PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**I**N pursuance of the provisions contained in the eighty-eighth section of *The Public Service Act 1883*, and in the fifth section of the *Bank Holidays Act 1873*, I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation appoint

- FRIDAY THE 1ST DAY OF MARCH NEXT  
to be observed as a Public Holiday within the Shire of Healesville;
- WEDNESDAY THE 6TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT  
to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday at Richmond, as a Public Holiday within the Shire of Maldon, and as a Bank Holiday at Kyabram, Mooroopna, Natimuk, Shepparton, and Yarra Flats;
- THURSDAY THE 7TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT  
a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Yarrawonga;
- FRIDAY THE 8TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT  
to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday at Fitzroy, as a Public Holiday within the United Shire of Beechworth, and as a Bank Holiday at Beechworth;
- MONDAY THE 11TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT  
to be observed as a Public Holiday within the Shire of Tullaroop, and as a Bank Holiday at Carisbrook and Majorca;
- TUESDAY THE 12TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT  
to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday at Kerang\*;
- WEDNESDAY THE 13TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT  
a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Geelong;
- THURSDAY THE 14TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT  
to be observed as a Public Holiday within the Shire of Gisborne, and as a Bank Holiday at Colac and Gisborne;
- MONDAY THE 18TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT  
a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Benalla and Donald;
- MONDAY THE 18TH AND TUESDAY THE 19TH DAYS OF MARCH NEXT  
special days to be observed as Bank Holidays at Omco;
- FRIDAY THE 22ND DAY OF MARCH NEXT  
a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Portarlington.

“THE STAMP DUTIES AMENDMENT ACT 1888.”—REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-sixth day of February 1889.

IN accordance with the provisions of, and in exercise of the powers conferred by The Stamp Duties Amendment Act 1888, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations for carrying out the provisions of the said Act in the office of the Registrar-General, and doth order that the subjoined Regulations shall take effect on the first day of March proximo.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. In the collection of moneys the Collector of Imposts will be assisted by the officers whose duty it will be to receive or issue any papers or documents, or permit searches, in respect of which fees are chargeable. Those officers will mark upon tickets, having block counterparts, the amounts to be collected, and the Collector of Imposts will perforate, on receipt forms, the amounts actually received by him, as indicated by those tickets.
2. The officers who receive or issue documents, or permit searches, will see that the correct amount has been duly paid, and a receipt therefor given before performing any duty to which the amount payable relates, and it will be their duty to affix the receipts given by the Collector of Imposts to all papers or documents registered which would, but for the provisions of the Act No. 1010, have stamps affixed to them.
3. The Collector of Imposts will be assisted by such officers as may be found necessary, and no other officer or officers will be allowed on any pretence to collect moneys or impress papers or documents, and generally no officer is to transact business with the office as agent for another person.
4. The collector's cash book is to be checked daily against the dockets in the hands of officers in respect of the business of each day.
5. The forms to be in use under these Regulations will be the following:—
