INNER ROUTE TO TORRES STRAIT.

THE following information has been supplied by Lieutenant G. C. Frederick, R.N., commanding H.M. Surveying ship *Dart*:—
Oswald Reef, near Cape Melville, is 4 cables in length North and South; and 3 cables wide, with a general depth of from 2 to 5 fathoms. It has; however, several coral heads with not more than 9 feet, and one near its western edge on which there is only 4 feet, at low-water springs, and which lies in the following position:—

Lightship S. 20° W.
Sandy Islet, Pison Islands S. 64° 30' E.
Left extreme N. 37° E.

Taiwan Shoal has not more than 17 feet of water over it at low-water springs, and lies midway between e and g Reefs with the—

Beacon on e Reef bearing S. 34° W.
Beacon on d Reef S. 56° E.

Night Island:—The Reef off the N.W. end of this Island, of which a Notice was issued from this Office in December, 1887, has been found on examination to consist of a small detached reef, its outer or north-western edge lying N.W. ½ W. 3 cables from the northernmost mangroves of Night Island;

The main reef extends 2 cables northward of the Island, but all dangers may be cleared; and a good berth be picked up off the Sandy Beach; by keeping No. IX. Island; its own breadth; open to the westward of Night Island.

Shoal and Rock near No. X. Claremont Island.—A bank with 2½ fathoms on its western edge lies 3 cables E. by N. from this Island, and extends thence for more than a mile, with patches carrying 4 and 5 fathoms:

At 1½ miles E.N.E. from the Island is a coral rock with only 5 feet of water over it at low-water springs:

Rocky Patch off Cape Direction.—On the edge of the shoal water to the north-eastward of the Cape, and at a distance from it of 1½ miles, is a sandy patch with only 1 fathom at low water, with deep water close to, outside. It lies in the following position:—

Reef S.E. of Young Islet.—Careful search was made for the coral patch awash at low water shown on the Admiralty Chart as lying about 1 mile S.E. of Young Islet; but no indication of shoal water could be found.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

By virtue of the powers conferred by *The Cemeteries Statute 1864* (27 Vict. No. 201), the Trustees of the Mirboo North General Cemetery, on the thirtieth day of September, 1889, adopted by resolution the following Rules, Regulations, and Scale of Charges for the proper control and management of the said cemetery:—

- All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
- Application to make a grave or vault or to erect a monument is to be made to the trustees at their office. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in Schedule B, will be granted to the person applying on payment of the charges as set out in Schedule A.
- The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in the said cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion, or any other evidence proving to the satisfaction of any two of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.
- Orders for interment to be given either to the sexton or at the office of the trustees on the previous day. Six working hours' notice, from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m., must be given of each interment, and in default thereof an extra charge will be made of Five shillings or Seven shillings and sixpence for a public or private grave respectively, except when the necessity of immediate burial shall be certified by a legally qualified medical practitioner.
- The trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
- The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed. Unless otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals, will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., in the months of September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. the other four months.
- Every coffin in a vault or brick grave, to be bricked in, cemented, or covered by a slab of freestone, slate or iron; and a drawing of every stone, tomb, or pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet, proposed to be erected, is to be submitted to the trustees for approval. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.
- The plan of all fences are to be submitted to the trustees for approval. All wooden fencing must be after, and not inferior to, a model to be seen on application.
- No person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
- The ground will be open daily from sunrise to sunset.
- A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of purchased or other graves, will be kept at the office of the trustees, and can be inspected on application, at the charge set out in schedule A.
- The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in any of these regulations and charges.

