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IMPERIAL COMMISSIONS FOR OFFICERS OF COLONIAL LOCAL FORCES.

REGULATIONS UNDER WHICH COMMISSIONS IN THE BRITISH ARMY MAY BE OBTAINED BY OFFICERS OF COLONIAL LOCAL MILITARY FORCES.

1. Commissions in the cavalry or infantry of the line will be granted to officers (who are *bond fide* colonists) of the local military forces of certain colonies, to be specified from time to time, under the conditions hereinafter prescribed as to age, physical and moral fitness, length of service in the colonial forces, literary and military qualifications, and general eligibility for the position of an officer in Her Majesty's regular forces.

2. A candidate will be required to have served at least 15 months as an officer in the local military force of the colony from which he is nominated, and must have attended two annual trainings, or have seen active service in the field. A certificate to this effect from his commanding officer must be attached to the candidate's papers.

3. The candidate must be within the ages of 19 and 22 on the 1st January of the year in which he is allowed to present himself for the examination hereafter specified. A certificate of birth, or a declaration of his exact age made by the candidate's parents or guardian before a magistrate, must be attached to his papers when forwarded to the War Office.

4. He will be required to undergo an inspection by a medical board, to be convened by the Governor of the colony, or other proper authority, and will not be allowed to proceed further with his candidature unless certified by such board to be physically qualified in all respects for a commission in the army.

5. An intending candidate must apply for a nomination to the Governor through his commanding officer, or such other channel as the Governor may prescribe, in sufficient time to allow of arrangements being made for his undergoing the required examinations before he has exceeded the limit of age specified in para. 3.

6. A candidate will not be allowed to enter upon his examination until he has satisfied the Governor of the colony in which he is serving that he is actually a colonist, that he is of good moral character, and in all other respects a fit and proper person to hold a commission in Her Majesty's army. A certificate from the Governor to this effect must be attached to the candidate's papers when they are forwarded to the War Office.

7. Subject to the exceptions stated in paragraph 8, a candidate will be required, before being permitted to present himself for examination in military subjects, to undergo a qualifying literary examination in the following subjects:—

- (1) Mathematics—viz., (a) arithmetic, including vulgar and decimal fractions, proportion, and simple interest; (b) euclid, book I.; (c) algebra, up to and including simple equations.
- (2) French or German; the examination being limited to translation from the language and grammatical questions.
- (3) Writing English correctly, and in a good legible hand, from dictation.
English composition, tested by the power of writing an essay, letter, or précis.
- (4) The elements of geometrical drawing, including the construction of scales, and the use of simple mathematical instruments.*
- (5) Geography.

Any candidate who has previously passed an examination before the Civil Service Commissioners in three or more of the above subjects will be exempt from further examination in such subjects. But candidates who have to be examined in two or more subjects will be required to qualify in all at the same examination.

* Greater importance will be attached to neatness and exactness of drawing than to ability to solve geometrical problems.

In addition to the foregoing, the candidate will be required to select and qualify in two, and not more than two, of the following subjects:—

- (a) Mathematics—viz., algebra, up to and including the binomial theorem; the theory and use of logarithms; euclid, books I. to IV. and VI.; plane trigonometry, up to and including the solution of triangles; and mensuration.
- (b) Classics (Latin or Greek).
- (c) English history—General.
- (d) Freehand drawing.

The subjects selected should in all cases be stated in the application for papers.

8. The candidate will be exempted from the above examination, except in geometrical drawing, if he can produce a certificate from the proper university authority that he has taken his degree in arts, or has passed the examination for the degree of B.A. or M.A., at one of the following universities:—

Oxford, Edinburgh,
Cambridge, St. Andrew's,
Durham, Glasgow,
London, Aberdeen,
Dublin, The Royal University, Ireland,

or that he has passed one of the university examinations specified below:—

- Oxford, "moderations."
Cambridge, "the previous examination."
Dublin, "the final examination of the senior Freshman year," or, "the final examination of the school of engineering."
Durham, "the first year's examination."
The Royal University, Ireland, "the second university examination in arts, or the second professional examination in engineering."
Scotch universities, "the examination for candidates for the army."
London University, the "first examination" for the degrees of B.A., LL.B., Sc., or M.B.; or if he has passed some other test which is accepted by the university as exempting from the above examinations.

An equivalent examination at one of the chartered colonial universities will likewise be accepted as a sufficient ground for exemption.

