USE OF FLAGS IN THE BRITISH MERCHANT SERVICE.

SIR,

I have the honour to transmit to you for information and publication in the Colony under your Government a copy of 52 & 53 Vic. Cap. 73. "An Act to amend the Law relating to the use of Flags in the British Merchant Service," passed in the last Session of Parliament. I also enclose for publication and for insertion in any volumes of the Colonial Regulations in use in the Colony an amended paragraph to be substituted for number 6 of section 432 in chapter 20, relating to the use of flags.

"MERCHANT SHIPPING COLOURS ACT 1889."  
[52 and 53 Vic., ch. 73.]



CHAPTER 73.

An Act to amend the law relating to the use of flags in the British Merchant Service.

[30th August, 1889.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. *Explanation of law as to national colours for ships.*—The red ensign usually worn by merchant ships, without any defacement or modification whatsoever, is hereby declared to be the

proper national colours for all ships and boats belonging to any subject of Her Majesty, except in the case of Her Majesty's ships or boats, or in the case of any other ship or boat for the time being allowed to wear any other national colours in pursuance of a warrant from Her Majesty or from the Admiralty.

2.—(1.) *Penalty on ships not showing colours.*—A ship belonging to any subject of Her Majesty shall, on a signal being made to her by one of Her Majesty's ships, and on entering or leaving any foreign port, and if of fifty tons gross tonnage or upwards shall also on entering or leaving any British port, hoist the proper national colours.

(2.) If default is made on board any such ship in complying with the requirements of this section, the master of the ship shall incur a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds.

Provided that this section shall not apply to any sea fishing boat duly registered, lettered, and marked as required by the Acts relating to the sea fisheries.

3.—(1.) *Amendment of s. 105 of the Merchant Shipping Act 1854.*—Any penalty incurred under section one hundred and five of *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, in respect of the improper hoisting of colours or of a pendant on board any ship or boat belonging to any subject of Her Majesty, with the costs of recovering the penalty, may be recovered in Her Majesty's High Court of Justice in England or Ireland, or in the Court of Session in Scotland, or in any Vice-Admiralty Court within Her Majesty's dominions.

(2.) Any offence mentioned in that section may also be prosecuted, and the penalty for it recovered, in the same manner as if the offence were an offence declared by *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, to be punishable by a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds.

Provided as follows:

(a) Where any such offence is prosecuted as last aforesaid the Court imposing the penalty shall not impose a higher penalty than one hundred pounds; and

(b) Nothing in this section shall authorize the imposition of more than one penalty in respect of the same offence.

4. *Definition of Her Majesty's ships.*—The expression "one of Her Majesty's ships" includes any vessel being under the command of an officer of Her Majesty's navy on full pay.

5. *Saving for Admiralty.*—Nothing in this Act shall affect any power of the Admiralty in respect of the red ensign usually worn by merchant ships.

6. *Title and construction of Act.*—This Act may be cited as *The Merchant Shipping (Colours) Act 1889*, and shall be construed as one with *The Merchant Shipping Acts 1854 to 1887*, and those Acts and this Act may be cited together as *The Merchant Shipping Acts 1854 to 1889*.

6. All other vessels registered as belonging to one of Her Majesty's colonies or dependencies will fly the red ensign without any badge. (See section 1 of 52 and 53 Victoria Cap. 73.) There will, however, be no objection to colonial merchant vessels carrying distinguishing flags with the badge of the colony thereon, in addition to the red ensign, provided that such flag does not infringe the limits laid down in section 105 of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1854*.

REGULATION RESPECTING PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

"Receivers of revenue, collectors of imposts, and other duly authorized officers, shall obtain all books containing such printed forms of receipt or acknowledgment from the Treasury, by requisition through the permanent head of their respective departments. As regards those receipt books which are known not to be kept in stock at the Treasury, requisitions for supplies thereof must be forwarded in sufficient time to allow of the forms being printed."

REGULATION RESPECTING PUBLIC ACCOUNTS UNDER SECTION 2 OF 22 VICT. NO. 86.

"As regards Expenditure other than Salaries, Wages, and Allowances fixed by Law—

"Heads of Departments shall, so soon as funds are legally available for the service of any financial year, and thereafter not later than the 15th September, the 15th December, and the 15th March in each year, prepare on the Form (K) annexed an Estimate of moneys likely to become due and payable during the ensuing quarter for their respective departments; and shall submit the same to the Minister for the purpose of obtaining his sanction to certify accounts for payment to the extent specified in such Estimate; only when absolutely necessary may Supplementary Estimates be submitted for the like purpose between the dates above specified. Copies of all approved Estimates shall be forthwith transmitted, under the signature of the Minister, to the Treasurer and the Commissioners of Audit."

