#### REGULATIONS UNDER "THE EDUCATION ACT 1872" AMENDED.

THEREAS by the 18th section of The Education Act 1872 it was enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that Regulation III. of the Regulations under The Education Act 1872 be cancelled, and that in lieu thereof the following Regulations be substituted, that is to say:—

## III.-PAYMENTS BY WAY OF RESULTS.

- 1. Payments by way of results will be made to head teachers and assistant teachers, upon examination of their schools by an inspector in the subjects specified in the course of free instruction.
- 2. The maximum payment which any teacher can obtain by way of results will be an amount equal to one-half of his fixed
- 3. In order to entitle the teachers of any school to this maximum.
  - 1. Every scholar who has attended such school during any part of the two weeks preceding the inspector's visit must be presented for examination, unless prevented from attending by any unavoidable cause, such as—
    - (a.) Removal from the district;
    - (b.) Suffering from severe bodily accident or sickness, or being excluded on account of infectious disease in the home;
    - (c.) Flooded state of the roads;
    - (d.) Death of a near relative.
  - 2. The inspector must be satisfied—

    - (a.) That every scholar has a satisfactory knowledge of the work of the class in which he is enrolled, and has made adequate progress.

      N.B.—Scholars over seven years of age in Class I. who have been not less than twelve months on the roll must be presented for individual examination. Other scholars in that class may be so presented if their attainments be satisfactory.
    - (b.) That the names and ages of the scholars are stated correctly in the rolls;
    - (c.) That the scholars are properly classified;
- (c.) That the scholars are properly classified;
  (d.) That the discipline and tone of the school are good. In determining this, regard will be paid to the behaviour, neatness, and cleanliness of the children, the neatness of their work, and the tidiness of the school premises and appliances.
  3. The average age of the scholars examined individually in Class I must not exceed seven years and nine months; the average age of the scholars in Class II. must not exceed nine years; of those in Class IV. twelve years and six months; of those in Class IV. twelve years; and of those in Class IV. thirteen years and six months.
  Marka will be withdrawn for individual scholars and for
- those in Class V. thirteen years and six months.

  4. Marks will be withdrawn for individual scholars and for classes failing to comply with any of the above conditions, and the result payment made to the teachers will be in the same ratio to the maximum as the number of marks actually awarded is to that which might have been obtained, provided that during the year 1889 the percentage of marks awarded upon examination if not greater than 90 shall be increased by 10, and if greater than 90, by such number as will make the total percentage 100.
- 5. Any change in the amount payable for results, consequent upon an examination of the school, will take effect from the first day of the month succeeding that in which the examination is held.
- 6. In new schools result payments will be based upon an inspector's percentage of 75 until the school shall have been examined for results; but the payments upon that percentage will cease from the last day of the month in which the examination takes place.

# "THE MARINE STORES AND OLD METALS ACT 1888."—REGULATIONS:

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-sixth day of March 1889.

8. 9. Every truck, hand-cart, cart, barrow, or vehicle used by a collector whilst carrying on his business trucks, &c., to be shall have painted upon it, in a legible manner, a number and the name and address of the owner of such painted, ss. 22 and 45. truck, hand-cart, cart, barrow, or vehicle, whether such owner be the collector using the same or a dealer. When such truck, hand-cart, eart, barrow, or vehicle shall have been hired or borrowed from a dealer, it shall, in addition to the name and address of the owner, have upon it, painted in a legible manner, the number entered in the book kept by the dealer from whom such truck, hand-cart, cart, barrow, or vehicle number entered in the book kept by the dealer from whom such truck, hand-cart, cart, barrow, or vehicle was hired or borrowed; and when such collector is the owner of such truck, hand-cart, cart, barrow, or vehicle, in addition to his name and address, the number of his collector's licence and badge. ## PUBLIC HEALTH.-SHIRE OF ARAPILES.

#### Bre-law No. 1.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Arapiles, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in the Public Health Acts 1865-1888, and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

- This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.
- 2. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said Shire of Arapiles, excepting Part II., which is to apply to and have operation in the townships of Natimuk and Nossible only. Norajuha only.

