PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

Note.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land,

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with either of the above conditions will be eligible for examination.

### CERTIFICATES WITHOUT EXAMINATION.

Certificates will be granted by the Board without examination to gentlemen who shall produce evidence satisfactory to the examiners that they have complied with the following conditions, and shall have paid the prescribed fee. But such certificates shall state on the face of them that they have been granted without examination:—

I. Having passed some examination (equivalent in the opinion of the Board to that prescribed in Victoria) in Great Britain, the United States of America, India, or some British colony, and producing evidence of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian

II. Or producing evidence satisfactory to the Board of the possession of sufficient professional qualifications and experience, and of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

Examinations shall be held from time to time, as the interests of the Public Service may require; and notice thereof shall be published in the Government Gazette of the intention to hold an examination at least one month before the date fixed upon.

No. 505) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any numicipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the Government Gacette, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the ratepayers whose names are on the numicipal roll of the Shire of Boroondara has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition was duly published in the Government Gazette of the eighth day of February 1889, and no

counter petition has been received: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth hereby subdivide the Shire of Boroondara into three separate ridings, the names and boundaries of which shall be as follow, that is to say:—

### NORTH RIDING.

Commencing at a point on the western boundary of the shire at the intersection of the Burke road with Canterbury road; thence east along the last-named road to the eastern boundary of the shire; thence following the shire boundary north, westerly, and south to the point of commencement.

CENTRE RIDING.

Commencing at a point on the western boundary of the shire at the intersection of the Burke road with Camberwell road; thence south-easterly along the last-named road to Norwood road; thence east along that road to Back Creek; thence north-easterly by that creek to the Boundary road (being the eastern boundary of the shire); thence north by that road to Canterbury road; thence west by that road to Burke road (being the western boundary of the shire); and thence south by that road to the point of commencement.

#### SOUTH RIDING.

WHEREAS by section 63 of The Irrigation Act 1886, No. 288, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations relating to any Irrigation and Water Supply Trust appointed and created under the said Act for the purposes, among others, following:—

- (a) For determining the period for which the commissioners of any trust shall hold office, the time and manner of election, and the order of their retirement from office.
- (b) For determining the manner in which elections of any such commissioners shall be held, and the manner of voting thereat.
- (c) For determining the manner in which any vacancies in the office of any such commissioners shall be filled up; and
- (d) For determining questions as to the due election of any such commissioner.

Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain Irrigation and Water Supply Trust duly appointed and created under the said Act, and known as the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, make the regulations following. viz.:—

- 1. Interpretation of terms.—In these regulations, "the Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply; "the trust" or "the said trust" shall mean the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust; and "the district," "the said district," or "the irrigation district" shall mean the lands as defined by the Order in Council appointing and creating the said trust wherein the trust shall have authority.

  2. Period for which commissioners shall hold office.—Subject to the provisions in reference to the first election of commissioners hereinafter contained, for securing the annual retirement of two commissioners, the period during which the commissioners of the and trust shall hold office shall be three years.
- 3. Annual retirement of commissioners.—Two commissioners shall retire annually, but the retiring commissioners shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be eligible for re-election.
- 4. Term of office of persons elected commissioners at first election.

  —At the first election of commissioners two of the persons elected commissioners shall hold office as such commissioners for the term of three years, two others of such persons shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining two persons elected as such commissioners shall hold office for the term of one year, and the particular term for which each such person so, elected a commissioner shall hold office shall be determined in manner following (that is to say):

    If the first election is made without a poll, as in the case in these regulations provided, then the particular term for which each candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office shall immediately upon such election be publicly determined by lot by the returning officer in such manner as thin may seem fit, and the returning officer shall thereupon immediately and publicly announce the term for which each individual candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.
  - omice as so determined, and shart report the same to the first election a poll shall be held as in these regulations provided, then of the six candidates elected as commissioners the two candidates who shall have received the highest number of votes shall hold office as commissioners for the term of three years, and the two candidates who shall have received the next highest number of votes shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining two candidates who shall have been elected shall hold office for the term of one year; and if two or more than two candidates elected shall have obtained the same number of votes, then the returning officer shall determine by lot (as hereinbefore provided in the case of the first election if decided without ballot) the term of three, two, or one year or years during which such candidates shall respectively hold office. But so that no candidate elected shall hold office for a shorter time than the term during which any other candidate who shall have obtained a less number of votes shall hold office. Provided always that if such owners or lessees jointly, by notice in writing, desire that the number of votes to which, under the said provisions, any one of such owners or lessees is so entitled to give as aforesaid may be allotted between such owners or alterations so desired to be made in the said list of lists and the said list of the same be consistent with the said provisions, be made when the list shall be revised as hereinafter provided, and such owners or lessees lable be entitled to vote accordingly.

