## "THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1885."

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the 29th section of *The Factories and Shops Act 1885* (49 Vict. No. 862), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of the said section 29 in the

FACTORY OF MESSRS. MASEY AND CO., BOOT MANUFACTURERS,  
CHURCH-STREET, RICHMOND,

from the 18th November instant to the 31st December next, upon these express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory more than twenty females for more than fifty-four hours in any one week in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That none of such females shall be so employed without receiving payment for the extra work they are called upon to perform.
3. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
4. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

# PRIZES FOR BEST VARIETY OF IRRIGATED CROPS.

First Prize, £50. Second Prize, £25.

## Conditions of Competition.

1. The area of any irrigated land entered for competition for these prizes shall not be less than 12 acres in one holding.
2. No first prize will be awarded in respect of any holding the crops of which have been awarded first prize in last year's competition.
3. No second prize will be awarded in respect of any holding the crops of which have been awarded second prize in last year's competition.
4. Nominations will only be received from irrigation and water supply trusts and agricultural and horticultural societies. Each such trust or society shall have the right to nominate not more than two holdings.
5. For the purpose of computing the variety of computed crops grown on one farm, no crop shall be reckoned the net annual value of the produce of which, on the farm, is less than £5, except in the case of garden crops, grown for the use of those residing on the farm, the total net value of which may be reckoned as one item.
6. The number, value, and readiness of sale of the products shall each be taken into consideration in making the award; and all of these points will weigh in determining the relative merits of the entries.

A first prize of £50, and a second prize of £25, will be awarded to those two irrigated holdings, entered for competition, which, subject to the above conditions, exhibit the highest merit, should this be such, as in the opinion of the judges, to justify the award.

In determining the order of precedence of the entries, the judges will be further guided by the following considerations, viz.:

1. The irrigated land is to be so laid out, arranged, and prepared that the water may be applied without waste, without injury to the crops, and without injury to any adjacent lands.
2. The crops are to be arranged so that the extent of each shall be in proportion to the quantity of water available for its irrigation at the season when it requires to be watered; and that the whole shall utilize all the available labour of the farm at each season of the year.
3. Special attention will be given to such crops as are likely to command the readiest sale, and the highest prices relatively to the amount of labour and the area of land employed in their production.

The first prize of £30 shall be awarded to the farm fulfilling the above conditions, which, in the opinion of the judges, exhibits the highest merit, and the second prize of £20 to the next best; but the judges may decline to award either, or both prizes, if, in their opinion, the merit of the entries is insufficient to warrant them in making the award.

In making their awards, the judges will be guided, as far as possible, by the following considerations, viz.:

1. The land is to be so laid out, and cropped, as to fully utilize the available supply of water at all seasons of the year. Thus:—If the supply of water available in the locality be greater in winter than in summer, the land must be laid out so as to employ the greater proportion of it in the irrigation of cold-weather crops, or otherwise, so that the utmost use shall be made of the whole available water supply.
2. The farm is to be so arranged that the irrigated and unirrigated portions shall mutually contribute to the maintenance of each in the best condition of culture, and in the highest possible state of fertility.

*Lark Passage.*—A detached coral head of small extent with 4 feet over it at low water springs and 8 fathoms all round has been

discovered to the north-westward of the south-west beacon in Lark Passage; it lies with the beacon bearing S.  $39\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E. magnetic, distant 3.3 cables.

Angles taken on the rock:—

Mount Cook	} 32° 13'	{ South Peak of Cape Bedford	} 69° 20'	{ Summit of Cape Flattery.

THE following information received from Lieut. and Commander Pirie, H.M.S. *Paluma*, is hereby promulgated:—

*g Reef*.—*g Reef* is 4 cables long in an East and West direction, by  $2\frac{1}{2}$  cables wide; it is steep to all round, and has a small sand bank near its West extreme, which dries 6 feet at low water springs.

From the Sand Bank.

Cape Flattery bears N.  $83^{\circ}$  W.; distance, 13.3 miles.

S. Direction Island summit bears N.  $18\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  W.; distance, 10.8 miles.

The reef marked on the Chart as *g Reef* does not exist.

*A Coral Shoal*.—A coral shoal, with 6 fathoms over it at low water springs, has been discovered to the N. Eastward of Two Isles, it is 8 cables long inside the 10 fathom line in a N.E. and S.W. direction.

From the shoalest part.

Cape Flattery summit bears N.  $76^{\circ}$  W.; distance, 7.65 miles.

S. Direction Island summit bears N.  $13^{\circ}$  E.; distance 11.0 miles.

THE following information, received from Lieut. and Commander Frederick, H.M.S. *Dart*, is hereby promulgated:—

Result of an examination for the shoal water reported to lie 3 miles N.W. of Lookout Point, Coast of Queensland, by the Master of the *Decapolis*, and on which that vessel struck in 1879.

The soundings show that a shoal spit extends from Lookout Point in a north-westerly direction for  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles, having a least depth of one fathom at L. W. spring tides, bearing N.  $45^{\circ}$  W. 2 miles from the summit of the point. This spit is steep to on its eastern edge, deepening rapidly from 2 to 6 or 7 fathoms, but on the north-western side it deepens more gradually.

From the north-eastern edge of this spit, Cape Flattery is open a quarter of a point of Lookout Point, and the remarkable sand patch, which shows like a long white ridge bearing S.S.W. (the bearing given by the *Decapolis* when aground) would place her close to the edge of the spit.

The examination failed to show any shoal bank outside the spit; and on the position of the  $2\frac{1}{2}$  fathoms as given on Admiralty Charts Nos. 2351, 2352, there is an even bottom of  $6\frac{1}{2}$  to 7 fathoms.

*Clearing marks*.—The summit of Cape Flattery in line with the red beacon on the sandbank  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles E.S.E. of Lookout Point (S.  $38^{\circ}$  E. magnetic), leads clear to the eastward, of the shoal ground off the point; and round Hill in line with end of range, S.  $82\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  W. magnetic, leads 4 cables to the northward of the spit.

THE following hydrographic information, supplied in letter of 29th September, 1889, from Lieut. and Commander Frederick, H.M.S. *Dart*, surveying on the coast of Queensland to the north of Cape Flattery, is published for general information and guidance:—

The *Dart* put to sea on the morning of 14th September, and after communicating with the tide party at Lizard Island, proceeded to the northward as far as Cape Grenville in execution of surveying work.

The anchorage at Night Island was examined to ascertain the extent of the reef which has been reported to extend further than shown on Admiralty Chart No. 2353. A small detached patch of coral was found off the north-western point of the island, with its outer edge N.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. (magnetic) 3 cables from the northernmost Mangroves.

By keeping No. IX. island its own breadth open to the westward of Night Island, leads into the anchorage clear of all dangers, and a good bearth picked up off the sandy beach.

The North and Western sides of M reef, near Cape Grenville, were examined to ascertain the extent of the shoal spits reported on the Admiralty Chart, but the reef was found to be steep to all along, with no shoal spits, though it would be advisable to have the beacon replaced on the western side of this reef, as at high water with a bad light it is not easily distinguished.

The reef marked "awash at L. W.," situated 1 mile south-east of Young Islet was next searched for, and the ship anchored close to the assigned position, nothing was seen from the deck or aloft at low water which looked like shoal water, and a careful search in the vicinity by the boats during  $1\frac{1}{2}$  days, failed to discover any signs of a shoal, the bottom being very even, 12 to 14 fathoms.

