read "such invoices shall set forth legibly."

For "the following declaration,"

read "such of the declarations contained in Schedule E hereto as will suit the circumstances of the case."

Clause 2 (c) to be cancelled, and the following to be substituted:—

"The full amount of *ad valorem* duty paid upon importation may be allowed as drawback on the goods mentioned in Schedule I, subject to the following conditions, viz.:—

1. The entry having been duly dealt with as hereinbefore provided (*vide* clauses 1 and 2), shall bear on its face the words "Full duty paid claimed as drawback," and shall show thereon also the original invoice values (with 10 per cent. added thereto), and the rate of duty paid, and the declaration on back of said entry shall be in accordance with the schedule hereto (form E.)
2. The original invoices produced at the time the import entry was passed, and which must bear the Customs stamp and Landing Waiver's initials as evidence of such production, shall be shown to the proper officer.
3. Statement of original invoice values, &c., as per form D, must accompany the entries.
4. The goods for export on which drawback is claimed must be capable of easy identification by the officers of Customs with the original invoices, either by showing the maker's marks, or numbers on such goods, or by being still in the original packages in which imported, or such other evidence as to the Collector of Customs shall seem satisfactory.
5. Export (or Purchaser's) invoices must accompany the entry (see Declaration, form E.)
6. Travellers' samples will not be allowed drawback under this clause."

Clause 2 (d) to be cancelled, and the following to be substituted:—

"Drawback will be allowed on travellers' samples subject to the conditions that the usual export entry and invoices have been passed and dealt with as directed in clauses (a) and (b), and that the appropriate declarations as provided in schedule E have been duly made and subscribed."

NOTE.—The apparent increase of population in 1888, or that obtained by adding the excess of registered births over registered deaths to the excess of recorded arrivals over recorded departures, was 60,019, as against 39,064 in 1887. The actual increases are known to be less than these, in consequence of the departures by sea being imperfectly recorded. If allowance be made for the probable number of unrecorded departures in 1888, the net increase of population during that year will be reduced to 54,750, viz., 31,309 males and 23,441 females, as shown above.

The large number of arrivals in 1888, as compared with the number in 1887 and previous years, is no doubt partly due to the influx of persons connected with and of visitors to the Melbourne Centennial International Exhibition.

The registered births numbered 34,464 and the registered deaths 16,248 in 1888; thus the former exceeded the latter by 18,216, or 112 per cent. The births exceeded those in 1887 by 1,421, and the deaths exceeded those in 1887 by 243; both births and deaths were also much more numerous than in any other year.

The recorded arrivals by sea numbered 102,032 and the recorded departures by sea numbered 60,223 in 1888. The gain to the population by excess of the former over the latter was thus apparently 41,809. This number, however, must be reduced by an allowance for unrecorded departures, estimated to amount to 5,289, which brings the probable net gain by immigration down to 36,534.

From the period of the census of 1881 to the end of 1888, the whole reduction made for supposed unrecorded departures has been 41,257. Had no such reduction been made, the population at the end of 1888 would apparently have amounted to 1,132,126.

The gain by excess of births over deaths in 1888 exceeded that in 1887 by 1,178, and the gain by excess of recorded arrivals over recorded departures in 1888 was greater than in 1887 by 19,777.

In 1888 the recorded arrivals from were greater than the recorded departures for New South Wales by 10,517; South Australia by 3,402; Tasmania by 8,649; New Zealand by 8,475; the United Kingdom by 9,894; Foreign Countries by 866.

The population of New South Wales is estimated by the Government Statistician of that colony to have numbered 1,085,356 (viz., 508,827 males and 486,529 females) at the end of 1888, or 5,513 less than the estimate for this colony. It is believed that New South Wales became more populous than Victoria about the middle of 1887, and that, at the end of that year, her population was the larger by 6,800; but according to the present estimate Victoria has regained her position as the most populous colony of the Australasian group. The increase in New South Wales during the year is set down as 42,437, or 12,313 less than the estimated increase in Victoria. No account is or can be taken in either colony of the emigration of the population overland, and the population estimates are based upon the assumption that the numbers going from and coming to each colony over its borders are equal.

