GRANT TO HORTICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations in connection with the above-named Grant 1888-9:—

Regulations for the distribution of the sum of Seven hundred and fifty pounds granted by Parliament to Horticultural Societies 1888-9.

1. That each society claiming to participate in the Grant shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st February 1889, a statement in the Form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the Form marked B.
2. The distribution of the vote will be made one month after the above-mentioned date, when a sum equal to the amount of the prize-money awarded and paid away will be allotted to each society having a claim, and be made payable to the treasurer thereof, provided that the sums claimed do not exceed in the whole Seven hundred and fifty pounds, and if they do exceed this amount then they will be reduced *pro rata*, and the allotment made accordingly.
3. No society whose expenditure in prizes between the 1st January 1888 and the 31st December 1888 amounts in the total to less than Fifty pounds shall be entitled to participate in the vote.

GRANT FOR PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS, 1888-89.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations in connection with the above-named Grant, viz.:

PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS.

Regulations in connection with the Vote of Nine thousand five hundred pounds (£9,500) for Fencing and Improving Public Parks and Gardens under the control of Borough Councils, Trustees, Committees of Management, &c.

1. A sum not exceeding Ten shillings shall be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister may approve, in such park or garden between 1st January 1888 and 31st December 1888, out of funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Agriculture on or before the 1st February 1889. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in the form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the form B.
2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park or garden from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park or garden, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st of January 1888 and 31st December 1888; but it shall not mean nor include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January 1888.
3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park or garden shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1888 (vide form A), and a sum equal to one-half of the balance then remaining, if made up of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of Nine thousand three hundred and four pounds seventeen shillings and sixpence, they shall be reduced *pro rata*.
4. A sum of Ninety-five pounds two shillings and sixpence shall be paid to the Eaglehawk Borough Council in satisfaction of its claim against the vote for the year 1887-8; same not having been received in time to participate in distribution.

5. In every case in which a claim is sent in, an officer of the department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.
6. Moneys expended in street planting or in fencing, formation or maintenance of land for racing, cricket, football, croquet, tennis, bowling, quoits, or other sports, or in erection or repairs of stands or pavilions for the purpose of witnessing sports, must not be included in any claim upon the vote.
7. The foregoing shall not apply to parks and gardens within the limits of the city of Melbourne, except the Royal Park, or to the Edinburgh Garden, Fitzroy, or the Botanical Garden, Geelong.

GRANT TO AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES, 1888-89.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations in connection with the above-named Grant, viz.:

AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

Regulations for the distribution of the sum of Twenty thousand pounds (£20,000) granted by Parliament to Agricultural Societies, 1888-89.

1. Each society shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st February 1889, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.
2. On receipt of the above-mentioned statement so verified, the Minister of Agriculture may cause to be paid to the treasurer of each society a sum equal to two-thirds of the amount shown to have been awarded and paid away in prizes not exceeding £25 each (except for the exhibits mentioned in the statement above referred to, and such other exhibits the Minister may consider unsuitable), on condition that this sum do not exceed

the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations; and if it do exceed the same, that it be in that case reduced to a sum equal to the amount so raised.

3. Of the whole grant (£20,000), a sum not exceeding Nineteen thousand five hundred pounds shall be so divided; and if the sums claimable be in excess of this amount they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. A sum not to exceed Five hundred pounds shall be paid to the St. Arnaud Agricultural Society towards the expenses of its Spring show, held on the 26th and 27th September 1888, under the patronage of the Department of Agriculture.

5. No society located within twenty miles of any other society shall be entitled to participate in the vote unless the sum awarded and paid away in prizes by such society, as hereinbefore specified, amounts in the total to One hundred pounds at least.

Instructions.

1. The blank spaces in the declaration, form E, for the sums awarded and paid in prizes and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations, between the 1st January 1888 and the 31st December 1888, must be filled up in words as well as in figures, and the declaration must be made before a justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.

2. The account, when received, must be signed by the treasurer and be countersigned by the president, or the vice-president, or by two members of the committee of management. It should then be returned to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne.

3. Challenge cups must not be included in the return of prize moneys paid, unless such cups have been finally awarded.

NOTE.—The forms B, C, and D are forwarded herewith by way of guidance, but can be made use of at the option of the society. If, however, extra forms be required, the same must be furnished by the applicant, and be of uniform size and pattern.