From this I conclude that the patch must be very much out of position, or non-existent.

On the 21st September the *Dart* arrived No. X. islet, near Cape Direction, and a plan made on a scale 2 inches to the mile, to sound out the channels on either side of the island, and to delineate the extent of the reef.

The result of the examination showed that foul ground existed on the Eastern side of the island, a patch of 24 fathoms, coral, lying  $8\frac{1}{2}$  cables E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N. from the island, and from thence a bank extends to the Eastward with patches of 4 and 5 fathoms on it, while a coral rock with only 5 feet over it lies 1.8 miles E.N.E. from the island.

The channel on the West side of No. X. Island is deep and clear of dangers, while the beacon on the Western extreme of the reef is a good mark, and may be approached to within 2 cables.

At the North-east edge of the shoal water off Cape Direction is a patch of one fathom, sand, with deep water close to outside, lying 1.6 miles from the extremity of the Cape with the following bearings:—

Beacon on Y. reef N. $60^{\circ}$ E.	} Magnetic
Highest tree on No. X. Island S. $36^{\circ}$ E.	
Rocky Island S. $13^{\circ}$ W.	

On the 28th September, the *Dart* anchored on the shoal patch between E. and G. reefs, of the Claremont group, which is probably the reef reported by the *Taiwan*. On the boats sounding out the shoal it was found to have a least depth of 17 feet, coral, lying with the following bearings:—

Beacon on E. reef S. $34^{\circ}$ W.	} Magnetic
Beacon on D. reef S. $56^{\circ}$ E.	
Beacon on F. reef S. $85^{\circ}$ W.	

This shoal is nearly circular and about 300 yards in diameter, the shoalest water being near the centre and gradually deepening all round to 9 and 10 fathoms.

The beacons on b and m reefs. Claremont Group, are not now in position and have probably been washed away.

## "The Marine Board Act 1887."

## REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF ENGINEERS FOR CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the annexed Regulations under *The Marine Board Act 1887*, and has ordered that such Regulations shall come into force from the 1st January, 1890.

WHEREAS by section 40 of *The Marine Board Act 1887* it is amongst other things enacted that the Marine Board of Victoria may, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make Regulations for the conduct of the examination of persons desiring to obtain Certificates of Competency as Engineers, for the qualifications to be possessed by such persons, for the issue of Certificates of Competency thereto, and for prescribing the fees to be paid by applicants for examination, not exceeding the fees mentioned in the Second Schedule of the said Act: Now, therefore, the said Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Regulations for the Examination of Engineers."
2. These Regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1889.
3. Certificates of Competency consist of three grades, Grades, namely, "First-class Engineers' Certificates," "Second-class Engineers' Certificates," and "Third-class Engine-drivers' Certificates," and will be granted to those persons who pass the required examinations and otherwise comply with the requisite conditions.
4. Persons desirous of obtaining certificates shall make Application application for examination on the proper form, which may be obtained at the Marine Board Office; such application form, properly filled in, together with the candidate's testimonials, as specified in the following clause, must be lodged with the Secretary at least two days before the date of examination.
5. Applicants will be required to produce, in addition to Testimonials testimonials the usual Forms of Discharge, satisfactory testimonials as to sobriety, experience, ability, and general good conduct for (at least) the twelve months immediately preceding the date of application to be examined, and without producing them no person will be examined. If the service has been on shore the testimonials must be signed by an Employer, if at sea by the Master or Chief Engineer of the vessel in which applicant has served.
6. In cases where a testimonial cannot, from any sufficient reason, be obtained from the Master or Chief Engineer of the vessel in which applicant has served, then, in lieu of the testimonial of such Chief Engineer, that of the Superintending Engineer (or person occupying an equivalent position) of any Company may be accepted, and in lieu of the testimonial required to be given by the Master, that of the Secretary to or Chairman of the Board of Directors, or Managing Owner, or Managing Director of a Company, may be accepted; provided that in every such instance the testimonial must state that the facts set forth are in accordance with reports made by the Chief Engineer or the Master, as the case may be, or else that the facts therein set forth are within the writer's personal knowledge.
7. The testimonials of servitude of foreigners and of Testimonials of foreigners British seamen who have served in foreign vessels which cannot be verified in any Mercantile Marine Office, must be confirmed either by the consul of the country to which the ship in which the candidate served belonged, or by some other recognised official authority of that country; or by the testimony of some credible person having personal knowledge of the facts required to be established. The production, however, of such evidence will not of necessity be deemed sufficient; and, in each case, the Board reserves to itself the right of dealing with any application made under this regulation as it may see fit.

Certificate as to age.	8. Should any doubt exist as to the age of a candidate he will be required to produce a certificate of birth or baptism, or other satisfactory evidence of age.
Foreigners to know English.	9. Foreigners must prove to the satisfaction of the examiners that they can speak and write the English language sufficiently well to perform the duties required of them on board a British vessel.
Verification of services, &c., by articles.	10. Services which cannot be verified by proper entries in the articles of the ships in which the candidates have served cannot be counted.
Assistant Engineer.	11. Services performed on rivers or within smooth or partially smooth water limits cannot be accepted as service required for a First or Second Class Certificate.
Service in home or coasting trade.	12. Service entered upon a ship's articles as having been performed in the capacity of Assistant Engineer must be supported by proof of the candidate having acted as Second, Third, Fourth, &c., Engineer, as the case may be.
Service as Engineer only accepted as qualifying service.	13. The service required by these Regulations to qualify a candidate for examination for a First or Second Class Certificate is to be regarded as referring to service in the foreign trade. Service in the home trade must amount to at least half as much again as that required by the Regulations, to make up for the time spent in port, <i>e.g.</i> , for every twelve months' service under the Regulations eighteen months' service in the home trade will be required. In all cases the length of service will be deemed to have commenced on the date of signing of the articles of agreement and to end on the date of discharge.
Service as Third and Fourth Engineer.	14. Service in the engine-room (hereinafter referred to) for qualifying a candidate to be examined for a Second-class Engineer's Certificate must be only in those capacities which afford opportunities of obtaining practical experience as an engineer; and service in the capacity of fireman, stoker, donkeyman, greaser, winch man, labourer, engineer's steward, or any other capacity than that of engineer taking watch on engines and boilers for propelling will not be accepted.
Service below the grade of Fourth Engineer.	15. Service as Third and Fourth Engineer in foreign-going steamers, where more than three or four engineers, as the case may be, are carried, their names being all entered on the articles in their respective ratings, may be accepted equally with service as Second Engineer, to qualify a candidate for examination for a First-class Engineer's Certificate, provided he has, during the whole of such service, been in possession of a Second-class Engineer's Certificate (Imperial, or under Order in Council), and provided also that he was regularly in charge of a watch. In the case of Fourth Engineers, however, eighteen months of such service must be proved for every twelve months required by the regulations.
"Responsible charge."	16. Service in a capacity below that of Fourth Engineer cannot be accepted as qualifying for a Second-class Certificate unless the testimonials of the candidate explicitly certify that during such service he has been taking regular watch in the engine-room, and that the Chief Engineer or Superintending Engineer considers him properly qualified by that experience to act as Chief Engineer of a foreign-going steamer of 99 horse-power nominal. <i>In any case the applicant must prove that he has had the responsible charge of the engines or boilers on regular watch for at least twelve months of sea service, of which for not less than six months he must have been in charge of the propelling engines and rated on the articles not lower than Fourth Engineer.</i>
Workshop service.	17. Having "responsible charge" will be understood to imply, in regard to the engines, that the applicant for the time specified was, on regular watch, the person responsible for carrying out the orders given through the engine-room telegraph, and in regard to the boilers, that he was, similarly for the period specified, the person responsible for regulating the feeds.
	18. When service has been performed in a workshop <i>where steam-engines are not made</i> , and the class of work done is similar to that required in engine making, the service may, with the approval of the Board, be accepted with an additional year in the engine-room; that is, three years' workshop service and two years in the engine-room, of which one year must have been at sea.
	19. When service has been performed in a workshop <i>where engines are made</i> , and the department in which the applicant has been principally engaged is not "fitting" or "erecting," if the nature of the service be such as is

useful training for an Engineer, the Board may, on proper representation of the circumstances, see fit to accept the service as qualifying along with subsequent experience, but in every such case the applicant must prove additional engine-room service as required above.