Bullot papers to be numbered.—Before delivering any ballotpaper to the voter, the returning officer, or his deputy, shall write upon the back of each such hallot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number set opposite to the voter's name in the roll, and shall thereupon, upon a copy of such roll, check off such voter's name as having voted, and mark against such name the number of ballot-papers delivered to such voter.
- 31. Informal ballot-papers.—If any voter suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of commissioners to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect.
- 32. What question may be asked.—At any election of commissioners, the returning officer may, if he see fit, or if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer, put to any person tendering his vote the question following:—
  - "Are you the person whose name appears as (A.B.) in the roll now in force for this trust, being enrolled therein in respect of land in the parish of being (here specify land as described in the roll)?"

And no other question shall be put to any person tendering his vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer such question, or who shall not answer the same absolutely in the affirmative, shall receive a ballot-paper on be permitted to vote.

False answer, polling twice, and personation.—Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer to the question aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once, or offer to poll more than once at the same election, or who shall depart or attempt to depart from any polling-booth after having received a ballot-paper without having deposited the same in the ballot-box as hereinbefore provided, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of those regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as it appears by the roll he is entitled so to do.

Appeal to Minister from determination of trust.—In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the commissioners shall have determined the question, and the Minister may make such inquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary, and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just, and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.

  39. Failure to elect deemed to create extraordinary vacancies.—
  If at any election of commissioners no vacancies or a number of vacancies less than the whole number which should have been filled up at such election are filled up, then the vacancies which are not so filled shall severally be deemed extraordinary vacancies and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election. Provided always that the commissioners eventually elected to fill such vacancies shall go out of office as if elected at such election.
- 40. Expenses of election to be paid by trust.—The expenses incurred by the returning officer, or under his direction, in connection with any election, shall be defrayed by the trust.
- 41. Penalty for breach of regulations.—These regulations shall also be deemed to be regulations under section 250 of The Irrigation Act 1886, and any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner before justices of the peace.
- 42. Interpretation. In these regulations words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to or inconsistent with this interpretation.

WHEREAS by section 63 of The Irrigation Act 1886, No. 898, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations relating to any Irrigation and Water Supply Trust appointed and created under the said Act, for the purposes, among others, following:—

(a) For determining the period for which the commissioners of any trust shall hold office, the time and manner of election, and the order of their retirement from office.

(b) For determining the manner in which elections of any uch commissioners shall be held, and the manner of voting

(c) For determining the manner in which any vacancies in the office of any such commissioners shall be filled up; and (d) For determining questions as to the due election of any such commissioner.

Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain Irrigation and Water Supply Trust duly appointed and created under the said 'Act, and known as the Emu Valley Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, make the regulations following, viz. :—

  1. Interpretation of terms.—In these regulations "the Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply; "the trust" or "the said trust" shall mean the Emu Valley Irrigation and Water Supply Trust; and "the district," "the said district," or "the irrigation district" shall mean the lands, as defined by the Order in Council appointing and creating the said trust, wherein the trust shall have authority.

And no person who shall not have been so mande, shall within the subsequent provisions of these regulations be deemed to be a candidate at any election of commissioners.

Where number of candidates does not exceed number of commissioners to be elected.—If at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nominations of candidates the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of commissioners to be elected, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

