BACCHUS MARSH IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATIONS FOR THE ELECTION OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE URBAN DIVISION.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fifth day of February, 1890.

WHEREAS by section 10 of *The Irrigation Amendment Act 1889*, No. 1047, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations for the purposes following, viz.:—

- (a) For determining the period for which the commissioners of any trust elected for an urban division shall hold office, the time of election, and the order of their retirement from office.
- (b) For determining the manner in which elections of any such commissioners shall be held, and the mode of voting thereat.
- (c) For determining the manner in which any vacancies in the office of any such commissioners shall be filled up.
- (d) For determining questions as to the due election of any such commissioner; and
- (e) For prescribing, subject to the provisions of the said Act, any other matter necessary for giving effect to Part I. of the said Act.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth, for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to the urban division of a certain Irrigation and Water Supply Trust duly appointed under the said Act, and known as the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, make the regulations following, viz.:—

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In these regulations, "the Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply; "the trust" or "the said trust" shall mean the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust; and "the urban division," "the said division," or "the said urban division," shall mean the urban division of the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply District as such urban division is limited and defined by a certain proclamation made on the 20th August, 1888, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 24th August, 1888.

2. *Period for which commissioners shall hold office.*—Subject to the provisions in reference to the first election of commissioners hereinafter contained, for securing the annual retirement of one commissioner, the period during which the commissioners of the said trust for the said division shall hold office shall be three years.

3. *Annual retirement of commissioners.*—One commissioner shall retire annually, but the retiring commissioners shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act and of *The Irrigation Act 1889*, be eligible for re-election.

4. *Term of office of persons elected commissioners at first election.*—At the first election of commissioners one of the persons elected commissioner shall hold office as such commissioner for the term of three years, one other of such persons shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining person elected as such commissioner shall hold office for the term of one year, and the particular term for which each such person so elected a commissioner shall hold office shall be determined in manner following (that is to say):—

(a) *How term of office is ascertained when no poll taken.*—If the first election is made without a poll, as in the case in these regulations provided, then the particular term for which each candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office shall immediately upon such election be publicly determined by lot by the returning officer in such manner as to him may seem fit, and the returning officer shall thereupon immediately and publicly announce the term for which each individual candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

(b) *How term of office ascertained when poll taken.*—If at the first election a poll shall be held as in these regulations provided, then of the three candidates elected as commissioners the candidate who shall have received the highest number of votes shall hold office as commissioner for the term of three years, and the candidate who shall have received the next highest number of votes shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining candidate who shall have been elected shall hold office for the term of one year; and if two or more than two candidates elected shall have obtained the same number of votes, then the returning officer shall determine by lot (as hereinbefore provided in the case of the first election if decided without ballot) the term or terms of three, two, or one year or years during which such candidates shall respectively hold office. But so that no candidate elected shall hold office for a shorter time than the term during which any other candidate who shall have obtained a less number of votes shall hold office. And the returning officer shall publicly declare the respective terms during which the several candidates shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

5. *Extraordinary vacancies, how filled, and term of office.*—Should any vacancy in the office of commissioner be occasioned by death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or any other cause

whatever, an election shall forthwith be held to fill such vacancy; and the provisions contained in these regulations as to the nomination of candidates, the manner in which elections shall be held, and the mode of voting thereat, shall apply to any election in respect of such vacancy; and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the commissioner whose seat shall have become vacant.

6. *Date of first election of commissioners.—Date of ordinary annual election.*—The first election of commissioners of the said trust for the said division shall be held on the 7th day of May, 1890, and the ordinary annual election shall be held on the 7th day of May in each succeeding year. Provided that whenever such date may fall upon a Sunday, or upon any day set apart as a public holiday, such election shall be held upon the day next following.

7. *Voters' list to be prepared.*—For the purposes of the first election of commissioners of the said division, a voters' list shall be prepared by the secretary or other proper officer of the trust, and the said voters' list shall be forwarded to the Minister.

8. *Form of voters' list.—First Schedule.*—Such voters' list shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain, in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of every municipal ratepayer of the municipal district or such part thereof as may be within the said division of the said trust, and shall also specify the description and situation of the rateable property of each such person, and shall state as the number of votes to which each such person is entitled under the provisions of the said Act, the number of votes to which each such person is respectively entitled for the time being under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1874*, No. 506.

9. *Copy of voters' list to be available for inspection.—Second Schedule.*—Objections to list to be in writing, and forwarded to Minister.—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day time, in some convenient place within or near to the said division for a period of seven clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Second Schedule hereto, setting forth the times and place at which such voters' list may be so inspected, shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said division, and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded in writing to the Minister within the time mentioned in the said notice.

10. *Grounds of objection to be stated.*—All objections to the said list shall be forwarded in writing to the Minister within eight days after the first day of the publication of such notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

11. *Minister to revise and certify lists.*—The Minister shall revise the said list, and consider all objections thereto, and make such alterations and amendments therein as to him may seem just, and shall certify the list under his hand as correct; and no objection to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

12. *Certified list to be voters' roll.*—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of the first election of commissioners of the trust for the said division, but shall also be available for any election in respect of any extraordinary vacancy occurring within twelve months next after the date of the said first election.

13. *Voters' list to be prepared yearly.*—Before the first day of March in each year the officers of the trust shall prepare a voters' list in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and such list shall contain, in regular numerical sequence and in alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of every municipal ratepayer of the municipal district, or such part thereof as may be within the said division, and shall also specify the description and situation of the rateable property of each such person, and shall state as the number of votes to which each such person is entitled under the provisions of the said Act, the number of votes to which each such person is respectively entitled for the time being under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1874*, No. 506.

14. *Copy of list to be available for inspection.—Third Schedule.*—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day time, at some convenient place within or near to the said division, for a period of seven clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Third Schedule hereto shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said division; and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded in writing to the chairman of the trust within the time mentioned in the said notice.