As regards the Victorian estimate, it should be stated that the figures of births and deaths during 1888, and consequently those of population, will probably be slightly altered when the returns of the Deputy Registrars are finally examined.

BOROUGH OF STAWELL LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

BYE-LAW No. 2.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, the Local Board of Health for the Borough of Stawell, being the Municipal Council thereof, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, doth hereby make the bye-law following, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws or parts of bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*, and shall have operation in the whole of the said borough.

3. The occupier or person in charge, or having the management or control of any house, dwelling, school, licensed public-house, factory, workshop, or other building or premises within the said borough shall provide for and constantly keep in every privy or place in the nature of an earth-closet used in connection therewith a proper closet-pan, made of galvanized iron properly

riveted and soldered, so as to be watertight, with handles there to, and of a capacity not less than ten gallons, and not exceeding three cubic feet.

4. Every occupier or person in charge, or having the management or control of any such house, &c., &c., as described above, shall keep, or cause to be kept, in every privy or earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material sufficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all such night-soil which may be deposited to be immediately on deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to deodorize the contents of such pan.

5. Every such occupier and person above described shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every pan as aforesaid.

6. No person shall empty any pan as aforesaid, privy, earth closet, cesspit, or any place for the deposit, except by means of a night-cart duly licensed by the Local Board of Health or the Municipal Council, and the said licensee or driver of said night-cart shall be entitled to demand and receive for such service such sum of money for each pan or service as above-named as the Local Board may from time to time fix or determine.

7. Every person who shall, by any act or default, be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall on conviction be liable to a penalty of Forty shillings but not less than Five shillings, and a further penalty of Forty shillings but not less than Five shillings for every day during which such breach shall continue.

The foregoing bye-law was allowed and confirmed by the Central Board of Health in and for the Colony of Victoria (it having been first certified that notice of the intention to apply for such confirmation had been given in the Borough for which the same has been made in the manner required by law) this eighth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

FURTHER REGULATIONS FOR THE PREVENTION OF THE SPREAD OF CONTAGIOUS DISEASES.

WHEREAS the contagious or infectious diseases known as diphtheria, measles, scarlet fever, typhoid fever, and whooping-cough are at present prevalent in several towns and places in the Colony of Victoria, and whereas the provisions contained in section 74 of *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883* have, by Order in Council, been directed to be put in force in the said colony, the Central Board of Health doth, by virtue of the powers conferred by the said section, and of every other power enabling the said Central Board in this behalf, make the following further Regulations for preventing or mitigating the said diseases, that is to say:—

1. Clause 9 of the Regulations heretofore made by the said Board for the prevention of the spread of the said diseases, dated the twenty-third day of April 1885, is hereby revoked, and the following shall be read in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

9. *Closets and privies.*—All earth-closets, water-closets, and privies shall be kept in an inoffensive and cleanly condition, and emptied at least once a week; and during the continuance of any case of typhoid fever in any house, within the meaning of the said *Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, all closets of any kind or description whatever on the premises of such house, or in any way connected therewith or used by the inmates thereof, shall be emptied daily. A sufficient quantity of some effective deodorant, such as dry earth or wood or other ashes, shall be always kept ready for use in such closet. All closets attached to any school, railway station, factory, hospital, or place of assembly or entertainment, or any licensed house, shall, during the prevalence or on the occurrence of any case of typhoid fever in the vicinity, be disinfected daily, by the addition of a sufficient quantity of sulphate of iron, chloride of lime, or other reliable antiseptic powder to the closet-pans, or receptacles, whatever they may be. And for the purposes of this regulation the station-master, resident surgeon, master of a school, manager or overseer of a factory, or other person in immediate local charge or having control of the establishment, shall be the person responsible for the due execution of this regulation. Every building in which any one shall work, have to be taught, or to live or remain, shall have attached to it forthwith (if not already provided) one or more properly constructed earth-closets, and all underground cesspits shall be, as soon as possible, emptied, treated with fresh lime, and filled up with dry earth.

2. The Regulation for the prevention of the spread of the said diseases, dated the fourth day of March 1886, and called an "Additional Regulation," is hereby revoked.

3. These Regulations shall be read and construed in connection with the said Regulations of the twenty-third day of April 1885.

