**SPECIAL PLACE OF ANCHORAGE FOR FOREIGN SHIPS OF WAR IN TIME OF PEACE.—ADDITIONAL PORT REGULATION.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency Sir WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANÇOIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Passengers Harbors and Navigation Statute 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively and for the regulation of shipping in the said ports respectively and the protection and preservation of the same, and also for the due management of all public wharfs, and may appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; and any such limits, boundaries, rules and regulations may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed, and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the following to be an additional Port Regulation, and to be observed accordingly:—

**SPECIAL PLACE OF ANCHORAGE FOR FOREIGN SHIPS OF WAR IN TIME OF PEACE.**

The special anchorage in the colony of Victoria appointed for foreign ships of war is situated near the western entrance to the South Channel, Port Phillip Bay, and about six (6) cables to the westward of the chequered buoys on Nicholson's Knoll.

Foreign ships of war on entering the port of Port Phillip shall proceed to such anchorage, unless otherwise notified by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs.

Commanding officers in charge of foreign war ships who may be desirous of proceeding to any other anchorage in the colony of Victoria, are required to make application, in writing, to the Commissioner of Trade and Customs.

Foreign ships, whether of war or transport, will not be permitted to land armed parties. Unarmed parties may, however, be landed for drill or exercise upon permission being obtained from the Commissioner of Trade and Customs.

2. The purchases will be made in Madras, Calcutta, and Bombay, and at the various horse fairs and horse shows in India, by Remount Agents under the orders of the Director, Army Remount Department.

3. The Calcutta Landing and Remount Depot will be open for the reception of horses from the 1st October to the end of the purchasing season, and not from the 15th September. Purchasing to commence as soon after arrival of the shipment as the Remount Agent may direct.

4. Horses and mares of all breeds will be received, but they must be within the prescribed age, 4 to 6 years, except as regards country-breds; and in the case of Australian horses, 14 hands 3 inches to 16 hands high. It is to be distinctly understood that in regard to Class I. and III. remounts three years old and mares in foal will not be purchased.

5. Grays will not be purchased for horse or field artillery.

6. The average price for an Australian or Cape remount has been fixed at Rs. 650, which will be paid at the Indian port of purchase. ## PUBLIC HEALTH.—CITY OF PRAHRAN.

## BYE-LAW 37.

*A Bye-law of the Local Board of Health in and for the City of Prahran.*

**F**OR regulating the times and manner of cleansing, emptying, and manuring of earth-closets, privies, cesspools, and places for the deposit of nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, and for regulating the disinfecting or deodorizing of the nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter contained therein or removed therefrom, and for the prevention of nuisance or injury to health from the transport, deposit, or use as manure of nightsoil, offal, blood, or other offensive matter, and for the regulation of the position and manner of construction of privies, earth-closets, and cesspools, or urinals, and of foundations for buildings, and of the carriage of meat, made under the provisions of the *Public Health Acts 1835-1888*, and numbered ninety-seven.

The Local Board of Health in and for the City of Prahran, being the members of the municipal council thereof, doth hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

*Removal of House Refuse.*

1. The occupier of every house, building, or other tenement or premises within the City of Prahran shall cause to be provided and kept therein a box or other such covered receptacle, which receptacle shall be of such dimensions as that the same may, with the contents thereof when full, be readily and conveniently movable by the public scavenger for the purpose hereinafter mentioned, and shall cause all dust, ashes, rubbish, or other house refuse, produced, collected, or accumulated on any such premises to be from time to time placed in such box or receptacle, which box or receptacle shall be kept constantly covered, except at such times as the same may be or shall be opened for the deposit therein of dust, ashes, rubbish, or house refuse as aforesaid; and such box or receptacle shall be placed, at such times as are hereinafter mentioned in this bye-law, either in the yard of such tenement or premises and close to the entrance thereof, or otherwise in the adjoining street, lane, or right-of-way, contiguous to such premises, in order that the contents of such box or receptacle may be readily and conveniently discharged and removed by the public scavengers or other person or persons authorized or appointed to collect and remove the same by the Local Board of Health for the said city. The occupier of every house, building, or other tenement or premises within the said city shall cause the box or receptacle herebefore mentioned to be placed as aforesaid between the hours of 7 a.m. and 11.35 a.m. on the days set forth in the 1st schedule hereto.

