WESTERN PACIFIC.—REGULATION BY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER PROHIBITING THE SUPPLY OF INTOXICATING LIQUORS TO NATIVES OF THE WESTERN PACIFIC ISLANDS.

A REGULATION

(Made in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific under the provisions of the Western Pacific Order in Council 1879)

To prohibit the Supply of Intoxicating Liquors to Natives of the Western Pacific Islands.

(L.S.) JOHN B. THURSTON.

26th December 1888.

1. Regulations Nos. 1, 2, 3, and 4 of 1879 prohibiting the supply of intoxicating liquors to natives of certain islands of the Western Pacific are hereby repealed.

2. In this Regulation the expression—
"Western Pacific Islands" shall mean and include any of the following islands or places namely:—

The groups of Islands known as—
The Friendly Islands,
The Navigator's Islands,
The Union Islands,
The Phoenix Islands,
The Ellice Islands,
The Gilbert Islands,
The Solomon Islands,
The New Hebrides Islands,
The Santa Cruz Islands;

All other islands in the Western Pacific Ocean not being within the limits of the colonies of Fiji Queensland New South Wales or New Guinea and not being within the jurisdiction of any civilised power.

"Native" shall mean and include in its reference every person in the Western Pacific not of European descent.

"Intoxicating liquor" shall include all spirituous compounds and all fermented liquors and any mixture part whereof is spirituous or which contains fermented liquors and any mixture or preparation containing any drug capable of producing intoxication.

3. If any British subject in the Western Pacific sells or gives or otherwise supplies either directly or indirectly any native of any island or place within the Western Pacific Islands any intoxicating liquor he shall on conviction thereof before the court of Her Majesty's High Commissioner be liable to punishment as follows:—

(1) Imprisonment for any term not exceeding three months, with or without hard labour and with or without a fine not exceeding Ten pounds; or,
(2) A fine alone not exceeding Ten pounds without any imprisonment.

4. It shall not be an offence under this Regulation for any person to give to any native for any urgent cause or necessity and without recompense or remuneration any intoxicating liquor when such intoxicating liquor is given solely and purely for medicinal purposes but it shall rest with the person giving such intoxicating liquor to prove to the satisfaction of the court the existence of such urgent necessity and failing such proof such person shall be liable to the punishment provided in section 3 hereof.

5. This Regulation shall come into force on the first day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

SIR.—I have the honor to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of an Agreement between the Governments of Great Britain and Brazil relative to Merchant Seamen Deserters, signed at Rio de Janeiro on the 30th of July last, together with a copy of an Order of the Queen in Council, dated the 17th of November, extending the provisions of the *Foreign Deserters Act 1852* to Brazil.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENTS OF GREAT BRITAIN AND BRAZIL RELATIVE TO MERCHANT SEAMEN DESERTERS.

Signed at Rio de Janeiro, July 30, 1888.

THE Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Government of the Empire of Brazil, Her Highness the Princess Imperial acting as

Regent in the name of His Majesty the Emperor, being desirous for the benefit of the commerce of the two countries, to facilitate the discovery, apprehension, and surrender of seamen who may desert from merchant vessels of either country, on the basis of a full and entire reciprocity, have agreed as follows:—

It is mutually agreed that if any seamen or apprentices, not being slaves, should desert from any ship belonging to a subject of either of the Contracting Parties, within any port in the territories or in the possessions or colonies of the other Contracting Party, the authorities of such port and territory, possession or colony, shall be bound to give every assistance in their power for the apprehension and sending on board of such deserters, on application to that effect being made to them by the consul of the country to which the ship of the deserter may belong, or by the deputy or representative of the consul.

It is understood that the preceding stipulations shall not apply to subjects of the country where the desertion shall take place.

Each of the two High Contracting Parties reserves to itself the right of terminating this Agreement at any time, on giving to the other a year's notice of its wish to that effect.

In witness whereof the undersigned have signed the present Agreement, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

Done in duplicate, in the city of Rio de Janeiro, on the thirtieth day of the month of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

WHEREAS by the *Foreign Deserters Act 1852*, it is provided that, whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are or will be given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of any foreign power, Her Majesty may by Order in Council, stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that seamen, not being slaves, who desert from merchant ships belonging to a subject of such power, when within Her Majesty's dominions, shall be liable to be apprehended, and carried on board their respective ships, and may limit the operation of such Order, and may render the operation thereof subject to such conditions and qualifications, if any, as may be deemed expedient.

And whereas it hath been made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities for recovering and apprehending seamen (not being Brazilian subjects) who desert from British merchant ships in the territories belonging to His Majesty the Emperor of Brazil, will be given under an agreement between the Governments of Great Britain and Brazil, signed at Rio de Janeiro, on the thirtieth July, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said *Foreign Deserters Act 1852*, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that from and after the publication hereof in the *London Gazette*, seamen, not being slaves, and not being British subjects, who, within Her Majesty's dominions, desert from merchant ships belonging to subjects of His Majesty the Emperor of Brazil, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships. Provided always that if any such deserter has committed any crime in Her Majesty's dominions, he may be detained till he has been tried by a competent court, and until his sentence, if any, has been carried into effect.

And Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said *Foreign Deserters Act 1852*, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is further pleased to order and declare that, upon and after the publication hereof in the *London Gazette*, the Order in Council relating to seamen who desert from the merchant ships belonging to the subjects of the Emperor of Brazil, made by virtue of the said Act, on the seventeenth day of May, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, shall be revoked, and the same is hereby revoked accordingly.

And the Secretary of State for the Home Department, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and the Secretary of State for India in Council, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Kennedy Shoal—Has recently been examined by H.M.S. *Paluma*, and was found to extend 2½ miles in a N. and S. direction and 1½ miles east and west, the depth on it varying from 2 to 9 fathoms. The shoal consists of numerous coral heads on a coarse sandy bottom. The least depth found was 1½ fathoms. At the point where the shoal encroaches most on the inner route the bearings are as follows:—Hillock Point S. 7½° W. Gould Peak S. 67½° W. Dunk Island (S. E. Peak) N. 69° W. Which agrees very well with the present charted position.

