MURDER AT TYNTYNDER, NEAR SWAN HILL.

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS, on Friday, the 25th July, 1890, a man named Donald McDonald was found dead in his tent at Tyn-tynder, on the Murray River, about twelve miles from Swan Hill: And whereas a medical examination of the body has shown that the man was murdered by being shot through the head: Notice is hereby given that a reward of One hundred pounds will be paid by the Government for such information as will lead to the arrest and conviction of the murderer or murderers.

On the 15th July an inquirer was informed by a man camped in the vicinity that Donald McDonald was out looking after his nets; the deceased was, however, last seen alive on Friday, the 11th July, when he returned from Swan Hill after selling fish, and it is believed that he was murdered about that date by a shot from the door of his tent while sitting on his bed.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Land Tax Act 1890*, section 38, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, by this present Order, make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

1. For the purposes of these Regulations, unless the context be inconsistent therewith, the words "Commissioners" and "Registrar" shall mean the Commissioners of Land Tax and the Registrar of Land Tax respectively, and the word "Act" shall mean the *Land Tax Act 1890*.

2. The distribution of work by the Commissioners between the Classifiers shall be ordered in the form in Schedule A hereto.

3. The returns to be made by the Classifiers to the Commissioners shall be in the form in Schedule B hereto.

4. Directions by the Commissioners for re-classification of landed estates shall be in the form in Schedule C hereto.

5. The classification for Victoria shall be in the form in Schedule D hereto.

6. The Registrar shall make out lists of appeals in the form in Schedule E, and copies of such lists in the form in Schedule F hereto.

7. Gazette notices of amendments by the Commissioners of the classification of landed estates shall be in the form in Schedule G hereto.

8. Lists of owners of landed estates in Victoria shall be in the form in Schedule H hereto.

9. The Land Tax Register shall be kept by the Registrar in the form in Schedule I hereto.

10. The Valuation for Victoria shall be kept in the form in Schedule J hereto.

11. The Land Tax Register and the Valuation for Victoria shall be open to inspection of any person interested on ordinary days of business from Ten a.m. to Three p.m., excepting on Saturdays, when the said books shall be open for inspection from Ten a.m. to Twelve noon. Any person whose name may appear in the said books as liable to pay land tax, or his attorney or agent duly appointed (in writing) in that behalf, or any person who may be authorized by the Commissioners or by the Registrar to make such inspection, and no other person, shall be deemed to be a person interested within the meaning of the Act.

12. Applications to the Registrar for the removal of names from the Land Tax Register shall be made in the form or to the effect in Schedule K hereto.

13. Notices of determination shall be given by the Registrar in the form in Schedule L hereto.

14. The Registrar-General and the Registrar of Titles respectively shall furnish to the Registrar, weekly, a return in the form in Schedule M hereto, with respect to instruments registered in their respective offices which may work any change in the ownership of land within the meaning of the Act. The clerk of every municipality shall furnish to the Registrar of Land Tax, whenever requested by him in writing so to do, copies of the rate book or of the municipal rolls of such municipality, within one month from the making of such demand in writing by the Registrar of Land Tax, and if any such clerk shall wilfully neglect or refuse to furnish such copies so required of him within the said time, such clerk shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

**REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING CERTIFICATES
TO FACTORY ENGINE-DRIVERS.**

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, pursuant to the provisions of section 38 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, No. 1091, has approved of the subjoined Regulations relating to the granting of certificates to factory engine-drivers and to boiler attendants in factories and work-rooms.

REGULATIONS.

Preliminary Requirements.

1. Each applicant for a certificate must forward to the Secretary for Mines, Melbourne, notice in writing of his intention to present himself for examination, such notice to be given not less than fourteen clear days prior to the date of examination.

The notice must be accompanied by cash, post-office order, postal note, or stamps to the amount or value of 10s.

Should the applicant pass the prescribed examination, the deposit shall, in each instance, go towards payment of the fee for certificate; in the event, however, of the failure of the candidate to pass the examination, such amount shall be forfeited to the consolidated revenue.