And it is hereby declared that the said _____ shall be entitled to have, maintain, and keep up such vault, monument or tombstone, according to the terms of this permission to and for the sole and separate use of the said _____ and _____ heirs and near relations for ever: Provided—always, and it is hereby declared that this grant is made subject to the terms and conditions following, viz.:—*First*, that the said piece of ground shall be kept and used by the said _____ and _____ heirs and near relations, solely as a burying place, and that no other use shall be made thereof. *Second*, that no enclosing wall, fence, building, monument, or tombstone, shall be erected or placed on said piece of ground until a plan thereof shall have been exhibited to the said trustees, and their authority given for the erection thereof. *Third*, that the said grave or vault, and the said wall, fence, building, monument, or tombstone, shall be maintained and kept by the said _____ and _____ heirs and near relations in proper repair, to the satisfaction of the said trustees. *Fourth*, that the said _____ and _____ heirs and near relations shall, in the use of the said piece of ground, and access thereto, be subject in every respect to such rules and regulations as the trustees of the said cemetery may from time to time make; and shall not be entitled to exercise the right to bury or inter therein, except on payment of such charges as may from time to time be established by the said trustees.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Trustees of the Williamstown General Cemetery rescind the Rules and Regulations published previously by the Municipal Council, and make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.
2. Any person desiring ground for a private grave or a vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or for any other purpose in the cemetery, shall apply to the trustees thereof. If approved, the trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in Schedule B, or otherwise, as the case may be.
3. Any person desiring to construct a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection in any part of the cemetery, shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the time submit a plan, design, or drawing of such with full particulars for approval.
4. Any order for interment shall be given at the cemetery at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed without such notice.
5. The name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule C shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.
6. The trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, under directions of the manager, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
7. Every coffin shall have on the lid a lead or copper plate with the name of the deceased stamped thereon.
8. Every grave shall be at least seven feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than three feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground after such interment.
9. No interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial, or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.
10. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given in with the order.
11. No burial shall be permitted to take place in said cemetery without a certificate from a deputy registrar of deaths, or a coroner or justice of the peace. Such certificate shall be delivered at the lodge before the funeral enters the cemetery.
12. The hours fixed for burials shall be as follows:—On week days, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.; on Sundays, from 2 to 4 p.m.
13. No burials shall be allowed to take place between the hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m., except by special permission of the trustees.
14. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.
15. Every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance of the cemetery, and no vehicle, except the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter or to stand opposite the entrance gates. Breaking out of the procession after passing the gates is forbidden. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the cemetery.
16. Any person desiring to place any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a copy thereof.
17. No person shall put up any erection or place any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery without the permission of the trustees, and any workman (though not employed by the trustees) shall, while occupied in any of the works aforesaid, be deemed to be under the supervision and control of the manager, who may define his hours of labour within the said cemetery, and see that all work is completed satisfactorily and with despatch. All persons engaged in such work shall obey all lawful and necessary commands of the said manager.
18. Every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). No Bath, Caen, or other soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work. All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed at once. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of tablets or other exposed stone work.
19. All materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than four inches broad shall be permitted to enter.
20. No catacomb shall be allowed.
21. No wooden erection shall be allowed.
22. The trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment either in said or any other cemetery.

23. Before any such exceptional case can be dealt with by the trustees, a written application, setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and in the event of said application being granted, the permission of the Minister administering the *Coroners Statute 1865* and the Act numbered CCGXXXVIII, in addition to that of the trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight coffin prior to removal.

24. Unless otherwise ordered, the principal entrance shall be open daily from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

25. No child under ten years shall be admitted into the cemetery except in charge of a responsible person.

26. No smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery, nor any fireworks be discharged therein.

27. No dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery.

28. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, road, path, or any erection, or otherwise infringing the above Act, or any rule, regulation, or by-law made for protecting the cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.

29. No person shall take any flower or plant out of the cemetery.

30. The manager shall exercise a general supervision and control, under the trustees, over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.

31. No person employed under the trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment from the trustees.

32. Any person so employed accepting any such gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to be summarily dismissed.

33. Licences to grave dressers may be issued by the trustees in the form set out in Schedule D.

34. To encourage as much as possible decorating and maintenance of graves, the trustees will undertake the responsibility of doing same with their own staff of men, at moderate charges (see Schedule A).

35. The trustees will proceed to allot for new graves the four feet hitherto left between each line of graves unless the same be applied for as extensions.

36. A plan of the cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, situations and numbers of the graves, and a registry of all certificates of right of burial shall be kept by the secretary.

SHIRE OF WOORAYL.

BY-LAW No. 1.