Shoal Ground Westward of Family Islands—A least depth of 15 feet, gravel bottom, was found on a shoal of small extent in the channel westward of the Family Islands. From the shoal—Mound Islet bears N. 9½° E. Gould Peak S. 22½° E. Tam O'Shanter Point (south extreme) N. 60° W. distant 1¼ miles.

According to information received from an English trader, there are only 2 fathoms of water on the shoal, which did not exist previous to a violent eruption of the volcano of Ambrym, a few months ago.

No bottom was obtained at a distance of about two cables from the shoal, which could not be examined, as there was no time available.

A reef is said to extend one and a half miles in a north-easterly direction from the next point to the N.E. of Dip Point.

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act 1865* it was amongst other things enacted that where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission shall have happened in the preparation or transmission or printing of any general roll or supplementary roll or ordinary electoral roll or roll of ratepaying electors, the Governor in Council might take all such measures as might be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission, or might declare any such roll valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission; and every such Order in Council should state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and should be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power in him vested by the 68th section of the said Act, doth by this present Order declare valid the General Roll 1888 for the Eltham Division of the South-Eastern Province, notwithstanding that the General List for the said division was revised on a day not legally appointed for that purpose.

WHEREAS by the *Dentists Act 1837* the Dental Board is empowered from time to time, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council, to make, alter, and repeal bye-laws regulating their proceedings and sittings, and the election of a Chairman, and generally as to the conduct of their business: And whereas such bye-laws require to be made, altered, and repealed subject to the approval of the Governor in Council: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby approve of the following bye-laws made by the Dental Board of Victoria, that is to say:—

PROCEEDINGS OF BOARD.

1. The ordinary meetings of the Board shall be held in the office of the Registrar or some other place appointed by the Board on every fourth Friday in every month, at the hour of 8 p.m., or at such hour as the Board may from time to time appoint.
2. Special meetings of the Board may be called upon the requisition of the President or any two members of the Board, provided that three clear days' notice shall have been given by the Registrar to the other members of the Board.
3. If there be not the authorized quorum present at thirty minutes after the expiration of the appointed hour of meeting, that meeting shall lapse, and no business shall be transacted.
4. At every ordinary meeting of the Board, after the reading and confirmation of the minutes of the previous meeting, the order of business shall be as follows, unless altered by a resolution of the Board to that effect, viz.:—
 - (1.) Correspondence and business arising therefrom.
 - (2.) Reports of committees.
 - (3.) Payment of accounts.
 - (4.) Ordinary business, including postponed and adjourned business.
 - (5.) Special business, of which due notice has been given.

REGISTRAR AND REGISTRATION.

5. The Registrar shall be in attendance at his office at such hours as from time to time may be appointed by the Board for that purpose, and be present at all meetings of the Board and committees. It shall be his duty to superintend the affairs of the Board under the direction of the Board and committees. The Registrar shall keep the books in a neat and orderly manner; he shall conduct all correspondence and issue all summonses, record the minutes of all meetings for business, and make a report of all dental matters that come under his cognizance for the information of the Board and committees. He shall consult the President on any business requiring attention between the various meetings, and be responsible for the safe custody of all the documents and property belonging to the Board which shall be under his control; and he shall find security in the sum of £200.
6. The Registrar shall receive all fees, fines, and other moneys which may become due or payable to the Board, and give a printed receipt, and no other, for the same, retaining a block counter-part of such receipt. He shall, once in each week, lodge in the bank, in the name of the Board, all moneys received by him.

TREASURER.

7. The Board may from time to time appoint one of their number as Hon. Treasurer, whose duty it shall be to receive from the Registrar a weekly account of all moneys taken, and to see that these moneys are lodged in the bank appointed by the Board to the credit of an account headed "Dental Board of Victoria," and to pay by a cheque, signed by the President, Treasurer, and Registrar, such accounts as the Board from time to time order by a resolution which shall specify the sums of money to be paid and to whom.
8. The Board may from time to time direct the Treasurer to invest any surplus funds over and above what is required for the working expenses of the Board, in such manner and upon such security as shall be authorized by a resolution of the Board.
9. The Treasurer shall present to the Board a monthly statement showing the receipts and expenditure for the past month; and he shall also, in the month of February in each year, prepare and present to the Board an annual balance-sheet, showing the exact financial position of the affairs of the Board.

AUDITORS.

10. The Board shall appoint two fit and proper persons as auditors, who shall hold office twelve months; and the Board may pay out of the moneys accruing under the *Dentists Act 1837* a fee of £2 2s. to each of such auditors.
11. The auditors shall inspect the books and accounts of the Board, and examine the annual balance-sheet prepared by the Treasurer, and shall certify to the same if correct; and they shall also investigate and examine all contracts, accounts, invoices, books, bills of parcels, and vouchers, in any wise relating to or concerning the same, which may be kept by or in the possession of the Treasurer and Registrar; and they shall also examine the bank pass-book, and ascertain that it corresponds with the account of the Board in the bank; and they shall present an annual report to the Board, stating the result of their inspection and examination.

STUDENTS.

12. Every dental student entering upon his apprenticeship must notify the same to the Registrar, with the object of being registered as a dental student, and must forward at the same time to the Registrar a copy of his indentures.

BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

BYE-LAWS.—MELBOURNE WATER SUPPLY.

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, make the Bye-laws following:—

1. All bye-laws heretofore made relating to the Melbourne Water Supply shall be and the same are hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed or the recovery of any rates due and payable thereunder.
2. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Board, that is to say:—
 - i. On every house or tenement of £20 annual value and under, Ten shillings per annum.
 - ii. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £20, a rate of Sixpence for each pound sterling on the amount of the valuation up to £300 inclusive, and One pound ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300.
 - iii. Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, a rate of Sixpence for each pound sterling on the amount of the valuation up to £300, and One pound per centum on the amount of such valuation in excess of £300.
 - iv. Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Forty shillings per annum each, except where in the opinion of the Board a meter shall be necessary.
 - v. Water for steam boilers will be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler except where, in the opinion of the Board, a meter shall be necessary.
 - vi. For water supplied to shipping the charge will be—at the Melbourne Wharves, Three shillings per one thousand gallons; at other places, Four shillings per one thousand gallons.
 - vii. Water for horses, where the number kept on one tenement does not exceed two, will be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each horse, and water for cows up to three in number, kept or partially kept on premises, at the rate of Five shillings for each cow, but it shall be optional for the owners of same to take the supply by measure.

