IMPORTATION OF ARMS AND AMMUNITION INTO SAMOA.

THE annexed Declaration respecting the importation of arms and ammunition into the islands of Samoa, extracted from the Final Act of the Conference on Samoan Affairs, which appeared in the *London Gazette* of 24th January, 1890, is published for general information.

Art. VII.—A Declaration respecting Arms and Ammunition, restraining their sale and use.

"The importation into the islands of Samoa of arms and ammunition by the natives of Samoa, or by the citizens or subjects of any foreign country, shall be prohibited, except in the following cases:—

"(a) Guns and ammunition for sporting purposes, for which written licence shall have been previously obtained from the President of the Municipal Council.

"(b) Small arms and ammunition carried by travellers as personal appanage.

"The sale of arms and ammunition by any foreigner to any native Samoan subject or other Pacific Islander resident in Samoa is also prohibited.

"Any arms or ammunition imported or sold in violation of these provisions shall be forfeited to the Government of Samoa. The Samoan Government retains the right to import suitable arms and ammunition to protect itself and maintain order; but all such arms and ammunition shall be entered at the Customs (without payment of duty), and reported by the President of the Municipal Council to the Consuls of the three Treaty Powers.

"The three Governments reserve to themselves the future consideration of the further restrictions which it may be necessary to impose upon the importation and use of fire-arms in Samoa."

The births of 1,401 children, viz., 718 boys and 683 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of February. In the month of January 1,251 births were registered, or 150 less than in the month under review. The births were 546 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 67 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in February numbered 878, viz., 472 of males and 406 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 523, or 60 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in January by 120, but were over the average of February during the previous ten years by 252. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by 48 only.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.06, and of deaths registered 1.91.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 103.4° on the 6th, and the lowest was 52.5° on the 24th. The mean temperature of the month (70.5°) was almost 5 degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (35.7°) took place on the 26th. The least range (4.6°) was on the 8th. The mean daily range was 21.6°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.229 inches on the 18th, and the lowest was 29.501 inches on the 7th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.870 inches) was about the average.

Rain fell on 5 days, the amount of rainfall being .56 inch. The average rainfall in February during the previous ten years was 1.49 inches, or nearly an inch more than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 54 per cent., and females 46 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 48 per cent. to that mortality, as against the following proportions in the corresponding month of each of the years named:—52 per cent. in 1889, 47 per cent. in 1888, 52 per cent. in 1887, 48 per cent. in 1886, 48 per cent. in 1885, 40 per cent. in 1884, 42 per cent. in 1883, 46 per cent. in 1882, 45 per cent. in 1881, and 52 per cent. in 1880.

Twenty-four deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a gentleman, aged 75, died of diarrhoea; a contractor, aged 75, of gout; two gentlemen, each aged 75, of cancer; a miner, aged 75, of paralysis; a female, aged 75, of hepatitis; a boardinghouse-keeper, aged 75, of diarrhoea; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 76, of phthisis; a female shopkeeper, aged 76, of heart disease; a female, aged 76, of gastro-enteritis; a housekeeper, aged 77, of paralysis; a female, aged 77, of embolism; a fisherman, aged 78, of cancer; a female, aged 78, of bronchitis; a labourer, aged 80, of insanity; an architect, aged 83, of heart disease; a female, aged 90, of bronchitis; a gentleman and two labourers, each aged 75, a female, aged 76, a female, aged 84, and two females, each aged 87, of old age.

