PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA AND CONSTITUTION OF A NEW SHIRE.

REGULATION RELATING TO THE REGISTRATION OF PLUMBERS AND GASFITTERS.

Any person in any way employed on the 25th day of November, 1889, as a plumber or gasfitter, whether as a master or workman, will be registered as a plumber or gasfitter, or as a plumber and gasfitter (as the case may be), on forwarding to the Secretary, Board of Public Health, before the 31st day of March next, satisfactory evidence of the fact of his being so employed, with his full name and address, and the name of the municipal district in which he is resident.
2. A statutory declaration of employment as aforesaid will be considered satisfactory evidence under the preceding Regulation, provided that, in the case of a workman, a certificate of employment by a master may be required by the Board.
3. Any person not employed in any way as a plumber or gasfitter, whether as master or servant, on the 25th November, 1889, and any person so employed who has not complied with the provisions of the next but one preceding Regulation, will be registered on producing to the Board satisfactory evidence of his competence as a plumber or gasfitter (as the case may be).
4. Any registered plumber or gasfitter shall notify to the Secretary of the Board any change in his residence.

"THE IRRIGATION ACT 1886."

IN the matter of the petition of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, praying for the constitution of a certain portion of its Waterworks district as an Irrigation and Water Supply District within the meaning of the said Act, and for the appointment and creation of a Trust for such district.

Pursuant to section 18 of the said Act, I hereby declare upon the said petition the matters following, viz:—

1. That the scheme or plan of works will comprise a storage reservoir at Lake Lonsdale, with channels from Fyans Creek, the Mokepilly Creek, and Pleasant Creek, to divert their waters into the basin; a main supply channel from the reservoir to the Glenorchy weir, which will be enlarged and strengthened to adapt it to act as the distribution head-work; a system of distribution and reticulation channels to convey and distribute the water throughout the irrigable area of the Trust district; and the existing channels, dams, tanks, and other works owned by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust.

2. That all the works shall be Trust works.

3. That the amount of money which it is proposed that the Board of Land and Works shall advance by way of loan, for the purpose of carrying out the said works, is Four hundred and twenty-five thousand pounds (£425,000) sterling.

4. That the rate of interest to be paid by the Trust upon such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum.

5. That the sources from which the Trust will obtain its water supply will be the Fyans Creek, Mokepilly Creek, and Pleasant Creek, the waters of which will be stored in a reservoir to be constructed at Lake Lonsdale; and the Wimmera River at Glenorchy weir. From the reservoir the Trust will be entitled to take and use the whole volume of water stored therein. From the Wimmera River at Glenorchy, the Trust will be entitled to take and use two-thirds of the total natural volume at any time flowing therein, provided that no water shall be withdrawn from the river when its volume is less than three hundred (300) cubic feet per minute.

6. That the powers of rating to be given to the Trust shall not exceed the sum of Four shillings in the pound of the net annual value of the property in the Trust district.

BACCHUS MARSH IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—RATING REGULATION No. 1.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Rating Regulation (No. 1), made by the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under the provisions of section 95 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*.

REGULATION No. 1.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust do hereby make this Regulation for annual rating and other charges and purposes as follows:—

- For every house or tenement of £20 annual value or under, situated within the area supplied by the water mains of the Trust, the minimum sum of £1 per annum shall be charged.
- For every house or tenement above the annual value of £20, used partly or wholly as a domicile, 5 per cent. on the annual value.
- For every house or tenement above the annual value of £20, not being a domicile, 3½ per cent. on the annual value; minimum, £1.
- For water supplied from channels for irrigation purposes the rate shall be 1d. per 1,000 gallons, which is equivalent to 6d. per 1,000 cubic feet. Delivery shall be made of not less than 60,000 gallons at one time, and the water shall be delivered from the channels at such times and in such manner as may from time to time be directed by regulations made by the Trust.
- All measurement of water for irrigation shall be by gauges, approved, fixed, and kept in repair at the expense of the owner or occupier of the land irrigated, and to the satisfaction of the Trust. The registration of the quantity supplied shall be made by an officer of the Trust, and the gauges shall not be removed or interfered with without the consent of such officer.
- Delivery of water for irrigation shall be taken at such times and in such order as the Trust shall direct, and if absolutely necessary shall be continued on Sunday. Every person shall receive notification of the time when water will be supplied to him, and to what extent.
- Any person not being duly authorized who shall open irrigation outlets, or do any act that may cause damage to the works of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.
- Applications for water for irrigation shall be accompanied by cash for payment of same to the amount covering quantity required, but the Trust shall not necessarily deliver the full amount of any such order thus received. Any sum paid for water not supplied will be returned to the applicant.
- For every water trough the sum of 10s. per annum shall be paid.
- For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, 10s. per annum on each inch of the diameter of the cylinder.
- The rate to be charged for water supplied by the Trust from any standpipe shall be 1s. for one load of 200 gallons or less, and for each additional 100 gallons or part thereof, 6d.

12. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement from the mains (except a special agreement be made) 2s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons shall be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purposes of irrigation, or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

	Gallons.
¼ of an acre and less, per annum	8,000
Exceeding ¼ of an acre, but not exceeding ½ acre, per annum	12,000
Exceeding ½ acre, but not exceeding ¾ acre, per annum	16,000
Exceeding ¾ acre, but not exceeding 1 acre, per annum	28,000
Exceeding 1 acre, but not exceeding 1 ½ acres, per annum	34,000
Exceeding 1 ½ acres, but not exceeding 2 acres, per annum	40,000

And at the rate of 40,000 gallons per acre for every additional acre, and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

In cases of extensions of area supplied, or new applications from persons desirous of obtaining a supply of water by measurement during the currency of the year, all such applications granted subsequent to 30th June in any year shall be entitled to a rebate of one half the annual charge.

In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 3,000 gallons per stall used for above purposes, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

13. For water supplied by the Trust to public parks, gardens, or show yards (except a special agreement be made), 6d. per 1,000 gallons shall be charged; and to market gardens, nurseries, and vineyards, cultivated for trade purposes, 1s. per 1,000 gallons.

14. In lieu of any of the measurement charges in this regulation, the Trust may, whenever it shall be deemed expedient, or any person obtaining water from the mains, may cause a meter or meters to be affixed, such to be provided at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement at rates to be fixed by written agreement for a period of not less than six months. The annual water rate payable on shire assessment to go in liquidation of such charges by measurement, and be supplemented by any additional amount required. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial is capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons.

15. For a temporary supply during erection of buildings a charge of 5s. per week during period of erection, with a minimum of 10s., or by meter, as mentioned in clause 14. When a special connection with the main has to be made the applicant must pay the cost of such connection.

16. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carrier's stable, or a supply for any manufacturing purpose, or for irrigation of grass plots, gardens, or grounds, either by manual conveyance or mechanical or artificial contrivance for transporting water to the roots of plants, or trees, or grasses, either with or without labour; or for water power; or for fountains or any ornamental purpose. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground or trees or plants unless the water is supplied by measure, computed by acreage as above, or by meter.

17. If any meter should cease registering, from period of such cessation, and during the time when it is undergoing repair, the Trust shall estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

18. Fire plugs shall not be used except for purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them be allowed by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of an officer of the Trust.

19. Any person receiving water from the Trust, who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

20. Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe or channel, without being authorized by the Trust to do so, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

21. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or for the purpose of irrigating gardens, &c., without paying the charges imposed by these regulations, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each breach.

22. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair, or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust until he shall have obtained from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

23. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.

24. No person (whether a licensed plumber or not) shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust; nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust, appointed for the purpose. And any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such breach.

25. Any person, whether licensed or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes, the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the

Trust of his intention to do so, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe, the property of the Trust, without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, open, or injure any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, weir, channel, reservoir, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding £20.

26. Before any licensed person shall break up any footpath for the purpose of laying on the water from the main to any house or premises, he shall deposit with the Trust the sum of £2, and in case he shall not, immediately after laying on the water as aforesaid, make good and restore the said footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of £2 shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good or restoring the said footpath or otherwise as the Trust may deem best.

27. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, under a penalty of £5, and in the event of continuing the offence to a penalty of £2 for each day after notice from the Trust.