20. If a candidate, having a Second-class Certificate, has served in the engine-room in the capacity of a Second Engineer in foreign-going steam-ships under 100 horsepower, such ships not being required by law to carry a certificated Second Engineer, his service may be accepted without reference to the vessel's horse-power, provided he has been on the ship's articles as Second Engineer, and produces certificates of discharge as Second Engineer, for the required period.

Service as Second Engineer when certificate not required.

21. The Board may allow an applicant who, in consequence of service abroad, has been unable to obtain a Second-class Certificate, to be examined for a First-class Certificate, although he has not obtained a certificate of the lower grade, provided he is able to satisfy them as to the satisfactory character of his services.

First-class Certificates without Second.

22. In such cases (Reg. 21) or in cases where the candidate is already in possession of a Certificate of Service, should he fail to pass the examination for the higher grade, but passes the examination for the lower grade, he may receive a certificate accordingly, but no part of the fee will be returned.

Unsuccessful candidates may in certain cases receive certificates for inferior grade.

23. A candidate who under Regulation 21 has been permitted to be examined for a First-class Certificate without first obtaining a Second-class Certificate of Competency or a Certificate of Service, and who fails in his examination in practical knowledge, may not be re-examined for a certificate of the higher grade until he has served 12 months as Second Engineer with a Second-class Engineer's Certificate of Competency as required by the Regulations.

Consequence of failure in such cases.

24. If the candidate fails altogether, *i.e.*, both in the examination for the lower as well as for the higher grade of certificate, he may be re-examined for a Second-class Certificate only, subject to the usual Regulations relating to failure.

25. When an applicant has passed his examination, and has complied with requisite regulations, he will be notified to that effect by the Secretary, and will subsequently receive his Certificate of Competency from the Board. His testimonials will be returned to him with his certificate.

Notification of passing.

26. If, however, a candidate has passed his examination, and it subsequently is discovered that his services are insufficient to entitle him to receive a certificate of the grade for which he has passed, it will not be granted to him; but, if the Board are satisfied that the error in the calculation of his services did not occur through any fault or wilful misrepresentation on his part, the certificate may be issued to him, or he may be allowed to go up for re-examination without payment of further fee, when he has performed the amount of service in which he was deficient, as the Board may direct.

If after passing examination services are found to have been insufficient.

27. If, in such a case, the applicant's services are sufficient to entitle him to receive a certificate of a lower grade, provided as aforesaid he has not wilfully misrepresented the amount of his services, an inferior certificate may be granted to him, and the difference between the fee paid by him for examination for the superior certificate and the fee payable for the inferior certificate may be placed to his credit in the event of his again presenting himself for examination.

Certificate of a lower grade may be granted on certain conditions.

28. In such a case when the applicant has by further service made up the time in which he was previously found to be short, he may be required, before he can receive the higher certificate, to be re-examined in all the subjects.

May have to be re-examined for certificate of higher grade.

#### QUALIFICATIONS FOR CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

29. **Third-class Engine-drivers' Certificates** will be of two classes, namely, those issued for **River and Bay Service** and those issued for the **River Murray and Tributaries**. The latter class of Certificate will be valid on the River Murray and tributaries *only*, and will be so

Third-class Certificates

endorsed; whereas those issued for the River and Bay Service without such endorsement will entitle the holder thereof to serve in the capacity of an Engine-driver within any port, or on any lake or river within the colony of Victoria.

Service where performed.

30. Service performed on the River Murray or tributaries will only be accepted as qualifying service for a Certificate for such waters on a candidate passing the prescribed examination; service performed on any other river, lake, or bay in the colony of Victoria will, under a like condition, be accepted as qualifying service for a Third-class Certificate for river and bay steamers.

Extension of limits of Certificate.

31. The holder of a Third-class Certificate restricted to service on the Murray River and tributaries, and desirous of obtaining a Certificate for the "River and Bay Service," may have his Certificate exchanged therefor, on his producing satisfactory evidence of having served for a period of not less than six months as fireman or assistant engineer on a steam-ship plying in Port Phillip Bay, and, on his showing to the satisfaction of the Board's examiner, that he has acquired practical knowledge and experience in the working of engines and boilers of steamers plying in such waters.

Third-class Engine-driver.

32. A candidate for a **Third-class Engine-driver's Certificate** must be twenty-two years of age:

- (a) He must have served afloat two years as a fireman, and one year as leading fireman and assistant-engineer, making three years' service, or such service which, in the opinion of the Board, is equal to the qualifying service herein specified;
- (b) He must produce satisfactory testimonials for the whole of the period of service;
- (c) He must be able to explain the use of the principal parts of engines and boilers in general use on the waters for which he is desirous of being examined, including all valves, cocks, and connexions; also the salinometer;
- (d) He must write a legible hand, and understand the first four rules of arithmetic.

Service with Third-class Certificate.

33. Service with Third-class Certificate will not entitle the holder to present himself for examination to obtain a certificate of a higher grade.

Second-class Engineer.

34. A candidate for a **Second-class Engineer's Certificate** must be 21 years of age:

- (a) He must have served an apprenticeship to an Engineer for three years at least, and prove that during the period of his apprenticeship he has been employed on the making and repairing of engines: Or if he has not served an apprenticeship, he must prove that for not less than three years he has been employed as a journeyman mechanic in some factory or workshop\* on the making or repairing of engines.† In either case he must also have served one year at sea in the engine-room as an Engineer on regular watch in the foreign or home trade. (See also Reg. 13.)
- (b) He must have served at least four years at sea in the engine-room as an Engineer on regular watch in the foreign or home trade. (See also Reg. 13.)
- (c) He must be able to give a description of boilers, and the methods of staying them, together with the use and management of the different valves, cocks, pipes, and connexions.
- (d) He must understand how to correct defects from accident, decay, &c., and the means of repairing such defects.
- (e) He must understand the use of the barometer, thermometer, and salinometer, and the principles on which they are constructed.
- (f) He must state the causes, effects, and usual remedies for incrustation and corrosion.
- (g) He must be able to state how a temporary or permanent repair could be effected in case of derangement of a part of the machinery, or total breakdown.

\* No period of service in a drawing office can be allowed to count for more than six months' workshop time.

† These may be either land or marine engines.