In instances where the above numbers are exceeded, the supply of water must be by measure.
- iii. The Board may supply water for the making and mixing of concrete at the rate of Twopence per cubic yard, and for masonry and brickwork at the rate of Three halfpence per cubic yard as measured in the work.
- ix. Water supplied by the Board by measurement will be charged at the rate of One shilling per one thousand gallons, and in cases where the supply is solely for purposes other than domestic, the minimum charge will be 25,000 gallons per quarter.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes, as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which at One shilling per thousand gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

4. The Board may grant permission to persons requiring water for "domestic" and for "other than domestic purposes" to affix two service-pipes, one for domestic supply without meter for which the ordinary assessed rate shall be paid, and one for other than domestic purposes with meter, the water used therefrom to be paid for at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons, but subject to such regulations as may be approved by the Board against the use or re-use of water from the domestic service for irrigation or any other purpose not domestic.

5. Any person receiving water from the Board who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Board who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Board, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Board, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Board, he shall obtain from the Board a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

8. Such licence shall be for such period and be from time to time renewable as the Board shall see fit, and the Board may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof, by himself or his employés, committing any breach of these bye-laws.

9. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Board the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Board that he is a competent plumber.

10. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Board, without giving two days' notice to the Board of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Board, without the permission in writing of the Board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the Board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

11. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Board without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipe of the Board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board. Lead piping of the following weights:—

and galvanized iron piping of approved quality only will be allowed for external and internal services.

Ordinary connexions with submains must be made with proper stop-cock ferrules, to which, for iron services, a length of not less than three feet of lead pipe must be attached. One service-pipe only for domestic supply to each tenement will be permitted, and for houses rated at Twenty pounds per annum and under, the bore of such service-pipe must not exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ inch.

12. All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings. All joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper bit" joints be allowed on water service-pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of licence. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock shall be fixed on each house service between the main and the building line, and at a uniform distance of three (3) feet from the building line, to be properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap.

13. No extensions of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Board.

14. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Board into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Board that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Board may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said Board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none the owner, shall in every instance in which, after notice that service-pipe requires repairing, any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

15. Any person supplied with water by the Board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

16. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Board. Each meter must be capable of registering at least one million gallons.

17. If any meter should cease registering, or be reported by the inspector as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the Board shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Board may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe.

18. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to, and with the approval of the Board.

19. Baths to be fitted must not exceed six feet three inches in length along the centre line by a mean width of two feet and a depth of one foot nine inches; the section of bottom to be a segment of a circle, the ends to be circular in shape and sloping inwards. Overflow pipes will not be permitted.

20. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

21. No person shall, without the written permission of the Board, water streets or thoroughfares by means of hydrants and hose attached to fire plugs. Any person offending against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

22. The water supply to all public parks and gardens shall be exclusively under the control and direction of the officers of the Water Supply-Branch of the Department of Public Works, and any person not duly authorized turning on the water or otherwise interfering with such water supply shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

23. No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe (used for the purpose of supplying the water of the Board for domestic purposes to any house or premises) for watering any garden, laying dust, or for any other purpose whatsoever, unless where a water meter is fixed and the water supplied by measure; and any person offending against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

24. No tap shall be placed in any garden or yard or to or outside of any dwelling or premises supplied with the water of the Board unless a water-meter is fixed and the water supplied by measure; and any person offending against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

25. In the construction of these bye-laws, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole.

The births of 1,265 children, viz., 668 boys and 597 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of December. In the month of November 1,329 births were registered, or 64 more than in the month under review. The births were 431 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 215 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in December numbered 1,112, viz., 605 of males and 507 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 153, or 14 per cent. The deaths were more numerous than those in November by 293, and exceeded the average of December during the previous ten years by 476. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, the excess over that average will be reduced to 311.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.23, and of deaths registered 2.84.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 96.4° on the 26th, and the lowest was 47.2° on the 2nd. The mean temperature of the month (66.7°) was nearly four degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (43.3°) took place on the 3rd, viz., from a maximum of 94.1° to a minimum of 50.8°. The least range (8.1°) was on the 21st, viz., from a maximum of 63.4° to a minimum of 55.3°. The mean daily range was 22.4°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.196 inches on the 27th, and the lowest was 29.374 inches on the 18th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.884 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 9 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.72 inches. The average rainfall in December during the previous ten years was 2.41 inches, or nearly one-third of an inch less than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 54 per cent., and females 46 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 56 per cent. to that mortality, as against 55 per cent. in 1887, 50 per cent. in 1886, 53 per cent. in 1885, 46 per cent. in 1884, 46 per cent. in 1883, 48 per cent. in 1882, 51 per cent. in 1881, 42 per cent. in 1880, 46 per cent. in 1879, and 48 per cent. in 1878.

Forty deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, two gentlemen and a female, aged 76, 81, and 91 respectively, died of diarrhoea; a female, aged 82, of chronic rheumatism; a female, an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum, aged 87, of anaemia; a female, an inmate of the Austin Hospital, aged 75, a laborer, aged 77, an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum, of paralysis; a hawker, an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum, aged 78, two females, inmates of the Immigrants' Home, each aged 76, and a female, an inmate of the Kew Lunatic Asylum, aged 75, died, the cause set down being "insanity"; a laborer, an inmate of the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, aged 87, died of syncope; a mason, an inmate of the Alfred Hospital, aged 83, of senile gangrene; a gentleman and a female, each aged 76, and a female, aged 87, of heart disease; a female, aged 77, a medical practitioner, aged 82, and a female, aged 91, of bronchitis; a female, aged 78, of pneumonia; a furniture dealer, aged 82, of congestion of the lungs; a laborer, an inmate of the Melbourne Hospital, aged 80, of uremia; a gentleman, aged 78, of suppuration of the prostate gland; a female, aged 75, two females, each aged 76, one of the latter an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum, a seamstress, aged 77, a female, aged 78, a master mariner and a female, each aged 80, a naval pensioner and a gentleman, each aged 81, a tailor and a laborer—the latter an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum—each aged 82, a farm laborer and a female, each aged 83, the former an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum, two females, each aged 88, a male of occupation unknown, aged 90, and a female, said to be aged 104, of old age.*

* This woman had no relatives, and it is exceedingly doubtful if she had really attained to so great an age.