15. *Grounds of objections to list to be forwarded in writing to the chairman of trust.*—All objections to the said list shall be forwarded in writing to the chairman of the trust within the time mentioned in the said notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

16. *Special meeting of trust to be held to revise list.—List to be certified.*—In the month of March in each year a special meeting of the trust shall be held for the purpose of revising the said list, and all objections which may have been forwarded to the chairman under the preceding clause shall be considered by the commissioners then present; and the chairman may make such alterations and amendments in the said list as the commissioners or a majority of the commissioners present may determine to be just and necessary; and the list, when so revised, altered, and amended, shall be certified as correct under the hand of the chairman, and no objection to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

17. *Revised and certified list to be voters' roll.*—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of any election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) of trust commissioners to be held within one year from the 7th day of May then next, the said day inclusive.

18. *Minister may appoint returning officer for first election.*—*Chairman of trust to be returning officer at subsequent elections.*—For the purposes of the first such election, the Minister may appoint some fit and proper person to be returning officer; but for every subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) the chairman of the trust for the time being shall be the returning officer; but if at the time of any election the office of chairman of the trust should be vacant, the commissioners of the trust may, by resolution, appoint one of their number to be returning officer until the office of chairman shall again be filled; and the returning officer may appoint a deputy to assist him or to act in his room at any election, and such deputy may do all or any of the acts or things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

19. *Notice of election.*—*Nomination of candidates.*—*Fourth Schedule.*—Fourteen clear days before any election of commissioners under these regulations, the returning officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the said division, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said division, to be named in such notice, in manner hereinafter mentioned, between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon, on some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than four nor more than seven days after the time of giving such notice, and named therein; and any person desirous of nominating a candidate shall, before Four o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination-day, cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid to the returning officer a nomination-paper in the form of the Fourth Schedule, or to the like effect, stating therein the christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required in and by the said Schedule; and such nomination-paper shall be signed by not less than three persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, and also signed by the person named therein as a candidate, in token of his assent to being so named; and such candidate or some person on his behalf shall, at the time when such nomination-paper is delivered to the returning officer, pay into the hands of such returning officer the sum of Ten pounds (£10), to be dealt with as by law provided. And no person who shall not have been so nominated, and by whom or on whose behalf such payment shall not have been so made, shall within the subsequent provisions of these regulations be deemed to be a candidate at any election of commissioners.

20. *Where number of candidates does not exceed number of commissioners to be elected.*—If at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nominations of candidates the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of commissioners to be elected, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

21. *Where number of candidates exceeds number of commissioners to be elected.*—*Fifth Schedule.*—*Notice of poll.*—*Hours of polling.*—If at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates the number of candidates exceeds the number of commissioners to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed, with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full, in the form of the Fifth Schedule hereto, and shall also forthwith give public notice by advertisement in some newspaper generally circulating in the said division, stating the names of the persons so nominated, and that a poll will be taken for the election of such commissioners upon the day named in such notice, at such place within the said division as the returning officer shall in and by such notice appoint; and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at Eleven o'clock a.m., and close at Three o'clock in the afternoon.

22. *Retirement of candidates before polling-day.*—If at any election after a poll shall have been appointed as aforesaid any candidate for such election and two of the persons having signed the paper nominating him as aforesaid are desirous that he should retire from such candidature, such candidate and the persons aforesaid may sign and deliver to the returning officer, not later than four clear days before the day of polling, a notice, in the form of the Sixth Schedule hereto, stating that such candidate so retires; and the said candidate or his agent shall thereupon publish in some newspaper generally circulating in the said division a copy of such notice, and the returning officer, on sufficient proof of such publication aforesaid, if the number of candidates is by such retirement reduced to the number of persons to be elected at such election, shall on the day appointed for the election declare the remaining candidates duly elected, and if the said number is not so reduced shall omit the name of the person so retiring from the ballot-papers to be used at the said election, and if such papers are already printed shall erase such name therefrom; and such person shall not be capable of being elected at such election.

23. *Polling-booth may be hired.*—At such election the returning officer shall provide a suitable place for taking a poll, and may, if necessary, cause to be hired and used as a polling-booth any room which he may deem to be suitable at the place appointed for taking the poll, and may divide such room into compartments as to him may seem most convenient.

24. *Returning officer to preside at polling-booth.*—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall preside at the polling-booth for taking the poll.

25. *Scrutineers may be appointed.*—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present in the polling-booth, and the said returning officer, or his deputy,

and the said scrutineers, and any voters, not exceeding four in number, actually engaged in voting, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling-booth.

26. *Pencils to be provided.*—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall provide pencils in the polling-booth for the use of the voters, and also a locked box, to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers; and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the scrutineers before the polling begins; and the box shall then be locked, and shall stand on a table opposite the returning officer, or deputy returning officer, who shall keep the key of such box.

27. *Mode of voting.*—*Where voter is illiterate.*—The returning officer shall deliver to every voter who requires the same a ballot-paper, or if such voter appears by the roll to be entitled to give more votes than one then so many ballot-papers as may be equal to the number of votes which such voter so appears to be entitled to give, such ballot-papers being in the form of Schedule Five hereto, and initialed by the returning officer; and every such voter shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from all or any of such papers the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote. And in case any voter is unable to read or write, the returning officer, or his deputy, if so required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as the voter may desire, strike out the name or names of such candidate or candidates as such voter may designate; and after such name or names have been so struck out the ballot-paper or ballot-papers (as the case may be) shall forthwith be deposited in the said box. Provided that all the ballot-papers to which any person may be entitled at the polling-booth shall be demanded and received by him at one and the same time; and no person, having once demanded and received any such ballot-paper or papers, and voted by the same, shall at the same election receive any further ballot-papers, or exercise any further right of voting.

28. *Ballot-papers to be numbered.*—Before delivering any ballot-paper to the voter, the returning officer, or his deputy, shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number set opposite to the voter's name in the roll; and shall thereupon, upon a copy of such roll, check off such voter's name as having voted, and mark against such name the number of ballot-papers delivered to such voter.

