THE Governor in Council has been pleased to order the following alterations in, and additions to, the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces, made on the third day of December, 1888:—

PART I., SECTION VIII.—DRESS REGULATIONS.

In paragraph 7, line 3, *erase* "And Victorian Horse Artillery." In line 5, after "and spike," *add* "Victorian Horse Artillery will wear a white helmet without gilt badge, but with white puggaree, and gilt chain with ball."

In paragraph 23, after "Cavalry" *erase* "and Victorian Horse Artillery." *Add*

Paragraph 23A. *Victorian Horse Artillery*—

*Jacket*.—As in Royal Horse Artillery.  
*Forage cap*.—As in Royal Horse Artillery, but with universal badge above lace in front.

*Pantaloon*.—As in Royal Horse Artillery, scarlet stripe.

*Trousers*.—As in Royal Horse Artillery, with 1½-inch lace down side seams.

*Sword*.—As in Royal Horse Artillery.

*Patrol jacket*.—As in Artillery, Victorian Military Forces.

Page 32.—The number of the paragraph, Victorian Artillery and Artillery Militia, is altered from 25A to 23B.

Paragraph 32.—After "Cavalry" *erase* "and Victorian Horse Artillery;" and *add* new paragraph—

32A. *Victorian Horse Artillery*—

*Jacket*.—As for Royal Horse Artillery.  
*Forage cap*.—As for Royal Horse Artillery, with universal badge above lace.

*Pantaloon*.—As for Royal Horse Artillery.

*Trousers*.—As for Royal Horse Artillery.

Paragraph 45. *Ambulance Corps*.—*Cancel* "white linen badge with Geneva cross in red," and *substitute*

"A badge with the Geneva cross in red on white ground to be worn on the collar each side. A badge with the Geneva cross in red on white ground to be worn on the left arm."

Paragraph 36. *Warrant and non-commissioned officers of the Permanent Staff*.—After "those of Imperial army" *erase* "excepted" and *substitute* "included." After "cap of special pattern" *add* "with ½-inch gold embroidery on peak for both warrant and non-commissioned officers, and with universal badge. The cap of Garrison Sergeant-Major to be the same as the cap for Warrant Officer of Engineers."

Paragraph 39A. *Military clerks*.—After "Military" *add* "Staff." DRESS.

*Jumper*.—*Erase* "universal buttons" and *add* "hooks and eyes." After "shoulder straps" *add* "with V.R. worked in gold."

*Forage cap*.—*Erase* "Battery and Company Sergeant-Majors" and *add* "Warrant and Non-Commissioned Officers, Permanent Staff, but with band of scarlet cloth 1½ inches wide, as in Imperial army, and universal badge."

Page 33. *Add* new paragraph 27A. *Victorian Volunteer Cadets*.—*Headquarters Staff Office*—

*Tunic*.—Khaki, pattern same as in Imperial army, and with gold lace (buttons and shoulder straps excepted).

*Head-dress*.—Soft-felt hat, grey, looped at right side to gilt cadet badge, grey three-plait puggaree.

*Trousers*.—Khaki, with gold lace, as in Imperial army.

*Gloves*.—White leather.

*Boots*.—Plain ankle, with brass box spurs.

Paragraph 11. *Pouches for officers*.—*Add* "Headquarters Staff Volunteer Cadet Corps, the same as for Infantry."

*Pouch belts for officers*.—*Add* "Headquarters Staff Volunteer Cadet Corps, the same as for Infantry."

16. *Sword belt*.—*Add* "Headquarters Staff Volunteer Cadet Corps, the same as for Infantry."

PART II., PERMANENT FORCES.—SECTION II., VICTORIAN ARTILLERY.