Forty-five deaths were due to external causes during the month, of which forty-two were set down to accident, one to homicide, and two to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A female child, aged 4, two labourers, aged 27 and 37 respectively, and a timekeeper, aged 46, were passed over by vehicles; a market gardener, aged 52, was killed in a railway accident; a boy, aged 16, two contractors, aged 47 and 62 respectively, died of injuries consequent on falls; a storeman, aged 34, of fracture of the thigh, caused by a cask falling on him; a train examiner, aged 38, of fracture of the spine, the result of a bale of wool falling on him; a groom, aged 19, of injury to the hand—how caused not stated; a male infant, aged 2, of injuries 16, of injury to the eye; and a labourer, aged 19, of diffuse inflammation of the arm, the result of a scratch on the finger; a boy, aged 16, resulting from scalds; two female infants, aged 8 months and 3 years respectively, a boy, aged 10, a female, aged 30, a labourer, aged 40, a female, aged 42, a timber-yard employe, aged 44, a cabinetmaker, aged 45, a farmer, aged 50, a carpenter, aged 53, and a labourer, aged 60, of heat apoplexy; a hawker, aged 25, of inhalation of chloroform properly administered; two boys, aged 6 and 11 respectively, a boot apprentice, aged 13, a labourer, aged 17, a quarryman, aged 26, and a male, of occupation unknown, aged 35, were drowned in the River Yarra; an ironmonger's assistant, aged 16, a seaman, aged 29, a wood merchant, aged 55, and a female, aged 72, were drowned in Hobson's Bay; a male, aged 13, a female, aged 21, and a carpenter, aged 42, were found drowned; a female infant, aged 1 hour, was suffocated during birth; a female infant, aged 14 days, was overlain; a male infant, aged 6 days, died of umbilical hæmorrhage. The homicidal death was that of a newly-born female infant, who was strangled—a verdict of wilful murder being returned. The suicidal deaths were those of a female, aged 20, who poisoned herself with opium; and a female, aged 23, who drowned herself.

One hundred and forty-five deaths, or 17 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—57 in the Melbourne Hospital, 21 in the Alfred Hospital, 8 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 4 in the Children's Hospital, 5 in the Lying-in Hospital, 9 in the Immigrants' Home, 7 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 14 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Austin Hospital, 5 in the Melbourne Gaol, 3 in the Protestant Refuge, 1 in the Infant Asylum, and 1 in the Eye and Ear Hospital.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 425, of which 214, or 50 per cent., were of males, and 211, or 50 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 295 were under one year of age, 86 were between one and two, 22 were between two and three, 13 were between three and four, and 9 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 453. Of these, 258, or 56 per cent., were males, and 195, or 44 per cent., were females; 35 were between five and ten, 22 were between ten and fifteen, 29 were between fifteen and twenty, 44 were between twenty and twenty-five, 39 were between twenty-five and thirty, 40 were between thirty and thirty-five, 27 were between thirty-five and forty, 27 were between forty and forty-five, 32 were between forty-five and fifty, 26 were between fifty and fifty-five, 27 were between fifty-five and sixty, 42 were between sixty and sixty-five, 21 were between sixty-five and seventy, 18 were between seventy and seventy-five, 18 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 6 were upwards of eighty.

Specific febrile or zymotic diseases, which caused 193 deaths in the thirty-one days of January, caused as many as 210 deaths in the twenty-eight days of February. Under this head, deaths from diphtheria increased from 25 to 46, deaths from scarlet fever from 6 to 7, and deaths from whooping-cough from 6 to 8. On the other hand, deaths from typhoid fever fell from 78 to 73, and deaths from diarrhoeal diseases from 74 to 66. In addition to the deaths from diphtheria, 2 deaths were set down to diphtheritic croup in both months. In January 17 and in February 10 deaths were set down to sunstroke, as against only 4 deaths from that cause in the former, and no deaths from that cause in the latter month of the previous year.

GISBORNE WATERWORKS TRUST CONSTITUTED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fourth day of March, 1890.

WHEREAS by *The Water Conservation Act 1887* it was amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application should have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, should submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application or as to any alterations or additions he might think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and the Governor in Council might thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or might disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and should make an Order in Council accordingly; and it was further enacted that if the Governor in Council should approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations or additions or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust should be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks, and of the constitution of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, should

- (a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out such proposed waterworks, and of paying the cost and expense of preparing the general plan and description of the same, and the costs of the application for the constituting of such Waterworks Trust; and also the rate of interest which will be charged for such loan, such rate being at least one-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the Public Loan out of which such loan might be granted;
- (b) Specify the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such Waterworks Trust should have authority, to be called a Waterworks District;
- (c) State what are the principal works to be constructed;
- (d) Assign a corporate name to such Waterworks Trust; and
- (e) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with this Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council thinks fit.