28. Overflow waste pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

29. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, as the Trust may deem fit, unless the necessary repair shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipe, the occupier, if any, and if none, the owner shall, in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair, or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of £2 for each day after notice of offence from the Trust.

30. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officers of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty of £2 for each offence.

31. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes, or permits to be done anything in contravention to these regulations or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charges imposed by the Trust, when due, or fails to do anything which, under any of these regulations, ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

32. In construction of these regulations the word "person" shall extend to and be deemed to include a corporation whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust.

The above-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st January, 1890, and ending on the 31st December, 1890, and shall be paid half-yearly in advance on the 1st January and 1st July, 1890; and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust may from time to time approve of for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

CAMPASPE IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation, No. 1, made by the Campaspe Irrigation and Water Supply Trust under the provisions of section 95 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*.

REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the Campaspe Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 95 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, do make the following Regulation:—

No. 1.—*Regulation of Proceedings at Meetings of the Campaspe Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, &c., &c.*

1. *General conduct of business.*—In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed as far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

2. *Minutes of meeting to be read at next subsequent meeting.*—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy

as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall be signed by the chairman; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Trust at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting if required.

3. *Order of business at meetings.*—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to the effect:—

- (i.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the Trust.
- (ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (v.) Payments.
- (vi.) Ordinary business.
- (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (viii.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (ix.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (x.) Notices of motion.
- (xi.) Reading rough minutes if required.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. *Addresses to Governor.*—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

5. *Motions.*—All notices of motion shall be dated, and given by the intending mover to the secretary at the close of the meeting of the Trust, or delivered to him at his office personally or by post, provided that he receive them at least four days before the meeting at which they are to be proposed; and such secretary shall number and enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

6. *Notice of motion to be given.*—No commissioner shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion, but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

7. *Petitions.*—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

8. *Motions to be moved in order in motion book.*—Except by leave of the Trust, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the secretary in the notice of motion book, or they may be postponed by vote of the Trust, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

9. *Motion to be proceeded with by commissioner giving same, except with consent.*—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

10. *Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.*—No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

11. *Order, &c., of debate.*—Any commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the commissioner (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

12. *Nature of motion to be stated.*—Any commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

13. *Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Trust.

14. *Motion to be seconded.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded, but a commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

15. *Mover of motion.*—A commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

16. *Designation of commissioners.*—The commissioners in meeting of Trust shall designate each other by their official title, namely, that of chairman or commissioner, as the case may require.

17. *Priority of commissioners.*—If two or more commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

18. *Chairman to rise in addressing Trust.*—The chairman shall rise in addressing the Trust to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

19. *Commissioner not to speak a second time on same question.*—No commissioner shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

20. *Points of order.*—The chairman, when called upon to decide upon points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final, except when an appeal is made to the Trust immediately upon the chairman giving his decision. On such an appeal no commissioner shall speak more than once, and the question shall be put thus:—Shall the decision of the chair be maintained.

31. *Commissioners not to digress, &c.*—No commissioner shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other commissioner in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on commissioners shall be deemed highly disorderly.

32. *Commissioners to apologize for disorderly, &c., expressions.*—Whenever any commissioner shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other commissioner, the commissioner so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

33. *Commissioners called to order to sit down.*—A commissioner called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

34. *Commissioners twice offending guilty of an offence.*—Any commissioner using offensive or disorderly language, and having been called twice to order or to withdraw and apologize for such conduct and refusing so to do, shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this regulation.

35. *Strangers.*—Any person, not being a commissioner, who having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, shall be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this regulation.

36. *Committee of the whole.*—Whenever a majority of the Trust determine, any matter before the Trust may be referred to a committee of the whole for consideration and report to the Trust, and such report may be received and adopted, or otherwise, as the Trust may think fit. When the Trust resolves itself into a committee of the whole, the public shall be ordered to withdraw by the chairman, and the doors shall be closed, unless a majority of the committee determine otherwise.

37. *Commissioner not attending order for call.*—Any commissioner not attending in compliance with an order for call of the whole Trust, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this regulation.

