Assign a name to such borough or shire. 2. Describe the boundaries thereof. 3. Determine of how many members the council shall consist. 4. Determine whether the municipal district constituted shall be subdivided or not; and every such Order constituting any new municipality having for its municipal district portion of a previously existing municipal district, shall operate to sever such portion from such previously existing municipal district; and that every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day

of such publication: And whereas a petition, signed by a majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the Shire of Romsey, has been presented to the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, praying that the area therein described might be severed from that shire and constituted a separate municipality under the designation of the "Shire of Lancefield": And whereas the substance and prayer of such petition have been published in the manner directed by the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the said petition, doth by this present Order sever from the Shire of Romsey the portion described therein, and forming the Lancefield Riding and part of the Rochford Riding thereof, and doth direct that the portion so severed be constituted a separate municipality under the name or title of the "Shire of Lancefield," as hereinafter defined; and, with the advice aforesaid, doth re-define the boundaries of the Shire of Romsey, as hereby reduced, in manner following, that is to say:—

MILDURA SHIRE CONSTITUTED AND DEFINED.

Commencing at a point on the western boundary of the colony being the north-west angle of the Shire of Lowan; thence east along the north boundary of that shire and of the Shire of Dimboola to the west boundary of mallee block 13A; thence north by the west boundary and east by the north boundary of that block and block 13B to the River Murray; thence following that river northerly and westerly to the South Australian boundary; thence south by that boundary to the commencing point.

SWAN HILL SHIRE REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED.

(b) Should proclaim the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such Trust should have authority, to be called a Waterworks District;

(c) Should state what are the principal works to be constructed; and

(d) Should contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the provisions of the now in part recited Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council should think fit.

And it was further enacted by section 23 of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946, that whenever a Waterworks District was either wholly, or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof, within one municipal district, the Governor in Council might appoint the municipal council for the time being of such municipal district, together with one or more persons not being members of such municipal council, to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application of the Council of the Shire of Healesville, for a loan of Four thousand five hundred pounds (£4,500) sterling to carry out certain waterworks for the supply of the township of Healesville, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

(1) The construction of the said waterworks.

(2) The municipal council of the Shire of Healesville for the time being and one other Commissioner to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District.

(3) That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be Four thousand five hundred pounds (£4,500) sterling, for the purpose of carrying out approved works and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payable half-yearly.

(4) That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 1, section III., parish of Gracedale; thence southerly by east boundary of said allotment 1 to the south-east angle thereof; thence westerly by a road forming the south boundaries of allotments 1, 2, 11, 10, and 9 to the south-west angle of allotment 9, section III.; thence south-westerly by a road forming the south boundary of the township of Healesville and allotments 37, 36, 35, 34, 33, and 32, section I., to the south angle of said allotment 32; thence north-westerly by the south-west boundary of said allotment 32 to its intersection with the Yarra Yarra River; thence in a general northerly direction by the Yarra Yarra River to the junction of the Watts River therewith; thence in general north-easterly, easterly, northerly, easterly, and north-easterly directions by the Watts River to a point due north of a point on the north boundary of a road forming the north-west boundary of H. Lindupp's allotment, distant thirty-one chains from north-east angle of allotment 35, section II., parish of Gracedale; thence due south by a line to that point on the northern boundary of road; thence south-easterly by a line along the north-east boundary of proposed pipe-head reservoir, and along the line of proposed channel from pipe-head reservoir to proposed weir on the Graceburn

(b) Specify the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such Waterworks Trust should have authority, to be called a Waterworks District;

(c) State what are the principal works to be constructed;

(d) Assign a corporate name to such Waterworks Trust; and

(e) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with this Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council thinks fit.

And it was further enacted that the Governor in Council might, where a Waterworks District is either wholly or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof within one or more ridings of any municipal district, appoint the councillors for such riding or ridings, together with any other person or persons, not exceeding three in number, to be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application of the councillors of the Western Riding of the Shire of Ballan, for a loan of Eight hundred pounds sterling (£800) to carry out certain waterworks for the domestic supply of a Waterworks District under the said Act, embracing the township of Gordons, as shown on the general plan and description accompanying the said application, deposited in the Department of Victorian Water Supply, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

(1) The construction of the said waterworks, and the constitution of a Waterworks Trust.

