Intended alteration of Savage Island light—Port of Akyab.

W. of a small coral patch with a depth of 3 feet, from which the same north-west extreme bears N. 50° E. distant 3½ cables. The coral patch is marked by a perch, but it must not be depended on.

The anchorage between Pulo Arang Arang and the main land, with depths of 7 to 9 fathoms, is about 1½ cables in width.

A stone pier is being constructed in connection with the railway on the main land, northward of Pulo Arang Arang, which, with an iron extension, will reach into 7 fathoms water.

Position on Adm. Chart, No. 355, lat. 2° 31' N., long. 101° 47' E.

To enter, the extremity of stone pier bearing N. E. by E. ½ E. leads just south of the outer buoy, northward of the inner buoy, and between Pulo Arang Arang and the main. Should the buoys and beacon be adrift, the north-west extreme of Pulo Arang Arang bearing E. N. E. will lead in one cable northward of the 3-feet coral patch.

High water full and change at Arang Arang (approximate) at 7^h, springs rise 10 feet; the flood stream sets to the eastward, the ebb stream to the westward.

The depths are given at low water spring tides. The bearings are magnetic.

III.—Buoys in the Harbour of Penang.

According to Straits Settlements Government Gazette, 8th March, 1889, the following buoys, not shown on the chart, lie in the harbour of Penang:—

1. A red buoy, indicating a telegraph cable, is moored in 4 fathoms water on the mark. Signal station—The Highlands and Harbour Mark in line, which direction makes an angle of 51° with the island Rat.

3. A green wreck buoy in 11 fathoms, on the bearing Fort Cornwallia, S. 65° W. distant 4½ cables.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Broadmeadows has requested that the streets herein-after mentioned be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands acquired or used for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situate in the Shire of Broadmeadows, to be Public Highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz. :-

"THE LUNACY AMENDMENT ACT 1888."—REGULATIONS FOR BOARDING OUT PATIENTS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-ninth day of July, 1889.

WHEREAS by Section 26 of *The Lunacy Amendment Act 1888* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations, which shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, for the boarding out of patients, and that such regulations shall prescribe, together with such other matters (if any) as the Governor in Council may consider necessary, the following:—

- (1) The class or classes of persons with whom patients may be placed to reside and board.
- (2) The distance from some asylum within which any house in which a patient is to reside must be situate.
- (3) The accommodation which every house in which any patient is to reside and board shall contain.
- (4) The general dietary scale which must be provided for patients.
- (5) The hours to be kept by patients in such houses.
- (6) The occupations to be permitted to be followed by patients.
- (7) The degree of liberty and absence (if any) from place of residence which may be allowed to patients.
- (8) The inspection to which all such houses shall be subject.
- (9) The scale of payment to be made for patients.

Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the same, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid make the regulations following, namely:—

1. *The class of persons (in these regulations called "guardians") with whom patients may be placed to reside and board.*—Guardians must be either the owners or sole tenants of the houses, and must reside in the houses in which patients are to be boarded; and, in all cases, guardians must be people of good repute who possess a certificate of respectability, good character, and fitness to be entrusted with the care of patients from a local magistrate or minister of religion who has known the person named in the certificate for a period of not less than six months immediately preceding the date of the certificate. In each case the person selected as a guardian shall be, if possible, of the same social position and of the same religious denomination as the patient.

Limitation as to patients.—Excepting with the written consent in each case of the Honorable the Chief Secretary, one patient only shall be boarded in the same house at the same time, and the same person shall not be guardian of more than one patient at the same time.

2. *The accommodation which every house in which any patient is to reside and board shall contain. The distance from an asylum within which such house must be, and the character of the site of such house.*—The house must be well drained and free from damp, with well ventilated rooms, and must be sufficiently commodious to provide for each patient a bedroom of not less cubical contents than 600 feet. Unless within 6 miles of a railway station, upon a line of railway, house must be within 30 miles of an asylum for the insane; and if within 6 miles of a railway station, on a line of railway, then must be within 100 miles of an asylum for the insane; and must be in a healthy and cheerful situation.

3. *Furniture.*—Each patient's bedroom must contain a comfortable single bed and suitable bed-clothes, sheets to be changed at least weekly, and such other furniture as the Inspecting Medical Officer shall from time to time require to be supplied.

Protection from fire.—No patient shall be allowed the possession of or use of matches or other combustible material; and candles and other artificial light shall be used by patients only under the immediate control of the guardian or some member of the guardian's family.

Clothing.—All clothing required by the patients, and not supplied by their friends, shall be supplied from an asylum, and shall be such as is usually worn by ordinary persons in the same social position as the patients.

