## SHIRE OF WANNON.

## BY-LAW NUMBER FIVE.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, the president, councillors, and ratepayers for the Shire of Wannon, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, within its jurisdiction, doth hereby make the by-law following, that is to say:—

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In the construction and for the purpose of this by-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have their respective meanings hereby assigned to them:—"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings, or premises; "cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or other offensive matter below the surface of the ground; "street" shall mean and include any highway or any public bridge, or any lane, road, footway, square, alley, court, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

2. The construction in the future of any cesspool for the deposit of night-soil or other offensive matter is hereby prohibited.

3. The use of a closet-pan known as the Hesse Sanitary System is hereby adopted.

4. The Council will furnish a pan or pans at every dwelling or place where necessary upon the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—For one pan the charge will be Twenty-six shillings per annum, and for two or more pans the charge shall be Twenty shillings each additional pan per annum, payable quarterly in advance, that is to say, on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, the 1st day of October in each and every year.

5. The fees referred to in the preceding section must be paid to the person appointed by the Council to receive payment of the same within seven days when due or payable, or in default legal proceedings will be taken for recovery of the before-named fees.

6. Every closet must be constructed with a door or opening sufficiently large to admit of the removal of pan or pans, and shall be available for access for such removal when required.

7. No person will be allowed to remove any night-soil, unless duly authorized by this Council.

8. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall once at least in every week, between the hours of sunset and sunrise, allow each pan to be removed for cleansing purposes.

9. Every person who shall commit a breach of this by-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings.

10. The foregoing by-law, number five, shall apply to and have operation in the part or in the place or places with the jurisdiction of the Wannon Shire Council as follows, that is to say, all that area comprised within the limits of the surveyed boundaries of the township of Coleraine.

11. This By-law shall come into operation from and after the date of publication in the *Government Gazette*.

## SPECIAL NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights bearing date on or before the 1st December, 1889, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the new General Lists to be made up on the 1st December next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new Lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new Rolls.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. The law requires the prescribed questions as to an applicant's qualification to be answered in writing; therefore, if application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, as is too frequently the case, much inconvenience will be occasioned, with the possible result that many will be deprived of the opportunity of enrolment.

Intending applicants are further cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law; inasmuch as a penalty on conviction is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining electors' rights when not qualified.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any division of a Province may obtain an elector's right for such Province, and no person whose name is already on any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any division of an Electoral District may obtain an elector's right for such District.

WHEREAS default has been made in payment by the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust of the interest due by it on loans granted by the Governor in Council to such Waterworks Trust, and the said Trust has also failed to form a sinking fund for the liquidation of such loans in accordance with the Act in that behalf: And the Board of Land and Works, having done all things necessary under the powers in that behalf it enabling, has taken possession of the works of the said Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust, and is desirous, in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, of making a rate for the payment of such interest and the expenses incidental to the maintenance of the said works, and the collection of the rates, and the formation of a sinking fund, in such manner as the Governor in Council directs:

And whereas notice that the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust district is supplied with water has been given in the *Government Gazette*:

And whereas by two proclamations by the Governor in Council, bearing date the eighteenth day of December, 1883, certain portions of the said Waterworks Trust district (towns of Kerang and Castle Donnington) were proclaimed urban districts within the meaning of the *Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*:

And whereas by an Order in Council, bearing date the eighteenth day of November, 1890, made under the provisions of section 100 of the *Water Act 1890*, the Waterworks District of the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust, exclusive of the lands comprising the aforesaid urban districts of Kerang and Castle Donnington, was divided into four divisions, numbered I., II., III., and IV. respectively, and the boundaries of each division were in and by such Order in Council limited and defined. And it was further directed in and by the aforesaid Order in Council of the eighteenth day of November, 1890, that the rates necessary for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust, and for the maintenance of the waterworks of the said Trust, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, should be levied in Divisions I., II., and III., and it was further directed and determined in and by such Order in Council that such rates should be levied differentially as between the said Divisions I., II., and III., and that the proportions in which such divisions should be rated respectively one to another should be as follow:—

In Division I.—A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of rateable property situated therein.

