Every survey, re-survey, or subdivision made or used for the purposes of any application or dealing in the Office of Titles must be made by or under the immediate personal supervision of a Surveyor licensed under the *Transfer of Land Act 1890*, and such survey, re-survey, or subdivision, and every plan submitted to the Office of Titles purporting to represent the same respectively, must be made in strict accordance with these Regulations and Instructions, and the Surveyor shall sign a certificate written on the face of the plan in the form given in the Appendix hereto, numbered one.

2. No Surveyor shall sign any certificate required by these Regulations and Instructions in respect of any survey or plan not actually made by him or under his immediate personal supervision, and a Surveyor acting in contravention of this regulation will be liable to have his licence revoked, and such survey or plan will be liable to be rejected by the Office of Titles.

3. The statutory declaration required of licensed Surveyors for plans under the 172nd section of the *Transfer of Land Act 1890* shall be in the form hereto appended, numbered two, and shall be made on the margin of the plan to which it refers.

4. The Surveyor will be expected to disclose all doubts, discrepancies, and difficulties, and to afford all other information obtainable by him relative to the property that may aid in securing accuracy and completeness in the certificate of title to the land. In these matters he will consider himself rather an agent and adviser of the Government than of the person incidentally employing him, nor will he regard for the interests of such employer be considered as excusing in any degree the withholding of any information affecting the merits of the application, even though the description supplied be literally and technically correct.

5. The Surveyor must adhere to the principle of the unchangeableness of original lines and corners established by Government or other duly authorized Surveyors, done in good faith; in other words, where the lines and corners have originally been established on the ground by a proper officer, in pursuance of the survey system authorized by the law of the time, and can be identified, they must be regarded as the true lines and corners which they represent, even if subsequent surveys show that the posts, pegs, or marks are out of line, and that the corners are out of position, according to the original description contained in the Crown grant or title.

6. If a re-survey or subdivision of the whole of any original Crown allotment is made for the purposes of the *Transfer of Land Act 1890*, the boundaries must be taken as originally marked on the ground, and the lines re-marked where necessary, so that the boundaries may be easily traced, and the several corners identified.

7. The Surveyor shall, if practicable, chain the actual boundaries of blocks under survey; but should insuperable difficulties render this impossible, the method observed in measuring and obtaining distances shall be clearly shown in the field notes.

8. The bearing of one of the sides of the original allotment, as given on the public maps, is to be taken as the datum of the bearings for a re-survey or subdivision of same; and where discrepancies are found to exist in the original bearings, preference is to be given to the longest side abutting on a street or road. Tie lines, in lieu of angles, may be given in the subdivision of small pieces of land; such tie lines must be sufficient to determine the exact form and area of the allotment.

9. When an irregular boundary is defined by offsets and insets measured thereto from traverse lines, such traverse lines must form part of the geometrical figure used in computing the area, and the areas of the portions lying between the traverse lines and the boundary are to be computed from such offsets and insets.

10. The names and widths of all streets, roads, or right-of-ways adjoining the block under survey must be recorded in field notes and on plan, the greatest care being taken to ascertain correctly the actual lines and widths of such streets, roads, &c. The widths of footpaths where defined must also be noted.

11. The actual measurements made in the field must be given, notwithstanding that they may not agree with the Crown grant or public charts; and should the difference be greater than the maximum of error allowable under the *Real Property Act 1890*, in addition to a complete survey of the allotment or parcel being dealt with, the entire frontage or frontages of the section from street to street or road to road must be measured as well as any other check line that may be deemed necessary by the Office of Titles, in order to determine whether any encroachment exists, or whether the differences arise from defects in the former surveys.

12. All bearings must be observed with a serviceable theodolite in good adjustment, and all measurements must be made with a Chesterman's steel tape, adjusted to the standard of the Survey Department.

13. All plans lodged or deposited at the Office of Titles must be prepared on drawing paper of good quality, in no case cut to less than foolscap size, and the quality of the drawing, printing, figuring, and writing must be satisfactory to the Chief Draughtsman. Plans on which erasures or alterations have been made, or which in any way have become damaged or defaced, will be liable to rejection.

14. All plans must be drawn to a scale sufficiently large to admit of the necessary details and dimensions being clearly inserted. The dimensions to be in links or feet and inches.

