TRAMWAYS IN THE CITY OF SANDHURST AND
THE BOROUGH OF EAGLEHAWK.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act Amendment Act 1883* it is provided that tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except the municipal districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Richmond, South Melbourne, Hotham, St. Kilda, Brunswick, Kew, Hawthorn, and Sandridge) when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf upon the application of the council of the municipality in compliance with the provisions of the said Act, and of the Rules and Regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the Councils of the Municipalities of the City of Sandhurst and of the Borough of Eaglehawk have made a joint application, under the Common Seals of the said municipalities, in accordance with the said Act, and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder, for an Order by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of tramways in the Municipal District of the City of Sandhurst and the Municipal District of the Borough of Eaglehawk: And whereas the Governor in Council, being satisfied that the requirements of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder have been duly complied with by the said councils of the said municipalities, and that notice of the intention of the said councils to make the said application, in which notice the routes proposed to be followed were described, and persons objecting to the same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the regulations, has been duly published as required by the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council in pursuance of the said Act in that behalf, and that no valid objections to the said application have been lodged within the time provided in the said rules, and being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same, subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth, for the purpose aforesaid, make the Order following, that is to say:—

That the Councils of the Municipality of the City of Sandhurst and of the Municipality of the Borough of Eaglehawk shall be and are hereby authorized to construct tramways in the Municipal District of the City of Sandhurst and the Municipal District of the Borough of Eaglehawk.

Routes.—That the routes of such tramways shall be as follows:—

Section A.—Commencing at a point in the centre of Mitchell street, in the city of Sandhurst, opposite Mollison street and near the Sandhurst Railway Station; thence along Mitchell street and crossing Pall Mall to View place; thence along View place to Barnard street; thence along that street to the Mount Korong road; thence along that road through Long Gully and California Gully to the terminus at Darling street, in the borough of Eaglehawk, near the Town Hall.

Section B.—Commencing at the intersection of Napier street, in the city of Sandhurst, with Napoleon crescent, near the Botanical Gardens, White Hills; thence along Napier street and the White Hills road to Bridge street; thence along Bridge street to Pall Mall; thence along Pall Mall, intersecting Section A at Charing Cross, to High street; thence along High street to the terminus at the southern boundary of the city of Sandhurst.

Gauge.—That the gauge of such tramways shall be four feet eight and a half inches (4 feet $8\frac{1}{2}$ inches), and that the said tramways shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications numbered from one (1) to thirteen (13) inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, Melbourne, and which plans and specifications are endorsed with a memorandum of the Honorable the Minister of Public Works, identifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be deemed to be as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

Works and signals at intersection of tramways with railways.—That the said Councils of the said Municipalities of the City of Sandhurst and the Borough of Eaglehawk shall execute all works and maintain all signals, &c., which, in the opinion of the Victorian Railway Commissioners, may be considered necessary in order to insure the safety of the traffic upon any railways now constructed or hereafter to be constructed and intersected by such tramways, and all works at such intersections shall be constructed according to a design approved of by the said Railway Commissioners, and executed to their satisfaction.

Motive power.—That the motive power to be used upon the said tramways shall be electricity applied to the propulsion of the cars by storage cells or accumulators and electromotors.

Maximum speed.—That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway shall be ten (10) miles in the hour.

Time of completion.—That the portion of the tramway comprised within Section A shall be completed and opened for traffic throughout its entire length within the period of two (2) years from the date of this Order. That the portion of the tramway comprised within Section B shall be completed and opened for traffic throughout its entire length within the period of four (4) years from the date of this Order.

Passenger traffic only.—That such tramways shall be used for passenger traffic only.

Necessary precautions for safety of passengers and public.—That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramways, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets or roads upon the routes of such tramways, shall be taken and ordered by the said councils of the said municipalities.

