It will be observed from the last paragraph of Clause 1 of the Regulations that three engineer studentships will be given annually to sons of gentlemen in the colonies, on the recommendation of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, provided they pass the required examination.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF ENGINEER STUDENTS IN HER MAJESTY'S NAVY, AND FOR THE ENTRY OF STUDENTS IN NAVAL CONSTRUCTION, WITH A VIEW TO THEIR BEING TRAINED IN HER MAJESTY'S DOCKYARD AT DEVONPORT.

(The Engineer Students to be trained for service afloat as Engineer Officers.)

(The Students in Naval Construction to be trained with a view to their joining the Royal Corps of Naval Constructors.)

1. *Vacancies open to public competition principally: a few to be filled by nominated candidates.*—Vacancies for appointments as engineer students in Her Majesty's navy will be filled principally by means of competitive examinations open to all sons of British subjects, being of the prescribed age and of good moral character, but their Lordships will reserve to themselves the right to nominate a few candidates at each entry who will be appointed on passing the examination specified in paragraph 11.

The candidates to be nominated will be selected by the Board of Admiralty from sons of officers of the navy, army, or royal marines who have been killed in action or who have been lost at sea on active service, or killed on duty, or who have died of wounds received in action or injuries received on duty within six months from the date of such action or injury, or sons of officers of the navy or royal marines who have performed long and meritorious service. The number to be so nominated will not exceed one-fifth of the total number of engineer students to be entered. Except as regards exemption from the competitive examination, these candidates will be subject in all respects to these regulations.\*

Three engineer studentships will be given annually to sons of gentlemen in the colonies on the recommendation of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, provided they pass the required examination. These candidates will be subject to precisely the same regulations as herein laid down for nominated service candidates.†

2. *Appointments.*—The number of appointments to be made in each year will be fixed by their Lordships.

3. *Time for sending in applications.*—The list of candidates for the appointments by open competition will be kept at the office of the Civil Service Commissioners. All applications for the forms to be filled up by persons who wish to compete must be sent to the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, London, S.W., on or after the first of January in each year, and care must be taken that the forms when filled up are returned so as to reach the Civil Service Commissioners on or before the 15th March following, as no notice will be taken of forms received after that date. The list of nominated candidates will be kept at the Admiralty.

4. *Age.*—Candidates must not be less than fifteen nor more than sixteen years of age on the first day of May in the year in which they are examined.‡

5. *Age and character, evidence of.*—Evidence of age and character will not be required before the examination, but candidates successful in it will not be eligible for appointment unless they satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners on these points.

6. *Medical examination, time and place. Re-vaccination.*—The medical examination of the successful candidates will be held under the authority of their Lordships as soon as possible after the result of the educational examination is made known. No candidate will be entered as an engineer student unless he is pronounced to be physically fit. Candidates in or near London will be medically examined by the Medical Director-General of the Navy at the Admiralty. Those residing near one of Her Majesty's dockyards, or one of the first reserve ships or drill ships of the Royal Naval Reserve, or the flagship at Queenstown, will be examined by the medical officers attached thereto. The medical examinations will be conducted in all respects in strict accordance with the instructions for the examination of persons for admission into the naval service. All candidates at the time of their medical examination must produce certificates to the satisfaction of the examining officers that they have been re-vaccinated, or they must be re-vaccinated before they can be considered eligible for entry as engineer students in H.M. Navy.

\* Applications for nominations must be made so as to arrive at the Admiralty before the first of February in each year, and should be addressed to the Secretary of the Admiralty if the candidate is a son of an officer of the navy or marines; to the Military Secretary, Horse Guards, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the army; and to the Military Secretary, India Office, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the Indian Army.

† The names of the Colonial candidates are to be received at the Admiralty from the Colonial Office on or before the first of February in each year.

‡ The age will be extended to seventeen for the year 1889 only.

