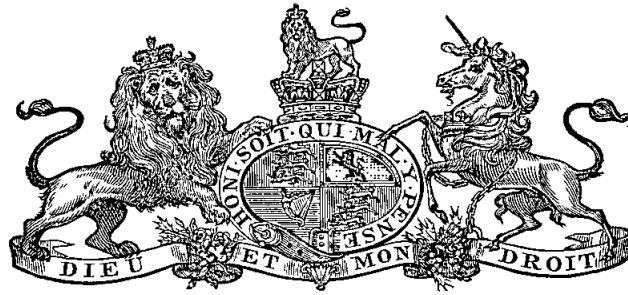

# VICTORIAN MILITARY FORCES.—REGULATIONS.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the third day

WHEREAS by *The Discipline Act 1870* it is provided that the Governor in Council may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order the following additions to the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces made on the third day of December 1888, that is to say:—

## PART III. MILITIA FORCES.—SECTION II. DISCIPLINE.

At the end of paragraph 13 add—

Any Officer of the Force who may proceed to England to undergo a course of military instruction may be classed as effective during his absence, and receive the pay of his rank during such period, provided that on his return to the colony he proves to the satisfaction of the Military Commandant that he has passed through useful courses of instruction. Pay will not, however, be granted in any such case for a longer period than a year and a half.

## PART IV. MOUNTED RIFLES.—SECTION IV. MEDICAL AND VETERINARY STAFF.

Add new paragraphs 4 and 5—

4. The Medical Officers will be required to give professional attendance to the Warrant and Non-Commissioned Officers permanently employed (together with their wives and families) who may be attached to the Corps at their several stations.

5. At any Military Station where the services of a Medical Officer of the Victorian Mounted Rifles are not available, the Officer commanding may, in case of emergency, make arrangements with a civil practitioner to carry out the duties required.

And the Honorable Sir James Lorimer, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The births of 1,344 children, viz., 687 boys and 657 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of April. In the month of March 1,438 births were registered, or 114 more than in the month under review. The births were 428 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 120 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in April numbered 982, viz., 523 of males and 459 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 362, or 37 per cent. The deaths exceeded those in March by 42, and exceeded the average of April during the previous ten years by 441. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, the excess over the average will be reduced to 259.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.07, and of deaths registered 2.24.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 87.9° on the 2nd, and the lowest was 37.2° on the 28th. The mean temperature of the month (60.5°) was slightly below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (30.5°) took place on the 22nd. The least range (3.7°) on the 8th. The mean daily range was 17.6°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.450 inches on the 27th, and the lowest was 29.501 inches on the 17th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.042 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 7 days, the amount of rainfall being 3.60 inches. The average rainfall in April during the previous ten years was 1.90 inches, or 1.70 inches less than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on 1 day during the month.

Males contributed 53 per cent., and females 47 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 41 per cent. to that mortality, as against 38 per cent. in 1888, 39 per cent. in 1887, 41 per cent. in 1886, 39 per cent. in 1885, 40 per cent. in 1884, 33 per cent. in 1883, 41 per cent. in 1882, 36 per cent. in 1881, and 40 per cent. in 1880, and 43 per cent. in 1879.

Fifty deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, three females, aged respectively 75, 75, and 80, died of diarrhoea; a laborer, aged 78, of dysentery; two females, aged respectively 77 and 86, of cancer; a bootmaker, aged 83, of phthisis; a female, aged 70, a gentleman, aged 78, a female, aged 82, a bootmaker, aged 84, and a female, aged 86, of apoplexy; a commission agent, aged 76, of paralysis; a laborer, aged 76, of insanity; two females, aged respectively 78 and 83, of cerebral disease; a female servant, aged 77, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 75, a female, aged 78, a laborer, aged 81, of pneumonia; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 77, of congestion of the lungs; a female, aged 78, of enteritis; a female, aged 75, of strangulated hernia; a laborer, aged 78, a carpenter and a female, each aged 81, of nephritis; a female, aged 78, of herpes; a weaver, aged 84, of compound fracture of the thigh, caused by his being accidentally run over by a cart; a farmer,

aged 79, of suffocation, a piece of meat having become impacted in his throat; a female, aged 75, a female, aged 76, a shoemaker, aged 79, a miner and two females, each aged 80, a glover, a gardener, and a female, each aged 81, two females, each aged 82, a female, aged 85, a female, aged 86, a master mariner, aged 87, a farmer and a gentleman, each aged 94, of old age.

