ELECTRIC WIRE AT PORT WESTERN.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1895* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* might from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and might appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; and any such limits, boundaries, rules and regulations might from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed, and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the following to be an additional Port Regulation (No. 195), and to be observed accordingly:—

ELECTRIC WIRE.

An electric wire connecting the mainland with Phillip Island has been suspended across the eastern entrance to Port Western. The lowest elevation of the wire is 110 feet above high-water mark, and it increases in height to 140 feet between the buoy and Griffith's Point wharf. To insure the due preservation of such wire, masters of vessels and others shall not navigate any vessel thereunder until they have ascertained that the masts of the vessel they navigate are sufficiently low to clear the electric wire.

WHEREAS by *The Discipline Act 1870* it was provided that the Governor in Council might make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order the following alterations in additions to the Regulations for the

Victorian Military Forces made on the sixteenth day of June 1885 and on the second day of March 1886 respectively, that is to say:—

PART IV., SECTION VII.

In paragraph 3—“Arrangements will be made for attaching officers, if they desire it, to the Victorian Artillery for instruction in their duties. Not more than two officers so attached in one year will be permitted to draw the pay and allowances of a Junior Lieutenant of Victorian Artillery for a period not exceeding two months.” For “not more than two officers,” read “not more than four officers.”

PART V., SECTION I.

Paragraph 13 is cancelled, and the following is substituted therefor:—

The Musketry course for the Mounted Rifles will be the same as that laid down for Rifle Clubs.

PART VII., SECTION I.

Militia Reserve of Officers.

1. The Unattached List of Officers in the Militia will be designated in future the Militia Reserve of Officers.
2. Officers on the present Unattached List of the Militia whose term of service will expire on the 31st December 1888 will not be required to join the Reserve unless they desire it.
3. Officers on the Reserve are liable to retirement on account of age under the same conditions as those on the active list of the Militia.
4. The services of Officers of the Reserve are at all times to be at the disposal of the Commandant. In order to be classed as effective they must attend four days at the annual training, or nine half-day parades during the year.
5. Officers below the rank of Major will be attached for duty to such corps as the Commandant may direct, and they will not be allowed to do duty with other corps unless by permission.
6. Officers above the rank of Captain will be employed on such duties as the Commandant may determine.
7. Officers must have performed the drills mentioned in paragraph 4 by the 30th of June in every year, in order to be classed as effective, unless they have joined the Reserve during the year, in which case they must have performed a proportionate number of drills. Notwithstanding this regulation, officers of the latter class will be permitted to perform the whole number of drills requisite for the year.
8. Any Officer of the Reserve who is not effective will not be allowed to retain his commission unless, in the opinion of the Commandant, there are special reasons for the relaxation of the rule.
9. Officers of the Reserve will receive the pay of their rank for all duties performed, provided it does not exceed in any one year the amount allowed for four whole days or nine half-days. Officers who join the Reserve during the financial year cannot receive pay for more drills than the total number allowed for the Militia (Active List).
10. Officers of the Reserve will be eligible to fill vacancies on the active list of the Militia.

REGULATION No. 2.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1837*, No 946, do hereby make the following Regulation:—

1. For water supplied from the channels for irrigation purposes the rate shall be 1d. per 1,000 gallons, which is equivalent to 6d. per 1,000 cubic feet. Delivery shall be made of not less than 60,000 gallons at one time, and the water shall be delivered from the channels at such times and in such manner as may from time to time be directed by regulations to be made by the Trust.
2. All measurements of water for irrigation shall be by gauges approved, fixed, and kept in repair to the satisfaction of the Trust. The registration of the quantity supplied shall be made by an officer of the Trust and the gauges shall not be removed or interfered with, without the consent of such officer.
3. Delivery of water for irrigation shall be taken at such times and in such order as the Trust shall direct, and if absolutely necessary shall be continued on Sunday. Every person shall receive notification of the time when water will be supplied to him, and to what extent.
4. Any person not being duly authorized who shall open any irrigation outlets, or do any act that may cause damage to the works of the Trust shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.
5. All accounts for water supplied otherwise than by rate shall be paid monthly, or as may be authorized by the Trust.

REGULATION No. 3.

The Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the regulations following:—

1. For every water-trough the sum of 10s. per annum.
2. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, 10s. per annum on each inch of the diameter of the cylinder.
3. The rate to be charged for water supplied by the Trust from any stand-pipe shall be 1s. for one load of 200 gallons or less, and for each additional 100 gallons or part thereof, 6d.
4. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement 2s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purposes of irrigation, or for ornamental purposes shall be as follows:—

	Gallons.
1. $\frac{1}{4}$ of an acre and less per annum	8,000
2. Exceeding $\frac{1}{4}$ acre, but not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ acre per annum	12,000
3. Exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ acre, but not exceeding $\frac{3}{4}$ acre per annum	16,000
4. Exceeding $\frac{3}{4}$ acre, but not exceeding 1 acre per annum	23,000
5. Exceeding 1 acre, but not exceeding 2 acres per annum	34,000
6. Exceeding 2 acres, but not exceeding 1 acre per annum	40,000

And at the rate of 40,000 gallons per acre for every additional acre, and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 3,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for above purposes each space of five feet shall be charged for as a stall.