4. *Penalties.*—Any person who fails to comply with any of the foregoing Regulations, or is guilty of any neglect or disobedience thereof, is, by section 168 of the said Statute, thereby guilty of an offence against the provisions of Part IV. of that Statute, and is liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Twenty shillings for each day during which such offence is continued, besides any expenses which may be incurred in remedying his default.

BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

BYE-LAWS.—MELBOURNE WATER SUPPLY.

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, make the Bye-laws following:—

1. All bye-laws heretofore made relating to the Melbourne Water Supply shall be and the same are hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed or the recovery of any rates due and payable thereunder.

2. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Board, that is to say:—

- I. On every house or tenement of £20 annual value and under, Ten shillings per annum.
- II. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £20, a rate of Sixpence for each pound sterling on the amount of the valuation up to £300 inclusive, and One pound ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300.
- III. Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, a rate of Sixpence for each pound sterling on the amount of the valuation up to £300, and One pound per centum on the amount of such valuation in excess of £300.
- IV. Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Forty shillings per annum each, except where in the opinion of the Board a meter shall be necessary.
- V. Water for steam boilers will be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler except where, in the opinion of the Board, a meter shall be necessary.
- VI. For water supplied to shipping the charge will be—at the Melbourne Wharves, Three shillings per one thousand gallons; at other places, Four shillings per one thousand gallons.
- VII. Water for horses, where the number kept on one tenement does not exceed two, will be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each horse, and water for cows up to three in number, kept or partially kept on premises, at the rate of Five shillings for each cow, but it shall be optional for the owners of same to take the supply by measure.
In instances where the above numbers are exceeded, the supply of water must be by measure.
- VIII. The Board may supply water for the making and mixing of concrete at the rate of Twopence per cubic yard, and for masonry and brickwork at the rate of Three halfpence per cubic yard as measured in the work.
- IX. Water supplied by the Board by measurement will be charged at the rate of One shilling per one thousand gallons, and in cases where the supply is solely for purposes other than domestic, the minimum charge will be 25,000 gallons per quarter.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes, as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which at One shilling per thousand gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

4. The Board may grant permission to persons requiring water for "domestic" and for "other than domestic purposes" to affix two service-pipes, one for domestic supply without meter for which the ordinary assessed rate shall be paid, and one for other than domestic purposes with meter, the water used therefrom to be paid for at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons, but subject to such regulations as may be approved by the Board against the use or re-use of water from the domestic service for irrigation or any other purpose not domestic.

5. Any person receiving water from the Board who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Board who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Board, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Board, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Board, he shall obtain from the Board a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

8. Such licence shall be for such period and be from time to time renewable as the Board shall see fit, and the Board may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof, by himself or his employé, committing any breach of these bye-laws.

9. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Board the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Board that he is a competent plumber.

10. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Board, without giving two days' notice to the Board of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Board, without the permission in writing of the Board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the Board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

11. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Board without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipe of the Board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board. Lead piping of the following weights:—

and galvanized iron piping of approved quality only will be allowed for external and internal services.

Ordinary connexions with submains must be made with proper stop-cock ferrules, to which, for iron services, a length of not less than three feet of lead pipe must be attached. One service-pipe only for domestic supply to each tenement will be permitted, and for houses rated at Twenty pounds per annum and under, the bore of such service-pipe must not exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ inch.

12. All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings. All joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper bit" joints be allowed on water service-pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of licence. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock shall be fixed on each house service between the main and the building line, and at a uniform distance of three (3) feet from the building line, to be properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap.

13. No extensions of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Board.

14. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Board into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Board that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Board may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said Board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none the owner, shall in every instance in which, after notice that service-pipe requires repairing, any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

15. Any person supplied with water by the Board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

16. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Board. Each meter must be capable of registering at least one million gallons.

17. If any meter should cease registering, or be reported by the inspector as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the Board shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Board may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe.

18. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to, and with the approval of the Board.

19. Baths to be fitted must not exceed six feet three inches in length along the centre line by a mean width of two feet and a depth of one foot nine inches; the section of bottom to be a segment of a circle, the ends to be circular in shape and sloping inwards. Overflow pipes will not be permitted.

20. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

21. No person shall, without the written permission of the Board, water streets or thoroughfares by means of hydrants and hose attached to fire plugs. Any person offending against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

22. The water supply to all public parks and gardens shall be exclusively under the control and direction of the officers of the Water Supply Branch of the Department of Public Works, and any person not duly authorized turning on the water or otherwise interfering with such water supply shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

23. No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe (used for the purpose of supplying the water of the Board for domestic purposes to any house or premises) for watering any garden, laying dust, or for any other purpose whatsoever, unless where a water meter is fixed and the water supplied by measure; and any person offending against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

24. No tap shall be placed in any garden or yard or to or outside of any dwelling or premises supplied with the water of the Board unless a water-meter is fixed and the water supplied by measure; and any person offending against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

25. In the construction of these bye-laws, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole.

BALLAN WATERWORKS TRUST CONSTITUTED.

WHEREAS by *The Water Conservation Act 1887* it was amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application should have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, should submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application or as to any alterations or additions he might think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and the Governor in Council might thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or might disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and should make an Order in Council accordingly: And it was further enacted that if the Governor in Council should approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations or additions or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust should be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks, and of the constitution of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, should state—

(a) The amount of money which the Governor in Council would grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the same and paying the cost and expenses of the plans and application for the same; and also the rate of interest which would be charged for such loan, such rate being at least one-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the Public Loan out of which such loan might be granted;

(b) Should proclaim the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such Trust should have authority, to be called a Waterworks District;

(c) Should state what are the principal works to be constructed; and

(d) Should contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the now in part recited Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council should think fit.

And it was further enacted by section 23 of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 943, that whenever a waterworks district was either wholly or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof within one, municipal district, the Governor in Council might appoint the municipal council for the time being of such municipal district, together with one or more persons not being members of such municipal council, to be the Waterworks Trust of such waterworks district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application of the president, councillors, and ratepayers of the Shire of Ballan for a loan of Six thousand pounds sterling to carry out certain waterworks for the supply of a waterworks district under the said Act, embracing such portion of the Shire of

Ballan as is shown on the plan accompanying the said application, together with the general plan and description therein referred to, deposited in the Department of Victorian Water Supply, Melbourne, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

(1.) The construction of the said waterworks.

(2.) The municipal council of the Shire of Ballan for the time being and one other Commissioner to be the Waterworks Trust of such waterworks district.

(3.) That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be Six thousand pounds sterling, for the purpose of carrying out approved works and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payable half-yearly.

(4.) That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—

Portion I.—Commencing at a point due west eight chains from the north-west corner of allotment 4A, section XII., parish of Moorabool West, county of Grant; thence by a line north 35° 30' west seventeen chains; thence by a line north 54° 30' east ten chains; thence by a line south 35° 30' east seventeen chains; thence by a line to the commencing point south 54° 30' west ten chains.

Portion II.—A strip of land fifty links in width: Commencing at a point on the south boundary of portion No. I., as above described, fifty links south-westerly from right bank of River Werribee; thence in general directions easterly, southerly, south-easterly, westerly, easterly, south-westerly, and southerly, through allotments 4, 4A, Glenlyon pre-emptive right, allotments 9B, 9A, 10, 17, 18, 27, and 28 of section XII., and allotment 1 of section A, parish of Moorabool West, to the north boundary of portion No. III., described below.

Portion III.—Commencing at a point on the east side of the Daylesford and Geelong road bearing south 32° 19' east twenty chains from the north-west angle of allotment 1 of section A, parish of Moorabool West; thence by a line bearing south 57° 41' west one hundred and fifty links; thence by a line bearing south 32° 19' east three hundred links; thence by a line bearing north 57° 41' east one hundred and fifty links; thence by a line to the commencing point bearing north 32° 19' west.

Portion IV.—A strip of land fifty links in width, commencing at a point on the south boundary of portion No. III., as above described, distant about fifty links from the east side of the Daylesford and Geelong road; thence in a general direction south-easterly along that road and through allotment 1 of section A and allotment 1A, parish of Moorabool West, and allotments 11, 12, 13, 14 of section I., the Ballan pre-emptive right, and allotments 3 and 4, all in the parish of Gorong, to the centre of the main three-chain road from Ballarat to Ballan; thence easterly along that road to the west boundary of the township of Ballan.

