QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE DISEASES IN STOCK ACT 1872."

WHEREAS upon the statutory declaration of an Inspector of Stock, made pursuant to clause 59 of the Regulations of the 19th March 1880, under *The Diseases in Stock Act 1872*, the lands hereinafter described have become Quarantine Districts until the determination and declaration of the Governor in Council relative thereto: It is hereby notified, that the Governor in Council has declared the said lands to be Quarantine Districts, in pursuance of clause 60 of the Regulations under the Act aforesaid, viz.:-

1. Land in the occupation of Mr. Frederick Peeck, viz.:- Allotment 24, parish of Gelantipy West, county of Tambo, containing nine hundred and six acres: Commencing at the north-west angle; thence east along the south boundary of allotment 25 about fifteen thousand seven hundred links to Butcher's Creek; thence south-west about six thousand five hundred links along the said creek; thence west fourteen thousand one hundred and seventy-five links to the south-west boundary of allotment 24; thence north about six thousand links to the point of commencement.

2. - Coal from the Gippsland Mines to be charged Firewood Rates.
- The minimum on Cheese, Colonial, loose or in cases, is reduced to 10 cwt.
- Electro-plate, Britannia Metal, Mixed Metal, and Plated Goods, ex vessels at the piers, to be charged 5s. per ton of 40 cubic feet, with a minimum of 4s. per case, cask, or package when the value is £5 and upwards.

GRANT FOR PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS, 1888-89.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations in connection with the above-named Grant, viz. :—

PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS.

Regulations in connection with the Vote of Nine thousand five hundred pounds (£9,500) for Fencing and Improving Public Parks and Gardens under the control of Borough Councils, Trustees, Committees of Management, &c.

1. A sum not exceeding Ten shillings shall be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister may approve, in such park or garden between 1st January 1888 and 31st December 1888, out of funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Agriculture on or before the 1st February 1889. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in the form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the form B.

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park or garden from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park or garden, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st of January 1888 and 31st December 1888;

but it shall not mean nor include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January 1888.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park or garden shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1888 (*vide form A*), and a sum equal to one-half of the balance then remaining, if made up of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of Nine thousand three hundred and four pounds seventeen shillings and sixpence, they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. A sum of Ninety-five pounds two shillings and sixpence shall be paid to the Eaglehawk Borough Council in satisfaction of its claim against the vote for the year 1887-8; same not having been received in time to participate in distribution.

5. In every case in which a claim is sent in, an officer of the department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.

6. Moneys expended in street planting or in fencing, formation or maintenance of land for racing, cricket, football, croquet, tennis, bowling, quoits, or other sports, or in erection or repairs of stands or pavilions for the purpose of witnessing sports, must not be included in any claim upon the vote.

7. The foregoing shall not apply to parks and gardens within the limits of the city of Melbourne, except the Royal Park, or to the Edinburgh Garden, Fitzroy, or the Botanical Garden, Geelong.

GRANT TO AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES, 1888-89.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations in connection with the above-named Grant, viz.:-

AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

Regulations for the distribution of the sum of Twenty thousand pounds (£20,000) granted by Parliament to Agricultural Societies, 1888-89.

1. Each society shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st February 1889, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked B.

2. On receipt of the above-mentioned statement so verified, the Minister of Agriculture may cause to be paid to the treasurer of each society a sum equal to two-thirds of the amount shown to have been awarded and paid away in prizes not exceeding £25 each (except for the exhibits mentioned in the statement above referred to, and such other exhibits the Minister may consider unsuitable), on condition that this sum do not exceed the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations; and if it do exceed the same, that it be in that case reduced to a sum equal to the amount so raised.

3. Of the whole grant (£20,000), a sum not exceeding Nineteen thousand five hundred pounds shall be so divided; and if the sums claimable be in excess of this amount they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. A sum not to exceed Five hundred pounds shall be paid to the St. Arnaud Agricultural Society towards the expenses of its Spring show, held on the 26th and 27th September 1888, under the patronage of the Department of Agriculture.

5. No society located within twenty miles of any other society shall be entitled to participate in the vote unless the sum awarded and paid away in prizes by such society, as hereinbefore specified, amounts in the total to One hundred pounds at least.

Instructions.