A By-law of the Shire of Woorayl made under the 213th section of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 1, for regulation of proceedings, council, officers, &c.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Woorayl, order as follows:—That the whole of Part XI. of the 13th Schedule of "The Local Government Act 1874" be adopted, viz.:—

PART XI.—REGULATION OF PROCEEDINGS OF COUNCIL, OFFICERS, ETC.

1. In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2. At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as by this Act required; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the council at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting.

3. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follow, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i.) Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the council.
- (ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (v.) Payments.
- (vi.) Ordinary business.
- (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (viii.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (ix.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (x.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the clerk of the municipality, unless otherwise ordered by the council.

6. All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered and given by the intending mover to the municipal clerk at the close of the meeting of council, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting then three clear days prior to the next meeting of council; and such clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

7. No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition memorial or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of council after that at which it has been presented.

9. Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the municipal clerk in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

10. No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

12. Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment or taking part in discussion thereon shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

14. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

15. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded, but a councillor may however require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by directing the mayor's or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

17. The councillors in meeting of council shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of mayor, president, chairman, or councillor, as the case may require.

18. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. The chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

20. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply or in explanation when he had been misrepresented or misunderstood.

21. The chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice shall state the provision rule or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

22. No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.

24. A councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

25. Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and to apologize for such conduct and refusing to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.

26. Any person not being a councillor who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

27. Any councillor not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole council, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be guilty of an offence.

28. Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

29. The council shall vote by show of hands, and any councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

30. The chairman shall in taking the sense of the council put the question first in the affirmative then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. At every meeting of the council all motions whether original motions or amendments shall be reduced into writing signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

32. No second or subsequent amendment whether upon an original proposition or an amendment shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

33. If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

34. If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at a time.

35. The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

37. Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the council by the protesting councillor in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the municipal clerk, and signed by such councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the council.

38. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

39. If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

40. Minutes of all proceedings of committees as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute book, and being signed by the chairman of the committee shall be presented to the council; and the municipal clerk when practicable shall attend all meetings of committees.

41. The municipal clerk shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter by order of the council, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or of any two members of the committee.

42. No petition shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

43. It shall be incumbent on every councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that the contents do not violate any by-law or any provision thereof.

44. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

45. Every petition shall be in writing and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

46. Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

47. No letters affidavits or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

48. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

49. No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the borough, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

50. The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

51. No councillor or officer of the council and no assessor or auditor of the municipality shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the council or for any work to be done for the council.

52. In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

53. All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the council at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any ratepayer during that time.

54. It shall be lawful for the treasurer of the municipality from time to time, on the written order of the municipal clerk, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the council for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in any interval between two ordinary meetings of the council the sum of five pounds.

55. The common seal of the municipality shall be kept in a box having two locks, of one of which locks each councillor shall have a key and of the other of which locks the key shall be kept by the municipal clerk; and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the chairman of the municipality and one other member of the council, or in the absence of such chairman, unless two councillors be present.

56. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this subdivision may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the council.

57. If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this subdivision, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

SHIRE OF WOORAYL.

BY-LAW No. 2.

A By-law of the Shire of Woorayl made under the 215th section of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 2, for the purpose of adopting and applying to the said shire the provisions of clauses 41 and 42 of Part I. of the 13th Schedule of the said Act; also the provisions of clauses 11, 12, and 14 of Part VIII. of the 13th Schedule of the said Act; also the provisions of clauses 2 and 3 of Part IX. of the 13th Schedule of the said Act.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Woorayl order as follows:—(1.) That clauses 41 and 42 of Part I. of the 13th Schedule of the said Act be adopted. (2.) That clauses 11, 12, and 14 of Part VIII. of the 13th Schedule of the said Act be adopted. (3.) That clauses 2 and 3 of Part IX. of the 13th Schedule of the said Act be adopted, viz:—

PART I.—STREETS AND FOOTWAYS.

(9.) Obstructions, &c., to Streets, &c., by Cattle, &c.

