DECLARATION BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENTS OF GREAT BRITAIN AND FRANCE WITH REFERENCE TO PROCEEDS OF WRECKS.

THE following correspondence respecting a Declaration between the Governments of Great Britain and France with reference to the proceeds of wrecks, and notifying the accession of this colony to that Declaration, is published for general information.

Sir,—I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the colony under your Government, a copy of a Declaration between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the Government of the French Republic, signed at Paris on the 23rd of October, 1889, with reference to the disposal of the proceeds of wrecks on their respective coasts.

I have to call your attention to Article VI. of the Declaration, from which you will observe that, if it is desired that the stipulations of the Declaration should be made applicable to the colony under your Government, notice to that effect must be given by Her Britannic Majesty's Representative to the French Republic within one year from the 23rd of October, the date of the signature of the Declaration.

I have, therefore, to request that you will be good enough to acquaint me as soon as possible of the wishes of your Government in the matter.

DECLARATION BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND IRELAND AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE FRENCH REPUBLIC WITH REFERENCE TO THE DISPOSAL OF THE PROCEEDS OF WRECKS ON THEIR RESPECTIVE COASTS.

The Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and the Government of the French Republic, desiring to regulate by a new agreement questions relative to the disposal of the proceeds of wrecks on the coasts of the two States, have agreed to replace the Declaration signed at London on the 16th June, 1879, by the following arrangements:—

ARTICLE I.

When any ship belonging to the subjects of one of the two contracting States is wrecked or stranded on the coast of the other, the competent local authorities shall, with as little delay as possible, bring the fact to the knowledge of the Consul-General, Consul, Vice-Consul, or Consular Agent nearest to the spot where the wreck or stranding has taken place.

ARTICLE II.

All operations relative to the salvage of British ships which may be wrecked or stranded on the coasts of France shall be directed by the Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, or Consular Agents of Great Britain, and, reciprocally, the French Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, and Consular Agents shall direct all operations relative to the salvage of ships of their nation wrecked or stranded on the coasts of Great Britain.

Le Gouvernement de Sa Majesté la Reine du Royaume-Uni de la Grande-Bretagne et d'Irlande, Impératrice des Indes, et le Gouvernement de la République Française, désirant régler par un nouvel accord les questions relatives à la liquidation des sauvetages sur les côtes des deux Etats, sont convenus de remplacer la Déclaration échangée à Londres le 16 Juin, 1879, par les dispositions suivantes:—

ARTICLE I.

Lorsqu'un navire quelconque appartenant aux sujets de l'un des deux Etats Contractants fera naufrage ou échouera sur le littoral de l'autre, les autorités locales compétentes devront, dans le plus bref délai possible, porter le fait à la connaissance du Consul-Général, Consul, Vice-Consul, ou Agent Consulaire le plus rapproché du lieu de l'accident.

ARTICLE II.

Toutes les opérations relatives au sauvetage des navires Anglais qui naufrageraient ou échoueraient sur les côtes de France seront dirigées par les Consuls-Généraux, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, ou Agents Consulaires de la Grande-Bretagne, et réciproquement, les Consuls-Généraux, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, et Agents Consulaires Français dirigeront les opérations relatives au sauvetage des navires de leur nation naufragés ou échoués sur les côtes de la Grande-Bretagne.

ARTICLE III.

If the owners of the ship and cargo, or their duly authorized representatives, shall be present and shall claim it, the Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, and Consular Agents shall hand over to them the conduct of the salvage operations after requiring the deposit of the ship's papers, as well as the reimbursement of the expenses already defrayed, and a sufficient guarantee for those incurred before the operations were handed over, and which may not have been already settled.

ARTICLE IV.

The intervention of the local authorities shall only take place in the two countries for the purpose of assisting the Consular authority, of maintaining order, of securing the interests of the salvors if they are strangers to the shipwrecked crews, and of assuring the due execution of the arrangements to be carried out for the entry and departure of the merchandise saved.

In the absence, and until the arrival of the Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, or Consular Agents, the local authorities shall, moreover, take all necessary measures for the protection of the persons, and for the preservation of the articles which shall have been saved from the wreck.

This intervention shall not give rise to any charges, with the exception of those which the salvage operations and the protection of the articles saved shall have rendered necessary, and those to which national ships would, under similar circumstances, be liable. These charges shall be paid according to the circumstances of the case, either by the agents of the Consular service, or by their owners or their proxies.

In case absence, sickness, or any other cause should prevent the agents of the Consular service from seeing to the operations and the management of the salvage, the local authorities who may be charged with the operations and management in question shall be bound to remit to the aforesaid agents the ship's papers and the net proceeds of the ship and the cargo.

ARTICLE V.

The merchandise and articles saved shall not be liable to any customs duties, unless they are intended for home consumption, in which case they shall pay the same duties as they would have had to pay if they had been imported in national vessels.

ARTICLE VI.

The stipulations of the present Declaration shall be applicable to all the colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, excepting to those hereinafter named, that is to say, except to :—

India.
The Dominion of Canada.
Newfoundland.
The Cape.
Natal.
New South Wales.
Victoria.
Queensland.
Tasmania.
South Australia.
Western Australia.
New Zealand.

Provided always that the stipulations of the present Declaration shall be made applicable to any of the above-named colonies or foreign possessions on whose behalf notice to that effect shall have been given by Her Britannic Majesty's Representative to the French Republic within one year from the date of the signature of the present Declaration.

The stipulations of the present Declaration shall be applicable to all the colonies and foreign possessions of France.

ARTICLE VII.

The present Declaration shall come into operation three months after the date of its signature, and shall remain in force until the expiration of one year from the day on which either party may give notice of its intention to terminate it.

In witness whereof, the undersigned Plenipotentiaries, His Excellency the Earl of Lytton, Ambassador of Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and His Excellency M. Eugène Spuller, Minister for Foreign Affairs, have signed the present Declaration, and have affixed thereto their seals.