And it was further enacted that the Governor in Council might, where a Waterworks District is either wholly or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof within one or more ridings of any municipal district, appoint the councillors for such riding or ridings, together with any other person or persons, not exceeding three in number, to be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application of the councillors of the Mountain and Borough Ridings of the Shire of Gisborne, for a loan of Four thousand seven hundred pounds sterling (£4,700) to carry out certain waterworks for the domestic supply of a Waterworks District under the said Act, embracing the townships of Old and New Gisborne, as shown on the general plan and description accompanying the said application, deposited in the Department of Victorian Water Supply, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

- (1) The construction of the said waterworks, and the constitution of a Waterworks Trust.
- (2) That the councillors for the Mountain and Borough Ridings of the said Shire of Gisborne and one other person shall be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust.
- (3) That the amount of the loan hereby granted shall be Four thousand seven hundred pounds sterling (£4,700), for the purpose of constructing waterworks for the supply of the townships of Old and New Gisborne with water, and also for paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payment of which interest shall be made half-yearly.
- (4) That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—

Commencing at the south-east angle of the township of Gisborne, as gazetted 25th February, 1861, p. 404, thence westerly and northerly by south and west boundaries of said township of Gisborne; thence easterly by north boundary of said township to three-chain main road to Melbourne; thence north-westerly by that road to the most westerly angle of allotment 60, section 34, parish of Gisborne; thence due north by a line across one-chain road to its intersection with south-east boundary of Racecourse and Recreation Reserve; thence north-easterly, northerly, and north-westerly by portion of the east and north

boundary of said Racecourse and Recreation Reserve to the most north-eastern angle thereof; thence north-easterly by a line to the south-west angle of allotment 17, section 34; thence northerly by west boundary of allotments 17 and 16 to north-west angle of allotment 16; thence north-easterly by a line to the south-west angle of allotment 1, Wooling pre-emptive right; thence northerly by west boundary of said pre-emptive right to its intersection with the Baringo Creek; thence north-easterly by said Baringo Creek to a point distant twenty chains from said west boundary of said allotment 1; thence due north by a line to a point in the north boundary of allotment 2a, section 8, parish of Macedon; thence easterly by north boundary of said allotment 2a to the north-east angle of that allotment; thence north-easterly by a line across road and portion of the east boundary of allotment 1, section 8, parish of Macedon, to the most eastern angle thereof; thence easterly by a line across the Baringo Creek to the most western angle of allotment 160, parish of Kerrie; thence in a southerly, easterly, and southerly direction by portion of west boundaries of said allotment 160 to south-west angle thereof; thence southerly by a line across road to the north-east angle of allotment 124; thence south-westerly by north boundary of said allotment 124 to the north-west angle thereof; thence southerly by parish boundary of Kerrie and Gisborne to the intersection of same with north boundary of allotment 13, section 34, parish of Gisborne; thence westerly by portion of boundary of said allotment 13 to north-west angle thereof; thence southerly by west boundary of said allotment 13 to the south-west angle thereof; thence westerly by road forming south boundary of allotment 14 to north-east angle of allotment 8; thence southerly by east boundary of allotments 8, 7, and 6 to south-east angle of allotment 6; thence westerly by south boundary of allotment 6 to north-east angle of subdivision F, allotment 5; thence southerly by east boundary of said subdivision F to south-east angle thereof; thence continued further south by a line and east boundary of allotment 67, section 34, to south-east angle thereof; thence westerly by road forming south boundary of allotments 67 and 66 to intersection with road forming east boundary of allotments 62, 59, and 58; thence in a general southerly direction by that road and road forming east boundary of allotments 40 and 39, section 34, to the intersection of same with north boundary of township of Gisborne; thence easterly and southerly by north and east boundary of said township of Gisborne to the commencing point, all of which boundaries are as shown on Order in Council plan deposited in office of Minister of Water Supply, Melbourne.