41. If any cattle shall be found upon any land not being a common and such that there is no fence, whether upon the same land or any other dividing such first-mentioned land from any street or road, whether public or private, without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and the proper officer of the council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody; and any justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form addressed to such owner as "owner" only, without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood, may, after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear then as in other cases; and the justice may order the cattle to be sold and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the justice, of seizing, keeping and selling the said cattle, shall be paid if demanded within one month to the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded then to the municipal fund; and if the said money shall not be sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.

42. If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings, and if such cattle shall by reason of having been so found at large have been impounded by the council the amount of such penalty and costs if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle shall not be sufficient after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs shall have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered; and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known then the provisions of the last preceding section so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction shall apply.

PART VIII.—NUISANCES, ETC.

(2.) Private Slaughter-houses.

11. Except it be by some Act of Parliament otherwise expressly provided, it shall be lawful for the council (if the council shall not as yet have provided abattoirs within the municipal district and duly notified the same as ready for public use) to license, upon payment of such sum not exceeding Two pounds as shall be appointed by regulation in that behalf, such slaughter-houses (not being in any case within one mile from the corporate limits of the city of Melbourne or the town of Geelong) as they from time to time may think proper for slaughtering cattle, and every such licence shall be in force until the thirty-first day of December in the year for which such licence shall be granted.

12. Every person who without having such licence as aforesaid in force uses as a slaughter-house any place within the municipal district other than a slaughter-house which was in use at the time of the coming into operation of the Act numbered one hundred and eighty-four, and has so continued to be used ever since, shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and a like penalty for every day after conviction upon which he shall so offend.

14. It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following (that is to say):—

For the licensing (where the council are empowered to license) and for the registering and inspection of all private slaughter-houses:

For appointing, subject to the limits herein prescribed, the fees for licences and registration:

For preventing cruelty in such slaughter-houses:

For keeping the same in a cleanly and proper state, and for removing the filth at least once in every twenty-four hours, and requiring them to be provided with a sufficient supply of water:

For confining the use of licensed slaughter-houses to the slaughter of any particular kinds of animals:

And every person offending contrary to any such regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence a further sum not exceeding Ten shillings for every day during which such offence shall continue after such conviction.

PART IX.—MISCELLANEOUS MATTERS.

2. If any person shall wilfully, and without the authority of the council, cut break bark root up or otherwise destroy or damage the whole or any part of any trees sapling shrub or under-wood growing in or upon any street road or place under the management of the council, although the injury done shall not be to the amount of one shilling, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

3. If any person shall, without the authority of the council, break displace or remove the surface or soil of any land belonging to or under the control or management of the council, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

SHIRE OF WOORAYL.

BY-LAW No. 3.

A By-law of the Shire of Woorayl, made under 212th section of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 3, for the purpose of adopting and applying to the said shire the provisions of Part I. of the Police Offences Statute, sections 5 to 10, inclusive.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Woorayl order as follows:—That clauses 5 (with sub-sections 1. to XXIII.) to 10 of Part I. of "The Police Offences Statute 1865" be adopted.

5. *Penalty on offences relating to the good order of towns, &c.*—Any person guilty of any of the following offences, omissions, or neglects shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds:—

(I.) Throwing any glass filth dirt rubbish or other matter of a similar nature upon any road footway or public place:

(II.) Riding driving or wheeling any barrow or carriage up or along any footpath:

(III.) Placing any timber bricks or other building materials upon any footway channel surface drain or carriage road without the permission of the local authority having been first obtained:

(IV.) Burning any shavings or other materials upon any footway carriage road or open or public place:

(V.) Leaving any inflammable materials or matter in any public shed or place or on any open space near any building without having first obtained the permission of the local authority:

(VI.) Drawing or trailing any sledge timber or other heavy material upon any footway or carriage road to the injury of such footway or carriage road:

(VII.) Emptying any privy or cesspool or carting away any night soil or other offensive matter without a licence from and without having given such security as is required by the local authority:

(VIII.) Allowing any night soil or other offensive matter to be spilt or otherwise cast into or upon any road street footway or public place:

(IX.) Allowing the drippings of the eaves of any house to fall upon any public footway:

(X.) Placing any placard or other document writing painting on or otherwise defacing any house or building or any wall fence lamp post or gate without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof:

