We, the judges of the Supreme Court, in pursuance of the provisions of an Act of the Legislature of Victoria, No. 1035, section 10, make the following rule:—

That the following fees shall be taken by and are hereby made payable to Registrars of the County Courts acting under the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

Where the whole estate does not exceed £50, the sum of two shillings and sixpence;

Where the whole estate exceeds £50, the sum of two shillings and sixpence, and the further sum of one shilling and threepence for every £50, or fraction of £50, by which the estate exceeds £50.

The estimated population of Greater Melbourne at the end of 1889 was 458,470, as compared with 437,785, at the same period of the previous year. There was thus an apparent increase of 20,685, or of 4.73 per cent., during the year.

Of the increase referred to, only 6,521 was due to excess of births over deaths, the balance being attributable to immigration from the country districts and places outside the colony.

In Greater Melbourne as a whole, the registered births exceeded the registered deaths by 63 per cent. in 1889, as compared with 82 per cent. in 1888; but excluding the births and deaths which occurred in hospitals, asylums, &c., the excess of the former over the latter was 86 per cent. and 116 per cent. in those years respectively.

In 164 instances twins were born in Greater Melbourne during the year under notice. As the births in the same period numbered in all 16,934, the confinements must have numbered 16,770. Thus one mother in 102 gave birth to twins. No case of triple birth was recorded during the year.

The births set down as illegitimate in 1889 numbered 1,184, or 109 more than in 1888. More than a third of these took place in the Women's Hospital or in buildings under the supervision of the officers of that institution. The proportion of illegitimate births to the whole number of births registered was 1 in 14, as against 1 in 15 in the previous year.

Subjoined are the birth and death rates in each sub-district in 1889. Births and deaths in hospitals, asylums, &c., are excluded, and the sub-districts are arranged in order, the sub-district with the highest birth-rate and the highest death-rate being placed first and the rest in succession:—

In calculating the rates for the above table, the births and deaths occurring in hospitals, asylums, &c., have been excluded, as already stated. If these should be included, the proportion per 1,000 of the mean population of Greater Melbourne would be—births, 38.04; deaths, 23.39.

According to the table, the birth-rate is lower in Melbourne City than in any other sub-district, and the death-rate in that city is also much below the average.

In consequence of the excessive mortality which attends the period of infancy, high death-rates are usually concurrent with high birth-rates, and *vice versa*. This is exemplified in the case of Footscray, which in 1889 had the highest birth and death rates; and in the case of St. Kilda, which had, with one or two exceptions, the lowest.

In Greater Melbourne, taken as a whole, the average number of persons to the acre at the end of 1889 was nearly two and four-fifths (2.79), but the density of the population varies considerably in the different sub-districts, ranging from nearly 40 persons to the acre in North Melbourne Town, to less than 2 persons to the acre in Kew Borough, and about 1 person to every 3 acres in the portion of the district situated in shires. The following table shows the area of, and density of the population living in, each sub-district:—

It should be remarked that in some of the sub-districts extensive parks, gardens, and other public reserves exist, so that the population is really living in closer proximity than the figures indicate. Melbourne City contains 1,723 acres of such reserves; Kew, 634 acres; portion of district situated in shires, 569 acres; South Melbourne, 474 acres; Williamstown, 446 acres; Flemington and Kensington, 307 acres; St. Kilda, 250 acres; Richmond, 190 acres; Brighton, 166 acres; Port Melbourne, 80 acres; Essendon, 54 acres; Fitzroy, 41 acres; and smaller areas in the other municipalities.

The births in Greater Melbourne were much more numerous in 1889 than in any previous year named in the table, as also was their proportion to the total population.

The deaths in 1889 were also much more numerous than in any previous year, whilst their proportion to the population was exceptionally high, and was larger than in any of the years except 1875, which was a period in which the mortality was largely increased by the prevalence of scarlatina and measles in an epidemic form.