Portion V.—The whole of the township of Ballan, parish of Gorong, counties of Grant and Bourke, as described in the *Government Gazette* of 1861, page 401.

All of which portions are as shown on Order in Council plan in the office of the Minister of Water Supply, Melbourne.

(5.) That the principal works to be constructed or carried out by the Trust shall consist of a weir on the Werribee River, main channel, pipe-head reservoir with main pipe therefrom, and reticulation pipes in the Ballan township.

(6.) That the name of the Trust shall be the "Ballan Waterworks Trust."

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A RACE-COURSE, AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF STRANGWAYS, AT NEWSTEAD.

WE, John Kyd, James Charles House, John Treacy, James Sheehan and John McGuinness, the duly appointed Trustees of the reserve for a Racecourse, and other purposes of Public Recreation in the parish of Strangways, at Newstead, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*:-

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve, which is parcelled out into the divisions set forth hereunder, shall be open to the public free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not to exceed four in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart by the Trustees

for the holding therein of races:-(1.) The grand stand, lawn, saddling paddock, steward's stand and weighing yard, all of which are enclosed partly by a close fence and partly by a picket fence. (2.) The portion of the ground known as the hill reserve, and which is enclosed partly by a picket fence and partly by portion of the boundary fence. (3.) The remainder of the reserve, excepting such parts (if any) as may hereafter be enclosed and set apart for plantations.

2. The scale of charges or fees which may be levied and taken on the occasion of races for admission to the first, second, and third divisions of the reserve and the buildings thereon, shall be as follows:-

For admission to the first division of every person with a truck or barrow, Seven shillings and sixpence.

For admission to the second division of every person with a truck or barrow, Five shillings.

For the admission of every horse to the second division, Two shillings.

For admission to the second division of every vehicle drawn by one horse, Two shillings and sixpence.

For admission to the second division of every vehicle drawn by more than one horse, Two shillings and sixpence for each horse.

For admission to the second division of every person whether on horseback, or in a vehicle, or on foot, Two shillings.
For admission to the first division of every person, Seven shillings and sixpence.
For admission to the third division of every person, One shilling.

3. No horse except a racehorse engaged in the races or any vehicle of any kind whatsoever, shall be admitted to the first division of the reserve, and no horse or vehicle shall be admitted to the third division thereof.

4. The scale of charges or fees which may be levied and taken for the admission of horses to the reserve for the purpose of training or exercising, shall be as follows:—For every horse engaged in the Newstead races only, Five shillings; for every other horse, One pound.

5. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

6. Every person who has been proved to the satisfaction of the Trustees to have been guilty of malpractice or dishonourable conduct in connection with racing, or to be a defaulter, shall be excluded from the first and second divisions of the reserve, notwithstanding that such person shall have paid the charges or fees for admission thereto.

7. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

8. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, flowers, buildings, or fences in or around the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except with the consent, in writing, of the Trustees.

9. No person shall, except as hereinbefore provided, bring any horse or vehicle into the reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees.

10. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees, or bring any dog therein, unless led by a chain or cord: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

11. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any other structure of any kind whatsoever, for the purpose of profit or of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.

12. No person, except laborers or workmen employed by the Trustees in the reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

13. No person shall engage in the games of cricket and football, except in those portions of the reserve which may be set apart by the Trustees for such games.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith

apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

Security will be required either in Government debentures, bank deposit-receipt in favor of the Secretary of the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security is calculated at Ten per cent. upon contracts not exceeding £1,000, and at Five per cent. over that sum; but no deviation will be allowed from the amounts above stated.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Persons failing to take up their contracts will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be according to sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labor may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods, and be transmitted through the Stores and Transport Department, except in the case of supplies for the Local Military Department, the Naval Forces, the Harbor Department, and for Works and Buildings. From these departments the order will be sent direct to the contractor. All orders must accompany the goods on delivery, otherwise the goods will not be received. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and, in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form simultaneously with delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being rendered with the order to which it relates. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officers issuing the orders. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods.

10. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 13 of these conditions.

11. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. All articles rejected must be immediately replaced by the contractor, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in condition 7.

12. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the colony for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 7.

13. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 7, or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

14. *Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.* In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

17. In the event of any alteration in the tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government will neither claim any decrease upon the contract price nor entertain any application from a contractor for any increase to it.

DAYLESFORD DISTRICT HOSPITAL AND BENEVOLENT ASYLUM.

ALTERATION IN THE RULES.

At a special meeting of Governors and Subscribers, held on the 9th January 1889, the following alterations in the Rules of the above Institution were adopted, viz:—

PRIVILEGES OF SUBSCRIBERS.

That each annual contributor of £1 ls. and upwards shall have the privilege of recommending one in-patient and four out-patients (or, should he prefer it, six out-patients instead) for each guinea subscribed for a period of twelve months from the date of such contribution.

That every benefactor of £20 or upwards in any one year shall be a life governor, and shall be entitled to the same privilege as an annual contributor of £2 2s.

That every executor (first named) under any will paying to the institution a bequest of £20 or upwards, and every minister receiving by one or more collection in his church in any one year the sum of £20 or upwards, and that every other person elected at a general meeting of governors and subscribers, at the recommendation of the committee of management, in consideration of special services rendered to the institution, be respectively honorary governors, with all the rights and privileges of life governors; and one person (with the exception of the paid collector) collecting by subscription in any one year the sum of £10 or upwards, and the chairman or representative of any public body or society voting in any one year the sum of £5 5s., shall be respectively annual governors, and shall be entitled for that year to the same privilege as an annual subscriber of £3 3s.

Every benefactor of £10 10s. in any one year shall be a life subscriber, and be entitled to the same privileges as an annual contributor of £1 ls.

That every annual contributor of £1 ls. or upwards, life, honorary, and annual governors, and life subscribers, shall be entitled to one vote each at all meetings of governors and subscribers.

Admission to the hospital shall in all cases be subject to the approval of the committees of managements hereinafter mentioned, provided there are vacant beds, and the funds of the hospital admit of the reception of such patients.

In the absence of satisfactory reasons to the contrary being offered to the general committee, no person shall be allowed to remain in the hospital who, in the opinion of the medical staff, may receive equal benefit as an out-patient. Every person obtaining the benefit of the institution under a plea expressed or implied of destitution, who shall, in the estimation of the general committee, upon a representation being made to them of the fact, be able to pay for such benefit, shall be liable for the same the rate of £2 per week; and every person admitted on the ground of emergency to the benefits of the hospital, and well able in the estimation of the general committee to pay for them, will also be required to pay at the same rate, the general committee having power to reduce or increase this amount, as they may deem advisable, in special cases.

That paying patients be only admitted by the patients' committee, subject to the approval of the general committee and to such regulations as may be made from time to time.

A list of all paying patients admitted, and the rate of payment fixed, to be submitted by the patients' committee to the general committee at each monthly meeting.

The hours of attendance for out-patients shall be from 11 o'clock a.m. to 1 p.m. daily.

Rule 17. "Thursday" substituted for "Friday."

Rule 20. "July" substituted for "January."

That any member of the committee of management failing to attend for four consecutive meetings, without leave from the committee, shall cease to be a member, and another shall be appointed in his stead, as provided by the Act.

A visiting committee, consisting of three members, shall be elected for three months, by, from, and subject to the general committee. It shall be their duty to visit the hospital at least once a week, to examine the building, inspect the wards, make inquiries as to the quality and quantity of the rations, enforce the rules, engage, suspend, or discharge servants, subject to the approval of the general committee, and bring up a report at the next monthly meeting of the general committee of their proceedings, and all other things connected with the management of the institution, and requiring attention, for the consideration of the general committee.

The office of any member of the visiting committee shall cease by his ceasing to be a member of the general committee or by his neglecting his duties for four weeks in succession, except by special leave of the visiting committee. Any vacancies shall be filled by the general committee.

FINANCE COMMITTEE.

A finance committee, consisting of three members, with the treasurer of the hospital for the time being, who shall be an *ex officio* member, shall be appointed by and from the general committee annually. It shall be the duty of this committee to examine and check all accounts and details of income and expenditure, and generally to supervise and have control over all financial matters connected with the institution, and to report to the general committee at each monthly meeting. The committee shall meet at least once in each month, or oftener if necessary. The office of any member shall be vacated by his ceasing to be a member of the general committee, or by neglecting to attend three successive meetings of the finance committee, except by special leave of absence from the committee.