15. Every plan must bear upon its face a full description of what it purports to represent, for example:—Plan of survey of (part of) Crown allotment (section or portion as the case may be), city or town of _____, parish of _____, at (as suburb or locality within the parish), and county _____, and be dated.

16. Every plan of an allotment must show the nature of the boundaries at the date of survey, whether buildings, walls, fences, roads, natural features, pegs, &c. If the boundary is a wall, whether a party wall; and if the boundary line runs through the centre or otherwise.

17. Every plan of a subdivision must exhibit, distinctly delineated, all roads, streets, passages, thoroughfares, easements, squares, or reserves set apart for public use; and also show all allotments, with measurements and area, into which the land may be divided.

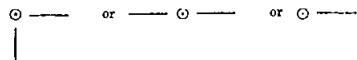
18. The parcel being dealt with is to be coloured pink.

19. The area of every allotment must be calculated by the Surveyor, and inserted distinctly on the face of the plan.

20. Proper field notes of all surveys are to be kept in books of convenient form, and any corrections in the entries made for practical errors are to be shown in red, with an explanatory note on the page on which they occur. Such field book shall be given up for inspection when asked for. A certified copy of the field notes, including corrections, to be furnished with the plan, if required.

21. All surveys for the purposes of the Transfer of Land Act are, where practicable, to be marked on the ground in the same manner as the original surveys of Crown lands by the Department of Lands and Survey, by substantial pegs and trenches; such pegs to be not less than 2 by 2 inches scantling of sound seasoned hardwood, not less than 14 inches long, driven 12 inches into the ground. At the pegs, where practicable, trenches at least 6 feet long, 9 inches deep, and 9 inches wide, commencing 1 foot from the pegs, are to be cut in the direction of the boundary lines.

22. The position of new pegs and trenches are to be shown on plan by small black circles and lines; the position of old pegs and trenches, when identified, to be shown by red circles and lines, thus—



23. The boundaries of subdivisions in cities or towns, where the ordinary method of marking by pegs and trenches is impracticable, must be marked by iron spikes, or in such other manner as may be ordered by the Commissioner of Titles, and Surveyors shall observe and comply with any special directions from time to time given by the Commissioner of Titles in respect to the mode of marking and conducting any survey.

24. The necessity for the greatest possible accuracy in surveys and plans cannot be too strongly impressed upon Surveyors, as in many cases no means exist by which errors can be immediately detected. If it is found, therefore, that the work of any Surveyor is not up to the standard of accuracy required by the Office of Titles, or that he has in other respects neglected to comply with the foregoing regulations, his plans will be rejected and his licence revoked.

THE BAIRNSDALE IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION No. 1.

THE Commissioners of the Bairnsdale Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 251 of the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following regulation:—

REGULATIONS FOR PROCEEDINGS OF MEETINGS, OFFICERS, ETC.

1. *General conduct of business.*—In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

2. *Ordinary meetings, when held.—Quorum.*—The ordinary meetings of the Trust shall be held at least monthly, on the third Thursday of every month, at the Trust's office, Bairnsdale, at Eleven o'clock in the forenoon, and five commissioners shall form a quorum.

3. *Confirmation of minutes of preceding meeting.*—At every ordinary meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting for confirmation of the minutes of preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

4. *Order of business at meetings.*—The order of business at meetings shall be as follows, or as nearly thereto as practicable, but for the convenience of the Trust such order may be temporarily varied:—

- (a) Reading of outward correspondence.
- (b) Reading of inward correspondence, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (c) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (d) Opening of and dealing with tenders.
- (e) Accounts.
- (f) Presentation of reports.
- (g) Orders of the day.
- (h) Motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (i) Reading notices of motion for consideration at future meetings.

5. *Petitions and memorials.*—Every petition or memorial addressed to the Trust shall be in proper form, and must be presented by a commissioner, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded, and who shall sign his name in the margin thereof; and no debate shall take place thereon, except as to its being received and taken into consideration.

6. *Orders of the day.*—The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the Trust, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration.

7. *Motions or amendments to be entered in minute-book.*—Every motion or amendment shall be entered in the minutes, with the names of the mover and seconder, and, on a division, the votes shall be recorded if so required by any commissioner.