Page 43, line 9, *et seq.*, to line 23, *strike out* from "1 tunic" to "October," and *substitute*

"In cases where officers of the Victorian Artillery are detailed for duty which will necessitate their absence from the fort at which they are stationed, no claims for actual expenses will be allowed if they are entitled to draw working pay. But claims for actual expenses incurred, accompanied by vouchers, can be forwarded for the approval of the Minister in cases where working pay is not allowed, when officers proceed on duty from the fort at which they are stationed before 8 a.m. or return after 6 p.m."

The births of 1,251 children, viz., 639 boys and 612 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of January. In the month of December 1,370 births were registered, or 119 more than in the month under review. The births were 282 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but 35 below that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in January numbered 998, viz., 531 of males and 467 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 253, or 25 per cent. The deaths were less than those in December by 18, and were above the average of January during the previous ten years by 297. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by only 68.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.73, and of deaths registered 2.18.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 101.5° on the 25th, and the lowest was 47.9° on the 8th. The mean temperature of the month (71.6°) was slightly more than 5° above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (48.3°) took place on the 5th. The least range (5.3°) was on the 23rd. The mean daily range was 23.4°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.137 inches on the 30th, and the lowest was 29.554 inches on the 6th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.910 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 7 days, the amount of rainfall being 1.37 inches. The average rainfall in January during the previous ten years was 2.06 inches, or about three-quarters of an inch more than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 53 per cent., and females 47 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 48 per cent. to that mortality, as against 57 per cent. in 1889; 53 per cent. in 1888, 53 per cent. in 1887, 54 per cent. in 1886, 48 per cent. in 1885, 44 per cent. in 1884, 48 per cent. in 1883, 49 per cent. in 1882, 45 per cent. in 1881, and 43 per cent. in 1880.

Forty deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these a female, aged 75, died of cancer of the throat; a farmer, aged 75, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 75, of pneumonia; a female, aged 75, of jaundice; a gentleman, aged 75, of Bright's disease; a female, aged 75, of heat apoplexy; a widow, aged 76, of rheumatism; a chimney-sweeper, aged 76, of injuries to the ribs—how caused not stated; a female, aged 77, of paralysis; a labourer, aged 77, of enteritis; a female, aged 78, of diarrhoea; a female, aged 78, of syncope; a female, aged 78, of jaundice; a gentleman, aged 78, of cystitis; a tailor, aged 79, of insanity; a male of occupation unknown, aged 79, of heart disease; a labourer, aged 79, of pneumonia; a clergyman, aged 80, of apoplexy; a farmer, aged 82, of bronchitis; a female, aged 83, of paralysis; a gentleman, aged 83, of injuries, the result of a train passing over him; a labourer, aged 84, of rheumatism; a blindmaker, aged 84, of gout; a female, aged 84, of heart disease; a labourer, aged 85, of paralysis; a female, aged 91, of bronchitis; two females, aged 76 and 78 respectively; a cabinet maker, and a gentleman, each aged 78, three females, each aged 81, a female and a sawyer, each aged 83, a shoemaker, aged 86, a female, aged 87, a female, aged 91, a female servant, aged 92, and a widow aged 95, of old age.

Sixty-seven deaths arose from external causes during the month, of which fifty-seven were set down to accident, two to homicide, and eight to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A platerlayer, aged 29, a labourer, aged