Stoppages for taking up and setting down passengers.—That for the convenience of the public the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at such points upon the several routes as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic on the streets or roads or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

Tolls and charges.—That the charges to be made for every passenger on the said tramway may be but shall not exceed the following, that is to say, for each passenger:—

Section A: From the commencing point near the Sandhurst Railway Station to Long Gully Bridge, or *vice versa*, or any lesser distance between, Threepence. From Long Gully Bridge to the terminus, near the Town Hall, Eaglehawk, or *vice versa*, or any lesser distance between, Threepence.

Section B: From the commencing point near the Botanical Gardens, White Hills, to the intersection of Bridge and Nolan street, or *vice versa*, or any lesser distance between, Threepence. From the intersection of Bridge and Nolan streets to the intersection with Section A and thence to the Sandhurst Railway Station, or *vice versa*, or any lesser distance between, Threepence. From the commencing point of Section A, near the Sandhurst Railway Station, to the intersection with Section B, and thence to Maple street, or *vice versa*, or any lesser distance between, Threepence. From Maple street to the terminus at the southern boundary of the city of Sandhurst, or *vice versa*, or any lesser distance between, Threepence.

Governor in Council to be sole judge of breach of Order.—That the Governor in Council shall be the sole judge of the compliance with or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order; and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 26 of the regulations contained in the Second Schedule to the said Act before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the regulations in the said schedule.

If upon the report to the Governor in Council by the referee made under the said clause 26 of the regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or non-compliance with or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited or shall cease and determine or shall be suspended, as the Governor in Council shall direct; and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall, in his adjudication, state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Councils of the said Municipalities of the City of Sandhurst and the Borough of Eaglehawk shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets or roads along which the said routes are laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramways, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act Amendment Act 1883*, sec. 32, it was enacted that the Governor in Council, at the request of the council of any municipality, might, by Order to be published in the *Government Gazette*, direct that any portion of a street or road in the municipal district should be a Tree Reserve, so that the portion of such street or road remaining available for traffic upon both sides of such Tree Reserve, including footpaths, should in no place be reduced by any such Tree Reserve to less than forty-six feet, and so that no such Reserve be a greater length than ten chains, and the Governor in Council might revoke any such Order: And whereas on the twenty-fifth day of May One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight the Council of the Borough of Daylesford requested that certain portions of an unnamed and unproclaimed street in the township of Daylesford be declared a Tree Reserve: Now therefore the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the said in part recited Act, and in compliance with the request made as aforesaid, doth by this Order declare the portions of the street hereinafter mentioned to be a Tree Reserve within the meaning of the 32nd section of the said Act, that is to say:—

Certain portions of an unnamed and unproclaimed street in the township of Daylesford, as shown on a plan marked "A," and deposited at the Office of Public Works, Melbourne. And the Honorable John Nimmo, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The births of 1,471 children, viz., 777 boys and 694 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of August. In the month of July 1,232 births were registered, or 239 fewer than in the month under review. The births were 493 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 240 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in August numbered 627, viz., 348 of males and 279 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 844, or 135 per cent. The deaths exceeded those in July by 33, and were above the average of August during the previous ten years by 123. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been lower than that average by 8.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.76, and of deaths registered 1.60.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 67.1° on the 30th, and the lowest was 30.0° on the 5th. The mean temperature of the month (48.6°) was two and a half degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (33.3°) took place on the 30th, viz., from a maximum of 67.1° to a minimum of 33.8°. The least range (6.0°) was on the 31st, viz., from a maximum of 55.5° to a minimum of 49.5°. The mean daily range was 16.6°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.402 inches on the 9th, and the lowest was 29.453 inches on the 31st. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.048 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 12 days, the amount of rainfall being .99 inch. The average rainfall in August during the previous ten years was 1.87 inches, or .88 inch more than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on 5 days during the month.

Males contributed 56 per cent., and females 44 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 30 per cent. to that mortality, as against 36 per cent. in August 1887, 30 per cent. in August 1886, 23 per cent. in August 1885, 39 per cent. in August 1884, 30 per cent. in August 1883, 31 per cent. in August 1882, 33 per cent. in August 1881, 43 per cent. in August 1880, 36 per cent. in August 1879, and 31 per cent. in August 1878.