29. *Informal ballot-papers.*—If any voter suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of commissioners to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect.

30. *What question may be asked.*—At any election of commissioners, the returning officer may, if he see fit, or if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer, put to any person tendering his vote the question following:—

"Are you the person whose name appears as (A.B.) in the roll now in force for the urban division of this trust, being enrolled therein in respect of property described to be situated in (here specify the street or other place described in the roll)?"

And no other question shall be put to any person tendering his vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer such question, or who shall not answer the same absolutely in the affirmative, shall receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.

31. *False answer, polling twice, and personation.*—Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer to the question aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once or offer to poll more than once at the same election, or who shall depart or attempt to depart from any polling-booth after having received a ballot-paper without having deposited the same in the ballot-box as hereinbefore provided, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as it appears by the roll he is entitled so to do.

32. *Result of polling, how ascertained.*—*Returning officer to have casting vote.*—Immediately upon the close of the poll, the returning officer shall, in the presence of and subject to the inspection of so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present, proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer shall abstain from inspecting the number written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the returning officer shall seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the booth, and as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll publicly declare the candidates, not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up, who have received the greatest number of votes to have been duly elected commissioners of the trust; and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall in each case have the casting vote.

33. *Ballot-papers, how disposed of.*—The returning officer shall, in the case of the said first election of commissioners, forthwith, after the declaration of the poll, endorse with a description of the contents thereof and sign the sealed parcel of ballot-papers, and forward the same to the Minister, who shall, as soon as may be after the first meeting of trust commissioners shall have been held, forward such sealed packet to the secretary of the trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three commissioners of the trust; but in all subsequent elections the parcel of ballot-papers so sealed, endorsed, and signed shall be delivered by the returning officer to the said secretary, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months after such delivery, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three of the commissioners of the trust.

34. *Minister to determine questions arising upon first election.*—If any question arise as to the due election of any commissioner at the first election, the returning officer shall, at the request of any voter or candidate, submit such question in writing to the Minister, who shall decide the same; and such decision shall be final and binding.

35. *Questions arising upon subsequent elections to be determined by trust.*—If any question arise as to the due election of any commissioner at any subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary), such question shall be determined by the commissioners of the trust at the first ordinary meeting held after the election; but no commissioner in respect of whose election such question shall have arisen shall act as a commissioner at such meeting, or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof, or in any manner or at any time to act as a commissioner until such question shall have been so determined; and the majority of the commissioners whose election is not in dispute shall form a quorum.

36. *Appeal to Minister from determination of trust.*—In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the commissioners shall have determined the question, and the Minister may make such inquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary, and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just; and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.

37. *Failure to elect deemed to create extraordinary vacancies.*—If at any election of commissioners no vacancies or a number of vacancies less than the whole number which should have been filled up at such election are filled up, then the vacancies which are not so filled shall severally be deemed extraordinary vacancies and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election. Provided always that the commissioners eventually elected to fill such vacancies shall go out of office as if elected at such election.

38. *Expenses of election to be paid by trust.*—The expenses incurred by the returning officer, or under his direction, in connection with any election shall be defrayed by the trust.

39. *Penalty for breach of regulations.*—These regulations shall also be deemed to be regulations under section 250 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, and any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner before justices of the peace.

40. *Interpretation.*—In these regulations, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to or inconsistent with this interpretation.

WHEREAS by section 63 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, No. 898, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations relating to any Irrigation and Water Supply Trust appointed and created under the said Act for the purposes, among others, following:—

(a) For determining the period for which the Commissioners of any Trust shall hold office, the time and manner of election, and the order of their retirement from office.

(b) For determining the manner in which any vacancies in the office of any such Commissioners shall be filled up, and

(d) For determining questions as to the due election of any such Commissioner.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth alter and amend certain regulations providing for the election of Commissioners of the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, made on the 8th day of April, 1889 (and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 12th day of April, 1889, page 1248), in the manner and to the extent following, viz:—

1. By adding the words "save and except the lands within the Urban Division of the said Trust" after the word "authority," in clause 1 of the said regulation.

2. By inserting the words "or near to" in the following clauses of the said regulations, viz., in clause 21, after the words "at some place within," and in clause 23, after the words "at such place within."

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by *The Discipline Act 1870* it is provided that the Governor in Council may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Act, and from time to time amend, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order the following addition to the Regulations fixing the pay and allowances of Officers, Warrant Officers, Petty and Non-commissioned Officers and men engaged under *The Discipline Act 1870*, which were made on the 8th of October, 1883, 1st of July, 1889, 26th of August, 1889, and 14th of October, 1889, respectively, that is to say:—

All persons who are appointed to the Permanent Naval or Military Forces will receive pay and allowances from the date on which they commence duty only, and not from any earlier date.

And the Honorable James Bell, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS under the provisions of *The Vermin Destruction Act 1889*, No. 1028, it is among other things provided that on the application of the council of any shire the Governor in Council, out of any moneys which may be provided by Parliament for the purpose, may from time to time grant a loan to any such shire for the purpose of enabling such shire to obtain materials for wire-netting or other rabbit-proof or vermin-proof fencing, to be supplied to owners of land in special areas, constituted under the said Act: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Kowree has received petitions signed by a majority in number of the owners of land in the special area (the petitioners owning more than one-half of the land in such area), describing the special area for which the petitioners desire a loan to be obtained by the shire, which petitions contain statements of the area of the whole of such special area, and of the area owned by each and every owner of every part thereof, with a short description of the land owned by each petitioner, and of the area thereof, and gives an estimate of the probable cost of the whole of the materials for wire-netting or other rabbit-proof or vermin-proof fencing required for the land in such area, and asks that the said shire council will apply to the Governor in Council for a loan of the amount of such estimate, and gives an estimate of the materials required for each petitioner's land, and the probable cost of such material, and an estimate of the extent of fencing to be erected by each owner; and states that in such special area adjoining properties could advantageously be enclosed by one continuous wire-netting fence; "and states in each case the estimated cost of such continuous fence, and the proportions thereof to be borne by every owner of property to be enclosed by such fence"; and states that each petitioner signing the petitions undertakes to pay to the council in each and every year one-tenth part of his proportion of the value of all materials for wire-netting fencing, which the council may obtain by means of the loan proposed to be obtained from the Governor in Council, and that such undertaking as between each petitioner, or the owner for the time being of the land of such petitioner, or any part thereof, and the said shire council is to be deemed to be and may be enforced as a specialty contract, and states that each petitioner undertakes to erect on his land, with the materials with which he may be furnished, wire-netting fencing to the satisfaction of the said council, or that he will join with other owners in erecting all necessary fencing: And whereas every signature to such petitions is verified by the solemn declaration of a person signing such petitions, which declaration is in the form or to the effect in the Eighth Schedule to the said Act.