- 3. In the construction and for the purposes of this bye-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—
  - "House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings
  - "Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter, below or above the ground; and "earth-closet" shall include a pan-closet of any de-scription.
  - "Street" shall mean and include any highway and any pub-lic bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.
  - "Slaughter-yard" or "Slaughter-house" shall include an abattoir or any place whatever where slaughtering takes

Words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

#### Part I.—General Cleanliness.

- 4. The occupier of every house and premises shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connexion therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all dust, filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be, once at least in every week, removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of save premises used for the purpose of any premises used for the purpose of any
- removed at the expense of such occupier.

  5. The occupier of any premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, occupation, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon, to be effectually deodorized and to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.
- 6. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter, in any street, road, lane, right-of-way or place so as to be a misance to any person, or injurious to health, or in any way contrary to the directions of the local board or officer of health.
- 7. No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

# Part II.—Disposal of House Refuse and Cleanliness in Townships.

- 8. Every occupier of a house or premises shall provide and keep thereon a box or some other covered receptacle for the temporary deposit of house refuse, which box or receptacle shall be of such dimensions as that the same may, with the contents thereof, when full, be readily and conveniently movable by one man, or so many such boxes or receptacles as may be necessary to contain all the house refuse produced or accumulated on such premises during one week, and shall cause all house refuse to box or receptacle,
- 9. The occupier of any premises fronting, adjoining, or abutting on any street shall, once at least in every day before nine o'clock a.m., sweep and cleanse, or cause to be swept and cleansed, the footways and pavements adjoining such premises.
- 10. In order that the contents of every box or receptacle in or about any house or premises containing house refuse may be conveniently discharged and removed by the public scavengers or other person or persons authorized or appointed to remove the same by the municipality or the Local Board of Health, every occupier of such house or premises shall cause every such box or receptacle containing house refuse to be placed in the yard of such house or premises, and close to the entrance thereof, or in

the street, lane, or right-of-way contiguous to such house or premises, between such hours as may be directed by the local board or inspector of nuisances.

The occupier of any land on which is eracted any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pig-sty, or on which land is any building wherein any horse or other beast of draught or burden or any cattle or swine are kept, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to, one cubic yard, or once at least in every week should the quantity not amount, in that time, to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said Local Board at the expense of such occupier.

  12. Every occupier of a building or premises wherein or whereon

Every occupier of a building or premises wherein or whereon any horse or other beast of draught or burden or any cattle or swine may be kept shall provide, in connexion with such building or premises, whenever required by the local board or officer of health, a suitable receptacle for dung, manure, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter which may from time to time be produced in the keeping of any such animal in such building or upon such premises, and cause such receptacle to be constructed so that the bottom or floor thereof shall not in any case be lower than the surface of the ground adjoining such receptacle, and in such a manner and of such materials, and to be maintained at all times in such a condition, as to prevent any effluvia therefrom or any escape of the contents thereof, or any soakage therefrom, into the ground or into the wall of any building, and to be furnished with a suitable cover, and, when not required to be open, to be kept properly covered.

He shall likewise provide in connexion with such building or premises, if required by the local board or officer of health, a sufficient drain constructed in such a manner and of such materials, and maintained at all times in such a condition, as effectually to convey all urine or liquid filth or refuse therefrom into a proper receptacle.

#### Part III. - As to Manure.

  14. Nothing herein contained shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil (not being nightsoil), or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any byelaw of the Local Board of Health, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or contrary to any directions of the local board or officer of health.

  15. Every person placing, depositing, or spreading, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any liquid manure of which night-soil, urine, or any similar offensive matters form a part, night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cosspool, or other place, shall, immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof, cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep and use the same in such a way only as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health. And before doing so such person shall obtain the written permission of the local board, and do the same to the satisfaction of the officer of health, subject, however, to any regulations which the Central Roard, by publication in the Government Guzette, may make. But such permission shall be no defence in any complaint or prosecution for having kept or used such liquid manure, night-soil, offal, blood, or other matter in such a way as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

- Part IV.—As to Earth-closets, &c.