PATIENTS' COMMITTEE.

A patients' committee, consisting of three members, shall be elected by and from the general committee half-yearly. It shall be their duty to visit the hospital at least once each week, to inquire into the circumstances of all persons making use of the charity, either as paying patients or otherwise; to have general supervision over all matters connected with the admission and discharge of patients, and the enforcement of by-laws, rules, and regulations connected therewith; and to report to the general committee at each monthly meeting. The office of any member shall be vacated by his ceasing to be a member of the general committee, or by neglecting to attend the meetings of the committee for four weeks in succession, except by special leave of the committee.

Any vacancy in the visiting, finance, or patients' committee to be filled by the general committee at the meeting following such vacancy.

The visiting and patients' committees shall meet weekly, and the finance committee monthly, on such days and hours as they may from time to time appoint, and shall keep minutes and records of their proceedings.

The patients' and visiting committees shall each keep a book, in which shall be entered all complaints, directions, or suggestions regarding the working or management of the institution made by the members of the said committees, and such books shall be open for the inspection of the resident surgeon and wardman, and shall be laid before the general committee at each monthly meeting thereof.

RESIDENT SURGEON.

The resident surgeon shall reside in the residence connected with the hospital. He shall visit all patients in the institution twice daily, morning and evening, and, in case of emergency or special cases, as often as may be necessary. He shall have the right of private practice, but shall arrange with one of the honorary surgeons to attend any cases of emergency which may arise during his absence.

The resident surgeon shall receive the certificates from the applicants for admission, examine the nature of the cases, and decide on their fitness for admission, either as in-door or out-door patients, subject to the approval of the patients' committee; and he shall discharge all patients as soon as he considers them fit to be discharged.

He shall take charge of all patients, and of their treatment; but, in case of difficulty or danger, shall request the attendance of any or all of the honorary medical officers.

He shall make a special report to the patients' committee of every patient who may have been two months in the hospital; and he shall report every case that may be considered incurable by the medical staff, to be dealt with as the committee may see fit.

He shall enter regularly, in proper books to be kept for such purpose, the names of the patients as they are admitted and discharged, and note the nature and history of their disease while under treatment; loss or breakage of surgical instruments or other things in his charge; and shall have such books ready at all times for the inspection of the patients' and visiting committees. He shall attend the weekly meetings of the various committees if required, and shall lay before them all recommendations for patients received since their last meeting; and he shall receive all money and other property belonging to the patients, and shall account for the same weekly to the committee.

In the event of the resident surgeon requiring temporary leave of absence, the patients' committee, if satisfied of the necessity, and that due arrangements have been made for the performance of his duties, may grant such leave, not exceeding three days, and report the same to the general committee at the next monthly meeting.

He shall not grant leave of absence to any of the subordinates of the institution for a period exceeding twenty-four hours, without the consent of the visiting committee.

There may be three honorary medical officers, who must be legally-qualified medical practitioners. They shall be elected by the governors and subscribers at each annual meeting, but shall

be subject to removal by the committee of management for malpractice, misconduct, or neglect of duty.

Any vacancy in the number of honorary medical officers may be filled by the general committee until the next annual meeting.

The honorary medical officers shall attend the hospital when required by the resident surgeon.

The honorary medical officers and the resident surgeon shall perform the surgical operations in such order as may be agreed upon by themselves. *Post-mortem* examinations shall be conducted by the resident surgeon, who shall keep the keys of the dead-house, and give notice to the honorary medical officers when a consultation is to be held or an operation to be performed, but in all cases of emergency he shall act to the best of his judgment. A consultation of the medical staff shall take place in all cases of capital surgical operation; but if any honorary medical officer shall not attend within a reasonable time after being duly summoned, or if, in the opinion of the resident surgeon, the safety of the patient may be endangered by delay, the latter may forthwith perform the duty.

The honorary medical officers shall make a report of each of their visits to the institution in a book to be provided for the purpose.