9. The literary examination will take place on the second Tuesday in April in each year.

10. An examination in military subjects of such candidates as have previously passed the literary examination will be held in September in each year. The subjects and the maximum marks obtainable in each subject will be as follows:—

	Marks.
1. The elements of field fortification ...	600
2. Military topography ...	600
3. The elements of tactics ...	600
4. Military law ...	600

In order to qualify for a commission, a candidate will be required to obtain 25 of the marks in each subject, and 5 of the aggregate.

11. The scope will be that embraced by the synopsis of the course of instruction (in the subjects specified in paragraph 10) at the Royal Military College.* There will, however, be no practical out-of-door examination in any subject. The text-books will be those in use at the time at the Royal Military College, Sandhurst, which, for the present, are as follows:—

1. The elements of field fortification.—Phillips' course of artillery and fortification.
2. Military topography.—Official text-book of military topography.
3. The elements of tactics.—Field exercises. Clerly's minor tactics.
4. Military law.—Army Act. Queen's regulations. Elements of military administration and law (Boughey).

12. Sets of papers for the examination in both the literary and military subjects will be forwarded in due course, in sealed envelopes, to the Governors of the respective colonies, who will convene boards, the duty of which will be to see that the papers are fairly worked by the candidates. The papers will then be returned without delay to the Director-General of Military Education, War Office, London, for adjudication.

13. The Governor of the colony will notify to the War Office, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, each year, whether he has any duly-qualified candidates to nominate, and will, at the same time, state how many sets of papers he will require for their examination, and the optional subjects selected by the candidates.

This notification must reach the War Office not later than the 1st February.

14. Until further notice, two army commissions will be allotted to each of the undermentioned colonies annually:—

New South Wales, Queensland,
South Australia, New Zealand,
Victoria, Cape of Good Hope.

Six will be allotted annually to Canada and one biennially to Tasmania.

In the event of the number of candidates nominated by the Governor in a colony at any time exceeding the allotted number of commissions, the selection will be decided by competition in the military portion of the prescribed examination.

THE ZOOLOGICAL AND ACCLIMATISATION SOCIETY.—REGULATIONS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, pursuant to the powers conferred by section 9 of *The Zoological and Acclimatisation Society Incorporation Act 1884*, No. 794, has, by an Order in Council made on the 30th day of June, 1890, ordered that clauses 1 and 3 of the Regulations made by the Council of the Zoological and Acclimatisation Society, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 27th January, 1885, be repealed, and has approved the subjoined Regulations in lieu thereof, viz.:

1. *Membership.*—A subscriber of One guinea annually shall be a member of the Society, and shall be entitled to a member's ticket admitting himself and one lady or two children to the garden. A subscriber of Two guineas annually shall be entitled to a family ticket to admit himself and family to the garden. And a contributor of Ten guineas or upwards in one sum shall be a life member of the Society, and shall have the same privileges as the holder of a family ticket. Any person who has rendered special services to the Society may be elected an honorary member by the council, and shall have the same privileges as the holder of a family ticket. Members of the council of the Society and the directors have power to admit visitors to the colony free of charge to the garden.

3. *Vacancy in Council, how supplied.*—In case of a vacancy occurring by the death, resignation, or non-attendance of any member of the council for a period of two months without leave of the council, the remaining members shall, in due course, appoint another member of the Society to be a member of the council in the place and stead of the member who shall so die, resign, or absent himself; but such new member shall be nominated at an ordinary meeting of the council prior to the meeting at which he is elected.

PUBLIC HIGHWAYS WITHIN THE CITY OF PRAHRAN

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as public highways within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Prahran has requested that the streets hereinafter mentioned be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands acquired or used or by purchase acquired for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situate in the City of Prahran, to be public highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

The births of 1,612 children, viz., 832 boys and 780 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of May. In the month of April, 1,478 births were registered, or 134 less than in the month under review. The births were 565 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 223 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in May, numbered 799, viz., 450 of males and 349 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 813, or 102 per cent. The deaths were less than those in April by 174, and above the average of May during the previous ten years by 228. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to exceed that average by only 75.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.52, and of deaths registered 1.74.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 73.5° on the 16th, and the lowest was 37.7° on the 9th. The mean temperature of the month (54.4°) was about the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (6.1°) took place on the 17th. The mean daily range was 16.4°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.454 inches on the 30th, and the lowest was 29.652 inches on the 27th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.112 inches) was about the average.