(2) That the councillors for the Western Riding of the said Shire of Ballan and three other persons shall be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust.

(3) That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be Eight hundred pounds sterling (£800), for the purpose of constructing works for the supply of the township of Gordons with water, and also for paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payment of which interest shall be made half-yearly.

(4) That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be the township of Gordons as described in the *Government Gazette* of the 24th day of December, 1875, page 2396, and as shown on an Order in Council plan deposited in the office of the Minister Water Supply, Melbourne.

WHEREAS by section 250 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, No. 898, it is enacted that the Governor in Council shall have power from time to time, on the application of any Trust or any other body or persons authorized by the now in part recited Act, to construct waterworks, and after any such Trust, body, or persons has or have by Order in Council been duly appointed or authorized, to make additional orders relating to such Trust, body, or persons not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act; but that no such additional order shall in any way whatever lessen or diminish any liability or obligation previously incurred or imposed upon any such Trust, body, or persons, or in any way release or discharge any such Trust, body, or person from any such liability or obligation, and that the Governor in Council may in such additional Orders in Council (among other things)—

(a) Make any order which might have been made in the Order in Council appointing or authorizing such Trust, body, or persons; and

(b) Repeal any of the provisions of any previous Order in Council relating to such Trust, body, or persons.

And whereas by a certain Order in Council dated the twelfth day of March, 1889, the Governor in Council duly constituted and appointed a certain Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, known as the Torrumberry North Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, hereinafter called "the said Trust."

And whereas the said Trust has applied for a loan of certain moneys from the Board of Land and Works to carry out its duly authorized scheme of works: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth order that clauses numbered 6, 8, and 9 of the said Order, bearing date as aforesaid, shall be and the same are hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be and be deemed to be, and may be cited as, clauses 6, 8, and 9 of the said Order respectively:—

6. That the total amount of money proposed to be expended by the said Torrumberry North Irrigation and Water Supply Trust on Trust works is Twelve thousand three hundred pounds (£12,300) sterling.

8. That the amount of money proposed to be advanced by the Board of Land and Works to the said Torrumberry North Irrigation and Water Supply Trust by way of loan is Twelve thousand three hundred pounds (£12,300) sterling; that the rate of interest to be paid upon such loan is Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, being one-half per cent. higher than the rate paid by the Government upon the public loan out of which such moneys are to be advanced, the rate of such interest to be subject to reduction in accordance with section one hundred and forty-six of the said Act in event of the interest paid by the Government upon such public loan being reduced.

9. That the amount of moneys which may be borrowed by the said Torrumberry North Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall not, at any time, together with any balance due from the Trust to the Board of Land and Works or upon any Trust loan, exceed the sum of Twelve thousand three hundred pounds (£12,300) sterling; and no rate shall be made by the Trust which shall exceed the sum of Five shillings in the £ upon the annual value of the property rated within the Trust district.

6. For a temporary supply during erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone work brick work, and plastering.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE COMMISSIONER OF TRADE AND CUSTOMS UNDER SECTION 17 OF "THE MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT 1889."

THE subjoined regulations, which have been made by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs under the provisions of section 17 of *The Merchandise Marks Act 1889*, are published for general information.

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by *The Merchandise Marks Act 1889* (hereinafter called "the Act"),

After various provisions against the sale, or exposure for sale, or possession for sale, trade, or manufacture of goods with forged trade-marks, or false trade descriptions, or trade-marks falsely applied to them;

And after defining (amongst other things) the expression "trade-mark" in manner therein set forth;

And after defining the expression "trade description" as any description, statement, or other indication, direct or indirect, as to number, quantity, measure, gauge, or weight of goods, as to place or country in which any

goods were made or produced, as to the mode of manufacturing or producing any goods, or as to the material of which any goods are composed, or as to any goods being the subject of any existing patent, privilege, or copyright;

And after defining the expressions "false trade description," and "goods," "apply," and "falsely apply;" is provided by section 17 that—

- (1) All such goods as above-mentioned, and
- (2) All goods manufactured at any place outside Victoria bearing any name or trade-mark being, or purporting to be, the name or trade-mark of any manufacturer, dealer, or trader in Victoria, unless such name or mark be accompanied by definite indication of the country in which such goods were made or produced,

shall be prohibited to be imported, and, subject to the provisions of the said section, shall be included among goods prohibited to be imported, as if they were specified in section 50 of *The Customs Act 1853*.

