1. For the use of the trunk line, £45 per annum, payable in advance; this sum to be charged in addition to the local Exchange rates.
2. Non-subscribers to the trunk line to be allowed to converse on the line upon payment of the sum of *One shilling and sixpence* (1s. 6d.) for any period not exceeding five minutes.
3. That a fee of 6d. be charged for messenger's services for calling any person required to converse with subscribers or others to the public office. That annual subscribers be allowed the use of the line at any time when the same is disengaged.
4. Subscribers to the Melbourne and Geelong local Exchanges may use the line when required by paying a toll fee of 1s. 6d. for each connection of five minutes duration or fraction thereof, provided a sum of money equal to their estimated requirements for, say one month, be paid in advance. All accounts to be rendered monthly, re-imbursments to be promptly made, and no connections to be made after notification that the advance has been exhausted.
5. Public offices will be established in Melbourne and Geelong, where persons not subscribers to either Exchange may, on application thereat, be allowed the use of the line and instruments, and be connected with any subscriber at the other end, or may converse with any other person at the other end, who may be in attendance by appointment, on paying the toll fee of 1s. 6d. for each connection of five minutes duration or fraction thereof.
6. Upon payment of the fee of 6d., in addition to the telephone toll fee, a messenger will be despatched to call any person the applicant may desire to converse with, provided the place of business or residence of such person be within a radius of 1½ miles from the office.
7. No person, whether an annual subscriber, toll subscriber, or otherwise, to be allowed the use of the line for more than five (5) minutes consecutively if other applicants are waiting to use it; but, if the line be disengaged, an extension of time may be granted to annual subscribers without further fee, and to others on paying an additional fee of 1s. 6d. for every five minutes or portion thereof.

THE Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order the following additions to the Regulations for Volunteer Cadet Corps made on the 29th day of August, 1887, that is to say:—

EFFECTIVE ALLOWANCE.

ADDITIONS TO THE REGULATIONS FOR CADET CORPS.

Para. 31.—
During the month of January of each year the following annual allowance will be paid, subject to the amount being voted by Parliament, viz.:

Battalion Commanders	£10 0 0
Officers (Commissioned) in command of detachments	3 0 0 each.
Officers not in command of detachments	2 0 0 "
Cadets	0 10 0 "
Senior Cadets (between 15 and 19 years old)	1 0 0 "
Expenses incidental to musketry practice, drills, camps, and exercises, £2 each detachment.	

In order that the above amounts may be claimed, the following conditions must be observed:—

Officers.

(a) Each officer must provide his own uniform of the regulation pattern, and must have been appointed and confirmed in his appointment to his detachment three months previous to the 30th of June, 1889, and in each succeeding year previous to the 31st of October.

(b) The allowance to officers may be stopped or reduced at the discretion of the Commandant if, in the opinion of the inspecting officer, the battalion or detachment is not in a satisfactory state.

(c) Officers in command of detachments must keep a complete record of all drills and rifle practice of their detachments, to be produced at the official inspection, and provide the necessary books showing the payments received and the expenditure incurred by them on behalf of their detachments.

(d) No payments will be made to officers of detachments which have been disbanded during the periods above named, or to any officer unconnected with an effective detachment.

(e) In the event of an officer in command of a detachment being transferred or removed from a school in which a detachment exists, he shall render to his successor, as officer of the detachment, or, failing such being appointed, to the principal or head master of the school, a true and correct account of all receipts and expenditure received and incurred up to date, before being relieved of his responsibility.

(f) Every officer in command of a detachment, or, where no officer is appointed and confirmed in his appointment, the principal or head master of the school, shall sign the approved document making himself personally responsible for the disbursement of the effective allowance. If he declines to do this, the Corps will be disbanded.

Cadets.

Para. 32.—

(a) The effective allowance will be paid for all cadets in uniform inspected by the Head Quarters Cadet Staff, or an officer appointed by the Commandant, between the 1st of July and the 31st of December, 1889, and in each succeeding year previous to the 30th of November.

(b) At the official inspection a certificate from the officer in charge, or, in the case of no officer being appointed, the principal or head master of the school, must be produced, showing that each cadet has attended at least 12 detachment drills and 3 battalion parades during the current year, and has also gone through the musketry course for the same period as directed by the Commandant.

(c) In detachments without an officer, no allowance will be made unless the detachment is instructed in drill and put through the musketry course by some competent person to be approved by the Commandant.

Detachments.

Para. 33.—
The allowance of £2 per detachment will not be paid unless at the official inspection at least 20 effective cadets are on the roll of the detachment. This allowance may be stopped or reduced by the Commandant if, in the opinion of the inspecting officer, the detachment is in an unsatisfactory state.

Payments.