Previously to making any payment, the treasurer shall require a warrant of the committee of management authorizing such payment, which shall be signed by the president or one of the vice-presidents and two other members of the committee, and countersigned by the secretary.

He shall collect subscriptions and all monies due to the institution, and in all cases give receipts for such monies on consecutively numbered printed receipt forms, to be supplied to him by the committee, and shall fill up the butt of each block to correspond with the receipt issued, and pay over all monies received to the treasurer at least once in each week, and render him an account of the amounts collected or received since last payment, and he shall also submit his book, blocks, and accounts to the finance committee at each meeting.

The wardman shall take charge of the institution during the absence of the resident surgeon, and during that period he shall have full control of the servants and the assistant wardmen, and be held responsible for the proper conduct of the institution and the care of the patients, and shall immediately report any breach of rules or regulations or dereliction of duty to the president and resident surgeon.

The wardman shall, subject to the regulations made by the general committee, take delivery of all supplies for the hospital, and examine and check the same to see that they are in accordance with the quality specified, and that the quantities charged for are correct.

He may refuse to take delivery of any provisions or other supplies which are of inferior quality, deficient in weight, or not according to specifications, and shall immediately report such refusal, and the reason therefore, to the resident surgeon and the visiting committee.

This shall not apply to medicines, medical comforts, surgical instruments, or appliances, which shall be subject to the approval of the resident surgeon.

No wardman, nurse, or servant shall leave the institution without permission of the resident surgeon, in accordance with the committee's regulations.

All wardmen, nurses, and servants shall be obedient to the regulations of the institution, and they shall report immediately to the resident surgeon any impropriety of conduct or infringement of them by any patients, visitors, or other person; and, if such complaint be not properly attended to, they shall report the same to the visiting committee at its next meeting.

Any patient having any charge or complaint as to his or her treatment while in the hospital shall communicate the same to the patients' committee or secretary for the purpose of investigation; but if such complaints are not made before leaving the institution, or within three days after, they will not be entertained.

Patients judged by the resident surgeon sufficiently convalescent to be able to assist in the work of the institution, in the improvement of the reserve, or otherwise in any way for the benefit of the institution, may, at the discretion of the resident surgeon or patients' committee, be so employed.

Visitors are admitted into the institution on Sunday, Wednesday, and Saturday in each week, between the hours of one and five o'clock in the afternoon; but no visitor is allowed to remain more than two hours.

Visitors may be admitted on special occasions by the resident surgeon, or a written order from a member of the committee addressed to the resident surgeon.

Any visitor violating any of the regulations of the institution, or behaving with impropriety, will be compelled to retire, and will not be readmitted without special leave from the resident surgeon or visiting committee.

Ministers of religion, or persons certified by them in writing to be qualified, and no other, shall have access to sick persons of their respective denominations at all reasonable time for the purpose of religious instruction. Every clergyman or religious instructor shall confine his visits to the sick patients who belong to his religious communion, unless his services are specially requested by any of the patients, and shall impart religious instruction at the bedside of the patient in such a way as to be as little overheard as possible by the surrounding patients. It is not allowable to read in a loud voice or conduct public religious service in the sick wards of the hospital, except by special permission of the general committee; but the waiting-room of the hospital shall be available for public worship among the convalescent of each religious persuasion, as far as the same may be practicable, subject to the approval of the general committee.

The presence of four members shall constitute a quorum of the general committee, and two of the patients, visiting, and finance committees.

No member shall make any motion for re-considering a motion previously disposed of except in pursuance of a notice given at a

previous meeting of the committee, and such notices must be given in writing before the close of the meeting.

That no new rules or regulations, or any repeal or alteration in the existing rules or regulations, shall be valid unless the same shall have been passed at a special meeting of the committee, in pursuance of notice of motion given at a preceding meeting of the general committee, setting forth the proposed new rules or regulations or alteration in existing rules and regulations in full.

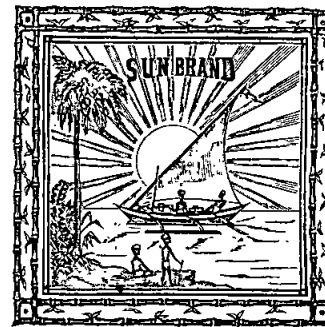
