## WESTERN PACIFIC.—REGULATIONS BY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER RELATING TO SAMOA.

THE following despatch from Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, and its enclosures, are published for general information.

SIR,

Herewith I have the honor to enclose copies of two Regulations which I have recently made under the provisions of the Western Pacific Order in Council of 1879—No. 2 of 1888, "For the preservation of good order in the town of Apia, Samoa;" and No. 3 of 1888, "To prohibit the supply of dynamite to natives of Samoa."

These Regulations have been rendered necessary by the denunciation of the Imperial German Government of the Convention of the 2nd of November 1879 (whereby the control of the town and district of Apia was entrusted to a Board consisting of the consular representatives of the three treaty powers and of unofficial members nominated by them), and the consequent abrogation of previously existing Regulations of the municipality of Apia.

The Regulations now transmitted for Your Excellency's information are in general conformity with those now enforced by the *de facto* Government of the Islands, which, however, at present exercises no jurisdiction over the subjects of Her Majesty.

### A REGULATION

(Made in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific under the provisions of the Western Pacific Order in Council 1879)

For the preservation of Good Order in the Town and Harbor of Apia, Samoa.

1. *Saving of the power of the Court.*—Nothing in this Regulation contained shall be construed to take away or diminish the power of the High Commissioner's Court to award any punishment which may now be awarded by the Court for any of the offences named in this Regulation.

### INTERPRETATION.

2. *Interpretation clauses.*—The following words and expressions in this Regulation shall have the meaning hereby assigned to

them unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction (that is to say):—

"Apia" shall include the town and district of Apia being the space comprised within the following limits (that is to say)—Commencing at Vaioa passing thence along the coast to the mouth of the Fuluasa River thence up the course of the Fuluasa River to the point at which the Alafalava Road crosses such river thence along the said road to the point where it reaches the river Vaisigano and thence in a straight line to the point of commencement.

"The Harbor" shall include the waters lying between the sea-reef and the coast and bounded on the east and west by lines running north from the British Consulate and from the northern end of Mulinuu Point.

"British Consul" shall mean the senior British Consular Officer at Apia.

"Samoa Government" shall mean such body as is recognised by the British Consul on behalf of Her Majesty as exercising the functions of Government in Apia for the time being.

"Health Officer" shall mean any duly qualified person appointed by the Samoa Government to be Health Officer in Apia.

"Harbor-master" shall mean any duly qualified person appointed by the Samoa Government to perform the duties of Harbor-master in the harbor.

"Street" shall include any road square court alley lane wharf jetty thoroughfare or public passage or highway within the town of Apia.

"Publican" shall mean any British subject keeping a house in Apia for the sale of fermented and spirituous liquors to be consumed on the premises.

"Cattle" shall include horses asses mules kine sheep goats and swine as well as horned cattle.

### PART I.

#### STREETS AND PUBLIC PLACES.

3. *Fast riding or driving—Crossing bridges—Riding without a bridle—Driving cattle without proper assistance—Cricket—Bathing, &c.—Penalty.*—Every British subject who shall in Apia commit any of the following offences:—

- (1.) Ride or drive in any street any cattle or vehicle so as to endanger public safety;
- (2.) Ride or drive over any bridge except at a walking pace;
- (3.) Ride any horse mule or ass without a proper bridle;
- (4.) Lead or drive any cattle without proper and sufficient assistance;
- (5.) Play cricket in any street or play cricket except within a space at a distance of not less than sixteen yards from any street;
- (6.) Indecently expose himself in any street or other public place;

shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for each offence and in default of payment thereof to imprisonment with or without hard labor for any term not exceeding fourteen days.