40, and a gentleman, aged 83, were passed over by railway trains; a female, aged 46, and a cabdriver, aged 56, died of injuries consequent on being thrown out of vehicles; a slater, aged 32, and a labourer, aged 39, of injuries, the result of falls; a fireman, aged 24, of fracture of the skull; a civil engineer, aged 44, of fracture of the thigh bone; a contractor, aged 52, of fracture of the spine; a chimney-sweeper, aged 76, of injuries to the ribs; a wool carrier, aged 15, of injuries, and a female, aged 52, of compound fracture of the leg—how caused not stated. A male child, aged 4, and a female, aged 41, were burnt to death; two female children, aged 1 and 5 respectively, were scalded to death; two female infants, aged 1 month and 6 months respectively, and a male child, aged 2, a male and a female child, each aged 4, a female child, aged 5, a labourer, aged 30, a banker, aged 33, a stavedore, aged 45, a female servant, aged 46, an insurance agent, aged 43, a labourer, aged 50, a dealer, aged 52, a male cook, aged 54, a dairyman, aged 60, a railway gatekeeper, aged 64, and a female, aged 75, died of heat apoplexy; a baker, aged 43, of chronic lead poisoning; a female, aged 50, was poisoned by the inhalation of chloroform; a male child, aged 2, a seaman, aged 24, a journalist, aged 25, a fireman, aged 32, a clerk, aged 34, a carpenter, aged 40, a male of occupation unknown, aged 45, two females, each aged 50, a paver, aged 60, were drowned in the River Yarra; a blacksmith, aged 45, was drowned in the Saltwater River; an infant, of age unknown and supposed to be a female, was drowned at Brighton; a girl, aged 14, and a fireman, aged 35, were drowned in Hobson's Bay; four boys, aged 10, 12, 14, and 15 respectively, a butcher, aged 21, a carver and gilder, aged 60, were found drowned; and a newly-born infant was overlain. The homicidal deaths were those of a bootmaker, aged 32, who died of abscess of the brain from injuries—a verdict of wilful murder being returned; and of a blacksmith, aged 33, who died of injuries consequent on a blow—a verdict of manslaughter being returned. The suicides were those of a grocer, aged 23, a carpenter, aged 27, a bank clerk, aged 29, and a tinsmith, aged 40, who shot themselves; a manager, aged 38, who cut his throat; a groom, aged 35, and a labourer, aged 59, who drowned themselves; and a labourer, aged 50, who hanged himself.

One hundred and fifty-four deaths, or 15 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—79 in the Melbourne Hospital, 22 in the Alfred Hospital, 4 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 7 in the Children's Hospital, 7 in the Lying-in Hospital, 4 in the Immigrants' Home, 9 in the Benevolent Asylum, 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Austin Hospital, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, 1 in the Infant Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 576, of which 239, or 50 per cent., were of males, and 237, or 50 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 357 were under one year of age, 78 were between one and two, 20 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 13 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 522. Of these, 292, or 56 per cent., were males, and 230, or 44 per cent., were females; 22 were between five and ten, 24 were between ten and fifteen, 20 were between fifteen and twenty, 40 were between twenty and twenty-five, 50 were between twenty-five and thirty, 37 were between thirty and thirty-five, 44 were between thirty-five and forty, 34 were between forty and forty-five, 38 were between forty-five and fifty, 30 were between fifty and fifty-five, 40 were between fifty-five and sixty, 53 were between sixty and sixty-five, 27 were between sixty-five and seventy, 23 were between seventy and seventy-five, 21 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 19 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from zymotic diseases, which numbered 77 in October, and 157 in November, and 191 in December, increased to 198 in the month under review, the increase being chiefly due to typhoid fever, which rose from 31 to 78, and to diphtheria, which rose from 23 to 25. Besides the deaths from diphtheria, 2 deaths were set down to diphtheritic croup, (classed as a disease of the respiratory system) as against 9 in November, 5 in October, 7 in September, 8 in August, and 10 in July, and 7 in December.

**REGULATIONS UNDER "THE EDUCATION  
ACT 1872."**

WHEREAS by the 18th Section of *The Education Act 1872*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, from time to time, make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that Regulation III. of the amended Regulations under *The Education Act 1872* be rescinded, and that the subjoined Regulation be substituted therefor, that is to say:—

**III.—Payments by way of Results.**

1. Payments by way of results will be made to head teachers and assistant teachers upon examination of their schools by an inspector in the subjects specified in the course of free instruction.

2. The maximum payment which any teacher can obtain by way of results will be an amount equal to one-half of his fixed salary.