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1874 it is amongst other things enacted that where any street or road in any municipal district exceeds one chain in width such street or road may, for any length thereof, be reduced in width to any width not less than one chain, and that the council of the municipality and the Board of Land and Works, and every owner of any land having a frontage to such street or road in any place where the same is so reduced in width, or in any place not more than three chains from any such place, may agree in writing, under the common seals of the municipality and the Board of Land and Works, and under the hand and seal of every such owner, upon a scheme for the reduction in width of such street or road for the length mentioned in such scheme, and for the disposal of the surplus land taken from such street or road, and as to the purchase-money to be paid by any such owners who may be allowed to purchase any of the surplus land, and as to the compensation, if any, not exceeding in the whole the amount of the purchase-money to be paid in respect of any land injuriously affected by such scheme, and the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the Government Gazette, confirm such scheme, and thereupon any land mentioned in such scheme in that behalf shall cease to be a street or road, and all rights of way over the same shall cease and determine; and it shall be lawful for the Governor, on payment of the purchase-money for any such surplus land to the Treasurer of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, to grant such land in accordance with the provisions of any such scheme in the manner prescribed by the said Act; and by warrant under his hand to direct payment of any such compensation out of the consolidated revenue, which is by the said Act appropriated for that purpose accordingly; And, whereas a scheme has this day been submitted to the Governor in Council for reducing the width of a portion of Vickery-street, in the Township of Alexandra, in the Colony of Victoria; Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the 367th section of the said Act, doth by this present Order confirm the said scheme for the reduction of the width of that portion of Vickery-street, in the Township of Alexandra aforesaid, as shown in red lint on a plan attached to such scheme, and deposited in the Office of Crown Lands and Survey, Melbourne, and, in accordance with the said scheme, under the seals of the Shire of Alexandra, the Board of Land and Works, and under the hands and seals of the respective owners of land having a frontage to the portion of the street aforesaid, and dated the twelfth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

"THE IRRIGATION ACT 1886."

IN the matter of the petition of the president, councillors, and ratepayers of the Shire of Bairnsdale, praying for the constitution of certain lands situate in the parishes of Glenaladale, Nindoo, Coongulmerang, Moornung, Bairnsdale, Goon Nure, and Bengwood, in the county of Tanjil, and in the parishes of Wuk Wuk, Wy Yung, and Broadlands, in the county of Dargo, as an irrigation and water supply trust within the meaning of the said Act, and for the appointment and creation of a trust for such district.

Pursuant to section 18 of the said Act, I hereby declare upon the said petition the matters following, viz.:-

1. That the scheme or plan of the proposed works shall be— (a) a weir on the Mitchell River immediately below its junction with Stony Creek, in the parishes of Glenaladale, county of Tanjil, and Wuk Wuk, county of Dargo; (b) a main channel from the weir along the left bank of the Mitchell River to the head of the valley, about 2½ miles in length, capable of carrying 8,500 cubic feet of water per minute; (c) a flume across the Mitchell River at the end of the main channel to convey 7,000 cubic feet of water per minute to the south channel; (d) a south channel about 42 miles in length, capable of carrying 7,000 cubic feet of water per minute at its head, terminating in the parish of Bengworden; (e) a north channel in continuation of the main channel along the left side of the Mitchell Valley, about 47 miles in length, capable of carrying 1,500 cubic feet of water per minute at its head; (f) all the necessary channels, fencing, flumings, pipes, bridges, and minor works required for the efficient distribution of the water over the Trust area; (g) the existing Bairnsdale Town Water Supply works.

2. That the whole of the works shall be Trust works.  
3. That the amount of money which it is proposed that the Board of Land and Works shall advance by way of loan, for the purposes of such Trust works is One hundred and eleven thousand three hundred and seventy-six (£111,376) pounds sterling.

4. That the rate of interest to be paid by the Trust upon such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum.

5. That the source of supply will be the Mitchell River, and the maximum quantity of water that may be diverted for the use of the Trust shall be 8,500 cubic feet per minute throughout the year, but in no case shall the quantity diverted exceed one-half of the natural flow of the river at any time.

6. That the powers of rating to be given to the Trust shall not exceed 25 per cent. on the annual valuation of the rateable property within the Trust district.

NAGAMBIE WATERWORKS TRUST.—  
REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations made by the Nagambie Waterworks Trust under the provisions of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Nagambie Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946, do hereby make the following regulations:—

i. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, Three shillings for every one thousand gallons shall be charged.

ii. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when the water is supplied by measure shall be—

(1.) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at Three shillings per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2.) If for other than domestic purposes only thirty thousand gallons per half-year, excepting as follows:—

Gardens and lawns, ¼ acre and less,	8,000 galls. per annum.
" " " "	12,000 " "
" " " "	16,000 " "
" " " "	28,000 " "
" " " "	40,000 " "
Livery and carriers' stables for each stall or space of five feet	3,000 " "
Stand-pipe or hydrant, water for each load of 100 gallons or under ...	... Sixpence.