5. For water supplied by the Trust to parks, gardens, or show yards, the rate shall be 6d. per 1,000 gallons.
6. The Trust, or any person obtaining water from the mains, may cause a meter or meters to be affixed, such to be provided by the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurements at aforesaid rates. The annual water rate payable on shire assessment to go in liquidation of such charges by measurement, and be supplemented by any additional amount required. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial is capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons.

7. For a temporary supply during the erection of buildings, a minimum quantity of 28,000 gallons per month shall be charged for at aforesaid rates. For every additional part of a month, in proportion.

8. If any meter should cease registering, from period of such cessation and during the time it is undergoing repair, the Trust shall estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

9. Fire plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them be allowed by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of an officer of the Trust.

10. Any person receiving water from the Trust, who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

11. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose. And any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such breach.

12. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for such breach.

13. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter under a penalty of £5, and, in the event of continuing the offence to a penalty of £2 for each day after notice from the Trust.

14. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

15. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, until he shall have obtained from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

16. Before any such license shall be granted by the Trust the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such license at any time.

17. Any person, whether licensed or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes, the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust, of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe, the property of the Trust, without the permission of the Trust in writing being first obtained, or who shall wilfully

or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding £20.

18. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, as to the Trust may seem fit, unless the necessary repair shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipe, the occupier, if any, and if none the owner shall, in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair, or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of £2 for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

19. Before any licensed person shall break up any footpath for the purpose of laying on water from the main to any house or premises he shall deposit with the Trust the sum of £2, and in case he shall not immediately after laying on the water as aforesaid, make good and restore the said footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of £2 shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good and restoring the said footpath or otherwise as to the Trust shall seem best.

20. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officers of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty of £2 for each offence.

21. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention to these regulations or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charges imposed by the Trust, when due, or fails to do anything which, under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

22. In the construction of these regulations the word "person" shall extend to and be deemed to include a corporation whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Shire of Bacchus Marsh Waterworks Trust.

3. That the amount which it is proposed the Board of Land and Works shall advance by way of loan for trust works and joint works is Two hundred and forty-two thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight pounds (£242,878) sterling.

4. That the rate of interest to be paid by the Trust upon such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum.

5. That the rate at which the Trust shall pay for water supplied from national works shall be Four shillings for every cubic foot

Pursuant to Section 18 of the said Act, I hereby declare upon the said petition the matters following, viz.:—

1. That the scheme or plan of the proposed works shall be a pumping plant on the bank of the Murray River, to raise water therefrom, with channels to convey and distribute the water to the lands to be irrigated.

2. That the whole of these works shall be Trust works.

3. That no portion of the funds required for the carrying out of the works of the scheme shall be advanced by the Board of Land and Works.

4. That the source from which the Trust shall derive its water supply shall be the Murray River, and the maximum quantity of water it shall be entitled to take from such source shall be 1,800 cubic feet per minute, subject to the condition that the whole of it shall be *bona fide* used for domestic and stock supply, and for the irrigation of lands within the Trust district. This right shall be for three years only, and shall be subject to review at the end of that period, and shall be then modified, amended, or reduced in such manner and to such extent as the facts of the case and the public interests may then seem to require.

5. The powers of rating to be given to the Trust shall be not more than one shilling in the £1 of the annual rateable value of all property within the Trust district.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT OF A PARK IN THE TOWN OF YARRAWONGA FOR THE RECREATION AND CONVENIENCE OF THE PEOPLE.

WHEREAS by the 133rd section of *The Land Act 1884* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations, or to rescind any rules and regulations heretofore made for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering in or upon such public parks and reserves: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the Regulation following to be observed and enforced in respect of the land in the town of Yarrowonga, temporarily reserved by Order of 16th July 1886, as a site for a Park for the recreation and convenience of the people.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

No. XIV.

REGULATIONS OF THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

WHEREAS by *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883* it is enacted that the Victorian Railways Commissioners shall make Regulations for the granting of leave of absence from time to time to employés in the Railway Service, and that such Regulations, when confirmed by the Governor in Council, shall have the same force and effect as if they had been contained in the Act: Now, therefore, in pursuance of the said enactment, the said Victorian Railways Commissioners make the following Regulations with a view to assisting Railway Artisans to acquire further knowledge of their trades than can be obtained in Victoria by enabling them to visit countries and places outside the colony:—

1. Leave of absence may be granted for any period not exceeding 18 months, but only by the Victorian Railways Commissioners.
2. No more than two artisans to be allowed leave in any one year under these Regulations, and, in the event of there being more than two applicants for the privilege, the selection shall be made of the two most competent after their having been practically examined

as to their knowledge of their trades, together with a test of their theoretical acquaintance with the principles of mechanism and drawing.