1. The blank spaces in the declaration, form E, for the sums awarded and paid in prizes and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations, between the 1st January 1888 and the 31st December 1888, must be filled up in words as well as in figures, and the declaration must be made before a justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.

2. The account, when received, must be signed by the treasurer and be countersigned by the president, or the vice-president, or by two members of the committee of management. It should then be returned to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne.

3. Challenge cups must not be included in the return of prize moneys paid, unless such cups have been finally awarded.

NOTE.—The forms B, C, and D are forwarded herewith by way of guidance, but can be made use of at the option of the society. If, however, extra forms be required, the same must be furnished by the applicant, and be of uniform size and pattern.

Regulations for the distribution of the sum of Seven hundred and fifty pounds granted by Parliament to Horticultural Societies 1888-9.

1. That each society claiming to participate in the Grant shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st February 1889, a statement in the Form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the Form marked E.

2. The distribution of the vote will be made one month after the above-mentioned date, when a sum equal to the amount of the prize-money awarded and paid away will be allotted to each society having a claim, and be made payable to the treasurer thereof, provided that the sums claimed do not exceed in the whole Seven hundred and fifty pounds, and if they do exceed this amount then they will be reduced *pro rata*, and the allotment made accordingly.

3. No society whose expenditure in prizes between the 1st January 1888 and the 31st December 1888 amounts in the total to less than Fifty pounds shall be entitled to participate in the vote.

It may expedite the payment of the money to fill in at the top of the account the name of the nearest pay office in the space left blank for the purpose. It is necessary to bear in mind that, if that space be not filled up, the account will be payable at Melbourne only.

4. Challenge cups must not be included in the return of prize moneys paid, unless such cups have been finally awarded.

NOTE.—The forms B, C, and D are forwarded herewith by way of guidance, but can be made use of at the option of the society. If, however, extra forms be required, the same must be furnished by the applicant, and be of uniform size and pattern.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—
REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations made by the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust under the powers conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946.

REGULATIONS.

The Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, whose Waterworks District is contained and described in a proclamation dated the 29th day of December 1887, as the Town of Shepparton, has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, make the following regulations (that is to say):—

The rates hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of land and tenements shall pay in respect of the term of one year, from the 1st day of January to the 31st day of December 1889, in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rates to be payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year.

On every house or tenement of the annual value of Twenty pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during said year, the annual minimum sum of Twenty-five shillings.

On every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during said year, the sum of One shilling and twopence in the pound of such valuation.

2. The following shall be the charges payable in respect of water supplied by measure:—

(a.) Water supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic use or for the irrigation or watering of private gardens shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per thousand gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used for the above purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

(b.) For water supplied for manufacturing purposes, unless otherwise specified, One shilling per one thousand gallons.

(c.) For stand-pipe or hydrant, water for each load of Two hundred and fifty gallons or under, sixpence, and for each additional load *pro rata* upon the above scale.

(d.) Where water is supplied for domestic use, and is used to supply boilers for steam engines under ten horse-power, the charge shall be by special agreement, or at the rate of Twelve shillings and sixpence per horse-power per annum in addition to the charge for domestic use (except in cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power) in which case a charge by measurement shall be made.

(e.) For water supplied to cricket and bowling clubs, One shilling per thousand gallons.

(f.) For water supplied to gardens and nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per thousand gallons.

(g.) For water supplied to troughs in streets, Twenty shillings each per annum in addition to the charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

(h.) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where it is supplied by measure for domestic use, the watering or irrigation of private gardens, or for any other purpose whatsoever, shall be the quantity for which the return would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable upon the premises so supplied if supplied under the rating or otherwise than by measure.

4. All accounts for water supplied under special agreement or by measure shall be paid monthly or as may be agreed upon.

5. Where water is supplied for domestic use, except when paid for by meter or under special agreement, the supply shall be through separate service-pipes of the following diameter, according to the assessed value annually of the premises supplied, as follows:—

(1.) For premises assessed at or under £20 (£in.) half-inch pipe.

(2.) And more than £20 per annum to £100 (£in.) three-quarters of an inch pipe.

(3.) Over £100 per annum (1in.) one-inch pipe.

6. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carrier's stables, or for manufacturing purposes, or for irrigation (which shall mean any mechani-

cal or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants without labour) or for water power of fountains, fishponds, or for any ornamental or other purpose not provided in these regulations.

7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe, or alter, repair, or in any measure interfere with any pipe belonging to the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a license or authority in that behalf to execute such works.

8. No person shall be authorised or allowed to lay private service-pipes, and attach the same to any pipe of the Trust, or to any private service-pipe already connected with the pipes laid down by the Trust unless he can satisfy the Trust or their officer that he is competent to execute such work.

9. No private service whatsoever to be laid or extension made from one tenement to another by any authorised person unless he has ascertained at the office of the Trust that the person for whom such work is intended has duly signed the required form of application to the Trust, and has received the consent of the Trust to execute such work.

10. Before any private service is laid, extension made, or meter affixed and attached to the service-pipes laid by the Trust or otherwise to service-pipes already connected, each authorised person shall give twelve hours' notice of same, and shall, after each service or extension, &c., has been completed, report on the prescribed form the nature of the work done, and lodge the same at the office of the Trust within twenty-four hours of such service or extension, &c., being completed as aforesaid.

11. Each authorised person shall be held solely responsible to the Trust for each service-pipe being laid and completed by him in a sound, competent, workmanlike, and durable manner, and to remain in that condition (sound and watertight) for a period of three (3) months after each service has been completed.

12. Each authorised person shall be held solely responsible to the Trust for any injury occasioned by him from whatsoever cause to the service-pipes laid by the Trust, their street mains, or other property, or whilst attaching services to the pipes laid by the Trust, or to services already laid and connected with the Trust's water supply, and any loss of water sustained by the Trust through such injury, or its ascertained value, together with the cost of all and every repairs necessitated thereby, shall be refunded by such person to the Trust within twenty-four (24) hours after the time of such injury having occurred.

13. Every person, previous to being licensed or authorised to lay private services, shall read the specifications in the office of the Trust, and shall sign in witness thereof his name and address, and at the same time deposit the sum of Five pounds (£5) sterling as security for the strict observance and performance of the stipulations and conditions contained therein; and in case of the non-observance and non-performance of any of the stipulations and conditions aforesaid, the Trust may cancel such license or authority, and shall be entitled to declare such deposit to be absolutely forfeited as liquidated damages, and the name of such person may at once be struck off the roll of those authorised to lay private services, and the same may be published in any local paper.

14. Provided that the period of maintenance of private services laid has duly expired, deposits may be withdrawn at any time upon seven (7) days' notice in writing to that effect being previously given to the Secretary of the Trust, when the name or names of such parties withdrawing their deposits may be published as before described in a local paper; and the Trust reserves the right on their part to alter, cancel, and annul the term and nature of any license or authority to lay such services at any time.

15. The whole of the works herein referred to shall be carried out under the superintendence, and according to the direction, of the foreman of the works of the Trust; and any disputes between the various parties concerned as to the quality of work and labor done, or as to the exact meaning of the specification aforesaid, shall be referred to the Trust, whose decision in all cases shall be final and binding upon all parties.

16. *Quality of materials required in laying private services, viz.*—The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles, bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron, of British manufacture.

17. All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of same.

18. All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.

19. The whole of the tubes, tees, bends, &c., &c., to be perfectly new, sound, and free from all defects, and capable of standing hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet.

20. All delivery-cocks to be high pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern, to screw into elbows or bends, &c. All cocks to stand the same pressure as the tubes.

21. All meters required to be fixed on private ground to be of the best manufacture and pattern, and no meter to be provided and fixed by any person unless previously approved by foreman of works.

22. No service-pipes in private ground shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground less than ten (10) inches.

23. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission of the Trust, in writing, being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe-work, or engine the property of the Trust, shall be liable for such offence to the penalty hereinafter mentioned.

24. No person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust or service-pipes therefrom except according to the specification approved of by the Trust, and if necessary, subject to and under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Trust, nor shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of

the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust. Wrought-iron piping of approved quality only will be allowed to be fixed for internal services.