4. *General dietary scale.*—The food must always be sufficient in quantity, of good quality, suitable description, and carefully cooked. Fermented liquors not allowed to patients, unless by direction of the medical officer. The patients shall take their meals along with their guardians, at the same table, and they shall be supplied with the same kind of food, unless the medical officer shall decide otherwise.

5. *The hours to be kept by patients.*—Patients shall be allowed eight hours for sleeping, and not be required to work longer than the Inspecting Medical Officer shall approve of. They are not to be allowed out after dark, unless for some special purpose and suitably attended.

6. *Occupations to be permitted to be followed by patients.*—Patients, subject to any directions which may from time to time be given by the Inspecting Medical Officer, are to be allowed and encouraged to employ themselves in any occupation or work for which their previous education or training may suit them; but care must be taken that they do not overtask themselves. If the patients should earn any money by their exertions this must be treated as the property of the patients, and the guardians should keep an account of this for the patient, and report the amount to the Inspecting Medical Officer at each visit by him.

7. *The degree of liberty and absence (if any) from the place of residence which may be allowed to patients.*—Outdoor exercise by patients should be, as much as possible, encouraged by guardians, but, unless approved by the Inspecting Medical Officer, patients should not be allowed to wander out of sight of their

guardian, unless in the care of some person approved by the guardian—but, so far as the safety of the patient will admit of, freedom from constraint should be permitted to the patient; and, with the written consent of the Inspecting Medical Officer, a patient may be allowed to be absent from residence for not longer than eight days at one time if the guardian is satisfied of the fitness of the person with whom the patient states his intention to reside during his or her absence from his or her guardian and of the reliance which may be placed upon the patient's statement. But in each case of absence from residence for longer than one day, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 7 p.m., the previous consent in writing of the Inspecting Medical Officer must be obtained.

8. *The inspection to which all such houses shall be subject.*—In addition to the inspection provided for in the Principal Act and the said *Lunacy Amendment Act 1888*, all such houses and the patients therein shall be visited and inspected at least once in every three calendar months by the superintendent of the asylum nearest to the house to be inspected, or by some medical practitioner in actual practice to be appointed by the Chief Secretary.

9. In each house a book to be called "The Inspector's Book" shall be kept by the guardian; in which the guardian shall enter—

- The name of the patient;
- The date of the reception of the patient;
- The asylum or receiving-house or other place from which the patient comes;
- The occurrence, and the date of the occurrence, of any physical ailment, of, or accident to the patient;
- The date and occasion of any absence of the patient;
- The date of each visit of the Inspecting Medical Officer;
- The date of the removal or death of patient during residence.

And in this book the Inspecting Medical Officer shall enter—

- The date of each visit made by him with his observations on the state of the house and condition of the patient, and any other observations he may think proper.

10. *The scale of payment to be made for patients.*—The scale of payment may vary, subject to the following condition, from per week to per week. The amount shall be fixed in each case by the Inspector of Asylums, subject in all cases in which the estate of the patient is under the control of the Master-in-Lunacy, or of any committee or guardian, to the approval of the Master-in-Lunacy. In determining the amount to be paid the following conditions shall be considered:—

- (a) The physical and mental condition of the patient as affecting the comfort of the guardian and guardian's family;
- (b) The amount of personal attention which the patient will require;
- (c) Any special diet which the Inspecting Medical Officer may certify to be necessary;
- (d) The ability of the patient to pay, where superior accommodation is desired by the friends of the patient, and the character of the accommodation which, in such case, it is proposed should be supplied.

11. *General duty of guardians towards patients.*—

- (a) The first duty of the guardian shall be to secure the safety, the comfort, and happiness of the patient.
- (b) The patients shall be treated as other members of the guardian's family are treated.
- (c) The patient shall receive the personal care and attention of the guardian.
- (d) Any indication of a suicidal tendency or extreme excitement shall be at once communicated to the superintendent of the nearest asylum for the insane.

12. *Termination of agreement with guardian and removal of patient.*—The guardian may terminate the agreement for the board of a patient by giving not less than fourteen days' notice in writing to the superintendent of the nearest asylum for the insane; or, in the case of a patient being unmanageable, the guardian may take the patient back to the asylum or receiving-house from which he or she came, after such reasonable notice as the circumstances of the case will admit of. In any case in which the superintendent of an asylum for the insane, or the Inspector of Asylums, shall consider, either upon the report of the Inspecting Medical Officer, or upon his own inspection, that any of these regulations are not duly observed by the guardian, or that the patient has ceased to be a fit subject to be boarded out, the superintendent of an asylum for the insane or the Inspector of Asylums may remove, or may order the removal of such patient either after such reasonable notice as in each case such superintendent or inspector shall think proper, or without notice if the superintendent or inspector be of opinion that an immediate removal is necessary. In the event of such removal being upon the ground of a breach of the regulations, then no payment beyond the last day of the preceding week's board shall be paid, but in the event of removal for any other cause, then one week's board in addition to the week's board in which the patient is removed shall be paid to the guardian.