In Division II.—A rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of rateable property situated therein.

In Division III.—A rate of One shilling and tenpence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of rateable property situated therein.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, doth hereby order and empower the Board of Land and Works to make and levy, under the powers of the said *Water Act 1890*, a rate for the year 1890 in respect of the aforesaid Divisions I., II., and III., and that such rate shall be of the amount hereinbefore specified for each division.

## MAGNETIC SHOAL NEAR COSSACK, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

INFORMATION has been received from His Excellency Admiral Lord Charles Scott, to the effect that on the 6th inst., H.M.S. *Penguin*, when leaving Cossack, passed over a magnetic shoal of about one mile in diameter, the focus or centre of magnetic attraction of which is situated in latitude 20° 32' 35" S., longitude 117° 13' 2' E., directly in the track of vessels visiting Cossack. From this focus, which is about 50 feet in diameter, the summit of Bezout Island bears S. 79° 25' W., distant 2.14 miles, and Jarman Island Lighthouse S. 2° 40' E., distant 6.52 miles. All compasses on the vessel were deflected 55 degrees to the right and 23 degrees to the left when passing over the focus. The angle subtended by the extreme points of Bezout Island was 16 degrees, sounding eight fathoms, and bottom. It is deemed probable that this area of magnetic attraction may form one of many around the coast of Australia.

REGULATION BY THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

WHEREAS default has been made in payment by the Avoxa Water Trust of the interest due by the said Trust on a loan of £15,630, granted by the Governor in Council to such Water Trust, and the said Trust has also failed to form a sinking fund for the liquidation of such loan in accordance with the Act of Parliament in that behalf: And the Board of Land and Works having done all things necessary under the powers in that behalf it enabling, has taken possession of the lands, tenements, and works of the said Trust: And whereas notices that the said Water Trust District is supplied with water have been duly given in the *Government Gazette*.

And whereas by a proclamation by the Governor in Council, bearing date the 10th day of March, 1885, a portion of the said Waterworks District was proclaimed an urban district within the meaning of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*.

And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the 27th day of October, 1890, made under the authority of the *Water Act 1890*, it was directed that the rates and charges which should be made and levied by the said Board of Land and Works in respect of the said urban district should be made for the year 1891, and should be made in accordance with the provisions of Division 9 of Part 2 of the said last-mentioned Act.

Now therefore the Board of Land and Works doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said *Water Act 1890*, and in accordance with the said recited Order in Council of the 27th October, 1890, in that behalf, make the following Regulation in respect of the said urban district for the year 1891, that is to say:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling for the year 1891 on the annual shire valuation of the said urban district.
2. The sum of One pound sterling shall be the minimum rate to be paid by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated in the said urban district.
3. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the Trust works, Three shillings and fourpence for every thousand gallons shall be charged.
4. Such rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1891.

Such person or persons as the Board of Land and Works may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rates and charges.

The above Regulation is made by the Board of Land and Works in exercise of the powers vested in the said Board in that behalf the 6th day of November, 1890.

LOWAN SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
REGULATION FOR 1891.

THE Commissioners of the Lowan Shire Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following regulation:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within the Nhill Urban District, that is to say:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds sterling annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.
2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual value, an amount equal to One shilling in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.
3. For all tenements in the said urban district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half a mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates.
4. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, One pound per annum on each inch diameter of the cylinder.
5. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—  
One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.  
Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.  
Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.  
Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum, 20,000 gallons.  
Exceeding half an acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre for every additional acre; and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for every fractional part of an acre.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1891, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1891, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1891.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Lowan Shire Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive, and collect and recover the said rate.

## ROMSEY SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.

## REGULATION No. 11.

A Regulation of the Romsey Shire Waterworks Trust, made under the powers conferred by section 75 of the *Water Act 1890*, for the purpose of imposing, levying, and receiving a rate.