8. *Notices of motion, in absence of mover, not to be dealt with unless under written authority.*—No notice of motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of the commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

9. *Motions referred to committee.*—The mover of any motion which may be referred to a committee shall, for the occasion, be a member of such committee.

10. *Amendments.*—One amendment only shall be received at one time, but if that is lost another may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried, one other amendment thereon may be moved.

11. *Motion for adjournment.*—No discussion shall be allowed upon any motion for adjournment of the Trust; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, or any other that may be allowed precedence, shall be discussed before any further motion for adjournment shall be entertained.

12. *Commissioners restricted to one speech on same question.*—The mover of any original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no commissioner shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order; but a commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

13. *Resolutions, how revoked.*—No resolution at any meeting of the Trust shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting unless notice of intention to propose such revocation or alteration be given to each of the commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of two-thirds of the commissioners present at such subsequent meeting. If the number of commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to, or by a majority if the number of commissioners present at subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

14. *Notices of motion, how received and dealt with.*—Every notice of motion shall be given to the secretary in writing, and shall be read aloud at the meeting previous to that at which the same is to be taken into consideration, or shall be handed to the secretary seven clear days before any ordinary meeting, in which case copies thereof shall be posted to each commissioner at the chairman's direction four clear days before such meeting; and every such motion shall, except by consent of the Trust, be considered in the order in which the same is recorded in the notice of motion book.

15. *Protests, how received and dealt with.*—Any commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and the notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered and signed by the protesting commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the secretary's office three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previous to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

16. *Interruption of debate through want of quorum.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

17. *Commissioners to address chair standing.*—Every commissioner shall address the chairman standing.

18. *Priority of speech to commissioners.*—If two or more commissioners rise to speak at the same time the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. *Commissioners when speaking to designate each other officially.*—The commissioners at Trust meetings shall designate each other by their official titles, viz., that of chairman or commissioner as the case may require.

20. *Points of order to be decided by chairman.*—The chairman, when called upon to decide points of order or practice shall, if requested, state the provisions, rules, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

21. *Penalty on commissioner for disobedience.*—Any commissioner who shall refuse to obey when ruled out of order, or who shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any commissioner, and who, if required by the chairman, shall refuse to withdraw such expression and make a satisfactory apology, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling.

22. *Commissioner interrupting meeting to be suspended therefrom.*—Any commissioner who shall persistently interrupt the business of any Trust meeting by disorderly conduct shall, upon the motion of any other commissioner, duly seconded and carried, be by the chairman's order suspended from such meeting.

23. *Strangers guilty of improper conduct to be removed.*—Any person not being a commissioner, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may by his order be forthwith removed and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling.

24. *Commissioner disobeying order for call guilty of an offence.*—Any commissioner not attending in compliance with an order for call of the whole Trust, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be guilty of an offence.

25. *General penalty.*—If any person shall be guilty of any breach of this regulation he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds sterling for every such offence.

26. *Commissioner to temporarily resume his seat if point of order is raised.*—No commissioner shall be interrupted whilst addressing the chairman, unless a point of order is raised, when he shall resume his seat until the point of order has been disposed of when the commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject; notwithstanding, however, the commissioner interrupted shall not be debarred from addressing the chairman on the point of order raised.

27. *Committees, appointment and duties of.*—The Trust may appoint occasional or standing committees who may meet from time to time, and adjourn from place to place, and fix the quorum of every such committee, and every such committee shall appoint one of the commissioners thereof to be chairman of such committee, and the Trust may from time to time continue, alter, or discontinue such committee, and such committee may from time to time remove such chairman, and every such committee shall report to the Trust. The chairman of the Trust shall be *ex officio* a member of all committees, and shall preside at all meetings at which he is present, unless disabled by law.

28. *Committee's minutes to be recorded.*—Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as their reports numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute-book, and shall be signed by the chairman, or one other member of committee, and shall be presented to the Trust, and the secretary, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of committees.

29. *Fixed date for committees to report.*—Upon the appointment of any committee a time shall be named for bringing up a report.