7. *Educational examination, time and place.*—The educational examination will be held by the Civil Service Commissioners in London, Liverpool, Portsmouth, Devonport, Bristol, Leeds, Newcastle-on-Tyne, Edinburgh, Glasgow, and Dublin, and will take place in the month of April of each year. The exact date may be ascertained by application to the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, on or after the first of January in each year.

8. *Competitive examination.*—The following will be the subjects of the competitive examination, and the maximum number of marks for each subject:—

All candidates will be tested as to their ability to read aloud with clearness, distinctness, and accuracy, and without hesitation. Stammering, or any imperfection of utterance, will be regarded as a disqualification.

9. *Examination fee.*—A fee will be required from every candidate attending an examination.||

10. *Result of examination.*—Candidates in the competitive examination who fail to pass in the first four subjects (those marked with an \* asterisk), or in reading aloud, will be disqualified, and their other papers will not be examined. Successful candidates will be entered as engineer students in H.M. Navy according to the number of appointments which it may be decided to make each year; they will be taken according to their position on the examination list. Candidates who obtain less than 780 marks in the aggregate will not be placed upon the list.

11. *Examination for nominated candidates.*—The candidates who are nominated by their Lordships, and by the Secretary of State for the Colonies, will be required to pass the same test examination in the first four subjects and in reading aloud as the candidates who enter for the competitive examination. They will also be examined in the other subjects to ascertain the extent of their knowledge and to determine their order of merit, and no nominated candidate will be appointed as an engineer student who obtains less than 780 marks in the aggregate.

12. *Informing of result of examination.*—Candidates will be informed by letter from the Civil Service Commission of the result of their examination as soon as it has been ascertained.

13. *Entry as engineer students.*—The successful candidates will be entered as engineer students in H.M. Navy about the first of July in each year, and will be borne on the books of the guard ship of the reserve at Devonport for disciplinary purposes. The period of training at H.M. dockyard at Devonport will be for five years, but it will be reduced to four years in the case of engineer students of the latter service who pass the examination described in paragraph 29, clause 1, and also pass very creditably in practical workmanship, professional subjects, and knowledge of engine-room duties referred to in paragraph 32.

14. *Appointment as students in naval construction. Bonds.*—Students in naval construction not exceeding two in number annually will be appointed from among engineer students who have shown special ability at the end of their second year of service. The students in naval construction, on appointment, must join with their parents or guardians in a bond for £500 to enter, if required, into Her Majesty's service as assistant constructors, if at the expiration of their training they should obtain certificates of good conduct and efficiency for entry in that capacity. They will continue to be under naval discipline until their entry as assistant constructors. (See paragraphs 40 to 48).

15. *Students in naval construction will complete five years' service at Devonport in the training school for engineer students, and will be subject to the same conditions as to fees, pay, uniform, and other details as may be prescribed from time to time for engineer students. Their course of instruction will be laid down from time to time.*

16. *Fees.*—The parent or guardian of each engineer student entered in future will be required to pay yearly in advance the sum of £40 per annum for each year the student may be under training—four or five years as the case may be. It will, however, be at the discretion of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty to select from among the students entered at each yearly examination, a number not to exceed five, being sons of officers of the

navy, army, or marines, or of civil officers under the Board of Admiralty, with respect to whom the annual payment will be £25 only. Their Lordships also reserve the power to further reduce this latter sum in the case of sons of officers killed or drowned, or who have otherwise lost their lives on service. In making their selection, my Lords will have regard solely to the pecuniary circumstances of the parents or guardians of the students.

17. *Payment of fees.*—The payments are to be made to the Cashier of H. M. Dockyard at Devonport: the first payment is to be made before the student is entered, and the subsequent payments on or before the 30th day of June in each of the four succeeding years. Should a student leave from any cause or be dismissed from the service, not any portion of the payments that have been made in his behalf will be refunded.