The proportion by which the births exceeded the deaths was lower in 1889 than in any other year since 1870, except the four years 1874 to 1877 and 1882. All the figures in this table relating to births and deaths include those which occurred in hospitals, asylums, &c., which accommodate large numbers of persons coming from country districts. Should these be eliminated, the number of births would be somewhat less and that of deaths would be considerably less, whilst the excess of births over deaths would be very much higher.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the year 1889 was 99.8° on the 26th December; and the lowest was 31.3° on the 12th July. The mean temperature of the year (58.5°) was higher than in any of the previous 18 years, and was a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (43.8°) took place on the 26th December, and the least range (3.7°) on the 8th April. The mean daily range was 17.2°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.582 inches on the 26th August; and the lowest was 29.218 inches on the 7th June. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.94 inches) was about the average. Rain fell on 125 days, and the amount of rainfall was 27.14 inches, which was 5 inches below that in 1887, but much above that in any other of the last nine years, and 2 inches above the average of that period. The number of days in which fog occurred was 20.

Of the births registered in Greater Melbourne during 1889, 51 per cent. were of males, and 49 per cent. were of females. Of the deaths during the year, 54 per cent. were of males, and 46 per cent. were of females. Children under the age of 5 years contributed 44 per cent. to the total mortality, as against 42 per cent. in 1888 and 1887, 41 per cent. in 1886, 38 per cent. in 1885, 41 per cent. in 1884, 36 per cent. in 1883, 40 per cent. in 1882, 33 per cent. in 1881, and 40 per cent. in 1880 and 1879.

The deaths of 3,290 infants under 1 year of age occurred in Greater Melbourne during 1889, the proportion being 19.44 to every 100 births. This was the highest infantile death-rate that has occurred in the district during the last 17 years, the next highest being 19.39 in 1882. The corresponding proportion in 1888 was 17.18; in 1887, 17.51; and in 1886, 17.84. In the 16 years ended with 1888, the mean proportion to every 100 infants born of those who died before completing their first year of life was 17.08.

The deaths of 458 persons, viz., 244 males and 214 females, of the age of 75 years or upwards occurred during 1889, or 72 more than in the previous year. Of these, 215 were between 75 and 80, 153 between 80 and 85, 67 between 85 and 90, 18 between 90 and 95, 3 between 95 and 100, and 2 were stated to be 100 years of age. The following are the numbers of deaths in 1889 which took place in Public Institutions:—747 in the Melbourne Hospital, 285 in the Alfred Hospital, 72 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 88 in the Children's Hospital, 57 in the Women's Hospital, 115 in the Immigrants' Home, 16 in the Infant Asylum, 130 in the Benevolent Asylum, 63 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 83 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 34 in the Austin Hospital, 57 in the Melbourne Gaol, 7 in the Pentridge Stockade, 3 in the Eye and Ear Hospital, 22 in the Protestant Refuge, and 12 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor. The number is 1,791 in all, which figures, compared with the total deaths (10,413), furnish a proportion of 17 per cent., or, in other words, 1 person in every 6 who died in Greater Melbourne during 1889 ended his days in a hospital, an asylum, or a gaol.

