#### THE FEDERAL COUNCIL OF AUSTRALASIA.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander in Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS a Bill intituled "A Bill to regulate the Pearl Shell and Beche-de-mer Fisheries in Australasian Waters adjacent to the Colony of Queensland," passed by the Federal Council of Australasia at a session (being the second session thereof) held in the colony of Tasmania, was reserved by His Excellency the Governor of the colony of Tasmania for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure, in pursuance of the provisions of an Act of the Imperial Parliament passed in the forty-eighth and forty-ninth years of Her Majesty's Reign, chapter 60, intituled An Act to constitute a Federal Council of Australasia: And whereas by an Order of the Queen in Council made on the 3rd day of May One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, a copy whereof is hereunto appended, Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the said Bill: And whereas in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act of the Imperial Parliament the said Bill (now intituled An Act to Regulate the Pearl Shell and Beche-de-mer Fisheries in Australasian Waters adjacent to the Colony of Queensland) has been proclaimed in the Government Gazette of the said colony of Tasmania, and has been by the Governor thereof transmitted to me: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Brougham Loch, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c., do, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act of the Imperial Parliament, proclaim that the said Act has received the assent of Her Majestv.

Given under my hand and the seal of the colony, at Melbourne, this sixteenth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and in the fifty-second year of Her Majesty's reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the 48th and 49th years of Her Majesty's reign, entitled An Act to constitute a Federal Council of Australasia, it is amongst other things enacted that:—

Saving Her Majesty's prerogative, and subject to the provisions therein contained with respect to the operation of the said Act, the Federal Council thereby constituted have legislative authority in respect to the several matters therein mentioned, including fisheries in Australasian waters beyond territorial limits; and that every Bill in respect of such fisheries shall, unless proviously approved by Her Majesty through one of Her Principal Secretaries of State, be reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure.

And it is by the said Act further enacted, that a Bill reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure shall not have any force unless and until within one year from the day on which it was presented to the Governor for Her Majesty's assent, and such Governer signifies, by message to the Council, or by proclamation, published as last aforesaid, that is has received the assent of Her Majesty.

And whereas a certain Bill passed at a Session held in the colony of Tasmania by the said Federal Council, entitled An Act to regulate the Pearl Shell and Beche-de-mer Fisheries in Australusian Waters adjacent to the Colony of Queensland was presented to the Governor of the said colony of Tasmania for Her Majesty's assent:

And whereas the said Bill was reserved by the said Governor for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon:

And whereas the said Bill so reserved as aforesaid has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and it is expedient that the said Bill should be assented to by Her Majesty;

Now therefore Her Majesty, in pursuance of the said Act, and in exercise of the power thereby reserved to Her Majesty as aforesaid, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, declare Her assent to the said Bill.

AN ACT to regulate the Pearl Shell and Beehe-de-mer Fisheries in Australasian Waters adjacent to the Colony of Queensland.

[Reserved, 20 January 1888; Queen's Assent proclaimed, 19 July 1888.]

Preamble.

Whereas by certain Acts of the Parliament of the colony of Queensland provision has been made for regulating the Pearl Shell and Beche-de-mer Fisheries in the territorial waters of that colony. And whereas, by reason of the geographical position of many of the Islands forming portion of that colony, vessels employed in such Fisheries are, in the prosecution of their business, sometimes within and sometimes beyond the territorial jurisdiction of Queensland: And whereas it is expedient that the provisions of the said Acts should extend and apply to such vessels during all the time during which they are so employed, and that for that purpose the provisions of the said Acts, so far as they are applicable to extra-territorial waters, should be extended to such waters by an Act of the Federal Council of Australasia:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Federal Council of Australasia, assembled at Hobart, in the colony of Tasmania, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as The Queensland Pearl Shell and Beche-de-mer Fisheries (Extra-territorial) Act of 1853, and shall commence and take effect on and from the date of Her Majesty's assent thereto being proclaimed in Queensland.

2. In this Act the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, have the meanings set against them respectively, that is to say—

"Australasian waters adjacent to Queensland"—All Australasian waters within the limits described in the Schedule to this Act, exclusive of waters within the territorial jurisdiction of the colony of

"Ship"—Any vessel used in navigation or in fishing, and not being a boat as defined by this Act;

"Boat"—Any vessel used in navigation or in fishing, and not being a boat as defined by this Act;

"Carried on board of a ship, or attached to a ship;

"Master" or "Employer"—Any person other than a pilot who is for the time being in command or in charge of any ship or boat, or who is in charge of any Fishory as hereinafter defined;

"Native Labourer"—Any aboriginal native of Australia or New Guinca, or of any of the islands adjacent thereto respectively;