My Lord,—With reference to your Lordship's Despatch, No. 54 of 30th April, I have the honour to state to your Lordship, for the information of your Government, that the notification of the accession of the colony under your Government to the Declaration with France respecting the disposal of the proceeds of wrecks, of the 23rd of October last, has been formally made to the French Government, and notified in the *Journal Officiel*, under date 1st August, 1890.

ARTICLE III.

Quand les propriétaires du navire ou de la cargaison, ou leurs représentants dûment autorisés, seront présents et le réclameront, les Consuls-Généraux, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, et Agents Consulaires devront leur remettre la conduite des opérations de sauvetage en exigeant le dépôt des papiers de bord, ainsi que le remboursement des frais déjà faits et une garantie suffisante pour les dépenses engagées avant la remise et non encore liquidées.

ARTICLE IV.

L'intervention des autorités locales n'aura lieu dans les deux pays que pour assister l'autorité Consulaire, maintenir l'ordre, garantir les intérêts des sauveteurs s'ils sont étrangers aux équipages naufragés, et assurer l'exécution des dispositions à observer pour l'entrée et la sortie des marchandises sauvées.

En l'absence, et jusqu'à l'arrivée des Consuls-Généraux, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, ou Agents Consulaires, les autorités locales devront, d'ailleurs, prendre toutes les mesures nécessaires pour la protection des individus et la conservation des objets qui auront été sauvés du naufrage.

Cette intervention ne donnera lieu à aucun frais, sauf ceux que les opérations de sauvetage et la garde des objets sauvés auront rendus nécessaires, ainsi que ceux auxquels seraient soumis en pareille circonstance les navires nationaux, les frais seront soldés, suivant le cas, soit par les Agents du service Consulaire, soit par les propriétaires ou leurs mandataires.

Dans le cas où l'éloignement, la maladie, ou toute autre cause empêcheraient les Agents du service Consulaire de pourvoir aux opérations et à la gestion du sauvetage, les autorités locales qui resteraient chargées de ces opérations et de cette gestion seront tenues de remettre à ces Agents les papiers de bord et le produit net du navire et de la cargaison.

ARTICLE V.

Les marchandises et les objets sauvés ne seront assujettis à aucun droit de douane, à moins qu'ils ne soient destinés à la consommation intérieure, auquel cas ils acquitteront les mêmes droits qu'ils auraient eu à payer s'ils avaient été importés par des navires nationaux.

ARTICLE VI.

Les stipulations de la présente Déclaration seront applicables à toutes les Colonies et possessions de Sa Majesté Britannique, à l'exception de celles ci-après dénommées, savoir :—

Les stipulations de la présente Déclaration seront applicables à toutes les Colonies et possessions de la France.

ARTICLE VII.

La présente Déclaration sera mise à exécution trois mois après la date de sa signature et demeurera en vigueur jusqu'à l'expiration d'une année à partir du jour où l'une des deux Parties Contractantes aura notifié son intention d'en faire cesser les effets.

En foi de quoi, les Plénipotentiaires Soussignés, son Excellence le Comte de Lytton, Ambassadeur de Sa Majesté la Reine du Royaume-Uni de la Grande-Bretagne et d'Irlande, Impératrice des Indes, et son Excellence M. SUPPLY OF FISH AND OYSTERS IN VICTORIA.
AMENDED REGULATIONS.

THE following Amended Regulations for the distribution of the bonus of £2,000 appropriated by Parliament to encourage the increase of the supply of fish and oysters in Victoria, are published for general information:—

1. Any person or company intending to compete for the bonus voted by Parliament for the encouragement of the fishing industry shall notify their intention to the Honorable the Commissioner of Trade and Customs on or before the 31st December, 1890, and shall give in such notification full particulars of the vessel and appliances proposed to be used, and the names of all parties concerned in the venture.

FISH.

2. Out of the sum of £2,000 set apart for the development of the fishing industry, the sum of £600 shall be paid to the person or company who shall, before the 30th September, 1891, deliver in Melbourne 50 tons of fish, exclusive of salmon, taken by means of trawling or deep-sea fishing from any part of Bass' Straits, or off the coasts of Victoria. The vessel or vessels used for such purpose shall not be less than 25 tons gross registered measurement, and shall, with all fittings and appliances and equipment, be subject to the approval of the Inspector of Fisheries as to their adaptability to the work of trawling or deep-sea fishing. In the event of more than one person or company competing and delivering, as above mentioned, 50 tons of good marketable fish, exclusive of salmon, before the date specified, such person or company as shall be second in delivering the said quantity of fish shall receive a bonus of £400. No credit will be given for any fish not approved or passed by the Inspector of Fisheries. All fish delivered under this regulation must have been taken by the vessel or vessels above mentioned.

OYSTERS.

3. Out of the said sum of £2,000, the sum of £300 shall be paid to the person or company who shall, before the 30th September, 1891, deliver in Melbourne 600 sacks of oysters, each sack containing three bushels, taken without infringing proclamations, by means of dredging, from any part of Bass' Straits, or off the coasts of Victoria. The vessel or vessels used for the purpose shall not be less than 25 tons gross registered measurement, and shall, with all fittings and appliances and equipment, be subject

to the approval of the Inspector of Fisheries as to their adaptability to the work of oyster dredging. In the event of more than one person or company competing and delivering, as above mentioned, 600 sacks, each containing three bushels, of oysters, before the date specified, such person or company as shall be second in delivering the said quantity of oysters shall receive a bonus of £200.

4. The fish and oysters may be delivered in Melbourne in any quantities, and at such times as may be most convenient to the takers, provided that no credit will be given for any fish or oysters respecting which the Inspector of Fisheries is not satisfied that they have been caught or taken by the persons or company delivering them. The fish delivered may be either fresh or salted.