*Removal of Yard Refuse.*

2. The occupier of any house, building, or other tenement or premises within the City of Prahran shall cause the yard or ground adjacent or belonging thereto to be kept in a cleanly condition, and so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, or other such refuse matter produced or accumulated on such premises, to be collected in one place in such yard or ground at a distance of not less than four feet from any street or tenement, and to be there kept in an unoffensive condition, and so as that the same shall not be productive of any nuisance, and shall cause all such refuse matter so collected to be from time to time removed from such yard, ground, or premises, as often as such refuse matter shall amount to a quantity equal to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such rubbish or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the Local Board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

*Stables, Cow-sheds, and Piggies.*

3. The occupier of any land within the City of Prahran, on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pig-sty, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health; and shall cause all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated therein, to be collected in one place in the yard of such premises at a distance of not less than four feet from any street or tenement, and to be there kept in an unoffensive condition, and so as not to be productive of any nuisance; and shall cause such dung, soil, or other manure to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so collected or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of any such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the Local Board of Health at the expense of such occupier.

*Cleansing of Privy Cesspools.*

4. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the city of Prahran shall cause every privy cesspool thereon to be emptied and cleansed from time to time, as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of six inches from the top of the wall, sides, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except by some nightman duly authorized or licensed as such by the local authority for the said city of Prahran; and that the contents of any privy cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m., and that any privy cesspool situate in any of the blocks of the city set forth in the second schedule hereto shall only be emptied upon the night set apart for such block, except by leave of an inspector of the Board; and provided also that the contents of any privy cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith a quantity of chloride of zinc, carbolic acid, common salt, or some other efficient deodorizer, sufficient to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same. No privy cesspool shall have connected therewith or attached thereto any pipe or other appliance capable of being used for the purpose of discharging or removing the contents of such cesspool upon or under the surface of any adjoining ground or into any drain or sewer.

5. No person shall place, deposit, or cause or suffer to be placed or deposited, in or on any street, road, right-of-way, lane, passage, or water-channel, or in any creek, river, or reservoir, or in any public place (not being a manure dépôt duly appointed by the Local Board of Health as a place for the deposit for such manure, rubbish, or other such refuse matter), any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, offal, manure, dung, or soil; and for the purposes of this bye-law any unsold or reserved public lands, other than any manure dépôt as aforesaid, shall be deemed and taken to be a public place as before mentioned.

6. If any person shall desire or intend to deposit, or cause or suffer to be deposited, on any land, field, farm, or garden within the City of Prahran, any blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing, he shall cause the same, before the removal thereof, to be deodorised and disinfected by the admixture therewith of carbolic acid in the proportion of one part of the latter to two parts of the former of bulk, and previously notify his intention so to deposit the same to the Inspector of the Board.

*Noxious and Offensive Trades.*

7. The occupier of any premises within the City of Prahran used for the purposes of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatsoever shall cause all rubbish, filth, offal, bones, water, liquids, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom at least once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any effluvia; and if the occupier of any such premises shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any such offensive matter as aforesaid, such offensive matter may be removed by the Local Board of Health or their officers at the expense of such occupier.

*Removal Nightsoil, Offal, &c.*

8. No nightsoil, offal, fat, bones or blood shall be removed or carried through or along any street in the City of Prahran except in air-tight carts, and between the hours of eleven *post meridian* and five *ante meridian*.

*Removal of Manure, &c.*

9. No person removing manure, rubbish, or filth shall allow any cart containing the same to remain stationary in any street within the City of Prahran.

*Position and Construction of Privies, &c.*

10. No privy, earth-closet, or cesspool, and no urinal shall be placed or built in front of any dwelling or at a less distance than four feet from any public highway, or from the door or window of any dwelling, or from any lane or street of a width at any part thereof of sixteen feet or upwards, or from any street channel, or at a less distance than two feet from any partition fence.

11. Every privy, or earth-closet, shall be constructed of the dimensions and materials set forth in one or the other of the specifications in the 3rd schedule hereto, except in cases where the board shall otherwise order or direct.

12. Every cesspool or closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly rivetted and soldered, so as to be water-tight, with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet, and shall be of the form of the approved pattern lying at the City offices, Chapel street, Prahran.

13. No closet door or trap shall abut or open upon a street or lane exceeding 16 feet in width.

*Foundations of Buildings.*

14. Every person erected any new building within the City of Prahran shall upon receiving notice so to do from the said Local Board of Health of the said city, construct or lay such drains or pipes as may be prescribed by such notice, and, if so required to do by such notice as aforesaid, shall cover the surface of the ground upon which such building is to be erected with asphalt pavement of tar and stone screenings, according to the tenor of such notice, in such manner and so that the foundations of such building shall be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, and so that no water, soakage, or damp shall lodge there.