### PART II.

#### PUBLIC HEALTH.

4. *Free circulation of air—Erection of boat-sheds, &c.*—Every British subject who erects any building or part of a building (except as hereinafter provided) on the north or sea-side of the principal public road between the store now occupied by Mr. Thomas Throod in Matafele and the store now occupied by Messrs. Ruge and Company at Matantu shall on conviction forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds and in default of pay-

ment thereof shall be imprisoned with or without hard labor for any term not exceeding one month; and the Court may inflict—in addition to such punishment by imprisonment or fine—a further fine not exceeding Ten shillings a day for every day during which such building remains counting from the day on which such building or part of a building was erected until the day on which it shall be removed. Provided always that it shall be lawful for any British subject to serve the Health Officer with a written notice that it is his intention to apply to the British Consul after an interval of not less than six days for permission to erect a boat-house or similar small structure near the water and the British Consul may fix a day (notice of which shall be given to the Health Officer) to hear objections against the erection of the proposed small structure and if the British Consul is of opinion after hearing the objections (if any) that such structure can be erected without interfering with the public convenience and the free circulation of air in the town of Apia he shall give a certificate to that effect to the applicant.

5. *Weeding*.—Every British subject occupying or owning buildings in Apia shall weed and keep clear the space between such buildings and the street. Every person neglecting to carry out the provisions of this section shall on conviction forfeit a sum not exceeding Two pounds for each offence and in default of payment thereof shall be imprisoned with or without hard labor for any term not exceeding fourteen days.

6. *Contagious and infectious diseases*.—Every British subject suffering from an infectious or contagious disease or who occupies any building in which there is any person suffering from any such disease shall give written notice of the same to the Health Officer as soon as such British subject shall become aware of the existence of such disease. And it shall be lawful for the Health Officer to declare to be infected any such premises on which there is or has been any person suffering from any such disease and to forbid communication between persons inside and persons outside the said premises except in such manner as such Health Officer shall in writing direct. Provided always that if the existence of any infectious or contagious disease shall come to the knowledge of the Health Officer without any notification as aforesaid or when in the early and imperfectly diagnosed stage of any disease the Health Officer shall deem it necessary for the public safety it shall be lawful for such Health Officer to declare any such premises to be infected and to forbid any communication therewith excepting in the manner provided for in this section.

7. *Penalty*.—Every British subject who is guilty of a breach of the provisions of the section next preceding shall on conviction suffer imprisonment for any term not exceeding three months with or without hard labor and with or without a fine not exceeding Ten pounds or shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds without any imprisonment at the discretion of the Court.

## PART III.

## HARBOR AND VESSELS.

8. *Riding lights*.—The master of every British vessel riding at anchor in the harbor shall if so directed by the Harbor-master exhibit from sunset to sunrise a bright white light not less than fifteen feet from deck under the forestay of such vessel and the master or owner or person in charge of every such vessel on which such light is not so displayed shall on conviction thereof be liable to a fine not exceeding One pound and in default of payment thereof to imprisonment for any term not exceeding seven days.

9. *Throwing rubbish into harbor*.—Any British subject who shall throw or cause to be thrown any rubbish ballast earth or refuse into the harbor without the permission of the Harbor-master or except at such place and in such manner as the Harbor-master may direct shall on conviction for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and in default of payment thereof to imprisonment not exceeding one month.

10. *Fishing with dynamite*.—Every British subject who uses dynamite or other explosive substance to catch or destroy fish in the harbor shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Five pounds or in the discretion of the Court to be imprisoned with or without hard labor for a term not exceeding fourteen days.

11. *Conveying intoxicating liquor on board vessels*.—Every British subject supplying or conveying or causing to be supplied or conveyed any intoxicating liquor on board of any vessel in the harbor without an order or permit in writing signed by the master of such vessel shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds or at the discretion of the Court to imprisonment for any term not exceeding two months.

## PART IV.

## PUBLIC HOUSES.

12. *Hours*.—No publican shall keep his premises open for the sale of liquor or shall sell any liquor or permit the same to be drunk or consumed in or on his premises unless between the hours of five in the morning and eleven at night on the six business days of the week and between the hours of one in the afternoon and eleven at night on Sundays. Every publican offending against any part of this section shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and in default of payment thereof to imprisonment for any period not exceeding fourteen days.