And whereas by section 10 of the Act, after authorizing the continued use of trade descriptions lawfully and generally applied to goods of the particular class, or manufactured by a particular method to indicate such class or method, it is provided that, where such trade description includes the name of a place or country, calculated to mislead as to where the goods were actually made or produced, such goods not having been actually made or produced there, the said reciting section should not apply (and, consequently, goods so marked would be prohibited), unless there be added to the trade description, immediately before or after the name of the place or country, in an equally conspicuous manner with that name, the name of the place or country in which the goods were actually made or produced, with a statement that they were made or produced there.

And whereas it is also provided by the said section 17 that the Commissioner of Trade and Customs (hereinafter called the "Commissioner") may from time to time make, revoke, and vary regulations, either general or special, respecting the detention and forfeiture of goods the importation of which is prohibited as hereinbefore mentioned, and the conditions, if any, to be fulfilled before such detention and forfeiture; and may by such regulations determine the information, notices, and security to be given, and the mode of verification of such evidence.

And it is further provided by the said last-mentioned section—

That before detaining goods or taking proceedings with a view to the forfeiture thereof under the law relating to the Customs, the Commissioner may require that such regulations as aforesaid shall be complied with, and satisfy himself as to the liability of the goods to forfeiture.

That such regulations may apply to all goods the importation of which is prohibited by the said section, or different regulations may be made respecting different classes of such goods.

And also that the regulations may provide for the informant reimbursing the Commissioner all expenses and damages incurred in respect of any detention made on his information, and of any proceedings consequent on such detention.

Now, therefore, the Commissioner, under and by virtue of the hereinbefore recited power in that behalf, hereby makes and requires to be complied with the following regulations, viz:—

1. Goods prohibited to be imported as hereinbefore recited, having applied to them forged trade-marks, false trade descriptions, or marks, names, or descriptions otherwise illegal, which, upon examination, are detected by the officers of Customs, are to be detained by them without the requirement of previous information.

2. Any person desirous of preventing the importation of any goods to which the provisions of this Act may apply, shall give notice, in writing, to the collector or chief officer of Customs of the port (or sub-port) of expected importation.

3. Every such person shall, in addition to such notice, give the following information, in writing, to the proper officer, viz:—

- (a) The number of packages expected, as far as he is able to state the same;
- (b) The description of the goods, by marks or other particulars; sufficient for their identification;
- (c) The name or other sufficient indication of the importing ship;
- (d) The manner in which the goods infringe the Act;
- (e) The expected day of the arrival of the ship.

He must also deposit with the collector or other officer as aforesaid a sum sufficient, in the opinion of that officer, to cover any additional expenses which may be incurred in the examination required by reason of his notice.

4. If upon arrival and examination of the goods the officer of Customs is satisfied that there is no ground for their detention, they will be delivered. If he is not satisfied, he will decide either to detain the goods, as in a case of detention upon ordinary examination, or to require security from the informant for reimbursing the Commissioner or his officers all expenses and damages incurred in respect of the detention made on his information, and of any proceedings consequent thereon.

5. The security thus required must be an immediate *ad valorem* deposit of Ten pounds per cent. on the value of the goods, as fixed by the officer from the quantities or value shown by the entry, and also subsequently a bond, to be completed within four days, in double the value of the goods, with two approved sureties. The *ad valorem* deposit will be returned upon completion of the bond, and will not be required if, as an alternative, where time permits, the informant prefers to give a like bond, before examination, upon estimated value of the goods declared to by

him under statutory declaration. If the security is not duly given as above required, there will be no further detention of the goods.

6. In the above regulations the words "officer of Customs" mean an officer acting under general or special direction of the Commissioner, and the words "value of the goods" mean value irrespective of duty.

7. The "notice" and "bond" required as above shall be in the forms contained in the schedule to these regulations, or in such other forms as the Commissioner may from time to time order and direct.

8. The security taken under these regulations will be given up at the times following, that is to say:—

Where given before examination, and if no detention, forthwith.

Where given on detention;—

If the forfeiture is completed, either by lapse of time or ultimate condemnation by a court of justice, then on such completion of forfeiture.