(3.) All charges for water supplied by measure to be paid monthly.

iii. Tenements situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, chargeable with half-rate.

iv. Tenements exceeding one quarter, but not exceeding one half a mile distant from a stand-pipe, chargeable with one-fourth rate.

v. Every person who is supplied by the Trust with water by measure shall, at his or her own expense, provide a meter (which meter shall be submitted to and examined by the proper officer of the Trust, who, if he shall find the same correct and in a proper working order, shall give his certificate to that effect), which, when fixed, shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such person. The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection and so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto; the keys of the meter shall be in possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet-pipe, unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.

vi. All service-pipes with the necessary stop-cocks shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Trust may appoint.

vii. All delivery cocks to be strong hard brass, and in all exposed places to be open and shut by a moveable key or handle.

viii. Plumbers or other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and to fix meters, or to re-fix or relay the same, must satisfy the proper officer of the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner.

ix. No meter shall be fixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

x. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises, or of any lands or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

xi. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

xii. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

xiii. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

xiv. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted, the inlet-pipes to which must be visible and accessible, and attached to the bath above the bottom thereof, and the bath provided with a proper well-fitted and watertight ground outlet plug or cock.

xv. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

xvi. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

xvii. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or washing houses and walls, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by measure.

xviii. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his or her premises, or shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

xix. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

xx. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without first receiving permission and giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose; and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each breach.

xxi. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall each have a stop-cock at the main, and shall in no case exceed one half-inch diameter for the supply of premises except where supplied by measure, and then not to exceed three-quarters of an inch.

xxii. The water supplied in the urban district of the Trust shall be received and used under and in accordance with these regulations and *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, and such parts of *The Public Works Statute 1865* as are incorporated herewith.

xxiii. If any person, whether supplied with water by the Trust or otherwise, shall commit a breach of these regulations, such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and such person, if supplied with water by the Trust, shall be liable to have the supply of water cut off from his premises, either by cutting the pipes by or through which such water is supplied, or otherwise as the Trust may think fit, and such supply shall cease so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

xxiv. In the foregoing regulations, wherever the words "officer" or "servant" appears, the same shall be deemed to be taken and mean an officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf.

The foregoing regulations were made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Nagambie Waterworks Trust under and by virtue of section 119 of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946, this 10th day of December, 1889.

The births of 1,300 children, viz., 656 boys and 644 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of November. In the month of October 1,371 births were registered, or 71 more than in the month under review. The births were 387 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 80 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in November numbered 925, viz., 500 of males and 425 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 375, or 41 per cent. The deaths exceeded those in October by 280, and were above the average of November during the previous ten years by 375. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by 190 only.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.97, and of deaths registered 2.11.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 93.2° on the 20th, and the lowest was 41.3° on the 12th. The mean temperature of the month (61.8°) was about a degree and two-thirds above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (35.1°) took place on the 3rd, and the least range (7.4°) was on the 23th. The mean daily range was 19.0°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.173 inches on the 11th, and the lowest was 29.516 inches on the 4th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.844 inches) was slightly below the average.

Rain fell on 13 days, the amount of rainfall being 4.27 inches. The average rainfall in November during the previous ten years was 2.94 inches, or 1 1/4 inch less than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on one day during the month. Males contributed 54 per cent., and females 46 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 55 per cent. to that mortality, as against 47 per cent. in 1888, 41 per cent. in 1887, 54 per cent. in 1886, 48 per cent. in 1885, 53 per cent. in 1884, 45 per cent. in 1883, 49 per cent. in 1882, 38 per cent. in 1881, 41 per cent. in 1880, and 39 per cent. in 1879.

Twenty-four deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these a carrier, aged 75, died of softening of the brain; a female, aged 75, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 75, of congestion of the lungs; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 76, of cardiac dilatation; a storekeeper, aged 76, of bronchitis; a gardener, aged 76, of strangulated hernia; a female, aged 76, of fracture of the right femur; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 77, of softening of the brain; a cooper, aged 78, of diarrhoea; a female, aged 78, of cancer; a ropemaker, aged 78, of apoplexy; a chemist, aged 78, of cardiac dilatation; a builder, aged 80, of diarrhoea; a coachbuilder, aged 80, of gastro-enteritis; a gentleman, aged 80, of shock consequent on having his arm broken; a female, aged 82, of diarrhoea; a gentleman, aged 84, and a bootmaker, aged 87, of heart disease; a farmer, aged 87, of Bright's disease of the kidneys; a labourer, aged 77, a gentleman, aged 80, a female, aged 81, a ploughman and a female, each aged 84, of old age.