13. *Supplying intoxicating liquor to drunken persons*.—If any publican or his servant supplies intoxicating liquor to any person who is at the time in a state of intoxication such publican shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and in default of payment thereof to imprisonment for a term not exceeding seven days.

14. *Lights*.—Every publican shall keep burning a bright light at the main entrance to the bar from sunset till the hour of closing and every publican neglecting to comply with this section shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds and in default of payment thereof to imprisonment for any term not exceeding seven days.

15. *Date of coming into operation*.—This Regulation shall come into force on the first day of September in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

(Made by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty under the provisions of the Western Pacific Order in Council 1879)

To prohibit the supply of Dynamite to Natives of Samoa.

31st July 1888.

1. Any British subject who sells or gives or procures the sale or gift to any aboriginal native of Samoa or to any aboriginal native of Polynesia or Melanesia resident in Samoa any dynamite or similar explosive substance shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding Ten pounds or to imprisonment not exceeding three months as the Court may determine.

2. This Regulation shall come into force on the first day of September in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

## DEPARTMENT OF TRADE AND CUSTOMS.

IT is hereby notified for general information that the Governor in Council has approved of the following Regulations under sections 6 and 18 of *The Tobacco Act 1880*:-

1. Any grower of tobacco in Victoria desirous of manufacturing tobacco from Victorian-grown leaf only in quantities not exceeding 50,000 lbs. weight annually must make application in writing to the Commissioner of Trade and Customs for the approval and appointment of premises as a tobacco factory, ground plan, and full description of which, must accompany such application.

2. A bond in the sum of One thousand pounds (£1,000) must be executed by the proprietor or occupier of such tobacco factory, together with two sufficient sureties to be approved of by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs for the security of the duty due on any tobacco which may be deposited in such factory, and for the due and faithful observance of the terms, conditions, and requirements of *The Tobacco Act 1880*, and of the regulations now made or hereafter to be made thereunder.

3. An annual fee of Five pounds (£5), payable quarterly in advance, shall be paid by the proprietor or occupier of such tobacco factory to the Collector of Customs, Melbourne.

4. All leaf tobacco entered for manufacture shall be weighed by an officer of Customs or Excise, or such other officer as the Commissioner may appoint.

5. All manufactured tobacco shall be carefully weighed by an officer of Customs or Excise, or other duly appointed officer, before it can be removed from the factory.

6. Books of accounts (showing all leaf tobacco and strips of tobacco weighed into each manufactory, and all manufactured tobacco cleared from such manufactory) shall be correctly kept by each manufacturer, and such books shall always be open to inspection by the Customs or Excise Officer in charge.

7. No manufactured tobacco shall be cleared, except for exportation, from any manufactory until it has paid the excise duty required by law.

8. Any warehouse approved by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs under these Regulations may be entered at any time by day or night by any Officer of Customs or Excise (specially authorized by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs).

9. Every manufacturer shall, before delivery thereof, place upon every package and box his name and address, together with a consecutive number for such package or box; such consecutive number, together with the address of the person to whom such package or box may be sent, shall be entered at the time of delivery in a book to be kept by the manufacturer for that purpose.

## Conditions.

AN applicant for appointment must not be more than twenty years nor less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper discharge of his duty. He will also be required to produce satisfactory evidence of having received a fair general education, including a good knowledge of euclid, algebra, and arithmetic, and to furnish a specimen of his drawing, either plain or freehand.

## Competitive Examination.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements, the applicant will be required to undergo a competitive examination, on a date of which he will be duly notified. The subjects of such examination will be arithmetical and plane trigonometrical computation, and the use of logarithms. The competitors to whom

shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Board of Examiners will be recommended for appointment in the order of merit. If any candidate shall have already passed as a pupil-surveyor he will be eligible, without further examination, for appointment, according to the position he may have attained at such examination.

