shall be prohibited to be imported, and, subject to the provisions of the said section, shall be included among goods prohibited to be imported, as if they were specified in section 50 of The Customs Act 1883.

And whereas by section 19 of the Act, after authorizing the continued use of trade descriptions lawfully and generally applied to goods of the particular class, or manufactured by a particular method to indicate such class or method, it is provided that, where such trade description includes the name of a place or country, calculated to mislead as to where the goods were actually made or produced there, the said reciting section should not apply (and, consequently, goods so marked would be prohibited), unless there he added to the trade description, immediately before or after the name of the place or country in which the goods were actually made or produced, with a statement that they were made or produced, with a statement that they were made or produced there.

That before dotaining goods or taking proceedings with a view to the forfeiture thereof under the law relating to the Customs, the Commissioner may require that such regulations as aforesaid shall be complied with, and satisfy himself as to the liability of the goods to forfeiture.

That such regulations may apply to all goods the importation of which is prohibited by the said section, or different regulations may be made respecting different classes of such goods.

and also that the regulations may provide for the informant reimbursing the Commissioner all expenses and damages incurred in respect of any detention made on his information, and of any proceedings consequent on such detention.

Now, therefore, the Commissioner, under and by virtue of the hereinbefore recited power in that behalf, hereby makes and requires to be complied with the following regulations, viz.:—

He must also deposit with the collector or other officer as aforesaid a sum sufficient, in the opinion of that officer, to cover any additional expenses which may be incurred in the examination required by reason of his notice.

If he is not satisfied, he will decide either to detain the goods, as in a case of detention upon ordinary examination, or, to require security from the informant for reimbursing the Commissioner or his officers all expenses and damages incurred in respect of the detention made on his information, and of any-proceedings consequent thereon.

6. In the above regulations the words "officer of Customs" mean an officer acting under general or special direction of the Commissioner, and the words "value of the goods" mean value irrespective of duty.

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to commons made by the Governor in Council on 1st May, 1888, the Council of the Shire of Maldon, as managers of the Maldon Shire Common, having drated the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council in lieu of the regulations heretofore in force in respect of the undermentioned commons:

The Baringhup East, Loader Downs, and Laanccoorie United Farmers' Common.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within five (5) miles of the

common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one (1) additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the bond fide owner.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year:—For every head of large cattle, 3s. per annum; for every head of small cattle, 1s. 6d. per annum.

4. No sheep, entire horse, or bull, shall be allowed to depasture or run on the common without the written consent of the managers thereof.

5. Persons wishing to despature stock on the common shall forward to the shire secretary or other person appointed to receive the same a statement in writing of the correct brands and description of the stock they intend to despature.

6. All unbranded stock over six months old found on the Common shall be liable to be impounded.

7. REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A RACE-COURSE AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF CORRYONG.

THE Council of the Shire of Towong, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for a racecourso and other purposes of public recreation in the township of Corryong, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and deconey therein; and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon; submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of The Land Act 1884:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be parcelled out into the following

divisions:—

(a) The cricket ground.
(b) The remainder of the reserve.
(c) The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise till sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for shows, races, sports, fêtes, and holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a charge for the admission of every adult may be made.

3. The following shall be the scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to either of the divisions of the reserve:—

For the admission of every adult to the first division of the reserve such a sum as the council may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.).

For the admission of every adult to the second division of the reserve such a sum as the council may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.).

4. The Council shall be at liberty to allow any duly recognised committee of any shows, races, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements to use either or both of the divisions of the reserve; and such committee shall abide by any order given by the council in reference to the reserve, or buildings, or other erections for the time being thereon.

5. No person shall remain in the reserve who may offend against decency, as regards dress, language, or conduct.

6. No person shall dimb upon or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills, or cut maines thereon, or in any way damage the trees, seats, or any building whatsoever, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

8. No person shall put in the reserve any horses or cattle or take horses therein without first obtaining the written permission of the council, provided always that the moneys received

for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

9. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent of the council first obtained, in writing

10. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the

10. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

11. Any person committing in the reserve or in any of the buildings or other crections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the reserve, or either of the divisions thereof:

1. Assaulting any person.

2. Being drunk.

3. Gressing or treenessing on the cricket or playing ground.

Assaulting any person.
Being drunk.
Crossing or trespassing on the cricket or playing ground during the time any cricket match or other amusement is taking place or when crossing or trespassing on such ground would injuriously affect it for the several purposes for which the same is set apart.
Using profane or obscene language.
Using abusive or insulting words.
Behaving improperly or riotously.
Obtaining admission to the reserve or any buildings thereon when not entitled to such admission or refusing to surronder (if required) to any gatekeeper or authorized person any ticket duly authorizing admission to that division of the reserve where such person shall be found.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of The Land Act 1884, on conviction

cordance with section 133 of The Land Act 1884, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence.

And every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term of three years.
- 10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.
- 11. Tenderers are informed that the Department undertakes to carry parcels up to 7 lbs. in weight by all services for which tenders are accepted for conveyance of mails by vehicle. Packets up to 3 lbs. in weight are conveyed by horseback ser-

- 12. Tenderers for services to and from Post Offices and Railway Stations are required to name a lump sum per annum for the number of trips specified in the call for tenders, and also state a rate per trip as a basis of payment for additional trips, or for reduction in the payment, should the number of trips be increased or lessened during the currency of the contract.

The carriage of mails one way, viz., either from a Post Office to a Railway Station or from a Railway Station to a Post Office, shall be regarded as half a trip, and payment made accordingly. Where tendes are invited for a service to and from a Post Office and Railway Station "as often as required," tenderers are required to name a lump sum per annum for the work, and such sum shall not be liable to alteration either through increase or diminution in the number of trips. Contracts for services to and from Post Offices and Railway Stations are liable to be discontinued at one month's notice from the Department.

- 13. A separate bond fide tender must be sent in for each service.
- 14. The attention of tenderers is drawn to the condition which requires that in cases where vehicles are used, Members of Parliament shall be conveyed free of charge between the districts they represent and the districts in which they reside and Mel-
- 15. The contractor shall not be entitled to claim any extra payment on account of the estalishment of any new Post Office, or the removal of any existing Post Office, during the term of his contract, unless such establishment or removal shall increase the distance to be travelled by such contractor on any one day to the
- 16. No application for the transfer of a contract will be entertained until a fee has been paid of Ten shillings on a contract not exceeding £50 per annum, and Twenty shillings on a contract above £50 per annum.
- 17. The general conditions referred to in the printed form of tender, and upon which the tender is to be made, can be inspected by persons proposing to tender, either at the General Post Office or at any post office in the colony.
- 18. The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

A By-law of the Shire of Marong, made under section 212 of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 7, relating to fire lighting and rubbish burning in the open air within the precincts of townships throughout the shire.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Marong order as follows:—

13th Schedule, Part 7, Sub-sections 5 and 6.—

1. Every person who wilfully sets fire to any inflammable matter whatsoever in the open air without having given notice in writing to the occupiers of the land adjoining to the land upon which such matter shall be, and also to the municipal clerk of his intention so to do, or within twenty-four (24) hours after giving the last given of such notices, or between the hours of Four in the afternoon of any day and Eight in the morning of the following day, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

2. Every person who shall light any bonfire, tar barrel, or fireworks upon or within sixty (60) yards of any public or private street, or any public place, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.