Forty-five deaths arose from external causes during the month, of which thirty-six were set down to accidents, five to homicide, and four to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A seaman, aged 44, and a labourer, aged 47, died of injuries consequent on falling into the hold of a ship; a labourer, aged 38, of fracture of the skull, the result of a derrick

falling on him; a blacksmith, aged 21, of injuries caused by a piece of iron striking him; a labourer, aged 27, of the effects of a blow from a pick; a cabdriver, aged 27, and a gatekeeper, aged 64, of injuries occasioned by falls; a male infant, aged 18 months, and a labourer, aged 50, were passed over by vehicles; a messenger, aged 12, a sailmaker, aged 24, and a labourer, aged 29, were passed over by railway trains; a male child, aged 2, died of exhaustion from peritonitis, caused by his being impaled; a gold miner, aged 28, of injuries from the explosion of dynamite; a clergyman, aged 45, and a female, aged 76, died of fracture of the thigh; a gentleman, aged 80, of shock caused by his arm being broken; a female child, aged 9, of injuries to the pelvis, how caused not stated; a male child, aged 3, of injuries resulting from burns; a female, aged 27, was poisoned by sulphuric acid; a male child, aged 8, a hawker, aged 23, and a laundress, aged 31, were found drowned in the River Yarra; a clerk, aged 44, was drowned in Hobson's Bay; a bill-sticker, aged 49, a groom, aged 50, a stone Sawyer, aged 39, a gardener, aged 56, and a railway pointsman, aged 57, were found drowned; a female infant, aged 1 day, a male infant, aged 10 weeks, and a female infant, aged 3 months, were overlain; a male child, aged 3 years, was suffocated in a manner not stated; a female, aged 28, an inmate of the Lunatic Asylum, was suffocated whilst being fed; a hatter, aged 44, and a dealer, aged 58, were suffocated whilst intoxicated. The homicidal deaths were those of a male infant, who was killed by suffocation; a male and a female infant, who were killed by fracturing the skull; a male infant, who was drowned by his mother; and a cellerman, aged 36, who was shot with a revolver—a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of a clerk, aged 34; a labourer, aged 38, and a master mariner, aged 57, who shot themselves; and a female, aged 28, who drowned herself.

One hundred and forty-nine deaths, or 16 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—65 in the Melbourne Hospital, 30 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Homeopathic Hospital, 16 in the Children's Hospital, 4 in the Lying-in-Hospital, 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 5 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Austin Hospital, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, 2 in the Protestant Refuge, and 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 507, of which 276, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 231, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 402 were under one year of age, 65 were between one and two, 15 were between two and three, 16 were between three and four, and 9 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 418. Of these, 224, or 54 per cent., were males, and 194, or 46 per cent., were females; 28 were between five and ten, 12 were between ten and fifteen, 20 were between fifteen and twenty, 29 were between twenty and twenty-five, 50 were between twenty-five and thirty, 34 were between thirty and thirty-five, 33 were between thirty-five and forty, 25 were between forty and forty-five, 19 were between forty-five and fifty, 31 were between fifty and fifty-five, 34 were between fifty-five and sixty, 36 were between sixty and sixty-five, 23 were between sixty-five and seventy, 20 were between seventy and seventy-five, 13 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 11 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from zymotic diseases rose from 77 in October to 157 in the month under review, the increase being mainly due to deaths from diarrhoeal diseases, which rose from 21 to 87. Under this head, also, deaths from typhoid fever rose from 6 to 16, those from diphtheria from 21 to 27, those from whooping cough from 15 to 18, and those from scarlet fever from 1 to 3. Moreover, under the head of diseases of the digestive system, deaths increased from 61 to 164. Besides the deaths from diphtheria referred to in the last column of the following table, 9 deaths were set down to diphtheritic croup (classed as a disease of the respiratory system), as against 8 in October, 7 in September, 8 in August, and 10 in July.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in each of the first eleven months of the present and the two previous years:—

CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR EXCURSIONS.

(Passengers can, however, travel by the express train on the New South Wales line on payment of 15s. first class and 10s. second class.) The journey cannot be broken on the New South Wales line.

**Adelaide Excursion Tickets.**—From the 18th December, 1889, till the 2nd January, 1890 (both dates inclusive), excursion tickets, available by the express and ordinary trains, will be issued at Melbourne for Adelaide at the following return fares, viz.:—First class, £4 2s. 6d.; second class, £2 12s. 6d. Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oats hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oats, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, clean white (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oats hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oats or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Botanic and Domain Gardens may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulet, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September 1890, and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

#### TENDERS FOR GRAZING LANDS.

**Tenders must be sent in on proper form, which can be obtained on application to the Lands Department, Melbourne, or any of the Survey Offices in the country.**

Tenders must be placed in the Crown Lands Office Tender-box not later than Twelve noon on Tuesday, 31st December, 1889.