3. In order to entitle the teachers of any school to this maximum—

- (i.) Every scholar who has attended the school during any part of the two weeks preceding such visit must be presented for examination, unless prevented from attending by any unavoidable cause, such as—
  - (a) Removal from the district;
  - (b) Suffering from severe bodily accident or sickness, or being excluded on account of infectious disease at home;
  - (c) Flooded state of the roads;
  - (d) Death of a near relative.

But scholars who, within the two months immediately previous to the inspector's visit, have resumed attendance after exclusion from school for at least two months on account of infectious disease, may be excepted.

(ii.) The inspector must be satisfied—

- (a) That every scholar has a satisfactory knowledge of the work of the class in which he is enrolled, and has made adequate progress, and that singing and drawing and the special lessons mentioned in the General Notes to Regulation 1 have been satisfactorily taught.

Scholars over 7 years of age in Class 1, who have been not less than twelve months on the roll, must be presented for individual examination. Other scholars in that class may be so presented if their attainments be satisfactory.

Children (1) who have been less than six months in their class, or (2) have attended less than half the number of possible attendances during the six months preceding the examination need not be taken into account in calculating the percentage, but should be examined to test their classification and progress, provided that of the children due for examination in any school the number excluded from examination on the foregoing grounds shall not exceed during the year 1890 twenty per cent., during the year 1891 fifteen per cent., and during subsequent years ten per cent. In the case of the children included under (1) above, who have been promoted less than six months prior to the examination, the inspector must be satisfied that their promotion was necessary or desirable; and, in the case of those included under (2) above, the irregularity of attendance must be satisfactorily explained. A satisfactory explanation would be one which showed that the irregularity was in no measure due to negligence or want of energy or tact on the part of the head teacher.

- (b) That the names and ages of the scholars are stated correctly in the rolls.
- (c) That the scholars are properly classified.
- (d) That the general management and the discipline and tone of the school are good, and the instruction of an intelligent character.

(iii.) The average age of the scholars examined individually in Class 1 must not exceed 7 years and 9 months; the average age of the scholars in Class 2 must not exceed 9 years; of those in Class 3, 10 years and 6 months; of those in Class 4, 12 years; and of those in Class 5, 13 years and 6 months.

4. Not more than 85 per cent. of the marks obtainable by any school shall be granted for compliance with the conditions specified above under 3, (ii.), (a), (b), and (c). The remaining 15 per cent. shall be awarded according to the degree in which the conditions specified above under 3, (ii.), (d) are fulfilled.

5. Marks will be withdrawn for individual scholars and for classes failing to comply with any of the required conditions. Provided that if the classification and progress are satisfactory—

- (1) No deduction will be made for the excessive age of scholars in part-time schools;
- (2) That in full-time schools the age of any pupil who has been less than 12 months on the rolls of the school may be disregarded.

6. The result payment made to the teachers will be in the same ratio to the maximum as the number of marks actually awarded to the school is to the number which might have been obtained, provided that in schools having more than one teacher entitled to result payment, any such teacher who has displayed marked inefficiency may be paid on some lower percentage of the maximum than that awarded to the school.

7. Any change in the amount payable for results per cent., consequent upon an examination of the school, will take effect from the first day of the month succeeding that in which the examination is held.

8. In new schools result payments will be based upon a percentage of 80 until the school shall have been examined for results, but the payments upon that percentage will cease from the last day of the month in which the examination takes place.

9. The examination of a school for results will be held annually, and as far as practicable in the same month of the year.

WE, Michael Farrell, Richard Hoskin, Willis Little, Edwin Fitzroy Lusignan, and Robert McBean, the duly appointed Trustees of the Benalla Racecourse and Recreation Reserve, having framed the following Regulation in respect thereof, submit the said Regulation to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*:—

REGULATION.

No person shall after the seventh day of March, One thousand eight hundred and ninety, carry on the trade, business or calling of a bookmaker, except in and on such portions of the reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the following conditions:—

First.—That he be registered annually as a bookmaker by the trustees of the reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Benalla Racing Club, or by those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards, on payment of a fee of one pound (£1).