And whereas the said shire council has considered the prayer of such petitions, and has determined to apply for a loan from the Governor in Council in accordance therewith, and has transmitted to the Minister the said petitions, accompanied by an application under seal on behalf of the said shire for a loan of Five Thousand and twenty-seven pounds ten shillings in the terms therein stated, which said application contains an undertaking by the said shire to repay such loan, in accordance with the provisions of the said recited Act and of any Order in Council granting such loan: Now

therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby order that the sum of Two thousand seven hundred and two pounds ten shillings, being a part of the amount applied for by the said shire council in the application hereinbefore referred to, be granted out of the moneys provided by Parliament as a loan to the said Shire of Kowree for the purposes of Part II. of the said *The Vermin Destruction Act 1889*.

That the said sum of Two thousand seven hundred and two pounds ten shillings be paid to the council in one instalment of Two thousand seven hundred and two pounds ten shillings.

That the said sum of Two thousand seven hundred and two pounds ten shillings be a loan for the benefit of part of land described in petitions.

That the said sum of Two thousand seven hundred and two pounds ten shillings be a loan for the benefit of the land specified in the schedule hereunder.

That the proportion of the said sum of Two thousand seven hundred and two pounds ten shillings to be paid by each and every owner of land within the special area to the said shire council is that set out in the schedule hereunder.

That the said sum of Two thousand seven hundred and two pounds ten shillings be repaid by the council of the said shire to the Secretary for Lands for the time being within ten years by annual instalments of not less than Two hundred and seventy pounds five shillings each. The first of such payments to be made on or before the thirty-first day of May, 1891, and a further instalment of not less than Two hundred and seventy pounds five shillings on or before the thirty-first day of May in each and every succeeding year until the whole sum of Two thousand seven hundred and two pounds ten shillings is repaid.

That the said sum of Nine hundred and thirty-eight pounds eighteen shillings and ninepence be a loan for the benefit of the whole land described in the petitions.

That the said sum of Nine hundred and thirty-eight pounds eighteen shillings and ninepence be a loan for the benefit of the land specified in the schedule hereunder.

That the proportion of the said sum of Nine hundred and thirty-eight pounds eighteen shillings and ninepence to be paid by each and every owner of land within the special area to the said shire council is that set out in the schedule hereunder.

VICTUALLERS' LICENCES.

WHEREAS by section 24 of *The Licensing Act 1885*, as amended by section 7 of *The Licensing Amendment Act 1888*, the Governor in Council is authorized to make regulations prescribing the mode in which a poll is to be taken to determine whether or not the number of victuallers' licences in any licensing district from which a petition under the provisions of the said Acts shall have been presented to him shall be decreased to any number below the number then existing, but not below the statutory number, or to determine whether or not the number of such victuallers' licences in such licensing district shall be increased to any number above the number then existing, but not above the statutory number, and the form in which the ballot-papers shall be framed, and defining the powers and duties of the returning officer and his deputies, and generally for all matters whatsoever relating to the taking of the poll: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, doth, for the purposes aforesaid, in addition to the Regulations, numbered 1 to 30, made by Order in Council on the 24th day of June, 1889, make the Regulation following (that is to say):—

31. In the event of the returning officer being unable by reason of sickness or other sufficient cause to do or suffer to be done any act or acts, thing or things, whether prescribed by *The Licensing Act 1885*, as amended by *The Licensing Amendment Act 1888*, or by the Regulations made thereunder or otherwise howsoever in connection with or incidental to his duties as returning officer, such returning officer may from time to time apply to the Minister for the time being administering the Acts to appoint a substitute to do any such act or acts, or thing or things, which the returning officer is so rendered unable to do or suffer to be done through any such cause as

aforesaid. Upon any such application, if the Minister be satisfied as to the sufficiency of the cause, he may from time to time, by writing under his hand, appoint, and when appointed may remove, some one or more fit and proper person or persons to be a substitute or substitutes for such returning officer, to act either generally for such returning officer, or to do or suffer to be done as and for the returning officer such particular act or acts, or thing or things, as the Minister may think fit to limit in the appointment of such substitute. Upon the appointment of any such substitute, such substitute at any time may and shall as and for the returning officer do and suffer all such acts and things within the limits of his appointment (if any), and subject in every case to the like provision as though he were the returning officer, and the Regulations shall be construed accordingly.

WHEREAS by section 31 of *The Licensing Act 1885*, as amended by section 7 of *The Licensing Amendment Act 1888*, the Governor in Council is authorized to make regulations prescribing the mode in which a poll is to be taken to determine whether or not the number of the grocers' licences in any licensing district from which a petition under section 29 of the said Licensing Act 1885, as amended by the Licensing Amendment Act of 1888, shall have been presented to him shall be increased to any number above the number then existing, but not above the statutory number, and the form in which the ballot-papers shall be framed, and defining the powers and duties of the returning officer and his deputies, and generally for all matters whatsoever relating to the taking of the poll: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, doth, for the purposes aforesaid, in addition to the Regulations, numbered 1 to 30, made by Order in Council on the 24th day of June, 1889, make the Regulation following (that is to say):—