NOTE.—The fee for the period from 1st January, 1890, to 31st December, 1890, and fee of Five shillings for licence, must accompany each tender.

TENDERS will be received by the Board of Land and Works, up to Noon of Tuesday, 31st December, 1889, for the occupation for Grazing purposes only of the following unappropriated portions of land, subject to the Regulations approved by the Governor in Council and also the subjoined special conditions.

Every licence granted under section 119 of *The Land Act 1884* shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the schedule hereto, and to such special conditions and payment in advance of such fee as the Minister may determine, and shall be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized in that behalf.

Under sections 3 and 4 of *The Rabbit Suppression Act Amendment Act 1884*, all licensees under the section for which these licences will issue are liable for the destruction of rabbits within the boundaries of their licences.

##### Conditions:

1. The issue of this licence shall not prevent the land comprised therein, or any part or parts thereof, being sold, leased, licensed, alienated, or dealt with under any of the provisions of *The Land Act 1884*, except under the 119th section thereof, under which the licence is issued, or being resumed by order of the Governor or Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, for any of the purposes for which land may be reserved under section 10 of *The Land Act 1884*, or for mining purposes.

2. In case the said land, or any part or parts thereof, shall be sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation other than the return of such portion of his licence fee paid by him as the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering Part XI. of *The Land Act 1884* may think fit. This licence is also subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine therein, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation for surface or other damage.

2A. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purposes for which the licence has been granted, until notice has been given in the *Government Gazette* that such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid; and, immediately upon such notice being given, all the interest of the licensee in the licensed land described in such notice shall cease and be determined, and any person entitled to occupy the licensed land, or any part thereof, may lawfully make entry upon and hold the same, without the permission or sanction of the licensee or any one claiming under her, him, or them.

3. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

4. This licence entitles the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but does not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate, or to fence any portion thereof.

5. If the licensee desire a renewal of this licence, notice to that effect must be given to the responsible Minister aforesaid one month prior to the expiration thereof, but nothing herein contained shall be deemed to confer the right to any renewal.

6. The interest in this licence may not be transferred without the consent of the Minister aforesaid and the payment of a fee of £1.

7. No claim whatever shall be made or entertained by reason of the licence not being renewed or transferred.

8. This licence is to be used under and in accordance with the regulations made or to be made under the provisions of the said Act and for the time being in force.

9. This licence may be forfeited if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with any of these conditions.

10. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette* purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

##### Special Conditions:

1. The period of occupation will be from 1st January, 1890, to 31st December, 1890.

2. The licence fee must be paid in advance. The fee for the period from 1st January, 1890, to 31st December, 1890—for which the licence will be issued—must accompany the tender, or be paid by the successful tenderer or his agent immediately on the declaration of the acceptance of the tender, otherwise the offer of the next highest tenderer who may be prepared to comply with this condition may be accepted.

3. Tenders to be for so much per lot and block per annum.

4. Separate tenders must be lodged for each block.

5. Tenders to be endorsed "Tender for Lot 1, Block 303," or "Lot 2, Block 956," or "Lot 3, Block 986," as the case may be.

### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The supplies are to be equal in every respect to the contract sample or specification, and are to be delivered at the Government Printing Office, but delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of.

2. The quantity mentioned in the schedules will be required from the contractor, who will be bound, however, to supply any further quantities, at the scheduled price, that may be ordered by the Government Printer during the currency of the contract. Six (6) months' notice of the ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS will be given to the contractor by the Government Printer.

3. In the event of the supplies not being delivered by the time specified in the schedule or order as the case may be, it will be competent for the Government Printer to purchase the same, or such articles as may be suitable for the service, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense that may be incurred over and above the contract price will be deducted.

4. The supplies on delivery will be surveyed by a board appointed by the Government for that purpose, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. Payment will be made on the board's certificate that the goods are of contract quality and in good order and condition.

5. If the board of survey shall decide that the goods are not of contract quality, the contractor must in that case remove the goods objected to and supply others in their stead, failing which the supplies may be purchased as in condition 3.

6. All rejected goods must be removed by the contractor within forty-eight hours after notice has been given to him by the Government Printer of such rejection, and if not so removed the Government Printer is hereby empowered to send same to any store in Melbourne, there to be stored at the contractor's risk and expense.

7. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding One hundred pounds, as the Government may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 3, or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the security.

8. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

9. In the event of the contractor failing to carry out the contract, the contract security money will be absolutely forfeited, and the contractor disqualified from tendering for a period of twelve months.

10. The packages, cases, &c., will become the property of the Government without extra charge.

11. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the unpacking and stacking of paper and materials at the Government Printing Office.

#### FIRST DIVISION.—273 SERVICES.

1. 2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.