3. Applicants must not be under 23 nor over 35 years of age, and must have served a full apprenticeship to a trade in the Victorian Railways workshops.
4. Each person to whom leave is granted will be allowed by the Railway Department a sum of 4s. 6d. per day towards his expenses during his absence.
5. No increment will be made to the pay of any person during his absence.

6. A letter of character, to contain particulars as to why each artisan is allowed to travel, will be furnished by the Victorian Railways Commissioners, and each such artisan will be required to work in as many leading establishments where his trade is carried on as he can conveniently during his absence, and he will also be required to study the various new methods of doing the work of his trade, and to take copious notes of all matters coming under his notice which may be useful to the Victorian Railways when he returns.

TARADALE GENERAL CEMETERY.—RULES AND
REGULATIONS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has rescinded the rules and regulations made by the trustees of the Taradale General Cemetery, which were published on page 1703 of the *Government Gazette* of the 3rd September 1888, and has ordered that the subjoined rules and regulations, which have been submitted in accordance with section 9 of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*, be substituted therefor.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. Application for permission for vault or monument must be made at the office of the secretary. A certificate of permission in the form set out in the schedule will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the charges in the schedule.
3. The trustees may permit any poor person to be buried in the cemetery without fee or charge.
4. Orders for interment must be given at the office of the secretary. Such notice to be given between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. the day previous to the proposed interment; if not so given, an extra charge will be made (see amended scale). No free interment will be allowed without the above notice.
5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be requested to construct them under the direction of the trustees; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault the consent, in writing, of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
6. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.
7. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
8. Until otherwise ordered the usual hours fixed for interment will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. in the months from September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other four

months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from 1 to 5 p.m. throughout the year.

9. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, iron, or redgum planking, 2½ inches in thickness.

11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected in the cemetery shall be submitted to the trustees for approval, who will determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

12. No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in any duty on behalf of, the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

13. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, will be kept at the office, and may be inspected; and a register of all grants shall be kept by the secretary.

14. All fees must be paid at the time of giving the orders. No children allowed in the cemetery, unless accompanied by responsible guardians. No dogs allowed in the cemetery. Any person or persons climbing fences, destroying flowers, or damaging graves or monuments, will be prosecuted as the law directs.

15. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these regulations, and in the scale of fees and charges.

A By-law of the Town of Hawthorn, made under section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 31, for regulating the depositing of building materials, &c., in the Town of Hawthorn.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the mayor, councillors, and burgesses of the Town of Hawthorn order as follows:—

A portion of the roadway may be enclosed by builders and others for the storage of material, &c., for the construction of new buildings under the following conditions:—

The length of roadway enclosed shall not exceed the length of frontage of the land upon which the intended building is to be constructed.

In streets of 66 ft. and upwards, the distance from the line of kerb shall not exceed 12 ft. In those of 50 ft. in width up to 66 ft., 10 ft.; and in streets of from 40 ft. to 50 ft. in width, 8 ft. No portion of the roadways is to be enclosed in streets of less than 40 ft. in width, unless under special circumstances satisfactory to engineer.

The space enclosed shall be protected by a close boarded hoarding at least 6 ft. in height on all sides.

Such hoarding shall be lighted from sunset till sunrise by a good and sufficient light at each end.

When the hoarding is removed the surface of the roadway shall be restored to the satisfaction of the engineer.

Before any hoarding is erected a license must be obtained at the Town Hall. The fee to be paid for such license shall be One shilling for each foot of frontage, and $\frac{1}{2}$ s. for each foot of projection into the road beyond five feet from the line of kerb.

When the hoarding is removed and the road restored such license fee, less the charges for the privilege, will be returned.

The charges for the privilege to be paid to the Council shall be one-twelfth of the license fee for each month, or part of a month, such hoarding may be erected: Provided always that no hoarding is to be allowed for a longer period than six months, dating, as well as the charges for the privilege, from the day the license is granted, unless under special circumstances which may be satisfactory to the engineer.

In all cases where buildings of more than one-story are erected on the line of frontage, or within 4 ft. of the same, a close boarded verandah shall be erected across the footpath for the full length of the building for the protection of persons using the footpath; such verandah shall be at least 9 ft. in height from the said footpath, and shall be erected to the satisfaction of the engineer.

In all cases where it is necessary to obtain temporary access to the intended building by crossing the footpath the channel and footpath are to be protected by close boarding, chamfered at the edges, and secured by three strips of hoop-iron. These temporary crossings are to be constructed wherever the footpaths are to be crossed for any purpose whatever.