- (h) He must write a legible hand, and understand the first five rules of arithmetic, and the use of decimals, and their application to questions relating to the consumption of stores, and full capacities of tanks and bunkers, the duty of pumps, and the direct strains in engines and boilers.
- (i) He must be able to pass a creditable examination as to the various constructions of paddle and screw engines in general use; as to the details of the different working parts, external and internal, and the use of each part.

35. A candidate for a **First-class Engineer's Certificate** must be 22 years of age. First-class Engineer.

36. In addition to the qualification required for a Second-class Engineer:

- (a) He must possess either a First-class Engineer's Certificate of Service; or, in the event of his not being so possessed, he must have served for one year at sea as Second Engineer with a Second-class Engineer's Certificate of Competency, or for two years at sea as Second Engineer with a Second-class Engineer's Certificate of Service; or having served one year at sea as Second Engineer with a Second-class Engineer's Certificate of Service, he must show, in addition, at least six months' service as Chief Engineer in a vessel required by law to carry at least one Engineer holding a Certificate. (See also Reg. 15 as regards service as Third and Fourth Engineer.)

The Examiner should therefore be satisfied that an applicant for a First-class Engineer's Certificate has not only been in possession of a Second-class Certificate for the periods above stated, but that he has actually served for such periods in the Engine-room, at sea, with a Second-class Certificate, in the capacities referred to, and that his name has been entered in the articles of agreement accordingly. (See also Reg. 21.)

- (b) He will be required to make an intelligible hand-sketch, or a working drawing of some one or more of the principal parts of a steam-engine; and to mark in, without a copy, all the necessary dimensions in figures, so that the sketch or drawing could be worked from.
- (c) He must also be able to take off and calculate indicator diagrams.
- (d) He must be able to calculate safety-valve pressures, and the strength of the boiler shell, stays, and riveting.
- (e) He must be able to state the general proportions borne by the principal parts of the machinery to each other, and to calculate the direct stress, the torsional stress, and the bending stress in round bars, and the direct stress and the bending stress in rectangular bars with given loads.
- (f) He must be able to explain the method of testing and altering the setting of the slide valves, and to sketch about what difference any alteration in the slide valve will make in the indicator diagram, and also the method of testing the fairness of shafts, and of adjusting them.
- (g) He must be conversant with surface condensation, superheating, and the working of steam expansively.
- (h) His knowledge of arithmetic must include the mensuration of superficies and solids and the extraction of the square root, and the application of these rules to questions relating to the power, duty, and economy of engines and boilers; and to the stresses in rods, shafts, and levers of the engine.

#### EXAMINATION FOR AN EXTRA OR HONORARY CERTIFICATE.

37. An Extra First-class Engineer's Examination is An extra First-class Engineer's Examination.  
voluntary, and is intended for such persons as wish to prove their superior qualifications; and are desirous of having Certificates for the highest grade granted by the Board.

38. A candidate for an Extra First-class Engineer's Certificate will not be entitled to present himself for examination for such Certificate unless he is in possession of an ordinary First-class Engineer's Certificate of Competency (Imperial, or issued under Queen's Order in Council), and has served as a First-class Engineer in a foreign-going steamship for a period of not less than twelve months, or in a home-trade steamship for a period of not less than eighteen months, which service must be verified by official discharges, &c.

39. Applicants are required to make application on form which may be obtained at the Marine Board office; such form, properly filled in, together with the candidate's testimonials and discharges, must be lodged with the Secretary at least two days before the date of examination.

- (a) The candidate must possess a thorough knowledge of the construction and working of the different forms of marine engines and propellers in all their parts, and be so far acquainted with the elements of theoretical mechanics as to comprehend the general principles on which the machine works, and to illustrate his knowledge of these principles by numerical examples.
- (b) He must possess a knowledge of the theory of strain and stress sufficient to be able to deduce the ordinary rules for the bending of rectangular bars and for the twisting and bending of round bars.
- (c) He must be acquainted with the principles of expansion and the modern theory of heat, and be able to solve, with the assistance of his own books or without books, according as the examination papers may be set, questions in economy and duty in connexion with engines and boilers.
- (d) He must understand how to apply the indicator, and to draw the proper conclusion from the diagrams and to construct the approximate diagrams for any given data.
- (e) He must be able to produce, without a copy, a fair working drawing of any part of the machinery, with figured dimensions fit to work from.
- (f) He must understand the principles of the action of the screw propeller and the paddle-wheel, and must be able to estimate numerically the effect in speed of ship and consumption of fuel due to any alteration in pitch, diameter, revolutions, &c., &c.
- (g) He must be able to give a description of boilers and the methods of staying them, and must show that he possesses a knowledge of the theoretical principles which regulate their construction, and that he is able to calculate the strength of the boiler shell, stays, and riveting.
- (h) He must understand the general nature of the strains and stresses produced by the steam pressure, and by the expansions due to unequal temperatures in boiler shells.
- (i) He must have a knowledge of safety-valve construction, and the principles involved in determining the size of a safety valve; and the construction of spring-loaded and dead-weight valves.
- (k) He must possess a thorough knowledge of the theory of combustion; the chemical composition of fuels; the evaporative duty of fuels of given composition; the production of draught; the effect in regard to economy, safety, and wear and tear, of increasing or of diminishing the proportion of heating surface, of grate bar surface, of area of section of air passages, of area of water surface, of steam space capacity and water capacity.
- (l) He must be able to explain the formation of scale and the precipitation of salt, and the precautionary means adopted in respect thereto, with jet condensers and with surface condensers.
- (m) He must understand the general principles involved in the construction of the barometer, thermometer, salinometer, and steam and vacuum gauges.

- (n) He must be familiar with the general results obtained from past experience in relation to corrosion, pitting, and galvanic action in boilers, and the use of zinc and of soda in boilers.
- (o) He must give a variety of illustrations of how defects have arisen from accident, imperfect construction, or deterioration; and how these defects might have been prevented, and the best way of repairing such defects.
- (p) He must possess an intelligent knowledge of the properties of the lubricants, boiler cements, and india-rubber in general use in steamers.
- (q) He must understand the causes of spontaneous combustion, and the formation of explosive gases in coal holds, and the precautionary measures proper to prevent accidents from these causes.
- (r) The candidate may, with his application to be examined, send in to the Secretary questions set by himself and answers worked in his own way, without books. This is to afford him an opportunity of showing to the best advantage what he knows. Questions based upon these examples will be afterwards put before him to test the soundness of that knowledge, and must be answered to the satisfaction of the examiner.
- (s) The examiner may put any questions he desires to the candidate for the purpose of testing his knowledge of the principles of that part of engineering science relating more particularly to marine engines.

#### FEES.

40. The fee for examination shall be paid to the Secretary of the Marine Board. Fees to be paid by applicants for examination.

41. If a candidate prior to examination, or during the course of any examination, offer any sum of money or other thing whatsoever by way of reward or bribe to any examiner or other officer of the Board, for the purpose of influencing him in any manner in regard to such examination, the Board may refuse to permit such candidate to be examined, or, if the examination shall have already commenced, may direct the examiner not to proceed with such examination. And, further, the Board may forfeit any fee paid by him, and may also debar the candidate from presenting himself at any future examination for a period not exceeding twelve (12) months from the date of the offer of such bribe or reward.