15. Whenever, in the opinion of the said Local Board of Health, it is necessary that any building or buildings within the said city shall be drained, the said Local Board may order that the owner of such building or buildings shall forthwith construct and lay down such drains or other means of drainage as shall be specified by such order; and the owner of such building or buildings shall, upon service of a copy of such order, construct and lay down such drains within the time limited by such order, and shall maintain the same in good order and condition.

*Carriage of Meat.*

16. No person shall convey in or through the city of Prahran any meat intended for consumption as human food except in a covered cart or wagon, with closed sides or curtains, in a cleanly condition, and so arranged and kept as that such cart or wagon, sides or curtains, shall be in a cleanly condition, and shall protect such meat from sunshine, dust, mud, or filth. And no person shall sit or lie upon any such meat.

*Penalties.*

17. Every person committing a breach of any one of the provisions contained in this bye-law, No. 37, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty or sum not exceeding Ten pounds, and not less than Five shillings; or, if such breach be a continuing act or default, shall forfeit and pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Five pounds, and not less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

## The 3rd Schedule.

## SPECIFICATIONS OF PRIVIES.

## No. 1.—Privy of Wood.

The inside dimensions in clear shall be 5 feet by 4 feet; the framing to be of clean hard wood, the studs 7 feet long 3 inches by 2 inches, all tenoned into the top and bottom plates, except the corner ones, which are to be 3 in. x 3 in. in sections, the bottom and top plates to be 3 in. x 3 in. and 3 in. x 2 in. in section respectively, mortised for the studs, secure the framing to No. 4 red gum blocks 4 in. x 4 in. in section set solid on the clay the tops of which shall be 3 inches above the surface of the land; form an opening in the back framing to receive a full-size portable cesspool, 2 feet long and 1 ft. 6 in. deep clear dimensions; cover the walls with 1-inch weatherboards, securely nailed to the studs, to lap at least 1 inch, and butt against proper angle stuffs 2½ inches wide and 1½ inches thick, all wrought; the floor joists to be hard wood, 4 in. x 2 in. in section, secured to the plate; the floor boards to be 1-inch clean Scotch deal, grooved and tongued, laid to close joints and nailed to the joists; the rafters to be Oregon, 4 ft. 1½ ft., ridge piece 7 inches deep, 1½ in. thick. The barge boards for gable ends to be 5½ inches deep, 1½ in. thick, chamfered on lower edges; cap the same with 1-inch deal, 4½ inches wide, so as to seal the joints of the iron or slate covering. Make and hang with 18-inch T hinges a common 1-inch deal ledged door, 5 ft. 9 in. long, 2 ft. 6 in. wide, fitted with a common size Norfolk latch, and a 4-in tower bolt on the inside. Make and hang at the back of the privy to enclose the cesspan a common ledged door out of 1-inch deal, 2 feet x 1 ft. 6 in., hung with 18-inch T hinges, and fitted with bolt, as before stated. Fix a deal ground around the said opening out of 1½ in. x 2½ in. deal, on which to hang the door, and stop the weatherboarding. Cover in the roof with corrugated iron or slates, secured with screws or nails to 1½ in. x 2½ in. deal battens; the ridge capping to be galvanized iron, 14 inches wide.

Fix a common seat in privy, with full side hole and cover, 20 inches wide, on proper bearers, out of 2½ in. x 1½ in. deal, and a common 1-inch deal riser, 20 inches deep.

## No. 2.—Privy of Brick.

Inside dimensions, 5 ft. x 4 ft.; walls of clean hard-burnt bricks 9 inches thick, 7 feet in height above the stone foundations, which is to be common rubble work 1 foot in thickness, set or built upon the solid clay; in all cases the stonework to be not less than 4 inches above the level of the surface of the land; the masonry and brickwork to be built in mortar made from Geelong or Waratah Bay lime and clean sharp sand, made up in proportion of two parts sand and one of lime. Before building the brickwork lay all round the walls of stone foundations a damp coarse compound of tar and clean sharp sand, half-inch in thickness, strike the joints of the brickwork on both sides, and twice lime-white the walls on the inside.

