"THE IRRIGATION ACT 1886."

IN the matter of the Petition of Frederick Murray and others, praying for the constitution of certain lands situate in the parishes of Mincha, Mincha West, Patho, and Macorna, in the county of Gunbower, in the colony of Victoria, as an Irrigation and Water Supply District within the meaning of the said Act, and for the appointment and creation of a Trust for such district.

Pursuant to section 18 of the said Act, I hereby declare upon the said petition the matters following, viz.:—

1. That the scheme or plan of the proposed works shall be—An intake, with regulating works, on the south bank of the River Murray, at a point about twelve miles east of the southern boundary of Kow Swamp; thence a supply channel to the swamp, which will be converted into a storage basin by means of a weir at its north-west side; the channel from the Murray, and

the auxiliary works thereof at present existing, which will be taken over as National works from the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust; a pumping plant on the Mount Hope Creek, at a point about two miles above where it flows into the swamp; a main channel to be supplied by the pumps following the natural contour of the country round the northern flank of Mount Hope; thence across the Pyramid Creek to the boundary of the district of the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust; thence along the road forming the eastern boundary of that district for a distance of about three miles and a half; and distributary channels for the reticulation of the district.

2. That all the works at the intake, the channel to the Kow Swamp, and all works for the conversion of the latter into a storage basin shall be National works. The pumping plant, main and distributary channels, and the auxiliary works connected therewith shall be Trust works.

3. That the amount which it is proposed that the Board of Land and Works shall advance, by way of loan, for Trust works shall be Twenty-four thousand five hundred pounds (£24,500) sterling.

4. That the rate of interest to be paid by the Trust upon such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum.

5. That the rate at which the Trust shall pay for water supplied from National works shall be a proportion of the total charges for interest, management, and maintenance of such works equivalent to the proportion of water delivered from them to the Trust. The quantity of water to be delivered to such Trust being 16 per centum of the total supply, the Trust will have to pay as its proportion of the annual charges a like percentage of their total, and, as far as can be at present ascertained, the amount to be annually paid by the Trust will be £905.

6. That the quantity of water which the Trust shall be entitled and required to take from National works shall be a volume of 1,581 cubic feet per minute from the 1st day of July to the 30th day of November, and 1,008 cubic feet per minute from the 1st day of December to the 30th day of April, in each year.

7. That the powers of rating to be given to the Trust shall be Five shillings in the pound of the annual value of the property rated within the Trust district.

REGULATION No. 1.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Woodend Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, make the Regulation following:—

1. The following rates and charges are those respectively which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust District, that is to say:—

1. For every house or tenement, used wholly or partly as a domicile, at a rate of One shilling in the £ on the shire assessment. Minimum, as fixed by the Governor in Council, Twenty shillings.

2. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Twenty shillings per boiler per annum.

3. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement by the Trust), One shilling and sixpence for every one thousand gallons.

4. Any person who may or shall obtain water, or may be supplied with water, from the public stand-pipes, or any or either of them in the said district, shall pay the sum of Ten shillings per annum.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when water is supplied by measure shall be:—

1. If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

2. If for other than domestic purposes only, thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

3. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1890, commencing from the 1st of January, as also the charges for every steam boiler, and for water supplied from public stand-pipes, and shall be payable in one payment on the 1st day of July, 1890.

4. All other charges by measurement shall be paid half-yearly on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July.

5. Such person or persons as the commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose, are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

As of a greater quantity or weight than appears in any invoice or entry of such goods, or which on being shipped or brought to any quay, wharf, or other place to be shipped for exportation, shall on examination by the proper officers of Customs be found not to agree with the entry thereof in the shipping bill or other proper document for allowance of drawback on shipment, or to be of less value for home use than the amount of drawback claimed,

every such person shall in any and every such case forfeit the sum of One hundred pounds or treble the amount of the drawback claimed, at the election of the Commissioner, and all such goods and the package containing the same with all other the contents therein shall be forfeited.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the annexed Regulations under *The Marine Board Act 1887*, and has ordered that such Regulations shall come into force on and after the 1st January, 1890.