3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, marked cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and in the event of the travelling distances on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term of three years.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

11. Tenderers are informed that the Department undertakes to carry parcels up to 7 lbs. in weight by all services for which tenders are accepted for conveyance of mails by vehicle.

Packets up to 3 lbs. in weight are conveyed by horseback services.

12. 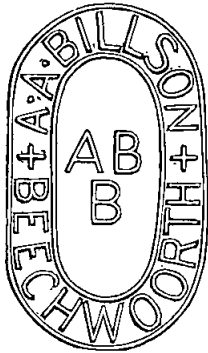

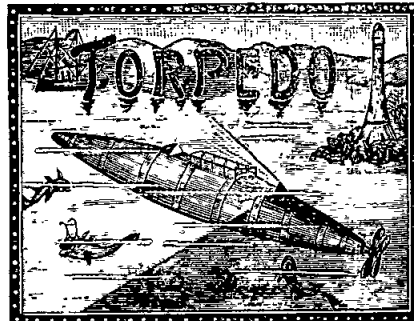

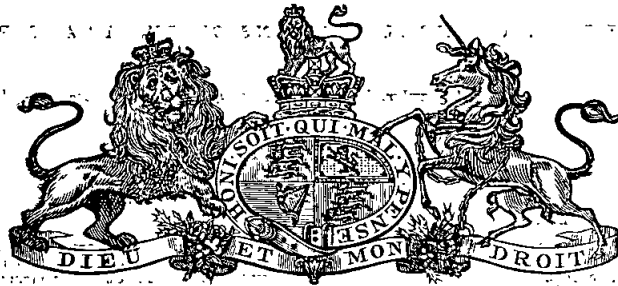

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Nidry of Nidry Castle in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the twelfth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine; and issued in pursuance of *The Public Health Statute 1865*, it was notified that the Island of Sumatra was infected with cholera, and that it was probable that such disease might be brought from such Island to Victoria: And whereas the circumstances which led to the issue of such Proclamation have ceased to exist: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation.

GENERAL RULES FOR FORMAL INVESTIGATIONS BY THE COURT OF MARINE INQUIRY.

WHEREAS by section 135 of *The Marine Board Act 1887*, it is provided that the Governor in Council, may, from time to time, make, and when made may revoke, alter, and add to general rules to carry into effect the provisions of the said Act with respect to the Court of Marine Inquiry, and in particular with respect to the summoning of and procedure before the court, the amount and application of fees, and the publication of such rules: And whereas the Governor in Council did, on the 28th day of December, 1888, make General Rules for Formal Investigations by the Court of Marine Inquiry, and whereas it is expedient to revoke the same to the extent hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth revoke the rules Nos. 26, 27, and 29, and in lieu thereof doth make and substitute the following amended rules, namely:—

26. *Constitution of court where master or mate of sailing ship charged.*—Where the investigation involves or appears likely to involve the cancelling or suspension of the certificate of a master or mate of a sailing ship, one at least of the members of the court shall be a master mariner, possessing a certificate of

competency as such, who has served five years as a master in the merchant service, two years of which service, at least, must have been in command of a sailing ship, or an officer who has served not less than five years in any rank not lower than that of lieutenant or navigating lieutenant in Her Majesty's naval forces or in the naval forces of the colony of Victoria.

27. *Constitution of court where master or mate of steam ship charged.*—Where the investigation involves or appears likely to involve the cancelling or suspension of the certificate of a master or mate of a steam ship, one at least of the members of the court shall be a master mariner, possessing a certificate of competency as such, who has served five years as master in the merchant service, two years of which must have been in command of a steam ship, or an officer who has served not less than five years in any rank not lower than that of lieutenant or navigating lieutenant in Her Majesty's naval forces or in the naval forces of the colony of Victoria.

29. *Constitution of court where pilot or exempt master charged.*—Where the investigation involves or appears likely to involve the cancelling or suspension of the licence of a Port Phillip pilot or of an exempt master, one at least of the members of the court shall be a Port Phillip pilot, or a master holding a licence as exempt master at the time of his selection by the Board as eligible for appointment as a skilled member of the court, or shall be a person who has held a licence as a Port Phillip pilot and has retired from active service.

And the Honorable James Brown Patterson, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Trade and Customs for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1885."

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the 29th section of *The Factories and Shops Act 1885* (49 Vict. No. 862), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of the said section 29 in

ALL THE WOOLLEN FACTORIES IN VICTORIA

for a further period of three months from the 1st January, 1890, upon these express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factories any female or any male under the age of sixteen for more than fifty-six hours in any one week, or more than ten hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That no female or male under the age of sixteen shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without her or his consent.
3. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in each such factory for the information of all concerned.