30. *Business hours of Trust.*—The Trust offices shall be open daily (Saturdays and Sundays excepted) between the hours of Nine a.m. and Four p.m., and on Saturdays between the hours of Nine a.m. and Twelve noon, during which time the secretary shall be in attendance for the purpose of transacting the ordinary

business of the Trust. The engineer shall be in attendance during the hours of business at every ordinary meeting of the Trust, and at such other times as the chairman may direct.

31. *Appointment of officers, how made.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until at least seven clear days' notice shall have been given in some newspaper circulating within the Trust's boundary, or in any two newspapers published in Melbourne, inviting applications for the same.

32. *Fidelity bond of officers.*—In all cases where security is required from officers for the faithful discharge of their duties, such security shall be obtained from an approved guarantee society, and the expense thereof shall be borne by the officer.

33. *Reports to be furnished by officers.*—All officers of the Trust shall deliver or cause to be delivered to the Trust official reports at every ordinary meeting, or at such other times as the Trust may direct.

34. *Seal of Trust.*—The common seal of the Trust shall be kept in a locked compartment, accessible to the chairman and secretary, and the seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the chairman or, in his absence, two commissioners be present.

35. *Books and documents of Trust to be open to inspection of commissioners.*—Any commissioner may of right demand the production of any documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion, and he may at any time during business hours require the officers of the Trust to produce for his inspection or examination any books or documents belonging to the Trust.

36. *Accounts when dealt with.*—No accounts shall be dealt with at any meeting of the commissioners unless received at the offices of the Trust two clear days preceding the day of meeting.

The foregoing Regulation, No. 1, was made by the Commissioners of the Bairnsdale Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under and by virtue of section 254 of the *Water Act 1890*, this sixteenth day of October, One thousand eight hundred and ninety, and the corporate seal of the said Trust was affixed hereto in the presence of—

BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD WATERWORKS TRUST. —RATING REGULATION FOR 1891.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following:—

REGULATION NUMBERED 9.

Fixing the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied within the Trust District, such rate being made for the year commencing on the first day of January, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1891.

The rates and charges which shall be payable by the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements within the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust District, who are supplied with water by the Trust, shall be as follows, viz.:—

1. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel, of the annual value of £20 and under, the sum of £1 1s. per annum.
2. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel, above the annual value of £20, and not exceeding the annual value of £200, the sum of £5 per cent. per annum on the valuation.
3. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel, above the annual value of £200, the sum of £4 10s. per cent. on the valuation.
4. On every hotel of the annual value of £30 and under, a minimum rate of £2 per annum.
5. On every hotel above the annual value of £30, the sum of £6 per cent. per annum on the valuation, provided that the charge shall not in any case be less than £2.
6. On unoccupied lands, and lands on which no tenements are erected, the sum of £5 per cent. on the annual valuation.
7. On livery, coach, and hotel stables, at the rate of 10s. per annum for the first stall, and 7s. 6d. per annum for each additional stall. In open sheds used for stabling, each six feet to be considered as one stall. For horses kept on private premises, 10s. per annum for the first horse kept and 7s. 6d. per annum for each additional horse.

Cows to be paid for at the rate of 1s. each per annum.

Water-troughs, 10s. each per annum.

8. Water supplied by meter to be at the rate of 2s. per 1,000 gallons, except to manufactories, aerated water makers, &c., to whom the charge shall be 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons, provided that not less than 50,000 gallons per annum is consumed, failing which the charge shall be 2s. per 1,000.

9. Water supplied for irrigation of gardens, nurseries, cricket grounds, &c., to be charged for at the rate of 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per annum.

10. For water supplied to buildings in course of erection, the charge shall be 20s. per cent. on the amount of the contract for brickwork, stonework, or plastering; or should the Trust require a meter to be affixed, the rate shall be 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons.

11. For water supplied to steam-boilers, the charge shall be at the rate of 10s. per horse-power per annum.

12. The charge for water supplied for mining purposes shall be as per agreement.

13. These rates and charges shall be payable by equal half-yearly instalments, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1891, except in cases where the Trust may have made a special agreement regarding the times of payment for water supplied by measure or for mining purposes.

14. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate and charges.

The foregoing Regulation, numbered nine, was made and adopted by the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust, this 14th day of November, 1890.