13. *Moneys and property of patient.*—Upon the removal of any patient the guardian shall hand over to the superintendent of the nearest asylum for the insane, or to the Master-in-Lunacy, any property of the patient in his or her possession or care, including any moneys which the patient may have earned during residence with the guardian.

14. *Notice of death, escape, and recapture of patients.*—In the event of the death, escape, or after escape, of recapture of any patient, the guardian shall, without delay, give notice in writing of such death, escape, or recapture to the Inspecting Medical Officer, to the Inspector of Asylums, and to the Master-in-Lunacy.

15. *Interpretations.*—The term "The Inspecting Medical Officer," when used in these regulations, shall include the Inspector of Asylums for the Insane (in these regulations called "The Inspector of Asylums"), the superintendent of the nearest asylum for the insane, and any medical practitioner appointed by the Chief Secretary to inspect houses in which patients are boarded out.

**"THE LUNACY AMENDMENT ACT 1888."—REGULATIONS FOR CARE AND
TREATMENT OF PAYING PATIENTS.**

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-ninth day of July, 1889.

WHEREAS by section 29 of *The Lunacy Amendment Act 1888* it is provided that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations for the establishment and regulation of cottages or other separate accommodation for the reception, care, and treatment of paying patients, and that such regulations shall prescribe certain things in the said section specified, together with such other matters as the Governor in Council deems necessary: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations (that is to say) :—

1. In these regulations—

"Patient" shall have the same meaning as that assigned to it by section 3 of the *Lunacy Statute*; and Interpretation of the expression "paying patient" shall have the same meaning as that assigned to it by section 3 of *The Lunacy Amendment Act 1888*.

2. All cottages and other buildings erected or set apart for the reception, care, and treatment of paying patients shall be situated within the grounds or domain of attached or adjacent to some public lunatic asylum, and shall be deemed for all purposes to be a part of the lunatic asylum within the grounds or domain of which they are respectively situated, and shall also be deemed to be receiving houses within the meaning of the said last-mentioned Act: And all the provisions of any Act or Acts for the time being in force relating to lunatics shall apply to paying patients detained in any such cottage or other building.

3. Every cottage intended for the reception of one paying patient only and the necessary attendants shall contain the following accommodation, viz.:—

Accommodation to
be provided in
single-patient
cottages.

One patient's bedroom.
One patient's sittingroom.
One spare room for use as a "single room" for the purpose of the seclusion of the patient should he or she become dangerous or violent.
One room for the accommodation of two attendants.
One bathroom for the patient.
One scullery.
One storeroom.
One earth-closet.
Suitable kitchen accommodation.
Attached to each such cottage shall be a suitable piece of ground for a garden bounded on the outside by a fence.

4. Every cottage for the reception of more than one paying patient shall contain—

Accommodation to
be provided in
cottages for more
than one patient.

In the dormitory or dormitories at least one thousand cubic feet of space for each person sleeping therein, and in the sitting or day room a space of four hundred and eighty cubic feet for each patient residing in such cottage.
One room for the accommodation of each two attendants.
One bathroom, with dressingroom attached.
One earth-closet for every seven patients residing in such cottage.
Suitable kitchen accommodation.
Attached to each such cottage shall be a suitable piece of ground for a garden bounded on the outside by a fence.

5. Not more than fourteen paying patients shall be placed in any one cottage.

Maximum number

in one cottage.

6. When the separate accommodation for paying patients is provided in a building other than a cottage, the accommodation to be provided for each paying patient shall be as follows :—

Accommodation to

In the dormitory or dormitories there shall be at least one thousand cubic feet of space for each person sleeping therein, and in the corridor or rooms used by the patients during the day four hundred and eighty cubic feet of space for each patient residing in such building.

7. The payment to be made for the separate accommodation of paying patients shall vary in accordance with the accommodation provided, and shall in each case be fixed by the Inspector of Asylums, Hospitals, and Licensed Houses, after conferring with the Master-in-Lunacy, but shall in no case be less than One pound per week.

8. The daily rations to be supplied to each paying patient shall, subject to modification in the case of any particular patient by order of the Medical Superintendent, be as follows :—

General dietary
scale.

16 ounces of bread,
2 ounces of butter,
½ ounce of tea,
4 ounces of sugar,
2 gills of milk,
16 ounces of meat,
16 ounces of vegetables,
1 ounce of cheese,
1 ounce of rice,
1 ounce of coffee,
2 ounces of flour.

Also pepper, salt, mustard, and vinegar, as required, together with any extras which the Medical Superintendent in charge may consider necessary, and think fit to order.