No certificate shall be issued until full payment of the fee required shall have been made to the Secretary for Mines.

Certificates of Competency.

2. The certificates of competency to be issued by the Board of Examiners shall be of two classes, namely, first and second.

A first-class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room.

A second-class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room the cylinder of which does not exceed twelve inches in diameter (or if two cylinders be used the combined area thereof must not exceed that of a cylinder twelve inches in diameter).

3. An applicant for a second-class certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—

(a) Of his respectability of character.

(b) That he has had not less than twelve months' experience in assisting at the working of an engine used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room.

(c) That he is at the date of examination not under the age of eighteen (18) years, nor over the age of fifty (50) years. The latter age not to apply to persons who have previously been drivers.

(d) That neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any other mental or bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties.

Candidates must produce testimonials or certificates signed by their employers, and such documents must specify clearly and distinctly the class of engines they have driven. The diameter of the cylinders of the engines driven must be stated on the testimonials.

4. An applicant for a first-class certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—

(a) Of his respectability of character.

(b) That he has been the holder of a second-class certificate, under these regulations, for a period of not less than twelve months, and that he has during that period had charge of and driven a "second-class" engine for a period of not less than six months.

(c) That he is at the date of examination not under the age of nineteen (19) years, nor over the age of fifty (50) years. This latter age not to apply to persons who have previously been drivers.

(d) That neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any other mental or bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties.

Candidates must produce testimonials or certificates, signed by their employers, and such documents must specify clearly and distinctly the class of engines they have driven. The diameter of the cylinders of the engines driven must be stated on the testimonials.

5. Provided nevertheless that at any series of examinations held at any place, under the provisions of these regulations, the Board may grant a first-class certificate of competency to any such applicant as shall satisfy the Board that he has had experience in driving, and is fully competent to drive any and every kind of engine used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room.

6. Candidates for certificates of competency will be examined as to their practical knowledge and working of machinery, including steam-engines and all connexions, boilers, and mountings, or any other machinery used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room.

7. If a candidate shall fail to pass the examination prescribed, he shall not again present himself until a period of not less than six months shall have elapsed from the date of his last examination.

Certificates of Service.

8. The certificates of service to be issued by the Board of Examiners shall be of two classes, namely, first and second.

(a) A first-class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room.

(b) A second-class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room the cylinder of which does not exceed twelve inches in diameter (or if two cylinders be used the combined area thereof must not exceed that of a cylinder twelve inches in diameter).

9. First-class certificates of service will be granted to such candidates as satisfy the Board that they have been in charge of and have efficiently managed and driven an engine the cylinder of which is more than twelve inches in diameter, or a double cylinder engine the cylinders of which have an area equal to a single cylinder of more than twelve inches in diameter, used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room for a period of not less than twelve months prior to 3rd November, 1883.

10. Second-class certificates of service will be granted to such candidates as satisfy the Board that they have been in charge of and have efficiently managed and driven an engine used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room the cylinder of which does not exceed twelve inches in diameter (or if two cylinders be used the combined area thereof does not exceed that of a cylinder twelve inches in diameter) for a period of not less than twelve months prior to 3rd November, 1883.

11. If a candidate attempt to obtain a certificate of service or of competency by means of false testimonials, he shall not be allowed to again present himself to the Board of Examiners for examination until a period of not less than twelve months shall have elapsed from the date of his last examination.

Examinations.

12. Examinations will be conducted by the Board at such times and places as may from time to time be notified by the Secretary in the *Government Gazette* and in a newspaper or newspapers published or circulated in the locality, and candidates will be examined according to priority of receipt of notice required by clause 1.

Miscellaneous.

13. Whenever a person proves to the satisfaction of the Board of Examiners that he has, without fault on his part, lost or been deprived of any certificate previously granted to him under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, such Board shall, upon payment of such fee, if any, as they may direct, but not exceeding the fee specified in the schedule hereto, cause a copy of the certificate to which the applicant appears to be entitled to be made out and certified by the Secretary to the Board, and delivered to the applicant, and any copy so made and certified as aforesaid shall have the effect of the original certificate. The fee, if any, herein referred to shall be paid to the Secretary for Mines in cash, stamps, postal note, or post-office order, and shall by him be paid into the consolidated revenue.