Forty-seven deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a male cook, aged 75, was killed through falling down a cutting; a female, aged 75, a gentleman and a female, each aged 76, and a female, aged 81, died of congestion of the lungs; a builder, aged 76, and a female, aged 82, of cancer of the lip and uterus respectively; a gentleman, aged 76, of chronic inflammation of the bladder and uremia; a female, aged 77, a female, aged 83, a female, aged 88, and a female servant, aged 88, of bronchitis; a laborer (a prisoner of the Crown), aged 78, of rupture of the heart; a female, aged 78, a female, aged 84, and a weaver, aged 89, of disease of the heart; a gentleman, aged 78, of disease of the bladder; a female, aged 80, of diarrhoea; a chairmaker, aged 80, of rheumatic gout; a carpenter, aged 80, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 80, of valvular disease of the heart; a laborer, aged 80, of chronic enteritis; a laborer, aged 80, of intestinal obstruction; a laborer, aged 85, of hæmorrhage; a female teacher (an inmate of the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum), aged 87, of disease of the brain and heart; a stonemason and a female, each aged 75, a farmer and a female, each aged 76, a female, aged 78, a steward and a female, each aged 80, two females, each aged 81, a female, aged 82, a laborer, aged 83, a gardener, a female, a gentleman, and a housepainter, each aged 84, a gentleman and three females, each aged 86, a female, aged 92, a female servant, aged 93, and a female, aged 94, of old age.

Thirty-four deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which twenty-nine were set down to accident, three to homicide, and two to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A girl, aged 4, died of fracture of the skull, the result of an injury through coming into contact with the wheel of a jinker; a boy, aged 7, was passed over by a spring cart; a boy, aged 6, a clerk, aged 16, and a male, of unknown occupation, aged 40, were passed over by railway trains; a laborer, aged 31, was killed—a lift descending on him; a laborer, aged 26, died of fracture of the spine—portion of a wall falling on him; a boy, aged 10, of fracture of the skull, and a female, aged 28, of dislocation of the neck, both consequent on falls downstairs; a male child, aged 4, was killed by falling into the Williamstown Graving Dock; a seaman, aged 24, died of contusion of the back, caused by falling down the hold of a ship; a laborer, aged 32, of fracture of the skull, occasioned by a fall from a scaffold; a journalist, aged 38, of fracture of the skull, attendant on a fall whilst intoxicated; a male cook, aged 75, was killed by falling down a cutting. A male child, aged 4, and a female, aged 55, died of burns, caused by their clothes catching fire; a gunner, aged 28, was burnt to death in a conflagration; a boy, aged 6, died of scalds, through pulling a kettle of boiling water over himself; a male child, aged 4, of accidental submersion in diluted muriatic acid; a carrier, aged 30, a charwoman, aged 38, and a nurse, aged 69, were found drowned. A male infant was smothered at birth, through difficulty in delivery; a male and a female infant, each aged 4 months, were overlain; a male child, aged 1 year and 3 months, was choked by a cork becoming impacted in his throat; two tinsmiths, aged 19 and 20 respectively, and a laborer, aged 33, were suffocated by the inhalation of carburetted hydrogen gas. Of the homicidal deaths, a male infant was murdered at birth; a painter, aged 56, died of fracture of the thigh—a verdict of murder being brought in against his assailant; and a quarryman, aged 40, of fracture of the skull—a verdict of justifiable homicide being returned. The suicidal deaths were those of a farmer, aged 38, and an incubator maker, aged 39, who shot themselves in the head.