18. *Clothing, washing, necessities, board, lodging, medical attendance.*—The parents or guardians of the students will also be required to provide the uniform (see par. 48) or other clothing, washing, and necessities of each student. Board and lodging, and medical attendance, will be provided by the Admiralty. The students will be required to reside in the training school at Keyham.

19. *Pay.*—The weekly pay of students during their training will be as follows, provided they are well reported on by the officers:—

20. *Leave.*—Five weeks' leave (30 working days) on full pay will be granted each year to all students whose conduct and progress have been satisfactory. This leave is to be taken during the school vacations at Midsummer and Christmas.

21. *Checking of pay. Discharge, if unfit.*—The students are not to be checked pay while on leave, nor when hurt on duty. When sick or sent to hospital from causes beyond their own control, they are not to be checked of their pay until they have been absent for six months in the aggregate during any period of twelve months; at the expiration of this time a special report is to be made to their Lordships. When sick, or sent to hospital from causes within their own control, they are to be checked of their pay. Students pronounced at the end of twelve months' absence on account of sickness or hurt to be permanently unfit or unlikely to be capable of entering Her Majesty's Service as assistant engineers, or as assistant constructors, will be discharged. Should any student in the course of his training develop physical unfitness for the service, he will be discharged.

22. *Supervision.*—The students will be under the supervision of the superintendent of the dockyard and a staff of officers, and subject to such rules and regulations as their Lordships may deem necessary.

23. *Employment and instruction of students.*—Students will receive practical training in the workshops and instructions in iron shipbuilding at H. M. Dockyard at Devonport. While the engineer students are being instructed in iron shipbuilding they are to be under the direction of the Chief Constructor. They will attend the Engineer Student's School in the dockyard for such periods, and to pursue such studies as may from time to time be determined on; they will also pass a portion of their time in the Drawing Office. Means will be afforded them of acquiring the groundwork of the knowledge required by a naval engineer respecting the working of marine engines and boilers, including those repairs which can be carried out afloat, the practical use of the various instruments used in the engine-room, also of the construction and working of electric light, torpedo and gun machinery, and of becoming generally acquainted with the duties of a naval engineer.

24. *Examination of students.*—Students will be examined once a year under the direction of the President of the Royal Naval College, Greenwich.

Those who fail in making satisfactory progress and give no hope of becoming efficient officers, or are guilty of persistent misconduct, will be considered annually with reference to discharge from the service.

25. The preliminary examination at the end of the second year of service will be as follows, subject to modification at any future period, if considered desirable:—

26. *Students who fail at end of second year.*—Students who fail to pass the examination will be discharged, unless for satisfactory reasons their Lordships sanction their remaining on the lower division for another year.

27. *Examination as to practical acquirements. Prizes practical work.*—Students will be examined in practical engineering at the end of their second year of service, and be required to reach a standard of 25 per cent. They will also be examined as to their practical acquirements and knowledge of steam machinery and shipbuilding respectively at the end of the third, fourth, and fifth years of their service by officers of the Admiralty. Prizes will be given annually at the dockyard to the students most highly

reported on as regards their skill as workmen. A certain degree of proficiency in practical engineering and shipbuilding respectively will be considered essential at examinations.

28. *Examination of engineer students at end of fifth year.*—The final examination of engineer students at the end of the fifth year will be as follows, subject to modification at any future time, if considered desirable:—

29. *Regulations for passing.*—The following are the regulations for passing at the final examination, subject to modification at any future time, if considered desirable:—

- (1.) The standard for admission to the Royal Naval College will be 60 per cent., or above, on the combined total of the obligatory and optional subjects.
- (2.) The standard for passing with a second-class certificate will be at least 50 per cent. on the total obligatory subjects, but less than 60 per cent. on the combined total of obligatory and optional subjects.
- (3.) The standard for passing with a third-class certificate will be 30 per cent., or above, but less than 50 per cent. on the total of obligatory subjects.
- (4.) Students who obtain less than 30 per cent. of the total number of marks for obligatory subjects will be ineligible for appointment as probationary assistant engineers.