31. In the event of the returning officer being unable by reason of sickness or other sufficient cause to do or suffer to be done any act or acts, thing or things, whether prescribed by *The Licensing Act 1885*, as amended by *The Licensing Amendment Act 1888*, or by the regulations made thereunder or otherwise howsoever in connection with or incidental to his duties as returning officer, such returning officer may from time to time apply to the Minister for the time being administering the Acts to appoint a substitute to do any such act or acts, or thing or things, which the returning officer is so rendered unable to do or suffer to be done through any such cause as aforesaid. Upon any such application, if the Minister be satisfied as to the sufficiency of the cause, he may from time to time, by writing under his hand, appoint, and when appointed may remove, some one or more fit and proper person or persons to be a substitute or substitutes for such returning officer, to act either generally for such returning officer, or to do or suffer to be done as and for the returning officer such particular act or acts, or thing or things, as the Minister may think fit to limit in the appointment of such substitute. Upon the appointment of any such substitute, such substitute at any time may and shall as and for the returning officer do and suffer all such acts and things within the limits of his appointment (if any), and subject in every case to the like provision as though he were the returning officer, and the Regulations shall be construed accordingly.

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The Public Health Act 1889.

REGULATION RELATING TO THE REGISTRATION OF PLUMBERS AND GASFITTERS.

WHEREAS by section 71 of *The Public Health Act 1889*, the Board of Public Health may from time to time make, alter, or rescind Regulations providing for the Registration of Plumbers and Gasfitters: Now therefore the Board of Public Health, by virtue of the powers contained in the said Act, doth hereby make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

1. Any person in any way employed on the 25th day of November, 1889, as a plumber or gasfitter, whether as a master or workman, will be registered as a plumber or gasfitter, or as a plumber and gasfitter (as the case may be), on forwarding to the Secretary, Board of Public Health, before the 31st day of March next, satisfactory evidence of the fact of his being so employed, with his full name and address, and the name of the municipal district in which he is resident.

2. A statutory declaration of employment as aforesaid will be considered satisfactory evidence under the preceding Regulation, provided that, in the case of a workman, a certificate of employment by a master may be required by the Board.

3. Any person not employed in any way as a plumber or gasfitter, whether as master or servant, on the 25th November, 1889, and any person so employed who has not complied with the provisions of the next but one preceding Regulation, will be registered on producing to the Board satisfactory evidence of his competence as a plumber or gasfitter (as the case may be).

4. Any registered plumber or gasfitter shall notify to the Secretary of the Board any change in his residence.

NOTE.—The apparent increase of population in 1889, or that obtained by adding the excess of registered births over registered deaths to the excess of recorded arrivals over recorded departures, was 33,180, as against 60,019 in 1888, and 39,064 in 1887. The actual increases are known to be less than these, in consequence of the departures by sea being imperfectly recorded. If allowance be made for the probable number of unrecorded departures in 1889, the net increase of population during that year will be reduced to 27,208, viz., 12,490 males and 14,718 females, as shown above.

The large increase of population in 1888 was exceptional, being chiefly due to the influx of persons connected with and of visitors to the Melbourne Centennial International Exhibition.

The registered births numbered 36,388 and the registered deaths 19,372 in 1889; thus the former exceeded the latter by 17,016, or 88 per cent. The births exceeded those in 1888 by 1,885, and the deaths exceeded those in 1888 by 3,085; both births and deaths were much more numerous than in any other year.

The recorded arrivals by sea numbered 84,582 and the recorded departures by sea numbered 68,418 in 1889. The gain to the population by excess of the former over the latter was thus apparently 16,164. This number, however, must be reduced by an allowance for unrecorded departures, estimated to amount to 5,972, which brings the probable net gain by immigration down to 10,192.

From the period of the census of 1881 to the end of 1889, the whole reduction made for supposed unrecorded departures has been 47,229. Had no such reduction been made, the population at the end of 1889 would apparently have amounted to 1,165,306.

The gain by excess of births over deaths in 1889 was not so great as that in 1888 by 1,200, but was about the same as in 1887. The gain by excess of recorded arrivals over recorded departures in 1889 was less than in 1888 by 25,639, than in 1887 by 5,862, or than in 1886 by 9,138, but was much greater than in 1885 and preceding years.

In 1889 the recorded arrivals from were greater than the recorded departures for the United Kingdom by 10,287, Tasmania by 5,259, South and Western Australia by 507, New Zealand by 361, and Foreign Countries by 9. On the other hand, the recorded departures for New South Wales and Queensland exceeded the recorded arrivals therefrom by 259.

The population of New South Wales is estimated by the Government Statistician of that colony to have numbered 1,122,200 (viz., 618,300 males, and 503,900 females), at the end of 1889. The increase during the year is set down as 36,460, or 9,252 in excess of the estimated increase in Victoria.

Victoria became more populous than New South Wales—from which Queensland had not then been separated—in 1854, continued to be so until 1887, at the end of which year the mother colony was apparently the more populous by 6,800. In 1888 Victoria appears to have again taken the lead, and at the end of that year was estimated to contain the larger population by 5,129. The positions of the two colonies became again reversed in 1889, the official estimates, made up to the 31st December, as now published, showing the population of New South Wales to exceed that of Victoria by 4,123.

No account is taken in Victoria of the migration of the population overland, and the population estimate is based upon the assumption that the numbers going and coming over its borders are equal. The Government Statistician of New South Wales, however, has succeeded in obtaining an estimate of overland migration, with the apparent net result that, in 1889, that colony gained 1,231 persons from over the South Australian and Queensland frontiers, but lost 2,816 persons over that of Victoria.

As regards the Victorian estimate, it should be stated that the figures of births and deaths during 1889, and consequently those of population, will probably be slightly altered when the returns of the Deputy Registrars are finally examined.

1. In the construction of these Rules any words herein used defined by *The Patents Act 1889* shall have the meanings thereby assigned to them respectively. Interpretation of terms.

APPLICATIONS, ETC.

2. An application for a patent must be signed by the applicant. All other communications between the applicant and the Commissioner and all attendances may be made by or through a patent agent duly authorized as hereinafter provided. By whom made.

