### CHAPTER 52.

An Act to prevent the Disclosure of Official Documents and Information.

[26th August, 1889.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. *Disclosure of information.*—(1) (a) Where a person for the purpose of wrongfully obtaining information—

(i.) enters or is in any part of a place belonging to Her Majesty the Queen, being a fortress, arsenal, factory, dockyard, camp, ship, office, or other like place, in which part he is not entitled to be; or

(ii.) when lawfully or unlawfully in any such place as aforesaid, either obtains any document, sketch, plan, model, or knowledge of any thing which he is not entitled to obtain, or takes without lawful authority any sketch or plan; or

(iii.) when outside any fortress, arsenal, factory, dockyard, or camp belonging to Her Majesty the Queen, takes or attempts to take without authority given by or on behalf of Her Majesty, any sketch or plan of that fortress, arsenal, factory, dockyard, or camp; or

(b) where a person knowingly having possession of, or control over, any such document, sketch, plan, model, or knowledge as has been obtained or taken by means of any act which constitutes an offence against this Act at any time wilfully and without lawful authority communicates or attempts to communicate the same to any person to whom the same ought not, in the interest of the State, to be communicated at that time; or

(c) where a person after having been entrusted in confidence by some officer under Her Majesty the Queen, with any document, sketch, plan, model, or information, relating to any such place as aforesaid, or to the naval or military affairs of Her Majesty, wilfully and in breach of such confidence communicates the same when, in the interest of the State, it ought not to be communicated;

he shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction be liable to imprisonment, with or without hard labour, for a term not exceeding one year, or to a fine, or to both imprisonment and a fine.

(2) Where a person having possession of any document, sketch, plan, model, or information relating to any fortress, arsenal, factory, dockyard, camp, ship, office, or other like place belonging to Her Majesty, or to the naval or military affairs of Her Majesty, in whatever manner the same has been obtained or taken, at any time wilfully communicates the same to any person to whom he knows the same ought not, in the interest of the State, to be communicated at that time, he shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and be liable to the same punishment as if he committed an offence under the foregoing provisions of this section.

(3) Where a person commits any act declared by this section to be a misdemeanor, he shall, if he intended to communicate to a foreign State any information, document, sketch, plan, model, or knowledge obtained or taken by him, or entrusted to him as aforesaid, or if he communicates the same to any agent of a foreign State, be guilty of felony, and on conviction be liable at the discretion of the court to penal servitude for life, or for any term not less than five years, or to imprisonment for any term not exceeding two years with or without hard labour.

2. *Breach of official trust.*—(1) Where a person, by means of his holding or having held an office under Her Majesty the Queen, has lawfully or unlawfully either obtained possession of or control over any document, sketch, plan, or model, or acquired any information, and at any time corruptly or contrary to his official duty communicates or attempts to communicate that document, sketch, plan, model, or information to any person to whom the same ought not, in the interest of the State, or otherwise in the public interest, to be communicated at that time, he shall be guilty of a breach of official trust.

(2) A person guilty of a breach of official trust shall—

(a) if the communication was made or attempted to be made to a foreign State, be guilty of felony, and on conviction be liable at the discretion of the court to penal servitude for life, or for any term not less than five years, or to imprisonment for any term not exceeding two years, with or without hard labour; and

(b) in any other case be guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction be liable to imprisonment, with or without hard labour, for a term not exceeding one year, or to a fine, or to both imprisonment and a fine.

(3) This section shall apply to a person holding a contract with any department of the Government of the United Kingdom, or with the holder of any office under Her Majesty the Queen as such holder, where such contract involves an obligation of secrecy, and to any person employed by any person or body of persons holding such a contract, who is under a like obligation of secrecy, as if the person holding the contract and the person so employed were respectively holders of an office under Her Majesty the Queen.

3. *Punishment for incitement or counselling to commit offence.*—Any person who incites or counsels, or attempts to procure, another person to commit an offence under this Act, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction be liable to the same punishment as if he had committed the offence.

4. *Expenses of prosecution.*—The expenses of the prosecution of a misdemeanor under this Act shall be defrayed in like manner as in the case of a felony.