Rain fell on 11 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.35 inches. The average rainfall in May during the previous ten years was 1.98 inches, or about one-third of an inch less than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on 10 days during the month.

Males contributed 56 per cent., and females 44 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 31 per cent. to that mortality, as against 33 per cent. in 1889, 37 per cent. in 1888, 32 per cent. in 1887, 32 per cent. in 1886, 33 per cent. in 1885, 36 per cent. in 1884, 34 per cent. in 1883, 30 per cent. in 1882, 31 per cent. in 1881 and 1880.

Fifty-two deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these a gentleman, aged 75, died of apoplexy; a teacher of gymnastics, aged 75, of heart disease; a labourer, aged 76, of cancer; a male of occupation unknown, aged 76, of insanity; a female, aged 76, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 76, of asthma; a labourer and a farmer, each aged 76, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 77, of typhoid fever; a female, aged 77, of diarrhoea; a farmer, aged 77, of dysentery; a spicemaker, aged 77, of endocarditis; a female, aged 77, of heart disease; a female, aged 78, of aneurism; a miner, aged 79, of phthisis; a master mariner, aged 79, of prostatic enlargement; a gentleman, aged 80, of dysentery; a female,

aged 81, of apoplexy; a ship and station owner, aged 81, of syncope; a labourer, aged 82, of bronchitis; a female, aged 83, of cancer; a labourer, aged 84, of consumption; a blacksmith, aged 85, of senile gangrene; a female, aged 85, of congestion of the lungs; a female, aged 86, of senile gangrene; a female, aged 87, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 87, of pleurisy; a male of occupation unknown, aged 98, of insanity; a blacksmith, aged 76, two females, each aged 77, a dealer, a boot repairer, and two females, each aged 78, a stone-breaker, aged 79, a stonemason and a gardener, each aged 80, a female aged 82, a joiner, aged 84, a harbour-master and a tailor, each aged 85, a gentleman and two females, each aged 86, two females, each aged 87, an architect, aged 89, a gentleman and a female, each aged 90, a female, aged 91, and a gentleman, aged 97, of old age.

Forty-two deaths were due to external causes during the month, of which 36 were set down to accident, 3 to homicide, and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 9, and a labourer, aged 16, died of injuries the result of kicks from horses; a boy, aged 15, of injuries consequent on being struck on the head by a swinging chair; a fitter, aged 23, was killed by a piece of timber falling on him; a porter, aged 25, two labourers, aged 30 and 32 respectively, a carter, aged 40, a leather dresser, aged 42, a painter, aged 47, a blacksmith, aged 53, and a watchman, aged 62, were passed over or struck by railway trains; a male of occupation unknown, aged 31, died of internal hæmorrhage, the result of a blow on the head from a truck handle; a slaughterman, aged 37, of fracture of the skull; two females, aged 64 and 74 respectively, of fracture of the thigh—how caused not stated; a male infant, aged 1, a girl, aged 10, and three females, aged 42, 65, and 70 respectively, of burns; a gentleman, aged 72, of sunstroke; a clerk, aged 20, was poisoned by carbolic acid; a boy, aged 8, and a female, aged 26, were drowned in Hobson's Bay; a gentleman, aged 41, was drowned in the Saltwater River; a female infant, aged one day, a male infant, aged one month, and a female infant, aged six months, were overlain; a carpenter, aged 51, was suffocated by the inhalation of hydrogen gas; a male infant, aged 2 days, died of hæmorrhage of the umbilical cord. The homicidal deaths were those of a newly-born female infant, who was suffocated at birth; a male infant, aged one month, who died of starvation; and a plumber, aged 26, who died of fracture of the skull—a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of a labourer and a station hand, aged 28 and 45 respectively, who cut their throats; and a gasfitter, aged 20, who drowned himself.

One hundred and forty-two deaths, or 18 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—78 in the Melbourne Hospital, 12 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 4 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Lying-in Hospital, 8 in the Immigrants' Home, 12 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 9 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Austin Hospital, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, 2 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 244, of which 125, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 119, or 49 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 159 were under one year of age, 38 were between one and two, 21 were between two and three, 15 were between three and four, and 11 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 555. Of these, 325, or 59 per cent., were males, and 230, or 41 per cent., were females; 24 were between five and ten, 15 were between ten and fifteen, 28 were between fifteen and twenty, 43 were between twenty and twenty-five, 53 were between twenty-five and thirty, 39 were between thirty and thirty-five, 34 were between thirty-five and forty, 41 were between forty and forty-five, 35 were between forty-five and fifty, 32 were between fifty and fifty-five, 35 were between fifty-five and sixty, 46 were between sixty and sixty-five, 39 were between sixty-five and seventy, 39 were between seventy and seventy-five, 24 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 28 were upwards of eighty.