IN pursuance of the powers granted or conferred by section 75 of the *Water Act 1890*, the Commissioners of the Romsey Shire Waterworks Trust hereby make the following regulation:—

A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the waterworks district of the Shire of Romsey Waterworks Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Romsey, in which such lands and tenements are situated, for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1891, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1891.

Such rate shall be payable and collected in two equal portions or instalments of One shilling each, and the first portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the 2nd day of January, 1891, and the second portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the 2nd day of July, 1891.

Such person as the Commissioners of the Romsey Shire Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive, collect and recover the said rate.

SHEPPARTON WATER TRUST.—RATING  
REGULATION FOR 1890.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Water Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

## REGULATION No. 7.

1. This Regulation shall apply to the Urban District of Numurkah.

2. The rates hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements, liable to be rated within the said urban district, shall pay in respect of the year 1890 in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes.

3. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Thirteen pounds ten shillings, or under, according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the sum of Twenty shillings; on every house or tenement above the annual value of Thirteen pounds ten shillings, according to the municipal valuation for the time being, an amount equal to Seven and a half per centum on the amount of the said municipal valuation. Provided that no owner or occupier shall be rated in respect of more than one vacant allotment.

4. The water supplied for other than domestic purposes shall be by measure.

5. The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense provide a meter.

6. Such meter shall be submitted to and examined by the authorized officer of the Trust, who, if he shall find the same correct and in proper working order, shall give his certificate to that effect, which, when fixed, shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such person. The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection, and so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto. The keys of the meter shall be in possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet-pipe leading from the service-pipe, unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.

7. All service-pipes, with the necessary stop-cocks, shall be supplied and fixed, at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Trust may appoint.

8. All delivery-cocks to be of high pressure and of strong hard brass, and in all exposed places to be opened and shut by a movable key or handle.

9. Plumbers or other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and fix meters, or to refix or relay the same, must satisfy the proper officer of the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner.

10. No meter shall be fixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

11. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises or of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied for the provision and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

12. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received

notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

13. Any person who, having been served with the notice mentioned in clause 5 of this Regulation, shall refuse or neglect to provide a meter within the time in such notice specified shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day after the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice on which he shall still refuse or neglect to comply with the terms of such notice.

14. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste.

15. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

16. No pipes shall be affixed to the main-pipe nor to any service-pipe or apparatus connected therewith, nor shall any alteration be made in any existing pipes or apparatus without notice, in writing, of the intention so to do being given to the Trust and the consent of the Trust thereto first had and obtained.

17. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

18. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

19. No hose or pipe shall be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground or trees, or plants, or washing-houses, or walls, carriages, or horses, or for any similar purpose unless the water is charged for by measure.

20. No person receiving water from the Trust shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or shall allow any person to take or carry away any such water, or shall sell the same to any other person.

21. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly-authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose.

22. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall each have a stop-cock at the main, and shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value half inch diameter. For the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds, but not more than One hundred pounds annual value three-quarter inch diameter. For the domestic supply of premises exceeding One hundred pounds annual value one inch diameter. For the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

23. The charge payable in respect of water supplied by measure shall be paid half-yearly, such charge shall be (except in the case of stand-pipe or hydrant water) One shilling and sixpence for every one thousand gallons.

24. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for per half-year to the various owners or occupiers hereinafter mentioned shall be as follows:—

In respect of a trough not exceeding twelve feet in length...	8,000 gallons
For every additional five feet or any fractional part thereof	4,000 gallons
In respect of steam-boilers, for each inch of the diameter of the largest cylinder	4,000 gallons
In respect of livery and carriers' stables, for each stall	1,000 gallons

In all other cases the minimum shall be a quantity equivalent to five hundred gallons for every One pound of the municipal valuation.

25. Stand-pipe or hydrant water, other than under section 120 of the Act, for each load of 100 gallons or under, One shilling, and for each additional 100 gallons or fraction of 100 gallons after the first, or any one load to be paid for at the time of taking, Sixpence.

26. If any person, whether supplied with water by the Trust or otherwise, shall commit a breach of these regulations, such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.

The foregoing regulation was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Water Trust on the 1st day of August, 1890.

# SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING REGULATION FOR 1891.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following regulations:—

## REGULATION FOR DETERMINING THE RATES AND CHARGES WHICH SHALL BE MADE FOR WATER SUPPLIED WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST DISTRICT.

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at £14 (Fourteen pounds) and upwards situated within the waterworks district of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust is hereby made for the year 1891.

2. The minimum rate for such year in respect of properties valued at less than Fourteen pounds sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings, as provided by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust district before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same: Provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Three shillings per annum.

4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use, or for the irrigation or watering of private gardens, or distribution on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For every public water-trough supplied with water by the Trust the sum of Twenty shillings per annum, unless such water be supplied by measurement.

6. For every steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power a charge by measurement shall be made.

7. Water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the charge will be One shilling per thousand gallons.

8. Watersupplied to Government departments, cricket-grounds, bowling-grounds, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement: Provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Fifty shillings per annum.

9. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrant for each load of two hundred and fifty gallons or under, Sixpence, and for each additional load *pro rata* upon the above scale.

10. For a temporary supply during the erection of a new building, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

11. For water supplied to premises not by measure, where horses are constantly kept, to be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for the first stall, and Seven shillings and sixpence per annum for each additional stall, in addition to the charge for domestic purposes.

12. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of January and the first day of July in such year, excepting those by measure, which shall be monthly.

13. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

The foregoing regulations were made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, and by virtue of the powers contained in the *Water Act 1890*, on the 11th day of November, 1890 (One thousand eight hundred and ninety).

# SWAN HILL SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGU- LATION BY THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

WHEREAS default has been made in payment by the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust of the interest due by the said Trust on loans granted by the Governor in Council to such Waterworks Trust, and the said Trust has also failed to form a sinking fund for the liquidation of such loans in accordance with the Act of Parliament in that behalf, and the Board of Land and Works, having done all things necessary under the powers in that behalf, it enabling, has entered upon and taken possession of the lands, tenements, and works of the said Trust.

And whereas notice that the said Swan Hill Shire Waterworks District is supplied with water has been given in the *Government Gazette*.

And whereas by two proclamations by the Governor in Council, bearing date the 18th day of December, 1883, certain portions of the Waterworks District (towns of Kerang and Castle Donnington), were proclaimed urban districts within the meaning of the *Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*.

And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the 27th October, 1890, made under the authority of the *Water Act 1890*, it was directed that the rates and charges which should be made and levied by the said Board of Land and Works in respect of the said urban districts should be made for the year 1891, and should be made in accordance with the provisions of Division 9 of Part 2 of the said last-mentioned Act.

Now therefore the Board of Land and Works doth hereby in exercise of the powers conferred by the said *Water Act 1890*, and in accordance with the said recited Order in Council of the 27th October, 1890, in that behalf, make the following Regulation in respect of the said urban districts for the year 1891, that is to say:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling for the year 1891 on the annual municipal valuation of all lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said urban districts.
2. The sum of One pound sterling shall be the minimum rate to be paid by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated in the said urban districts.
3. The rate to be charged for water supplied from the mains by measure shall be Three shillings and fourpence per one thousand gallons.
4. The rate to be made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1891.

Such person or persons as the said Board of Land and Works may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rates and charges.

The above Regulation is made by the Board of Land and Works in exercise of the powers vested in the said Board in that behalf the 6th day of November, 1890.

#### NO. 31.—URBAN DISTRICT OF MURTOA.

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust within the urban district of Murtoa—that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements if not on such streets are supplied by water by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds per annum, the sum of Ten pounds per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.

3. The births of 1,417 children, viz., 721 boys and 696 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of October. In the month of September, 1,627 births were registered, or 210 more than in the month under review. The births were 415 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 87 above that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in October numbered 591, viz., 330 of males and 261 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 826, or 140 per cent. The deaths were less than those in September by 22, but exceeded the average of October during the previous ten years by 107. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 51.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.09, and of deaths registered 1.29.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 76.0° on the 4th and 7th, and the lowest was 42.6° on the 2nd. The mean temperature of the month (56.7°) was a fraction above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (28.8°) took place on the 4th, and the least (8.8°) on the 20th. The mean daily range was 17.0°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.100 inches on the 27th, and the lowest was 29.193 inches on the 12th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.663 inches) was a quarter of an inch below the average.