- (5) That the principal works to be constructed shall consist of an offtake weir on the Garden Hut Creek; pipe main from thence to townships of Old and New Gisborne, and the reticulation of those townships.
- (6) That the name of the Trust shall be the Gisborne Waterworks Trust.

WHEREAS under the provisions of *The Vermin Destruction Act 1889*, No. 1028, it is amongst other things provided that on the application of the council of any shire the Governor in Council, out of any moneys which may be provided by Parliament for the purpose, may from time to time grant a loan to any such shire for the purpose of enabling such shire to obtain materials for wire-netting or other rabbit-proof or vermin-proof fencing, to be supplied to owners of land in special areas constituted under the said Act: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Seymour has received petitions signed by a majority in number of the owners of land in the special area (the petitioners owning more than one-half of the land in such area), describing the special area for which the petitioners desire a loan to be obtained by the shire, which petitions contain statements of the acreage of the whole of such special area, and of the acreage owned by each and every owner of every part thereof, with a short description of the land owned by each petitioner and of the acreage thereof, and gives an estimate of the probable cost of the whole of the materials for wire-netting or other rabbit-proof or vermin-proof fencing required for the land in such area, and asks that the said shire council will apply to the Governor in Council for a loan of the amount of such estimate, and gives an estimate of the materials required for each petitioner's land, and the probable cost of such material, and an estimate of the extent of fencing to be erected by each owner; and states that in such special area adjoining properties could advantageously be enclosed by one continuous wire-netting fence; "and states in each case the estimated cost of such continuous fence, and the proportions thereof to be borne by every owner of property to be enclosed by such fence"; and states that each petitioner signing the petitions undertakes to pay to the council in each and every year one-tenth part of his proportion of the value of

all materials for wire-netting fencing, which the council may obtain by means of the loan proposed to be obtained from the Governor in Council, and that such undertaking as between each petitioner, or the owner for the time being of the land of such petitioner, or any part thereof, and the said shire council is to be deemed to be and may be enforced as a specialty contract, and states that each petitioner undertakes to erect on his land, with the materials with which he may be furnished, wire-netting fencing to the satisfaction of the said council, or that he will join with other owners in erecting all necessary fencing: And whereas every signature to such petitions is verified by the solemn declaration of a person signing such petitions, which declaration is in the form or to the effect in the Eighth Schedule to the said Act.

And whereas the said shire council has considered the prayer of such petitions, and has determined to apply for a loan from the Governor in Council in accordance therewith, and has transmitted to the Minister the said petitions, accompanied by an application under seal on behalf of the said shire for a loan of Two thousand four hundred and ninety pounds in the terms therein stated, which said application contains an undertaking by the said shire to repay such loan, in accordance with the provisions of the said recited Act and of any Order in Council granting such loan: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby order that the sum of Two thousand four hundred and ninety pounds, being the whole of the amount applied for by the said shire council in the application hereinbefore referred to, be granted out of the moneys provided by Parliament as a loan to the said Shire of Seymour for the purposes of Part II. of the said *The Vermin Destruction Act 1889*.

That the said sum of Two thousand four hundred and ninety pounds be paid to the council in one instalment of Two thousand four hundred and ninety pounds.

That the said sum of Two thousand four hundred and ninety pounds be a loan for the benefit of the whole land described in the petitions.

That the said sum of Two thousand four hundred and ninety pounds be a loan for the benefit of the land specified in the schedule hereunder.

That the proportion of the said sum of Two thousand four hundred and ninety pounds to be paid by each and every owner of land within the special area to the said shire council is that set out in the schedule hereunder.

That the said sum of Two thousand four hundred and ninety pounds be repaid by the council of the said shire to the Secretary for Lands for the time being within ten years by annual instalments of not less than Two hundred and forty-nine pounds each. The first of such payments to be made on or before the thirty-first day of May, 1891, and a further instalment of not less than Two hundred and forty-nine pounds on or before the thirty-first day of May in each and every succeeding year until the whole sum of Two thousand four hundred and ninety pounds is repaid.