5. *Saving for laws of British possessions.*—If by any law made before or after the passing of this Act by the legislature of any British possession provisions are made which appear to Her Majesty the Queen to be of the like effect as those contained in this Act, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, suspend the operation within such British possession of this Act, or of any part thereof, so long as such law continues in force there, and no longer, and such order shall have effect as if it were enacted in this Act:

Provided that the suspension of this Act, or of any part thereof, in any British possession shall not extend to the holder of an office under Her Majesty the Queen who is not appointed to that office by the Government of that possession.

The expression "British possession" means any part of Her Majesty's dominions not within the United Kingdom.

6. *Extent of Act and place of trial of offence.*—(1) This Act shall apply to all acts made offences by this Act when committed in any part of Her Majesty's dominions, or when committed by British officers or subjects elsewhere.

(2) An offence under this Act, if alleged to have been committed out of the United Kingdom, may be inquired of, heard, and determined, in any competent British court in the place where the offence was committed, or in Her Majesty's High Court of Justice in England or the Central Criminal Court, and the Act of the forty-second year of the reign of King George the Third, chapter eighty-five, shall apply in like manner as if the offence were mentioned in that Act, and the Central Criminal Court as well as the High Court possessed the jurisdiction given by that Act to the Court of King's Bench.

(3) An offence under this Act shall not be tried by any court of general or quarter sessions, nor by the sheriff of Scotland, nor by any court out of the United Kingdom which has not jurisdiction to try crimes which involve the greatest punishment allowed by law.

(4) *50 & 51 Vict. c. 20.*—The provisions of the *Criminal Law and Procedure (Ireland) Act 1887*, shall not apply to any trial under the provisions of this Act.

7. *Restriction on prosecution.*—(1) A prosecution for an offence against this Act shall not be instituted except by or with the consent of the Attorney-General.

(2) In this section the expression "Attorney-General" means the Attorney or Solicitor General for England; and as respects Scotland, means the Lord Advocate; and as respects Ireland, means the Attorney or Solicitor General for Ireland; and if the prosecution is instituted in any court out of the United Kingdom, means the person who in that court is Attorney-General, or exercises the like functions as the Attorney-General in England.

8. *Interpretations.*—In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires—

Any reference to a place belonging to Her Majesty the Queen includes a place belonging to any department of the Government of the United Kingdom or of any of Her Majesty's possessions, whether the place is or is not actually vested in Her Majesty;

Expressions referring to communications include any communication, whether in whole or in part, and whether the document, sketch, plan, model, or information itself or the substance or effect thereof only be communicated;

The expression "document" includes part of a document; The expression "model" includes design, pattern, and specimen;

The expression "sketch" includes any photograph or other mode of representation of any place or thing;

The expression "office under Her Majesty the Queen" includes any office or employment in or under any department of the Government of the United Kingdom, and so far as regards any document, sketch, plan, model, or information relating to the naval or military affairs of Her Majesty, includes any office or employment in or under any department of the Government of any of Her Majesty's possessions.

9. *Saving.*—This Act shall not exempt any person from any proceeding for any offence which is punishable at common law, or by military or naval law, or under any Act of Parliament other than this Act, so, however, that no person be punished twice for the same offence.

10. *Short title.*—This Act may be cited as the *Official Secrets Act 1889*.

"MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT 1889."

CHAPTER 46.

An Act to amend the *Merchant Shipping Act 1854* and the Acts amending the same.

[20th August, 1889.]

Enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. *Remedies for recovery of master's disbursements.*—Every master of a ship, and every person lawfully acting as master of a ship by reason of the decease or incapacity from illness of the master of the ship, shall, so far as the case permits, have the same rights, liens, and remedies for the recovery of disbursements properly made by him on account of the ship, and for liabilities properly incurred by him on account of the ship, as a master of a ship now has for the recovery of his wages; and if in any proceeding in any Court of Admiralty or Vice-Admiralty, or in any county court having Admiralty jurisdiction, touching the claim of a master or any person lawfully acting as master to wages or such disbursements or liabilities as aforesaid, any right of set-off or counterclaim is set up, it shall be lawful for the court to enter into and adjudicate upon all questions, and to settle all accounts then arising or outstanding and unsettled between the parties to the proceeding, and to direct payment of any balance which is found to be due.

2. *Restrictions on advance notes.*—*17 and 18 Vict. c. 104 s. 140.*—(1) Any agreement with a seaman made under section one hundred and forty-nine of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1854* may contain a stipulation for payment to or on behalf of the seaman, conditionally on his going to sea in pursuance of the agreement, of a sum not exceeding the amount of one month's wages payable to the seaman under the agreement.

