2. The purchases will be made in Madras, Calcutta, and Bombay, and at the various horse fairs and horse shows in India, by Remount Agents under the orders of the Director, Army Remount Department.

3. The Calcutta Landing and Remount Depot will be open for the reception of horses from the 1st October to the end of the purchasing season, and not from the 15th September. Purchasing to commence as soon after arrival of the shipment as the Remount Agent may direct.

4. Horses and mares of all breeds will be received, but they must be within the prescribed age, 4 to 6 years, except as regards country-breds, and in the case of Australian horses, 14 hands 3 inches to 16 hands high. It is to be distinctly understood that in regard to Class I. and III. remounts three years old and mares in foal will not be purchased.

5. Greys will not be purchased for horse or field artillery.

6. The average price for an Australian or Cape remount has been fixed at Rs. 650, which will be paid at the Indian port of purchase. The average price for Arabs and Persians is Rs. 550, for other horses according to their merits; but every horse presented for purchase will be valued separately, and higher or lower prices may be given, provided that the averages fixed above are not exceeded.

An unsuccessful search has been made by the Commander of H.N.M. surveying vessel *Hydrograaf* for the Milton and Hastings Rocks, marked on the charts westward and southward of Bawean.

In consequence of this search the dangers have been removed from the charts.

MALACCA STRAIT.

II.—Particulars of Tanjong Krong light. Larut River entrance.

According to "Notice to Mariners" No. 94, H. O. Adm. London 1889, the following information has been received from Captain H. J. Carr, H.B.M.S. *Orion*, concerning the harbor light exhibited on Tanjong Krong, north side of Larut River entrance:—

The light (fixed red) is of the fifth order, visible through an arc of 90° , or from between the bearing of N. 10° E. to S. 80° E.; it is elevated 30 feet above high water, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of four miles.

The light is shown from a mast painted white.

Position on Adm. charts, lat. $4^{\circ} 48' 5''$ N., long. $100^{\circ} 30'$ E.

III.—Harbor light on Pulo Katta. Dinding Channel entrance.

Also, that a harbor light is now exhibited on Pulo Katta, southern entrance to Dinding Channel.

The light is a fixed light of the fifth order, showing white from the bearing of S. 56° E. to N. 35° E.; red from N. 35° E. to N. 55° W.; again white from N. 55° W. to S. 35° W.; and is obscured from S. 56° E. to S. 35° W.

The light, shown from a mast painted white, is elevated 114 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather, the white light from a distance of ten miles, the red light from a distance of five miles.

Position on Adm. charts, lat. $4^{\circ} 9' 10''$ N., long. $100^{\circ} 53' 30''$ E.

IV.—Proposed harbor light on shoal. Perak River entrance.

Also, that it is proposed to exhibit (probably in the year 1890) a harbor light from a lighthouse to be erected on a shoal about five miles northward of Perak River entrance.

The light will probably be a fixed light, with red and white sectors, elevated 37 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of eight miles.

The illuminating apparatus will be dioptric of the fourth order.

The lighthouse will be of iron frame work.

Approximate position as given, lat. $4^{\circ} 42'$ N., long. $100^{\circ} 44'$ E.

V.—Harbor light on Kuala Perak. Perak River entrance.

Also, that a harbor light is now exhibited on Kuala Perak, south side of Perak River entrance.

The light is a fixed light of the fifth order, showing red seaward from the bearing of N. 70° E. to S. 21° E.; white from S. 21° E. to S. 70° W.; it is obscured from S. 70° W. to 21° W.; and again shows white from N. 21° W. to N. 70° E.

The light, shown from a wooden trestle with mast, is elevated 50 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather, the white light from a distance of eight miles, the red light from a distance of four miles.

Position, lat. $3^{\circ} 59' 40''$ N., long. $100^{\circ} 45' 20''$ E.

The bearings are magnetic and are given from seaward.

REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF PILOTS TO THE PORT PHILLIP PILOT SERVICE.

WHEREAS by section 30 of *The Marine Board Act 1887* it is among other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Marine Board of Victoria may exercise the powers and shall perform the duties exercised and performed before the commencement of the said Act by the Pilot Board of Victoria: And whereas section 64 of *The Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865* provides, among other things, that the Pilot Board of Victoria may make and alter or repeal rules and regulations for the examination of persons as to their competency to act as pilots, and for the granting of certificates under the 62nd section of the said Act: Now therefore the said Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Administrator of the Government in Council, make the following regulations, that is to say:—

SEA PILOTS.

1. On a vacancy occurring for a sea pilot, the Marine Board shall, by public advertisement, invite applications for such vacancy, and, after duly considering the qualifications of each applicant, shall nominate one of the applicants to be a leadsman, who, when he shall have passed the examination hereinafter prescribed, be duly licensed as a sea pilot; provided that, if in the opinion of the Marine Board none of the applicants are suitable for the position of sea pilot, further applications shall be invited.

2. After the nomination of any person as a pilot for the sea service, he shall, prior to his being licensed, serve for a period of three (3) months as a leadsman, and shall make himself thoroughly acquainted with all the beacons, lights, buoys, headlands, &c., of the port of Port Phillip by proceeding up and down the pilot waters in ships arriving at and departing from the port; and at the expiration of such three months he shall be examined by a Board consisting of the Examiner in Pilotage and a senior pilot, to be in each case selected by the Marine Board, and three members of the Marine Board, and, if he passes such examination, the Marine Board shall thereupon grant him a license authorising him to pilot vessels having a draught of not exceeding seventeen (17) feet of water, and at the end of six (6) months from the date of such license the Board may grant to him a license to pilot vessels whose draught of water does not exceed twenty (20) feet, and at the expiration of a further period of six (6) months the Board may issue a license authorising the pilotage by him of all vessels without restriction.

3. Before any applicant is appointed to the office of sea pilot he must produce satisfactory certificates from a medical practitioner, to be nominated by the Marine Board, that he is physically qualified for the position.

HARBOR AND RIVER PILOTS.

4. On a vacancy occurring for a harbor and river pilot the Marine Board shall by public advertisement invite applications for such vacancy, and after duly considering the qualifications of each applicant shall nominate one of the applicants for such vacancy; provided, that if in the opinion of the Marine Board none of the applicants shall be considered suitable for the position of such pilot, further applications shall be invited.

5. An applicant on nomination to the position of harbor and river pilot, and before a license is issued to him, must serve under and regularly proceed with a duly licensed harbor and river pilot in the performance of his daily duty for a period of two (2) months, and produce certificates from the masters of vessels or such licensed pilot in support of such service.

6. Before any applicant is appointed as a harbor and river pilot he must produce a satisfactory certificate from a medical practitioner, to be nominated by the Marine Board, that he is physically qualified for the position.

7. These regulations shall come into force from and after the 1st day of June 1889.

8. These regulations may be cited as the "Regulations for the appointment of Pilots."

The foregoing regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board held this 23rd day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

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REGULATIONS FOR THE ISSUE OF CERTIFICATES OF SERVICE.

WHEREAS by section 40 of *The Marine Board Act 1887* it is among other things enacted that the Marine Board of Victoria, subject to the provisions of the said Act, may, from time to time, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make and alter regulations for regulating the issue of certificates of service to masters and mates, and for prescribing the fees to be paid thereon not exceeding the fees mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said Act: Now therefore the said Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Administrator of the Government in Council, make the following regulations, that is to say:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the "Regulations for the Issue of Certificates of Service."
2. All persons who may be desirous of obtaining a certificate of service under the provisions of the 45th section of *The Marine Board Act 1887*, shall make application therefor to the Marine Board of Victoria in the form of the First Schedule to these regulations.
3. Applicants for certificates must, with their applications, forward evidence to the satisfaction of the Marine Board that they have fulfilled the conditions specified in the said section.
4. Applicants must also produce evidence of good character and of their competency to serve in the grade for which they desire certificates.
5. The fees to be charged upon the issue of certificates of service shall be as follows:—For certificate as master, £2; for certificate as mate, £1.
6. These regulations shall come into force from the 1st June 1889.

