REGULATIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF ENGINEER STUDENTS IN HER MAJESTY'S NAVY, AND FOR THE ENTRY OF STUDENTS IN NAVAL CONSTRUCTION, WITH A VIEW TO THEIR BEING TRAINED IN HER MAJESTY'S DOCKYARD AT DEVONPORT.

(The Engineer Students to be trained for service affoat as Engineer Officers.

(The Students in Naval Construction to be trained with a view to their joining the Royal Corps of Naval Constructors.)

1. Vacancies open to public competition principally; a few to be filled by nominated candidates. Vacancies for appointments as engineer students in Her Majesty's navy will be filled principally by means of competitive examinations open to all soms of British subjects, being of the prescribed age and of good moral character, but their Lordships will reserve to themselves the right to nominate a few candidates at each entry who will be appointed on passing the examination specified in paragraph 11.

The candidates to be nominated will be selected by the Board of Admiralty from sons of officers of the navy, army, or royal marines who have been killed in action or who have been lost at sea on active service, or killed on duty, or who have died of wounds received in action or injuries received on duty within six months from the date of such action or injury, or sons of officers of the navy or royal marines who have performed long and meritorious service. The number to be so nominated will not exceed one-fifth of the total number of engineer students to be entered. Except as regards exemption from the competitive examination, these candidates will be subject in all respects to these regulations.

Three engineer studentships will be given annually to sons of gentlemen in the colonies on the recommendation of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, provided they pass the required examination. These candidates will be subject to precisely the same regulations as herein laid down for nominated service candidates.

- 2. Appointments.—The number of appointments to be made in each year will be fixed by their Lordships.

 3. Time for sending in applications.—The list of candidates for the appointments by open competition will be kept at the office of the Civil Service Commissioners. All applications for the forms to be filled up by persons who wish to compete must be sent to the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, London, S.W., on or after the first of January in each year, and care must be taken that the forms when filled up are returned so as to reach the Civil Service Commissioners on or before the 15th March following, as no notice will be taken of forms received after that date. The list of nominated candidates will be kept at the Admiralty.
- 4. Age.—Candidates must not be less than fifteen nor more than sixteen years of age on the first day of May in the year in which they are examined.
- 5. Age and character, cridence of —Evidence of age and character will not be required before the examination, but candidates successful in it will not be eligible for appointment unless they satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners on these points.

 6. Medical examination, time and place. Re-receination.—The medical examination of the successful candidates will be held under the authority of their Lordships as soon as possible after the result of the educational examination is made known. No candidate will be entered as an engineer student unless he is pronounced to be physically fit. Candidates in or near London will be medically examined by the Medical Director-General of the Navy at the Admiralty. Those residing near one of Her Majestry's dockyards, or one of the first reserve ships or drill ships of the Royal Naval Reserve, or the flagship at Queenstown, will be examined by the medical officers attached thereto. The medical examinations will be conducted in all respects in strict accordance with the instructions for the examination of persons for admission into the naval service. All candidates at the time of their medical examining officers that they have been re-vaccinated, or they must be re-vaccinated before they can be considered eligible for entry as engineer students in H.M. Navy.
- Applications for nominations must be made so as to arrive at Applications for nominations must be made so as to arrive at the Admiralty before the first of February in each year, and should be addressed to the Secretary of the Admiralty if the candidate is a son of an officer of the navy or marines; to the Military Secretary, Horse Guards, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the army; and to the Military Secretary, India Office, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the Indian Army.

The exact date may be ascertained by application to the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, on or after the first of January in each year.

Successful candidates will be entered as engineer students in H.M. Navy according to the number of appointments which it may be decided to make each year; they will be taken according to their position on the examination list. Candidates who obtain less than 780 marks in the aggregate will not be placed upon the list.
- 11. Examination for nominated candidates.—The candidates who are nominated by their Lordships, and by the Secretary of State for the Colonics, will be required to pass the same test examination in the first four subjects and in reading aloud as the candidates who enter for the competitive examination. They will also be examined in the other subjects to ascertain the extent of their knowledge and to determine their order of merit, and no nominated candidate will be appointed as an engineer student who obtains less than 780 marks in the aggregate.
- 12. Informing of result of examination.—Candidates will be informed by letter from the Civil Service Commission of the result of their examination as soon as it has been ascertained.

The students in naval construction, on appointment, must join with their parents or guardians in a bond for £500 to enter, if required, into Her Majesty's service as assistant constructors, if at the expiration of their training they should obtain, certificates of good conduct and efficiency for entry in that capacity. While the engineer students are being instructed in iron shipbuilding they are to be under the direction of the Chief Constructor. They will attend the Engineer Student's School in the dockyard for such periods, and to pursue such studies as may from time to time be determined on; they will also pass a portion of their time in the Drawing Office. Means will be afforded them of acquiring the groundwork of the knowledge required by a naval engineer respecting the working of marine engines and boilers, including those repairs which can be carried out affoat, the practical use of the various instruments used in the engineeroom, also of the construction and working of electric light, torpedo and gun machinery, and of becoming generally acquainted with the duties of a naval engineer.