Rain fell on 19 days, the amount of rainfall being 1.99 inches. The average rainfall in October during the previous ten years was 2.50 inches, or half an inch more than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 56 per cent., and females 44 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 31 per cent. to that mortality, as against 40 per cent. in October, 1889; 35 per cent. in October, 1888; 36 per cent. in October, 1887; 32 per cent. in October, 1886; 29 per cent. in October, 1885; 46 per cent. in October, 1884; 30 per cent. in October, 1883; 31 per cent. in October, 1882; 33 per cent. in October, 1881; and 37 per cent. in October, 1880.

Thirty-two deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a gentleman, aged 75, died of influenza; a female, aged 75, of cancer; a female, aged 75, of strangulated hernia; a female,

aged 76, of influenza; a shipwright and two females, each aged 76, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 76, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 76, of pneumonia; a female, aged 76, of congestion of the lungs; an agent, aged 77, of paralysis; a labourer, aged 78, of cancer; a female, aged 79, of bronchitis; a labourer, aged 79, of pleurisy; a male of occupation unknown, aged 83, of paralysis; a gentleman, aged 84, of cystitis; a female, aged 86, of bronchitis; a female, aged 88, of congestion of the lungs; a dairyman, aged 87, of cystitis; a female servant, aged 92, of bronchitis; a labourer, aged 77, a seaman, aged 78, a bootmaker and two females, each aged 80, a retired Supreme Court Judge, a labourer, and a female, each aged 83, a female, aged 84, a labourer, aged 85, a miner, aged 87, and a female, aged 96, of old age.

Thirty-three violent deaths took place during the month, of which 28 were set down to accident, 3 to homicide, and 2 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A paperhanger, aged 39, and two females, aged 57 and 74 respectively, died of injuries consequent on falls; a frenchpolisher, aged 39, a painter, aged 45, a draper, aged 62, and a labourer, aged 63, were passed over by railway trains; a farmer, aged 59, was killed by a tramcar; a boy, aged 8, by a dray; a boy, aged 15, died of injuries to the head, the result of a telegraph pole falling on him; a gentleman, aged 26, was killed in a steepchase; a farmer, aged 52, died of fracture of the skull; a female, aged 23, of a scalp wound; a widow, aged 72, of fracture of the thigh; a labourer, aged 31, of accidental injuries—how caused not stated; a male child, aged 2, of burns; two females, aged 46 and 49 respectively, of scalds; a female child, aged 3, from the effects of poison in milk; a female, aged 26, a house painter, aged 28, a farmer, aged 50, and a night watchman, aged 51, were drowned in the River Yarra; a law clerk, aged 26, and a seaman, aged 32, in Holson's Bay; a female child, aged 18 months, was drowned in a tank; a new-born female infant was overlain; a farmer, aged 56, was suffocated by food. The homicidal deaths were those of a male and a female infant, both newly-born, who were drowned; and a new-born male infant, who was suffocated, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in all cases. The suicidal deaths were those of a commission agent, aged 40, who shot himself; and a gardener, aged 56, who hanged himself.

One hundred and twenty-eight deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—53 in the Melbourne Hospital, 25 in the Alfred Hospital, 3 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 3 in the Children's Hospital, 3 in the Lying-in Hospital, 13 in the Immigrants' Home, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Austin Hospital, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Eye and Ear Hospital, 1 in the Infant Asylum, 2 in the Protestant Refuge, and 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 182, of which 92, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 90, or 49 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 124 were under one year of age, 29 were between one and two, 14 were between two and three, 10 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 409. Of these, 238, or 58 per cent., were males, and 171, or 42 per cent., were females; 20 were between five and ten, 10 were between ten and fifteen, 15 were between fifteen and twenty, 26 were between twenty and twenty-five, 29 were between twenty-five and thirty, 36 were between thirty and thirty-five, 29 were between thirty-five and forty, 22 were between forty and forty-five, 29 were between forty-five and fifty, 23 were between fifty and fifty-five, 37 were between fifty-five and sixty, 32 were between sixty and sixty-five, 42 were between sixty-five and seventy, 27 were between seventy and seventy-five, 16 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 16 were upwards of eighty.