YATCHAW IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—ELECTION OF COMMISSIONERS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eighth day of January 1889.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor,

WHEREAS by section 63 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, No. 898, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations relating to any irrigation and water supply trust appointed and created under the said Act, for the purposes, among others, following:—

- (a) For determining the period for which the commissioners of any trust shall hold office, the time and manner of election, and the order of their retirement from office;
- (b) For determining the manner in which elections of any such commissioners shall be held, and the manner of voting thereat;
- (c) For determining the manner in which any vacancies in the office of any such commissioners shall be filled up; and
- (d) For determining questions as to the due election of any such commissioner.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain irrigation and water supply trust duly appointed and created under the said Act, and known as the Yatchaw Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, make the regulations following, viz:—

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In these regulations "the Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply; "the trust" or "the said trust" shall mean the Yatchaw Irrigation and Water Supply Trust; and "the district," "the said district," or "the irrigation district" shall mean the lands, as defined by the Order in Council appointing and creating the said trust, wherein the trust shall have authority.

2. *Period for which commissioners shall hold office.*—Subject to the provisions in reference to the first election of commissioners hereinafter contained, for securing the annual retirement of two commissioners, the period during which the commissioners of the said trust shall hold office shall be three years.

3. *Annual retirement of commissioners.*—Two commissioners shall retire annually, but the retiring commissioners shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be eligible for re-election.

4. *Term of office of persons elected commissioners at first election.*—At the first election of commissioners of the persons elected commissioners shall hold office as such commissioners for the term of three years, two others of such persons shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining two persons elected as such commissioners shall hold office for the term of one year; and the particular term for which each such person so elected a commissioner shall hold office shall be determined in manner following (that is to say):—

(a) *How term of office is ascertained when no poll taken.*—If the first election is made without a poll, as in the case in these regulations provided, then the particular term for which each candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office shall, immediately upon such election, be publicly determined by lot by the returning officer, in such a manner as to him may seem fit, and the returning officer shall thereupon immediately, and publicly, announce the term for which each individual candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

(b) *How term of office ascertained when poll taken.*—If at the first election a poll shall be held as in these regulations provided, then of the six candidates elected as commissioners the two candidates who shall have received the highest number of votes shall hold office for the term of three years, and the two candidates who shall have received the next highest number of votes shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining two candidates who shall have been elected shall hold office for the term of one year; and if two or more than two candidates elected shall have obtained the same number of votes then the returning officer shall determine by lot (as hereinbefore provided in the case of the first election if decided without ballot) the term or terms three, two, or one year or years during which such candidates shall respectively hold office. But so that no candidate elected shall hold office for a shorter time than the term during which any other candidate who shall have obtained a less number of votes shall hold office. And the returning officer shall publicly declare the respective terms during which the several candidates shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

5. *Extraordinary vacancies, how filled, and term of office.*—Should any vacancy in the office of commissioner be occasioned by death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, an election shall forthwith be held to fill such vacancy, and the provisions contained in these regulations, as to the nomination of candidates, the manner in which elections shall be held, and the mode of voting thereat, shall apply to any election in respect of such vacancy, and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the commissioner whose seat shall have become vacant.

6. *Date of first election of commissioners.*—Date of ordinary annual election.—The first election of commissioners of the said trust shall be held on the 4th day of February 1889, and the ordinary annual election shall be held on the 4th day of February

In each succeeding year. Provided that whenever such date may fall upon a Sunday, or upon any day set apart as a public holiday, such election shall be held upon the day next following.

7. *Voters' lists to be prepared.*—For the purposes of the first election of commissioners of the said trust, a voters' list shall be prepared by the persons upon whose petition the said trust has been appointed and created, and the said voters' list shall be forwarded to the Minister.

8. *Form of voters' list.*—*First Schedule.*—Such voters' list shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain in regular numerical sequence, and alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address, so far as these may be known, of each person entitled to vote under the provisions of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, or under the provisions of any Act amending the said *Irrigation Act 1886*, and shall also specify the extent of, and indicate with reasonable certainty, the land of each such person, or the land in respect of which each such person shall be entitled to vote, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Act, each such person is entitled.