LOWAN SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1891.

THE Commissioners of the Lowan Shire Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within the Nhill Urban District, that is to say:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds sterling annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual value, an amount equal to One shilling in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

3. For all tenements in the said urban district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half a mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates.

4. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, One pound per annum on each inch diameter of the cylinder.

5. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum, 20,000 gallons.

Exceeding half an acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre for every additional acre; and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for every fractional part of an acre.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1891, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1891, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1891.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Lowan Shire Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive, and collect and recover the said rate.

THE MARQUIS HILL IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—LOAN.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council, in pursuance of section 3 of *The Water Supply Loans Act 1889*, has granted as a loan for irrigation works to the Marquis Hill Irrigation and Water Supply Trust the sum of Two thousand pounds sterling (£2,000), such said Trust being a corporation named in the second part of the Schedule to the said Act, and the sum not being in excess of the amount set forth in the said part opposite the name of such corporation. The repayment of the said loan to be secured by the said corporation giving a mortgage or deed of charge to the Board of Land and Works over the works of the said Trust, and over all moneys and rates payable to the said Trust under the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*. The rate of interest to be paid by the said Trust to be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum.

RODNEY IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, the Commissioners of the Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

REGULATION No. 3.

1. The charges of the Trust in respect of a supply of water from its works for domestic and stock purposes, shall be as follows:—

(a) To the owner or occupier of land through whose property or holding a channel of the Trust passes, for every 640 acres, or portion thereof, Ten shillings.

(b) For the filling of a tank or dam of a capacity of two hundred and fifty (250) cubic yards, or under, Ten shillings.

(c) For the filling of a tank or dam of a capacity exceeding two hundred and fifty (250) cubic yards, and not exceeding five hundred (500) cubic yards, Twenty shillings.

(d) For the filling of a tank or dam of a capacity exceeding five hundred (500) cubic yards; in addition to the charge up to five hundred (500) cubic yards—for per thousand (1,000) cubic yards or portion thereof extra, Ten shillings.

2. A rebate of Two shillings per mile may be made to the owner or occupier of property who has to conduct the water on to his land from a distant channel of the Trust for the purpose of filling his tank or dam.

SHEPPARTON WATER TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1890.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Water Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION No. 7.

1. This Regulation shall apply to the Urban District of Numurkah.

2. The rates hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements, liable to be rated within the said urban district, shall pay in respect of the year 1890 in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes.

3. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Thirteen pounds ten shillings, or under, according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the sum of Twenty shillings; on every house or tenement above the annual value of Thirteen pounds ten shillings, according to the municipal valuation for the time being, an amount equal to Seven and a half per centum on the amount of the said municipal valuation. Provided that no owner or occupier shall be rated in respect of more than one vacant allotment.

4. The water supplied for other than domestic purposes shall be by measure.

5. The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense provide a meter.

6. Such meter shall be submitted to and examined by the authorized officer of the Trust, who, if he shall find the same correct and in proper working order, shall give his certificate to that effect, which, when fixed, shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such person. The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection, and so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto. The keys of the meter shall be in possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected

with more than one separate and distinct inlet-pipe leading from the service-pipe, unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.

7. All service-pipes, with the necessary stop-cocks, shall be supplied and fixed, at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Trust may appoint.

8. All delivery-cocks to be of high pressure and of strong hard brass, and in all exposed places to be opened and shut by a movable key or handle.

9. Plumbers or other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and fix meters, or to refix or relay the same, must satisfy the proper officer of the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner.

10. No meter shall be fixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

11. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises or of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied for the provision and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

12. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

13. Any person who, having been served with the notice mentioned in clause 5 of this Regulation, shall refuse or neglect to provide a meter within the time in such notice specified shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day after the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice on which he shall still refuse or neglect to comply with the terms of such notice.

14. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste.

15. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

16. No pipes shall be affixed to the main-pipe nor to any service-pipe or apparatus connected therewith, nor shall any alteration be made in any existing pipes or apparatus without notice, in writing, of the intention so to do being given to the Trust and the consent of the Trust thereto first had and obtained.

17. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

18. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

19. No hose or pipe shall be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground or trees, or plants, or washing-houses, or walls, carriages, or horses, or for any similar purpose unless the water is charged for by measure.

20. No person receiving water from the Trust shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or shall allow any person to take or carry away any such water, or shall sell the same to any other person.

21. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly-authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose.

22. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall each have a stop-cock at the main, and shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value half inch diameter. For the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds, but not more than One hundred pounds annual value three-quarter inch diameter. For the domestic supply of premises exceeding One hundred pounds annual value one inch diameter. For the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

23. The charge payable in respect of water supplied by measure shall be paid half-yearly, such charge shall be (except in the case of stand-pipe or hydrant water) One shilling and sixpence for every one thousand gallons.

24. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for per half-year to the various owners or occupiers hereinafter mentioned shall be as follows:—

In respect of a trough not exceeding twelve feet in length...	8,000 gallons
For every additional five feet or any fractional part thereof	4,000 gallons
In respect of steam-boilers, for each inch of the diameter of the largest cylinder	4,000 gallons
In respect of livery and carriers' stables, for each stall	1,000 gallons

In all other cases the minimum shall be a quantity equivalent to five hundred gallons for every One pound of the municipal valuation.

25. Stand-pipe or hydrant water, other than under section 120 of the Act, for each load of 100 gallons or under, One shilling, and for each additional 100 gallons or fraction of 100 gallons after the first, or any one load to be paid for at the time of taking, Sixpence.

26. If any person, whether supplied with water by the Trust or otherwise, shall commit a breach of these regulations, such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.

The foregoing regulation was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Water Trust on the 1st day of August, 1890.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING REGULATION FOR 1891.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulations:—

REGULATION FOR DETERMINING THE RATES AND CHARGES WHICH SHALL BE MADE FOR WATER SUPPLIED WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST DISTRICT.

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at £14 (Fourteen pounds) and upwards situated within the waterworks district of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust is hereby made for the year 1891.

2. The minimum rate for such year in respect of properties valued at less than Fourteen pounds sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings, as provided by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust district before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same: Provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Three shillings per annum.

4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic use, or for the irrigation or watering of private gardens, or distribution on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For every public water-trough supplied with water by the Trust the sum of Twenty shillings per annum, unless such water be supplied by measurement.

6. For every steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power a charge by measurement shall be made.

7. Water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the charge will be One shilling per thousand gallons.

8. Watersupplied to Government departments, cricket-grounds, bowling-grounds, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement: Provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Fifty shillings per annum.

9. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrant for each load of two hundred and fifty gallons or under, Sixpence, and for each additional load *pro rata* upon the above scale.

10. For a temporary supply during the erection of a new building, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

11. For water supplied to premises not by measure, where horses are constantly kept, to be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for the first stall, and Seven shillings and sixpence per annum for each additional stall, in addition to the charge for domestic purposes.

12. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of January and the first day of July in such year, excepting those by measure, which shall be monthly.

13. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

The foregoing regulations were made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, and by virtue of the powers contained in the *Water Act 1890*, on the 11th day of November, 1890 (One thousand eight hundred and ninety).

23. The charge payable in respect of water supplied by measure shall be paid half-yearly on the dates provided by clause two (2) of this regulation. Such charge shall be (except in the case of stand-pipe or hydrant water) One shilling and sixpence for every one thousand (1,000) gallons.

24. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for per half-year to the various owners or occupiers hereinafter mentioned, shall be as follows:—

In respect of a trough not exceeding 12 feet in length	8,000 gallons
For every additional 5 feet or any fractional part thereof	4,000 gallons
In respect of steam boilers—for each inch of the diameter of the largest cylinder	4,000 gallons
In respect of livery and carriers' stables—for each stall	1,000 gallons

In all other cases the minimum shall be a quantity equivalent to five hundred gallons for every One pound of the municipal valuation.

25. Stand-pipe or hydrant water supplied other than by rate under section 120 of the *Water Act 1890*—For each load of 100 gallons or under, One shilling; and for each additional 100 gallons or fraction of 100 gallons after the first or any one load, to be paid for at the time of taking, Sixpence.

26. If any person, whether supplied with water by the Trust or otherwise, shall commit a breach of these regulations, such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.