The death of a European from leprosy was reported during the month. The complaint was of the tubercular and anæsthetic (mutilans) form. During his lifetime, the sufferer stated that no other case had occurred in his family, he had never had any contact with Chinese, and had no knowledge of how the contagion took place. In May, as compared with April, deaths from influenza fell from 30 to 14, deaths from typhoid fever from 63 to 36, and deaths from diphtheria from 50 to 39. In addition to the deaths set down to diphtheria, 10 deaths from diphtheritic croup occurred in April, and 8 in May.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in each of the first five months of the present and the two previous years:—

THE LERDERBERG IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation, made by the Commissioners of the Lerderberg Irrigation and Water Supply Trust in accordance with the provisions of section 95 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, No. 898.

THE Commissioners of the Lerderberg Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 95 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, do make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION No. 1.

No. 1.—*Regulations of Proceedings at Meetings of the Lerderberg Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, &c.*

1. *General conduct of business.*—In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed as far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

2. *Minutes of meeting to be read at next subsequent meeting.*—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and no

discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall be signed by the chairman; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Trust at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting if required.

3. *Order of business at meetings.*—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the Trust.
- (ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv.) Presentation of reports of committees, &c.
- (v.) Payments.
- (vi.) Opening and dealing with tenders.
- (vii.) Ordinary business.
- (viii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (ix.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (x.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (xi.) Notices of motion.
- (xii.) Reading rough minutes (if required).

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. *Addresses to Governor.*—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and secretary to the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

5. *Motions.*—All notices of motion shall be dated, and given by the intending mover to the secretary before the close of the meeting of the Trust, or delivered to him at his office personally or by post, provided that he receive them at least four days before the meeting at which they are to be proposed; and such secretary shall number and enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received, and shall post a copy of the same to each commissioner two (2) clear days before the date of the meeting at which such notices shall be considered.

6. *Petitions.*—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

7. *Motions to be moved in order in motion book.*—Except by leave of the Trust, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the secretary in the notice of motion book, or they may be postponed by vote of the Trust, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

8. *Motion to be proceeded with by commissioner giving same, except with consent.*—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

9. *Order, &c., of debate.*—Any commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the commissioner (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

10. *Nature of motion to be stated.*—Any commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

11. *Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Trust.

12. *Motion to be seconded.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded, but a commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

13. *Mover of motion.*—A commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

14. *Designation of commissioners.*—The commissioners in meeting of Trust shall designate each other by their official title, namely, that of chairman or commissioner, as the case may require.

15. *Priority of commissioners.*—If two or more commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

16. *Chairman to rise when addressing Trust.*—The chairman shall rise in addressing the Trust to discuss any question.

17. *Commissioner not to speak a second time on same question.*—No commissioner shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misunderstood or misunderstood.

18. *Points of order.*—The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final, except when an appeal is made to the Trust immediately upon the chairman giving his decision. On such an appeal no commissioner shall speak more than once, and the question shall be put thus:—Shall the decision of the chair be maintained.

19. *Commissioners not to digress.*—No commissioner shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, and all imputations or improper motives and all personal reflections on commissioners shall be deemed highly disorderly.

20. *Commissioners to apologize for disorderly expressions, &c.*—Whenever any commissioner shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other commissioner, the commissioner so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

21. *Commissioner called to order to sit down.*—A commissioner called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

22. *Commissioners twice offending guilty of an offence.*—Any commissioner using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and apologize for such conduct and refusing so to do, shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this regulation.

23. *Strangers.*—Any person, not being a commissioner, who, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, shall be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this regulation.

24. *Committee of the whole.*—Whenever a majority of the Trust determine, any matter before the Trust may be referred to a committee of the whole for consideration and report to the Trust, and such report may be received and adopted, or otherwise, as the Trust may think fit. When the Trust resolves

itself a committee of the whole, the public shall be ordered to withdraw by the chairman, and the doors shall be closed, unless a majority of the committee determine otherwise.