The particulars of the roof, covering, flooring, and joists, the ledged doors, seats, and riser is to be the same kind of material, also the same in dimensions as those of Class 1 in every respect, except the floor plates, which are to be of red gum, 3 inches x 1½ inches, bedded in mortar. The door frame is to be 5 inches x 3 inches scantling, secured to a stone sill out of clean bluestone 3 feet 3 inches long, 9 inches wide, 6 inches deep, clean hammer faced, the head to form a lintel out of deal 3 feet 3 inches long, 9 inches wide wrought. Fix ¾-inch deal stops all round the frame 6½ inches wide, beaded on outer edges. Make and fix a solid frame at back of closet, opening for portable cesspool out of 4½-inch x 3-inch deal, 2 feet x 1 foot 6 inches, clear dimensions, on which hang a ledged door, before described.

The foregoing bye-law No. 97 was duly made and passed by the Local Board of Health in and for the City of Prahran, upon this eighth day of April, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

## PUBLIC HEALTH.—BOROUGH OF RUTHERGLEN.

## BYE-LAW No. 1.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Borough of Rutherglen in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in the Public Health Acts 1865-1888, and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said Borough.

## Definitions.

4. In the construction and for the purposes of this bye-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—

“House” shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

“Cesspool” shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground; and “earth-closet” shall include a pan closet of any description.

“Street” shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

“Slaughter-yard” or “Slaughter-house” shall include an abattoir or any place whatever where slaughtering takes place.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word “person” shall include a corporation.

## Part I.—General Cleanliness.

5. The occupier of every house and premises shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all dust, filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be, once at least in every week, removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of any premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, occupation, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon, to be effectually deodorized and to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

7. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter in any street, road, lane, right-of-way, or place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health, or in any way contrary to the directions of the local board or officer of health.

8. No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

## Part II.—Disposal of House Refuse and Cleanliness in Towns, &amp;c.

9. Every occupier of a house or premises shall provide and keep thereon a box or some other covered receptacle for the temporary deposit of house refuse, which box or receptacle shall be of such dimensions as that the same may, with the contents thereof, when full, be readily and conveniently movable by one man, or so many such boxes or receptacles as may be necessary to contain all the house refuse produced or accumulated on such premises during one week, and shall cause all house refuse to be deposited as soon as conveniently may be in some such box or receptacle.

10. The occupier of any premises fronting, adjoining, or abutting on any street shall, once at least in every day before nine o'clock a.m., sweep and cleanse, or cause to be swept and cleansed, the footways and pavements adjoining such premises.

11. In order that the contents of every box or receptacle in or about any house or premises containing house refuse may be conveniently discharged and removed by the public scavengers or other person or persons authorized or appointed to remove the same by the municipality or the Local Board of Health, every occupier of such house or premises shall cause every such box or receptacle containing house refuse to be placed in the yard of such house or premises, and close to the entrance thereof, or in the street, lane, or right-of-way contiguous to such house or premises, between such hours as may be directed by the local board or inspector of nuisances.

12. The occupier of any land on which is erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pig-sty, or on which land is any building wherein any horse or other beast of draught or burden or any

cattle or swine are kept, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard, or once at least in every week should the quantity not amount, in that time, to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

13. Every occupier of a building or premises wherein or whereon any horse or other beast of draught or burden or any cattle or swine may be kept shall provide, in connexion with such building or premises, whenever required by the local board or officer of health, a suitable receptacle for dung, manure, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter which may from time to time be produced in the keeping of any such animal in such building or upon such premises, and cause such receptacle to be constructed so that the bottom or floor thereof shall not in any case be lower than the surface of the ground adjoining such receptacle, and in such a manner and of such materials and to be maintained at all times in such a condition as to prevent any effluvia therefrom, or any escape of the contents thereof, or any leakage therefrom, into the ground or into the wall of any building, and to be furnished with a suitable cover and, when not required to be open, to be kept properly covered.

14. He shall likewise provide in connexion with such building or premises, if required by the local board or officer of health, a sufficient drain constructed in such a manner and of such materials, and maintained at all times in such a condition, as effectually to convey all urine or liquid filth or refuse therefrom into a proper receptacle.

*Part III.—As to Earth-closets, &c.*

15. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the content whereof does not exceed three cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

16. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

17. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be water-tight and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet, and provided with a closely-fitted cover of pattern to be approved by the inspector of nuisances.

18. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

19. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, sulphate of iron, chloride of lime, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

20. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall once at least in every week empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

21. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

22. Where, in any municipality, any nightman is licensed by the municipal authorities, such nightman shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for the removal of night-soil therefrom, and no other person shall remove the same.

23. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and finally placed in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

24. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of 11 p.m. and 5 a.m., unless otherwise permitted by the local board (of which the proof shall lie on such person), or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person empty-

ing or causing to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed so soon as the same is emptied.

25. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any drain or sewer.

*Part IV.—Prevention of Pollution of Water.*

26. No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed, in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

27. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any water supplied, used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any such water.

28. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way or be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized, and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within twenty-four hours of notice given by the local board or by one of its officers.

*Part V.—Drainage of Buildings.*

29. Every person erecting, or causing to be erected, any new building shall cause the foundations thereof, and the ground over which such building is to be placed, to be rendered dry, sound, and well-drained, so that no water soakage or damp shall lodge there.

30. Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

*Part VI.—Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.*

31. Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of January in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of five shillings.

*Application for Registration as*

32. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary of the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

33. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle, shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board, or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or secretary of the said local board; and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order in writing, signed by the secretary and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling-place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent

person; and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

34. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

35. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

36. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

37. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business; nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

38. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

39. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit, or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

#### Part VII.—Steam Whistles.

40. No person shall use, cause to be used, or assist in using, any steam whistle at any factory or other establishment so as to be a nuisance to any person; and no person who occupies or has the management or control of any factory or other establishment shall suffer or permit any steam whistle to be used thereat so as to be a nuisance to any person.

#### Part VIII.—Penalties.

41. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

## PUBLIC HEALTH.—SHIRE OF RUTHERGLEN.

### BYE-LAW No. 1/89.

*For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, &c.; and for regulating management of earth-closets, privies, &c.; disinfecting and deodorizing night-soil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit, and for the registration and regulation of dairies, and for other purposes.*

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Rutherglen, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in *The Public Health Acts 1869-1888*, and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-Law No. 1/89, of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said shire shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connection therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the Local Board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said shire on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pigsty, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health; and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said Local Board at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement, within the said shire, shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom, except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied or cleansed, every earth-closet or privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering, so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

9. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed or permitted by the Local Board from time to time for the final reception of same.

10. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed, or deposited, or spread, or assisting in placing, or depositing, or spreading, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, blood, offal, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool or other place, shall first obtain the written permission of the secretary or the health officer, and shall, immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof, cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

11. The occupier of any premises within the shire used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated therein to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said Local Board at the expense of such occupier.

12. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered, so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

13. No closet door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

14. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall, on or before the first day of January in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in the manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the Local Board of Health, an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Five shillings (5s.).

15. Upon the receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary for the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

16. Every person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, shall cause every store or every milk shop in his occupation, or under his control or management, and every milk vessel used by him for containing milk for sale, to be kept thoroughly clean.

17. Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report in writing to the health officer the occurrence of any disease in any of his milch cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

18. If any person commit a breach of any of the foregoing sections of this bye-law, he shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued: Provided the justices, before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered, may order the whole, or part only (not being less than Five shillings), of such penalty to be paid.

And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board of Health have, or have not, taken advantage of such powers.

The foregoing bye-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Rutherglen (being the Municipal Council thereof) this second day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and confirmed this sixth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

WHEREAS by *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, from time to time, by proclamation, place under the temporary management and control of, or may absolutely vest in, any Waterworks Trust any public water reserve or any waterworks, stream, or reservoir, either on any Crown lands or begun, constructed, or provided for by moneys heretofore or hereafter voted by Parliament: Provided, however, that notice of intention to make such proclamation shall be advertised for a period of at least one month previously to the making thereof in the *Government Gazette* and in some newspaper generally circulating in the neighbourhood of the property to be vested by such proclamation: And whereas it is expedient to place under the temporary management and control of the undermentioned Waterworks Trust the Reserve hereinafter mentioned, notice of intention of which has been duly advertised: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do hereby place under the temporary management and control of the undermentioned Waterworks Trust the Water Reserve hereinafter referred to, that is to say:—

PUBLIC WATER RESERVE HEREBY PLACED UNDER THE TEMPORARY MANAGEMENT AND CONTROL OF THE BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD WATERWORKS TRUST.

DAYLESFORD.—One acre three roods twenty perches, county of Talbot, municipal district of Daylesford, being the land temporarily reserved, by Order of the 12th August 1867, as a site for Victorian Water Supply purposes, and described in the *Government Gazette* of the 20th August 1867, page 1543.—(89. W. 32806.)