If the forfeiture is not completed, then—

If the goods are released by the Commissioner; and no action or suit has been commenced against him or any of his officers in respect of the detention, then at the expiration of three months from the time of detention; or, if the goods are released for failure of proceedings taken for the forfeiture and condemnation thereof upon information under section 203 of *The Customs Act 1853*, and no action or suit has been commenced against the Commissioner or any of his officers in respect of the detention, then at the expiration of three months from the trial of such information.

If within such periods as aforesaid any such action or suit as aforesaid has been commenced, then upon the ultimate conclusion of such action or suit and the fulfilment of the purpose for which the security was given.

9. These regulations apply to transhipment and transit goods, as well as to goods landed to be warehoused or for home consumption.

MALDON SHIRE COMMON.—REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the management of the Maldon Shire Common.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to commons made by the Governor in Council on 1st May, 1888, the Council of the Shire of Maldon, as managers of the Maldon Shire Common, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council in lieu of the regulations heretofore in force in respect of the undermentioned commons:—
The Baringhup East, Loader Downs, and Laanecoorie United Farmers' Common.
The Baringhup West Farmers' Common, the Bradford Common.
The Maldon United Town and Goldfield Common.
The Muckleford Farmers' Common, the Ravenswood Common, and the Walmer Farmers' Common.

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within five (5) miles of the

common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one (1) additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year:—For every head of large cattle, 3s. per annum; for every head of small cattle, 1s. 6d. per annum.

4. No sheep, entire horse, or bull, shall be allowed to depasture or run on the common without the written consent of the managers thereof.

5. Persons wishing to depasture stock on the common shall forward to the shire secretary or other person appointed to receive the same a statement in writing of the correct brands and description of the stock they intend to depasture.

6. All unbranded stock over six months old found on the Common shall be liable to be impounded.

7. All cattle depasturing upon the common shall be branded with the distinguishing brands of the common, and cattle not so branded shall be liable to be impounded.

8. Owners of diseased stock shall, immediately on receipt of a written notice, signed by the shire secretary or other person appointed by the council for the purpose, remove such stock from the common at their own cost, such stock after removal shall, if they require attendance, be looked after and provided for by their owners. The carcasses of stock lying on the common shall be at their owners expense removed, burned, or buried.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A RACE-COURSE AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF CORYYONG.

THE Council of the Shire of Towong, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for a racecourse and other purposes of public recreation in the township of Corryong, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein; and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon; submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be parcelled out into the following divisions:—

- (a) The cricket ground.
- (b) The remainder of the reserve.

2. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise till sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for shows, races, sports, fêtes, and holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a charge for the admission of every adult may be made.

3. The following shall be the scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to either of the divisions of the reserve:—

For the admission of every adult to the first division of the reserve such a sum as the council may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.).

For the admission of every adult to the second division of the reserve such a sum as the council may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.).

4. The Council shall be at liberty to allow any duly recognised committee of any shows, races, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements to use either or both of the divisions of the reserve; and such committee shall abide by any order given by the council in reference to the reserve, or buildings, or other erections for the time being thereon.

5. No person shall remain in the reserve who may offend against decency, as regards dress, language, or conduct.

6. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, or light fires therein.

7. No person shall climb upon or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills, or cut names thereon, or in any way damage the trees, seats, or any building whatsoever, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

8. No person shall put in the reserve any horses or cattle or take horses therein without first obtaining the written permission of the council, provided always that the moneys received

for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

9. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent of the council first obtained, in writing.

10. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

11. Any person committing in the reserve or in any of the buildings or other erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the reserve, or either of the divisions thereof:—

1. Assaulting any person.
2. Being drunk.
3. Crossing or trespassing on the cricket or playing ground during the time any cricket match or other amusement is taking place or when crossing or trespassing on such ground would injuriously affect it for the several purposes for which the same is set apart.
4. Using profane or obscene language.
5. Using abusive or insulting words.
6. Behaving improperly or riotously.
7. Obtaining admission to the reserve or any buildings thereon when not entitled to such admission or refusing to surrender (if required) to any gatekeeper or authorized person any ticket duly authorizing admission to that division of the reserve where such person shall be found.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence.

And every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, marked cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term of three years.

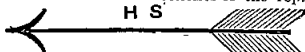