The foregoing regulation was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Water Trust on the 7th day of November, 1890.

SWAN HILL SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGU- LATION BY THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

WHEREAS default has been made in payment by the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust of the interest due by it on loans granted by the Governor in Council to such Waterworks Trust, and the said Trust has also failed to form a sinking fund for the liquidation of such loans in accordance with the Act in that behalf. And the Board of Land and Works, having done all things necessary in that behalf it enabling, has entered upon and taken possession of the lands, tenements, and works of the said Trust. And whereas notice that the said Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust District is supplied with water has been given in the *Government Gazette*.

And whereas by an Order in Council, bearing date the 18th day of November, 1890, the Waterworks District of the said Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust, exclusive of the lands comprised within certain urban districts (towns of Kerang and Castle Donington being part of the Waterworks District), proclaimed on the 18th day of December, 1883, was divided into four divisions, the boundaries of each were in and by such Order in Council limited and defined.

And it was further directed and determined in and by such Order in Council that the rates necessary for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust, and for the maintenance of the waterworks of the said Trust, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, should be levied in Divisions I., II., and III., described in the said Order in Council, and that the proportion in which such divisions should be rated respectively one to another should be as follows:—

In Division I.—A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling upon the annual municipal value of all rateable property situated therein.

In Division II.—A rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling upon the annual municipal value of all rateable property situated therein.

In Division III.—A rate of One shilling and tenpence in the pound sterling upon the annual municipal value of all rateable property situated therein.

And whereas by a certain further Order in Council, bearing date the 25th day of November, 1890, the Board of Land and Works was empowered to make a rate for the year 1890 in respect of the aforesaid Divisions I., II., and III., and that such rate should be of the respective amounts hereinbefore mentioned.

Now therefore the Board of Land and Works doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, and of the said recited Order in Council of the 25th day of November, 1890, in that behalf, make the following Regulation.

The following rates are hereby made, and shall be payable for the year 1890 upon all rateable property within the aforesaid Divisions I., II., and III. of the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust District, that is to say:—

In Division I.—A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling upon the annual municipal value of all rateable property situated therein.

In Division II.—A rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling upon the annual municipal value of all rateable property situated therein.

In Division III.—A rate of One shilling and tenpence in the pound sterling upon the annual municipal value of all rateable property situated therein.

The above rates are hereby made payable on the 15th day of December, 1890.

Such person or persons as the Board of Land and Works may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rates.

The above Regulation is made by the Board of Land and Works in exercise of the powers vested in the said Board in that behalf the 28th day of November, 1890.

WIMMERA UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1891.

THE Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulations:—

No. 30.—URBAN DISTRICT OF DONALD.

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust within the urban district of Donald—that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements if not on such streets are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds per annum, the sum of Ten pounds per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.

3. For all tenements in the said urban district situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1891, commencing on the 1st of January, 1891, and terminating on the 31st December, 1891, and shall be payable—the one moiety on the 1st of January and the other moiety on the 1st of July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

No. 31.—URBAN DISTRICT OF MURTOA.

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust within the urban district of Murtoa—that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements if not on such streets are supplied by water by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds per annum, the sum of Ten pounds per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.

3. No. 32.—URBAN DISTRICT OF WARRACKNABEAL.

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Vermin Destruction Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor may from time to time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare any animal, bird, or reptile therein named to be a natural enemy of vermin, and may prohibit within any district therein described the wounding, killing or capturing, selling, or disposing of any such animal, bird, or reptile without a special permit on that behalf signed by the Chief Inspector, and may from time to time alter or revoke any such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under and by virtue of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation declare the animals known as

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

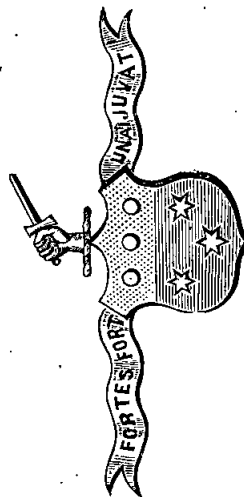

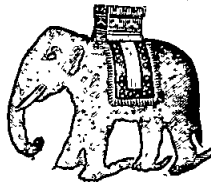