5. The persons or company who may compete for the bonuses above mentioned will be required to provide in each vessel employed in trawling or oyster catching suitable accommodation for an Assistant Inspector of Fisheries, and shall properly board the same for an amount not exceeding Four shillings per diem.

6. Any persons or company as aforesaid shall at all times when so required by the Inspector of Fisheries produce all books, vouchers, and evidence which such Inspector may deem necessary, in order to prove that the fish and oysters delivered are *bond fide* the property of the person or company delivering the same, and that such fish or oysters have been procured in the manner and by the means required under these regulations, and no bonus or any portion of the amount voted by Parliament shall be paid unless with the approval of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, and on the certificates of the Inspector of Fisheries that these regulations have been complied with.

KINGDOM OF GREECE.

Greece Consulate at Melbourne.

The Minister of Navy announces to Navigators that the works of transformation of St. Maur's lighthouse being finished, the lighting of the new apparatus will begin on the 15th of August. At the same time will cease the lighting of the temporary red beacon.

The new apparatus is a dioptric one of the 4th order. It lights all the horizon, and gives a steady white light, excepted in a sector of 37°, when the light is red, to cover the low Cape Yératripa.

The red sector is visible from the 66° 40' south-east to the 76° 20' north-east. (The statements are true and given from the sea.)

The extent of the light is 12 miles (geographical capacity).

The beacon is situated at 14' 60 meters above the level of the sea, and at 9' 70 above the upper works of the sheltering wall of the mole.

WHEREAS by the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may proclaim any city, town, borough, or populous place comprising the whole or any portion of a Waterworks District to be an "Urban District" for the purposes of the said Act, and may name the limits thereof: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the whole of the Waterworks District of the Gisborne Waterworks Trust, as such District is limited and defined by a certain Order in Council, bearing date the 24th March, 1890, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 28th March, 1890, page 1176, to be an "Urban District" for the purposes and within the meaning of the said Act.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Nagambie Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban district for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authority conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION.—MAKING A RATE.

A rate of Two shillings in the £1 sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the waterworks district of the Nagambie Waterworks Trust liable in respect of rates levied by the said Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of such rateable property for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such rateable property is situated, for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1891.

Such rate shall be payable and collected in two instalments. The first instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of January, 1891, and the second instalment on the 1st day of July, 1891.

Such person as the Commissioners of the Nagambie Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive, and collect and recover the said rate.

EXCURSIONS TO MELBOURNE IN CONNEXION WITH THE VICTORIA RACING CLUB'S SPRING MEETING ON 1ST, 4TH, 6TH, AND 8TH NOVEMBER (DERBY, CUP, OAKS, AND STEEPLECHASE DAYS).

From the 27th October to the 8th November (both days inclusive) return tickets at holiday excursion fares will be issued for Melbourne only at all stations (Deniliquin and Mathoura included), and by Messrs. T. Cook and Son's agents at Ballarat, Geelong, and Sandhurst. The tickets will be available for all trains, and for return by any train up to the night of the 17th November.

The 4th November (Cup Day) will be observed as a holiday in the Melbourne, Williamstown, and Port Melbourne goods sheds and at the piers.

MORDIALLOC LINE TRAINS.

On and after Monday, 3rd November, the 10 a.m. "down" and the 11.5 a.m. "up" between Melbourne and Mordialloc will resume running, and the 10.45 a.m. "down" and the 12.5 p.m. "up" between Melbourne and Mordialloc will be discontinued.

MILK CANS FOR THE BACCHUS MARSH AND BALLAN LINE.

On 4th November (Cup Day) milk cans required to be forwarded by the 11.50 a.m. Bacchus Marsh and Ballan line train will be received at "Llewellyn's siding" (goods yard).

WILLIAMSTOWN LINE TRAINS.

On 4th and 10th November the 6.12, 7.5 a.m., and 4.45 p.m. trains from Melbourne to Newport, and the 6.41, 7.33 a.m., and 5.17 p.m. trains from Newport to Melbourne will not run.

The births of 1,627 children, viz., 855 boys and 772 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of September. In the month of August, 1,557 births were registered, or 70 less than in the month under review. The births were 574 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 230 above that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in September numbered 613, viz., 359 of males and 254 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 1,014 or 165 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in August by 124, but were above the average of September during the previous ten years by 117. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 45.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.55, and of deaths registered 1.34.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 74.9° on the 23rd, and the lowest was 35.0° on the 9th. The mean temperature of the month (54.3°) was almost 1 degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (29.9°) took place on the 4th. The least range (5.3°) was on the 6th. The mean daily range was 16.1°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.280 inches on the 2nd, and the lowest was 29.404 inches on the 27th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.882 inches) was a fraction below the average.

Rain fell on 16 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.36 inches. The average rainfall in September during the previous ten years was 2.05 inches, or about one-third of an inch less than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on 3 days during the month.

Males contributed 57 per cent., and females 43 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 35 per cent. to that mortality, as against 34 per cent. in September, 1889; 29 per cent. in September, 1888; 28 per cent. in September, 1887; 34 per cent. in September, 1886; 27 per cent. in September, 1885; 33 per cent. in September, 1884; 32 per cent. in September, 1883; 33 per cent. in September, 1882; 23 per cent. in September, 1881; and 36 per cent. in September, 1880.

Thirty-one deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a female, aged 75, died of lupus; a female, aged 76, of hemiplegia; a female, aged 76, of syncope; a female, aged 77, of valvular disease of the heart; a gentleman, aged 77, of hernia; a female, aged 78, of heart disease; a female, aged 78, of bronchitis; a labourer, aged 78, of injuries, the result of a fall; a gardener, aged 79, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 79, of bronchitis; a female,

aged 79, of burns; a gentleman, aged 80, of heart disease; a waterman, aged 80, of senile gangrene; a carpenter, aged 81, of syncope; a female, aged 82, of pneumonia; an engine-driver, aged 83, of icterus; a female, aged 84, of bronchitis; a female, aged 84, of pneumonia; a female, aged 85, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 90, of asthma; a gentleman, aged 90, of asphyxia and hemorrhage; a female, aged 78, a gentleman, aged 80, a female, aged 84, a female servant, aged 80, a tailor, aged 87, two females, each aged 88, a carpenter and a female, each aged 92, and a female, aged 90, of old age.