Second.—That during the time he shall be in or upon the reserve, carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, he shall wear a ticket, to be supplied by the trustees of the reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Benalla Racing Club, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards, which ticket shall be visible to the public and shall have thereon his name.

Every person offending against this Regulation shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence. And every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

Schedules as above, giving an estimate of the articles required, and printed forms of tender may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, by whom also the samples will be shown and any information or explanation afforded to persons tendering.

Separate tenders will be received for each schedule, but they must include the whole of the articles therein mentioned, and a separate price must be stated for each article.

The total amount of tender must be stated in words as well as in figures.

Tenders having alterations or erasures therein will not be entertained.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit as shown above in bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Secretary of the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

Security will be required either in Government debentures, bank deposit-receipt in favour of the Secretary of the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security is calculated at Ten per cent. upon contracts not exceeding £1,000, and at Five per cent. over that sum; but no deviation will be allowed from the amounts above stated.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Persons failing to take up their contracts will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for —" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and, in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form as soon as possible after delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall, as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 13 of these conditions.

11. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in condition 7.

12. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the colony for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. It the board shall decide

that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 7.

13. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money.

14. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

15. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

16. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat or the Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Departments of Public Works and Defence, or on account of other Governments, or for the Telegraph or Railway Departments, or for supplies to the Aborigines, or for connections and fittings of Diamond Drills; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment; or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

17. In the event of any alteration in the tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government will neither claim any decrease upon the contract price nor entertain any application from a contractor for any increase to it.

4. Every tender must bear the *bonâ fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, marked cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term of three years.

Separate tenders will be received for each schedule, but they must include the whole of the articles therein mentioned, and a separate price must be stated for each article, for one and three years respectively. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c.

Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

Tenders having alterations or erasures therein will not be entertained.

Security will be required either in Government debentures, bank deposit-receipt in favour of the Deputy Postmaster-General, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

Tenders must be accompanied by bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Deputy Postmaster-General, for the amount of the deposit required (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The security will be calculated at Ten per cent. on the total amount of contract.

The security must be completed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

In the event of the contractor failing to carry out the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Persons failing to take up their contracts will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Postmaster-General will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractors for all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only for such articles, and such quantities of those articles, as the Postmaster-General may order from time to time; neither will the Postmaster-General be bound to take from the contractors any larger supply of any of the articles than may be shown upon the orders which have been issued during the year, nor will he be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedules for which orders have not been issued. Should the Postmaster-General require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will be bound to supply the same at the contract rate.

2. The supplies are to be according to sample, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds of manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality be equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. All orders must accompany the goods on delivery, otherwise the goods will not be received. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A RACE-COURSE IN THE PARISH OF MERAN.

WHEREAS by the Crown grant issued in favour of John Cullen, the younger, Woodford John Williams Patchell, Charles Yeo, John William Taverner, and James Wait (hereinafter and hereinafter called the said trustees) in respect of the reserve for a racecourse in the parish of Meran, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted and the buildings for the time being thereon shall be maintained and used as and for a racecourse and offices and conveniences connected therewith under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or Administrator of the colony of Victoria for the time being with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the said trustees or the survivors of them, or other the trustees for the time being of the said land and premises (such survivors or trustees not being less than two in number at the making of such regulations.) Now, therefore, the said trustees do hereby make the following regulations in respect of the said reserve for a racecourse in the parish of Meran:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The divisions into which the reserve, with the buildings and other erections and fences thereon, is parcelled out are as follow:—

1. The grand stand, the saddling paddock, the members' stand and carriage paddock, and approaches.
2. The weighing yard, the stewards' room, the stewards' stand, the judge's box and approaches.
3. The enclosures called the reserved paddocks, stands, and approaches.
4. The flat.
5. The training ground and approaches.