25. No service of a larger bore than one (1") inch will be permitted unless by special consent of the Trust.

26. Should any person allow any service-pipe or pipes conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person to remain defective or in want of repair after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe required repairing, the Trust may stop the water flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

27. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier or the owner shall in every instance in which damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, and in neglect to have such pipes repaired within twenty-four (24) hours after notice from the officers of the Trust, be liable to a penalty as hereinafter mentioned. The Trust shall have power, in default of such owner or occupier to have such repairs done, and to demand and recover by process of law from such owner and occupier all or any reasonable costs and charges the Trust may have incurred in laying all new service-pipes or in repairing or renewing any such service-pipes.

28. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty as hereinafter mentioned.

29. Any person who shall have agreed with the Trust for a supply of water by measure, or who shall be called upon by the Trust to affix a water-meter shall, at his own expense, provide such meter, and keep and maintain the same in good working order and condition, to the satisfaction of any officer or agent of the Trust; and in the event of any repairs being required, notice in writing shall be immediately given to the Trust, and the registration on the dial of the meter of the quantity of water supposed to have been used shall be taken before such meter is removed or such repairs are effected; and every person requiring to remove or alter the position of any meter shall give twelve (12) hours' notice to that effect to the Trust.

30. If any meter should cease registering, and during the time it is undergoing repairs, the Trust may estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous month or quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

31. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe, with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter shall be liable to a penalty as hereinafter mentioned.

32. No meter shall be affixed unless it is first approved by an officer of the Trust, and the dial of the same is capable of registering One million gallons (1,000,000).

33. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises to any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, or who shall allow any person to take and carry away the same, or who shall sell the water supplied by the Trust to any other person, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty as hereinafter specified.

34. Any person not having agreed with the Trust for a supply taking or carrying water away from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe shall be liable to a penalty as hereinafter mentioned.

35. The officers of the Trust shall have power at all reasonable times to enter any house, building, or lands to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust by measure or otherwise, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water consumed or supplied, or preventing waste, and to inspect and examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or lands for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus, the property of the Trust; and if any person hinders any such officer from entering or making such inspection, or effecting such removal, he shall be liable to a penalty as hereinafter mentioned.

36. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes to be done anything in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or to do anything which under these regulations ought to be done for the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption or contamination of the water, or wilfully or negligently allows the water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as the cause or injury remains or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Trust.

37. The water supplied in the above-named district shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid and affixed, and being under and in accordance with the same regulations, and not otherwise.

38. In the construction of these regulations the word "Person" shall be deemed to, and extend to, and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole; the word "Officer" shall be deemed and be taken to mean an officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word "Trust" be deemed to mean the "Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust."

39. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of any of these regulations above contained and numbered, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five (£5) pounds for such breach, and in the case of a continuing breach to a penalty not exceeding One (£1) pound for every day such breach continues after notice of the offence from the Trust.

The foregoing regulation was made by the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, on the twenty-eighth day of November One

REGULATION No. 6.

(1.) A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling (except as hereinafter mentioned) on the annual value of all rateable property in the Yarrowonga urban district, to be supplied otherwise than by measure with water for domestic purposes, according to the valuation for the time being of all the lands and tenements comprised within the said urban district for the municipal rates of the Shire of Yarrowonga in Yarrowonga, is hereby made for the year commencing on the first day of January 1889, and ending on the thirty-first day of December 1889.

Provided that the sum of One pound shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated by the Trust within the urban district of Yarrowonga when the valuation of such house or tenement shall be under the sum of Twenty pounds per annum.

(2.) Such rate shall be due and payable on the first day of January and the first day of July 1889.

REGULATION No. 8.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Water Works Trust, the Waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, make the following Regulation, viz. :—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said urban district :—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, used either partly or wholly as a domicile, an amount of five per cent. per annum on the annual value of such property.

3. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, not being a domicile, an amount of Three and a half per cent. per annum on the annual value of such property. Provided that in any case the charge shall not be less than the sum of One pound.

4. For every water-trough One pound per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs shall be 8,000 gallons.

5. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows :—

Exceeding one quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum 16,000 gallons.

Exceeding half an acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum 24,000 gallons.

For every additional acre and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

In livery, carter's, and carrier's stables, supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses.

In open sheds used for the above purposes each space of five feet shall be charged for as a stall.

6. For water supplied to cricket and bowling clubs, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

7. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 4,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the first day of January 1889, and ending on the thirty-first day of December 1889, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the first of January and on the first of July 1889.