Forty violent deaths took place during the month, of which 33 were set down to accident, 2 to homicide, and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A male child, aged 6 months, a boy, aged 14, a seaman, aged 25, a publican, aged 63, a male of occupation unknown, aged 69, and a labourer, aged 78, died of injuries, the result of falls; a boy, aged 13, was crushed by machinery; a male child, aged 3, and a carter, aged 26, were passed over by vehicles; a railway porter, aged 26, a boiler-maker and a labourer, each aged 30, a female of occupation unknown, aged 38, and a gatekeeper, aged 61, were killed by railway trains; a labourer, aged 39, was killed by a fall of earth; a female, aged 65, died of fracture of the leg—how caused not stated; a male child, aged 3, of scalds; 3 females, aged 44, 63, and 79 respectively, of burns; a plasterer, aged 27, of poison, accidentally taken; a female, aged 22, was drowned in Hobson's Bay; a boy, aged 9, a warder, aged 50, and a carter, aged 53, were drowned in the River Yarra; a brickmaker, aged 43, and a musician, aged 45, in the Saltwater River; a newly-born female infant died of asphyxia, due to strangulation by the umbilical cord; a female child, aged 4 months, was overlain; a bootmaker, aged 33, was suffocated in an epileptic fit, a female, aged 35, whilst intoxicated, and a clerk, aged 22, by hydrogen gas; an ironmonger, aged 90, died of asphyxia and hemorrhage. The homicidal deaths were those of a female infant, aged 2 days, who died of strangulation, and a labourer, aged 43, who was killed by a railway train—a verdict of wilful murder being returned in the former, and of manslaughter in the latter case. The suicidal deaths were those of a female and a pork butcher, aged 27 and 54 respectively, who shot themselves a female and a commission agent, aged 58 and 64 respectively, who drowned themselves in the River Yarra; and a carpenter, aged 29, who hanged himself.

One hundred and ten deaths, or 18 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—43 in the Melbourne Hospital, 13 in the Alfred Hospital, 4 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 8 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Lying-in Hospital, 4 in the Immigrants' Home, 9 in the Benevolent Asylum, 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Austin Hospital, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Infant Asylum, and 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 212, of which 127, or 60 per cent., were of males, and 85, or 40 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 144 were under one year of age, 36 were between one and two, 11 were between two and three, 12 were between three and four, and 9 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 401. Of these, 232, or 58 per cent., were males, and 169, or 42 per cent., were females; 23 were between five and ten, 10 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between fifteen and twenty, 26 were between twenty and twenty-five, 34 were between twenty-five and thirty, 37 were between thirty and thirty-five, 25 were between thirty-five and forty, 24 were between forty and forty-five, 24 were between forty-five and fifty, 29 were between fifty and fifty-five, 37 were between fifty-five and sixty, 36 were between sixty and sixty-five, 30 were between sixty-five and seventy, 21 were between seventy and seventy-five, 12 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 19 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from violence were more numerous by 9 in the month under review than the previous one, but, with this exception, smaller numbers appear in September than in August under all the classes in which causes of death are grouped. Only 3 deaths were set down to typhoid fever in September, which is the smallest number reported in any month since November, 1886, when only 1 death from typhoid occurred. Deaths from diphtheria numbered 27, which is 9 more than in August, but 10 less than in September, 1889. In addition to the deaths from diphtheria, 3 in the month under review were set down to diphtheritic croup, as against 7 in August and 8 in July.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in each of the first nine months of the present and the previous two years:—

MYALL IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST
BOUNDARIES RE-DEFINED.

WHEREAS by section 414 of the *Water Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1156) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after any Irrigation and Water Supply Trust has by Order in Council been duly constituted, make additional Orders relating to such Trust not inconsistent with the provisions of Part III. of the said Act, and that the Governor in Council may in such additional Order in Council (among other things)—

(1.) Make any Order which might have been made in the Order in Council originally constituting such Irrigation and Water Supply Trust;

(2.) Increase or diminish, or otherwise alter, in accordance with and not inconsistent with the previous provisions of this Act, the extent of the district of such Trust.

And whereas by Orders in Council bearing date the ninth day of June, 1890, the Governor in Council did constitute a certain Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, known as the "Myall Irrigation and Water Supply Trust," and did approve of a certain scheme of works relating to the said Trust: And whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries of the Irrigation and Water Supply District of the said Trust: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth order that the boundaries of the Irrigation and Water Supply District of the Myall Irrigation and Water Supply Trust as set forth in the aforesaid Orders in Council, be and the same are hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof doth hereby order that the limits of the lands to be called an Irrigation and Water Supply District, within which such Trust shall have authority, shall hereafter be as follows, that is to say:—

Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 2, parish of Murrabit; thence east and south by the north and east boundaries of said allotment 2 to the south-east angle thereof; thence east by portion of the north boundary of allotment 1, north boundary of allotment 10, and a line to the south-west angle of allotment 4; thence north, east, and south by the west, north, and east boundaries of said allotment 4, and further south by portion of the east boundary of allotment 9 to the most northern boundary of allotment 7; thence east by the north boundary of said allotment 7 and south by the east boundaries of allotments 7 and 6 to the south-east angle of said allotment 6; thence west and northerly by the south and western boundaries of allotment 6 to a point in the western boundary of same due east of the south-east angle of allotment 3; thence west by a line and the south boundaries of allotments 3 and 2, parish of Murrabit, and allotments 20, 21, and 22, parish of Murrabit West, to the south-west angle of said allotment 22; thence north by the west boundaries of allotments 22 and 13 and east by portion of the north boundary of said allotment 13 to the west boundary of allotment 14; thence south, east, and north by portion of the west, south, and east boundaries of allotment 14 to a point in the east boundary due west of the north-west angle of allotment 16A; thence east by a line, the north boundaries of allotments 16A and 17, and a line to the south-west angle of allotment 1, parish of Murrabit; thence north by the west boundaries of allotments 1 and 2 to the commencing point.