"Polynesian"—Any native of Fiji or New Caledonia or of any of the Loyalty, New Hebrides, Banks, or Solonon groups of Islands, or of any island in the Pacific Ocean not being in Her Majesty's Dominions, nor within the jurisdiction of any civilised power;

"Pearl Shell and Beche-de-mer Fishery" or 'Tho Fishery"—The business of diving for, collecting, preparing, storing, or carrying to or from any place within the colony of Queensland or its dependencies, pearl oysters or pearl oyster-shells, or the sea-slug commonly called beche-de-mer, or any other fish or shell of the like kind which the Governor of Queensland in Council may here after by proclamation published in the Queensland Government Gazette declare to be within the provisions of this Act.

3. Every ship and boat shall be deemed to be engaged in the Pearl Shell and Beche-de-mer Fishery, if she is used as a depot or place of lodging or refuge for persons employed in such Fishery, or for storing provisions for tho use of persons employed in such Fishery, or for storing provisions for the use of persons employed in such Fishery, or for storing provisions for the vest of persons employed in such Fishery, or for storing provisions for the use of persons employed in such Fishery, or for store pearl oyster-

then the ship or boat, together with all her tackle, apparel, furniture, and cargo shall be forrested to the Majesty.

6. It shall be lawful for any Police Majistrate or officer of Customs or Police of the said colony to seize and take any ship or boat which is found employed in the Fishery in Australasian waters adjacent to Queensland without being licensed as required by this Act, and to take any ship or boat so seized, or any ship or boat seized and taken under the provisions of the said recited Acts, to any port of Queensland, and to detain the same until a prosecution for breach of this Act or the said recited Acts is heard and determined.

7. Every ship or boat engaged in the Fishery in Australasian waters adjacent to Queensland shall keep her name, and the number of her licence, prefixed by the letters No., painted in letters and figures of not less than three inches in length in the case of boats, and of not less than six inches in length in the case of ships, in white upon a black ground, or black upon a white ground, on each side of her bow above the water-line during the whole time her licence remains in force.

If any ship or boat is found engaged in the Fishery in Australasian waters adjacent to Queensland without her name and the number of her licence painted as herein prescribed, the master or owner thereof shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. If the master of any licensed ship or boat refuses to produce the licence of such ship or boat when required so to do by any Police Magistrate or officer of Customs or Police of the said colony, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

9. Every person in charge of a ship engaged in the Fishery in Australasian waters adjacent to Queensland who is not required to hold a certificate of competency under the laws of that colony must hold a licence permitting him to be so employed; and if any such person is found in charge of a ship so engaged without being so licensed, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

10. Every such person in charge of a ship engaged in the Fishery in Australasian waters adjacent to Queensland who fails to show his licence when called upon to do so by any Police Magistrate or officer of Customs or Police of the said colony shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

11. It shall not be lawful for any master or other person to employ any seaman or other person in the Fishery in Australasian waters adjacent to Queensland unless under a written agreement recorded in some Custom House or shipping office of the said colony, or to discharge any such seaman or other person except in the presence of an officer of Customs or shipping master of the said colony.

If any master or other person in Australasian waters adjacent to Queensland employs any seaman or other person in the Fishery, or discharges any seaman or other person so employed, contrary to the provisions of this Act, or fails to produce the agreement when required so to do by a Police Magistrate or officer of Customs or Police of the said colony, he shall be imployed or carried on board of any ship or boat engaged in the Fishery in Australasian waters adjacent to Queensland unless he is carried on ship's articles in like manner as a seaman, and has been engaged to serve in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the Parliament of Queensland passed in the forty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign, and styled The Native Labourers' Protection Act of 1884.

Every native labourer employed on board of, or in connexion with, a ship or boat engaged in the Fishery in Australasian waters adjacent to Queensland, whether he was engaged before or is engaged after the commencement of this Act, shall be discharged and receive his wages in the presence of a shipping master of the said colony.

If the master or owner of any such ship or hoat, of any other person, in Australasian waters adjacent to Queensland, discharges a native labourer who has been employed on board of any such ship or boat, or pays his wages, otherwise than as is herein provided, be shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

15. All deaths and desertions of Polynesians or native labourers employed in the Fishery which occur in Polynesians or native labourers to Queensland shall be forthwith reported by the master or employer of such Polynesians or native labourers to the principal officer of Customs of the said colony at the port nearest to the place where such deaths or desertions have occurred; and if any master or employer fails to make any such report as aforesaid, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds or less than Five pounds.