WHEREAS by *The Neglected Children's Act 1887* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, by order to be published in the *Government Gazette*, make, alter, and repeal Regulations for the purposes set forth in section 89 of the said Act: Now therefore the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that the Regulations made on the twelfth day of August, 1889, under the Act aforesaid, be altered by adding to the note appended to the dietary scale of daily allowances set forth in the Sixth Schedule thereto the words—
"One ounce of butter to be allowed for each child on Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays, and Sundays."

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

BOROUGH OF PORTLAND.

BY-LAW No. 39.

For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter-houses, &c., and for regulating the management of earth-closets, privies, &c., disinfecting and deodorizing night-soil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, the Council of the Borough of Portland, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, doth hereby make the by-law following, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws or parts of by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply and come into operation in the whole of the area enclosed by lines drawn in the middle of the streets hereinafter mentioned, and commencing at the intersection of Glenelg-street with Blair-street; thence north to its intersection with Fern-street; thence east to the shore of Portland Bay; thence southerly by that shore to the intersection of Hoddle-street; thence south to the intersection of Glenelg-street; thence west to the point of commencement. And also the area enclosed by the lines drawn in the centre of the following streets, and commencing at the intersection of Wellington-road with Bancroft-street; thence by Bancroft-street to its intersection with Portland Bay; thence southerly by the shores of the said bay to the intersection of Hughes-street; thence by that street to its intersection with Wellington-road; and thence by that street to the point of commencement.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said borough shall cause the yard and ground belonging to such premises, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be removed from time to time from such yard or ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the borough council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such owner.

5. The occupier of any land in the said borough on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pigsty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises, as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to three cubic yards. And if at any time the occupier of such premises shall fail or neglect to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said borough council at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said borough within one month of the confirmation of this by-law shall cause every cesspool already in existence to be forthwith emptied and cleansed, refilled with clay, and henceforth abolished, and in lieu thereof shall substitute pans as hereinafter described. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of 11 p.m. and 5 a.m. And provided also that the contents of any privy or cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have been thoroughly mixed with carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer, sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, when necessary, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied or cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet, for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, or place for the reception of night-soil, except by means of a cart or conveyance, properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or portion of the contents thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

9. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to, and deposited in, such place or places as the council may appoint from time to time for the reception of the same.

10. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited, or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing, or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately, on the deposit or spreading thereof, cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

11. The occupier of any premises within the borough used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether as an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon, once in every twenty-four hours to be removed therefrom, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health; or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said council at the expense of such occupier.

12. Every closet pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted together and soldered so as to be water-tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity of not more than three cubic feet.

13. No closet door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

14. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds (£5) for every breach, or of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings (5s.), to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether the council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

- Orders for interment to be given to the person in charge of the cemetery, at the office of the trustees, on the day previous.
- The name, age, late place of residence, probable cause and date of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.
- The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at hour appointed for funeral.
- The usual hours for interment will be from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument at the cemetery to be made to the trustees; a certificate of permission will be granted to the persons applying on payment of the charges set forth in schedule marked A.
- All monuments, vaults, graves, and grave stones to be kept in repair and in proper condition at the expense of the owners.
- Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.
- Plan of every monument must be submitted to the trustees for approval.
- Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair may be removed by order of the trustees at a month's notice.
- A plan of the ground and a register will be kept, which may be examined.
- Three of the trustees to form a quorum.
- No grave to be of a less depth than 6 feet.

ROAD PROCLAIMED UNDER "THE LAND ACT, 1884."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Nidry of Nidry Castle in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and, in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form as soon as possible after delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. EASTER EXCURSIONS.

SHIRE OF YARRAWONGA.

By-LAW No. 13.