All of which boundaries are as shown on the amended Order in Council plans, deposited in the Office of the Minister of Water Supply, Melbourne.

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

ALLOWANCES TO WITNESSES IN CRIMINAL CASES ON A PROSECUTION BY ANY OFFICER ON BEHALF OF THE CROWN AND AT INQUESTS AND MAGISTERIAL INQUIRIES.

WHEREAS, by an Order of the Governor in Council bearing date the twenty-eighth day of January, 1867, certain rates of allowances to be made to witnesses and interpreters summoned to attend at the Supreme and Circuit Courts, Courts of General Sessions and Petty Sessions, at Inquests, and Magisterial Inquiries were prescribed: And whereas it is expedient to rescind the said Order and make another in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that, on and after the first day of November next, the said first-mentioned Order shall be rescinded, and that on and after that day the allowances to be made to witnesses and interpreters required to attend at the Criminal Sittings of the Supreme Court, and at General and Petty Sessions, or before justices, and at Inquests and Magisterial Inquiries shall be in accordance with the Regulations following: Provided that witnesses at Petty Sessions, or before justices, and at Inquests, and at Magisterial Inquiries, other than professional witnesses or experts, members of the Police Force, and interpreters shall be paid only in accordance with the provisions hereinafter specially set out in that behalf.

For Travelling.

1. To every witness or interpreter (not being a member of the Police Force) the sum actually paid, but not exceeding One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) for every mile he may reside from the court at which he is required to attend.
2. To every witness and interpreter who may travel by ship, coach, railway, or tram, the sum actually and properly paid for fares both in going to and returning from the court at which he may be required to attend.
3. No allowance under clause 1 will be made to any witness or interpreter residing within three miles of the court which he may be required to attend.
4. In all cases where practicable witnesses and interpreters must travel by ship, coach, railway, or tram, and in such part of the vessel, vehicle, or train as may be suitable to their station in life.

For Attendance.

date of attending the court, or of departure, as paid to witnesses residing beyond twenty miles from the court, and mentioned in the third column, or, in the case of members of the Police Force, as mentioned in the second column.

7. No allowance will be paid to aboriginal natives, nor to any prisoner of the Crown, but every protector, constable, warder, or other person having charge of any such native or prisoner will receive the expenses actually and necessarily incurred in taking him to and from and keeping him in attendance at the court.

8. No allowance will be paid to any member of the Police Force for attendance at a Court of Petty Sessions, or before justices, or at any Inquest or Magisterial Inquiry held within the city, town, borough, or township in which he is stationed.

9. Witnesses who attend in more than one prosecution or matter will be entitled to a proportionate payment only in each.

10. Witnesses at Petty Sessions, or before justices, and at inquests, and at magisterial inquiries, other than professional witnesses and experts, members of the Police Force, and interpreters, shall be paid sufficient to cover the loss which has been or will be sustained through such attendance, but not to exceed in any event the amounts hereinbefore set out, and it shall be the duty of the police magistrate, or (if no police magistrate is present), the chairman of the bench, or the coroner or presiding justice (as the case may be) to satisfy himself that such loss has been or will be sustained through such attendance, and a special minute to that effect must be placed on the face of the account, signed by such police magistrate or presiding officer. In paying witnesses at the Supreme Court and at Courts of General Sessions, under clause five, for attendance, the officer performing the duty shall similarly satisfy himself, and shall indorse and sign on the back of the abstract a general certificate that he has done so.

11. The abstract of payments to witnesses and interpreters, must be certified at the Supreme Courts by the Crown Solicitor; at Courts of General Sessions by the Clerk of the Peace, countersigned by the Prosecutor for the Queen, as inspected and approved; at Courts of Petty Sessions, or before justices, by the police magistrate, or (if no police magistrate present) by the chairman of the bench; at inquests by the coroner, or justice acting as such; and at magisterial inquiries, by the magistrate.

And the Honorable Henry Cuthbert, Her Majesty's Minister of Justice for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

BY-LAWS OF THE KILMORE HOSPITAL.

1. All by-laws made prior to the date of making these by-laws shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. The objects of the hospital are to afford gratuitous medical and surgical aid to sick persons in destitute circumstances, and to others upon such terms of payment as shall from time to time be determined by the Board of Management.

3. The affairs of the hospital shall be directed by a Board of Management, consisting of the president, two vice-presidents, the treasurer, and not more than three honorary medical officers, and a committee of twelve yearly subscribers or life members, elected at each annual general meeting, and in accordance with the provisions of the Hospitals Act, and one-third of the elected portion of the Board shall only retire annually after the first election under the Act (viz., the election of 1865), the one-third lowest on the poll to retire the first year, and the one-third next lowest on the poll to retire the second year, and every succeeding year the one-third longest in office. Retiring members to be eligible for re-election.

4. If any member of the Board of Management die, or resign by letter under his hand, addressed to the president, or become insolvent or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanour, or be absent for four consecutive meetings from the Board, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the Board may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor until the next annual meeting for the election of a Board of Management, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who, by the provisions of this Act, are required to go out of office.

5. The Board of Management shall meet on the second Tuesday in each month, at such time and place as they shall from time to time appoint. Four to form a quorum.

6. The Board of Management by vote, or four members thereof by writing under their hand, or the president, shall be at liberty at any time to require the secretary to summon a special meeting of the Board, three clear days' notice of which shall be given to each member, and the object specified, and no other business than that on the notice-paper shall be considered at such special meeting.