24. Examination of students.—Students will be examined once a year under the direction of the President of the Royal Naval College, Greenwich.

Those who fail in making satisfactory progress and give no hope of becoming efficient officers, or are guilty of persistent misconduct, will be considered annually with reference to discharge from the service.

23. Regulations for passing.—The following are the regulations for passing at the final examintion, subject to modification at any future time, if considered desirable:—

(1.) The standard for admission to the Royal Naval College will be 60 per cent., or above, on the combined total of the obligatory and optional subjects.

(2.) The standard for passing with a second-class certificate will be at least 50 per cent. on the total obligatory subjects, but less than 60 per cent. on the combined total of obligatory and optional subjects.

Regulations for passing.—Students in naval construction who obtain 50 per cent., or above, on each group of subjects (A and B) will be eligible for entry as probationary assistant constructors on the lat of July of the year of examination, and to proceed to the Royal Naval College on the lat of October following for study.

42. Studints in naval construction who fail.—Those who fail to pass the above-mentioned examination will be liable to be discharged or dealt with as may be determined by their Lordships.

43. Probationary assistant constructors' pay, de.—Probationary assistant constructors who, at the end of the first session at the Royal Naval College, fail to obtain a satisfactory report of their qualifications, will be required to withdraw from the service and forfeit a moiety of the bond unless the failure be due to sickness. Employment during vacutions at Greenwich.—The assistant engineers who pass the second and third sessions at Greenwich will be attached during the vacations between the 30th June and 1st October to the dockyards or steam reserves, where they will be employed sketching machinery, attending trials of new and repaired engines, and gaining such professional information as will be most useful to them for the purposes of engine design. The assistant constructors will also be attached to the dockyards during the vacations, and will be employed on duties appertaining to their position. to their position.

50. Assistant engineers to enter into a bond.—An assistant engineer, who is selected at the end of the first session at the Royal Naval College to remain for two more sessions at the college, will be required before commencing the second session to enter into a bond with surety for the sum of £500 not to leave Her Majesty's service within seven years of the completion of the term at Greenwich. This is in reference to defraying the charges incurred by the public for his education. The resignation is in every case to be subject to their Lordships' approval.

Medical Examinations.

54. Medical examination.—With a view to prevent parents and guardians from incurring the inconveni-nce and expense of preparing candidates for entry as engineer students in Her Majesty's dockyards, who may be physically unfit for Her Majesty's dockyards, who may be physically unfit for Her Majesty's ervice, it is suggested that the candidates be submitted to examination by the medical adviser of the family, or any other qualified medical practitioner, to whom the following points may be submitted as those upon which they will be physically examined by naval medical officers. It is to be understood that this private examination is merely suggested as a guide to parents and guardians, and to lessen the chances of disappointment, and that it is by no means intended to take the place of, or to influence in any way, the regular official physical examination.

A weak constitution, arising from imperfect development or weakness of the physical powers of the body, either hereditary or from chronic disease, wounds, or injuries,

Chronic cruptions on the skin or scalp.

Malformation of the head, with a dry, hersh, divergent state of the hair of the scalp, fracture or depression of the bones of the skull, disordered intellect, imbecility, cpilepsy, paralysis, or impediment of speech.

Blindness or defective vision, as tested by Snellen's test types, in one or both eyes, fistula lacirymalis, and ptosis.

Impaired heating, or discharge from one or both ears, disease or thickening of the lining membrane of the external ear.

Disease of the bones of the nose or of its cartilages, and polypus.

SHIRE OF LOWAN.—LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

BYE-LAW No. 2.—As TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Lowan, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in the Public Health Acts 1865-1888, and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said local board in the execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:

- 1. All former byo-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.
- 2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Guzette.
- 3. This bye law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Lowan.

Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of June in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of Two shillings and sixpence per annum.

Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary for the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board, or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or secretary of the said local board; and if, or inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely, in the equinon of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house

of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling-place, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

- 7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.
- 8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and kept perfectly clean, and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in such order so directed.
- All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.
- 9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

 10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or the officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health; and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business. Nor, if the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or its contamination has ceased.

 11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the content of the person of the communication of the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or its contamination has ce
- 11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowhed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.
- 12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.
- 13. In the interpretation of this bye law words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.
- 14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable in the discretion of the convicting justices to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less

than Five shillings, or, in the like discretion, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued

The foregoing bye-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health (being the Municipal Council) in and for the Shire of Lowan this fifth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

BYE-LAW No. 3.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Mount Rouse in the gelony of Victoria believed by Rouse, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in the Public Health Acts 1865-1888, and overy other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, oth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. Three (3) of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

- 1. All former byc-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this byc-law coming into operation.
- or this bye-law coming into operation.

 2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.

 3. This bye-law (excepting Part III.) shall apply to and have operation in the whole of said shire, and Part III. of this Bye-law shall apply to and have operation in all that portion of the shire which is not a surveyed or proclaimed township.

Definitions.

- 4. In the construction and for the purposes of this bye-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—

 "House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

 "Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground; and "earth-closet" shall include a pan closet of any description.