Sixty deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which fifty-two were set down to accident, two to homicide, and six to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 7, died of fracture of the neck, a wagon-wheel having passed over him; a seaman, aged 39, two laborers, each aged 40, and a female, aged 60, succumbed to injuries received by trains passing over them, and a bootmaker, aged 55, to injuries received by a cab passing over him; a boy, aged 10, and a laborer, aged 56, died of fractures of the skull, consequent on kicks from horses; a laborer, aged 17, and a seaman, aged 35, of fractures of the skull, through falling from scaffolds; a baker, aged 60, succumbed to injuries occasioned by falling down stairs; a laborer, aged 26, was crushed by a tram; a carter, aged 41, was gored to death by a cow; a laborer, aged 48, died of compound fracture of the leg, a slab of marble having fallen on him; a laborer, aged 47, through being crushed by machinery; a fireman, aged 30, of injuries received whilst intoxicated; a carter, aged 36, through falling from his dray; a fisherman, aged 69, through being knocked down by a horse; a laborer, aged 60, of internal injuries—how received not stated; a carpenter, aged 40, and two females, aged 17 and 33 respectively, of gunshot wounds; three female children, aged 1, 2, and 9 respectively, and a female, aged 59, of burns, owing to their clothes catching fire; a bottle-gatherer, aged 35, and a distiller, aged 65, of scalds. A female child, aged 2, five male children, aged 5, 7, 8, 8, and 9 respectively, four males, aged 10, 13, 14, and 19 respectively, a dressmaker, aged 15, a domestic servant, aged 19, a governess, aged 19, a gardener, aged 22, a printer, aged 30, a bootmaker, aged 32, a laborer, aged 34, a female, aged 38, a laborer, aged 46, and a gentleman, aged 67, were drowned; two female children, aged 2 and 5 months respectively, were overlain; a laborer, aged 44, was suffocated, consequent on his falling between trusses of hay in a stable; and a warehouseman, aged 54, was suffocated by gas. Of the homicidal deaths, a male and a female child were suffocated at birth, a verdict of manslaughter being returned. Of the suicidal deaths, a laborer, aged 32, cut his throat; two females, aged 30 and 38 respectively, poisoned themselves with "rough on rats"; a chemist, aged 28, poisoned himself with cyanide of potassium; a clerk, aged 51, poisoned himself with chlorodyne whilst of unsound mind; and a carpenter, aged 26, hanged himself.

One hundred and forty-six deaths, or 13 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—69 in the Melbourne Hospital, 18 in the Alfred Hospital, 4 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 8 in the Children's Hospital, 4 in the Lying-in Hospital, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 12 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 11 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Austin Hospital, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Industrial Schools, and 3 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 627, of which 317, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 310, or 49 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 528 were under one year of age, 71 were between one and two, 17 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 485. Of these, 288, or 59 per cent., were males, and 197, or 41 per cent., were females; 26 were between five and ten, 15 were between ten and fifteen, 25 were between fifteen and twenty, 31 were between twenty and twenty-five, 43 were between twenty-five and thirty, 43 were between thirty and thirty-five, 40 were between thirty-five and forty, 28 were between forty and forty-five, 28 were between forty-five and fifty, 34 were between fifty and fifty-five, 33 were between fifty-five and sixty, 39 were between sixty and sixty-five, 35 were between sixty-five and seventy, 27 were between seventy and seventy-five, 17 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 23 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from zymotic diseases rose from 123 in November to 191 in the month under notice. Under this head an increase of 53 took place in deaths from diarrhoeal diseases, of 23 in deaths from typhoid fever, of 3 in deaths from whooping-cough, and of 1 in deaths from diphtheria; whilst, on the other hand, a decrease of 4 took place in deaths from scarlet fever. Under the head of constitutional diseases deaths from phthisis increased from 73 to 92; and under the head of local diseases deaths from stomach and bowel complaints increased from 129 to 221. During the whole year 1888, deaths from typhoid fever numbered 328, and those from diphtheria numbered 138, as against 338 and 63 respectively in the previous year.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—
REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations made by the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust under the powers conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946.

REGULATIONS.

The Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, whose Waterworks District is contained and described in a proclamation dated the 29th day of December 1887, as the Town of Shepparton, has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, make the following regulations (that is to say):—

The rates hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of land and tenements shall pay in respect of the term of one year, from the 1st day of January to the 31st day of December 1889, in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rates to be payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year.

On every house or tenement of the annual value of Twenty pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during said year, the annual minimum sum of Twenty-five shillings.

On every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during said year, the sum of One shilling and twopence in the pound of such valuation.

2. The following shall be the charges payable in respect of water supplied by measure:—

- (a.) Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use or for the irrigation or watering of private gardens shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per thousand gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used for the above purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.
- (b.) For water supplied for manufacturing purposes, unless otherwise specified, One shilling per one thousand gallons.
- (c.) For stand-pipe or hydrant, water for each load of Two hundred and fifty gallons or under, sixpence, and for each additional load *pro rata* upon the above scale.
- (d.) Where water is supplied for domestic use, and is used to supply boilers for steam engines under ten horse-power, the charge shall be by special agreement, or at the rate of Twelve shillings and sixpence per horse-power per annum in addition to the charge for domestic use (except in cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power) in which case a charge by measurement shall be made.
- (e.) For water supplied to cricket and bowling clubs, One shilling per thousand gallons.
- (f.) For water supplied to gardens and nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per thousand gallons.
- (g.) For water supplied to troughs in streets, Twenty shillings each per annum in addition to the charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.
- (h.) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where it is supplied by measure for domestic use, the watering or irrigation of private gardens, or for any other purpose whatsoever, shall be the quantity for which the return would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable upon the premises so supplied if supplied under the rating or otherwise than by measure.