A By-law of the Shire of Yarrowonga, made under section 213 of the "Local Government Act," and numbered 13, for adopting certain provisions of the said Thirteenth Schedule.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1874*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Yarrowonga make this by-law, as follows:—

The provisions of Part VIII. of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1874* shall be and are hereby adopted for the Shire of Yarrowonga, within the townships of Tungamah, Cobram, Katamatite, St. James, Yarrowonga, and Karraumbet.

Part VIII.—Nuisances, Etc.

1. *Keeper of goats to register name and address.*—Every owner or keeper of any goat usually kept within the several townships in the municipal district shall register with the municipal clerk his name and address as a keeper of goats, and shall, at the time

of such registration, pay to such clerk the sum of Sixpence, and shall place and keep upon the neck of every goat so owned and kept a collar bearing the name and address so registered; and if any person shall, without lawful excuse offend in any respect against this section, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

2. *Goats to be presumed to be kept by persons named on collar.*—If any goat shall be found having on its neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of a person registered as aforesaid, such goat shall *prima facie* be presumed to be owned and kept by such person.

3. *Place for custody of goats seized hereunder.*—The council shall from time to time provide one secure enclosure for the keeping and custody of goats for the purposes of this subdivision, and forthwith, when any such enclosure shall have been provided, shall notify the same and situation thereof in some newspaper generally circulating in the neighbourhood.

4. *Goats at large may be seized.*—Every goat found at large in any street, road, or public place may, by the proper officer of the council, be forthwith seized and confined in such enclosure as aforesaid, until dealt with as hereinafter provided.

5. *Notice of seizure to registered owner.*—Whenever a goat, having on the neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of a person resident within the municipal district registered as aforesaid, shall be seized hereunder, the proper officer of the council shall forthwith cause notice of such seizure to be given to such person or left at the place of such address.

6. *Goats seized may be destroyed after certain time.*—Subject to the provisions hereinafter in this by-law contained, every goat so seized and confined as aforesaid, which shall not have upon the neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of some person registered as aforesaid, may, by the proper officer of the council, be destroyed at or after noon of the day following the day of such seizure, and every such goat which shall have on the neck such a collar as aforesaid may, by the said officer, be destroyed at or after noon of the day following next but one the day of such seizure.

7. *Owner may apply to a justice to have goat restored, but the restoration shall be conclusive as to his liabilities as owner.*—The owner of any goat which shall have been seized as aforesaid may apply, *ex parte*, to any justice that such goat be restored to such owner, and such goat shall, if a justice shall so order and not otherwise, be, unless the same has been destroyed, restored to such owner accordingly; and order of a justice, or any minute thereof under the hand of such justice, shall, for all purposes of this subdivision, be conclusive evidence that the person so applying was the owner of such goat.

8. *Owners of all goats found at large to be liable to penalty.*—The owner, whether registered hereunder or not, of every goat found at large in any street, road, or public place shall, whether such goat be destroyed or not, or be restored or not, forfeit and pay a penalty of Five shillings.

9. *Regulations as to keeping swine.*—It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for appointing, by limits to be set forth therein, portions of the municipal district in which it shall not be lawful to keep any swine; and if any person shall keep any swine within any such prescribed limits, he shall forfeit for every day during which he shall so offend a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

10. *Removing night-soil, &c.*—Every person who shall empty any privy or load, carry, remove, or deposit any night-soil, offal, or any other offensive refuse or matter, save between such hours of the night, or shall deposit the same save at such places as respectively shall have been appointed by some regulations of the council in that behalf, or who shall use for any such purpose any cart or carriage not having a covering proper for prevention of escape of the contents of such cart or of the stench thereof, shall forfeit for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and it shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for appointing such hours and places as aforesaid.

SHIRE OF YARRAWONGA.

By-LAW No. 14.

A By-law of the Shire of Yarrowonga, made under Section 213 of the "Local Government Act," and numbered 14, for adopting certain provisions of the Thirteenth Schedule.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1874*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Yarrowonga make this By-law as follows:—

The provisions of Parts I. and V. of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1874* shall be and are hereby adopted for the Shire of Yarrowonga.