30. *Engineer students who fail.*—Engineer students who fail to pass the examinations at the end of their fifth year referred to in paragraph 29, clause 4, will be discharged unless their Lordships see fit to allow them to continue serving another year at Devonport. A second failure at the end of the sixth year will involve dismissal from the Service. In no case will the limit of six years be exceeded.

31. *Pay of a student during sixth year and payment to be made.*—The pay of a student in the sixth year will be the same as during the fifth year, and the payment to be made by the parent or guardian of the student in the sixth year will also be the same as for the fifth year of service.

32. *Examination in professional subjects, knowledge of engine-room duties, and practical workmanship.*—The examination of candidates for appointment as probationary assistant engineers in professional subjects and knowledge of engine-room duties will be held by the officers of the Steam Reserve in time for the necessary certificate D. 455 to be forwarded to the Admiralty by the 23rd of June in each year. Certificates of proficiency in practical workmanship, signed by the chief engineer of the dockyard, should also be forwarded by the same date.

These practical certificates from steam reserve and dockyard should be marked very creditable, creditable, or ordinary, in accordance with the proficiency of the candidates.

33. *To be able to swim.*—Students will not be entered as probationary assistant engineers, or probationary assistant constructors until they have learned to swim.

34. *Appointments as probationary assistant engineers, and as to their proceeding to the Royal Naval College for a course of study.*—Engineer students who pass the examinations described in paragraph 29, clauses 1, 2, and 3, and paragraphs 32 and 33, will be arranged in three classes, in the order of merit according to the marks which they obtain in the subjects above mentioned. They will be entered as probationary assistant engineers on the first of July of the year of examination, and will be appointed to the reserve guard ship at Devonport on that date. Those referred to in paragraph 29, clause 1, will join the Royal Naval College on the 1st of October of the year of examination for further study, and the others referred to in paragraph 29, clauses 2 and 3, will not proceed to the Royal Naval College, but will remain in the Steam Reserve at Devonport, to be appointed to H. M. ships as their services are required.

35. *Confirmation of probationary assistant engineers. Certificates obtained at the R. N. College.*—All the probationary assistant engineers will be confirmed at the end of their twelve months' probationary time if their conduct and qualifications are reported satisfactory, and those at the Royal Naval College, who pass in the first class at the examination at the end of the first session, will receive first-class certificates, and those who fail to secure first-class certificates at the examination at the college, will be granted second-class certificates. Probationary assistant engineers referred to in paragraph 29, clause 2, will also be granted second-class certificates, and those mentioned in paragraph 29, clause 3, will be granted third-class certificates.

36. Those who obtain first and second class certificates will be allowed to count twelve months and six months of their probationary time, respectively, for promotion, and those who obtain third-class certificates and pass very creditably in practical workmanship, professional subjects, and knowledge of engineering duties, will be allowed to count three months of their probationary time for promotion. (See paragraph 32.)

37. *Commission to be withheld for misconduct or failing to pass examination at R.N. College.*—In the event of the conduct and qualifications of any probationary assistant engineer not being reported satisfactory during his twelve months' probation, or of his failing to pass satisfactorily at the final examination at the Royal Naval College, his commission will be withheld for six months, or for such other period as may be determined on by their Lordships.

38. *Probationary assistant engineers' pay, &c.*—The pay of probationary assistant engineers while at the reserves will be 6s. a day, and they will receive 1s. 6d. a day in lieu of provisions, &c. While at the Royal Naval College at Greenwich they will be provided with quarters, and during their first session they will be paid 6s. a day and 1s. 6d. a day towards the mess expenses.