COMPASSES.—REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by Section 40 of *The Marine Board Act 1887* it is amongst other things enacted that the Marine Board of Victoria may, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make Regulations for the Adjustment of Compasses and the Transmission of Deviation Tables, and for affixing penalties to any breach of any Regulation made by the said Board under the authority of the said Act: Now, therefore, the said Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. *Short title.*—These Regulations may be cited as "The Regulations for the Adjustment of Compasses."

2. *Commencement.*—These Regulations shall come into force on and after the 1st January, 1890.

3. *Periodical adjustment.*—The compasses of every foreign-going steamship and home-trade steamship and every river and bay steamship, when the latter is employed in carrying passengers within the port of Port Phillip or within the port of Gippsland Lakes, and also of every foreign-going and home-trade ship, not being a steamship, when carrying passengers exceeding twelve in number, shall, at least once in every thirteen months, be properly examined, repaired (if necessary), and adjusted, and their errors ascertained by an adjuster of compasses duly licensed by the Marine Board. Provided that should the compasses of any such vessel have been previously examined and adjusted at any port or place, not being within the limits of the colony of Victoria, by any person (being duly authorized for that purpose by a competent authority recognised as such by the Marine Board of Victoria) within the said period of thirteen months, the certificate of such person may be accepted by the Marine Board as sufficient evidence of the correctness of such compasses, and satisfactory evidence of such examination and adjustment and of the good condition of such compasses shall be produced by the master of any ship on demand being made by an inspector or surveyor of the Board.

4. *Exemptions.*—The foregoing regulation shall not apply to any ship or classes of ships which the Marine Board may, by resolution, from time to time direct shall be exempted from its operation.

5. *Certificate by officers.*—At the periodical survey of any steamship, the compasses of which have been examined and adjusted as herein provided within the three months immediately preceding the date of such survey, the certificate, as prescribed in Schedule I. hereto, shall be forwarded to the Secretary of the Board, duly attested by the owner or agent, and signed by the master and mate, one of whom at least must have made the previous and is going to make the next voyage in the vessel; if, however, such certificate cannot be so signed and attested, then the compasses of such vessel shall be re-adjusted, the errors ascertained, and evidence thereof as required by the seventh regulation hereof shall be transmitted to the Secretary of the Board.

6. *Swinging-buoys.*—Where the compasses of any vessel to which these regulations apply are to be adjusted, such vessel shall be taken to the swinging-buoys laid down for such purpose in any port, and the errors of such compasses ascertained and adjusted thereat.

7. *Adjustment tables, &c.*—A duly licensed adjuster shall, on completion of the examination and adjustment by him of the compasses of any ship, forward to the Secretary of the Board a table in the form set out in Schedule II. hereto (copies of which will be issued by the Board), and also a Napier's diagram, showing the deviations of the standard compass of such ship. There shall be attached to the aforesaid table a declaration by the adjuster that the compasses are in good order and condition, and such deviation forms and diagrams shall be filed in the office of the Marine Board.

8. *Compasses not satisfactorily adjusted.*—Where in any case the Marine Board consider the deviations of the compasses of any vessel have not been satisfactorily ascertained, the Board may order such vessel to be again swung, and the compasses thereof re-adjusted, and the errors ascertained.

9. *Repairs, &c.*—Where at any time any ship has undergone at any port in Victoria alterations or repairs necessitating the removal or addition of any plates, beams, &c., from or to the hull, boilers, funnels, masts, &c., or if the inspector or surveyor to the Board has reason to believe that the compasses of any ship are unreliable, then, notwithstanding any regulation herein to the contrary, the compasses thereof must be adjusted and the errors ascertained prior to such ship proceeding to sea.

10. *Southern hemisphere.*—Where the compasses of any home-trade ship are unadjusted for the southern hemisphere, such compasses shall be adjusted and the errors ascertained in the manner herein required before such vessel shall be permitted to proceed to sea.