(XI.) Opening any drain or sewer or removing the surface of any footway or carriage road without the permission of the local authority having been first obtained:

(XII.) Neglecting to clean all private yards ways passages or avenues by which neglect a nuisance by offensive smell or otherwise is caused:

(XIII.) Rolling any cask beating any carpet breaking in any horse flying any kite using any bows and arrows or playing at any game to the annoyance of any person in any public place; or obstructing any footpath or carriage road whether by allowing any cart or animal to remain across such footpath or carriage road or by placing goods thereon or otherwise:

(XIV.) Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile to the damage or danger of any person:

(XV.) Having any awning on any footway in any public street or thoroughfare not being seven feet clear above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway:

(XVI.) Blasting any rock stone or timber in or near any public place without permission of the local authority and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such local authority:

(XVII.) Furiously or negligently riding or driving through any public place:

(XVIII.) Exposing in any public street or thoroughfare (except in any fair or market lawfully appointed for that purpose) any horse or other animal for show hire or sale:

(XIX.) Making cellar door or other opening from the footway of any street or public thoroughfare without the consent of the local authority:

(XX.) Any cartor plying for hire without a licence:

(XXI.) Any cartor waiting for hire allowing his cart or dray to stand in any other place than those appointed by the local authority or demanding higher rates than authorized by such local authority:

(XXII.) Plying for hire with any boat not being a steamboat at any ferry or on any river without a licence from the local authority or demanding higher rates than sanctioned by such local authority:

(XXIII.) Discharging any firearms or setting off any fireworks or carrying any firearms sword dirk dagger or other offensive weapon within any town or public place without permission from the local authority:

Provided that the provision last aforesaid shall not apply to any justice, or any person in Her Majesty's military or naval service, or any member of the police or other peace officer, or any member of a recognized volunteer corps, or any special constable, or any person actually in pursuit of any felon or offender.

6. *Local authority to make rules for boatmen and carters.*—Any local authority may make such rules and regulations with reference to the licensing of carters and boatmen, the places where they shall stand, the rates they shall receive, the distance they shall be compellable to go, and such other matters as may tend to the public convenience in regard to them as such local authority may see fit.

7. *Builders not to erect scaffolding or enclosures for building materials in the streets without permission of local authority.*—No person without a licence first had and obtained from the local authority shall erect place or set up or build in any public place any hoarding or scaffolding or place or erect any posts bars rails boards or other thing by way of enclosure for the purpose of making mortar or of depositing sifting screening or slaking any brick stone lime sand or any other materials for building or repairing any house or other tenement or erection or for any other purpose; and such licence as aforesaid shall specify therein the length of time for which any such hoarding scaffolding posts bars rails boards or other thing when so erected or set up may be continued, and shall contain such other directions respecting the same as are necessary. And if any person place set up erect or build or cause or permit to be erected placed set up or built any such hoarding or scaffolding or any enclosed posts bars or rails or any other matter or thing for the purposes aforesaid or for any other purpose without such licence or contrary to the provisions and conditions of such licence or be continued for any longer time than is allowed or expressed in such licence, then and in any of the said cases such person shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and also the sum of One pound for every day that the same has been and is set up and continued contrary to the provisions hereof; and the said local authority may four days after notice cause the same to be pulled down and removed, and the same and all the materials thereof to be kept and detained until such person pays to such local authority all the penalties incurred by such persons together with the charges of pulling down removing and keeping the same; and if the same be not claimed and the said penalties and charges as aforesaid paid within the space of five days next after the pulling down and removing thereof, such local authority may order or cause the same to be sold by public auction and the proceeds thereof applied according to the provisions hereinafter mentioned respecting the appropriation of moneys arising from forfeitures.

8. *Penalty on exposing articles for sale in public streets; articles may be seized.*—If any person expose for sale any article whatsoever on any footway or outside of any shop window or doorway abutting on any public thoroughfare or street so as to obstruct the public thoroughfare, he shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds; and if any article so exposed be not removed within six hours after notice, any local authority or any officer of police or any constable without warrant may seize any such article; and every such article shall be forfeited and sold and the proceeds thereof applied according to the provisions hereinafter mentioned respecting the appropriation of moneys arising from forfeitures.