Forty-nine deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 39 were set down to accident, 3 to homicide, and 7 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—An enginedriver, aged 18, died of injuries sustained by the explosion of a boiler; a porter, aged 24, of concussion of the brain, consequent on falling through a glass roof; a coach-trimmer, aged 34, of fracture of the skull, a wall having fallen on him; a coachmakers' apprentice, aged 16, of injuries sustained through falling from a lift; a seaman, aged 25, of injuries caused by a fall of stone; two laborers, each aged 30, of falls from scaffolds; a boy, aged 5, an ironmonger, aged 51, a messenger, aged 72, and a weaver, aged 84, of injuries resulting from their having been passed over by vehicles. A laborer, aged 30, and an engine-driver, aged 31, were killed by trains passing over them; a bailiff, aged 64, by a fall whilst intoxicated; a gardener, aged 53, by falling into a clay-pit. A farmer, aged 47, died of injuries to the foot; a master mariner, aged 68 of injuries to the thigh, how caused not stated; a letter-carrier, aged 19, and a clerk in the Exhibition, aged 29, of gunshot wounds; a girl, aged 12, of traumatic tetanus, how caused not stated; two infants, aged 1 and 2 years respectively, of scalds; a harness-maker, aged 33, a female, aged 53, a nurse, aged 59, and a laborer, aged 67, of burns; a boy, aged 5, of the effects of an irritant poison; a shot manufacturer, aged 52, of chronic lead poisoning. Two boys, aged respectively 8 and 11, a brass founder, aged 20, two males, of occupation unknown, aged respectively 35, and 45, a shipwright, aged 53, and a butcher, aged 65, were drowned. An infant, aged 2 days, was overlain; a farmer, aged 79, was suffocated by a piece of meat becoming impacted in his throat; an infant, aged 3 days, died of laceration of the oesophagus; and an infant, aged 7 days, of umbilical hæmorrhage. The homicidal deaths were those of a newly-born infant, who was suffocated; an infant, aged 21 days, who was found dead under suspicious circumstances, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case; and a female child, aged 2 years, who died of ill-treatment by her mother, a verdict of manslaughter being returned. The suicidal deaths were those of a male, of occupation unknown, aged 26, and a carpenter, aged 67, who shot themselves; a messenger, aged 47, who poisoned himself with arsenic; a female, aged 57, who poisoned herself with strychnine; a bricklayer, aged 72, who poisoned himself with sulphuric acid; a female servant, aged 18, who drowned herself; and a female, aged 24, who threw herself in front of a railway train.

One hundred and eighty-two deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—62 in the Melbourne Hospital, 24 in the Alfred Hospital, 19 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 17 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Lying-in-Hospital, 11 in the Immigrants' Home, 10 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Austin Hospital, 10 in the Melbourne Gaol, 6 in the Protestant Refuge, and 2 in the Eye and Ear Hospital.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 402, of which 204, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 198, or 49 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 253 were under one year of age, 85 were between one and two, 29 were between two and three, 18 were between three and four, and 17 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 580. Of these, 319, or 55 per cent., were males, and 261, or 45 per cent., were females; 37 were between five and ten, 16 were between ten and fifteen, 38 were between fifteen and twenty, 62 were between twenty and twenty-five, 74 were between twenty-five and thirty, 33 were between thirty and thirty-five, 31 were between thirty-five and forty, 32 were between forty and forty-five, 32 were between forty-five and fifty, 45 were between fifty and fifty-five, 39 were between fifty-five and sixty, 40 were between sixty and sixty-five, 34 were between sixty-five and seventy, 17 were between seventy and seventy-five, 21 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 29 were upwards of eighty.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

**BYE-LAW No. 75.**

**T**HE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*, do hereby make the following Bye-law, and all previous Bye-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