One hundred and forty-three deaths, or 28 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—62 in the Melbourne Hospital, 24 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 4 in the Children's Hospital, 8 in the Immigrants' Home, 16 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 11 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Austin Hospital, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, 2 in the Infant Asylum, 1 in the Protestant Refuge, and 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 189, of which 112, or 59 per cent., were of males, and 77, or 41 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 129 were under one year of age, 23 were between one and two, 11 were between two and three, 15 were between three and four, and 11 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 438. Of these, 236, or 54 per cent., were males, and 202, or 46 per cent., were females; 27 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between fifteen and twenty, 35 were between twenty and twenty-five, 31 were between twenty-five and thirty, 31 were between thirty and thirty-five, 30 were between thirty-five and forty, 29 were between forty and forty-five, 29 were between forty-five and fifty, 30 were between fifty and fifty-five, 37 were between fifty-five and sixty, 34 were between sixty and sixty-five, 38 were between sixty-five and seventy, 20 were between seventy and seventy-five, 15 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 32 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the previous month, under the head of specific febrile or zymotic diseases, deaths from diphtheria fell from 14 to 11, those from typhoid fever from 12 to 9, and those from septic diseases from 11 to 8. On the other hand, under the head of local diseases, deaths from brain and nerve complaints rose from 65 to 71, those from heart affections from 46 to 50, those from lung and chest disorders from 96 to 123, and those from bowel and stomach diseases from 43 to 51. Twelve deaths of child-bearing women occurred during the month, or 2 more than in July. If these numbers be compared with the births registered during the same period, it will be found that, in both months, 1 death of a mother took place to every 123 children born alive.

SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA.—REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE BIRREGURRA TOWN COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the 1st May 1888, the Council of the Shire of Winchelsea, having drafted the following Regulations for management of the Birregurra Town Common, submit

the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle.

2. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner, and the right to depasture shall not be transferable.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly in advance, on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in every year:—

For every horse ...	12s. per annum.
For every head of other large cattle ...	8s. per annum.
For every head of small cattle ...	8s. per annum.
Progeny, under six months old, of stock legally depasturing on the common ...	Free.

4. All stock running on the common shall be branded with the brands of the owners thereof.

5. All stock upon which fees shall be paid as aforesaid shall be registered and branded by the herdsman, assisted by the owners thereof, with the letter T, and no stock will be recognised as legally depasturing on the common until so registered and branded.

6. The herdsman shall take delivery of stock between the hours of Nine o'clock a.m. and One o'clock p.m. daily. A written description of each beast (with its brands) shall be given by the owner at the same time, and in no case shall the managers or herdsman be liable for poundage fees on any stock.

7. No stock duly registered shall be removed from the common without and unless notice in writing be first given to the herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt from the owner for the stock removed.

8. The herdsman shall, on any stock straying from the common, or being removed therefrom without the owner's consent, notify the same in writing to the owner thereof within ten days; and, in default of notice within that time, the herdsman shall, if the stock be lost, be held responsible, and the loss shall be computed at a rate not to exceed Ten pounds sterling for each animal.

9. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common.

10. The herdsman shall report immediately to the managers the indication of any contagious disease in any stock on the common, and shall give notice thereof in writing to the owner of such stock.

11. Whenever in these Regulations any act or thing is required to be done by the managers, it shall be considered to be well and truly done if done by any two or more of them duly appointed from time to time to act on their behalf.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

BOROUGH OF SALE.

BYE-LAW NUMBER NINE.

A Bye-law of the Borough of Sale, made under Section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered nine, for Regulating the Proceedings of the Borough Council.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Sale order as follows:—

(1.) In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

(2.) At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and upon their being confirmed, or amended and confirmed, as the case may be, the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as required by "The Local Government Act 1874."

(3.) After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (1.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the council.
- (2.) Reading of letters received and considering and ordering thereon.
- (3.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (4.) Presentation of minutes of committee meetings and of reports of committees and officers.
- (5.) Payments.
- (6.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meeting, motions of which previous notice has been duly given, any matter arising out of the correspondence, reports, petitions read or presented during the same meeting, if by special motion ordered to be considered, and any business which the mayor may think fit to bring under consideration.
- (7.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (8.) Notices of motion.
- (9.) Tenders.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

PETITIONS AND MEMORIALS.

4. Every petition shall be in writing and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

5. Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity or sickness.