9. *Local authority or justice may depute constable to inspect slaughter-houses, &c., and remove filth at occupier's expense if he neglect to do so himself.*—The local authority or any justice may authorize and depute any peace officer or constable from time to time to visit and inspect any butcher's shambles slaughter-house or yard or any house outbuilding lane alley or other place for the purpose of ascertaining if the same be kept clean; and such person so authorized shall, if it appears that any accumulation of manure dung offal soil filth coal ashes or other unwholesome or noxious matter whatsoever ought to be removed, give notice to the person to whom the same belongs, or to the occupier of the premises whereon it exists, to remove the same; and if at the expiration of four days after such notice the same be not complied with, the manure dung offal soil filth coal ashes or other matter referred to shall be removed by such constable or other peace officer at the expense of the person to whom such notice was given, and such expense may be recovered in the same manner as any penalty inflicted hereunder.

10. *Penalty on building chimney of inflammable materials.*—If any person after the coming into operation of this Act erect or cause to be erected in any city town district or place to which this provision may be extended any chimney or fireplace of timber or other matter liable to ignition or do not place for a sufficient

distance some matter or material not liable to ignition between such chimney or fireplace and any material of an inflammable nature or liable to ignition, the occupier of such house shall, on notice from the local authority being served upon him or left at such premises requiring such fireplace or chimney to be so altered as not to come within the meaning of this provision and neglecting after the expiration of seven days to comply with the conditions of such notice, forfeit and pay a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

SHIRE OF PRESTON.

BY-LAW No. 2.

A By-law of the Shire of Preston, made under subdivision 7, Part XVI, of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered Two, for fixing the levels of streets, regulating private streets, and filling up low ground.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Preston order as follows:—Sections 404, 405, 406, 407, 408, 409, 410, 411, 412, 413, 414, 415, 416, 417, and 418 of subdivision 7, Part XVI, of the Local Government Act are hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Preston.

404. Every person who intends to make or lay out any new street in any part of any municipal district to which the provisions of this subdivision of this part of this Act apply, shall give notice of such his intention to the council of the municipality, in order that the level of such street may be fixed by the council.

405. The level of every street not already fixed shall be fixed under the direction of the surveyor of the council, subject to such right of appeal as hereinafter mentioned; and the level so fixed, if not altered on appeal, shall be kept thereafter by every person erecting any house or other building in such street.

406. If the council do not fix such level within two months from the time of the delivery of such notice as aforesaid, unless the fixing of such level be delayed by the appeal hereinafter provided, the person giving such notice may proceed to lay out the street at any level which will allow of compliance with the other provisions of this Act as if such level had been fixed by the council; and in such case every change of the level which the council afterwards deem requisite and the works consequent thereon shall be made by the council, and the expense thereof and any damage which any person sustains in consequence of such alteration shall be defrayed by them.

407. Every person who makes or lays out any such new street as aforesaid without causing such notice to be given to the council as aforesaid shall be liable to defray all the expenses consequent upon any change of the level of the said street deemed requisite by the council; and any person who in building any house or other building in such street does not keep the level fixed by the council shall be liable to defray all the expenses consequent upon any change of the level of that part of the street on which such house or building abuts which the council deem requisite.

408. One month at the least before fixing the level of any street which has not theretofore been levelled or paved, the council shall give notice by advertisement to be twice inserted in some newspaper circulating in the neighbourhood of their intention to fix the level thereof, which notice shall set forth the name and situation of the street the level whereof is to be fixed, and shall refer to plans of such intended work, and shall specify a place where such plans may be seen, and a time when and place where all persons interested in such intended work may be heard thereupon.

409. The council shall meet at the time and place mentioned in such notice, and consider any objections made against such intended work; and all persons interested therein or likely to be aggrieved thereby shall be entitled to be heard before the council at such meeting; and thereupon the council in their discretion may abandon or make such alterations in the said intended work as they judge fit.