9. Paying patients shall not be required to rise from their beds before the hour of six in the morning, nor to go to bed before the hour of nine in the evening, unless the Medical Superintendent in charge specially order otherwise.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All fees must be paid to the secretary of the trustees before the ground is opened.
2. The charge will be remitted for the burial of any poor person on evidence being produced to the trustees that the friends of such person are not able to pay such fees.
3. The name, age, late place of residence, and religious denomination, and date of death of deceased, with cause of death, must be stated at the giving of order for burial.
4. On application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument or fence in the cemetery being made to the trustees, a certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the fees set forth in the scale following. (See Miscellaneous Charges.)
5. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences are to be kept in repair at the expense of the owner.
6. Every coffin in a vault shall be bricked in or cemented, or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
7. The friends of the deceased must cause all graves to be dug, and erect all monuments, tombs, or fences under the direction of the trustees or such persons as they may appoint.
8. Graves shall be not less than 6 feet deep.
9. No vehicle will be allowed to enter the cemetery without permission.
10. The hours for interment shall be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. during the other months of the year, with the exception of Sundays, when the hours shall be from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.
11. All material required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery. Stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after the work is completed shall be removed at once by the person employed on the work.
12. The trustees reserve the right of making any alterations from time to time in their regulations, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF ROTHWELL.

BY-LAW, No. 57.

FOR NAMING STREETS AND NUMBERING HOUSES.

A By-law of the town of Geelong, made under Section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 57, for the purpose of adopting Sections 8, 9, 10, 11 of Subdivision 2 of Part I of Schedule No. 13 of the said Act.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the mayor, aldermen, councillors, and burgesses of the town of Geelong order as follows:—

That sections 8, 9, 10, 11 of Part I of the said schedule No. 13 be adopted, viz:—

(2) Naming Streets and Numbering Houses.

8. Names of streets.—It shall be lawful for the council, from time to time, to cause to be painted or affixed on a conspicuous part of some house or building at or near each end corner or entrance of every street, and in the direction of the line of such street, the name of such street in legible characters, not exceeding three inches in length and proportionately broad and near to each other, and the Council may, where more than one street or road in the municipal district is called by the same name, alter the name of any or all of such streets or roads save one (to be described in the order altering the same) to any other name which to the Council may seem fit; and before any name is given to any new street or road notice of the intended name shall be given to the council, and if there be any street or road in the municipal district called or about to be called by the same name, the council may by notice stating that there is already a street or road in the municipal district called or about to be called by the same name, and describing the locality thereof, given to the person by whom notice of such intended name was given to them, at any time within fourteen days of the receipt of such last-mentioned notice, object to such intended name; and it shall not be lawful to set up any name to any street or road until the expiration of fourteen days after notice thereof has been given as aforesaid to the Council, or to set up any name objected to as aforesaid.

9. Numbering, &c. of houses.—The owners or occupiers of houses or buildings shall mark such houses or buildings with such numbers and names, for the purpose of distinguishing the same, as the council shall direct or approve, and shall renew the numbers or names of such houses or buildings as often as they are obliterated or defaced; and if any occupier of any such house or building neglect for one week after notice from the council to mark such house or building with such number or name as the council may direct or approve, or to renew the number or name thereof as aforesaid, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings; and the Council may cause such name or number to be so marked or renewed, and recover the expense thereof from the owner of such house or building before any justice.

10. Malicious injury to name or number.—If any person wilfully and maliciously destroys, pulls down, obliterates or defaces the name of any street or road, or the name or number of any house or building, or paints, affixes, or sets up any name to any street or road, or any name or number to any house or building, contrary to this subdivision, he shall for every such offence forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds; and it shall be lawful for the Council to cause such name or number so unlawfully painted, affixed, or set up, to be obliterated or destroyed.

11. Register of alterations.—The Council shall cause to be kept a register of all alterations made by them in the names of streets and roads, and such register shall be kept in such form as to show the date of every such alteration, and the name of every street or road previous to such alteration, and the new name thereof.

By-law 21.—The paragraph "admit and discharge inmates," to read "to consider the admission or discharge of inmates."

By-law 24.—At the end of the first paragraph, after the word "meeting," and shall find satisfactory security to the amount of One hundred pounds; after the word "secretary" in the last paragraph, insert "if honorary."

By-law 25 cancelled, and the following to take its place:—

25. Collector.—It shall be the collector's duty to canvass and obtain contributions for the asylum. He shall give a receipt for every sum he receives, and keep a counterpart of such receipt. He shall hand over to the treasurer weekly all moneys collected by him, and at the same time produce his receipt book for inspection, and shall find satisfactory security to the amount of £200.

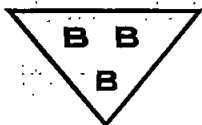