In the month under notice, as compared with the previous month, deaths from typhoid fever increased by 4, but deaths from diphtheria decreased by 7, the former being 1 more and the latter 1 less than in the same month of 1889. # THE COUNTIES OF BORUNG, KARA KARA, KARKAROO, AND TATCHERA ALTERED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, diminish or extend the area of any county, or alter the boundaries or name of any county, and add the territory taken away from one county to any other adjacent county, and divide any county into two or more counties, and give to each a distinguishing name: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the Colony of Victoria, bearing date the twentieth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, the boundaries of (amongst others) the counties of Borung, Kara Kara, Karkaroo, and Tatchera were defined: And whereas by another Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the said colony, bearing date the third day of November, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, the boundaries of (amongst others) the county of Tatchera were altered and re-defined: And whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries of the said counties of Borung, Kara Kara, and Karkaroo, and to further alter the boundaries of the said county of Tatchera: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in exercise of the power conferred by the Act hereinbefore in part recited, do by this my Proclamation alter the boundaries of the counties of Borung, Kara Kara, Karkaroo, and Tatchera aforesaid, and do hereby define and proclaim the boundaries of the said counties so altered as aforesaid in manner following, that is to say:—

## THE COUNTY OF BORUNG.

Commencing at the source of Mount Cole Creek in the Great Dividing Range; thence by that Creek to the Wimmera River; thence by that river downwards to the centre of the road which forms the boundary between the parishes of Glynwyll and Kirkella; thence by the centre of that road bearing true north to the Richardson River; thence by that river downwards to the Avon River; thence by that river downwards to Lake Buloke; thence by the southern and eastern shores of that lake to the north boundary of the parish of Banyenong; thence by that boundary bearing east to the east boundary of the parish of Corack; thence by that boundary and the east boundary of the parish of Narraport bearing north-westerly and northerly to the north-east angle of the last-named parish; thence by the north and part of the west boundary of that parish bearing westerly and southerly to the north-east angle of the parish of Warmur; thence by part of the north boundary of that parish bearing westerly and southerly to the south-east angle of the parish of Ballapur; thence by the 36th parallel of latitude bearing west to the eastern shore of Lake Hindmarsh; thence by that lake bearing southerly to the Wimmera River; thence by that river upwards to Norton's Creek; thence by that creek upwards to its most eastern source; thence by a line bearing true south to the Glenelg River; thence by that river upwards to a point bearing true west from the Mount William Trigonometrical Survey Station; thence by a line bearing true east to that station; thence by the Mount William Range bearing southerly and easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 90, parish of Nekeeya; thence by that allotment bearing S. 80° 58' E. six chains ten links, S. 74° 46' E. seventeen chains twenty-eight links, S. 86° 33' E. four chains thirty-eight links, N. 81° 33' E. four chains sixty-four links, S. 78° 48' E. three chains twenty-five links, N. 88° 9' E. four chains thirty-six links, N. 81° 15' E. two chains thirty-five links, and N. 63° E. forty-three chains twenty links; thence by a line, by allotment 81, by a line, and by allotment 80 bearing N. 63° E. ninety-two chains two links; thence by allotment 80 bearing east eighty chains; thence by a line and allotment 61 bearing N. 75° 58' E. eighty-two chains forty-eight links; thence by allotment 1 bearing N. 45° E. fifty-six chains fifty-seven links; thence by a line bearing east three chains to the north-west angle of allotment 2; thence by the south side of a road, one chain wide, bearing east four hundred and eighty-three chains, more or less, to the Great Dividing Range; and thence by that range to the point of commencement.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

6. 7.