Such persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time approve of for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, and receive, and collect, and recover the said rate.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Exhibition of Flashing Light on Eddystone Point, East Coast, Tasmania.

With reference to the Preliminary Notice issued by this Board, dated March 7th 1888, it is hereby notified that on and after the first day of May 1889, from sunset to sunrise, a light will be exhibited from the Lighthouse which has been erected on Eddystone Point, the position and characteristics of which are as follows:—

The Eddystone Lighthouse is situated in latitude 40° 50' 40" S., longitude 148° 20' 50" E. (approximate).

The light will be 142 feet above the mean sea-level, and the bright part of it will be visible in clear weather, at the height of 10 feet, 17½ miles.

It is a First Order Dioptric Flashing Light, showing every half-minute bright triple flashes from N. 22° W. (which will clear the rocks off St. Helen's Point 1 mile) round easterly to S. 3° W., which will clear the Salamander Rock 1 mile, and Red sectors will show from S. 3° W. to S. 48° E. (covering the Salamander Rock, Eucalyptus Rock, and other dangers in that vicinity) and from N. 22° W. round S. to N. 14° E.

A red subsidiary light, placed 60 feet to the eastward of the tower, will also be exhibited at the same time, with a radius of 2½ miles, at a height of 15 feet above the mean sea-level. This will clear the Victoria Rocks 1½ miles.

1. Rifle Clubs may, on the recommendation of the Council of Defence, be established in such localities as may be authorized by the Governor in Council, provided that no Rifle Club shall be established within ten miles of any other Club.

3. Should the application to establish a Club be approved, the approval will be notified by an Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette*, whereupon the Club may be formed.

I, A. B., do swear that I will well and truly serve our Sovereign Lady the Queen in the Victorian Defence Force for a period of three years, or until sooner legally discharged, dismissed, or removed, and that I will oppose and resist Her Majesty's enemies and cause Her Majesty's peace to be kept and preserved whether employed upon land or at sea, and that I will prevent to the best of my power all offences against the same, and that while I continue to act in the same I will to the best of my skill and knowledge faithfully discharge my duty according to law.

And shall be engaged to serve with the Victorian Defence Forces in the event of a National emergency : provided that the members of the Mounted Rifles and Rifle Volunteers shall serve only in their own Battalions.

(a) Correspondence connected with finance—purchase of rifles, ammunition, and accoutrements—should be addressed to "*The Secretary of Defence, Treasury Gardens.*"

(b) Correspondence on all other subjects should be addressed to "The Officer in Charge of Rifle Clubs, Victoria Barracks."

6. The Captain shall maintain order and discipline among the members of the Club at all rifle practices and other meetings thereof, and shall be responsible for the proper carrying out of all orders and regulations that may be issued from time to time. When members of the Mounted Rifles or Rifle Volunteers are assembled for drill or rifle practice amongst themselves, the Senior Officer or Non-Commissioned Officer shall be in command and be responsible.

8. Captains of Clubs may, on application to the Secretary of Defence, be supplied with rifles, ammunition, and accoutrements for members of their Clubs who have taken and subscribed to the oath, and members of the Police Force who are honorary members, at the following rates :—

9. Members of Clubs will, during membership, be required to keep their arms and accoutrements in good order, and produce them when called on for inspection by the Commandant or other officer deputed by him. No member can part with his rifle during the first three years of his service except to another member of the Club or to the Club. At the end of three years' continuous service and compliance with the regulations for Rifle Clubs, the rifle and accoutrements shall become private property. This rule applies only to purchased Rifles.

10. Rifles, ammunition, and accoutrements supplied by Government will be delivered, carriage free, at any railway station named by the Captain or Secretary of the Club. The Captain or Secretary signing receipts for such or any other articles of Government property issued for the use of members of the Club

will be held responsible for their safe custody or proper distribution, and will issue no articles without obtaining the written receipt of the member to whom he issues them, and such receipt alone will absolve him from the responsibility for the said articles, which will then rest upon the member to whom they have been issued.

11. Every member who has been engaged, and has taken and subscribed the oath, will be entitled, if in uniform or carrying a rifle, to be conveyed to and from all musters, drills, parades, and rifle practices over the Victorian State Railways, in accordance with the regulations to be issued from time to time.