42. If a candidate fails in his examination, no part of the fee he has paid will be returned to him.

43. The fees to be charged for examination are as follows:—

#### CERTIFICATES LOST OR DESTROYED.

44. When any certificate issued by the Board has been lost or destroyed through no fault of the owner, and satisfactory proof of such loss or destruction has been furnished, a duplicate may be issued on payment of a fee of five shillings. Forms of the necessary declaration to be made by applicants may be obtained from, and must be returned to the Secretary. Certificates lost, &c.

#### FAILURE.

45. If the applicant fails in practical knowledge he may not present himself for re-examination until he can produce proofs of 'THREE MONTHS' further service at sea as Engineer from the date of failure. If he fails in arithmetic or drawing only, he may come up again for examination at any time. Re-examination in case of failure.

## GENERAL RULES AS TO EXAMINATIONS.

Candidates not  
to take books,  
&c., into  
examining  
room.

46. All books necessary for the use of candidates under examination will be provided by the Board, and applicants are not permitted to take into the examining room any book, paper, document, or memoranda of any description whatever.

47. Candidates will be allowed in the time allotted to cancel any part of their work, and when required additional papers will be supplied by the Examiner and all replies put in must show the full working; candidates will not be allowed to work out the problems on a slate or on waste paper; the additional sheets must be attached to and form part of the examination papers.

48. Candidates for First-class Certificates shall pass an examination in Rough Working Drawing, which may, at the candidate's option, be either hand-sketches, clearly dimensioned and complete in the necessary "views" and "sections," or drawings to a scale. Drawing boards and T squares will be provided by the Board, but the applicants will have to bring with them any drawing instruments they may require.

Punishment for  
breaking rules.

49. In the event of any candidate being discovered copying from another, or affording any assistance or giving any information to another, or communicating in any way with another during the time of examination, he will be regarded as having failed in his examination, and will be turned back for three months, in the same manner as if he had failed in the practical part of the examination; and no part of the fees he may have paid for examination will be returned to him. This penalty also applies to any breach of Regulation 45.

Leaving  
examination  
room.

50. If a candidate leaves the room before answering any question which has been given to him, he cannot afterwards be permitted to answer it; but the examiner may substitute another question.

Questions.

51. All applicants presenting themselves for examination will be required to give written answers to ten questions selected from "Elementary Questions for the first examinations of Engineers for Certificates of Competency, and of Masters and Mates for Certificates in Steam."

52. The form on which these answers will be written contains also some questions as to the experience of the applicant, and must be answered by him in writing.

53. Examiners may add to their *viva voce* questions on the practical management of steam-engines and boilers any of those contained in the "Elementary Questions" referred to in Regulation No. 51.

54. If at the expiration of the time allowed he has not worked out the whole of the questions set to him, but if the result of the *viva voce* examination taken in connexion with the answers to such of the questions as he has worked out are sufficient to satisfy the examiner that the applicant is competent to take charge of engines of 100 nominal horse-power or upwards, he will be declared to have passed, otherwise he will be declared to have failed.

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria held this twenty-fifth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

# HARCOURT IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST CONSTITUTED.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eighteenth day of November, 1889.*

## PRESENT:

His Excellency the Administrator of the Government.

**WHEREAS** by *The Irrigation Act 1886* it is enacted that any Municipal Council, or Waterworks Trust, or Irrigation Trust, or any two or more together of such Councils or Trusts, or a majority in number of the ratepayers in any proposed district, or the majority in number of owners of land within any proposed district, such majority being the owners of at least half the land in the proposed district, may petition the Governor in Council to constitute such district an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein. And it is further provided by the said Act that, before any District or Trust can be constituted or appointed under the said Act upon a petition from any Municipal Council or Waterworks Trust, or from any two or more together of any such Councils or Trusts, or from a majority in number of ratepayers in any proposed district, or upon a petition from the majority of the owners of land within any proposed district, that a petition from owners of land, being an absolute majority of the owners of land within the proposed district, such majority being owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, shall be presented to the Governor in Council, praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first petition, as set out in the declaration of the Minister published under the said Act, may be adopted in part or in whole. And it is further enacted that, after compliance with the provisions in the said Act, the Governor in Council may approve of the scheme proposed, either with or without any alterations, or additions, or restrictions, as he may think fit, or he may disapprove of the same; and if he approve of the same, either with or without alterations, he shall make an Order in Council accordingly. And it is further enacted that, if the Governor in Council approve of such proposed scheme, with or without any alterations, or additions, or restrictions, he may, by Order in Council, constitute the proposed district an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and appoint and create an Irrigation and Water Supply Trust to construct, maintain, and continue the works described in the Order.

And whereas the majority in number of the owners of certain land situated within the parish of Harcourt, in the county of Talbot, in the colony of Victoria, and within the boundaries of a proposed district (shown upon the plan accompanying their petition), being the owners of at least half the land within such proposed district, have, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, petitioned the Governor in Council to constitute the proposed district, as shown upon the plan accompanying their petition, an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein for carrying out the scheme or plan of works proposed in the said petition.

And whereas all the provisions of the Act necessary to precede the declaration in writing of the Minister of Water Supply upon the said petition having been complied with, the Minister duly published his declaration in the *Government Gazette* on the sixteenth day of August, 1889, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act. And whereas, after due observance of the steps necessary under the said Act to precede such a petition, on this 18th day of November, 1889, a petition of an absolute majority of the owners of land in the district proposed to be constituted, such majority being the owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, hath been presented to the Administrator of the Government in Council, praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first-named petition, as set out in the said declaration in writing of the Minister, might be adopted. And whereas, after compliance with all the provisions under the said Act necessary to be observed before approval of the scheme proposed, the Administrator of the Government in Council has, by an Order in Council dated this eighteenth day of November, 1889, approved of the said proposed scheme.

Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in accordance with the provisions of, and in exercise of the powers conferred by, *The Irrigation Act 1886* aforesaid, doth declare, order, and direct:—

1. That the said proposed district shall be, and the same is hereby constituted, as from the date of this Order, an "Irrigation and Water Supply District," under the said *Irrigation Act 1886*, and an Irrigation and Water Supply Trust is hereby appointed and created to construct, maintain, and continue the works in this Order described, in accordance with the provisions of this Order and of the said Act.

2. That the limits and boundaries of the district within which such Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall have authority, and which district shall henceforth be an Irrigation and Water Supply District, shall be those contained within the limits and boundaries of the area of the said Irrigation and Water Supply District hereby constituted, as such limits and boundaries are set out and described in the First Schedule hereto.

3. That the name of the said Irrigation and Water Supply District shall be the "Harcourt Irrigation and Water Supply District," and the corporate name of the said Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be the "Harcourt Irrigation and Water Supply Trust."

4. That the scheme or plan of the proposed works of the said Harcourt Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall comprise the Barker's Creek reservoir and outlet, channels for the conveyance and distribution of the water, and a service tank and pipes for

the supply of Harcourt. That the Barker's Creek reservoir and outlet are national works, the rest of the works shall be trust works, and the works to be constructed and maintained are those set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

5. That the source from which the said Harcourt Irrigation and Water Supply Trust is to obtain its supply of water is the Barker's Creek Reservoir; and the quantity of water that the said Harcourt Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be entitled and required to take from the said Barker's Creek reservoir shall be thirty-two millions of gallons per annum.

6. That the rate of payment to be made by the said Harcourt Irrigation and Water Supply Trust for the water supplied to it shall be 1½d. per 1,000 gallons.