11. *Standard compass.*—Every foreign-going and home-trade ship wholly or partly constructed of iron or steel shall be provided with a standard compass, placed in a suitable position, such compass and the position thereof to be approved by an inspector or surveyor to the Board; the said compass shall be furnished with appliances for taking accurate observations and bearings.

12. "Time Azimuth Register Book."—The equipment of every foreign-going and home-trade steamship surveyed at any port in Victoria shall include a "Time Azimuth Register Book," printed according to the form in Schedule III. hereto, in which the master shall record the errors of the standard compass (such errors being ascertained by taking observations as often as practicable), and shall also at the same time note therein the different points of the ship's head and the approximate position of the vessel; such register book shall be produced to the Board's surveyor or inspector on demand, and when so produced shall be initialed by him.

The necessary register books will be supplied by the Marine Board on application to the Secretary.

13. *Compasses unadjusted.*—The master of any ship to which these Regulations apply who shall take or attempt to take any such ship to sea, or engage in trade or in the carriage of passengers, before the compasses of the vessel under his command shall have been duly adjusted as herein required shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these Regulations.

14. *Licences to adjusters.*—The Marine Board may, on payment to the Secretary of a fee of Three pounds, issue licences to such persons as they may consider competent, authorizing them to examine, adjust, compute the errors of compasses, and transmit tables of such errors to the owners or agents of ships of which the compasses have been examined and adjusted as herein required, and such licences may at any time be suspended or cancelled by the Board.

15. *Adjustment fees.*—The fees to be charged by the adjusters of compasses duly licensed by the Board shall not exceed the rates prescribed by Schedule IV. hereto.

16. *Penalty.*—If any person shall be guilty of any wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in these Regulations he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Fifty pounds.

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board held the eleventh day of October in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognized surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognized surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognized surveyor.

IV. Or he must have completed the full course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and have served one year in the field as above.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with either of the above conditions will be eligible for examination.

The births of 1,452 children, viz., 728 boys and 724 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of September. In the month of August 1,478 births were registered, or 26 more than in the month under review. The births were 461 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 127 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in September numbered 642, viz., 373 of males and 269 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 910, or 142 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in August by 81, but exceeded the average of September during the previous ten years by 174. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by only 17.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.32, and of deaths registered 1.47.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 74.5° on the 26th, and the lowest was 32.1° on the 3rd. The mean temperature of the month (52.3°) was slightly more than 1 inch below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (33.2°) took place on the 25th, the least range (7.0°) was on the 13th. The mean daily range was 18.3°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.329 inches on the 3rd, and the lowest was 29.461 inches on the 26th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.937 inches) was about the average.

Rain fell on 14 days, the amount of rainfall being 1.51 inches. The average rainfall in September during the previous ten years was 2.08 inches, or about half an inch more than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 58 per cent., and females 42 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 34 per cent. to that mortality, as against the following proportion in the corresponding month of the years named:—29 per cent. in 1888, 28 per cent. in 1887, 34 per cent. in 1886, 27 per cent. in 1885, 38 per cent. in 1884, 32 per cent. in 1883, 33 per cent. in 1882, 28 per cent. in 1881, 36 per cent. in 1880, and 31 per cent. in 1879.

Twenty-nine deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these a farmer, aged 75, died of inflammation of the lungs; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 75, of nephritis; a female, aged 76, of pneumonia; a female, aged 77, of gout; a female, aged 77, of cancer; a gentleman, aged 77, of congestion of the lungs; a gentleman, aged 77, of softening of the brain; a squatter and a female, each aged 77, of hemiplegia; a painter, aged 78, of paralysis; a female, aged 78, of congestion of the brain; a female, aged 79, of gout; a female, aged 80, of heart disease; a female, aged 80, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 80, of enteritis; a female, aged 81, of pleurisy; a female, aged 81, of gastritis; a female, aged 82, of Bright's disease of the kidneys; a female, aged 84, of rheumatism; and a male, aged 93, of apoplexy; a seaman, aged 80, three females, each aged 81, a female servant, aged 88, two females, each aged 89, a labourer and a female, each aged 92, died of old age.