1. No person shall, either with or without any vehicle of any description, unless licensed by the Victorian Railways Commissioners in that behalf, come or be upon any railway station, land, pier, or premises vested in the Commissioners for the purpose of plying for hire, or touting or soliciting custom or hire, or for the purpose of removing passengers or their luggage for reward, or for the purpose of touting or soliciting custom for any licensed house, coffee palace, boarding-house, lodging-house, or house of accommodation for travellers, or for the purpose of removing passengers or their luggage who are or are about to become customers, guests, or lodgers of any licensed person, proprietor of any coffee palace, boarding-house keeper, lodging-house keeper, or keeper of any house of accommodation for travellers, unless by permission of the Station-master or Pier-master in charge of such station, land, pier, yard, or premises; and any person evading, or attempting to evade, or being guilty of a breach of this Bye-law, or refusing or neglecting to quit the premises of the Victorian Railways Commissioners when thereto required by an officer or servant of the Commissioners, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

2. The driver of every vehicle allowed to come within or stand for hire upon the premises of the Victorian Railways Commissioners must be constantly attendant on his conveyance, and shall not at any time be more than three yards distant from it; and such driver shall not tout or solicit custom or hire; and such driver shall obey the reasonable directions of the officers and servants of the Commissioners, and shall stand in the place directed by the Station-master or Pier-master (as the case may be). Any person guilty of a breach of this Bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

3. Any person driving any horse or horses attached to any vehicle through, into, or out of any railway station, yard, or premises of the Commissioners, except at a walking pace, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

### PUPIL SURVEYORS.

APPLICATIONS will be received, addressed to the Secretary to the Board of Examiners, up to Monday the 10th June next, from Candidates desirous of being appointed as Pupil Surveyors and Draughtsmen in connection with this department. Two vacancies.

### Conditions.

An applicant for appointment must be not more than twenty years or less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession. He will also be required to produce satisfactory evidence of having received a good general education, including a competent knowledge of euclid, algebra, and arithmetic, also a specimen of his plan drawing.

### Competitive Examination.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements, he will undergo a competitive examination on a date of which he will be duly notified—subjects, plane trigonometrical computation, plotting, and plan drawing—when the competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Board of Examiners will be recommended for appointment in the order of merit, subject to the regulations of the department as to probation.

### Term of Service.

The pupil's service in the department shall be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where he will be engaged in drawing and computing. He will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction of traverse surveys, also plotting from field-book and plan drawing. If his progress up to this time is not deemed satisfactory he will be liable to be dispensed with, but, if satisfactory, he will be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice.

Afterwards he will have the privilege of attending for two months at the Melbourne Observatory, where he will be instructed in such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary for the duties he may be called on to perform as a qualified surveyor.

He will be allowed to present himself at the next ensuing examination for land surveyors (without payment of fees), for the purpose of obtaining the formal certificate of the Board of Examiners as to his qualifications.

### Remuneration.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupillage:—1st year, £52; 2nd year, £58; 3rd year, £66; 4th year, £72.

### Subject to Regulations.

During the whole term of his pupillage and service in the department he shall be subject to the Regulations for the Public Service of Victoria dated 31st December 1884, or any subsequent substituted or additional regulations.

### Bonds required.

Each successful candidate for appointment as pupil surveyor and draughtsman will be required to find two approved sureties, who shall enter into bonds for £150 each for the faithful performance of his duties.

#### REGULATION No. 4.

A rate of Sixpence in the £ sterling is hereby made for the year 1889 on the municipal valuation of the rateable property which is described in the *Government Gazette*, dated twenty-ninth day of September 1882, and included in the area of the Avoca Water Trust, and which lands are not included in the urban districts of East and West Charlton.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by a proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, made in pursuance of *The Land Act 1869*, and bearing date the twenty-sixth day of June One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, it was declared that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove timber, which, at the height of two feet was of less diameter than eight inches, on or from the Crown lands not included in a state forest within a radius of ten miles from the Beaufort Post Office: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said proclamation: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said proclamation.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* it is amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything therein before contained, the Governor may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part VIII. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove timber, which, at a height of three feet from the surface of the ground, is of less diameter than fifteen inches, on or from the Crown lands situate within a radius of ten miles from the Beaufort Post Office, and not included in a state forest.—(89.O.15933.)

The contractor must pay the minister's fee for reading the burial service should it be claimed, and he will be reimbursed, on producing the minister's receipt, which must specify that the burial service was duly and properly performed, and that he received the fee for so doing; the receipt must also specify the name, age,

and denomination of deceased, the name and denomination of the minister who performed the burial service, and the hour when the service was performed.

8. The account is to be rendered monthly to the officer ordering the service for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne. The charge for the minister's fee should be included in the account for the funeral.