2. Subject to the provisions of the seventh regulation, all persons who shall have duly paid for admission to the fifth of the said divisions for the purpose of training or exercising horses shall, upon production of their tickets, be admitted thereto with their horses for the period for which such tickets are issued, subject however, to such orders as the said trustees, or those authorized by them, may from time to time give as there may be occasion with reference to such division.

3. No person except the judge and time-keeper, or any person the judge may call to his assistance, shall enter the judge's box. No person shall enter the stewards' stand or the stewards' room except the stewards of the Kerang Turf Club, or such person as they may invite.



4. No person shall enter the weighing stand or the weighing yard or approaches thereto except the said trustees or the stewards of the Kerang Turf Club, or those authorized by the said trustees, the jockeys requiring to be weighed, and the owners and trainers of horses desirous of seeing their jockeys weighed.

5. No person shall enter the stewards' stand, the stewards' room, or the several approaches thereto, except the said trustees or the stewards of the Kerang Turf Club, or those authorized by the said trustees.

6. No person, unless otherwise permitted under these regulations, shall enter upon the reserve or any division or part thereof unless such person shall have a ticket duly authorizing him in that behalf.

7. No person who has been proved to the satisfaction of the said trustees or the stewards of the Kerang Turf Club, or those authorized by the said trustees, to have been at any time guilty of any malpractice or dishonorable conduct in connexion with racing, or who has been proved to the satisfaction of the said trustees or the stewards of the Kerang Turf Club, or those authorized by the said trustees, to be a defaulter, shall enter upon the reserve or any division or part thereof.

8. Every member of the Kerang Turf Club, and every person paying for admission to the first, third, and fifth divisions, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall upon demand produce, or (if required) surrender, to any gatekeeper, servant, or other person having authority from the said trustees to demand the production or surrender of the same.

9. No person shall remain in the reserve or any division or part thereof except the fifth division for a longer period than half-an-hour after the last race of the day shall have been run.

10. Persons renting or hiring for any race meeting the grand stand, or any portion thereof, or any booth upon the reserve, shall abide by any order given by the said trustees or those authorized by them in reference to the reserve and the buildings and other erections thereon.

11. No person shall bring any dog into the reserve, or any division or part thereof, or into any building thereon.

12. Any person committing in the reserve, or any division or part thereof, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission:—

1. Assaulting any other person.
2. Being drunk.
3. Kidding, crossing, or trespassing upon the course or any part of it during a race meeting, or when the horses are preparing or prepared to start, or are running for any race.
4. Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
5. Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
6. Behaving improperly or riotously.
7. Being found in the first, third, or fifth of the said divisions, and not producing upon demand, or, if required, not surrendering to any gatekeeper, servant, or other person having authority from the said trustees to demand production or surrender of the same, a ticket duly authorizing admission to such division, unless the person so found shall forthwith satisfy the said trustees, or those authorized by them, that the proper charge for admission has been paid by him, and that his ticket has been lost or surrendered.
8. Obtaining admission to the reserve or any division or part thereof when disentitled to such admission under these regulations.
9. Remaining in the reserve or any division or part thereof after having been warned off any part of the reserve.

13. The following is the scale of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges which shall be levied or taken for admission to the several divisions of the reserve and the buildings thereon respectively:—

14. No person shall, after the first day of March, One thousand eight hundred and ninety, carry on any trade, business, or calling whatever on any portion of the reserve other than upon such portions as may be respectively set apart by the said trustees for the carrying on of such trades, businesses, or callings, and then only when he shall have obtained the consent in writing of the said trustees.

15. No person shall, after the first day of March, One thousand eight hundred and ninety, carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker except in and upon the portions of the first, third, and fourth divisions respectively set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall comply with the following conditions:—

- 1st. That he be registered annually as a bookmaker by the trustees, committee, or stewards of the Victoria Racing Club, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards.