Forty-five deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 36 resulted from accident, 4 from homicide, 4 from suicide, and one from execution. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A railway guard, aged 30, a cab-driver and a seaman, each aged 35, a bricklayer, aged 37, a cook, aged 45, a bank clerk, aged 50, a female, aged 55, and a clerk, aged 58, died of injuries resulting from falls; a solicitor, aged 35, was killed by a pony falling on him; three firemen, aged 23, 35, and 38 respectively, were killed by a wall falling on them; a laundress, aged 48, a female cook, aged 50, a bookkeeper, aged 53, and a gardener, aged 56, were passed over by railway trains; a seaman, aged 40, died of fracture of the skull—how caused not stated; a farmer, aged 18, and a female, aged 24, of gunshot wounds; a gardener, aged 64, was poisoned with eucalyptus oil; a female child, aged 2, was drowned in a tub of water; a stowman and a labourer, each aged 24, a labourer and a carpenter, each aged 29, an engineer, aged 35, a male of occupation unknown, aged 40, a mining manager, aged 61, and a drover, aged 63, were found drowned in the River Yarra; a female, aged 45, was found drowned in Hobson's Bay; a female infant, aged 3 months, two female infants, each aged 4 months, a male and female infant each aged 5 months, were overlain; a female infant, aged 10 days, died of umbilical hæmorrhage. The homicidal deaths were those of three newly-born female infants, who were suffocated; and a male infant, aged 3 months, who was found in the Port Melbourne Lagoon—a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of a solicitor, aged 59, who shot himself; a female servant, aged 29, who cut her throat; a clerk, aged 18, who poisoned himself with phosphorus; and a male of occupation unknown, aged 30, who drowned himself. The case of judicial hanging was that of a cook, (a half-caste Manila man), aged 20, who was executed in the Melbourne Gaol for murder.

One hundred and thirty-four deaths, or 21 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—63 in the Melbourne Hospital, 23 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Homeopathic Hospital, 8 in the Children's Hospital, 2 in the Lying-in-Hospital, 10 in the Immigrants' Home, 7 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Austin Hospital, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Protestant Refuge, and 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 222, of which 118, or 53 per cent., were of males, and 104, or 47 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 143 were under one year of age, 33 were between one and two, 29 were between two and three, 15 were between three and four, and 8 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 420. Of these, 255, or 61 per cent., were males, and 165, or 39 per cent., were females; 27 were between five and ten, 15 were between ten and fifteen, 13 were between fifteen and twenty, 33 were between twenty and twenty-five, 24 were between twenty-five and thirty, 29 were between thirty and thirty-five, 34 were between thirty-five and forty, 24 were between forty and forty-five, 25 were between forty-five and fifty, 80 were between fifty and fifty-five, 47 were between fifty-five and sixty, 37 were between sixty and sixty-five, 28 were between sixty-five and seventy, 25 were between seventy and seventy-five, 12 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 17 were upwards of eighty.

The mortality from typhoid fever was lower in the month under notice than it had been in any month since October, 1887, and lower than in any September since that of 1885. Deaths from diphtheria, however, exceeded by 1 the number in August, and were, moreover, more numerous than in any other month of the present year except July. Deaths from whooping cough numbered 22, as against 19 in August. Seven deaths were set down to the consequences of childbirth, or 1 death of a mother to every 207 births registered. In addition to the deaths from diphtheria referred to in the last column of the following table, 7 deaths were set down to diphtheritic group in the month under review, 8 in August, and 16 in July.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in each of the first nine months of the present and the two previous years:—

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Town of Hawthorn has requested that the street hereinafter mentioned be so declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the land acquired or used for the street hereinafter named and described, and situate in the Town of Hawthorn, to be a Public Highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz. :-

WHEREAS by the *The Registration of Births, Death, and Marriages Statute 1865* (28 Vict. No. 246, sec. 5) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, divide the colony of Victoria into districts and assign the said colony and districts to the Registrar-General and Deputy-Registrars respectively, or to so many of them as he may think fit, and may define the limits of such districts, and from time to time revoke, vary, and alter such division and the limits of such districts: Now therefore, I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, do hereby define the limits and boundaries of the East Brunswick Registration District in manner following, that is to say :-

Commencing at a point at the intersection of Park-street east and Ewing-street, in the town of Brunswick; thence northerly by Ewing-street, Minnie-street, Trafford-street, South Audley-street, Carnarvon-street, and Victoria-grove to Albion-street east; thence easterly by Albion-street east to the Merri Creek; thence southerly by that creek to Park-street east; thence westerly by Park-street east to the commencing point.