REGULATIONS FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE  
BONUS OF £2,000 APPROPRIATED BY PARLIAMENT  
TO ENCOURAGE THE INCREASE OF THE  
SUPPLY OF FISH AND OYSTERS IN VICTORIA.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the distribution of the bonus of £2,000 appropriated by Parliament to encourage the increase of the supply of Fish and Oysters in Victoria:—

1. Any person or company intending to compete for the bonus voted by Parliament for the encouragement of the fishing industry shall notify their intention to the Honorable the Commissioner of Trade and Customs on or before the 31st March, 1890, and shall give in such notification full particulars of the vessel and appliances proposed to be used, and the names of all parties concerned in the venture.

FISH.

2. Out of the sum of £2,000 set apart for the development of the fishing industry, the sum of £600 shall be paid to the person or company who shall before the 1st of December, 1890, deliver in Melbourne 50 tons of fish, exclusive of salmon, taken by means of trawling or deep-sea fishing from any part of Bass' Straits, or off the coasts of Victoria. The vessel or vessels used for such purpose shall not be less than 25 tons gross registered measurement, and shall, with all fittings and appliances and equipment, be subject to the approval of the Inspector of Fisheries as to their adaptability to the work of trawling or deep-sea fishing. In the event of more than one person or company competing and delivering, as above mentioned, 50 tons of good marketable fish, exclusive of salmon, before the date specified, such person or company as shall be second in delivering the said quantity of

fish shall receive a bonus of £400. No credit will be given for any fish not approved or passed by the Inspector of Fisheries. All fish delivered under this regulation must have been taken by the vessel or vessels above mentioned.

## OYSTERS.

3. Out of the said sum of £2,000 the sum of £300 shall be paid to the person or company who shall before the 1st December, 1890, deliver in Melbourne 600 sacks of oysters, each sack containing three bushels, taken without infringing proclamations, by means of dredging, from any part of Bass' Straits, or off the coasts of Victoria. The vessel or vessels used for the purpose shall not be less than 25 tons gross registered measurement, and shall, with all fittings and appliances and equipment, be subject to the approval of the Inspector of Fisheries as to their adaptability to the work of oyster dredging. In the event of more than one person or company competing and delivering, as above mentioned, 600 sacks, each containing three bushels, of oysters before the date specified, such person or company as shall be second in delivering the said quantity of oysters shall receive a bonus of £200.

4. The fish and oysters may be delivered in Melbourne in any quantities, and at such times as may be most convenient to the takers, provided that no credit will be given for any fish or oysters respecting which the Inspector of Fisheries is not satisfied that they have been caught or taken by the persons or company delivering them. The fish delivered may be either fresh or salted.

5. The persons or company who may compete for the bonuses above mentioned will be required to provide in each vessel employed in trawling or oyster catching suitable accommodation for an Assistant Inspector of Fisheries, and shall properly board the same for an amount not exceeding Four shillings per diem.

6. Any persons or company as aforesaid shall at all times when so required by the Inspector of Fisheries produce all books, vouchers, and evidence which such Inspector may deem necessary, in order to prove that the fish and oysters delivered are *bona fide* the property of the person or company delivering the same, and that such fish or oysters have been procured in the manner and by the means required under these regulations, and no bonus or any portion of the amount voted by Parliament shall be paid unless with the approval of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, and on the certificates of the Inspector of Fisheries that these regulations have been complied with.

## REGULATION No. 5.

By virtue of Act No. 946.

Regulation for imposing, levying, and receiving water charges within the Borough Echuca Water Trust District for the year 1890.

1. The following charges are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Borough Echuca Water Trust District shall pay for the year 1890, namely:—

2. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Thirty pounds or less, the sum of Thirty shillings.

3. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Thirty pounds, in addition to the Thirty shillings named in the last clause, a sum of Four pounds per centum for every pound from £31 to £100 inclusive, and a sum of Three pounds per centum on every pound from £100 upwards.

4. On every cordial or aerated water factory, or other such like factories, a charge of Ten pounds per centum. On every flour mill a charge of Fifteen pounds.



-5. On every steam engine, exclusive of any factory or mill, &c., &c., a charge of Twenty shillings.

6. On every livery stable, a charge of Seven pounds ten shillings.

7. On every hotel, a charge of Five pounds per centum on the valuation up to £150; and for every pound from £150 upwards, a charge of Three pounds per centum, including eight stalls, every extra stall One shilling.

8. On every horse trough, a charge of Twenty shillings.

9. On houses, lands, hotels, tenements, &c., &c., using a hose, in addition to the foregoing charges named for each respectively a charge of Twenty shillings.

10. The charge for every private house shall include one quarter acre of land. Should any larger quantity of land be attached to a private house, and water laid thereon, an extra charge of Ten shillings for every quarter of an acre or part of a quarter of an acre shall be paid.