7. That the total amount of money proposed to be expended by the said Harcourt Irrigation and Water Supply Trust on Trust works is One thousand one hundred and fifty pounds (£1,150) sterling.

8. That the amount of money proposed to be advanced by the Board of Land and Works to the said Harcourt Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, by way of loan, is One thousand one hundred and fifty pounds (£1,150) sterling; that the rate of interest to be paid upon such loan is Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, being one-half per cent. higher than the rate paid by the Government upon the public loan out of which such moneys are to be advanced; the rate of such interest to be subject to reduction, in accordance with section one hundred and forty-six of the said Act, in event of the interest paid by the Government upon such public loan being reduced.

9. That the number of persons to be elected as commissioners of the said Harcourt Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be six, and the period for which such commissioners shall hold office shall be three years.

10. That the amount of moneys which may be borrowed by the said Harcourt Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall not, at any time, together with any balance due from the Trust to the Board of Land and Works, or upon any Trust loan, exceed the sum of One thousand one hundred and fifty pounds (£1,150) sterling; and no rate made by the said Harcourt Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall exceed the sum of Five shillings in the £ upon the annual value of the property rated within the Trust district.

11. That the maximum amount which may be paid out of a loan raised by the said Harcourt Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in defraying the preliminary costs and expenses of application for this Order, shall be Twenty-five pounds (£25).

line across Railway reserve, and south boundary of Cemetery reserve, to the south-east angle thereof; thence north-westerly by west boundary of the two-chain road forming east boundary of Cemetery reserve for a distance of nine chains; thence along line of proposed channel to its intersection with the west boundary of the township of Harcourt; thence northerly by portion of west boundary of township of Harcourt to north-west angle thereof; thence north-westerly to north-west angle of allotment 1A, section 2; thence north-westerly by a line across Dr. Barker's pre-emptive section to the south-west angle of allotment 18, section 5B; thence northerly along west boundaries of said allotment 18, and allotment 17, section 5B, to a point in the latter, distant eight chains from the south-west angle of said allotment 17; thence north-easterly by a line to a point in the south boundary of allotment 16, section 5B, distant three chains from the south-west angle of said allotment 16; thence north-easterly by a line to a point in the north boundary of said allotment 16, distant fourteen chains from north-east angle of said allotment 16; thence north-easterly by a line to the north-east angle of allotment 15, section 5B; thence easterly by a line to centre of the three-chain road forming east boundary of said allotment 15; thence south-easterly by a line to a point in the west boundary of allotment 22, section 5B, distant one chain from north-west angle of said allotment 22; thence south-westerly by a line to the south-east angle of allotment 21, section 5B; thence across the two-chain road forming south boundary of said allotment 21 to the commencing point; all of which boundaries are as shown on Order in Council plan deposited in the Office of Minister of Water Supply, Melbourne.

#### HARCOURT IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATIONS FOR THE ELECTION OF COMMISSIONERS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eighteenth day of November, 1889.

##### PRESENT:

His Excellency the Administrator of the Government.

**WHEREAS** by section 63 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, No. 898, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, from time to time, make, alter, and repeal regulations relating to any Irrigation and Water Supply Trust appointed under the said Act, for the purposes, among others, following:—

- (a) For determining the period for which commissioners of any trust shall hold office, the time and manner of election, and the order of their retirement from office.
- (b) For determining the manner in which elections of any such commissioners shall be held, and the manner of voting thereat.
- (c) For determining the manner in which any vacancies in the office of any such commissioners shall be filled up.
- (d) For determining questions as to the due election of any such commissioner; and
- (e) For prescribing, subject to the provisions of the said Act, any other matter necessary for giving effect to Part IV. of the said Act.

Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, duly appointed under the said Act, and known as the Harcourt Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, make the regulations following, viz:—

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In these regulations, "the Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply; "the Trust" or "the said Trust" shall mean the Harcourt Irrigation and Water Supply Trust; and "the district," "the said district," "the irrigation district," or "the irrigation and water supply district," shall mean the lands as defined by the Order in Council appointing the said trust wherein the trust shall have authority.

2. *Period for which commissioners shall hold office.*—Subject to the provisions in reference to the first election of commissioners hereinafter contained, for securing the annual retirement of two commissioners, the period during which the commissioners of the said trust shall hold office shall be three years.

3. *Annual retirement of commissioners.*—Two commissioners shall retire annually, but the retiring commissioners shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be eligible for re-election.

4. *Term of office of persons elected commissioners at first election.*—At the first election of commissioners two of the persons elected commissioners shall hold office as such commissioners for the term of three years, two others of such persons shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining two persons elected as such commissioners shall hold office for the term of

one year; and the particular term for which each such person so elected a commissioner shall hold office shall be determined in the manner following (that is to say):—

(a) *How term of office is ascertained when no poll taken.*—If the first election is made without a poll, as in the case of these regulations provided, then the particular term for which each candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office shall, immediately upon such election, be publicly determined by lot by the returning officer, in such manner as to him may seem fit, and the returning officer shall thereupon immediately, and publicly, announce the term for which each individual candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

(b) *How term of office ascertained when poll taken.*—If at the first election a poll shall be held as in these regulations provided, then of the six candidates elected as commissioners the two candidates who shall have received the highest number of votes shall hold office as commissioners for the term of three years, and the two candidates who shall have received the next highest number of votes shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining two candidates who shall have been elected shall hold office for the term of one year; and if two or more than two candidates elected shall have obtained the same number of votes, then the returning officer shall determine by lot (as hereinbefore provided in the case of the first election if decided without ballot) the term or terms of three, two, or one year or years during which such candidates shall respectively hold office. But so that no candidate elected shall hold office for a shorter time than the term during which any other candidate who shall have obtained a less number of votes shall hold office. And the returning officer shall publicly declare the respective terms during which the several candidates shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

5. *Extraordinary vacancies, how filled, and term of office.*—Should any vacancy in the office of commissioner be occasioned by death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, an election shall forthwith be held to fill such vacancy; and the provisions contained in these regulations as to the nomination of candidates, the manner in which elections shall be held, and the mode of voting thereat, shall apply to any election in respect of such vacancy; and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the commissioner whose seat shall have become vacant.

6. *Date of first election of commissioners.*—Date of ordinary annual election.—The first election of commissioners of the said trust shall be held on the 14th day of December, 1889, and the ordinary annual election shall be held on the 14th day of December, in each succeeding year, provided that whenever such date may fall upon a Sunday, or upon any day set apart as a public holiday, such election shall be held upon the day next following.

7. *Voters' list to be prepared.*—For the purposes of the first election of commissioners of the said trust, a voters' list shall be prepared by the persons upon whose petition the said trust has been constituted, and the said voters' list shall be forwarded to the Minister.

8. *Form of voters' list.*—First Schedule.—Such voters' list shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain, in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of each person entitled to vote under the provisions of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, or under the provisions of any Act amending the said *Irrigation Act 1886*, and shall also specify the extent of, and indicate with reasonable certainty, the land of each such person, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Acts, each such person is entitled.