  16. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground; and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof does not exceed three cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public house, factory, workroom, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

  17. Every occupier and every person having the management
- or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

  17. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for dec-dorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.
- 18. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet, and provided with a closely-fitted cover of pattern to be approved by the inspector of nuisances.

- 19. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right of way exceeding 10 feet in width.
- 20. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as spon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have go accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cosspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of 11 p.m. and p a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have ind mixed therewish carbolic agid, sulphate of iron, chloride of lime, or spine other efficient decorrer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually decodorize and disinfect the same.
- 21. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall once at least in overy week emitty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closets, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.
- 22. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to provent the escape of the contents, or any portion thereof, or of effluying therefrom.
- 23. Where any nightman is licensed by the Local Board of Health, such nightman shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for the removal of night-soil therefrom, and no other person shall remove the same.
- 24. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and finally placed in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.
- 25. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of 11 p.m. and 5 a.m., unless otherwise permitted by the local board (of which the proof shall lie on such person), or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed so soon as the same is emptied.
- 26. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, 20. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be empired, or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any drain or sewer.

## Part V .- Prevention of Pollution of Water.

- 27. No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed in, or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into, any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.
- 28. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool of place for the deposit of offal, libod, or other retuse matter, into any water supplied, used, or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents of any portion of the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any such water.
- 29. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way or be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be depodrized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within twenty-four hours of notice given by the local board or by one of its officers.

#### Part VI.—Drainage of Buildings.

- 30. Every person erecting or causing to be erected any new building shall cause the foundations thereof, and the ground eyer which such building is to be placed, to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water scakage or damp shall lodge there.
- 31. Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the immates of such building; and every tenant of a building under a lease, of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired, shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

# Part VII.—Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.

32. Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of April in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of 'Two shillings and sixpence.

Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary of the Local Board of Health shall inderse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed. indexed.

All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board, or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or secretary of the said local board; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be projudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling hapse of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person servicil personally or left at his dwelling; hape, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any caws found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon made.

  35. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a missance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any remises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.
- 36. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept parfectly, clean, and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order we directed.
- 37. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.
- 38. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health; and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purvoyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of auch trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

- 39. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or priveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.
- 40. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or chaltered.

#### Part VIII .- Steam Whistles.

41. No person shall use, cause to be used, or assist in using, any steam whistle at any factory or other establishment so as to be a nuisance to any person; and no person who occupies or has the management or control of any factory or other establishment shall suffer or permit any steam whistle to be used thereat so as to be a nuisance to any person.

# Pari IX.-Penaltics.

42. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued; unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Eltham, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in the Public Health Acts 1865-1888, and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said local board in the virtue of the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

- 1. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.
- 2. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire.

### Definitions.

3. In the construction and for the purposes of this bye-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the text or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses; or other buildings or premises.

"Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground; and "earth-closet" shall include a pan closet of any dearth-closet.

alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

#### Part I .- General Cleanliness.

The occupier of every house and premises shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all dust, fifth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be, once at least in every week, temoved from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such fifth, rubbish, or refuse mixter so termoved as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business; occupation, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish,

blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon, to be effectually deodorized and to be removed therefrom once in overy twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter in any street, road; lane, right-of-way, or place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injuirious to health or in any way contrary to the directions of the local board or officer of health.

No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle, shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board, or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or secretary of the said local board; and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudical to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order in writing, signed by the secretary and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling-place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person; and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said local board may reveke, but upon fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

29. All houses, dairies, cowsheds. milk stores. milk shops.

29. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to he a missance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

30. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

31. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly sealded and secured daily.

32. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business; nor, if the person negistered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its containination has ceased.

33. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or anong the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered or health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way

- Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.
- 3. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whother in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheads, butter firkins, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for.