(2) Save as authorized by this section, any agreement by or on behalf of the employer of a seaman for the payment of money to or on behalf of the seaman conditionally on his going to sea from any port in the United Kingdom shall be void, and no money paid in satisfaction or in respect of any such agreement shall be deducted from the seaman's wages, and no person shall have any right of action, suit, or set-off against the seaman or his assignee in respect of any money so paid or purporting to have been so paid.

(3) Nothing in this section shall affect any allotment made under the *Merchant Shipping Act 1854* or the Acts amending the same.

*43 and 44 Vict. c. 16.*—(4) Section two of the *Merchant Seamen (Payment of Wages and Rating) Act 1880* is hereby repealed.

3. *Register of deserters.*—Every superintendent of a mercantile marine office shall keep at his office a list of the seamen who, to the best of his knowledge and belief, have deserted or failed to join their ships after signing an agreement to proceed to sea in them, and shall on request show this list to any master of a ship.

A superintendent of a mercantile marine office shall not be liable in respect of any entry made in good faith in the list so kept.

4. *Rule as to payment of British seamen in foreign money.*—Where a seaman has agreed with the master of a British ship for payment of his wages in British sterling or any other money, any payment of, or on account of, his wages if made in any other currency than that stated in the agreement, shall, notwithstanding anything in the agreement, be made at the rate of exchange for the money stated in the agreement for the time being current at the place where the payment is made.

5. *Provisions as to steamships to apply to ships propelled by electricity, &c.*—The provisions of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, and the Acts amending the same, with respect to steamships, shall apply to ships propelled by electricity or other mechanical power, with such modifications as the Board of Trade may from time to time prescribe for purposes of adaptation.

6. *Short title and construction.*—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Merchant Shipping Act 1889*.

(2) This Act shall be construed as one with the *Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, and the Acts amending the same, and this Act and those Acts may be cited collectively as the *Merchant Shipping Acts 1854 to 1889*.

#### “MERCHANT SHIPPING (TONNAGE) ACT 1889.”

#### CHAPTER 43.

An Act to amend the Law relating to the Measurement of the Tonnage of Merchant Ships.

[26th August, 1889.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. *Amendment of rules for measurement of tonnage.*—(1) In the measurement of a ship for the purpose of ascertaining her register tonnage, no deduction shall be allowed in respect of any space which has not been first included in the measurement of her tonnage.

(2) *17 and 18 Vict. c. 104.*—In section twenty-one, paragraph (4), of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, the words “First, that nothing shall be added for a closed-in space solely appropriated to the berthing of the crew, unless such space exceeds one-twentieth of the remaining tonnage of the ship, and in case of such excess the excess only shall be added; and secondly”, and in section twenty-two, paragraph (2), of the same Act, the words “subject to the deduction for a closed-in space appropriated to the crew, as mentioned in Rule 1.” shall be repealed.

Provided that this section shall not apply until after the expiration of five years from the date of the passing of this Act to any ship in the measurement or re-measurement of which the deductions prohibited by this section have been made before the tenth day of March One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, or to any ship the building of which was commenced before the tenth day of March One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and which is registered for the first time between that date and the last day of December One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, unless in either case the ship is, before the expiration of the said five years, measured or re-measured in accordance with the provisions of this Act, and any such ship may be measured or re-measured at the request of the owner.

But this exemption shall not extend to any ship in the case of which the allowance for propelling power space exceeds fifty per cent. of the gross tonnage of the ship.

Subject as aforesaid, the tonnage of every ship shall be estimated for all purposes as if any deduction prohibited by this section had not been made, and the particulars relating to the ship's tonnage in the register book, and in her certificate of registry, shall be corrected accordingly.

2. *Rule as to allowance for engine room in steamers.*—In the case of any ship built or measured after the passing of this Act, such portion of the space or spaces above the crown of the engine room and above the upper deck as is framed in for the machinery or for the admission of light and air, shall not be included in the measurement of the space occupied by the propelling power,

except in pursuance of a request in writing to the Board of Trade by the owner of the ship, and shall not be included in pursuance of such request unless:—

(a) That portion is first included in the measurement of the gross tonnage; and

(b) A surveyor appointed under the Fourth Part of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, certifies that the portion so framed in is reasonable in extent and is so constructed as to be safe and seaworthy, and that it cannot be used for any purpose other than the machinery or for the admission of light and air to the machinery or boilers of the ship.