## BARMAH COMMON.—REGULATIONS.

**H**IS Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the Barnmah Common.

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council, on the 1st May 1888, the managers of the Barnmah Common, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common:—

*Regulations.*

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within five miles of the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follows, and shall be payable quarterly in advance, on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, and the 1st day of October in every year:—For every horse, eight shillings (8s.) per annum; for every working bullock, ten shillings (10s.) per annum; for every head of other large cattle, five shillings (5s.) per annum; for every herd of small cattle, five shillings (5s.) per annum. Progeny, under six months old, of horses and horned cattle legally depasturing on the common, free.

3. All stock running on the common shall be mustered at the commencement of every quarter, and all stock not claimed at the time of mustering shall be liable to be impounded.

4. No person shall remove stock from the common without first giving notice to the herdsman of the intention so to do.

5. All stock placed on the common shall be branded with the owner's fire-brand, and no person shall use more than one particular brand.

6. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common, and should any animal thereon become so affected, the owner of such animal shall remove the same within twenty-four hours after receipt of notice in writing from the managers or herdsman so to do, and in the event of such owner neglecting or refusing to remove the animal affected as aforesaid, the managers or herdsman may cause such animal to be removed or destroyed at the owner's expense.

7. The managers shall not be responsible for the loss of or injury to stock legally depasturing on the common.

8. Bulls or entire horses shall not be permitted to depasture on the common without the consent in writing of the managers first obtained.

9. All stock trespassing on the common shall be liable to be impounded by the herdsman.

10. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bond fide* owner.

11. No person shall cut fences or otherwise wilfully damage any property belonging to the common.

12. No person shall place on the common stock without the brands thereof being duly registered, and the fees for grazing paid thereon.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

## CITY OF MELBOURNE.

Bye-law No. 96.

A Bye-law to make better Regulations for the Management of the Abattoirs of the City of Melbourne and for the Dues to be charged thereat.

1. *Bye-laws Nos. 41 and 46 repealed.*—By virtue of section 8 of Act No. 356 of the Parliament of Victoria, intituled "An Act to amend the laws relating to Abattoirs and the Slaughtering of Cattle," it is enacted by the council of the City of Melbourne, hereinafter called "the Council," that from and after the date of this bye-law coming into operation, bye-law numbered 41, intituled "A Bye-law for the regulation of the public abattoirs and for fixing the rates of dues for slaughtering to be charged therein," and bye-law numbered 46, intituled "A Bye-law to repeal Bye-law No. 43 of the council of the City of Melbourne, and to prescribe a decreased scale of rates of dues for slaughtering to be charged in the public abattoirs of the city," which were made and passed by the council, the former thereof on the first day of October 1860, and the latter thereof on the twenty-fourth day of February 1862, shall be and the same are hereby repealed. And in lieu of the provisions of the said bye-laws the public abattoirs erected and established by the council, and situate in that portion of the parish of Dounta Galla which is within and parcel of the city of Melbourne, shall be regulated, managed, and made use of, subject to and in accordance with the regulations following, that is to say—

## AS TO SUPERINTENDENCE.

2. *Superintendence.*—The land of the council held for abattoir purposes, and all buildings and structures thereon and appurtenances thereto (and which land, buildings, structures, and appurtenances are meant by and included in the word "establishment" where occurring in this bye-law) shall be under the charge, care, management, and direction of an inspector, with such one or more assistants as the council have appointed or shall appoint for that purpose.

3. *Inspector's Duties.*—Along with such other duties as the council shall assign to the inspector, it shall be especially his duty to carry out and enforce the regulations of the council for the management of the establishment as to cleanliness and otherwise. To examine all animals slaughtered at the establishment, and take action as prescribed by law with regard to any which he may find to be unfit for human food. To see that all animals awaiting slaughter be duly supplied with food and water, and that no ill-treatment or unnecessary cruelty be inflicted upon any such animal. To take care that good order and propriety in conduct and speech be observed throughout the establishment. To keep the register of names of slaughtermen permitted to work at the establishment. To report weekly, through the Town Clerk, as to the condition of the establishment, the work done thereat, and any breach of the regulations by any person employed or working there.

4. *Assistant Inspector.*—During absence of the inspector his duties shall devolve upon and be performed by the assistant or other person in the service of the council then in charge of the establishment, and such assistant or person shall for the time being have all the power, authority, and duty of the inspector.

## AS TO SLAUGHTERMEN.

5. *Slaughtermen.*—No person shall be permitted to commence or continue to work for any other person at the establishment as a slaughterman unless his name shall be entered in the register of slaughtermen kept by the inspector, and he shall have signed an undertaking to observe, comply with, and obey each and every of the rules of the establishment under pain (apart from any other penalty) of having his name expunged from the register of slaughtermen.