38. *Commissioners may demand documents.*—Any commissioner may of right demand the production of any documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion, and he may at any time, during business hours, require the officers of the Trust to produce for his inspection or examination any books or documents belonging to the Trust; but such books or documents shall not be removed from the offices without the permission of the chairman, and then only for short and limited periods.

39. *Voting.*—The Trust shall vote by show of hands; and any commissioner present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this regulation. Divisions shall be taken upon any question submitted to the vote of the Trust, provided any commissioner demand it, before the next business has been proceeded with. When a division is taken, the secretary shall call the names of those commissioners who are present, and enter in his minute book how each vote, whether affirmatively or negatively, and the result shall be declared by the chairman.

40. *Question, how declared.*—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Trust, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

41. *Motions, &c., to be in writing.*—At every meeting of the Trust all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

42. *Amendments.*—(1) No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of. (2) An amendment destroying or altering the intention of a motion shall be in order, but an amendment relating to a different subject shall not be in order. (3) On an amendment to "strike out and insert," the paragraph to be amended shall first be read as it stands, then the words proposed to be struck out inserted, and finally, the paragraph as it would stand if so amended.

43. *Effect of rejection of original motion.*—If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

44. *If amendment be negatived, a second one may be moved.*—If an amendment be negatived, then a second amendment may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved; but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Trust for discussion at a time.

45. *Mover of motion to have right of reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no commissioner, with the above exception, shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

46. *Adjournment.*—(1) No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Trust; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made. (2) A motion to adjourn shall always be in order, except—1st, when a commissioner is in possession of the floor; 2nd, when the commissioners are voting; 3rd, when adjournment was the last preceding motion; 4th, when

it has been decided that the previous question shall be taken. (3) A motion simply to adjourn cannot be amended, but a motion to adjourn may be amended, and is open to debate.

37. *Protests.*—Any commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall, in every case, be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary, and signed by such commissioner, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

38. *Lapsed questions.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

39. *Explanations.*—While a member is speaking no one shall interrupt, except for the purpose of calling to order, or asking of the chairman leave to explain, or to call the previous question. A commissioner allowed to explain shall only have the right to explain an actual misunderstanding of language, and shall be strictly prohibited from going into debate on the merits of the case.

40. *Privileged questions.*—(1) When a question is before the Trust, the only motions to order shall be—1st, to adjourn; 2nd, the previous question; 3rd, to lay on the table; 4th, to postpone indefinitely; 5th, to postpone to a definite period; 6th, to refer; 7th, to divide, if the sense will permit of it; 8th, to amend, to take precedence as herein arranged, and the first three to be decided without debate. (2) When the previous question is moved and seconded, it shall be put in this form:—"Shall the main question now be put." If this is carried, all further amendments and debates shall be excluded, and the question be put without delay. If the question has been amended, the question shall be taken on the amendment first. It shall not be in order to reconsider the agreement to take the previous question. (3) When a motion and amendment are under discussion, it will be in order for any member to give notice of another amendment which he intends to move in the event of the amendment being lost. Upon such notice no debate will be allowed at that stage. (4) When a motion is postponed indefinitely, it shall not come up again during that meeting.

41. *Resolutions, how revoked or altered.*—No resolution at any meeting of the Trust shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting unless notice of the intention to propose such resolution or alteration be given to each of the commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of two-thirds of the commissioners present at such subsequent meeting, if the number of commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to, or by a majority, if the number of the commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

42. *Special meetings.*—The Trust may hold special meetings, and the chairman or any three or more of the commissioners may call a special meeting, but no such meeting shall be held unless four clear days' notice thereof at least be given.

43. *Notices of meetings.*—All notices of any meeting or adjourned meeting of the Trust shall be in writing, and shall be delivered or sent by the post or otherwise to the place of abode or place of business of each of the commissioners two clear days at least previous to such meeting; and every such notice shall specify the time of meeting; and in case of a special meeting, shall specify the object thereof; and no business shall be transacted at any special meeting except such as is stated in the notice thereof.

44. *Power to suspend officers.*—The Trust may, at any ordinary or special meeting, resolve that a special meeting be called to consider the removal from his office of any officer appointed by the Trust, and may direct that notice of such special meeting be given, and thereupon may suspend such officer from his office pending the holding of such meeting, and may appoint some other person to perform the duties of such office in the meanwhile.