7. The Board of Management shall direct the collection and distribution of funds, appoint and dismiss all paid officers and servants, frame rules for the management of the hospital (the same not to be repugnant to the Acts relating to hospitals), present an annual report to the general meeting, and manage the affairs of the hospital generally.

8. The Board of Management may, subject to these by-laws, make, alter, or rescind rules for the regulation of the hospital in every department, provided one month's notice has been given of the same. No motion to rescind a resolution of the Board of Management shall be submitted within three months after such resolution has been passed, unless one month's notice of the same has been given, and then such motion must be passed by an absolute majority of the Board of Management.

9. No member of the Board of Management shall vote or take part in the discussion of any matter in or before the Board in which he shall directly or indirectly have any pecuniary interest.

10. That a subscription of £1 a year shall qualify an annual subscriber, who shall be eligible to be elected a member of the Board of Management, and to vote at all special or annual meetings of the subscribers during the financial year in which such subscription is paid. Annual subscribers shall have the privilege of recommending one indoor or two out-door patients for every pound they shall subscribe. Ministers of religion or any person representing an association shall receive one indoor ticket for every £3 collected by them.

11. Every donor of £20 and upwards; every person, not being a paid collector, who shall raise in one or more collections in one year the sum of £30 or upwards from persons not claiming membership on account of their contribution towards such sum; any person appointed by any society paying £25; the executor, or, if more than one, the first-named in the will, by which a bequest of £50 or upwards shall be paid to the institution, shall be life members; and any other person elected at a meeting of subscribers, on the recommendation of the Board of Management,

in consideration of special services rendered to the institution, shall be a life member, and shall have the privilege of recommending three indoor or six out-door patients annually, and shall be entitled to one vote at annual or special meetings of the subscribers, and also shall be eligible to hold any office on the Board of Management.

12. Any public or corporate body, or church congregation, or firm or partnership, which shall pay to the hospital any or either of the amounts above specified in By-law 11 shall be authorized to nominate some one person, who shall be entitled to all the privileges attached thereto.

13. Annual subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the day on which such subscription be paid, and no contributor will be entitled to any privilege until his or her subscription be paid.

14. All applicants for admission or treatment must in ordinary cases procure a certificate from a contributor before being allowed the benefits of the hospital, the fitness of all applicants for relief to be determined by the house surgeon. Every applicant for treatment must also sign the following agreement:—

"I, A. B., hereby certify that I am in such destitute circumstances as to be unable to pay for medical treatment, medicines, or other relief. Dated

"Signed—A. B., Applicant."

15. In the event of any person, in a position to pay for medical or surgical advice elsewhere, being detected in the receipt of the charity of the institution, such person, if an in-patient, shall be liable to be prosecuted, and shall be charged 10s. per day for each day from the date of admission, or, if an out-patient, he may also be prosecuted, and shall be charged 10s. for each occasion upon which he shall consult the house surgeon, and the Board of Management may order the removal of any such person from the hospital, provided the case is not one of emergency.

16. Patients who are able to pay for medical attendance, medicine, and maintenance, shall, on admission, be charged at the rate of 30s. per week, which amount may be increased or reduced by the Board of Management, and the general rules and regulations of the institution shall be applicable to and observed by them while in the hospital. Every such patient shall, on admission to the hospital, sign an undertaking in the following form:—

Form of Agreement.

In consideration of my being admitted as a paying patient of the Kilmore Hospital, I hereby, for myself, my executors, and administrators, promise and agree to and with the Board of Management of the said Kilmore Hospital to pay to the said Kilmore Hospital the sum of _____ per week for my maintenance and medical treatment whilst in such hospital, such payment to commence from the date of my admission, viz., the day of 18 . Dated this _____ day of 18 .

Signature—

17. Cases of severe accident shall be admitted immediately without certificates from subscribers, but should patients so admitted be able to pay they shall be charged as specified in Rule 16.

18. Out-patients will be attended to at Noon on Mondays and Thursdays in each week upon their producing tickets, which must have been previously obtained from a subscriber or treasurer.

19. No lunatic or person suffering from any incurable disease, or chronic epilepsy, or pregnant woman for purpose of confinement, or child under five years of age shall be deemed a proper case for admission.

20. All property found on deceased patients shall be handed to their legal representatives or the Curator of Intestate Estates, and an account rendered to the said legal representatives or the Curator for the amount due for the patient's maintenance and burial.

21. Ministers of religion shall have access to patients of their respective denominations at all reasonable times, when not objected to by such patients or the medical staff, and any minister may attend any patient at any time when requested by such patient; and in cases of death of any patient, a notice shall be forwarded by the house steward to the clergyman of the denomination to which the deceased patient is supposed to belong, stating the hour of burial.

22. Visitors may be permitted to see patients two days in each week, Thursday and Sunday, and can do so on special occasions by procuring permission from the paid or honorary medical officers.

23. At all meetings of governors and contributors the president or one of the vice-presidents, or the treasurer, as the case may be, shall take the chair, but in their absence the meeting shall choose its own chairman, who shall have a casting vote only.

24. The annual meeting of governors and contributors to the hospital shall be held on the last Thursday in the month of July in every year for the following purposes:—

- (1) To receive the annual report and balance-sheet.
- (2) The election of the president, vice-presidents, treasurer, honorary medical officers, and two auditors for the ensuing year.
- (3) The election of members of committee of management.
- (4) The transaction of any other business of which due notice has been given, or that may arise at such meeting.

25. At all general meetings of governors and contributors twelve shall constitute a quorum, and as soon as such a quorum is present the chair will be taken, but if no quorum is present within half-an-hour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjourned to the following week, at the same day and hour.

26. All questions shall be decided by show of hands unless a ballot be demanded by five contributors. All elections where contested shall be by ballot. Voting by proxy shall not be allowed.