In considering the causes of death during the year, the most important feature is the exceptionally high mortality which occurred from diphtheria and typhoid fever, the former of which caused 463 deaths, or 196 more than in 1888, and over 2½ times as many as in any other of the previous 18 years; whilst the latter caused 560 deaths, or 234 more than in 1888, 222 more than in 1887, and a much larger number than in any other of the years named. Whooping-cough, moreover, appeared in an epidemic form in 1889, and caused 179 deaths, as against only 10 in 1888, but the former number had been sometimes reached on previous occasions. Diarrhoeal diseases (simple cholera, diarrhoea, and dysentery) caused 62 more deaths in 1889 than in 1888. The principal increases under the head of local diseases were—137 under diseases of the brain, of which 29 were due to apoplexy and 49 to convulsions; 286 under diseases of the digestive system, 35 under bronchitis, and 127 under pneumonia and other lung diseases (not including phthisis). The increase under constitutional diseases is attributable chiefly to cancer, scrofula, anemia, and chlorosis; and that under the ill-defined class entirely to the indefinite ailments of young children, such as atrophy and debility. Whilst one-third of the increase in the general mortality in the year under review as compared with the previous one was of children under 1 year, and more than one-half was of children under 5 years, over three-fifths of the increase under local diseases, the whole under ill-defined causes, and more than half under specific febrile diseases was due to the increased mortality at similar ages. As regards individual diseases, the increase in the mortality from diphtheria was mostly of children under 10, that from whooping-cough almost entirely of children under 5—chiefly between 6 months and 2 years, nearly half of that from diarrhoeal diseases and four-fifths of that from diseases of the digestive system (principally stomach diseases, &c.) was of young children under 2 years; whilst on the other hand, over two-thirds of that from typhoid fever was of adults between 15 and 35. In connexion with the high mortality which prevailed in the year under review, it should be noted that the rainfall was above the average, and that the mean temperature also was exceptionally high.

The following table shows the number of deaths from all causes, also from typhoid fever, diarrhoeal diseases, and diphtheria and croup, registered in each month of the last six years:—

According to the experience of the six years named, the general mortality and the mortality from diarrhoeal diseases is greatest between November and April, the worst months being December and January; the mortality from typhoid fever is greatest between December and May, the worst months being February, March, and April; and the mortality from diphtheria and croup is greatest between April and September, the worst month being July. It will be noticed that the last is the only one of the complaints named which appears to be more destructive in winter than in summer.

The estimated mean population, the births and deaths and their proportions to population, and the excess of births over deaths, in each of the metropolitan cities of Australasia in 1889 were as follow:—

It will be noticed that the birth-rate was higher in Melbourne than in Sydney, Adelaide, Hobart, or Wellington; but lower than in the other two capital cities; also that in Melbourne the death-rate, which was exceptionally high in the year under notice, was higher than in any of those cities; and the proportion of excess of births over deaths was lower than in any, except Hobart.

It should be mentioned that the death-rate of Melbourne is much swelled by the large number of country residents who are admitted to and die in the Metropolitan hospitals. In some of the other colonies it is the custom to eliminate such entries, and it is probable that in Melbourne such deaths bear a higher proportion to the total number of deaths recorded than they do in any of the other cities named.

EASTER EXCURSIONS.

Holiday Excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (Suburban excepted) from the 31st March to the 12th April inclusive, available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example:—An excursion ticket issued on the 1st April will be available till the 1st May. When the last day falls on a Sunday, the ticket will be available till the next day. The journey must be commenced on the day the ticket is issued, but after a distance of 15 miles has been travelled the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passenger. During the same period tickets will be issued at Messrs. T. Cook and Son's, 281 Collins-street; Federal Coffee Palace, 539-553 Collins-street; and Grand Hotel, Spring-street, City, from Melbourne to all stations; and at Yarra-street, Geelong (C. H. Swift); Lydiard-street, Ballarat (F. W. Niven and Co.); High-street, Sandhurst (J. Hemming), to Melbourne only.

Sydney Excursion tickets.—From the 31st March to the 11th April (both dates inclusive), Excursion tickets will be issued at Melbourne for Sydney at the following return fares, viz.:—1st class, £5 6s. 6d.; 2nd class, £4 1s. These tickets will be available for return for two calendar months from date of issue, but will not be available by the express train on the New South Wales line except on payment of 1s. 1st class and 10s. 2nd class, in addition to the above-mentioned fare. The journey cannot be broken on that line.

Adelaide Excursion tickets.—From the 31st March to the 11th April (both dates inclusive), Excursion tickets available by the express and ordinary trains will be issued at Melbourne for Adelaide at the following return fares, viz.:—1st class, £4 2s. 6d.; 2nd class, £2 12s. 6d. The tickets will be available for return for two calendar months from date of issue, and the journey may be broken.

