PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

 Should any vacancy in the office of commissioner be occasioned by death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, an election shall forthwith be held to fill such vacancy, and the provisions contained in these regulations as to the nomination of candidates, the manner in which elections shall be held, and the mode of voting thereat, shall apply to any election in respect of such vacancy, and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the commissioner whose seat shall have become vacant.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground is broken or a vault re-opened.

2. On application for permission to make a vault or erect a a monument in the cemetery being made to the Trustees, a certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the fees set forth in the schedule.

3. Charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in this cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the Trustees that the relatives of the deceased were unable to pay the usual fees.

4. The sexten shall dig all ordinary graves, unless specially ordered, on payment of the fees mentioned in Schedule A.
5. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owner.
6. All persons destroying the fences, or in any way injuring the cemetery, will be prosecuted as the law directs.
7. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in or cemented, or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
8. A plan of the ground and a register will be kept, which may be examined on payment of the charges set forth in Schedule A.
9. When a meeting of the Trustees is required, the same must be called by the secretary or chairman appointed by the Trustees.
10. The Trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alteration from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.

WHEREAS by the 133rd section of The Land Act 1884 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations, or to rescind any rules and regulations heretofore made, for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering in or upon such public parks and reserves: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the Regulation following to be observed and enforced in respect of the land temporarily reserved, by Order of 26th March 1889, as a site for Watering Purposes at Kyneton, in the parish of Lauriston.

REGULATION.

The said reserve shall be under the control of the Council of the Shire of Kyneton as a Committee of Management thereof,—(Corr.89.K.20535.)