27. The contributors shall have power to alter or rescind these or to make any new by-laws, but no alterations shall be passed unless concurred in by a majority of at least two-thirds of the votes of contributors present at a special meeting convened for

the purpose. Notice of any such alteration, rescinding, or making any new by-law, shall be given in writing to the secretary, and signed by at least ten contributors, and shall be considered on a day appointed by the Board of Management within one month of receipt of such notice; but no alteration, rescinding, or new by-law shall be of any force or effect until one month after the same shall have been confirmed by a general meeting of contributors specially convened for that purpose, and published in the *Government Gazette*.

28. The Board at their first meeting shall elect a committee of six to be designated the Finance Committee, who shall examine all accounts sent in for payment, and check them with the Provision Consumption Account, previously to their being passed for payment by the Board of Management, such accounts to be made up to the last day in each month, and to be sent in to the secretary four clear days before the day of meeting. The Board shall also at their first meeting elect a committee to be called the Visiting or House Committee, who shall visit the hospital at least once a month, in order to examine the state of the stock, and report thereon to the general board. They shall recommend the purchase or repair of any articles required for the use of patients or the institution, and order repairs of building when essentially required, provided the expense does not exceed Two pounds (£2).

SECRETARY AND DUTIES.

29. The Secretary shall keep the minutes and records of the hospital, conduct the correspondence, and carry out the resolutions of the Board. He shall also convene special meetings of the subscribers when directed by the president, the Board of Management, or on the written requisition of ten annual subscribers.

AUDITORS AND DUTIES.

30. The annual general meeting shall elect two contributors, not members of the Board, as auditors for the year. The auditors shall at the end of each year examine the treasurer's financial report, and all accounts, vouchers, and documents relating thereto, and shall report thereon to the annual general meeting. The treasurer's yearly report to be made up to the 30th June in each year.

TREASURER AND DUTIES.

31. The Treasurer shall receive all money on behalf of the institution, and invest the same in such bank as the Board shall direct; to the credit of the hospital. He shall pay all accounts passed by them by cheques on the bank, which shall be signed by the president or chairman of such Board, and treasurer, and countersigned by the secretary.

ENDOWMENT.

32. All legacies and bequests to the hospital shall, subject to any conditions under which such bequests are made, be paid to the Endowment Fund, and shall be invested in such manner as the Board of Management shall direct; the interest may be available for the maintenance of the hospital.

PAID MEDICAL OFFICER.

33. The paid medical officer shall be a legally-qualified medical practitioner, and shall have the right of engaging in private practice. He shall have the charge of all patients in the hospital and be responsible for their treatment, but in cases of difficulty or danger shall request the attendance of one or more of the honorary medical officers. He shall have the immediate superintendence of the house steward and dispenser, and the general control of the servants, and have power to suspend them for insubordination or neglect of duty until the next meeting of the Board. He shall give all requisite information to the honorary medical officers on their visits to the hospital, and shall enter all prescriptions in a book to be kept for that purpose. He shall visit the hospital every morning at Eleven o'clock (or oftener if required) and ascertain if the treatment prescribed has been attended to, and on his visits to the wards examine their condition with respect to cleanliness, temperature, and ventilation. He shall give notice to the honorary medical officers when an operation is to be performed, and shall attend at the hospital dispensary at the hour of Noon on Monday and Thursday in each week, for the purpose of administering relief to out-patients. He shall also, in conjunction with the honorary medical officers, decide on the fitness of patients to be received into, or discharged from the hospital.

DISPENSER AND HOUSE STEWARD.

I. The medicines, surgical instruments, and all stores belonging to the hospital shall be under his charge; and he shall make up and dispense, with due attention, all medicines for the sick as prescribed by the medical officers.

II. He shall take care that every medicine dispensed shall have the name of the patient, and the time and manner of using it, written in a clear legible hand affixed to the paper, box, phial, &c., into which it is put; and that the label be renewed when so far defaced as not to be easily read.

III. He shall from time to time commit to paper the particulars of such medicines and other articles as may be required for the use of the hospital, and have the names examined and signed by one or more of the medical officers before ordering the required supplies. He shall prepare such quantities of the compound medicines as may be necessary for the practice of the hospital, and insert in the "Consumption Account" the precise quantity of spirits used in making tinctures, &c.

IV. He shall have the superintendence of the sick wards, and see that the meals of the patients are properly served according to the prescribed dietary, and that all the orders of the medical officers are duly carried into effect; the nurses, wardmen, and other servants being under him, subject also to the directions of the medical officers.

V. He shall live in the hospital, and shall not leave it except on necessary occasions. He shall not be absent for more than two hours at any time in each day, such absence to be from Nine o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m., nor more than three hours at any other time, and not after Eleven o'clock at night, without the previous sanction of the Board of Management.

vi. He shall keep a register of the cases treated in the hospital, and also for out-door patients, a periodical abstract of which he shall prepare, to be laid before the Board yearly, embracing the numbers, diseases, and results. That on the admission of patients into the hospital every week he shall write the name, age, date of admission, &c., on a card to be suspended over the beds. He shall keep a book in which he shall insert the name of every patient for whom the medical officer shall prescribe either wine, spirits, ale, or stout, the name of the medical officer who has ordered the same, and the precise quantity rendered every day, which book shall be laid before the Board of Management at their stated meetings, together with a health report of the house.

vii. He shall keep also such other medical books and papers as the medical officers may require for the use of their department, and have charge of the key of the dead-house.

viii. He shall visit the patients morning and evening to ascertain that the treatment prescribed has been properly carried out, and especially to examine the condition of the wards in respect to their cleanliness, temperature, and ventilation, carefully observing if the nurses and the wardsmen have done their duty. And should any complaint be made, or any cause for such exist, in regard to the conduct of the nurses, wardsmen, or other servants, or the patients themselves, it shall be his duty to report the same at the earliest opportunity to the medical officer.

ix. He shall keep an exact inventory of all the goods belonging to and in the hospital, and shall examine both as to quantity and quality, all supplies received, and enter an account thereof, and also post daily the "Provision Consumption Account," according to the dietary scales of the Board of Management, and the orders of medical officers to sick inmates, so as to exhibit the individual and aggregate consumption of provisions and medical comforts, and also apportion the general expenditure under the different heads, as required by the Government, in the quarterly and yearly returns.

x. He shall keep an exact account of the admissions and discharges of patients, stating the cause of their discharge from the hospital. He shall, when required by the patients, procure the attendance of any required clergyman.