## Term of Service.

The pupil's service in the Observatory shall be for a term of four years, during which time he will be trained in computing, observing, astronomical surveying, and Observatory work generally. Should the pupil, however, be found unfit for such work, or his progress in the same be unsatisfactory, his services may be dispensed with at a month's notice. Pupils continuing the full four years, if their service shall have been satisfactory, and if they pass the examination under the regulations of the Public Service Board for appointment to the Clerical Division, will be eligible for appointment as Junior Computers and Observers of the 5th Class of the Chief Secretary's Department, in the order of their merit, and in accordance with the provisions of the regulations aforesaid.

## Remuneration.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupilage:—1st year, £52; 2nd year, £58; 3rd year, £66; 4th year, £72.

## Subject to Regulations.

During the whole term of his pupilage and service in the Observatory, he shall be subject to the regulations for the Public Service of Victoria, dated 31st December 1884, or any subsequent substituted or additional regulations made under *The Public Service Act 1888*.

#### CERTIFICATES WITHOUT EXAMINATION.

## WEIGHT OF INLAND PACKETS AND BOOK PACKETS TRANSMITTED THROUGH THE POST.

Post Office Act 1883, Secs. 10 and 50.

## PUBLIC HEALTH.

## SHIRE OF MANSFIELD.—LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

**T**HE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Mansfield, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and every other power enabling the said Local Board of Health in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 10 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately on its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in all proclaimed townships within the Shire of Mansfield.

## PART I.

*Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairy-men, and Purveyors of Milk.*

3. Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of January in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every application pay a fee of One shilling.

*Application for Registration as—*

To the Secretary of the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Mansfield.

Sir,—I desire to be registered in accordance with the particulars in the schedule hereunder:—

4. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary of the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it was received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

5. All the paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said Local Board of Health, or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or secretary of the said Local Board of Health; and if, on inspection, such grounds, paddocks, or enclosures, or any of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or persons so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said Local Board of Health may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling-place, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said Local Board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

6. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect to cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

7. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

8. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

9. If any person, or member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice to the Local Board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Local Board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale, vending, and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until the danger, in the opinion of such Local Board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any such person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

10. If at any time disease exists in the dairy, or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge (as the case may be) shall immediately give notice to the Local Board of Health, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of the diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

11. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

## PART NO. 2.

12. Every person erecting or causing to be erected any new building shall cause the foundation thereof, and the ground over which such building is to be placed, to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water, soakage, or damp shall lodge there.

13. Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, constructed so as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of the section.

14. Every person who causes to run from any manufactory, or any establishment for boiling and preparing of any animal matter, or any brewery, slaughterhouse, butcher's shop, or any dunghill or other receptacle for offal or rubbish, or from any "licensed premises" within the meaning of *The Licensing Act 1835*, into or upon any street or road, public or private, or any footway or channel, and every occupier of land or premises who causes or permits to run from such land or premises into or upon any such street or footway or channel any offensive liquid or matter shall for every day during which any such liquid or matter shall so run be liable to the penalties of this bye-law.

15. In the interpretation of this bye-law words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

16. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

WHEREAS by *The Mallee Pastoral Leases Act 1883* (No. 766, sec. 43) it was enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, might from time to time declare any lands situate within the Mallee country or Mallee border to be “Vermin Districts” for the purposes of the said Act, and fix the boundaries thereof, and might from time to time in like manner cause any lands to cease to be Vermin Districts, or might vary the boundaries thereof: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the twenty-ninth day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, and made in pursuance of the said Act, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, did, *inter alia*, notify and proclaim the boundaries of the Eastern Vermin District: And by a further Proclamation bearing date the seventeenth day of May One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, did vary the boundaries of the said district: And whereas it is expedient to again vary the boundaries of the said district: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby again vary the boundaries of the Eastern Vermin District by including in such district Mallee allotments 107A and 107B and 161, county of Tatchera.