3. The attorney of any corporation, howsoever or wheresoever incorporated, whether already constituted or hereafter to be constituted by a power of attorney under a seal purporting to be the common seal of the corporation giving the power, may make any application, petition, or solemn declaration for or on behalf of the corporation of which he is the attorney, and may make the requisite declarations to the best of his knowledge, information, and belief, and may subscribe the same in his own name. In case of corporation.

4. Every application shall be accompanied by a statement of an address, within the colony of Victoria, to which all notices and communications by the Commissioner may be sent, and such statement shall thereafter be binding upon the applicant, unless and until a substituted statement of address shall be furnished by him. Address for service.

5. Applications for a patent sent by prepaid letters through the post shall, as far as may be practicable, be opened and numbered in the order in which the letters containing the same have been respectively delivered in the ordinary course of post. Applications by post.

6. Applications left at the Patent Office otherwise than through the post shall be numbered in the order of their receipt. Applications left at office.

7. All applications shall also be marked with the date and time of day of receiving the same. Date of lodging.

DOCUMENTS.

8. All documents and copies of documents sent to or left at the Patent Office, or otherwise furnished to the Commissioner, shall be written or printed, or partly written and partly printed, in large and legible characters in the English language upon strong paper (on one side only) of a size 13 inches by 8 inches, leaving a margin of 2 inches on the left-hand side thereof. How to be prepared.

9. In all cases, duplicates of applications, provisional and complete specifications, and of all drawings required to accompany the same, shall be lodged with and at the same time as the originals, or within such time as the Commissioner may in any case direct. Duplicates.

DRAWINGS.

10. Drawings are not required if the specification sufficiently describes the invention without them. No drawing or sketch such as requires a special engraving for letterpress should appear in the specification itself. Sizes and methods of preparing drawings accompanying provisional or complete specifications.

Drawings must be delivered at the Patent Office either flat or on rollers, so as to be free from creases, folds, or breaks. They must be made on pure white, hot-pressed, rolled, or calendered drawing paper, of smooth surface and good quality, and, where possible, without colour or Indian ink washes. They must be on sheets of one of the two following sizes (the smaller being preferable):—13 inches at the sides by 8 inches at the top and bottom, or 13 inches at the sides by 16 inches at the top and bottom, including margin, which must be half-an-inch wide. If there are more figures than can be shown on one of the smaller-sized sheets, two or more of these sheets should be used in preference to employing the larger size. When an exceptionally large drawing is required, it should be continued upon subsequent sheets.

To ensure their satisfactory reproduction, the drawings must be executed with absolutely black Indian ink, the same strength of colour of fine and shade lines to be maintained throughout. Section lines and lines for effect, or shading lines, must not be closely drawn. Reference figures and letters must be bold and distinct, not less than one-eighth of an inch in height, and the same letters should be used in different views of the same parts.

In cases of complicated drawings, the reference letters must be shown outside the figure and connected with the part referred to by fine lines.

The scale adopted should be large enough to show clearly wherein the invention consists, and only so much of the apparatus, machine, &c., need be shown as effects this purpose. When the scale is shown in the drawing, it should be denoted not by words but by a drawn scale.

Drawings must bear the name of the applicant in the left-hand top corner. Drawings left with a complete specification, after a provisional specification, must also bear the number and year of the application. All drawings must also be marked with the number of sheets sent, and the number of each sheet marked in the right-hand top corner, and the signature of the applicant or his agent in the right-hand bottom corner.

No written description of the invention should appear on the drawings.

A fac-simile of the original drawings, but without colour or Indian ink washes, and prepared strictly in accordance with the regulations prescribed in the last Rule, must accompany the originals, and be marked "true copy."

If an applicant desires to adopt the drawings lodged with the provisional specification as the drawings for his complete specification, he should refer to them as those "left with the provisional specification."

DECLARATIONS, ETC.

How taken out of the jurisdiction. 11. All affidavits and declarations shall and may be sworn and taken in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or in any colony or place under the dominion of Her Majesty in foreign parts, before any judge, court, notary public, or person lawfully authorized to administer oaths in such country, colony, or place, respectively; or before any of Her Majesty's consuls or vice-consuls in any foreign part out of Her Majesty's dominion.

AMENDMENTS.

Generally. 12. Any document for the amendment of which no special provision is made by the Act may be amended, and any irregularity in procedure, which in the opinion of the Commissioner may be corrected without detriment to the interests of any person, may be corrected on such terms as the Commissioner may think fit.

Amendment of Specification.

Request for leave to amend. 13. A request for leave to amend a specification shall be signed by the applicant or patentee, and be accompanied by a copy of the original specification and drawings, showing, in red ink, the proposed amendment, and shall be duly advertised by publication of the request and nature of the proposed amendment.

Opposition to amendment. 14. A notice of opposition shall state the grounds of such opposition, and shall be signed by the party opposing, and shall contain an address within Victoria for service.

Evidence in support of opposition. 15. Within fourteen days after the expiration of one month from the first advertisement of the application for leave to amend, the opponent shall leave at the Patent Office statutory declarations or other evidence in support of his opposition, and deliver to the applicant a list thereof. Upon such list being delivered the provisions of Rules shall apply, and the further proceedings thereunder be thereby regulated.

ADVERTISEMENT.

16. Where a complete specification has been accepted, the Commissioner shall advertise such acceptance by publishing a notification thereof in the *Government Gazette* or in the "Official Journal" of the Patent Office.

All other advertisements, notices, or documents which by the Act or Rules are required to be published shall be inserted in such gazette, journal, or daily newspaper as the Commissioner shall direct or approve of.

EXTENSION OF TIME.

For leaving specification or making payments. 17. Applications for extension of time for leaving or accepting a complete specification, or for making any prescribed payment, shall be in writing, and shall state in detail in what circumstances and upon what grounds such extension is applied for, and shall be lodged in the Patent Office seven clear days at least before the expiration of the time sought to be extended, and the Commissioner may require the applicant to substantiate such allegations by such evidence as he may think necessary.