45. *Committees of Trust, and quorum.*—The Trust may from time to time, as they may see fit, appoint occasional or standing committees, and may fix the quorum of every such committee, and every such committee shall appoint one of the commissioners thereof to be chairman of such committee; and the Trust may from time to time continue, alter, or discontinue such committee, and such committee may from time to time remove such chairman, and every such committee shall report to the Trust. The chairman of the Trust shall be *ex-officio* member of all committees, and shall preside at all meetings at which he is present.

46. *Meetings, chairman, &c., of committee.*—Every committee so appointed may meet from time to time, and may adjourn from place to place, as they may think proper, but no business shall be transacted at any meeting of the committee unless the quorum of members (if any) fixed by the Trust, and if no quorum be fixed, three members be present; and at all meetings of the committee, if the chairman be not present, one of the commissioners present shall be appointed chairman; and all questions shall be determined by a majority of the votes of the commissioners present, and in case of an equal division of votes, the chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to his vote as a member of the committee.

47. *Seal.*—The seal of the Trust shall be in custody of the secretary, and shall not be impressed except by direction of the Trust, and in the presence of at least two commissioners.

48. *Lapsed order of the day may be restored.*—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

49. *Committees.*—Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute book, and, being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the Trust; and the secretary, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of the committees.

50. *Meetings of committee.*—The secretary shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any time thereafter by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or of any two members of the committee.

51. *Petitions.*—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

52. *Petitions to be respectful.*—It shall be incumbent on every commissioner presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that the contents do not violate any by-law or any provision hereof.

53. *Commissioners to affix their names.*—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

54. *Petition to be in writing.*—Every petition shall be in writing and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and the petition shall be prepared in a way similar to that adopted with regard to petitions presented to Parliament.

55. *To be signed by the petitioners.*—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

56. *No letters, &c., to be attached.*—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

57. *No letters or memorials to be dealt with.*—No letters or memorials shall be dealt with at any meeting of the commissioners unless received at the offices of the Trust, or the office of the chairman, not later than the day preceding the day of meeting.

58. *Deputations to signify intention.*—Deputations can only be received by the Trust when they have signified their intention of waiting upon the Trust, and stated their object at least one day beforehand.

59. *Letters or memorials returned for amendment.*—When letters or memorials do not accurately indicate the localities by giving the number of the subdivisional lot, allotment, and section, and name of the parish, or other technical description, it shall be in order to return the documents for amendment.

60. *Commissioners confined to statement of certain facts.*—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

61. *Appointment, &c., of officers.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Trust, except those appointments made at the first meeting of the Trust and before the adoption thereof, shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given, by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the irrigation district, and such other newspaper (if any) as the Trust may determine, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

62. *Salaries of officers, &c.*—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Trust shall, in all cases, be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, by advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement, except when the Trust, by special resolution, which may be moved without notice, orders otherwise.

63. *No commissioner, &c., to be surety for officer.*—No commissioner or officer of the Trust, and no assessor or auditor of the Trust, shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the Trust, or for any work to be done for the Trust.

64. *Expense of preparing security.*—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, except otherwise determined by the Trust, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

65. *Suspension of rules.*—Any one or more of the rules and regulations contained herein may be suspended for a special purpose, on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the Trust.

66. *Penalty.*—If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this regulation, he or she shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

The foregoing regulation, numbered one, was made by the Commissioners of The Campaspe Irrigation and Water Supply Trust under and by virtue of section 95 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, this twentieth day of December, 1889.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight); including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, clean white (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Botanic and Domain Gardens may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September 1890, and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

2. Tenders are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.

3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bonâ fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, marked cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application; and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so; provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term of three years.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

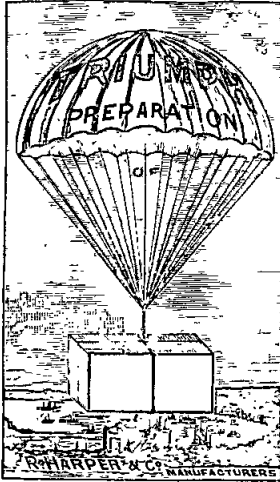