25. *Commissioner not attending order for call.*—Any commissioner not attending in compliance with an order for call of the whole Trust, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this regulation.

26. *Commissioner may demand documents.*—Any commissioner may of right demand the production of any documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion, and he may at any time, during business hours, require the officers of the Trust to produce for his inspection or examination any books or documents belonging to the Trust; but such books or documents shall not be removed from the offices without the permission of the chairman, and then only for short and limited periods.

27. *Voting.*—The Trust shall vote by show of hands; and any commissioner present and not voting, and not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this regulation. Divisions shall be taken upon any question submitted to the vote of the Trust, provided any commissioner demand it, before the next business has been proceeded with. When a division is taken, the secretary shall call the names of those commissioners who are present, and enter in his minute book how each vote, whether affirmatively or negatively, and the result shall be declared by the chairman.

28. *Question, how declared.*—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Trust, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

29. *Amendments.*—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

30. *Effect of rejection of original motion.*—If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

31. *If amendment be negatived, a second one may be moved.*—If an amendment be negatived, then a second amendment may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved; but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Trust for discussion at a time.

32. *Mover of motion to have right of reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no commissioner, with the above exception, shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

33. *Adjournment.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Trust; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

34. *Protests.*—Any commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall, in every case, be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary, and signed by such commissioner, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

35. *Lapsed questions.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

36. *Explanations.*—While a member is speaking no one shall interrupt, except for the purpose of calling to order, or asking of the chairman leave to explain, or to call the previous question. A commissioner allowed to explain shall only have the right to explain an actual misunderstanding of language, and shall be strictly prohibited from going into debate on the merits of the case.

37. *Resolutions, how revoked or altered.*—No resolution at any meeting of the Trust shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting unless notice of the intention to propose such resolution or alteration be given to each of the commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of two-thirds of the commissioners present at such subsequent meeting, if the number of commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to, or by a majority, if the number of commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

38. *Special meetings.*—The Trust may hold special meetings, and the chairman or any three or more of the commissioners may call a special meeting, but no such meeting shall be held unless two clear days' notice thereof at least be given, and every such notice shall specify the time of meeting and the object thereof; and no business shall be transacted at any special meeting except such as is stated in the notice thereof.

39. *Power to suspend officers.*—The Trust may, at any ordinary or special meeting, resolve that a special meeting be called to consider the removal from his office of any officer appointed by the Trust, and may direct that notice of such special meeting be given, and thereupon may suspend such officer from his office pending the holding of such meeting, and may appoint some other person to perform the duties of such office in the meanwhile.

40. *Committees of Trust, and quorum.*—The Trust may from time to time, as they may see fit, appoint occasional or standing committees, and may fix the quorum of every such committee, and every such committee shall appoint one of the commissioners thereof to be chairman of such committee; and the Trust may from time to time continue, alter, or discontinue such committee, and such committee may from time to time remove such chairman, and every such committee shall report to the Trust. The chairman of the Trust shall be *ex officio* member of all committees, and shall preside at all meetings at which he is present.

41. *Meetings, chairman, &c., of committee.*—Every committee so appointed may meet from time to time, and may adjourn from place to place, as they may think proper, but no business shall be transacted at any meeting of the committee unless the quorum of members (if any) fixed by the Trust, and if no quorum be fixed, three members be present; and at all meetings of the committee, if the chairman be not present, one of the commissioners present shall be appointed chairman; and all questions shall be determined by a majority of the votes of the commissioners present, and in case of an equal division of votes, the chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to his vote as a member of the committee.

42. *Seal.*—The seal of the Trust shall be in the custody of the secretary, and shall not be impressed except by direction of the Trust, and in the presence of at least two commissioners.

43. *Committees.*—Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute book, and, being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the Trust; and the secretary, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of the committee.

44. *Meetings of committee.*—The secretary shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any time thereafter by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or of any two members of the committee.

45. *Petitions.*—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

46. *Petitions to be respectful.*—It shall be incumbent on every commissioner presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that the contents do not violate any by-law or any provision hereof.

47. *Commissioners to affix their names.*—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

48. *No letters, memorials, or accounts to be dealt with.*—No letters, memorials, or accounts shall be dealt with at any meeting of the commissioners unless received at the offices of the Trust, or the office of the chairman, two clear days preceding the day of meeting.