9. In the event of any charge of impropriety or neglect in conducting the funerals being established against the contractor, the Government may for the first offence deduct from the security money, by way of fine, £5; and for the second offence a similar amount, and, in addition thereto, may forthwith cancel the contract.

#### BOROUGH OF CRESWICK.

##### BYE-LAW No. 15.

*A Bye-law of the Borough of Creswick made under the 213th and 483rd sections of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 15, for the regulation and management of the Botanical Reserve and Park Lake.*

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the mayor, councillors, and burgesses of the Borough of Creswick order as follows:—

##### BOTANICAL RESERVE.

1. No person shall vend or otherwise dispose of any fruit, provisions, or refreshments of any kind in any part of the Botanical Reserve without first having obtained a licence or the consent of the Council from the Town Clerk: Provided that this clause shall not apply to the area known as the "Oval Enclosure" on days when it is let for sports or other public purposes.

2. No licensed vehicle shall be allowed to enter the Botanical Reserve or ply for hire therein.

3. No person shall disturb, damage, or destroy any trees, shrubs, plants, seats, or other property or thing within the Botanical Reserve under a penalty for each offence of any sum not exceeding Five pounds.

4. No person shall ride or drive over any part of the Botanical Reserve other than the portions set apart as carriage ways under a penalty of any sum not exceeding Two pounds.

##### PARK LAKE.

5. No boat or vessel of any description shall be permitted upon the water of the lake without the written permission of the Town Clerk; and the owner of any boat wishing to ply for hire with the same must first obtain a licence from the Town Clerk, which licence shall be in force for twelve months from the date of issue. Such licence to be renewed annually upon payment of the sum of Five shillings, if after inspection by an officer of the Council said boat is found to be fit for the conveyance of passengers.

6. Any boat plying for hire on the lake must have a name legibly painted upon it, and also the name of the owner, and the number of passengers which it is licensed to carry. Any infringement of this clause will render the owner liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

7. The Council may from time to time cause an inspection to be made of any boat, whether plying for hire upon the lake or otherwise; and if upon such inspection the Council shall be satisfied that any such boat is not in a seaworthy condition, they shall cause notice in writing to that effect to be given to the owner of any such boat; and if after such notice any such owner shall ply for hire with such boat while the same is unseaworthy, the Council may suspend for a certain time the licence for such boat; and if any boatman whose licence shall have been suspended shall ply for hire during such suspension, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Two pounds, to be recovered in a court of law.

8. No person shall act as boatman in any boat plying for hire on the lake without having a licence so to act from the Council signed by the Town Clerk, for which licence he shall pay an annual fee of Five shillings; and no boatman shall carry a greater number of passengers than his boat is registered to carry, under a penalty of One pound for each offence; and no boatman shall be allowed to let his boat to children of tender years without they are accompanied by their parents or other persons fit to take charge of a boat.

9. The licence of any boatman may be suspended or revoked by the Council upon proof of any infringement of this bye-law, or upon proof of such boatman having used any abusive or insulting language to any person wishing to hire a boat.

10. All dogs or poultry found in the lake or on the margin thereof shall be liable to be destroyed.

##### BATHING IN THE LAKE.

11. No person shall bathe in the lake after the hour of seven o'clock in the morning; nor shall any person over ten years of age bathe therein without wearing a suitable and proper screen.

12. If any person throw any sticks, stones, glass, or rubbish of any kind into the lake, or cause or suffer anything to enter therein which will pollute the water or otherwise damage the lake, such person shall for each offence forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

13. No person shall lay down any moorings or drive any stakes in the lake without the consent of the Council first had and obtained.

##### FISHING IN THE LAKE.

14. No person shall angle for fish during the months of May, June, July, August, and September in each year; and any person using a net for the purpose of taking fish shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds. No person shall be permitted to angle for fish in the lake on Sundays, nor shall boats be used on the lake on Sundays.

1. All shops within the Borough of Creswick (other than those mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act) shall be closed every Wednesday afternoon from 1 o'clock, except in any week wherein said shops have been or may be closed for a public holiday.

2. 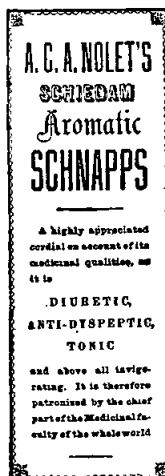