4. All accounts for water supplied under special agreement or by measure shall be paid monthly or as may be agreed upon.

5. Where water is supplied for domestic use, except when paid for by meter or under special agreement, the supply shall be through separate service-pipes of the following diameter, according to the assessed value annually of the premises supplied, as follows:—

- (1.) For premises assessed at or under £20 (£in.) half-inch pipe.
- (2.) And more than £20 per annum to £100 (£in.) three-quarters of an inch pipe.
- (3.) Over £100 per annum (lin.) one-inch pipe.

6. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carrier's stables, or for manufacturing purposes, or for irrigation (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants without labour) or for water power of fountains, fishponds, or for any ornamental or other purpose not provided in these regulations.

7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe, or alter, repair, or in any measure interfere with any pipe belonging to the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a license or authority in that behalf to execute such works.

8. No person shall be authorised or allowed to lay private service-pipes, and attach the same to any pipe of the Trust, or to any private service-pipe already connected with the pipes laid down by the Trust unless he can satisfy the Trust or their officer that he is competent to execute such work.

9. No private service whatsoever to be laid or extension made from one tenement to another by any authorised person unless he has ascertained at the office of the Trust that the person for whom such work is intended has duly signed the required form of application to the Trust, and has received the consent of the Trust to execute such work.

10. Before any private service is laid, extension made, or meter affixed and attached to the service-pipes laid by the Trust or otherwise to service-pipes already connected, each authorised person shall give twelve hours' notice of same, and shall, after each service or extension, &c., has been completed, report on the prescribed form the nature of the work done, and lodge the same at the office of the Trust within twenty-four hours of such service or extension, &c., being completed as aforesaid.

11. Each authorised person shall be held solely responsible to the Trust for each service-pipe being laid and completed by him in a sound, competent, workmanlike, and durable manner, and to remain in that condition (sound and watertight) for a period of three (3) months after each service has been completed.

12. Each authorised person shall be held solely responsible to the Trust for any injury occasioned by him from whatsoever cause to the service-pipes laid by the Trust, their street mains, or other property, or whilst attaching services to the pipes laid by the Trust, or to services already laid and connected with the Trust's water supply, and any loss of water sustained by the Trust through such injury, or its ascertained value, together with the cost of all and every repairs necessitated thereby, shall be refunded by such person to the Trust within twenty-four (24) hours after the time of such injury having occurred.

13. Every person, previous to being licensed or authorised to lay private services, shall read the specifications in the office of the Trust, and shall sign in witness thereof his name and address, and at the same time deposit the sum of Five pounds (£5) sterling as security for the strict observance and performance of the stipulations and conditions contained therein; and in case of the non-observance and non-performance of any of the stipulations and conditions aforesaid, the Trust may cancel such license or authority, and shall be entitled to declare such deposit to be absolutely forfeited as liquidated damages, and the name of such person may at once be struck off the roll of those authorised to lay private services, and the same may be published in any local paper.

14. Provided that the period of maintenance of private services laid has duly expired, deposits may be withdrawn at any time upon seven (7) days' notice in writing to that effect being previously given to the Secretary of the Trust, when the name or names of such parties withdrawing their deposits may be published as before described in a local paper; and the Trust reserves the right on their part to alter, cancel, and annul the term and nature of any license or authority to lay such services at any time.

15. The whole of the works herein referred to shall be carried out under the superintendence, and according to the direction, of the foreman of the works of the Trust; and any disputes between the various parties concerned as to the quality of work and labor done, or as to the exact meaning of the specification aforesaid, shall be referred to the Trust, whose decision in all cases shall be final and binding upon all parties.

16. *Quality of materials required in laying private services, viz.*—The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles, bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron, of British manufacture.

17. All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of same.

18. All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.

19. The whole of the tubes, tees, bends, &c., &c., to be perfectly new, sound, and free from all defects, and capable of standing hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet.

20. All delivery-cocks to be high pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern, to screw into elbows or bends, &c. All cocks to stand the same pressure as the tubes.

21. All meters required to be fixed on private ground to be of the best manufacture and pattern, and no meter to be provided and fixed by any person unless previously approved by foreman of works.

22. No service-pipes in private ground shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground less than ten (10) inches.

23. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission of the Trust, in writing, being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe-work, or engine the property of the Trust, shall be liable for such offence to the penalty hereinafter mentioned.

24. No person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust or service-pipes therefrom except according to the specification approved of by the Trust, and if necessary, subject to and under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Trust, nor shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust. Wrought-iron piping of approved quality only will be allowed to be fixed for internal services.

25. No service of a larger bore than one (1") inch will be permitted unless by special consent of the Trust.

26. Should any person allow any service-pipe or pipes conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person to remain defective or in want of repair after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe required repairing, the Trust may stop the water flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

27. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier or the owner shall in every instance in which damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, and in neglect to have such pipes repaired within twenty-four (24) hours after notice from the officers of the Trust, be liable to a penalty as hereinafter mentioned. The Trust shall have power, in default of such owner or occupier to have such repairs done, and to demand and recover by process of law from such owner and occupier all or any reasonable costs and charges the Trust may have incurred in laying all new service-pipes or in repairing or renewing any such service-pipes.

28. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty as hereinafter mentioned.

29. Any person who shall have agreed with the Trust for a supply of water by measure, or who shall be called upon by the Trust to affix a water-meter shall, at his own expense, provide such meter, and keep and maintain the same in good working order and condition, to the satisfaction of any officer or agent of the Trust; and in the event of any repairs being required, notice in writing shall be immediately given to the Trust, and the registration on the dial of the meter of the quantity of water supposed to have been used shall be taken before such meter is removed or such repairs are effected; and every person requiring to remove or alter the position of any meter shall give twelve (12) hours' notice to that effect to the Trust.