3. *Deductions for navigation spaces, &c.*—(1) In measuring or re-measuring a ship for the purpose of ascertaining her register tonnage, the following deductions shall be made from the space included in the measurement of the tonnage:—

(a) In the case of a ship wholly propelled by sails, any space set apart and used exclusively for the storage of sails;

(b) In the case of any ship—

(i.) Any space used exclusively for the accommodation of the master;

(ii.) Any space used exclusively for the working of the helm, the capstan, and the anchor gear, or for keeping the charts, signals, and other instruments of navigation, and boatswain's stores; and

(iii.) The space occupied by the donkey engine and boiler, if connected with the main pumps of the ship.

(2) The deductions allowed under this section shall be subject to the following provisions, namely:—

(a) The space deducted must be certified by a surveyor appointed by the Board or Trade as reasonable in extent and properly and efficiently constructed for the purpose for which it is intended;

(b) There must be permanently marked in or over every such space a notice stating the purpose to which it is to be applied and that whilst so applied it is to be deducted from the tonnage of the ship;

(c) The deduction on account of space for storage of sails must not exceed two and a half per cent. of the tonnage of the ship.

4. *Provisions as to deductions in case of certain steamships.*—In the case of a screw steamship which, at the passing of this Act, has an engine-room allowance of thirty-two per cent. of the gross tonnage of the ship, and in which any crew space on deck has not been included in the gross tonnage, whether its contents have been deducted therefrom or not, the crew space shall be, on the application of the owner of the ship, or by direction of the Board of Trade, measured and its contents ascertained and added to the register tonnage of the ship; and if it appears that with such addition to the tonnage the engine-room does not occupy more than thirteen per cent. of the tonnage of the ship, the existing allowance for engine room of thirty-two per cent. of the tonnage shall be continued, notwithstanding anything in this Act.

5. *Measurements of ships with double bottoms for water ballast.*—In the case of a ship constructed with a double bottom for water ballast, if the space between the inner and outer plating thereof is certified by a surveyor appointed by the Board of Trade to be not available for the carriage of cargo, stores, or fuel, then the depth required by section twenty-one, paragraph (2), of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, shall be taken to be the upper side of the inner plating of the double bottom, and that upper side shall, for the purposes of measurement, be deemed to represent the floor timber referred to in that section.

6. *Re-measurement of foreign ships.*—*17 and 18 Vict. c. 104.*—If and whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that the tonnage of any foreign ship, as measured by the rules of the country to which she belongs, materially differs from that which would be her tonnage if measured under the *Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, and the Acts amending the same, Her Majesty may from time to time, by Order in Council, direct that, notwithstanding any Order in Council for the time being in force under those Acts, any of the ships of that country may, for all or any of the purposes of those Acts, be re-measured in accordance with the provisions of those Acts, and Her Majesty may revoke any Order so made.

7. *Short title and construction.*—This Act may be cited as the *Merchant Shipping (Tonnage) Act 1889*, and shall be construed as one with the *Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, and the Acts amending the same.

1. The allocation of the amount annually voted by Parliament as a grant to Charitable Institutions.
2. The advisability of requiring municipal bodies to contribute towards the erection of Charitable Institutions, and towards their maintenance.
3. The mode of collecting funds by private contributions or otherwise on behalf of Charitable Institutions, and the system which should govern the distribution of receipts between the maintenance fund and the formation or increase of endowment funds.
4. The relief of the immediate and pressing wants of the poor of the community.
5. The limitation of the benefits of Charitable Institutions to those who from poverty or other causes are entitled to participate in them, and the advisability of establishing pay wards, and the conditions of admission to such wards.
6. The more general introduction of female nursing in hospitals, the training of nurses, and the general improvement of the system under which such nurses are employed.
7. The transfer from Hospitals to other Charitable Institutions of indigent or helpless persons who are no longer in need of hospital treatment.
8. The method of disposing of children in Orphan Asylums subsidized by the State.
9. The manner of making persons contribute towards the support of indigent relations who are burthens upon Charitable Institutions, and the best means of recovering moneys due to such Institutions.
10. And generally into all matters connected with the premises.

NUMURKAH SHIRE.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA AND CONSTITUTION OF A NEW SHIRE.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, sec. 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Numurkah which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Numurkah and constituted a new shire, under the name or title of "The Shire of Nathalia."