16. All offences against the provisions of this Act may be heard and determined by any Police Magistrate or two Justices of the colony of Queensland, in accordance with the laws of that colony regulating summary proceedings before Justices, and any such Police Magistrate or Justices shall for that purpose have power to hear with respect to which or in connection with which the offence was committed is found, or at any place in the said colony appointed for holding Courts of Petty Sessions, and to make such orders for the safe keeping, detention, seizure, forfeiture, or sale of any such ship or boat, and all things found therein, as such Police Magistrate or Justices may think fit.

13. If any person thinks himself aggrieved by any determination or adjudication of any Police Magistrate or Justices with respect to any penalty or forfeiture under the provisions of this Act, he may appeal to the Supreme appeals from Justices.

14. In any person thinks himself aggrieved by any determination that any person named therein is a Polynesian or a native labou

#### TOWNSHIP PROCLAIMED UNDER "THE LAND ACT 1884."

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Henny Brougham Loch, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

MEREAS by The Land Act 1884 (No. 812, sec. 73) it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor might from time to time, by a notice in the Government Gazette, proclaim as a street or road or as a township any portion or portions of Crown lands, and the lands in such township, or within any city, town, or brough proclaimed before the passing of the said Act should be sold by auction in the manner therein provided for the sale of Crown lands by public auction, and the lands upon which such street or road have been proclaimed should be and be deemed to be thenceforward dedicated to the public: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim as a township the portion of Crown land hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

A Bye-law of the United Shire of Beechworth, made under section 213 of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 12, for the adoption of certain of the provisions of the Thirteenth Schedule to "The Local Government Act 1874."

In Pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the United Shire of Beechworth order as follows:—
The following provisions of the Thirteenth Schedule to "The Local Government Act 1874," that is to say, Part VIII.; subdivision 1; clauses 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8, shall be and the same are hereby adopted to be in force within the United Shire of Beechworth.

Part VIII. Nuscione.

PART VIII .- NUISANCES, ETC.

(1.) Nuisances of various kinds.

1. Keeper of goats to register name and address.—Every owner or keeper of any goat usually kept within the municipal district shall register with the municipal clerk his name and address as a keeper of goats, and shall at the time of such registration pay to such clerk the sum of Silvpence, and shall place and keep upon the neck of every goat so owned and kept a collar bearing the name and address so registered; and if any person shall without lawful excuse offend in any respect against this section he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

2. Goats to be presumed to be kept by persons named on collar.—
If any goat shall be found having on its neck a collar purporting
to bear the name and address of a person registered as aforesaid,
such goat shall primā facie be presumed to be owned and kept by

to bear the name and address of a person registered as aforesaid, such goat shall prima facie be presumed to be owned and kept by such person.

3. Place for custody of goats scized hereunder.—The council from time to time shall provide one secure enclosure for the keeping and custody of goats for the purposes of this subdivision, and forthwith when any such enclosure shall have been provided shall notify the same and the situation thereof in some newspaper generally circulating in the neighbourbood.

4. Goats at large may be scized.—Every goat found at large in any street road or public place may by the proper officer of the council be forthwith seized and confined in such enclosure as aforesaid until dealt with as hereinafter provided.

5. Notice of scizure to registered owner.—Whenever a goat having on the neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of a person resident within the municipal district registered as aforesaid shall be scized hereunder, the proper officer of the council shall forthwith cause notice of such scizure to be given to such person or left at the place of such address.

6. Goats scized may be destroyed after certain time.—Subject to the provisions hereinafter in this byo-law contained, every goat so scized and confined as aforesaid, which shall not have upon the neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of some person registered as aforesaid, may by the proper officer of the council be destroyed at or after incon of the day following the day of such scizure, and every such goat which shall have on the neck such a collar as aforesaid may by the said officer be destroyed at or after incon of the day following the destroyed at or after noon of the day following the destroyed at or after noon of the day following the address of such scizure, and every such goat which shall have on the neck a collar as aforesaid may by the said officer be destroyed at or after noon of the day following the day of such scizure.

7. Owner may apply to a justice to have goat restored; but the restoration shall be conclusive as to his liabilities as owner.—The owner of any goat which shall have been seized as aforesaid may apply ex parte to any justice that such goat be restored to such owner, and such goat shall, if a justice shall so order and not otherwise, be, unless the same has been destroyed, restored to such owner accordingly, and such order of a justice or any minute thereof under the hand of such justice shall for all purposes of this subdivision be conclusive evidence that the person so applying was the owner of such goat.

8. Owners of all goats found at large to be liable to penalty.—The owner, whether registered hereunder or not, of every goat found at large in any street road or public place shall, whether such goat be destroyed or not or be restored or not, forfeit and pay a penalty of Five shillings.