Part I.—Depositing Building Materials.

29. *Unlawful depositing of building materials in street.*—Every person who throws or lays any building or other materials or building rubbish, or puts up, constructs, or erects any stage, scaffolding, hoarding, or fence in, upon, across, or over any street, road, footway, channel, or public place, save in lawful execution of the powers given by this sub-division, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Forty shillings for each day during which such matter or thing, or any of it, or any part thereof, is suffered to remain in or upon such street, road, footway, channel, or public place.

30. *Notice of intention to build, &c.*—Every person intending to build, put up, or take down, or cause to be built, put up, or taken down, any building, wall, or other structure, or any fence, or to alter or repair, or cause to be altered or repaired, the outward part of any such building or other structure, whether in any of such cases over or under ground, or to make any hole within ten feet of any street, road, or footway, shall give notice in writing of

such his intention to the council, and in such notice shall describe the intended work, and the height, depth, extent, and position thereof; and whether or not it be necessary for the execution of the said work that a scaffold or stage be constructed, or that buildings or other materials or building rubbish be deposited upon or in the footway or street adjoining or in front of such structure or hole, and for what time it will be necessary that such stage or scaffolding, or such materials deposited, be so kept or continued, or that such hole remain open; together with such other particulars touching such intended work as such person shall see fit.

36. *Street, &c., not to be obstructed, &c.*—Nothing herein contained shall render it lawful to construct any stage or scaffolding, or to deposit any materials or rubbish, or to put any hoarding or fence, platform or handrail, as aforesaid, or all or any of them, so that the same shall extend or be across, or over or upon, any street or road further from the inner edge of the footway than one-third the whole breadth of such street or road, or in any case so as to render the street or road, exclusive of the footways, impassable for carriages, or so as to obstruct the channel.

37. *Council may remove, &c., in certain cases, and recover expenses.*—If any person who ought under this by-law to remove any matter or thing, or to make good any footway, or street, or road, shall fail so to do, whether or not such person shall have been convicted or not of any offence under this sub-division, the council may remove such matter or thing, or make good such street or footway, and may recover the expenses of so doing from the person so making default before any justice.

41. *Cattle at large on unenclosed land.*—If any cattle shall be found upon any land not being a common, and such that there is no fence, whether upon the same land or any other, dividing such first-mentioned land from any street or road, whether public or private, without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and the proper officer of the council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody; and any justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form, addressed to such owner as "owner," only without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood may, after the expiration of twenty-four hours of such publication, proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear then, as in other cases, and the justice may order the cattle to be sold, and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded, and the reasonable expenses to be estimated and assessed by the justice of seizing, keeping, and selling, the said cattle, shall be paid if demanded within one month to the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded then to the municipal fund; and if the said money shall not be sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid, the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered, the whole of the said amount, may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.

42. *Cattle at large in streets.*—If any cattle be at any time found in the street without any person having the charge thereof, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings, and if such cattle shall by reason of having been so found at large have been impounded by the council, the amount of such penalty and costs, if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle, shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof, or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the pound-keeper, shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle shall not be sufficient after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs shall have been adjudged after the release or sale of such cattle, the same, or so much thereof as remains unpaid, shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered, and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known, then the provisions of the last preceding section, so far as necessary, to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction shall apply.

43. *Goats sold for trespass to be released or killed.*—If any goat shall have been impounded under the provisions of either of the two last preceding sections, or under the provisions of this by-law relating to the impounding of cattle for trespass in the streets, and shall not, after the expiration of twenty-four hours, be released, and the penalty, costs, fees, and charges be paid by the owner thereof, any justice may, by warrant under his hand directed to any constable, authorize the destruction of such goat, and the same may be destroyed accordingly.