Area described in petition:—

Commencing at the south-east corner of the parish of Waasia; bounded on the east by the parishes of Baulkamaugh and Ulupna, on the north to the point where the River Murray intersects the boundary line between the parishes of Yialima and Cocomah, by the River Murray; thence on the west and north by the parishes of Cocomah, Barmah, and Moira; thence on the south by the parishes of Kotupna and Kaarimba to the commencing point.

Petitioners state that the shire as at present constituted is unequal, to their detriment; the Western riding, comprising six parishes, returning three members, whilst the Eastern and Central ridings, together comprising only seven parishes, return six members; that the rateable property in the area described is valued at about twenty thousand pounds, and is rapidly increasing; the shire council meets and the municipal work is transacted at Numurkah, which is distant twenty-four miles from the north-west portion of Picola; railway communication is now complete to Nathalia; within the said area is the market centre, and a place appointed for the receipt of Crown rents, and where a court of petty sessions is holden every fourteen days. During the last two years at least thirty thousand pounds has been expended in buildings in the township of Nathalia; that the representatives of the area being in a minority in the council are unable to get redress of grievances under which they labour.

Petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the said area from the Shire of Numurkah, and constitute it a separate municipality, under the name and title of the "Shire of Nathalia;" that it be subdivided into two ridings, and that the council consist of six members.

*Rules and Regulations made by Trustees, 5th February, 1890.*

1. The rules and regulations numbered 1 to 12 shall be the rules and regulations of the Brim Springs General Cemetery, after the publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. The office of the trust shall be open daily from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

3. No burial shall, under any circumstances, be permitted in the cemetery until an application has been made, name, age, late place of residence, occupation, and probable cause of death of the deceased given at the office of the trust, an order in the form Schedule A obtained, and the fees paid.

4. The fees mentioned in Schedule B shall be the fees payable under the Act, and shall be paid at time of making application for any order.

5. No person other than the owner or his agent duly authorized in writing shall be permitted to interfere in any way whatever with a grave or enclosure, unless by special direction of the trustees.

6. Every grave, vault, tombstone, or other erection shall be maintained and kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.

7. Every grave shall be six feet deep for an adult's body, and not more than two adults, unless the grave be of greater depth or of extra width, shall be interred in each, two infants being considered equal to an adult.

8. Notices of any burial shall be given at the cemetery eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial.

9. Before a private grave shall be re-opened, the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same shall be given.

10. No order for burial shall be issued until there has been deposited at the Trust Office a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and, in case of re-interment, on removal from another cemetery, verified copies of such certificate and of the licence of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf, and on payment of the usual fees.

11. Any workman employed in the cemetery, though not in the employment of the trustees, shall be required to comply with such general directions of the trustees or their secretary as may be necessary for the control and good order of the cemetery.

12. All material required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery. Stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after the work is completed shall be removed at once by the person employed on the work.

3. *The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.*

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, marked cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term of three years.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

Separate tenders will be received for each schedule, but they must include the whole of the articles therein mentioned, and a separate price must be stated for each article, for one and three years respectively. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c.

Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

Tenders having alterations or erasures therein will not be entertained.

Security will be required either in Government debentures, bank deposit-receipt in favour of the Deputy Postmaster-General, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

Tenders must be accompanied by bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Deputy Postmaster-General, for the amount of the deposit required (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The security will be calculated at Ten per cent. on the total amount of contract.

The security must be completed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

In the event of the contractor failing to carry out the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Persons failing to take up their contracts will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Postmaster-General will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractors for all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only for such articles, and such quantities of those articles, as the Postmaster-General may order from time to time; neither will the Postmaster-General be bound to take from the contractors any larger supply of any of the articles than may be shown upon the orders which have been issued during the year, nor will he be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedules for which orders have not been issued. Should the Postmaster-General require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will be bound to supply the same at the contract rate.

2. The supplies are to be according to sample, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds of manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality be equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. All orders must accompany the goods on delivery, otherwise the goods will not be received. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered.

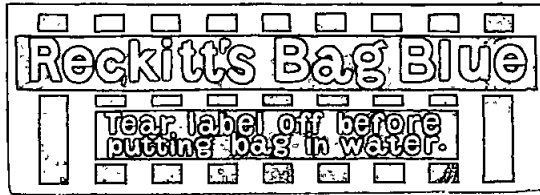