9. *Voting in respect of lands jointly owned or jointly leased.*—In the case of joint owners of land, or in the case of joint lessees of land, the name of any one of such owners or lessees (as the case may be) shall, subject to the provisions of the said Acts and of these regulations, be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list in like manner as if such land were owned or leased solely by such one owner or lessee, and the owner or lessee so placed upon the said list or lists shall alone be entitled to vote accordingly. Provided always that if such owners or lessees jointly, by notice in writing, desire that the number of votes to which, under the said provisions, any one of such owners or lessees is so entitled to give as aforesaid may be allotted between such owners or lessees in any manner they may jointly indicate, the alteration or alterations so desired to be made in the said list shall, if the same be consistent with the said provisions, be made when the list shall be revised as hereinafter provided, and such owners or lessees (as the case may be) shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

10. *Copy of voters' list to be available for inspection.*—*Second Schedule.*—*Objections to list to be in writing, and forwarded to Minister.*—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day time, in some convenient place within or near to the irrigation and water supply district of the trust for a period of seven clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Second Schedule hereto, setting forth the times and places at which such voters' list may be so inspected, shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said district, and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded in writing to the Minister within the time mentioned in the said notice.

11. *Grounds of objection to be stated.*—All objections to the said list shall be forwarded in writing to the Minister within nine days after the first day of the publication of such notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

12. *Minister to revise and certify list.*—The Minister shall revise the said list, and consider all objections thereto, and make such alterations and amendments therein as to him may seem just, and shall certify the list under his hand as correct; and no objections to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

13. *Minister may require evidence of qualification to vote.*—For the purpose of revising such list, and in order to clearly ascertain the voting powers and qualifications under the said Acts, of persons entitled or claiming to be entitled to have their names inserted in such list, the Minister, if he think fit, may require such persons to furnish him with such evidence of qualification (whether by the production of documents of title or otherwise) as he may deem necessary.

14. *Certified list to be voters' roll.*—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of the first election of commissioners of the trust, but shall also be available for any election in respect of any extraordinary vacancy occurring within twelve months next after the date of the said first election.

15. *Voters' list to be prepared yearly.*—Before the first day of December in each year the officers of the trust shall prepare a voters' list in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and such list shall contain, in regular numerical sequence, and in alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of each person entitled to vote under the provisions of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, or under the provisions of any Act amending the said *Irrigation Act 1886*, and shall also specify the extent of, and indicate with reasonable certainty, the land of each such person, or the land in respect of which each such person shall be entitled to vote, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Acts, each such person is entitled.

16. *Voting in respect of lands jointly owned or jointly leased.*—In the case of joint owners of land, or in the case of joint lessees, the name of any one of such owners or lessees (as the case may be) shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act and of these regulations, be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list in like manner as if such land were owned or leased solely by such one owner or lessee, and the owner or lessee so placed upon the said list shall alone be entitled to vote accordingly. Provided always that if such owners or lessees jointly, by notice in writing, desire that the number of votes to which, under the said provisions, any one of such owners or lessees (as the case may be) is so entitled to give as aforesaid may be allotted between such owners or lessees in any manner they may jointly indicate, the alteration or alterations so desired to be made in the said list shall, if the same be consistent with the said provisions, be made when the list or lists shall be revised

as hereinafter provided, and such owners or lessees (as the case may be) shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

17. *Copy of list to be available for inspection.*—*Third Schedule.*—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day time, at some convenient place within or near to the irrigation and water supply district of the trust for a period of fourteen clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Third Schedule hereto shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said district; and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded in writing to the chairman of the trust within the time mentioned in the said notice.

18. *Grounds of objections to list to be forwarded in writing to the chairman of trust.*—All objections to the said list shall be forwarded in writing to the chairman of the trust within the time mentioned in the said notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

19. *Special meeting of trust to be held to revise list.*—*List to be certified.*—In the month of December in each year a special meeting of the trust shall be held for the purpose of revising the said list, and all objections which may have been forwarded to the chairman under the preceding clause shall be considered by the commissioners then present; and the chairman may make such alterations and amendments in the said list as the commissioners or a majority of the commissioners present may determine to be just and necessary, or such as by these regulations are required to be made; and the list, when so revised, altered, and amended, shall be certified as correct under the hand of the chairman, and no objection to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

20. *Evidence of voters' qualification to be furnished.*—For the purpose of revising such list, and in order to clearly ascertain the voting powers and qualifications, under the said Acts, of persons entitled, or claiming to be entitled, to have their names inserted in such list, the commissioners of the trust, or the majority of them, may require such persons to furnish them with such evidence of qualification (whether by the production of documents of title or otherwise) as the said commissioners, or a majority of them, may deem necessary.