410. Any person aggrieved by any order of the council as aforesaid relating to the level of any street may, at any time within fourteen days next after the making of any such order, give notice to the council that he intends to appeal against such order to the next Court of General Sessions to be holden for the district in which any part of the street to which such order relates is situated, and if within eight days after giving such notice the party enter into a recognisance before some justice with two sufficient sureties conditioned to try the appeal and abide the order of the court, and to pay such costs as may be awarded by the court thereon, the order so appealed against shall not take effect until after the judgment on such appeal; and such court shall hear and determine the matter of the appeal, and shall make such order thereon, either confirming, quashing, or varying the order of the council, as to it may seem fit.

411. If the council deem it necessary to raise, sink, or otherwise alter the level of any street in which any water pipe or gas pipe, or other waterworks or gasworks, are laid they shall from time to time, by notice in writing, require the person to whom such pipes or works belong to cause forthwith, or as soon as conveniently may be, such pipes or works to be raised, sunk, or otherwise altered in position in accordance with the altered level of such street, provided that such alteration be not such as permanently to injure such works, or to prevent the water or gas from flowing as freely and conveniently as before; and the expenses attending such raising, sinking, or altering, and full compensation for every damage done thereby, shall be paid by the council as well to the person to whom such pipes belong as to all other persons.

412. If the person to whom any such pipes or works belong do not proceed forthwith, as soon as conveniently may be after the receipt of such notice, to cause the same to be raised, sunk, or altered in such manner as the council require, the council may themselves cause such pipes or works to be raised, sunk, or altered, as they think fit, provided that such works be not permanently injured thereby or the water or gas prevented from flowing as freely and conveniently as before.

413. If after the fixing of the level of any street, under the provisions of any law for the time being in force relating to local government, the council of any municipality alter the level of the ground in such street, save to conform to the level so fixed, the municipality shall make full compensation to all persons interested in any property injuriously affected by such alteration, and the same may be recovered by an action for damages in any court of competent jurisdiction.

414. If any private street or road, the property of more than one owner in fee, not being of less width than thirty-three feet, be at the commencement of this Act or shall be thereafter paved, flagged, macadamised, or otherwise made good to the satisfaction of the council of the municipality, then, on the application of the owners in fee of so many of the houses and lands abutting upon such street as shall in rateable value be the greater part of all the houses and lands so abutting, the council shall, by writing under the common seal of the municipality, declare the same to be a public street; and, upon the publication of the same in the *Government Gazette*, the said street shall become a public street, and shall thereafter be under the management of the council.

415. If any private street or road or if any part of such street has not been drained, paved, flagged, macadamised and otherwise made good to the satisfaction of the council, they may, by notice in writing, require the owners of the buildings or lands abutting on such street or road or such part thereof (as the case may be) to drain, pave, flag, macadamise, or otherwise make good to the satisfaction of the council, so much of the same to the centre thereof as fronts such last-mentioned buildings and lands within a reasonable time, to be fixed by the council, and the said owners shall within such time as aforesaid, at their own cost, obey such requirement; and if such street, or such part thereof as aforesaid, be not so made good within the time fixed, the council may cause so much as shall not be so made good to be made good, and the expenses which may be incurred by the council shall be repaid to them by the owners by whom such work ought to have been done respectively.

416. The council of the municipality may cause the footway or pathway in front of any house or ground along any street or private street within the municipal district to be flagged, kerbed, and paved or asphalted in such manner as the council think fit; and half the amount of the expenses thereof shall be borne and paid by the owner of such house or land, and may be recovered from such owner or from the occupier of such house or land in a summary way before two justices: Provided that no proceeding for the recovery of such amount shall be taken until at least one month after a requisition for payment of the amount hereinbefore mentioned together with an account of the total expenditure, signed by the municipal clerk, has been sent or delivered to such owner or occupier: Provided also that if the occupier of such house or land shall be compelled to pay for such flagging, kerbing, paving, or asphaltting, such occupier may either deduct the amount so paid from any rent then due or thereafter to become due to the owner, and the production of the receipt for the amount so paid by or recovered from such occupier shall be a good and sufficient discharge for the amount so paid or recovered on payment of rent to the owner; or such occupier may recover from the owner the amount so paid or recovered or any balance thereof after deducting the rent, in a summary way before two justices.