STORES AND TRANSPORT REGULATIONS.

IT is notified that His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following Stores and Transport Regulations (made by the Public Service Board under section 95 of Act 773), and that they are to take effect from the 1st January, 1890, and to be in lieu of all existing Stores and Transport Regulations.

EXCEPTIONS.

These Regulations shall not apply to the following :—

Department.	Extent of exception.
All Departments ...	Contracts entered into by the Agent-General.
Chief Secretary ...	Contracts and agreements made by the Aborigines Board.
Post and Telegraph ...	Contracts for the supply of telegraph and telephone instruments and material, transport of mails, and telegraph material.
Mines ...	Contracts for connexions and fittings of diamond drills.
Defence ...	Stores required for troops encamped or on active service.

If transport be required for any stores included in the above exceptions, it may be obtained according to the Regulations.

Tender Board.

1. There shall be a Tender Board, consisting of the following officers :—

Secretary for Lands,
Secretary for Public Works,
Chief Commissioner of Police,
Inspector-General Penal Establishments,
Government Printer,
Chief Inspector Post and Telegraph
Department,
Secretary for Departments for Neglected
Children and Reformatory Schools,
Controller Naval and Military Stores,

Inspector-General Public Works,
Surveyor-General,
Inspector Hospitals for the Insane,
Inspector-General Education Department,
Chief Engineer Water Supply,
Engineer in Charge Ports and Harbours,
Chief Electrician Postal and Telegraph
Department.

2. The members of the Tender Board shall, at the commencement of every financial year, elect from among their number a Chairman and Deputy Chairman, who shall hold office until the end of the financial year in which they are elected. If any vacancies in such offices occur during the currency of any financial year, they shall be filled by similar proceeding. The Chairman, or in his absence the Deputy Chairman, shall preside at all meetings of the Tender Board; but if both be absent, the Board may at any meeting elect from among the number then present a Chairman, who shall preside at such meeting.

3. The Tender Board shall meet at least once a fortnight, and whenever specially summoned by direction of the Chairman or Deputy Chairman; but no business shall be transacted unless three members be present.

4. The Tender Board shall ascertain from the annual estimates, to be furnished as hereinafter mentioned, the quantity and description of stores likely to be required for the service of the ensuing year, and shall report to the Treasurer as to the manner in which the said stores should be procured, whether by annual contract or otherwise, and shall generally advise thereon. If in the course of the year demands for goods not included in the annual contracts be submitted from any department and approved by the Minister, the Tender Board shall give directions as to the mode of obtaining them.

5. The Tender Board shall take action as soon as the decision of the Government is notified to it by the Treasurer, by advertising for tenders or otherwise. The list of stores required for the service of any year shall be classified and divided into so many schedules as may appear to be necessary to admit of fair competition among manufacturers, merchants, and others in a position to supply, and separate tenders shall be invited for the stores described in each and every of such schedules. All advertisements calling for supplies shall contain the particulars of the supply, the period for and within which it is to be furnished, the amount of security required, with all other necessary information; and due notice shall be given of the day and hour on or before which tenders will be received. Any tender received after the advertised time shall not be entertained, and no tender shall be considered unless it be securely enclosed in an envelope, on the outside of which is clearly stated the supply for which it is a tender.

6. All tenders for supplies under these Regulations shall be opened and examined by the Tender Board, and numbered consecutively, and initialled, by the Chairman of the meeting. After consideration of the tenders the Board shall forward them, through the Treasurer, to the Government, with a recommendation as to their acceptance or rejection, and with such explanation as may be necessary. Should the rates named in the tenders be excessive, or should no tenders be received, the Board shall advise the Government as to the best course to be taken to obtain the supplies.

