NEW HEBRIDES AND LEEWARD ISLANDS OF TAHITI.

Downing street, 10th July 1888.
With reference to the Convention relative to the New Hebrides, signed at Paris on the 16th of November, copies of which accompanied my despatch of the 3rd of December last, I have the honor to transmit to you copies of the Declaration signed on the 30th of May for the abrogation of the Declaration of the 19th of June 1847, between Great Britain and France concerning the Islands to the leeward of Tahiti.

It may be convenient that I should transmit to you at the same time an extract from the Note Verbale of the 24th of October 1885, communicated by M. de Freycinet to Lord Lyons, relating to trade and convicts in those islands, which is referred to in Article V. of the Convention of the 16th of November.

I would also refer you to the Parliamentary Paper [C. 5256], 1888, "Agreement between the British and French Governments relative to the New Hebrides, 1887 and 1888," of which copies have already been forwarded to you.

DECLARATION FOR THE ABOGATION OF THE DECLARATION OF THE 19TH JUNE 1847, BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND FRANCE CONCERNING THE ISLANDS TO THE LEEWARD OF TAHITI.

Article V. of the Convention of the 16th November 1887, relative to the New Hebrides and the islands to the leeward of Tahiti, having stipulated that the Government of Her Britannic Majesty will proceed to abrogate the Declaration of the 19th June 1847, between Great Britain and France respecting the group of islands to the leeward of Tahiti, as soon as the French military posts shall have been withdrawn from the New Hebrides, the two Governments, after having made certain that the posts were withdrawn on the 15th March 1888, declare that at that date the above-mentioned Declaration ceased to exist, and that it remains null and void.

In witness whereof Her Britannic Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary at Paris, and the Minister of Foreign Affairs of the French Republic, have signed this Declaration, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.
Done in duplicate at Paris the 30th day of May 1888.

Extract of Note Verbale of the 24th October 1885, communicated by M. de Freycinet to Lord Lyons, referred to in Article V. of the above Convention.

The French Government willingly renew to Her Majesty's Government the assurance that the system of Customs which will be established in the islands to the leeward of Tahiti on the No. 83.—SEPTEMBER 14, 1888.—1.

day on which French authority shall have been definitely established there shall in no respect differ from that actually in operation in Tahiti itself, and that British subjects shall enjoy in them the same treatment as that extended to its own citizens.

Moreover, M. de Freycinet has no difficulty in declaring that the Government of the Republic has no intention of departing, in regard to Raiatea and the islands adjacent, from the course which it has hitherto pursued respecting the transportation of convicts to its Tahitian possessions.

NOTE.—During the second quarter of 1888 the excess of registered births over registered deaths was 5,013, viz., 2,340 males and 2,673 females; and the excess of recorded arrivals over recorded and unrecorded departures (the latter being estimated) was 8,133, viz., 5,004 males and 3,129 females. The total gain to the population was thus 13,146, viz., 7,344 males and 5,802 females, as shown in the table.

The total allowance for unrecorded departures since the census of 1881 was taken has been 38,804, viz., 30,962 males and 7,842 females. Had no such allowance been made, the apparent population at the end of June would have been 1,099,223, viz., 595,281 males and 503,942 females.

The increase of population during the second quarter of last year was 6,598, or only about half that in the second quarter of the present year (13,146). The increase during the first six months of last year was 16,063, or only about two-thirds of that during the first six months of the current year (24,300). It should, however, be pointed out that the larger increases during 1888 are partly due to the influx of persons connected with, and of visitors to, the Melbourne Centennial International Exhibition.

The total excess of recorded arrivals over recorded departures during the quarter under review was 9,392, the greatest gain to the population being from New South Wales (3,552), the next from New Zealand (2,911), then from Tasmania (1,879), the United Kingdom (942), and South and Western Australia (141). On the other hand, there was a loss of 34 by excess of departures for, over arrivals from, foreign countries. All the arrivals and departures referred to are by sea.

TRAMWAYS IN THE BOROUGH OF NORTHCOTE.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act Amendment Act 1887* it is provided that tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except the municipal districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Richmond, South Melbourne, Hotham, St. Kilda, Brunswick, Kew, Hawthorn, and Sandridge) when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf upon the application of the council of the municipality in compliance with the provisions of the said Act, and of the Rules and Regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Borough of Northcote has made an application, under the Common Seal of the said municipality, in accordance with the said Act, and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder, for an Order by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of a tramway in the Municipal District of the Municipality of the said Borough of Northcote: And whereas the Governor in Council, being satisfied that the requirements of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder have been duly complied with by the said council of the said municipality, and that notice of the intention of the said council to make the said application, in which notice the routes proposed to be followed were described, and persons objecting to the same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the regulations, has been duly published as required by the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council in pursuance of the said Act in that behalf, and that no objections to the said application have been lodged within the time provided in the said rules, and being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same, subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth, for the purpose aforesaid, make the Order following, that is to say:—

That the Council of the Municipality of the Borough of Northcote shall be and is hereby authorized to construct a tramway in the Municipal District of the Borough of Northcote.

Routes.—That the route of such tramway shall be as follows:—Commencing at the Merri Creek Bridge and extending northerly along High street to the northern boundary of the borough.

Works at intersection of railway hereafter constructed.—That in the event of any railway being hereafter constructed by the Victorian Railway Commissioners to connect the Outer Circle Railway with the Clifton Hill and Royal Park Railway, the Council of the said Municipality of the Borough of Northcote shall pay the cost of any additional works involved by the construction of the said tramway at any point of intersection thereof with such railway so to be constructed as aforesaid.

Gauge.—That the gauge of such tramway shall be four feet eight and a half inches (4' 8½"), and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications numbered from one (1) to four (4) inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans and specifications are endorsed with a memorandum of the Honorable the Minister of Public Works, identifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be deemed to be as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

Motive power.—That the motive power to be used upon the said tramway shall be a cable or electricity.

Maximum speed.—That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway shall be ten (10) miles in the hour.

Time of completion.—That the tramway shall be completed and open for traffic throughout its entire length within the period of eighteen months from the date of this Order.

Passenger traffic only.—That such tramway shall be used for passenger traffic only.

Necessary precautions for safety of passengers and public to be observed.—That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets or roads upon the route of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the said council of the said municipality.

Stoppages for taking up and setting down passengers.—That for the convenience of the public the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at such points upon the route as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or road or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

Tolls and charges.—That the charges to be made for every passenger upon the said tramway may be but shall not exceed the following, that is to say, for each passenger:—From the Merri Creek Bridge to the terminus, at the northern boundary of the borough, or vice versa, or any lesser distance between, Three-pence.

Governor in Council to be sole judge of breach of Order.—That the Governor in Council shall be the sole judge of the compliance with or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order; and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 26 of the regulations contained in the Second Schedule of the said Act before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided by the regulations in the said schedule.

If upon the report to the Governor in Council by the referee made under the said clause 26 of the regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or non-compliance with or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited or shall cease and determine or shall be suspended, as the Governor in Council shall direct; and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall, in his adjudication, state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Council of the said Municipality of the Borough of Northcote shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets or roads along which the said route is laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.