417. The council of the municipality may, by notice signed by the municipal clerk and delivered to the owner or left at his last known place of abode or at the residence of any agent or person receiving such owner's rents or transacting other business within the municipal district for such owner, call upon the owner of any ground lying alongside of any street private street road or pathway, and being of a lower level than such street or private street road or pathway, forthwith to have such low ground filled up to such level; and in case such owner shall refuse or neglect to fill up such ground for the space of one month after the delivery of such notice, the council may proceed to fill up such ground at the expense of such owner, and the amount of such expense, not exceeding one-fourth of the then value of such ground, may be recovered from the owner in a summary way before two justices.

418. If any hole or place within one foot of any road or street whether public or private be for want of sufficient protection or enclosure dangerous to the passengers along such street or road, the council shall, after due notice shall have been given, cause the same to be protected or enclosed so as to prevent danger therefrom, and the expenses of such protection or enclosure shall be repaid to the council by the owner of the premises so protected or enclosed.

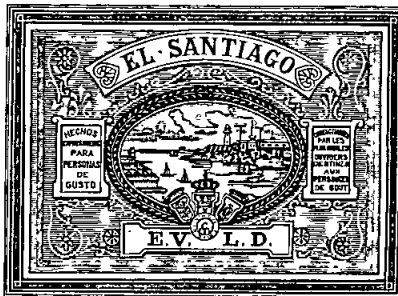

SHEWETH—

1. That on the twelfth day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine an election was held for one Member to serve in the Legislative Council of Victoria, to represent the Gippsland Province.
2. Your Petitioner was a candidate at the said election.
3. Charles Sargeant, of Warragul, in the colony of Victoria, sawmill proprietor, was the only other candidate at the said election.
4. As a result of the said election, the Returning Officer announced that the said Charles Sargeant had received one thousand four hundred and sixty-one votes, and that your Petitioner had received one thousand three hundred and twenty-three votes, and on the seventeenth day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine the said Returning Officer publicly declared that the said Charles Sargeant had received the majority of votes at the said election, and was duly elected to serve as a Member as aforesaid, and such Returning Officer made his return accordingly.
5. Your Petitioner has been informed and believes and now alleges that the said Charles Sargeant was at the time of the said election incapable of being lawfully elected a Member of the Legislative Council of Victoria, and is incapable of sitting or voting in the said Council by reason of his not having possessed at the time of his nomination and election, or at all, the qualification required by law to be necessary to render him capable of being elected as a Member of the said Council, in that the said Charles Sargeant had not for one year previous to the said election been legally or equitably seized or entitled to an estate of freehold in possession for his own use and benefit in lands or tenements in Victoria of the annual value of One hundred pounds above all charges and encumbrances affecting the same other than public or Parliamentary tax or municipal or other rate or assessment within the meaning of the eleventh section of the Act of the Parliament of Victoria, entitled "*An Act for the Reform of the Constitution*" No. 702.

6. Your Petitioner is advised and believes that by reason of the premises the said Charles Sargeant is not entitled to be declared a duly-elected Member of the Legislative Council for the said Gippsland Province.

Your Petitioner therefore respectfully prays—

That you will communicate the matter of this Petition to the Legislative Council of Victoria, in order that the case of your Petitioner may be referred to a Committee of the said Council duly authorized to receive, inquire into, and report upon the same according to law.

That the return of the said Returning Officer be declared void as respects the said Charles Sargeant.

That the said Charles Sargeant be declared disqualified to have been so elected as a Member of the said Legislative Council, and that he be declared not to have been duly elected.

That in the event of the said Charles Sargeant being declared not to have been duly elected, the return of the said Returning Officer be amended by striking out the name of the said Charles Sargeant and inserting in the place thereof the name of your Petitioner, and that your Petitioner be declared duly elected as a Member of the said Legislative Council of Victoria for the said Gippsland Province.

And that your Petitioner may have such further or other relief as the circumstances of the case may require or as to the said Committee may seem meet.

And your Petitioner will ever pray, &c.