Secretary to the Tender Board.

7. There shall be an officer of the Public Service appointed as Secretary to the Tender Board, who shall keep the minutes of the proceedings of the Board and perform such duties as he may be from time to time directed to do by order of the Tender Board.

8. The Secretary to the Tender Board shall obtain on or before the 30th November in every year from every permanent head of a department an estimate of the probable requirements of his department for the year commencing on the 1st July following, which shall specify whether in his opinion the various articles should be obtained by means of annual or special contract, and whether locally or in Melbourne. Such estimate shall contain an accurate description of the various articles; and with it shall be forwarded samples of any new stores not in contract which it is desired to procure as per sample; also new samples if it is desired to change those already in use.

9. On or before the 1st February in every year the Secretary to the Tender Board shall prepare for the Board classified schedules of all supplies likely to be required for the ensuing financial year.

10. When a tender for stores has been accepted, the Secretary, on behalf of the Government, shall enter into a contract with the tenderer for the supply. Among the conditions of contract the following shall be included, viz. :—

- (a) That the goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.
- (b) That at the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted and shall return the order to the contractor.

- (c) That the acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions.
- (d) That if after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein; such stores may be returned to the contractor.
- (e) That in case of the rejection or return of any supplies the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned.

11. The Secretary to the Tender Board shall advertise in the *Government Gazette* the particulars of all accepted tenders, and shall be responsible that the particulars gazetted correspond with the tenders.

12. The following documents are to be retained in the office of the Secretary to the Tender Board:—

- (1.) The advertisement.
- (2.) The contract, including tender and bond.

13. The Secretary to the Tender Board shall receive all preliminary deposits and securities in connexion with tenders and contracts, and shall deal with them as the Under Treasurer shall direct.

14. The transmission of stores or parcels (other than those ordered to be delivered direct by the contractor) to country stations or to foreign ports shall be undertaken by the Secretary to the Tender Board, on receipt of a requisition (form No. 1) from the head of the department or sub-department requiring the service. When transport is required for stores beyond the limit within which the contractor is liable to make delivery, the order for such stores shall be forwarded through the Secretary to the Tender Board.

15. The Secretary to the Tender Board shall, on receipt of a transport requisition, obtain the requisite transport and forward the supplies to their destination, and shall also as soon as possible send a way-bill (Form No. 2) for the same to the officer to whom the stores are to be delivered.

16. All transport for bulky stores, other than transport by railway, shall be performed under a written contract. When the weight of the goods shall be such as to render it advisable, tenders for transport shall be called for by public advertisement, and the tenders received shall be submitted to the Tender Board for consideration. In all other cases the Secretary to the Tender Board shall make contracts or agreements with individual carriers at the most advantageous rates.

17. The Secretary to the Tender Board shall superintend the landing of all stores (except naval and military stores and stores for the Department of Trade and Customs) received on behalf of the Government of Victoria, and shall obtain such transport as may be required for conveying them to their destination.

18. The Secretary to the Tender Board shall whenever required to do so by the Treasurer effect or superintend the sale of any condemned or other stores and shall collect the proceeds of such sale, or shall otherwise arrange for the disposal of such stores.

19. All annual contracts for forage shall be from the 1st March to the end of the following February. All annual contracts for other supplies shall be from the 1st July to the end of June next following. Under special circumstances, contracts may be entered into for the unexpired portion of a year.

20. The Secretary to the Tender Board shall afford every facility and assistance to the inspector of officers in charge of stores and material in obtaining any information he may require in the performance of his duties.

21. The Secretary to the Tender Board shall publish in the *Government Gazette* notification of the cancellation of any contract determined before the date expressed in such contract.

22. The Secretary to the Tender Board shall keep the following books, viz. :—

1. The minute-book of the Tender Board.
2. The advertisement-book.
3. Register of tenders.
4. Preliminary deposit and cash security book.
5. Register of fixed deposits.
6. Register of complaints against contractors.
7. Register of transport requisitions.
8. Register of transport accounts.
9. Cash-book—transport advance.
10. Register of imports and exports.
11. Register of claims for damages and for short or non-delivery.