Where number of candidates exceeds number of commissioners to be elected.—Fifth Schedule.—Notice of poll.—Hours of polliny.—If at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates the number of candidates exceeds the number of commissioners to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed, with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full, in the form of the Fifth Schedule hereto, and shall also forthwith give public notice by advertisement in some newspaper generally circulating in the district stating the names of the persons so nominated, and that a poll will be taken for the election of such commissioners upon the day named in such notice, at such place within or near to the said area as the returning officer shall in and by such notice appoint; and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at Eleven o'clock in the forenoon and close at Three o'clock in the afternoon.
- 24. Retirement of candidates before polling-day.—If at any election after a poll shall have been appointed as aforesaid any candidate for such election and two of the persons having signed the paper from such candidature, such candidate and the persons aforesaid may sign and deliver to the returning officer, not later than four clear days before the day of polling, a notice, in the form of the Sixth Schedule hereto, stating that such candidate so reires; and the said candidate or his agent shall thereupon publish in some newspaper generally circulating in the district a copy of such notice, and the returning officer, on sufficient proof of such notice, and the returning officer, on sufficient proof of such publication aforesaid, if the number of candidates is by such retirement reduced to the number of persons to be elected at such election, shall on the day appointed for the election declare the remaining candidates duly elected, and, if the said number is not so reduced, shall omit the name of the person so retiring from the ballot-papers to be used at the said election, and if such papers are already printed shall erase such name therefrom; and such person shall not be capable of being elected at such election.

Polling-booth may be hired.—At such election the returning officer shall provide a suitable place for taking a poll, and may, if necessary, cause to be hired and used as a polling-booth any room which he may deem to be suitable at the place appointed for taking the poll, and may divide such room into compartments as to him may seem most convenient.
- 26. Returning officer to preside at polling-booth.—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall preside at the polling-booth for taking the poll.

WOODEND WATERWORKS TRUST .- REGULATION No. 1.

The Commissioners of the Woodend Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conforred by The Water Conservation Act 1887, make the Regulation following:—

- 1. The following rates and charges are those respectively which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust District, that is to say:—
  - 1. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a rate of One shilling in the £ on the shire assessment. Minimum, as fixed by the Governor in Council, Twenty shillings.

  - 2. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Twenty shillings per boiler per annum.

    3. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling and sixpence for every one thousand gallons.
  - . 4. Any person who may or shall obtain water, or who may be supplied with water from the public stand-pipes, or any, or either of them in the said district, shall pay the sum of Ten shillings per annum.
- Ten shillings per annum.

  2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when water is supplied by measure shall be:

  1. If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
  - 2. If for other than domestic purposes, thirty thousand gallons per half-year.
  - 3. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1889, commencing from the lat of January, as also the charges for every steam boiler, and for water supplied from public stand-pipes, and shall be payable in one payment on the lat day of July 1889.
  - 4. All other charges by measurement shall be paid half-yearly on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July.

#### REGULATION No. 2.

THE Commissioners of the Woodend Waterworks Trust do here-by, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by The Water Conservation Act 1887, make the regulations following:—

- 1. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps within the Trust District for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing house, walls, or carriages, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter.
- 2. Any person receiving water is charged for by meter.

  2. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 3. Any person, not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- A. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust; nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the direction of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

- hable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds for every such breach.

  5: The service pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed half-an-inch in diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes and for all supplies by meter such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

  6. The Trust may contract with any owners or occupiers of any lands or tenements, who is entitled to be sinpplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied for the provision and laying of a service pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

  7. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the water from such service pipe or othorwise as to the Trust may seem fit until the necessary repairs have been effected.

  8. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or
- 8. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste; any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.
- 9. No person shall connect any service pipe or branch service pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.
- 10. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.
- 11. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.
- can escape at each flush.

  12. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering One million (1,000,000) gallons.

  13. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes, or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under these regulations ought to be done, or willfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied, or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.
- 14. The water supplied in the Waterworks District of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the said regulations, and not otherwise.
- 15. In the construction of these regulations, the word 'person' shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Woodend Waterworks Trust.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act Amendment Act 1883," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Eltham, order as follows:—
Part 1, Police Offences Statute 1865, Sections 5 to 10 inclusive, is hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Eltham.

- 5. Penalty on offences relating to the good order of towns, &c.—
  Any person guilty of any of the following offences omissions or
  neglects shall on conviction pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty

    (I.) Throwing any glass filth dirt rubbish or other matter of a similar nature upon any road footway or public place:

    (II.) Riding driving or wheeling any barrow or carriage upon or along any footpath:

(III.) Placing any timber bricks or other building material upon any footway channel surface drain or carriage road without the permission of the local authority having been first obtained:

(IV.) Burning any shavings or other materials upon any footway carriage road or open or public place:

(V.) Leaving any inflammable materials or natter in any public shed or place or on any open space near any building without having first obtained the permission of the local authority:

(VI.) Drawing or trailing any sledge timber or other heavy material upon any footway or carriage road to the injury of such footway or carriage road:

(VII.) Emptying any privy or cosspool or carting away any night soil or other offensive matter without a license from and without having given such security as is required by the local authority:

(VII.) Allowing any night soil or other offensive matter t to be spilt or otherwise cast into or upon any road street footway or public place:

(IX.) Allowing the drippings of the eaves of any house to fall upon any public footway:

(X.) Placing any placard or other document writing painting on or otherwise defacing any house or building or any wall fence lamp post or gate without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof:

(XI.) Opening any drain or sewer or removing the surface of any footway or carriage road without the authority of

wall fence lamp post or gate without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof:

(XI.) Opening any drain or sewer or removing the surface of any footway or carriage road without the permission of the local authority having been first obtained:

(XII.) Neglecting to clean all private yards ways passages or avenues, by which neglect a nuisance by offensive smell or otherwise is caused:

(XIII.) Rolling any cask beating any carpet breaking in any horse flying any kite using any bows and arrows or playing at any game to the annoyance of any person in any public place; or obstructing any footpath or carriage road whether by allowing any cart or animal to remain across such footpath or carriage road or by placing goods thereon or otherwise:

(XIV.) Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile to the damage or danger of any person:

(XV.) Having any awning on any footway in any public street or thoroughfare not being seven feet clear above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway:

(XVI.) Blasting any rock stone or timber in or near any public place without permission of the local authority and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such local authority:

(XVI.) Furiously or negligently riding or driving through any public place:

(XVII.) Exposing in any public street or thoroughfare (except in any fair or market lawfully appointed for that purpose) any horse or other animal for show hire or sale:

(XII.) Making cellar door or other opening from the footway.

that purpose) any horse or other animal for show hire or sale:

(XIX.) Making cellar door or other opening from the footway of any street or public thoroughfare without the consent of the local authority:

(XX.) Any carter plying for hire without a license.

(XXI.) Any carter waiting for hire allowing his cart or dray to stand in any other place than those appointed by the local authority or demanding higher rates than authorised by such local authority in river without a license from the local authority or demanding higher rates than authorised by such local authority.

(XXII.) Plying for hire with any boat not being a steamboat at any ferry or on any river without a license from the local authority or demanding higher rates than sanctioned by such local authority:

6. Local authority to make rules for boatmen and carters.—Any local authority may make such rules and regulations with reference to the licensing of carters and boatmen, the places where they shall stand, the rates they shall receive, the distance they shall be compellable to go, and such other matters as may tend to the public convenience in regard to them as such local authority may see fit.

7. Builders not to erect scaffolding or enclosures for building

compellable to go, and such other matters as may tend to the public convenience in regard to them as such local authority may see fit.

7. Builders not to erect scaffolding or enclosures for building materials in the streets without permission of local authority.—No person without a license first had and obtained from the local authority shall erect place or set up or build in any public place any hoarding or scaffolding or place or erect any posts bars rails boards or other thing by way of enclosure for the purpose of making mortar or of depositing sifting screening or slaking any brick stone lime sand or any other materials for building or repairing any house or other tenement or crection or for any other purpose; and such license as aforesaid shall specify therein the length of time for which any such hoarding scaffolding posts bars rails boards or other thing when so erected or set up may be continued, and shall contain such other directions respecting the same as are necessary. And if any person place set up erect or build or cause or permit to be erected placed set up or built any such hoarding or scaffolding or any enclosed posts bars or rails or any other matter or thing for the purposes aforesaid or for any other purpose without such license or contrary to the provisions and conditions of such license or to be continued for any longer time than is allowed or expressed in such license, then and in any of the said cases such person shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and also the sum of One pound for every day that the same has been and is set up and continued contrary to the provisions hereof, and the said local authority may four days after notice cause the same to be pulled down and

removed and the same and all the materials thereof to be kept

removed and the same and all the materials thereof to be kept and detained until such person pays to such local authority all the penalties incurred by such persons together with the charges of pulling down removing and keeping the same; and if the same be not claimed and the said penalties and charges as aforesaid paid within the space of five days next after the pulling down and removing thereof, such local authority may order or cause the same to be sold by public auction and the proceeds thereof applied according to the provisions hereinafter mentioned respecting the appropriation of moneys arising from forfeitures.