 - and "cartir-closet small include a pair close of any scription." Street" shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not. "Slaughter-yaud" or "Slaughter-house" shall include an abattoir or any place whatever where slaughtering takes

place. Words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

Part I.—General Cleanliness.

 5. The occupier of every house and premises shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all dust, filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be, once at least in every week, removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

 6. The occupier of any premises used for the purpose of any
- removed at the expense of such occupier.

 6. The occupier of any premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive brade, business, occupation, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon, to be effectually deodorized and to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and-to be in the meautime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluira; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

 7. No person shall place or deposit any dust, and ashes
- 7. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or, other offensive matter in any street, road, lane, right-offensive matter in any street, road, lane, right-offensy, or place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health, or in any way contrary to the directions of the local board or officer of health.

 8. No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

Part II.—Disposal of House Refuse and Cleanliness in Townships, de.

- 9. The occupier of any land on which is erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pig-sty, or on which land is any building wherein any horse or other beast of draught or burden or any cattle or swine are kept, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard, or once at least in every week should the quantity not amount, in that time, to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed thorefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

 10. Every occupier of a building or premises wherein or whereon
- moved by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

 10. Every occupier of a building or premises wherein or whereon any horse or other beast of draught or burden or any cattle or swine may be kept shall provide, in connection with such building or premises, whenever required by the local board or officer of health, a suitable receptacle for dung, manure, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter which may from time to time be produced in the keeping of any such animal in such building or upon such premises, and cause such receptacle to be constructed so that the bottom or floor thereof shall not in any case be lower than the surface of the ground adjoining such receptacle, and in such a manner and of such materials, and to be maintained at all times in such a condition, as to prevent any effluvia therefrom or any escape of the contents thereof, or any soakage therefrom, into the ground or into the wall of any building, and to be furnished with a suitable cover, and, when not required to be open, to be kept properly covered.

 11. He shall likewise grovide in connection with such building

He shall likewise provide in connection with such building or premises, if required by the local board or officer of health, a sufficient drain constructed in such a manner and of such materials, and maintained at all times in such a condition, as effectually to convey all urine or liquid filth or refuse therefrom into a proper receptacle.

Nothing herein contained shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises which are not within any surveyed or proclaimed township from causing any dung, soil (not being night-soil), or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any bye-law of the Local Board of Health, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or contrary to any directions of the local board or officer of health.
- or injurious to nemain, or contrary to any directions of the local board or officer of health.

 13. Every person placing, depositing, or spreading, or causing or suffering to be placed or depositing or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any liquid manure of which night-soil, offial, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cosspool, or other place, shall, immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof, cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness, and shall keep and use the same in such a way only as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health. And before doing so such person shall obtain the written permission of the local board or officer of health, subject however to any general regulation or directions which the Contral Board by publication in the Government Gazette may make or give. But such permission shall be no defence in any complaint or prosecution for having kept or used such liquid manure, night-soil, offal, blood, or other matter in such way as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptable for night-soil, the content whereof does not exceed three cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptable and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, whall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdast, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan-or other receptable in such earth-closet to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.
- 16. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be water-tight and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet, and provided with a closely-fitted cover of pattern to be approved by the inspector of nuisances.
- 17. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

18. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of eleven p.m. and five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, sulphate of iron, chloride of line, or some other efficient deodorize sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

19. Every occupier and every person having the management

Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall once at least in every week empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.
- 20. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.
- 21. Where any nightman is licensed by the municipal authorities, such nightman shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for the removal of night-soil therefrom, and no other person shall remove the same.

 22. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and finally placed in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

 23. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cosspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of eleven p.m. and five a.m., unless otherwise permitted by the local board of which the proof shall lie on such person), or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any carth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed so soon as the same is emptied.

No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any drain or sewer.

No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed, in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

 26. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any water supplied, used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any such water.

 27. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situ-
- 27. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way or be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within twenty-four hours of notice given by the local board or by one of its officers.

Part VI.-Drainage of Buildings.

- 28. Every person electing, or causing to be erected, any new building shall cause the foundations thereof, and the ground over which such building is to be placed, to be rendered dry, sound, and well-drained, so that no water soakage or damp shall lodge there.
- 29. Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the health-fulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

Part VII.—Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.

30. Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of June in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.).

All cattle in dairies shall also estimately inspected by a voterinary surgeon or other compotant person; and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time but upon fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time bo made.

 33. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

 34. All vards shade or other places used for keaping or badding.

All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be funigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.
- All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business; nor, if the person registered or conducting such business to himself the person suffering, shall be take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

 38. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit, or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

Part VIII .- Penalties.

39. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the

justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this byo-law, or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers. such powers.

THE Council of the City of Sandhurst, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Recreation purposes at Golden Square, Sandhurst, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of The Land Act 1884:—

- 1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise and
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick hills thereon, or cut names on the trees, fences, or scats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
- 5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the com-mittee of management.
- 7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of The Land Act 1884, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailliff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