49. *Deputations to signify intention.*—Deputations can only be received by the Trust when they have signified their intention of waiting upon the Trust, and stated their object at least one day beforehand.

50. *Appointment, &c., of officers.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Trust, except those appointments made at the first meeting of the Trust and before the adoption hereof, shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given, by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the irrigation district, and such newspapers (if any) as the Trust may determine, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same, unless otherwise determined.

51. *No commissioner, &c., to be surety for officer.*—No commissioner or officer of the Trust, and no assessor or auditor of the Trust, shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the Trust, or for any work to be done by the Trust.

52. *Expense of procuring security.*—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, except otherwise determined by the Trust, the expense of procuring such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

53. *Suspension of rules.*—Any one or more of the rules and regulations contained herein may be suspended for a special purpose, on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the Trust.

54. *Penalty.*—If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this regulation, he or she shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

The foregoing regulation, number 1, was made by the Commissioners of the "Lerderberg Irrigation and Water Supply Trust," under and by virtue of section 95 of *The Irrigation Act 1888*, this twenty-fourth day of June, 1890.

THE WESTERN WIMMERA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—RATING REGULATION.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Rating Regulation, made by the Commissioners of the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust under the provisions of section 95 of the *The Irrigation Act 1888*, No. 898.

The Commissioners of the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 95 of *The Irrigation Act 1888*, do make the following Regulation:—

No. 2.

Regulation for determining Rates to be paid for supply of Water for other than stock and domestic use, for preventing waste of water, and for other purposes in connection with water supply within the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply District.

1. A supply of water for stock and domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carriers' stables or troughs, or a supply for steam boilers, or for any manufacturing purpose or for irrigation (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants without labour), or for water power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing the house walls, or carriage, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged by meter. Syphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

2. The charges for water supplied by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, shall be at the rate of Two shillings per thousand gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation, or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

- One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.
- Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.
- Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.
- Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.
- Exceeding half an acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons.
- And at the rate of 40,000 gallons per acre for every additional acre, and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.
- In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purposes each space of five feet shall be charged for as a stall.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case, except in the cases of special agreement with the Trust where water is supplied by measure, shall be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if water was supplied otherwise than by measure.

4. The charges for water supplied under special agreement or by meter or measure shall be paid monthly, or as may be agreed upon.

5. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, and who shall not be rated or liable to be rated for water in respect of property situated in said district, who shall take or carry away water from any private or public service-pipe shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. The Commissioners may, if they see fit, allow persons not residing within said district to have water from any public service-pipe at the rate of One shilling for each tank of four hundred gallons or for any less quantity.

8. The Trust may cause a meter or meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary, such meter or meters to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement at the aforesaid rate. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial on the same is capable of registering one million gallons.

9. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make any such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose; and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

10. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being supplied, for the provision of laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are pipes of the Trust.

11. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for such breach.

12. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, under a penalty of Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice from the Trust.

13. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

14. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, until he shall have obtained from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

15. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.

16. Any person, whether licensed or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission of the Trust, in writing, being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

17. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, unless the necessary repair shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier, if any, and if none, the owner, shall in every instance, in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five Pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two Pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

18. Before any licensed person shall break up any footpath for the purpose of laying on water from the main to any house or premises, he shall deposit with the Trust the sum of Two pounds, and in case he shall not, immediately after laying on the water as aforesaid, make good and restore the said footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of Two pounds shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good and restoring the said footpath or otherwise as to the Trust may seem best.

19. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officers of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

20. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust, when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

21. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations and not otherwise, through pipes and meter laid, placed, and being in accordance with the said regulations and not otherwise.

22. In the construction of these regulations the word "Trust" shall mean "The Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust."

The foregoing regulation, numbered Two, was made by the Commissioners of the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust this second day of May, 1890.

- Orders for interment to be given by the secretary on the previous day, between the hours of Eight o'clock a.m. and Five o'clock p.m.

5. The hour fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery must be punctually observed.

6. Unless otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m.

7. All monuments, vaults, graves, grave-stones, and fences, to be kept in repair and proper order at the expense of the owners.

8. No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in, any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

9. A plan of the cemetery showing the situation of the purchased and other graves is kept by the secretary, and may be inspected at the charge set out in the schedule.

10. No interment allowed in common graves at a less depth from the surface than 6 feet, and in vaults at less than 4 feet from top of coffin.