9. *Voting in respect of lands jointly owned.*—In the case of joint owners of land, or in case of joint lessees of land, the name of any one of such owners or lessees (as the case may be) shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act and of these regulations, be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list in like manner as if such land were owned or leased solely by such one owner or lessee, and the owner or lessee so placed upon the said list or lists shall alone be entitled to vote accordingly. Provided always that if such owners or lessees jointly, by notice in writing, desire that the number of votes to which, under the said provisions, any one of such owners or lessees is so entitled to give as aforesaid may be allotted between such owners or lessees in any manner they may jointly indicate, the alteration or alterations so desired to be made in the said list shall, if the same be consistent with the said provisions, be made when the list shall be revised as hereinafter provided, and such owners or lessees shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

10. *Copy of voters' list to be available for inspection.*—Second Schedule.—Objections to list to be in writing, and forwarded to Minister.—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day time, in some convenient place within or near to the irrigation and water supply district of the trust for a period of seven clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Second Schedule hereto, setting forth the times and place at which such voters' list may be so inspected, shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said district, and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded in writing to the Minister within the time mentioned in the said notice.

11. *Grounds of objection to be stated.*—All objections to the said list shall be forwarded in writing to the Minister within eight days after the first day of the publication of such notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

12. *Minister to revise and certify lists.*—The Minister shall revise the said list, and consider all objections thereto, and make such alterations and amendments therein as to him may seem just, and shall certify the list under his hand as correct; and no objection to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

13. *Certified list to be voters' roll.*—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of the first election of commissioners of the trust, but shall also be available for any election in respect of any extraordinary vacancy occurring within twelve months next after the date of the said first election.

14. *Voters' list to be prepared yearly.*—Before the first day of November in each year the officers of the trust shall prepare a voters' list in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and such list shall contain, in regular numerical sequence and in alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of each person entitled to vote under the provisions of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, or under the provisions of any Act amending the said *Irrigation Act 1886*, and shall also specify the extent of, and indicate with reasonable certainty, the land of each such person, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Act, each such person is entitled.

15. *Voting in respect of lands jointly owned.*—In the case of joint owners of land, or in the case of joint lessees of land, the name of any one of such owners or lessees (as the case may be) shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act and of these regulations, be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list in like manner as if such land were owned or leased solely by such one owner or lessee, and the owner or lessee so placed upon the said list shall alone be entitled to vote accordingly. Provided always that if such owners or lessees jointly, by notice in writing, desire that the number of votes to which, under the said provisions, any one of such owners or lessees is so entitled to give as aforesaid may be allotted between such owners or lessees in any manner they may jointly indicate, the alteration or alterations so desired to be made in the said list shall, if the same be consistent with the said provisions, be made when the list or lists shall be revised as hereinafter provided, and such owners or lessees shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

16. *Copy of list to be available for inspection.*—Third Schedule.—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day time, at some convenient place within or near to the district of the trust for a period of seven clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Third Schedule hereto shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said district; and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded in writing to the chairman of the trust within the time mentioned in the said notice.

17. *Grounds of objections to list to be forwarded in writing to the chairman of trust.*—All objections to the said list shall be forwarded in writing to the chairman of the trust within the time mentioned in the said notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

18. *Special meeting of trust to be held to revise list.*—List to be certified.—In the month of November in each year a special meeting of the trust shall be held for the purpose of revising the said list, and all objections which may have been forwarded to the chairman under the preceding clause shall be considered by the commissioners then present; and the chairman may make such alterations and amendments in the said list as the commissioners or a majority of the commissioners present may determine to be just and necessary, or such as by these regulations are required to be made; and the list, when so revised, altered, and amended, shall be certified as correct under the hand of the chairman, and no objection to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

19. *Revised and certified list to be voters' roll.*—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of any election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) of trust commissioners to be held, within one year, from the fourteenth day of December then next, the said day inclusive.

20. *Minister may appoint returning officer for first election.*—Chairman of trust to be returning officer at subsequent elections.—For the purposes of the first such election, the Minister may appoint some fit and proper person to be returning officer; but for every subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) the chairman of the trust for the time being shall be the returning officer; but if at the time of any election the office of chairman of the trust should be vacant, the commissioners of the trust may, by resolution, appoint one of their number to be returning officer until the office of chairman shall again be filled; and the returning officer may appoint a deputy to assist him or to act in his room at any election, and such deputy may do all or any of the acts or things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

21. *Notice of election.*—Nomination of candidates.—Fourth Schedule.—Fourteen clear days before any election of commissioners under these regulations, the returning officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the said district, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said district, to be named in such notice, in manner hereinafter mentioned, between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon, on some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than four nor more than seven days after the time of giving such notice, and named therein; and any person desirous of nominating a candidate shall, before Four o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination-day, cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid to the returning officer, a nomination-paper in the form of the Fourth Schedule, or to the

like effect, stating therein the christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required in and by the said Schedule; and such nomination-paper shall be signed by not less than three persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, and also signed by the person named therein as a candidate, in token of his assent to being so named; and such candidate or some person on his behalf shall, at the time when such nomination-paper is delivered to the returning officer, pay into the hands of such returning officer the sum of Ten pounds (£10), to be dealt with as by law provided. And no person who shall not have been so nominated, and by whom or on whose behalf such payment shall not have been so made, shall within the subsequent provisions of these regulations be deemed to be a candidate at any election of commissioners.

22. *Where number of candidates does not exceed number of commissioners to be elected.*—If at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nominations of candidates the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of commissioners to be elected, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

23. *Where number of candidates exceeds number of commissioners to be elected.*—Fifth Schedule.—Notice of poll.—Hours of polling.—If at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates, the number of candidates exceeds the number of commissioners to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed, with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full, in the form of the Fifth Schedule hereto, and shall also forthwith give public notice by advertisement in some newspaper generally circulating in the irrigation district stating the names of the persons so nominated, and that a poll will be taken for the election of such commissioners upon the day named in such notice, at such place within the said district as the returning officer shall in and by such notice appoint; and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at Ten o'clock in the forenoon and close at Four o'clock in the afternoon.

24. *Retirement of candidates before polling-day.*—If at any election after a poll shall have been appointed as aforesaid any candidate for such election and two of the persons having signed the paper nominating him as aforesaid are desirous that he should retire from such candidature, such candidate and the persons aforesaid may sign and deliver to the returning officer, not later than four clear days before the day of polling, a notice, in the form of the Sixth Schedule hereto, stating that such candidate so retires; and the said candidate or his agent shall thereupon publish in some newspaper generally circulating in the irrigation and water supply district a copy of such notice; and the returning officer, on sufficient proof of such publication aforesaid, if the number of candidates is by such retirement reduced to the number of persons to be elected at such election, shall on the day appointed for the election declare the remaining candidates duly elected; and, if the said number is not so reduced, shall omit the name of the person so retiring from the ballot-papers to be used at the said election, and if such papers are already printed shall erase such name therefrom; and such person shall not be capable of being elected at such election.

25. *Polling-booth may be hired.*—At such election the returning officer shall provide a suitable place for taking a poll, and may, if necessary, cause to be hired and used as a polling-booth any room which he may deem to be suitable at the place appointed for taking the poll; and may divide such room into compartments, as to him may seem most convenient.

26. *Returning officer to preside at polling-booth.*—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall preside at the polling-booth for taking the poll.

27. *Scrutineers may be appointed.*—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present in the polling-booth, and the said returning officer, or his deputy, and the said scrutineers, and any voters, not exceeding four in number, actually engaged in voting, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling-booth.