21. *Revised and certified list to be voters' roll.*—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of any election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) of trust commissioners to be held within one year from the fourth day of February then next the said day inclusive.

22. *Minister may appoint returning officer for first election.*—*Chairman of trust to be returning officer at subsequent elections.*—For the purposes of the first such election, the Minister may appoint some fit and proper person, not being an owner of land within the district, to be returning officer; but for every subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) the chairman of the trust for the time being shall be the returning officer; but if at the time of any election the office of chairman of the trust should be vacant, the commissioners of the trust may, by resolution, appoint one of their number to be returning officer until the office of chairman shall again be filled; and the returning officer may appoint a deputy to assist him or to act in his room at any election, and such deputy may do all or any of the acts or things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

23. *Notice of election.*—*Nomination of candidates.*—*Fourth Schedule.*—Seven clear days before the election of commissioners under these regulations the returning officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the said district, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within or near to the said district (and named in such notice) in manner hereinafter mentioned, at a specified hour between ten o'clock in the forenoon and four o'clock in the afternoon; and any person desirous of nominating a candidate shall, at such hour and place, deliver or cause to be delivered to the returning officer a nomination paper in form of Fourth Schedule, or to the like effect, stating therein the christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required in and by the said Schedule; and such nomination-paper shall be signed by not less than four persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, and also signed by the person named therein as a candidate, in token of his assent to being so named, and such candidate or some person on his behalf shall, at the time when such nomination-paper is delivered to the returning officer, pay into the hands of such returning officer the sum of Ten pounds, to be dealt with as by law provided. And no person who shall not have been so nominated, and by whom or on whose behalf such payment shall not have been so made, shall within the subsequent provisions of these regulations be deemed to be a candidate at any election of commissioners.

24. *Where number of candidates does not exceed number of commissioners to be elected.*—If the number of nominations of candidates do not exceed the number of commissioners to be elected, the returning officer shall then declare the candidates nominated to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

25. *Where number of candidates exceeds number of commissioners to be elected.*—*Fifth Schedule.*—*Notice of poll.*—*Hours of polling.*—Should the number of candidates exceed the number of commissioners to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith publicly announce the names of the persons so nominated, and shall notify that a poll will be taken for the election of such commissioners at some specified hour later upon the day of nomination, at some specified place within or near to the said district; and such poll shall take place accordingly, and, for the purposes of such poll, the returning officer shall cause ballot-papers to be prepared, with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full, in the form of the Fifth Schedule hereto.

26. *Retirement of candidates before polling.*—If at any election after a poll shall have been appointed as aforesaid any candidate

for such election, and two of the persons having signed the paper nominating him as aforesaid are desirous that he should retire from such candidature, such candidate and the persons aforesaid may sign and deliver to the returning officer, a notice in the form of the Sixth Schedule hereto, stating that such candidate so retires; and the returning officer, if the number of candidates be by such retirement reduced to the number of persons to be elected at such election, shall at the time appointed for the election declare the remaining candidates duly elected, and, if the said number is not so reduced, shall omit the name of the person so retiring from the ballot-papers to be used at the said election, and if such papers are already prepared shall erase such name therefrom, and such person shall not be capable of being elected at such election.

27. *Polling-booth may be hired.*—At such election the returning officer shall provide a suitable place for taking a poll, and may, if necessary, cause to be hired and used as a polling-booth any room which he may deem to be suitable at the place appointed for taking the poll, and may divide such room into compartments, as to him may seem most convenient.

28. *Returning officer to preside at polling-booth.*—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall preside at the polling-booth for taking the poll.

29. *Scrutineers may be appointed.*—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present in the polling-booth, and the said returning officer, or his deputy, and the said scrutineers, and any voters, not exceeding four in number, actually engaged in voting, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling-booth.

30. *Pencils to be provided.*—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall provide pencils in the polling-booth for the use of the voters, and also a locked box, to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers; and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the scrutineers before the polling begins; and the box shall then be locked, and shall stand on a table opposite the returning officer, or deputy returning officer, who shall keep the key of such box.