6. *Responsible Slaughtermen.*—In every compartment of the abattoirs in which slaughtering shall be carried on, one of the slaughtermen shall be especially responsible for the observance of the regulations of the establishment in such compartment. If the master, butcher, or employer be working in the compartment, he shall be the responsible person, and if not he must nominate and appoint one of the slaughtermen who is to be responsible, and must notify such appointment to the inspector. Such appointment, however, shall not absolve any other slaughterman from the consequences of wilful disregard or breach of the regulations.

## AS TO USE AND MANAGEMENT.

7. *Use and Management.*—The establishment shall be open and slaughtering shall be permitted therein on every day (Sunday excepted) from five o'clock in the morning until ten o'clock at night, and at no other time unless upon special occasions, and except upon such special conditions as may be prescribed in writing under the hand of the Town Clerk.

8. *Use on Payment of Dues.*—Every person who shall pay to the inspector the dues for slaughtering as hereinafter fixed, shall be entitled to the use for a reasonable time of such portion of the

establishment as shall be available and assigned to him for the purpose by the inspector.

9. *Repair of Damage.*—Every person using the establishment who shall do any breakage, injury, damage, or destruction thereto shall make good the same, and if he shall have so acted wantonly or maliciously he shall also upon conviction thereof forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

10. *Cattle to be reported.*—Every person who shall bring cattle to the establishment shall inform the inspector of the description and number thereof, and the inspector shall enter such information in a book to be kept by him for that purpose, and shall direct and indicate the portion of the establishment in which such cattle shall be placed, and such person shall place such cattle in no other part of the establishment than that so directed and indicated, and shall himself be responsible for the safety and proper sustenance thereof. He must also give notice to the inspector of his intention to commence slaughtering stock before he shall commence to slaughter same.

11. *Animals not to be ill-treated.*—No person shall ill-treat any animal or resort to unnecessary cruelty in slaughtering any animal at the establishment.

12. *Food and Water for Cattle.*—Every person who shall bring cattle to the establishment and keep the same there for more than one day shall provide the same with sufficient food and water.

13. *Compartments to be kept clean, &c.*—Every person, who shall have assigned to him for his special use any compartment of the establishment, shall at all times, while he shall use such compartment, keep the same, with the yards and appurtenances thereof, clean and free from offence, whether by accumulation of blood, filth, or otherwise, and shall as and whenever required by the inspector cleanse, scrape, limewash, or otherwise purify in such manner as shall be necessary, and as the inspector shall direct, the walls, doors, floors, or other portion of such compartment and the appurtenances thereof, which he shall be so accustomed and entitled to use, and he shall in all respects comply with the regulations for the management of the establishment.

14. *Pithing-pens to be cleansed.*—In every compartment of the establishment upon one or more head of large cattle which shall have been enclosed in the pithing-pen being killed, and before any other beast is driven into such pen, the responsible slaughterman must sweep or cause to be swept cleanly all the blood from such cattle into the blood-pit constructed to receive the same, and must put, or cause to be put, any refuse which shall have resulted from such slaughtering into the separate bin or receptacle provided for it.

15. *Sheep, &c., to be killed on frames.*—In any such compartment no small cattle, that is to say, no sheep, lamb, pig, or goat shall be slaughtered except with a knife and upon the frame provided for that purpose, and with a trough beneath such frame for reception of the blood of the animal slaughtered. And when such trough shall have become full, but not to overflowing, the responsible slaughterman shall call upon the labourer employed under the inspector to empty and replace the said trough.

16. *Compartments to be cleansed after use.*—After completion of slaughtering, and before leaving the compartment, the responsible slaughterman shall carefully cleanse or cause to be cleansed the portion of the establishment which he shall have been at work in, and shall leave the same in a state of cleanliness and order to the satisfaction of the inspector.

17. *Offal must be hung up.*—No offal which can be hung up shall be allowed to remain upon the floor of any pithing-pen or hanging-room; but all such offal, when produced, must be hung up upon the hooks provided for that purpose in the hanging-room or other portion of the compartment.

18. *Refuse not to be removed by users of the establishment.*—No refuse or offal other than such as shall be capable of being without sanitary objection used as or converted into human food shall be removed from the premises by any slaughterman or person permitted to use any portion of the premises.

19. *Dogs excluded.*—No dog shall be brought upon or allowed to remain upon the premises.

20. *Trespassers not to intrude.*—No person, unless registered as a slaughterman or having lawful business to transact at the establishment, shall intrude into it or remain therein.