39. *Assistant engineers selected for further period of study at Greenwich.*—Two assistant engineers will be selected annually from those who take the highest place at the examination on the completion of their first course at Greenwich, to pass through a further course of scientific instruction if they desire it. These two will be allowed to study at the college for a second and third session. They will receive 7s. 6d. a day and 1s. 6d. a day towards the mess. On the completion of the third session at the college they will be sent to sea as assistant engineers, and, after one year's service at sea, they will be considered eligible to fill vacancies occurring in the civil appointments at the dockyards and at the admiralty.

40. *Examination of students in naval construction at end of fifth year.*—The final examination of students in naval construction at the end of their fifth year will be as follows, subject to modification at any time if considered desirable:—†

41. *Regulations for passing.*—Students in naval construction who obtain 50 per cent., or above, on each group of subjects (A and B) will be eligible for entry as probationary assistant constructors on the 1st of July of the year of examination, and to proceed to the Royal Naval College on the 1st of October following for study.

42. *Students in naval construction who fail.*—Those who fail to pass the above-mentioned examination will be liable to be discharged or dealt with as may be determined by their Lordships.

43. *Probationary assistant constructors' pay, &c.*—Probationary assistant constructors who, at the end of the first session at the Royal Naval College, fail to obtain a satisfactory report of their qualifications, will be required to withdraw from the service and forfeit a moiety of the bond unless the failure be due to sickness. The pay of the probationary assistant constructors, until the completion of their training at the Royal Naval College, will be the same as that of the probationary assistant engineers and assistant engineers of the same service.

44. Such probationary assistant constructors only as obtain first or second class professional certificates on their final examination at the Royal Naval College will be admitted to the corps of naval constructors, their first appointments being as assistant constructors third class.

45. When appointed assistant constructors, third class, on leaving the college, the bond referred to in paragraph 14 will become operative, and they will cease to be under naval discipline, except that they will have to proceed to sea for a term if so required.

46. Those who obtain third-class certificates will not be admitted to the corps, but will be eligible to receive appointments as draughtsmen in the dockyards.

47. Every student entering the Royal Corps of naval constructors will be liable to serve at any foreign naval establishment the Admiralty may direct.

48. The period of service in the third class for all assistant constructors to be four years. If favorably reported on at the end of this period as to character, ability, and industry, each officer will be eligible for promotion to the second class. Promotions from the second class to the first class of assistant constructors will be by selection. Those officers who have taken

first-class certificates on their final examination at the Royal Naval College will be eligible for promotion to first class if favorably reported on after five years' service, reckoned from the date of leaving the college, and those who have obtained second-class certificates to be similarly eligible after seven years' service.

49. *Employment during vacations at Greenwich.*—The assistant engineers who pass the second and third sessions at Greenwich will be attached during the vacations between the 30th June and 1st October to the dockyards or steam reserves, where they will be employed sketching machinery, attending trials of new and repaired engines, and gaining such professional information as will be most useful to them for the purposes of engine design. The assistant constructors will also be attached to the dockyards during the vacations, and will be employed on duties appertaining to their position.

50. *Assistant engineers to enter into a bond.*—An assistant engineer, who is selected at the end of the first session at the Royal Naval College to remain for two more sessions at the college, will be required before commencing the second session to enter into a bond with surety for the sum of £500 not to leave Her Majesty's service within seven years of the completion of the term at Greenwich. This is in reference to defraying the charges incurred by the public for his education. The resignation is in every case to be subject to their Lordships' approval.

51. Students are to be provided with—

Eight buttons placed by four to be worn on the breast of the tunic. The engineer students to have a single purple velvet stripe round the sleeve of the tunic, and the students in naval construction to have a silver grey stripe.

Estimated cost of uniform, to last three years with care, about £18.

Patterns of the several articles of uniform are kept, and can be seen at the Admiralty, Whitehall, and at the offices of the Naval Commanders-in-Chief at Sheerness, Portsmouth, and Devonport.

The probable annual expense attending renewals of uniforms and other clothes, washing, subscription to recreative fund, &c., is estimated to be about £25.