28. *Pencils to be provided.*—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall provide pencils in the polling-booth for the use of the voters, and also a locked box, to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers; and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the scrutineers before the polling begins; and the box shall then be locked, and shall stand on a table opposite the returning officer, or deputy returning officer, who shall keep the key of such box.

29. *Manner of voting.*—Where voter is illiterate.—The returning officer shall deliver to every voter who requires the same a ballot-paper, or if such voter appears by the roll to be entitled to give more votes than one then so many ballot-papers as may be equal to the number of votes which such voter so appears to be entitled to give, such ballot-papers being in the form of Schedule Five hereto, and initiated by the returning officer; and every such voter shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from all or any of such papers the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote. And in case any voter is unable to read or write, the returning officer, or his deputy, if so required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as the voter may desire, strike out the name or names of such candidate or candidates as such voter may designate; and after such name or names have been so struck out the ballot-paper or ballot-papers (as the case may be) shall forthwith be deposited in the said box. Provided that all the ballot-papers to which any person may be entitled at the polling-booth shall be demanded and received by him at one and the same time; and no person, having once demanded and received any such ballot-paper or papers, and voted by the same, shall at the same election receive any further ballot-papers, or exercise any further right of voting.

30. *Ballot-papers to be numbered.*—Before delivering any ballot-paper to the voter, the returning officer, or his deputy, shall write

upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number set opposite to the voter's name in the roll; and shall thereupon, upon a copy of such roll, check off such voter's name as having voted, and mark against such name the number of ballot-papers delivered to such voter.

31. *Informal ballot-papers.*—If any voter suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of commissioners to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect.

32. *What question may be asked.*—At any election of commissioners, the returning officer may, if he see fit, or if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer, put to any person tendering his vote the question following:—

"Are you the person whose name appears as (A.B.) in the roll now in force for this trust, being enrolled therein in respect of land in the parish of \_\_\_\_\_, being (here specify land as described in the roll)?"

And no other question shall be put to any person tendering his vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer such question, or who shall not answer the same absolutely in the affirmative, shall receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.

33. *False answer, polling twice, and personation.*—Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer to the question aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once or offer to poll more than once at the same election, or who shall depart or attempt to depart from any polling-booth after having received a ballot-paper without having deposited the same in the ballot-box as hereinbefore provided, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as it appears by the roll he is entitled so to do.

34. *Result of polling, how ascertained.*—Returning officer to have casting vote.—Immediately upon the close of the poll, the returning officer shall, in the presence of and subject to the inspection of so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present, proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer shall abstain from inspecting the number written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the returning officer shall seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the booth; and as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll publicly declare the candidates, not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up, who have received the greatest number of votes to have been duly elected commissioners of the trust; and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall in each case have the casting vote.

35. *Ballot-papers, how disposed of.*—The returning officer shall, in the case of the said first election of commissioners, forthwith, after the declaration of the poll, endorse with a description of the contents thereof and sign the sealed parcel of ballot-papers, and forward the same to the Minister, who shall, as soon as may be after the first meeting of trust commissioners shall have been held, forward such sealed packet to the secretary of the trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three commissioners of the trust; but in all subsequent elections the parcel of ballot-papers so sealed, endorsed, and signed shall be delivered by the returning officer to the said secretary, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months after such delivery, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three of the commissioners of the trust.

36. *Minister to determine questions arising upon first election.*—If any question arise as to the due election of any commissioner at the first election, the returning officer shall, at the request of any voter or candidate, submit such question in writing to the Minister, who shall decide the same, and such decision shall be final and binding.

37. *Questions arising upon subsequent elections to be determined by trust.*—If any question arise as to the due election of any commissioner at any subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary), such question shall be determined by the commissioners of the trust at the first ordinary meeting held after the election; but no commissioner in respect of whose election such question shall have arisen shall act as a commissioner at such meeting, or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof, or in any manner or at any time to act as a commissioner until such question shall have been so determined; and the majority of the commissioners whose election is not in dispute shall form a quorum.

38. *Appeal to Minister from determination of trust.*—In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the commissioners shall have determined the question, and the Minister may make such inquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary, and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just, and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.

39. *Failure to elect deemed to create extraordinary vacancies.*—If at any election of commissioners no vacancies or a number of vacancies less than the whole number which should have been filled up at such election are filled up, then the vacancies which are not so filled shall severally be deemed extraordinary vacancies and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election. Provided always that the commissioners eventually elected to fill such vacancies shall go out of office as if elected at such election.

40. *Expenses of election to be paid by trust.*—The expenses incurred by the returning officer, or under his direction, in connexion with any election shall be defrayed by the trust.

41. *Penalty for breach of regulations.*—These regulations shall also be deemed to be regulations under section 250 of *The Irrigation Act 1883*, and any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner before justices of the peace.

42. *Interpretation.*—In these regulations words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to or inconsistent with this interpretation.

WHEREAS by *The Irrigation Act 1886* it is provided that any Municipal Council or Waterworks Trust or Irrigation Trust, or any two or more together of such Councils or Trusts, or the majority in number of the ratepayers in any proposed district, or the majority in number of the owners of land within any proposed district, such majority being the owners of at least half the land of the proposed district, may petition the Governor in Council to constitute such district an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein. And it is further provided by the said Act that, before any District or Trust can be constituted or appointed under the said Act upon a petition from any Municipal Council or Waterworks Trust, or from any two or more together of any such Councils or Trusts, or from a majority in number of the ratepayers in any proposed district, or upon a petition from the majority of the owners of land within any proposed district, a petition from owners of land, being an absolute majority of the owners of land within the proposed district, such majority being the owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, shall be presented to the Governor in Council, praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first petition, as set forth in the declaration of the Minister, published under the said Act, may be adopted in part or in whole. And it is further enacted that, after compliance with the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council may approve of the scheme proposed, either with or without any alterations or additions or restrictions, as he may think fit, or he may disapprove of the same; and if he approve of the same, either with or without alterations, he shall make an Order in Council accordingly.

And whereas the majority in number of the owners of certain lands situate in the parish of Harcourt, in the county of Talbot, in the colony of Victoria, and within the boundaries of a proposed district (shown upon the plan accompanying their petition) being the owners of at least half the land within such proposed district, have, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, petitioned the Governor in Council to constitute the proposed district (as shown upon the plan accompanying their petition) an Irrigation and Water District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein for carrying out the scheme or plan of works proposed in the said petition.

And whereas all the provisions of the Act necessary to precede the declaration, in writing, of the Minister of Water Supply, upon the said petition having been complied with, the said Minister duly published his declaration in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th day of August, 1888, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act.

And whereas after due observance of the steps necessary under the said Act to precede such a petition, on this 18th day of November, 1889, a petition of an absolute majority of the owners of the land in the district so proposed to be constituted, such majority being owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, hath been presented to His Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council, praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first-named petition, as set out in the said declaration, in writing, of the Minister, might be adopted.

And whereas the Administrator of the Government in Council, having taken all the circumstances into consideration, and having ascertained and being satisfied that there has been a compliance with all the provisions of the said Act necessary to be observed before the approval of the scheme of the petition for the constitution of the proposed district as an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and for the appointment and creation of a Trust therein, has determined to approve of the scheme proposed by such petition.

Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in accordance with the provisions of and in exercise of the powers

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, clean white (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Botanic and Domain Gardens may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such

supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering it replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.