31. *Mode of voting.—Where voter is illiterate.*—The returning officer shall deliver to every voter who requires the same a ballot-paper, or if such voter appears by the roll to be entitled to give more votes than one then so many ballot-papers as may be equal to the number of votes which such voter so appears to be entitled to give, such ballot-papers being in the form of Schedule Five hereto, and initialed by the returning officer; and every such voter shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from all or any of such papers the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote. And in case any voter is unable to read or write, the returning officer, or his deputy, if so required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as the voter may desire, strike out the name or names of such candidate or candidates as such voter may designate; and after such name or names has or have been so struck out the ballot-paper or ballot-papers (as the case may be) shall forthwith be deposited in the said box. Provided that all the ballot-papers to which any person may be entitled at the polling-booth shall be demanded and received by him at one and the same time; and no person, having once demanded and received any such ballot-paper or papers, and voted by the same, shall at the same election receive any further ballot-papers, or exercise any further right of voting.

32. *Ballot-papers to be numbered.*—Before delivering any ballot-paper to the voter, the returning officer or his deputy shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number set opposite to the voter's name in the roll; and shall thereupon, upon a copy of such roll, check off such voter's name as having voted, and mark against such name the number of ballot-papers delivered to such voter.

33. *Informal ballot-papers.*—If any voter suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of commissioners to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect.

34. *What questions may be asked.*—At any election of commissioners, the returning officer may if he see fit, or if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer, shall put to any person tendering his vote the question following:—

“Are you the person whose name appears as (A. B.) in the roll now in force for this trust, being enrolled therein in respect of land in the parish of _____, being (here specify land as described in the roll)?”

And no other question shall be put to any person tendering his vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer such question, or who shall not answer the same absolutely in the affirmative, shall receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.

35. *False answer, polling twice, and personation.*—Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer to the question aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once or offer to poll more than once at the same election, or who shall depart or attempt to depart from any polling-booth after having received a ballot-paper without having deposited the same in the ballot-box as hereinbefore provided, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as it appears by the roll he is entitled so to do.

36. *Result of polling, how ascertained.*—Returning officer to have casting vote.—Immediately upon the close of the poll, the returning officer shall, in the presence of and subject to the inspection of so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present, proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer shall abstain from inspecting the number written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the returning officer shall seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the booth; and as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll publicly declare the candi-

dates, not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up, who have received the greatest number of votes to have been duly elected commissioners of the trust; and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall in each case have the casting vote.

37. *Ballot-papers, how disposed of.*—The returning officer shall, in the case of the said first election of commissioners, forthwith after the declaration of the poll endorse with a description of the contents thereof and sign the sealed parcel of ballot-papers and forward the same to the Minister, who shall as soon as may be after the first meeting of trust commissioners shall have been held forward such sealed packet to the secretary of the trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three commissioners of the trust; but in all subsequent elections the parcel of ballot-papers so sealed, endorsed, and signed shall be delivered by the returning officer to the said secretary, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months after such delivery, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three of the commissioners of the trust.

38. *Minister to determine questions arising upon first election.*—If any question arise as to the due election of any commissioner at the first election, the returning officer shall, at the request of any voter or candidate, submit such question in writing to the Minister, who shall decide the same, and such decision shall be final and binding.

39. *Questions arising upon subsequent elections to be determined by trust.*—If any question arise as to the due election of any commissioner at any subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary), such question shall be determined by the commissioners of the trust at the first ordinary meeting held after the election; but no commissioner in respect of whose election such question shall have arisen shall act as a commissioner at such meeting, or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof, or in any manner or at any time to act as a commissioner until such question shall have been so determined; and the majority of the commissioners whose election is not in dispute shall form a quorum.

40. *Appeal to Minister from determination of trust.*—In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the commissioners shall have determined the question, and the Minister may make such inquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary, and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just, and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.

41. *Failure to elect deemed to create extraordinary vacancies.*—If at any election of commissioners no vacancies or a number of vacancies less than the whole number which should have been filled up at such election are filled up, then the vacancies which are not so filled shall severally be deemed extraordinary vacancies and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election. Provided always that the commissioners eventually elected to fill such vacancies shall go out of office as if elected at such election.

42. *Expenses of election to be paid by trust.*—The expenses incurred by the returning officer, or under his direction, in connexion with any election shall be defrayed by the trust.