52. *Text Books, stationery, and drawing materials.*—Students will be required to find their own books, and a list will be furnished to each on appointment. They will also be required to find their own stationery and drawing materials.

53. The foregoing regulations will be generally followed, but may Lords will modify them from time to time as may be considered desirable.

#### Medical Examinations.

54. *Medical examination.*—With a view to prevent parents and guardians from incurring the inconvenience and expense of preparing candidates for entry as engineer students in Her Majesty's dockyards, who may be physically unfit for Her Majesty's service, it is suggested that the candidates be submitted to examination by the medical adviser of the family, or any other qualified medical practitioner, to whom the following points may be submitted as those upon which they will be physically examined by naval medical officers. It is to be understood that this private examination is merely suggested as a guide to parents and guardians, and to lessen the chances of disappointment, and that it is by no means intended to take the place of, or to influence in any way, the regular official physical examination.

A weak constitution, arising from imperfect development or weakness of the physical powers of the body, either hereditary or from chronic disease, wounds, or injuries.

Chronic eruptions on the skin or scalp.

Malformation of the head, with a dry, harsh, divergent state of the hair of the scalp, fracture or depression of the bones of the skull, disordered intellect, imbecility, epilepsy, paralysis, or impediment of speech.

Blindness or defective vision, as tested by Snellen's test types, in one or both eyes, fistula lachrymalis, and ptosis.

Impaired hearing, or discharge from one or both ears, disease or thickening of the lining membrane of the external ear.

Disease of the bones of the nose or of its cartilages, and polypus.

Disease of the throat, palate, or tonsils, unsound teeth, offensive breath from constitutional causes, unhealthy gums, scrofulous diseases of the glands of the throat or neck, external cicatrices from scrofulous sores.

† This examination to come into force in June 1890.

Paralysis, weakness, impaired motion, or contraction of the upper or lower extremities, from whatever cause; aneurism, a varicose state of the veins, especially of the leg. Bunions, distortion, malformation of the feet, or malposition of the fingers or toes.

Distortion of the spine, of the bones of the chest, or pelvis, from injury or constitutional defect.

Engineer officers in charge of engines of 3,000 indicated horse-power and upwards in the larger ships of modern construction will, in consideration of the increased responsibilities attaching to their position, be granted rates of charge pay varying from 4s. to 9s. a day, according to the special circumstances of each case, in lieu of the above rates which are for ships fitted with ordinary machinery. Engineers and assistant engineers in charge of engines of ships not in commission are allowed 1s. a day. Chief engineers in charge of machinery of an exceptional ship such as the "Hecle," though under 3,000 indicated horse-power, 4s. a day.

#### Extra Pay.

The senior engineer in ships in commission, having engines of 3,000 indicated horse-power and upwards, is allowed 1s. a day extra pay.

The chief inspectors and inspectors of machinery in the reserves, in consideration of their responsible duties, are allowed an additional 3s. a day.

#### Promotion.

Assistant engineers, qualified for advancement, are eligible for promotion to the rank of engineer after five years' service. Assistant engineers who obtain first-class certificates at the Royal Naval College count their twelve months probationary time towards promotion, and those who obtain second-class certificates at the college, and those who obtain second-class certificates on entry in H.M. Navy, count six months of their probationary time respectively towards promotion. Those who obtain third-class certificates on entry in H.M. Navy, and pass very creditably in practical workmanship, &c., will be allowed to count three months of their probationary time towards promotion. (See paragraph 32).

WHEREAS by a Mortgage dated the first of January 1887 made under the provisions of the Water Conservation Acts 1881-1883 by the Borough Echuca Water Trust, the interest on the additional loan of Three thousand pounds sterling (£3,000) obtained by such Waterworks Trust from the Government is made payable from the said first day of January 1887: And whereas by section 4 of *The Water Conservation Act 1884*, No. 829, the Governor in Council is empowered to direct that, notwithstanding anything contained in any such mortgage, the interest on money so secured shall be charged from a date not more than two years subsequent to the date in that behalf specified in such mortgage: And whereas by section 15 of the said Act, No. 829, the Governor in Council may, if he think fit, order that, notwithstanding anything contained in the Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881-1883, the provisions of the said Acts with regard to the formation of sinking funds by Waterworks Trusts which have obtained loans shall not apply in the case of any such Trust specified in such order for a period of five years or at any shorter period from the date of the mortgage by which the loan to such Trust is secured.

Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said sections of the said Victorian Water Conservation Act, No. 829, doth hereby direct that the interest on the moneys secured by the above-mentioned mortgage shall be charged from the 1st day of January 1889, and with the advice aforesaid, doth order that the provisions of the said Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881-1883, with regard to the formation of sinking funds by Waterworks Trusts which have obtained loans, shall not apply to the said Borough Echuca Water Trust until the 1st of January 1892.

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

*Sailmakers and Coopers*

Upon producing proof of having served an apprenticeship to their respective trades will in future be held to be in Schedule 2, Class 2—"Artisans and Others."

SHIRE OF LOWAN.—LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

BYE-LAW NO. 2.—AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Lowan, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in the Public Health Acts 1865-1888, and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Lowan.

*Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairy-men, and Purveyors of Milk.*

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of June in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of Two shillings and sixpence per annum.

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary for the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board, or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or secretary of the said local board; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house

of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling-place, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and kept perfectly clean, and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or the officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health; and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable in the discretion of the convicting justices to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less

than Five shillings, or, in the like discretion, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued

The foregoing bye-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health (being the Municipal Council) in and for the Shire of Loran this fifth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

#### PUBLIC HEALTH.—SHIRE OF MOUNT ROUSE.

##### BYE-LAW No. 3.

**T**HE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Mount Rouse, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in the Public Health Acts 1865-1888, and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. Three (3) of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law (excepting Part III.) shall apply to and have operation in the whole of said shire, and Part III. of this Bye-law shall apply to and have operation in all that portion of the shire which is not a surveyed or proclaimed township.

##### Definitions.

4. In the construction and for the purposes of this bye-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—

“House” shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

“Cesspool” shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground; and “earth-closet” shall include a pan closet of any description.

“Street” shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

“Slaughter-yard” or “Slaughter-house” shall include an abattoir or any place whatever where slaughtering takes place.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word “person” shall include a corporation.

##### Part I.—General Cleanliness.

5. The occupier of every house and premises shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all dust, filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be, once at least in every week, removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of any premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, occupation, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon, to be effectually deodorized and to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

7. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter in any street, road, lane, right-of-way, or place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health, or in any way contrary to the directions of the local board or officer of health.

8. No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

##### Part II.—Disposal of House Refuse and Cleanliness in Townships, &c.

9. The occupier of any land on which is erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pig-sty, or on which land is any building wherein any horse or other beast of draught or burden or any cattle or swine are kept, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard, or once at least in every week should the quantity not amount, in that time, to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

10. Every occupier of a building or premises wherein or whereon any horse or other beast of draught or burden or any cattle or swine may be kept shall provide, in connection with such building or premises, whenever required by the local board or officer of health, a suitable receptacle for dung, manure, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter which may from time to time be produced in the keeping of any such animal in such building or upon such premises, and cause such receptacle to be constructed so that the bottom or floor thereof shall not in any case be lower than the surface of the ground adjoining such receptacle, and in such a manner and of such materials, and to be maintained at all times in such a condition, as to prevent any effluvia therefrom or any escape of the contents thereof, or any soakage therefrom, into the ground or into the wall of any building, and to be furnished with a suitable cover, and, when not required to be open, to be kept properly covered.

11. He shall likewise provide in connection with such building or premises, if required by the local board or officer of health, a sufficient drain constructed in such a manner and of such materials, and maintained at all times in such a condition, as effectually to convey all urine or liquid filth or refuse therefrom into a proper receptacle.