Brisbane Excursion tickets.—From the 31st March to the 11th April (both dates inclusive), Excursion tickets will be issued at Melbourne for Brisbane at the following return fares, viz.:—1st class, £10; 2nd class, £6 17s. 6d. These tickets, which are available for return for three calendar months from date of issue, are also available by the express and ordinary trains on all lines, and the journey may be broken.

Luggage.—Excursion passengers to or from stations in Victoria will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van are required to be at the station half-an-hour before the starting time of train. Stamped parcels rates will be charged for it. All luggage should be plainly addressed with the owner's name and the station it is for.

Horses and vehicles.—From the 2nd to the 12th April (both dates inclusive), the Department cannot engage to forward horses and vehicles by passenger trains unless accommodation can be provided by special arrangement.

Commercial travellers' samples.—From the 2nd to the 12th April, commercial travellers' samples will not be taken to or from roadside stations except by mixed or goods trains.

Parcels.—On 3rd April, parcels must be at the Parcels office, at both Spencer-street and Prince's Bridge stations, 30 minutes before starting time of the ordinary trains.

Goods sheds Holidays.—The 4th and 7th April will be observed as holidays in the goods branch, and goods trains will not run. Perishable goods will, however, be delivered at all stations on application. Consignees of powder can ascertain from the station-master at Footscray West when explosives will be received in lieu of these dates. On 3rd, 4th, 5th, 7th, and 8th April, fruit and dairy produce will not be carried by purely passenger trains between Melbourne, Sandhurst, and Ballarat, nor on the North-Eastern line, unless parcels rates are paid. Fruit and other perishable goods will not be received at the Melbourne goods sheds after 12 noon on 3rd April.

Seaside Excursions.—The issue of these tickets at the principal stations will continue as already advertised. (See posters at all stations.)

EXTRA TRAINS AVAILABLE FOR EXCURSION AND ORDINARY PASSENGERS.

Northern system.—Extra trains will leave Melbourne for Sandhurst on 3rd April at 6.29 a.m., 12.10, 3.9, 3.25, 7.9, and 7.29 p.m.; 4th April at 6.14, 6.29, 7.0 a.m., and 12.10 p.m.; 5th April at 6.29 a.m., 12.10, and 3.25 p.m.; 7th April at 6.29, 7.0 a.m., 12.10, 3.25, and 7.9 p.m.; and Sandhurst for Melbourne on 3rd April at 6.40, 11.50 a.m., 3.0 and 6.50 p.m.; 4th and 5th April at 11.50 a.m., 3.0 and 6.50 p.m.; 7th April at 6.40, 11.50 a.m., 3.0, 6.50, and 7.35 p.m. With the exception of 7.0 a.m. and 7.29 p.m. trains from Melbourne, and the 7.35 p.m. train from Sandhurst, which will stop at the same stations as the ordinary trains, these trains will only stop at Sunbury, Woodend, Kyneton, and Castlemaine. The 3.0 p.m. train from Sandhurst will stop at Castlemaine, Kyneton, and all stations thence to Melbourne. Passengers for stations on the branch lines beyond Castlemaine and Sandhurst will not be booked by the train leaving Melbourne at 7.0 a.m. on 4th and 7th April. They must travel by the 6.14, 6.29 a.m., 3.9, and 3.25 p.m. down special trains, or by the 6.40 a.m. and 3.35 p.m. ordinary trains.

Woodend and Daylesford line.—On 3rd, 5th, 7th, and 8th April an extra train will leave Daylesford at 7.45 p.m., and return from Woodend at 9.50 p.m. It will connect with the last passenger train to Sandhurst or Melbourne.

Western system.—From the 3rd to the 8th April all trains leaving Melbourne for Warrnambool and Port Fairy or Ballarat will start from the east side of the Williamstown platform at Spencer-street station. "THE IRRIGATION ACT 1886."