43. *Punalty for breach of regulations.*—These regulations shall also be deemed to be regulations under section 250 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, and any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner before justices of the peace.

44. *Interpretation.*—In these regulations words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to or inconsistent with this interpretation.

SECTION VI.—COMMAND AND RANK.

REGULATIONS.**

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the undermentioned Commons in the Shire of Avoca.

Regulations for Management of the undermentioned Commons—
AVOCA UNITED FARMERS', GOLDFIELD, AND TOWN COMMON,
EYERSLEY AGRICULTURAL AREA FARMERS' COMMON,
MOONABEL MUNICIPAL COMMON,
MOONABEL GOLDFIELD COMMON,
NATTE YALLOCK AGRICULTURAL AREA FARMERS' COMMON,
BATHASCAR COMMON, and
UNITED TOWN AND GOLDFIELD COMMON OF REDBANK.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the first day of May 1888, the Council of the Shire of Avoca, as Managers of the above-named Commons, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of all or any of such Commons:—

REGULATIONS.

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, horses, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats; and the word "stock" shall mean and include "large cattle" and "small cattle."
2. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licensees, or carriers' licensees, and farmers may respectively depasture on the common within five (5) miles of their places aforesaid four (4)

head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such Common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the Commons shall be as follows, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of April and the first day of October in every year:—

For every horse	5s. 0d. per annum.
For every head of other large cattle	4s. 0d. "
" " small cattle	1s. 6d. "
Progeny, under six (6) months old, of stock legally depasturing on the Common	Free.

All stock registered during the currency of a half-year shall be charged the fees for the whole of such half-year.

4. No person shall depasture on any of the Commons stock of which he is not the *boni fide* owner.

5. Sheep shall be depastured on such portions only of the Commons as the managers may set apart for the purpose, and sheep found upon any other portion thereof shall be liable to be impounded. The expense and responsibility of herding sheep legally depasturing on the Commons shall be borne by the owners of such sheep.

6. No entire horse above the age of twelve (12) months shall be allowed to depasture on the Commons.

7. No bull above the age of six (6) months shall be allowed to depasture on the Commons without the permission, in writing, of the managers.

8. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on any of the Commons; and should any registered stock thereon become so diseased the owner shall remove the same therefrom within twenty-four hours after receiving notice, in writing, from the herdsman so to do.

9. The owners of large cattle (except horses) depasturing upon any of the Commons shall, if required by the herdsman, muster such large cattle in their own yards, or some other place, as often as may be found necessary to be branded with the Common brand in pitch or tar upon notice, in writing, being given to such owners by the herdsman; and all unbranded large cattle or unmarked small cattle shall be liable to be impounded forthwith. All registered large cattle (except horses) shall be branded by or under the supervision of the herdsman with the Common tar brand, and shall have in addition the owner's brand. All registered goats wear a triangular yoke around the neck, with the owner's name painted or carved thereon. All registered sheep shall be branded with the owner's fire brand, and the owners of registered sheep or goats shall, if required by the herdsman, yard them at any time for any necessary purpose.

10. All stock illegally depasturing on any of the Commons shall be liable to be impounded.

11. The managers shall not be responsible for the loss of, or injury to, any registered stock.

12. The herdsman shall keep an office in a convenient place, to be approved by the managers, and shall attend at such office between the hours of twelve o'clock noon and four o'clock in the afternoon on Tuesdays and Saturdays in every week to register stock entitled to depasture, and to receive the fees payable in respect thereof, and the managers shall give printed receipts for such fees in the prescribed form; and the herdsman shall see that all registered stock are branded with the Common brand, in pitch or such other distinguishing mark or brand as these regulations require, and shall without delay inform the owners of registered stock if any, to his knowledge, are missing from the Commons.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

No. 6.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Oakleigh, and numbered 6, made for the purpose of adopting and applying to the said Shire part of the provisions of subsection 7, part 10, sections 415, 416, 417, 418, of the "Local Government Act 1874," No. of Act 500.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers order as follows:—

Section 415.—If any private street or road, or if any part of such street, has not been drained, paved, flagged, macadamized, and otherwise made good to the satisfaction of the Council, they may, by notice in writing, require the owners of the buildings or lands abutting on such street or road, or such part thereof (as the case may be), to drain, pave, flag, macadamize, or otherwise make good to the satisfaction of the Council, so much of the same to the centre thereof as fronts such last-mentioned buildings and lands within a reasonable time to be fixed by the Council, and the said owners shall within such time as aforesaid, at their own costs, obey such requirement; and if such street, or such part thereof, as aforesaid be not so made good within the time fixed, the Council may cause so much as shall not be so made good to be made good, and the expenses which may be incurred by the Council shall be repaid to them by the owners, by whom such work ought to have been done respectively.