##### Part III.—As to Manure.

12. Nothing herein contained shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises which are not within any surveyed or proclaimed township from causing any dung, soil (not being night-soil), or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any bye-law of the Local Board of Health, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or contrary to any directions of the local board or officer of health.

13. Every person placing, depositing, or spreading, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any liquid manure of which night-soil, urine, or any similar offensive matters form a part, night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall, immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof, cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness, and shall keep and use the same in such a way only as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health. And before doing so such person shall obtain the written permission of the local board or officer of health, subject however to any general regulation or directions which the Central Board by publication in the *Government Gazette* may make or give. But such permission shall be no defence in any complaint or prosecution for having kept or used such liquid manure, night-soil, offal, blood, or other matter in such way as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

##### Part IV.—As to Earth-closets, &c.

14. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the content whereof does not exceed three cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

15. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

16. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be water-tight and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet, and provided with a closely-fitted cover of pattern to be approved by the inspector of nuisances.

17. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

18. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of eleven p.m. and five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, sulphate of iron, chloride of lime, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

19. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall once at least in every week empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

20. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

21. Where any nightman is licensed by the municipal authorities, such nightman shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for the removal of night-soil therefrom, and no other person shall remove the same.

22. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and finally placed in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

23. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of eleven p.m. and five a.m., unless otherwise permitted by the local board (of which the proof shall lie on such person), or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed so soon as the same is emptied.

24. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any drain or sewer.

#### Part V.—Prevention of Pollution of Water.

25. No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed, in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

26. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any water supplied, used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any such water.

27. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way or be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within twenty-four hours of notice given by the local board or by one of its officers.

#### Part VI.—Drainage of Buildings.

28. Every person erecting, or causing to be erected, any new building shall cause the foundations thereof, and the ground over which such building is to be placed, to be rendered dry, sound, and well-drained, so that no water soakage or damp shall lodge there.

29. Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

#### Part VII.—Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairy-men, and Purveyors of Milk.

30. Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of June in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.).

31. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary of the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

32. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle, shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board, or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or secretary of the said local board; and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order in writing, signed by the secretary and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling-place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person; and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

33. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

34. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

35. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

36. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business; nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

37. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

38. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit, or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

#### Part VIII.—Penalties.

39. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the

justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than five shillings—to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The foregoing bye-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health (being the Municipal Council) in and for the shire of Mount Rouse this thirteenth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine (1889).

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. The name, age, late place of residence, and cause of death of deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.
3. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the interment.
4. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced to two of the trustees that the relations or friends of such person are unable to pay the costs and charges, except the cost of digging the grave.
5. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to persons applying.
6. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the directions of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.
8. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered with a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.
9. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, shall be submitted to the trustees for approval, who may withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be proposed to be erected according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner.
10. A plan of the cemetery and registry will be kept, and may be inspected at the office of the sexton.
11. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.
12. No grave to be of less depth than 6 feet, except in case of still-born children, when the depth may be 4 feet.
13. The charge for digging grave to include filling up.
14. Family vaults to be limited to 10 feet frontage by a depth of 10 feet.

The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these regulations.

RECREATION RESERVE, GOLDEN SQUARE,  
SANDHURST.—REGULATIONS.

THE Council of the City of Sandhurst, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Recreation purposes at Golden Square, Sandhurst, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise and sunset.
  2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
  3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
  4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the trees, fences, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
  5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
  6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
  7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
  8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

WHEREAS by the 133rd section of *The Land Act 1884* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations, or to rescind any rules and regulations heretofore made, for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering in or upon such public parks and reserves: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind the Regulation made by the said Board on the 26th January 1887, in regard to the land temporarily reserved by Order of 13th December 1886 as a site for Public Recreation in the parish of Doutta Galla, and doth hereby make the Regulation following to be observed and enforced in respect thereof:—