12. One hundred (100) rounds of ammunition will be issued free annually to the Club for every member who has been engaged and has taken and subscribed the oath, part of which ammunition is to be expended as follows:—10 rounds each at 300, 500, and 600 yards range, and 10 rounds volley firing at 400 yards, military positions, with scoring and targets as in the Militia. Details of this practice must be forwarded to the Officer in Charge of Rifle Clubs not later than the fifteenth day of July in each year. Members who fail to fire the prescribed number of rounds will not be supplied with free ammunition for the next financial year unless by the special authority of the Officer in Charge of Rifle Clubs.

13. On or before the fifteenth day of July in every year the Captain will forward to the Officer in Charge of Rifle Clubs a return showing—

- (a) The names of all members of the Club on the 30th June;
- (b) The number of M.-H. rifles in possession of the Club on the 30th June.

Printed forms for these returns will be supplied by the Officer in Charge of Rifle Clubs. No free ammunition will be supplied to any Club from which the above return has not been received.

14. The Captain or Secretary shall at once inform the Officer in Charge of Rifle Clubs of the death, departure from the district, or resignation of any member. Absence for a longer period than three months from the locality in which a Club is established shall mean departure from the district, and any member so absent except on leave obtained from the Officer in Charge of Rifle Clubs shall be liable to be struck off the strength of the Club to which he belongs, provided that any man on leaving the locality of his Club may, at his own request, made in writing to his Club Captain, be transferred to the Club nearest his intended place of residence should the Officer in Charge of Rifle Clubs approve and the latter Rifle Club elect him as a member. The latter clause will not apply to members of the Mounted Rifles or Rifle Volunteers, who can be transferred from one Club to another at the discretion of the Officer in Charge of Rifle Clubs.

15. In the event of any Club falling below its minimum establishment of active members, or of these rules being disregarded, all privileges accorded to such Club may be withdrawn temporarily or permanently.

16. Any one joining a Rifle Club must join that one situated nearest to his place of domicile, unless authority is granted by the Officer in Charge of Rifle Clubs for him to join another Club. No man shall join a Rifle Club situated at a greater distance than ten miles from his place of domicile without the sanction of the Officer in Charge of Rifle Clubs.

17. No man can on any pretence whatever join a Rifle Club whilst he is on the rolls of another Rifle Club.

18. Any member can resign by giving fourteen days' notice in writing to the Captain of his Club, and on such resignation being accepted by the Officer in Charge of Rifle Clubs, his name shall be removed from the list of members. In the case of members who are in possession of Government property, the same must be returned in good order before the resignation can be accepted.

No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Town of Ballarat East has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition was duly published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-third day of November 1888, and no counter petition has been received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth hereby subdivide the Town of Ballarat East into three separate Wards, the names and boundaries of which shall be as follow, that is to say:—

NORTH WARD.

Commencing at a point on the west boundary of the town, opposite the centre of Bridge street; thence north by the town boundary to its north-west angle; thence east by the said boundary to the north-east angle; thence south by the east boundary to a point on same where it is intersected by the Geelong and Ballarat Railway; thence by that railway line

westerly to a point on same where it is intersected by Humfray street; thence southerly by that street to its intersection with Victoria street; and thence westerly by Victoria and Bridge streets to the commencing point.

CENTRAL WARD.

Commencing at the intersection of Victoria street and Main street; thence easterly by Victoria street to its intersection with Humfray street; thence northerly by Humfray street to its intersection with the Geelong and Ballarat Railway; thence easterly by that railway to the eastern boundary of the town; thence south by the eastern boundary and west by the south boundary to a point on same where it is intersected by the Buninyong road; and thence northerly by that road and Main street to the commencing point.

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheat or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheat hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. 3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Botanic and Domain Gardens may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whom account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12. 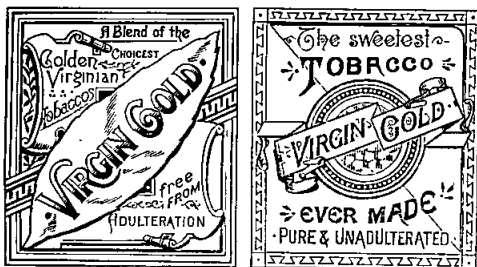