30. If any meter should cease registering, and during the time it is undergoing repairs, the Trust may estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous month or quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

31. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe, with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter shall be liable to a penalty as hereinafter mentioned.

32. No meter shall be affixed unless it is first approved by an officer of the Trust, and the dial of the same is capable of registering One million gallons (1,000,000).

33. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises to any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, or who shall allow any person to take and carry away the same, or who shall sell the water supplied by the Trust to any other person, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty as hereinafter specified.

34. Any person not having agreed with the Trust for a supply taking or carrying water away from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe shall be liable to a penalty as hereinafter mentioned.

35. The officers of the Trust shall have power at all reasonable times to enter any house, building, or lands to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust by measure or otherwise, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water consumed or supplied, or preventing waste, and to inspect and examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or lands for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus, the property of the Trust; and if any person hinders any such officer from entering or making such inspection, or effecting such removal, he shall be liable to a penalty as hereinafter mentioned.

36. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes to be done anything in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or to do anything which under these regulations ought to be done for the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption or contamination of the water, or wilfully or negligently allows the water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as the cause or injury remains or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Trust.

37. The water supplied in the above-named district shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid and affixed, and being under and in accordance with the same regulations, and not otherwise.

38. In the construction of these regulations the word "Person" shall be deemed to, and extend to, and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole; the word "Officer" shall be

deemed and be taken to mean an officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word "Trust" be deemed to mean the "Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust."

39. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of any of these regulations above contained and numbered, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five (£5) pounds for such breach, and in the case of a continuing breach to a penalty not exceeding One (£1) pound for every day such breach continues after notice of the offence from the Trust.

The foregoing regulation was made by the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, on the twenty-eighth day of November One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and to take effect from the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Rating Regulation for 1889, made by the Maryborough Waterworks Trust under the powers conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946.

REGULATION No. 8.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Water Works Trust, the Waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, make the following Regulation, viz.:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said urban district:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, used either partly or wholly as a domicile, an amount of five per cent. per annum on the annual value of such property.

3. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, not being a domicile, an amount of Three and a half per cent. per annum on the annual value of such property. Provided that in any case the charge shall not be less than the sum of One pound.

4. For every water-trough One pound per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs shall be 8,000 gallons.

5. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

Exceeding one quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum 16,000 gallons.

Exceeding half an acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum 24,000 gallons.

For every additional acre and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

In livery, carter's, and carrier's stables, supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses.

In open sheds used for the above purposes each space of five feet shall be charged for as a stall.

6. For water supplied to cricket and bowling clubs, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

7. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 4,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the first day of January 1889, and ending on the thirty-first day of December 1889, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the first of January and on the first of July 1889.

Such persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time approve of for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, and receive, and collect, and recover the said rate.

REGULATION No. 6.

(1.) A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling (except as hereinafter mentioned) on the annual value of all rateable property in the Yarrawonga urban district, to be supplied otherwise than by measure with water for domestic purposes, according to the valuation for the time being of all the lands and tenements comprised within the said urban district for the municipal rates of the Shire of Yarrawonga in Yarrawonga, is hereby made for the year commencing on the first day of January 1889, and ending on the thirty-first day of December 1889.

Provided that the sum of One pound shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated by the Trust within the urban district of Yarrawonga when the valuation of such house or tenement shall be under the sum of Twenty pounds per annum.

(2.) Such rate shall be due and payable on the first day of January and the first day of July 1889.

ROADS PROCLAIMED UNDER "THE LAND ACT 1884."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Land Act 1884 (No. 812, sec. 73) it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor might from time to time, by a notice in the Government Gazette, proclaim as a street or road or as a township any portion or portions of Crown lands, and the lands in such township, or within any city, town, or borough proclaimed before the passing of the said Act should be sold by auction in the manner therein provided for the sale of Crown lands by public auction, and the lands upon which such street or road should have been proclaimed should be and be deemed to be thenceforward dedicated to the public: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim as roads the portions of Crown lands hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

SHIRE OF MALVERN.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Malvern, made under section 215 of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 18, with respect to awnings or verandahs over public footways within the shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Local Government Act 1874*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Malvern order as follows:—

The word "portico" shall mean and include every awning, portico, porch, verandah, shed, shade, or covering upon or across any public footway for the purpose of shade or shelter, together with the supports other than the building against which it shall be of such portico.

Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, it shall be lawful for the owner of any house or building abutting upon any public footway to erect, or place against, or in front of such building, and upon or across such footway, such portico as such owner shall see fit.

Every such portico shall be supported by upright pillars or supports fixed on the outer line or kerb of the footway, and shall be in every part thereof of such height from the ground not less than seven feet, and, with the pillars or supports thereof, shall be of such shape, figure, dimensions, and materials respectively as shall have been appointed, as herein provided.

It shall be lawful for the Council from time to time to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following (that is to say):—

For regulating the height from the ground of such porticoes as aforesaid.

For appointing the shape, figure, dimensions, and materials of such porticoes.

And there shall be deposited at the office of the Council a plan and specification of such portico as shall be appointed in any such regulation, and such plan and specification shall be referred to in such regulation, and shall be open for inspection by any ratepayer or person interested at all reasonable times without fee or reward.

If before the coming into operation of this subdivision any portico shall have been erected, or placed against, or in front of any building, and upon or across any public footway contrary to some bye-law lawfully in force in that behalf, or if after such coming into operation any portico shall have been erected, or placed against, or in front of any building, and upon or across any public footway, otherwise than as shall have been appointed by some regulation to be made hereunder, or if any projecting window, balcony, step, cellar, cellar door, or window, or steps leading into any cellar or otherwise, lamp, lamp-post, lamp-iron, sign, sign-post, sign-iron, show board, window shutters, wall, gate, fence, or opening, or any other projection or obstruction placed, or made against, or in front of any building after the coming into operation of this subdivision therein shall be an annoyance in consequence of the same projecting into, or being made in or upon, or endangering or rendering less commodious the passage along any footway or street, it shall be lawful for the Council to give notice to the owner or occupier of such building to remove or to alter, so as to conform to such regulation, such portico, or to remove in such manner as the Council shall by such notice require to alter such projection or obstruction, and such owner or occupier shall within fourteen days after the service of such notice upon him remove, or in manner aforesaid respectively alter such portico, or such projection, or obstruction as aforesaid respectively; and if the owner or occupier of any such building neglect or refuse for fourteen days after such notice so served to remove such portico, or such projection, or obstruction, or to alter the same in manner aforesaid respectively, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day during which such projection or obstruction continues after the expiration of fourteen days from the time when he may be convicted of any such offence contrary to the provisions of this section.