In other cases. 18. The time prescribed by the Act or these Rules for doing any act, or taking any proceeding may be enlarged by the Commissioner upon such notice to other parties and upon such terms as he may direct.

OPPOSITION TO GRANTS.

Notice of opposition. 19. The notice required by Section 15 of the Act must be signed by the opponent, or by his solicitor or patent agent, and must contain an address within Victoria for service.

Grounds of opposition. 20. Where the ground or one of the grounds of opposition is that the invention has been patented in Victoria on an application of prior date, the title, number, and date of the patent granted in such prior application shall be specified in the notice.

Evidence in support of opposition. 21. Within fourteen days after the expiration of two months from the date of the advertisement of the acceptance of a complete specification, the opponent shall leave at the Patent Office statutory declarations or other evidence taken in manner hereby prescribed in support of his opposition, and deliver to the applicant a list thereof.

Applicant's evidence. Evidence in reply. 22. Within fourteen days from the delivery of such list, the applicant shall leave at the Patent Office statutory declarations or other evidence, as aforesaid, in answer, and deliver to the opponent a list thereof. and within seven days from such delivery the opponent shall leave at the Patent Office his statutory declarations or other evidence as aforesaid in reply, and deliver to the applicant a list thereof, such last-mentioned declarations or other evidence shall be confined to matters strictly in reply.

Further evidence. 23. No further evidence on either side shall be left except by leave of the Commissioner upon the written consent of the parties duly notified to him, or by special leave of the Commissioner on application made to him for that purpose.

Time for hearing. 24. On the completion of the evidence, the Commissioner shall appoint a time for the hearing of the case, and shall give to the parties seven days' notice at the least of such appointment.

Grounds. On the hearing of the case, no opposition shall be allowed in respect of any ground not stated in the notice of opposition.

Notice of decision. 25. The decision of the Commissioner shall be notified by him to the parties.

REGISTER.

26. A request for entry in the Register of a title by assignment, transmission, or other operation of law, shall be made in writing by the person claiming to be entitled to be registered, or by his agent, addressed to the Commissioner and left at the Patent Office. Entry of assignment, &c.

27. Every such request shall state the name, address, and description of the claimant, and the particulars of the assignment, transmission, or other operation of law, by virtue of which he claims to be entered in the Register; and all documents and other evidence of title necessary to prove such claim, or as the Commissioner may require, shall be produced to the Commissioner.

28. There shall also be left with the request an examined copy of the assignment or other document above required to be produced.

29. Where an Order of the Court has been made for rectification of the Register, for the revocation of patents, or otherwise affecting the validity or proprietorship of a patent, the person in whose favour such order has been made shall forthwith leave at the Patent Office an office copy of such order, and the same shall thereupon be duly entered in the Register. Order of court for rectification.

30. A body corporate may be registered as patentee by its corporate name. Corporation—how registered.

DISCRETIONARY POWER.

31. Before exercising any discretionary power as referred to in Section 66 of the Act the Commissioner shall give ten days' notice, or such longer notice as he may think fit, to the applicant of the time when he may be heard personally or by his agent. Notice to applicant.

32. Within five days from the date when such notice would be delivered in the ordinary course of post, or such longer time as the Commissioner may appoint in such notice, the applicant shall notify to the Commissioner whether or not he intends to be heard upon the matter. Reply.

33. Whether the applicant desires to be heard or not the Commissioner may at any time require him to submit a statement in writing within a time to be notified by the Commissioner, or to attend before him and make oral explanations with respect to such matters as the Commissioner may desire. Attendance of applicant.

34. The decision of the Commissioner shall be notified by him to the applicant and any other person affected thereby. Decision to be notified.

35. The term applicant in this Rule shall include an applicant whose specification bears a title the same as or similar to that of the specification of a prior applicant, and has been reported on by the Examiner. Meaning of applicant.

POWER TO WAIVE REQUIREMENTS.

36. Where under these Rules any person is required to do any act or thing, or to sign any document, or to make any affidavit or declaration on behalf of himself or any body corporate, or any document or evidence is required to be produced or left with the Commissioner or at the Patent Office, and it is shown to the satisfaction of the Commissioner that from any reasonable cause such person is unable to do such act or thing or to sign such document or make such affidavit or declaration, or that such declaration or evidence cannot be produced or left as aforesaid, it shall be lawful for the Commissioner upon such terms as he may think fit, to dispense with any such act or thing, document, declaration, or evidence.

FEES.

37. In addition to the fees mentioned in the Fifth Schedule to *The Patents Act 1889*, there shall be paid under the said Act the fees contained in the Schedule hereto.

PROCEDURE BEFORE LAW OFFICER.

38. When notice of intention to appeal to the Law Officer from a decision of the Commissioner has been duly given to the Commissioner, he shall forthwith transmit to the Law Officer all the papers relating to the application in respect of which such appeal is made. Upon notice of appeal commissioner to transmit paper.

39. Seven days' notice at least of the time and place appointed for the hearing of any appeal shall be given by direction of the Law Officer, unless special directions be given by him that any shorter notice be given; such notice shall in all cases be given to the Commissioner and the applicant, and where there has been an opposition before the Commissioner to the opponent or opponents; and when the Commissioner has refused to seal a patent on the ground that an application for a patent for the same invention is pending, to the prior applicant also. Notice of hearing.

40. The evidence used in an appeal to the Law Officer shall be the same as that used at the hearing before the Commissioner, and no further evidence shall be given, save as to matters which have occurred or come to the knowledge of either party after the date of the decision appealed against, except with the leave of the Law Officer, upon special application for that purpose. All documentary evidence required or allowed by the Law Officer to be filed, shall be subject to the same rules in all respects as apply to the procedure before the Commissioner, and shall be filed in the Patent Office, unless the Law Officer shall otherwise order. Evidence.

41. When by a decision of the Commissioner any costs or other sum of money are or is directed to be paid or deposited by any person appealing from such decision or any part thereof, the Law officer may decline to proceed with the hearing of such appeal unless and until such costs or sum of money have or has been duly paid or deposited or some security to the satisfaction of the Law Officer be approved of by him for the performance of such part of such decision. Condition precedent of hearing.