45. *Breaking-in, &c., horses in streets.*—It shall not be lawful to break-in any horse in any street, whether public or private, or in any public place, save such public places as from time to time may be appointed by some regulation of the Council in that behalf, which regulation the Council are hereby authorized to make, or by locking the wheels of any cart or other vehicle or otherwise to test or try any horse or other animal so as to obstruct or injure any street or public place; and any person offending against this section shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

MISCELLANEOUS.

49. *Council may regulate rate of speed for crossing bridges, &c.*—It shall be lawful for the Council to make regulations prescribing the rate of speed and the manner of crossing over all bridges and crossings for horses, carts, and carriages; and if any person driving or having the charge of any horse, cart, or carriage shall violate any such regulation he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

BY-LAW No. 15.

Part V.—Ruinous or Dangerous Buildings, &c.

5. *Notice to owner, &c., of ruinous building.*—If any building or wall or any thing affixed thereon be deemed by the proper officer of the Council to be in a ruinous state and dangerous to passengers or to the occupiers thereof, or of the neighbouring buildings, such officer shall immediately cause a proper board or fence, and, if he shall deem it necessary, props to be put up for the protection of passengers and of such occupiers; and shall also, if he shall deem it necessary, cause the neighbouring buildings to be properly shored-up, and shall cause notice, in writing, to be given to the owner of such building or wall if he be known and resident within the municipal district; and shall also cause such notice to be put on the door or other conspicuous part of the said premises or otherwise to be given to the occupier thereof (if any) requiring such owner or occupier forthwith to take down, secure, or repair such building, wall, or other thing, as the case may require.

6. *Justices may limit time for removal, repair, &c., and in default, &c., Council may do act.*—If such owner or occupier do not begin to take down, repair, or secure such building, wall, or other thing within the space of three days after such notice shall have been given or put up as aforesaid, and complete such taking down, repairs, or securing as speedily as the nature of the case will admit, such officer may make complaint thereof to two justices, and it shall be lawful for such justices to order the owner, or in his default the occupier (if any) of such building, wall, or other thing to take down, rebuild, repair, or otherwise secure to the satisfaction of such officer the same or such part thereof as appears to them to be in a dangerous state within a time to be fixed by such justices, and in case the same be not taken down, rebuilt, repaired, or otherwise secured within the time so limited, or if no owner or occupier can be found on whom to serve such order, the Council shall with all convenient speed cause all or so much of such building, wall, or other thing as shall be in a ruinous condition and dangerous as aforesaid to be taken down, rebuilt, repaired, or otherwise secured in such manner as shall be requisite, and all the expense of putting up such board, fence, and props, and of shoring-up such buildings, and of taking down, rebuilding, repairing, or securing such building, wall, or other thing shall be paid by the owner thereof, and any two justices may order such payment.

7. *Materials may be sold.*—If any such building or wall as aforesaid, or any part of the same, be pulled down by virtue of the powers aforesaid, the Council may sell the materials thereof, or so much of the same as shall be pulled down, and apply the proceeds of such sale in payment of the expenses incurred in respect of such building or wall, and the Council shall restore any surplus arising from such sale to the owner of the building or wall on demand.

8. *Land may be taken and sold in certain cases.*—If such owner cannot be found within the municipal district, or sufficient distress of his goods and chattels within the municipal district cannot be made, and the said expenses or any part thereof remain unpaid, the Council, after giving twenty-eight days' notice of their intention to do so by posting a notice in a conspicuous place on such building or wall, or on the land whereon such building or wall stood, may take such building or land, provided that such expenses or so much as remains due be not paid or tendered to them within the said twenty-eight days, making compensation to the owner of such building or land in the manner provided by Part VII. of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, in the case of lands taken otherwise than with the consent of the owners and occupiers thereof, and the Council shall be entitled to deduct out of such compensation the amount of the expenses so unpaid as aforesaid, and may sell or otherwise dispose of the said building or land for the purposes hereof.

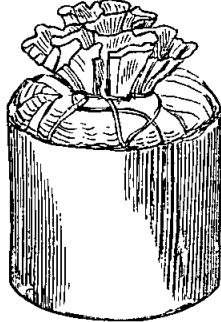