If before the coming into operation of this subdivision any portico shall have been erected or placed, without violation of any bye-law for the time being lawfully in force, against, or in front of, any building, and upon or across any public footway, laid out as such hereunder or otherwise, and such portico shall not be in conformity with some regulation for the time being in force hereunder, or if any such projection or obstruction, as in the last preceding section mentioned, which has been placed or made against or in front of any building before such coming into operation as aforesaid, shall be an annoyance as in the said section mentioned, it shall be lawful for the council to cause such portico to be removed or altered so as to conform to such regulation, or (as the case may be) such projection or obstruction to be removed or altered as they see fit. Provided that the council shall give notice of every such intended removal or alteration to the owner or occupier against or in front of whose building such portico, projection, or obstruction may be, seven days before such removal or alteration shall be commenced, and shall make reasonable compensation, to be ascertained and ordered, if the parties differ, by two justices, to every person who shall incur any loss or damage by such removal or alteration, except in cases where the portico, projection, or obstruction shall have been erected, placed, or made without lawful right, or may be removable under some other Act or law, in which case no compensation shall be made.

Every owner or occupier of any building against or in front of which there shall be any portico shall keep the same clean and in good repair, and it shall be lawful for the council to give notice to any such owner or occupier to clean or repair such portico, if, and as, the same shall require; and every owner or occupier who shall neglect or refuse, within seven days after the service of such notice, to effect such cleaning and repair shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day during which he shall fail to effect the same.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Malvern, made under section 213 of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 19, with respect to spouts and drains from houses and buildings within the shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Malvern order as follows:—

The owner or occupier of every house or building in adjoining or near to any street or road, within seven days next after service of a notice by the Council for that purpose, shall put up a shoot or trough of the whole length of such house or building, and shall connect the same either with a similar shoot on the adjoining house or building, or with a pipe or trunk to be fixed to the front or side of such first mentioned house or building, from the roof to the ground, to carry the water from the roof thereof in such manner that the water from such house or the shoot or trunk fixed thereto, or from any portico or projection therefrom shall not fall upon the persons passing along the street or road, or flow over the footway, but so that no such pipe or trunk shall be an obstruction to the safe and convenient passage along the footway, and shall construct or lay from and in continuation of such pipe or trunk to the water channel a gutter, herein called channel, at the outer edge of the footway, and through under and transversely to the footway, such covered drain or trunk for carrying such water to such channel as shall be authorised or directed by some regulation in that behalf, and shall thereafter keep in good condition every such shoot, trough, pipe, drain, and trunk; and every such drain or trunk shall be constructed, laid and repaired, subject to the inspection of such officer as the Council shall have appointed in that behalf; and, in default of compliance with any such notice within the period aforesaid or with the provisions of this section, such owner or occupier shall forfeit a sum not exceeding forty shillings for every day that he shall so make default.

Every owner or occupier of land in adjoining to or near any street or road, if such land shall be so situated that surface or storm water from or upon the same overflows or tends naturally, if not otherwise discharged, to overflow any footway of such street or road, shall, within seven days next after the service of notice by the Council for that purpose, construct and lay from such point upon such land being near to the footway as shall be specified in such notice by plan appended or otherwise and higher in level than the bottom of the channel at the outer edge of the footway to the said channel, and through under and transversely to the footway, and keep in good condition such covered drain or trunk as and subject to the like inspection as in the last preceding section mentioned respectively; and in default of compliance with any such notice within the period aforesaid, or with the provisions of this section, such owner or occupier shall forfeit a sum not exceeding forty shillings for every day during which he shall make default.

It shall be lawful for the Council to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following (that is to say):—

For regulating the materials and the size, the level and the fall of any drain or trunk to be laid or constructed under any footway, either absolutely or with relation to the level or fall of the footway or channel, or otherwise in like manner, and so if they please, that such size be variable within limits prescribed in the regulation according to the discretion of such officer as the council shall thereby direct.

SHIRE OF MALVERN.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Malvern, made under Section 213 of the Local Government Act 1874, and numbered 20, to prevent driving and riding across footways and water channels, and for regulating the construction of crossings over same.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers, of the Shire of Malvern, order as follows:—

Every person who wilfully and without lawful excuse rides or drives any horse or other animal, or drives, or wheels any carriage, cart, or other vehicle upon, along, or across any footway or any water channel or gutter, herein called channel, by the side of any street or road, save in each such case upon and by, or at some crossing to be made as hereinafter mentioned, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and shall also pay to the council such sum not exceeding Ten pounds by way of compensation for any damage done by him to the footway or channel, as the justice adjudicating upon the information shall on the hearing thereof order.

If any land shall front to adjoin or abut upon the footway of any street or road, and if access with horses and vehicles from such street or road to such land or to some sufficient way appurtenant thereto cannot be had without riding, driving, or wheeling the same respectively upon or across the said footway, or the channel (if any), lying along the outer edge thereof, and if the owner of such land shall desire that a crossing for horses and other animals and for vehicles be made as herein provided over such footway and channel, and shall give a notice in writing of such his desire to the council, and in such notice describe the land in question, and the proposed work, by reference to the specification deposited as hereinafter mentioned, such specification being in accordance with the provisions hereof and with such regulation as may be in force in that behalf, it shall be lawful for such owner, after seven clear days from the giving such notice and not before (with no unnecessary delay or obstruction), at his own cost and under the inspection of such officer as the council shall have appointed for the purpose, to make such crossing according to the tenor of such notice and specification, and not otherwise, and the owner of such land shall afterwards in like manner maintain the same.