Para. 34.—
(a) The effective allowance for officers, cadets, and detachments, if approved by the Commandant, will be drawn by the officer commanding each detachment, or, failing such officer being in charge, by the principal or head master of the school, and shall be applied to the supply and maintenance of uniform, expenses incidental to musketry practices, drills, camps, and exercises. On no account is any allowance to be given to a cadet.

(b) All claims for effective allowance must be rendered on the forms supplied from Head Quarters, and before being paid must be countersigned by the inspecting officer and approved by the Commandant.

NORTH BOORT IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATIONS FOR THE ELECTION OF COMMISSIONERS AMENDED.

WHEREAS by section 63 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, No. 898, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, make, alter, and repeal regulations relating to any Trust appointed under the said Act, for the purposes, among others, following:—

1. For determining the period for which commissioners of any trust shall hold office, the time and manner of election, and the order of their retirement from office.
2. For determining the manner in which elections of any such commissioners shall be held, and the mode of voting thereat.

Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth order that clauses 3 and 4 of certain regulations bearing date the 3rd day of September, 1888, providing for the election of commissioners of the North Boort Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 7th day of September, 1888, shall be and the same are hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof, the following shall be and be deemed to be and may be cited as clauses 3 and 4 respectively of the said regulations:—

3. *Annual retirement of commissioners.*—Two commissioners shall retire annually, but the retiring commissioners shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be eligible for re-election.
4. *Term of office of persons elected commissioners at first election.*—At the first election of commissioners two of the persons elected commissioners shall hold office as such commissioners for the term of three years, two others of such persons shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining two persons elected as such commissioners shall hold office for the term of one year; and the particular term for which each such person so elected a commissioner shall hold office shall be determined in the manner following (that is to say):—

(a) *How term of office is ascertained when no poll taken.*—If the first election is made without a poll, as in the case of these regulations provided, then the particular term for which each candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office shall, immediately upon such election, be publicly determined by lot by the returning officer, in such manner as to him may seem fit, and the returning officer shall thereupon immediately, and publicly, announce the term for which each individual candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

(b) *How term of office ascertained when poll taken.*—If at the first election a poll shall be held as in these regulations provided, then of the six candidates elected as commissioners the two candidates who shall have received the highest number of votes shall hold office as commissioners for the term of three years, the two candidates who shall have received the next highest number of votes shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining two candidates who shall have been elected shall hold office for the term of one year; and if two or more than two candidates elected shall have obtained the same number of votes, then the returning officer shall determine by lot (as hereinbefore provided in the case of the first election if decided without ballot) the term or terms of three, two, or one year or years during which such candidates shall respectively hold office. But so that no candidate elected shall hold office for a shorter time than the term during which any other candidate who shall have obtained a less number of votes shall hold office. And the returning officer shall publicly declare the respective terms during which the several candidates shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by section 250 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, No. 898, it is enacted that the Governor in Council shall have power from time to time, on the application of any Trust or any other body or persons authorized by the now in part recited Act, to construct waterworks, and after any such Trust, body, or persons has or have, by Order in Council, been duly appointed or authorized to make additional orders relating to such Trust, body, or persons not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act; but that no such additional order shall in any manner whatever lessen or diminish any liability or obligation previously incurred or imposed upon any such Trust, or body, or persons from any such liability or obligation, and that the Governor in Council may in such additional Orders in Council (among other things)—

Make any order which might have been made in the Order in Council originally, appointing or authorizing such Trust, body, or persons;

Repeal any of the provisions of any previous Order in Council relating to such Trust, body, or persons.

And whereas by a certain Order in Council, bearing date the 3rd day of September, 1888, the Governor in Council duly constituted and appointed a certain Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, known as the North Boort Irrigation and Water Supply Trust (hereinafter called "the said Trust"), and in and by clause 9 of the said Order in Council ordered that the number of persons to be elected as Commissioners of the said Trust shall be nine, and the period for which such Commissioners shall hold office shall be three years.

1. That clause 9 of the said Order in Council bearing date as aforesaid, shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be and be deemed to be and may be cited as clause 9 of the said Order in Council:—

9. That the number of persons to be elected as Commissioners of the North Boort Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be six, and the period for which such Commissioners shall hold office shall be three years.

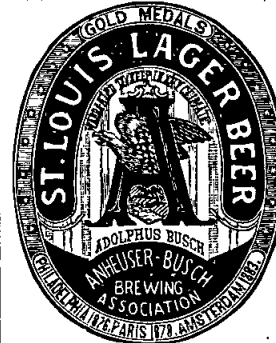

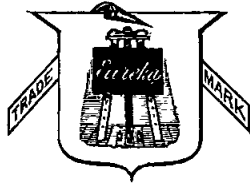