The foregoing regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board, held this 17th day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

Tunic for Victorian and Field Artillery only, as in Royal Artillery, buttons excepted.

IN PART III., SECTION III., PARAGRAPH 13.

To clause (d.) *add*—

In case of men leaving the force by desertion, discharge, or dismissal, who have pay due to them, and who have in their possession or under their control clothing or property belonging to the corps to which they were attached, the Commandant will assemble a Board composed of three officers, who will assess the value of such clothing or property. On approval of the finding of this Board by Commandant, the value so determined will be deducted from the pay due, and paid into corps funds. The balance, if any, will, in the case of desertion, be paid into the Treasury; and, in the case of discharge or dismissal, to the man.

SWAN HILL PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS AND SCALE OF CHARGES.

THE subjoined Rules and Regulations and Scale of Charges, made by the Trustees of the Swan Hill Public Cemetery, have been submitted to His Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council pursuant to the provisions of sections 9 and 15 of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864* (27 Vict. No. 201).

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All the charges must be paid to the sexton when orders are given, or before the ground is broken, or a vault re-opened.
2. On application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery being made to the trustees, a certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the fees set forth in the schedule.
3. Charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was unable to pay, and that the relatives of the deceased were also too poor to pay the usual fees.

4. Order for interment to be given to the sexton on the previous day, when a form of instruction must be filled up and given to the sexton.

5. The sexton shall dig all ordinary graves, unless otherwise specially ordered, on payment of the proper fee. Parties requiring brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees, or any two of them.

6. The time fixed for the funeral must be the time the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

7. The usual hours for the performance of funerals shall be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. from September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other four months.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

9. Plan of every monument or headstone must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.

10. All persons destroying the fences, or in any manner injuring the cemetery will be prosecuted as the law directs.

11. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in or cemented, or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

12. A plan of the ground and a register will be kept, which may be examined on payment of the specified charges.

13. The ground will be open daily from sunrise to sunset.

14. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alteration from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.

15. No interments shall be less than six feet in depth for adults and children over seven years of age, nor less than four feet in depth for children under seven years of age.

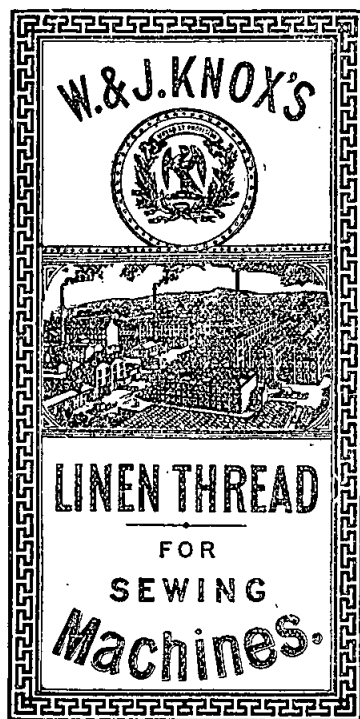

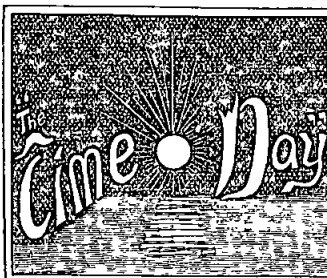

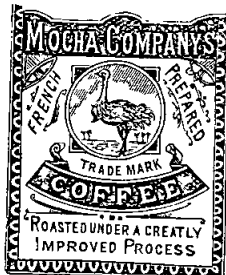