Mode of Obtaining Supplies.

23. Every permanent head shall from time to time submit, for the approval of the Minister, requisitions setting forth the particulars of all supplies required by the several sub-departments or branches of the department under his charge. (Forms Nos. 3 and 4.)

24. Requisitions for building materials and furniture shall be submitted for the approval of the Board of Land and Works. (Form No. 5.)

25. Requisitions shall be for such stores only as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the Public Service, and shall, if possible, be for stores of the kind specified in the contract. In all cases the weight, measurement, or quantity, and a correct description of the stores required, shall be given.

26. Permanent heads of departments in submitting requisitions for the approval of the Minister shall number them consecutively for every year and shall specify therein the contract price, and set forth the particulars in the same order as they appear in the gazetted schedule of contracts; if the articles applied for are not in contract, a requisition must be prepared (Form No. 4), and (if approved by the Minister) forwarded to the Tender Board, to be further dealt with as hereinbefore directed (clause 4).

27. The requisition having been approved by the Minister, any officer authorized by the permanent head of the department to order shall (if the articles applied for are in contract) issue orders numbered consecutively (Form No. 6) upon the contractors for the stores required. Should there be no contract for the articles required, the order to supply must not be forwarded until a contract has been entered into and gazetted, or until such other arrangements have been made as the Tender Board may advise (see clause No. 4). No order is to be made in excess of the approved requisition, and every order must state at what place the articles are to be delivered.

28. If the articles ordered be not duly received, notice thereof shall be sent to the permanent head of the department concerned, who may direct the issue of a duplicate order, or take such other action as he may consider necessary.

Supplies for Country Districts.

29. If the supplies be required for country districts, the contractor shall be directed to deliver at the place where the supplies are required or at some office in Melbourne or at some railway station or carrier's office for transmission by the Secretary to the Tender Board.

30. In case of the non-arrival of the goods within a reasonable time after the receipt of the way-bill (see clause 15), the officer in charge at the station shall communicate at once to the Secretary to the Tender Board the circumstances of the case, in order that such steps as may be necessary may be promptly taken.

31. If at any time the weight or quantity of the supplies received be deficient, or exceed that stated in the way-bill, the officer in charge shall point out the discrepancy to the carrier, and ascertain whether

40. Every officer authorized to take delivery of stores shall obtain samples of the material contracted for and shall retain such samples, and before taking delivery from any contractor shall compare the stores supplied with the order and with the sample or quality contracted for by the contractor tendering delivery. The production of the order shall be his authority for inspecting and receiving.

41. If, on inspection, he be satisfied, he shall give his receipt upon the order for the stores supplied; if he be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the supply he shall refuse delivery of the stores, and shall at once report the circumstances to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.

42. If after taking delivery of any stores or material he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material, and report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.

43. Every officer authorized to take delivery in Melbourne of stores for country districts shall, after inspection (if satisfactory), see that the necessary requisition for transport is forwarded to the Secretary to the Tender Board.

44. Every officer in charge of stores shall keep the following books,

- viz. :—
1. Receipt book.
 2. Store Ledger.
 3. Sub-Ledger, in which to enter material issued for manufacture and stores returned to stock.
 4. Record of condemned stores.

Custody of Stores.

45. Every officer in charge of stores shall keep a clear and exact account of all stores which may be placed under his charge, and he shall be held responsible for the custody and preservation of such stores. He shall obtain and file receipts for all stores and material issued by him (except provisions).

46. No articles shall be lent, sold, or exchanged, except upon the written authority of the Minister.

47. Every officer in charge of stores shall from time to time inspect his stores, and take stock thereof at least once in every year, or whenever called upon to do so by the Commissioners of Audit, or by the inspector of officers in charge of stores and material. If any deficiency be discovered, the value of any stores not reasonably accounted for shall be deducted from the salary of such officer.