Section 416.—The Council of the municipality may cause the footway or pathway in front of any house or ground along any street or private street within the municipal district to be flagged, kerbed, and paved, or asphalted, in such manner as the Council think fit; and half the amount of the expense thereof shall be borne and paid by the owner of such house or land, and may be recovered from such owner or from the occupier of such house or land in a summary way before two justices; provided that no proceeding for the recovery of such amount shall be taken until at least one month after a requisition for payment of the amount hereinbefore mentioned, together with an account of the total expenditure, signed by the municipal clerk, has been sent or delivered to such owner or occupier. Provided also that if the occupier of such house or land shall be compelled to pay for such

flagging, kerbing, paving, or asphaltting, such occupier may either deduct the amount so paid from any rent then due or thereafter to become due to the owner, and the production of the receipt for the amount so paid by or recovered from such occupier shall be a good and sufficient discharge for the amount so paid or recovered on payment of rent to the owner; or such occupier may recover from the owner the amount so paid or recovered or any balance thereof, after deducting the rent, in a summary way before two justices.

Section 417.—The Council of the municipality may, by notice signed by the municipal clerk, and delivered to the owner or left at his last known place of abode, or at the residence of any agent or person receiving such owner's rents or transacting other business within the municipal district for such owner, of any ground lying alongside of any street, private street, road, or pathway, and being of a lower level than such street or private street, road or pathway, forthwith to have such low ground filled up to such level; and in case such owner shall refuse or neglect to fill up such ground for the space of one month after the delivery of such notice, the Council may proceed to fill up such ground at the expense of such owner, and the amount of such expense, not exceeding one-fourth of the then value of such ground, may be recovered from the owner in a summary way before two justices.

Section 418.—If any hole or place near any road or street, whether public or private, be, for want of sufficient protection or enclosure, dangerous to the passengers along such street or road, the Council shall, after due notice shall have been given, cause the same to be protected or enclosed, so as to prevent danger therefrom, and the expenses of such protection or enclosure shall be repaid to the Council by the owner of the premises so protected or enclosed.

BOROUGH OF INGLEWOOD.

BYE-LAW NUMBER 30.

A Bye-law of the Borough of Inglewood, made under section 213 of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 29, for amending Bye-law Number 23, so as to prevent any nightsoil being removed from closets except by the authorized nightman, or being deposited anywhere except at the manure depot.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Inglewood order as follows:—

That clauses 11 and 19 of Bye-law No. 28 be repealed, and the following clauses substituted in lieu thereof:—

11. Emptying Receptacles for Nightsoil.—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises, shall once at least in every week cause to be emptied or cleaned by the licensed nightman only, every earth closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of nightsoil on or belonging to such premises.

19. All nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed by the licensed nightman from any earth closet, privy, cesspool, or other place of deposit, shall immediately be taken to the manure depot, and there trenched in to a depth of 18 inches, and the licensed nightman shall cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

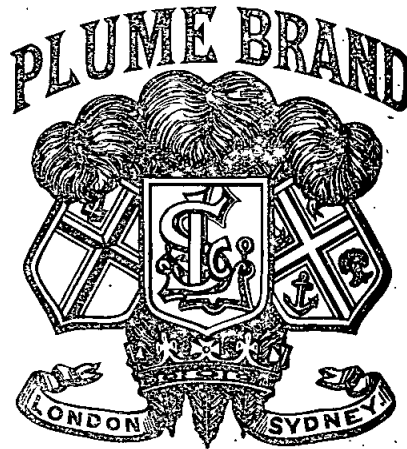

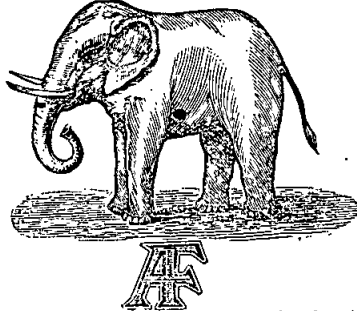
