. Nine of these were caused by puerperal fever, and the remainder by other circumstances attendant on child-birth. If the total number be compared with that of the births registered during the same period, it will be found that 1 death of a mother took place to every 86 children born alive.

WHEREAS by the Mining Statute 1865 it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make regulations, not being contrary to the provisions of the said Act, for the purposes mentioned in the forty-third section thereof, and such regulations from time to time to alter, add to, or rescind: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby alter the Regulations relating to mineral leases in so far only as they relate to the form of lease to be issued under such Regulations as set out in Schedule E thereto, and doth revoke the existing form of lease, and doth order that the form hereto subjoined be substituted therefor, that is to say:—