48. Prior to the removal of an officer in charge of stores from any station, he shall balance his accounts, and shall hand over the stock and the samples to his successor. The officer taking charge shall ascertain that the stock on hand agrees with the accounts.

49. Every officer shall be held responsible for the proper application of all stores entrusted to him for use or consumption, and for the proper care and preservation of all articles in use, and when considered necessary by the Permanent Head of his department shall keep a book containing a statement or inventory of all articles and also of all live-stock in his charge. At least once a year every officer in charge or sub-charge shall forward to the permanent head of his department a return of the stores in use under his supervision, and shall report as to their state and as to any loss of such stores or any damage thereto which in his opinion may have been due to want of care. Officers shall also comply with any departmental instruction for the time being in force for the checking of stores in their custody.

50. At every stocktaking the officer in charge of stores shall make a return showing what stores (if any) in his custody he considers to be unserviceable, and shall apply to the permanent head of his department for the appointment of a Board of Survey to deal with them.

51. No articles shall be dealt with as unserviceable until they shall have been inspected and condemned by a Board of Survey, appointed under the authority of the Minister.

52. Boards of Survey shall carefully examine the stores condemned, and shall report to the permanent head of the department concerned, for the information of the Minister, if they can be utilized in the manufacturing branch of any department of the Public Service, and, if not, as to the best method to be adopted for the disposing of them.

Duties of the Inspector of Officers in charge of Stores.

53. The inspector of officers in charge of stores shall at least once in every year inspect the books and accounts of every officer whose duty it is to receive stores and material, and also all stores and material in stock and under the control of such officer, and shall take stock thereof and shall investigate and examine all contracts, accounts, invoices, requisitions, books, bills of parcels, and vouchers in anywise relating to or concerning the same, and shall ascertain whether the stores and material received by such officer have been duly accounted for, and also whether the stores and material in stock are in quality and description in accordance with the contract for the supply.

54. The Inspector shall forthwith after such investigation and examination in regard to each officer in charge, report the result thereof to the Minister administering the department.

55. The Inspector shall report to the permanent head of the department and to the Tender Board if any stores in stock are inferior to sample.

56. The Inspector shall in the month of January in every year make a general report to the Treasurer.

Miscellaneous.

57. All contracts entered into by the Secretary to the Tender Board on behalf of the Government shall bind the departments for whose service they were taken.

58. Every account for supplies furnished by a contractor must be accompanied by receipted delivery orders, showing that the stores described in such account have been received by the duly authorized officer, and no item in any account shall be allowed which cannot be supported by such evidence of delivery. If by any mischance an original receipted delivery order be lost or destroyed, it shall be competent for the officer by whom the stores specified in such order were received, and within six months from the date of such receipt, to apply to the officer who issued the order for a duplicate of the original order, and upon receiving it to sign and forward it to the contractor; but a short statement shall be written upon the face of such duplicate, showing the circumstances under which it was furnished.

59. All delivery orders sent in by any contractor with his accounts shall be retained by the head of the department and shall be attached to the requisitions for the information of the inspector of officers in charge of stores and material.

60. In special cases in which loss or inconvenience would be caused to any department in procuring supplies, &c., under the general provisions of these Regulations, articles of small value, repairs, transport of parcels, and minor services may be obtained or effected and paid for by the head of the branch concerned, who will be held responsible for any improper expenditure. All such transactions shall be registered in a book kept for the purpose, and such book may at any time be examined by the inspector of officers in charge of stores and material. The cost of goods or services furnished under this clause upon any one requisition shall not be in excess of Ten pounds.

61. If the permanent head of any department shall consider it advisable, under exceptional circumstances, to obtain supplies from a contractor of a quality inferior to that provided for in the contract, he shall report the circumstances to the Tender Board; and the Board, if it thinks fit, may recommend to the Treasurer the acceptance of the supplies at such reduced prices as may be deemed sufficient, and as may be agreed upon with the contractor. If the Treasurer approve, the Board shall notify the permanent head and the contractor accordingly, and he supplies may thereupon be obtained at the approved prices.