PATENT AGENTS.

Who may
practise.

42. No person shall be entitled to practise as an agent for the procuring and taking out of letters patent for inventions (hereinafter termed a "patent agent") unless such person have previously obtained a certificate of qualification in accordance with these Rules.

Certificate—
how obtained.

Any person wishing to practise as a patent agent may apply in writing to the Commissioner for permission to do so, and if the Commissioner deems it expedient, and is satisfied as to the ability, fitness, and general qualifications of the applicant, he may issue under his hand a certificate in the form and to the effect following (that is to say):—

"The Patents Act 1889.

"CERTIFICATE OF QUALIFICATION AS A PATENT AGENT.

"I hereby certify that I am satisfied as to the ability, fitness, and general qualifications of
of to practise as a patent agent.

"Given under my hand and seal this day of A.D. 18 .

"Commissioner of Patents."

Such certificate of qualification shall entitle the person to whom it is issued to practise as a patent agent, subject to the payment of the amount or fee of One pound in the month of January in each and every year; and if any such person have not, on the thirty-first day of the month of January in any year, paid such fee, he shall be disqualified from practising as a patent agent until the same be paid and the receipt therefor deposited at the Patents Office.

4. Every tender must bear the *bond fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, marked cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond, and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenders will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term of three years.

CITY OF SANDHURST.

BY-LAW No. 12.

A By-law of the Municipal Council of the City of Sandhurst, made under section 479 of Part twenty-one of the "Local Government Act 1874," for licensing yards and premises for the sale of cattle within the municipal boundaries of the said city and outside the usual markets provided by the said council, and for fixing the dues to be paid for such licences.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1874*, the mayor, councillors, and citizens of the City of Sandhurst order as follows:—

1. That By-law number eleven of the said city shall be and is hereby repealed.

2. That no yards or premises within the municipal boundaries of the said city and outside the usual markets provided by the said council shall be used by any person or persons for the sale of cattle without a licence being first had and obtained from the said council.

3. That each of such licences shall be for the period of one year only from the date of issue, and it shall be in the absolute discretion of the said council to grant or refuse the same or any renewal thereof.

4. The fee to be paid for every such licence or any renewal thereof shall be the sum of One pound one shilling.

5. That it shall be lawful for the inspector for the time being of the cattle market of the said city appointed by the said council to demand, collect, and receive from any person or persons so licensed as aforesaid the following dues, being those appointed by a special order of the said council in that behalf, under Regulation number twenty-six of the said city.

For every horse, mare, gelding, foal, ass, or mule	£0 0 6
For every head of neat cattle	0 0 6
For every head of store cattle or calves	0 0 6
For every fat pig	0 0 3
For every store pig	0 0 1½
For every sheep, lamb, or goat	0 0 1

6. Any person who after this by-law comes into force shall conduct sales of cattle in any yards or premises outside the markets provided by the City Council aforesaid, and within the municipal boundaries of the said city, without being licensed as aforesaid, shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.

7. That every person so licensed as aforesaid shall within fourteen days from the granting of every such licence cause to be painted on boards, or to be printed and attached to boards, in large and legible characters lists of the several cattle dues from time to time payable under this by-law, and shall cause to be conspicuously set up within the time aforesaid and continued in the said licensed yards and premises a board as aforesaid containing every list relating thereto, and no cattle dues shall be payable at any such place as aforesaid which is not specified on some board set up therein. Provided always that if any such list is destroyed, injured, or obliterated the dues shall continue payable during such time as is reasonably required for the restoration of such list in the same manner as if such list had continued in the state required by this by-law.

BY-LAW No. 27.

A By-law of the Shire of Malvern, made under Section 213 of the Local Government Act 1874, and numbered 27, for naming streets and numbering houses within the Shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1874*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Malvern order as follows:—

1. It shall be lawful for the Council from time to time to cause to be painted or affixed on a conspicuous part of some house or building at or near each end, corner, or entrance of every street, and in the direction of the line of such street the name of such street in legible characters not exceeding three inches in length and proportionately broad and near to each other, and the Council may, where more than one street or road in the municipal district is called by the same name, alter the name of any or all of such streets or roads save one (to be described in the order altering the same) to any other name which to the Council may seem fit, and before any name is given to any new street or road notice of the intended name shall be given to the Council, and if there be any street or road in the municipal district called, or about to be called, by the same name, the Council may, by notice stating that there is already a street or road in the municipal district called or about to be called by the same name, and describing the locality thereof, given to the person by whom notice of such intended name was given to them, at any time within fourteen days of the receipt of such last-mentioned notice, object to such intended name; and it shall not be lawful to set up any name to any street or road until the expiration of fourteen days after notice thereof has been given as aforesaid to the Council, or to set up any name objected to as aforesaid.

2. The owners or occupiers of houses or buildings shall mark such houses or building with such numbers and names for the purpose of distinguishing the same as the Council shall direct or approve, and shall renew the numbers or names of such houses or buildings as often as they are obliterated or defaced; and if any occupier of any such house or building neglect for one week after notice from the Council to mark such house or building with such number or name as the Council may direct or approve, or to renew the number or name thereof as aforesaid, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings; and the Council may cause such name to be so marked or renewed, and recover the expense thereof from the owner of such house or building before any justice.

3. If any person wilfully and maliciously destroys, pulls down, obliterates, or defaces the name of any street or road, or the name or number of any house or building, or paints, affixes, or sets up any name to any street or road, or any name or number to any house or building contrary to this subdivision, he shall for every such offence forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds; and it shall be lawful for the Council to cause such name or number so unlawfully painted, affixed, or set up to be obliterated or destroyed.

4. The Council shall cause to be kept a register of all alterations made by them in the names of streets and roads, and such register shall be kept in such form as to show the date of every such alteration, and the name of every street or road previous to such alteration, and the new name thereof.