IN the matter of the Petition of Hugh Thompson and others, praying for the constitution of certain lands situate in the parish of Kerang, county of Gunbower, in the colony of Victoria, as an Irrigation and Water Supply District within the meaning of the said Act, and for the appointment and creation of a Trust for such district.

Pursuant to section 18 of the said Act, I hereby declare upon the said petition the matters following, viz. :-

1. That the scheme or plan of the proposed works shall be the provision of a steam pumping plant to divert water from the River Loddon, and the construction of a system of channels to convey and distribute the water so diverted over the lands of the Trust district.
2. That the whole of the works shall be Trust works.
3. That the amount which it is proposed that the Board of Land and Works shall advance for the purposes of such Trust works, by way of loan, shall be One thousand five hundred and sixty-one pounds (£1,561) sterling.
4. That the rate of interest to be paid by the Trust upon such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per annum.
5. That the source of the proposed Trust's supply shall be the Loddon River; and the quantities of water the Trust shall be entitled to take therefrom shall not exceed 100 cubic feet per minute from the 1st July to 31st October, and 20 cubic feet per minute from 1st November to 30th April in each year; such water-right to exist for three years; provided that the Trust shall at no time divert or withdraw water from the river when the total volume flowing therein at the point of offtake is less than 200 cubic feet per minute.
6. That the powers of rating to be given to the Trust shall not exceed the sum of Five shillings in the £1 of the annual value of the property rated within the Trust district.
7. That the Trust shall annually set apart a sum of Two hundred pounds (£200) sterling, as and by way of provision for a sinking fund, until such time as the amount so set apart shall equal the cost of the Trust's pumping plant and machinery, after which the amount to be annually contributed to such sinking fund may be reduced as the Governor in Council (subject to the provisions of the said Act) may order and direct.

The goods will be subject to the examination and test of an inspecting officer appointed by any of the above. 2. 4. 5. Each delivery of goods must be accompanied by invoice in duplicate, together with the departmental order.

6. The Engineer-in-Chief, Engineer for Existing Lines, Locomotive Superintendent, Telegraph Engineer, and Railway Storekeeper, or such inspecting officer as they may appoint, will have full power to reject any goods which in their opinion are not in accordance with contract, and the contractor, on receipt of rejection notice, must remove such articles immediately, and supply others in their stead, failing which they will be procured elsewhere, and any expense incurred will be deducted from contractor's account. 7. CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

3. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheds, butter firkins, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed at the contractor's expense.

4. Bread.—A sample of the best ordinarily retail to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality. Third quality (that issued to prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, fine sharps, the produce of prime, strong, thin-skinned, good coloured wheat, to be perfectly free from coarse pollard or other offal.

5. Milk.—The milk must be fresh, pure, and of the best quality, and subject to when required by the department. Should the supply prove to be not of contract quality, any expense incurred will be charged to the contractor.

6. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately, also buttocks only when ordered. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than ten inches, must have been cut off. The sticking pieces must be removed from the fore quarters of beef.

7. Potatoes to be dry and free from dirt. Contractors to supply 105 lbs. of potatoes for each cental credited to them, and, in addition, to take back all rejected before being cooked.

8. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned or any officer authorized by him.

9. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

10. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

11. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

12. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

13. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

14. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the colony for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the

delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

15. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

16. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board to survey, the head of the department, or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be obtained by the officer requiring it. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

17. A refusal to execute orders, or a repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal or repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

18. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. 20. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate improperly with a prisoner.

21. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat or Defence Department, or on account of other Governments, or for supplies to the aborigines; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

22. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

23. In the event of any alteration in the tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government will neither claim any decrease upon the contract price nor entertain any application from a contractor for any increase to it.

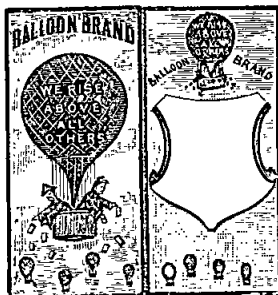