21. *Penalty for misconduct.*—Any person who in any portion of the establishment shall be drunk, or shall be guilty of profane swearing or of foul or abusive language or of obscenity or indecency or who shall conduct himself riotously or create disturbance or who shall obstruct in the execution of his duty the inspector, his assistant, or other officer or person appointed by the council to conduct or aid in the good management of the establishment, or who shall neglect or refuse to comply with any lawful request of any such inspector, assistant, officer or person made in accordance with the provisions of this bye-law or of such regulations as shall for the time being be lawfully in force at the establishment, or shall deposit any blood, offal, filth, or refuse, matter upon any portion of the establishment or on any land or road abutting thereon, save in the pits, bins, or receptacles provided and appointed for reception of the same, shall for every such offence upon conviction thereof forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

22. *Dues for slaughtering.*—The slaughtering dues which shall be demanded, received and taken at the establishment by the inspector or other officer or person appointed for that purpose by the council shall be as follows—that is to say:—

A Regulation of the Town of Ballarat East, made under the 1st sub-division of Part Five to the Thirteenth Schedule to "The Local Government Act 1874," in force in the Town of Ballarat East, by virtue of a Bye-law numbered thirty-five (35) of the above-named town.

For prohibiting and restraining the use of combustible materials in the construction, alteration, repair, or removal of buildings, roofs, or chimneys, flues, smoke-vents, or stove-pipes, in the said division, called in common "chimneys."

For regulating the distance from any other building at which it shall be lawful to construct any building.

For regulating the distance from any class of building at which it shall be lawful to erect or construct a building for burning clay or other material.

For regulating the height, thickness, construction, or materials of any party walls of buildings adjoining each other, and the external walls and buildings of chimneys, and the materials for and the mode of enclosing the same.

For regulating the construction, materials, and enclosing by building or otherwise, by fireplaces, or furnaces to be used in the working of engines by steam or any mill, brewery, bake-house, or gaswork, or in any manufactory whatsoever, although a steam engine be not used therein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the town of Ballarat East make the Regulation following: Regulation No. 11:—

CHIMNEYS.

1. All chimneys to be built of brick or stone, to be plastered or parpotted inside, and breasted up square to ceiling, if inside the building, and no flue to be used for a smoke-flue which is less internal diameter in any section than 9 inches.

ROOF COVERINGS AND REPAIRS TO BUILDINGS.

2. All new roofs must be covered with slates, tiles, lead, or galvanized corrugated iron, and with iron or slate in replacing or repairing old roofs, on any building within ten (10) feet of an adjacent building.

DISTANCE FROM ANY OTHER BUILDING.

3. No wooden building shall be erected within 10 feet of another building, unless there be a wall of brick or stone not less than 9 inches thick between the buildings, and in all cases the roofing must be of iron or slate.

VERANDAHS TO BUILDINGS.

4. Part 1, Sub-division (1) Thirteenth Schedule of "The Local Government Act 1874," and Regulation No. 4, are in full force. The first part of Regulation No. 4 to be extended to Barkly street from Bridge street; from Bridge street up Victoria street as far as Queen street; in Humfray street from Victoria street to Rowe street; in Peel street from Grant street to Railway bridge.

DRAIN AND RAIN-WATER PIPES AND EAVE GUTTERS.

5. These must be so arranged and constructed as to prevent the water therefrom dropping on to, or running over, any public way; and all such drain pipes, rain-water pipes, and eave gutters are to be made of metal; and all drain pipes from private premises laid under footpaths to street channels must be of cast iron or hard burnt earthenware not less than 4 inches in diameter, and the pipes put down before the footpaths are asphalted or flagged, and all drains to be kept in good order and always in proper repair.

THE SURVEYOR.

6. The Building Surveyor referred to in these Regulations shall be the Town Surveyor to the Town Council for the time being. Building committee to consist of three members of the Town Council.

7. No person shall commence any building, or any addition or alteration, without delivering at the Building Surveyor's office a written notice thereof two days before commencing, and producing, if required by the Surveyor, plan and specification of such building, addition, or alteration; said plans to be subject to the approval of the Engineer and Building Committee.

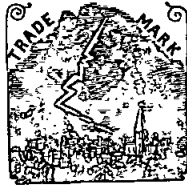

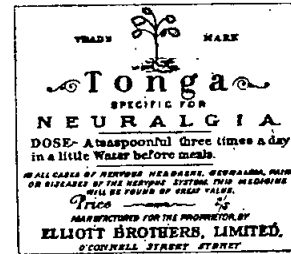