Every such owner who desires as aforesaid that any such crossing shall be made shall, before giving notice to the council as herein provided, deposit with the municipal clerk a specification describing the proposed work with respect to each of the several matters hereby or by any such regulation in force in that behalf required or provided.

Unless within the period of seven days after the receipt of any such notice as aforesaid, the council shall give notice to the person giving the same that (if the fact be so), such notice or the specification referred to therein and deposited is not in accordance with the provisions of such regulation as aforesaid, such notice and specification shall thereafter, so far only as affects the liability of such person to any penalty, be deemed to be in accordance therewith.

In streets or roads in which at the site of any such proposed crossing, there is a curb of stone or wood along the outer edge of the footway, the crossing so far as the footway extends shall have on both sides a curb not higher in any part than the surface of the footway at that part and similar in all respects to such first-mentioned curb, and such curb shall approach to and join the street-curb in gentle curves outwards, and such crossing shall be of such width, and the surface thereof so far as the footway extends shall have such inclination outwards, and be depressed so far below the footway, as shall have been respectively appointed by some regulation in that behalf, and shall with respect to the channel, be so laid or constructed as not to raise or obstruct the same or any part thereof.

In streets or roads in which at the site of any such proposed crossing there is no such curbing, as in the last preceding section mentioned, the crossing over the channel shall be such suitable bridge as shall leave a free passage for the water underneath the same, and shall be of such materials, form, length, size, strength, and fall as shall have been respectively appointed by some regulation in that behalf, and the surface of such crossing, so far as the footway extends, shall be so made good by paving, macadamizing, gravelling, or otherwise that the necessary traffic by animals or vehicles over the same shall not cause any damage thereto; but that such crossing shall be as sound and commodious for the passage of persons using the footway as the other portions of such footway adjoining such crossing.

If any crossing shall have been made in any respect contrary to this by-law or any regulation in force hereunder, it shall be lawful for the council, if they shall see fit, to cause the same to be altered so as to conform hereto and to such regulation respectively, and to recover in manner in the "Local Government Act 1874" provided the expenses of such alteration from the owner of the land to which such crossing shall lead; but they shall not so recover in those cases of departure from the notice or specification which the council or their officer might respectively have given notice of or reported, but failed to give notice of or report respectively in manner and within the time provided in the preceding sections hereof.

If any private street or road shall meet at an angle the footway of any public street or road, and there shall be no crossing upon and across such footway and the channel adjacent thereto from such private street or road to such public street or road, it shall be lawful for the council, if they shall see fit, to make in accordance with any regulation in force in that behalf a crossing upon and over such footway and channel of the description herebefore provided with respect to other crossings, and to recover from the owner of each of the tenements abutting on such private street or road such portion of the expenses of such making as shall bear to the whole of such expenses the same proportion as the rateable value of such tenement bears to the whole rateable value of all the tenements so abutting.

If any crossing across or over any footway or channel to any land or way appurtenant thereto, or to any private street or road, shall have been made before the coming into operation of this subdivision, but shall in any respect not be in accordance with any regulation made hereunder, the council may, if they shall see fit, cause the same to be altered so as to conform to such regulation; and if such crossing shall have been made contrary to any bye-law in force at the time of making the same, the council may recover the expenses of such alteration in manner in the last two preceding sections mentioned, according as one or the other may be applicable to the case.

If any crossing shall be out of repair, and the person liable hereunder to maintain or repair the same shall, for seven days after notice from the council to that effect, neglect properly and completely to repair the same, he shall forfeit for every day that such crossing shall remain so unprepared a sum of forty shillings, and the council may, if they shall see fit, effect such repair, and recover the same from such person before any justice.

It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following, that is to say:—

For regulating the width, depression, and inclination of crossings across or over footways and channels, and the materials for making and constructing the same, the mode of laying and bedding such materials, the length, width, size, strength, and fall of bridge crossings, and the said inclination and fall, either absolutely or with relation to the levels, inclination, or fall of the footway or channel or otherwise in like manner.

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or other receptacle, or from any inn, into or upon any street or road, public or private, or any footway or channel, and every occupier of any land or premises who causes or permits to run from such land or premises into or upon any such street or road, footway or channel, any offensive liquid or matter, shall, for every day during which any such liquid or matter shall so run, forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

When any building materials, rubbish, or other things are laid or any hole made in any street, road, or footway, whether the same be done by order or authority of the council or not, the person causing such materials or other things to be so laid or such a hole to be made shall, at his own expense, cause a sufficient light to be fixed in a proper place upon or near the same, and continue such light every night from sunset to sunrise while such materials or hole remain, and such person shall, at his own expense, cause such materials or other things and such hole to be sufficiently fenced and enclosed until such materials or other things are removed or the hole filled up or otherwise made secure; and every such person who fails so to light, fence, or enclose such materials or other things or such hole shall, for every such offence, forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day while such default is continued.

In no case shall any such building materials or other things or such hole as last mentioned respectively be allowed to remain an unnecessary time, under a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, to be paid for every such offence by the person who, whether by order or authority of the council or not, causes such materials or other things to be laid or such hole to be made; and in any such case the proof that the time has not exceeded the necessary time shall be upon the person so causing such materials or other things to be laid or causing such hole to be made.

Every person who wilfully sets or causes to be set on fire any chimney flue, smoke-vent, or stove-pipe, herein called in common "chimney," shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds: Provided always that nothing herein contained shall exempt the person so setting or causing to be set on fire any chimney from liability to be informed against or prosecuted before any court having criminal jurisdiction for such act as for an indictable offence.

If any chimney accidentally catch or be on fire, the person occupying or using the premises in which such chimney is situated shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings: Provided always that such forfeiture shall not be incurred if such person prove to the satisfaction of the justice before whom the case is heard that such fire was in nowise owing to the omission, neglect, or carelessness, whether with respect to cleansing such chimney or otherwise, of himself or his servant.

If any person shall, without the authority of the Council, break, displace or remove the surface or soil of any land belonging to or under the control or management of the Council, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