- 6. No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.
- 7. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall write his name at the beginning thereof.
- 8. It shall be incumbent on every councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council and that the contents do not violate any by-law or any provision hereof.
- 9. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.
- 10. No motion except that for receiving the same shall unless under most urgent circumstances be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the council after that at which it has been presented.
- 11. No petition shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

MOTIONS

- 12. All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered and given by the intending mover to the town clerk at the close of the meeting of council, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting then 48 hours prior to the next meeting of council, and such clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.
- 13. No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.
- 14. Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the town clerk in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.
- 15. No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same unless by some other councillor authorized by him to that effect.
- 16. At every meeting of the council all motions whether original motions or amendments shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.
- 17. It shall be competent for any councillor by notice to move for a call of the whole council for the consideration of any subject at the next meeting or any subsequent meeting, and due notice thereof shall be given by the town clerk to each councillor by post or otherwise of the day for which this order of the day or notice of motion for which such call is made is set down for consideration; and any councillor not in attendance when such order of the day or notice of motion comes under consideration, or not in attendance at the voting upon such question or any amendment thereof, shall be guilty of an offence unless reasonable cause for such absence be shown to the satisfaction of the council.

ORDER OF DEBATE.

- 18. The councillors in meeting of council shall designate each other by their official titles, namely that of mayor, chairman, or councillor, as the case may be.
- 19. Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment or taking part in discussion thereon shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.
- 20. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.
- 21. The chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.
- 22. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.
- 23. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.
- 24. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded, but a councillor may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by directing the mayor or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.
- 25. A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.
- 26. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question unless entitled to reply or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.
- 27. The chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.
- 28. No councillor shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate, and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.
- 29. Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.
- 30. A councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.
- 31. Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and to apologize for such conduct and refusing so to do shall be guilty of an offence.
- 32. Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

- 33. No second or subsequent amendment whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.
- 34. If any words of an original question be rejected the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.
- 35. If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at a time.
- 36. The mover of every original proposition but not of any amendment shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair.
- 37. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council, but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made; but if the motion for adjournment be carried the debate on the motion moved and seconded or on any order of the day may be resumed at the next meeting of the council at the point at which it was so interrupted.
- 38. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the next meeting of the council at the point at which it was so interrupted.

VOTING AND DIVISION.

- 39. The chairman shall in taking the sense of the council put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.
- 40. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman and recorded in the minutes.
- 41. Any councillor present and not voting not being disallowed by law from so doing shall be guilty of an offence.

COMMITTEES.

- 42. Minutes of all proceedings of committees as well as of their reports numbered in consecutive order shall be entered in the committee minute book, and being signed by the chairman of the committee shall be presented to the council, and the town clerk when practicable shall attend all meetings of committee.
- 43. The town clerk shall convene every committee as soon as possible after its appointment or on the order of the chairman of the committee or of the mayor.

STRANGERS.

- 44. Any person not being a councillor who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave the council chamber and the hearing thereof when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

SUSPENSION OF STANDING ORDERS.

- 45. Any one or more of the foregoing standing orders, rules, or regulations may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the council.

PENALTIES.

- 46. If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this by-law he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding 45 (Fifty pounds).

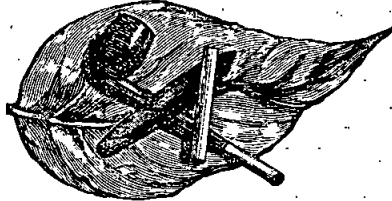

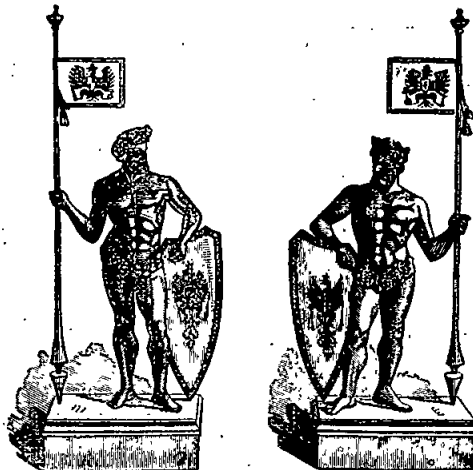