DUTIES OF WARDSMEN.

34. To nurse the sick and keep them clean, to communicate with the medical officers and house steward respecting them. He shall strictly conform to the instructions of the medical officers with regard to the treatment and attendance of patients, and shall not absent himself from the premises without the permission of the paid medical officer or Board of Management.

DUTIES OF NURSE, COOK, LAUNDRESS, AND OTHER SERVANTS.

35. They shall perform such duties as may be required of them, and shall carry out the instructions of the medical staff and house steward, and shall not at any time absent themselves from the institution without the permission of the medical officer in charge.

VISITORS' BOOK.

36. A book shall be kept in the hospital in which visitors may make remarks regarding the state of the institution, attaching their names thereto, and which shall be submitted to the Board of Management at each of their monthly meetings.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE IN-PATIENTS.

1. That they punctually observe the directions of their physicians and surgeons.

2. That friends of patients, not exceeding two on the same day to each, be permitted to visit them between One and Four o'clock in the afternoon on Thursdays and Sundays, but that they be admissible at other times by the special permission of the visiting medical officers or paid surgeon.

3. That no patient leave his bed or ward to go outside the hospital ground without leave.

4. That no patient absent himself from the hospital, or stay out all night without the permission of his physician or surgeon.

5. That the male patients do not go into the wards of the female patients nor the females into those appropriated to the male patients without leave of the matron or paid surgeon.

6. That no patient or other person play at cards, dice, or in any other game, smoke, swear, or use abusive language, or in any manner behave indecently in any part of the premises, or bring for the patients liquors or improper provisions.

7. That such patient as may be able to work do, by the permission of his physician or surgeon, such work as the house steward or matron may require.

8. That neither the patients nor their friends give money or any gratuity whatsoever to the nurse or any person belonging to the hospital.

9. That every patient having cause of complaint do inform the physician or surgeon, or the steward or matron of same.

10. That any patient not conforming to these Rules may be expelled by the Board, the paid surgeon, or visiting medical officers.

CHAPTER I.—ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS.

1. That the business of the Board of Management shall be conducted on all ordinary occasions with open doors, the Board having the power to exclude strangers for disorderly conduct.

2. The Board shall commence business at each meeting as soon as the legal quorum is present; but if at the expiration of thirty minutes after the appointed hour of meeting there is no quorum present, no business shall be transacted by the Board at that meeting.

3. That the minutes of the preceding meeting shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the Board, in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

4. At all meetings of the Board the reading of the correspondence unconnected with the orders of the day, the presentation of petitions by members of the Board, and the bringing up of reports of committees, shall have precedence of regular business.

5. On the presentation of a petition no debate shall take place thereon until notice has been given in the usual manner, and the only question that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be that the petition be received, and if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

6. The order of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the Board, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration. Any member of the Board may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be given in writing to the secretary ten clear days previous to the meeting at which the same is to be taken into consideration. All such notices of motion to be considered in the order in which they were given.

7. No motion entered on the notice-paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorized by him, in writing, be present when the business is called in order. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

8. The mover of any motion which may be referred to any committee shall be a member of such committee.

CHAPTER II.—ORDER OF DEBATE.

1. Any member desirous of proposing a motion or an amendment, or of discussing any matter under consideration, must rise and address the president or the presiding chairman, and no member, when speaking, shall be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down, in which case the member calling to order shall be heard thereon in preference to any other speaker, and the question of order shall be disposed of before the subject is resumed or any other subject entered upon.

2. Any member making a motion or amendment shall put in form, sign, and deliver it to the secretary, who shall add thereto the name of the seconder; and no motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Board.

3. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed unless it be seconded. Any member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Board by simply noticing that such order is disobeyed.

4. The members when speaking shall use respectful language to each other.

5. If two or more members arise to speak at the same time, the president or the then-presiding chairman shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.

6. Any member who shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member or person shall, if required by the Board, withdraw such expression, and make satisfactory apology to the Board.

7. The president, or the then-presiding chairman, shall be entitled to only one vote on each question, and shall, in taking the votes on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as it is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion from the show of hands as to which party has the majority.

8. The Board shall vote by a show of hands except in cases of election, when the vote shall be by ballot. Any member of the Board may, however, call for a division upon any question, in which case the members voting in the affirmative shall first stand up, and afterwards those in the negative until their votes are recorded.

9. No motion, the effect of which if carried would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the Board, shall be entered during the same current year, unless a call of the Board has been duly made for the purpose; and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the Board which shall have been negatived by the Board shall be again entertained during the same current year.

CHAPTER III.—ELECTIONS.

1. No election to any office at the disposal of the Board shall take place until seven clear days' notice shall have been given in one or more local newspapers inviting applications for the same; and the salary of such office shall in all cases be fixed for the current year before proceeding to the election.

2. No member of the Board or officer belonging to the Board shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the Board, or for any work to be done for the Board, and in all cases in which security for the due and faithful performance of any duty or contract is required, the expenses of preparing such surety shall be borne by the person or persons giving the same.

3. Any one or more of the standing orders of the Board may be suspended *pro tempore* in case of emergency; provided that a majority of the Board shall deem such suspension necessary, always excepting number 9 chapter 2, and number 2 chapter 3.