11. In cases where parties have gardens from any part of which produce is sold, in addition to the ordinary charge for domestic purposes, they shall pay an additional charge of Fifty shillings for every quarter of an acre or part of a quarter of an acre cultivated or watered.

*Cases where Water is not used.*

12. On every house, tenement, hotel, factory, &c., &c., not supplied with water, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the valuation of same.

13. On each allotment or piece of land rated separately from any tenement, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of same, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Two shillings and sixpence.

*Meters.*

14. The charge for water supplied by meter shall be Three shillings per thousand gallons (1,000), provided that the amount shall not in any case be less than the charges hereinbefore made.

15. The charge for water supplied from the Trust stand-pipes shall be Three shillings per thousand gallons (1,000).

The Commissioners of the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, by virtue of clause 95 and in accordance with the provisions of clause 136 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, do make the following Regulation:—

No. 5.

1. That the year shall be divided into four irrigation periods as follows, viz.:

- (1) From the first day of December to the last day of February, both inclusive.
- (2) From the first day of March to the thirty-first day of May, both inclusive.
- (3) From the first day of June to the thirty-first day of August, both inclusive.
- (4) From the first day of September to the thirtieth day of November, both inclusive.

2. That application for water may be made at any time, to be supplied in any period named in the application.

3. That water supplied to a consumer in one period shall not prevent such consumer from applying for and being supplied with a fair share of the water available during any other period. Provided that in no period shall a consumer be entitled to more than a fair share of the water available.

4. That no application for water shall be recognised unless a deposit equal to twenty-five per cent. of the total price of the quantity of water applied for be paid when the application is made; and if any applicant shall refuse or neglect to take such water at the time named in his application, as that at which he desires the supply; or if the water be not then available at some subsequent period not later than fourteen days from such time, such deposit as aforesaid shall be forfeited. Provided that if no water be available for the supply of such applicant during the irrigation period for which such application was made, the applicant shall be entitled to a refund of the amount of the deposit paid on account of such application. Any dispute which may arise with a water bailiff shall be referred to the head water bailiff and finally to the Trust.

5. That previous to the water being supplied, the balance (seventy-five per cent.) of the total price of the quantity of water applied for shall be paid by the applicant. If such balance be not paid as aforesaid, no water shall be supplied, and the deposit may be forfeited by the Trust.

Whereas the Governor in Council has, by an order made the second day of December, 1889, under the provisions of section 97 of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, divided the Wimmera United Waterworks District into divisions, and directed that the necessary rates for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust for the construction and maintenance of their waterworks, or to meet any other expenses in connection therewith, shall be levied in such divisions, viz.:—The Shire of St. Arnaud division, the Shire of Kara Kara division, the Shire of Dunmunkle division, and the shire of Stawell division; and has further directed that such rates be levied differentially as between such said several divisions, and that the proportion in which such several divisions shall be rated respectively one to another shall be as follows, that is to say, that the respective ratings in the pound sterling on the annual value of ratable property rated for municipal purposes in the said several divisions shall be—Shire of St. Arnaud division, fifteen pence; Shire of Kara Kara division, twelve pence; Shire of Dunmunkle division, sixteen pence halfpenny; Shire of Stawell division, ninepence.

And whereas the Governor of the colony of Victoria, by proclamation dated 28th June, 1886, proclaimed certain areas in and around the townships of Murttoa and Warracknabeal to be respectively Urban Districts under the provisions of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*, No. 778.

And whereas by further proclamation, dated the 29th December, 1887, the Governor of the colony of Victoria proclaimed certain areas in and around the townships of Donald and Dimboola to be respectively Urban Districts, under the provisions of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946.

And whereas the Governor in Council by an order dated the 13th day of December, 1886, diminished the extent of the said Wimmera United Waterworks District by excising therefrom the territory described above as the Shire of Wimmera division.

And whereas His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, by an Order dated the twenty-sixth day of August, 1889, further diminished the extent of the said Wimmera United Waterworks District by excising therefrom such portions of the said district as were within the Shire of Dimboola and to the westward of the Yarriambiack Creek, excepting the site of the Longerenong Weir and the portion of the reserve within two chains thereof:—

The following rate is made on the annual value of all the ratable property in the said several divisions of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, excepting in the said Urban districts of Murttoa, Warracknabeal, and Donald, according to the valuation for the time being on all such lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the Shires of St. Arnaud, Kara Kara, Dunmunkle, and Stawell respectively, that is to say, on ratable property within the Shire of St. Arnaud division, a rate of fifteen pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Kara Kara division, a rate of twelve pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Dunmunkle division, a rate of sixteen pence halfpenny in the pound sterling of such valuation; and in the Shire of Stawell division, a rate of ninepence in the pound sterling of such valuation.

Such rate is hereby made for the year 1890, commencing on the 1st January, 1890, and terminating on the 31st of December, 1890, and shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1890.