14. The holder of a second-class certificate of competency issued under the *Mines Act 1890* and the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* shall be entitled to drive any "second-class" engine under either Act.

15. Every certificate of competency or service issued under the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* shall specify the name, place, and date of birth of the person to whom such certificate is issued.

16. No person in charge of steam machinery used in or in connexion with any factory or work-room shall, under any pretext whatever, unless relieved by a competent person for that purpose, absent himself or cease to have continual supervision of such machinery during the time such machinery is at work.

Disqualification of Holder of Certificate.

17. Any person holding a certificate of competency or of service as an engine-driver, and who is charged with any offence or misconduct likely to be detrimental to the proper or efficient discharge of his duties, may be called upon by the Board of Examiners to show cause why he should not be disqualified as a certificated engine-driver; and if he fail to satisfy the said Board, he may, by an order of the Governor in Council, published in the *Government Gazette*, be disqualified for any period from acting as engine-driver.

Any such person shall, after such order, deliver into the charge of the said Board his certificate of competency or of service, which shall be retained by the said Board during the period of his disqualification, and no such person shall, during the period of such disqualification, take charge of any machinery in which steam or air is used as motive power.

The Board may, if they think fit, hold an inquiry into the conduct of an engine-driver accused of any of the foregoing offences; and with respect to such inquiry the following provisions shall have effect:—

(1) The inquiry shall be held at such time and place as the Board may appoint, the engine-driver to have the right to engage counsel to defend him at such inquiry. He shall receive fourteen days' notice of the Board's intention to hold the inquiry, and if the engine-driver intends to employ counsel he shall give seven days' notice of such intention to the Secretary to the Board.

(2) The Secretary to the Board shall, before the commencement of the inquiry, furnish to the engine-driver a statement of the case upon which the inquiry is instituted.

(3) The engine-driver shall attend such inquiry, and may produce such evidence as may be considered necessary.

(4) The Board shall, upon the conclusion of the inquiry, forward to the Minister of Mines a report containing a full statement of the case and their opinion thereon.

(5) An engine-driver may, in addition to disqualification, be compelled to defray all or part of the expenses of any inquiry which may be held under the provisions of this clause.

18. The Board may examine candidates, and grant certificates of competency to such of them as satisfy the said Board that they have had the necessary experience as engine-drivers of any class of steam-engines other than factory ones.

19. Every holder of a second-class certificate under these regulations must produce such certificate to the Board previous to his being examined for a first-class one, and in the event of the latter certificate being granted, his second-class one shall be surrendered and delivered up to the Board.

20. The Board may grant certificates of competency to boiler attendants in cases where steam boilers only are used, and where no engine or engine-driver is employed.

An applicant for a certificate of competency as boiler attendant must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—

(a) Of his respectability of character.

(b) That he has had not less than six months' experience in assisting to work a steam boiler used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room.

(c) That he is, at the date of examination, not under the age of eighteen (18), nor over the age of fifty (50) years. The latter age is not to apply to persons who have previously worked steam boilers.

(d) That neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any other mental or bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties.

A document signed by the applicant's employers bearing on this clause may be considered satisfactory evidence.

REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING CERTIFICATES TO MINING ENGINE-DRIVERS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the provisions of section 358 of the *Mines Act 1890*, No. 1120, has approved of the subjoined regulations relating to the granting of certificates of competency and service to mining engine-drivers.

PRELIMINARY REQUIREMENTS.

1. Each applicant for a certificate of competency or service must forward to the Secretary for Mines, Mining Department, Melbourne, notice in writing of his intention to present himself for examination, such notice to be given not less than fourteen clear days prior to the date of examination.

The notice must be accompanied by cash, post-office order, or stamps to the amount or value of 10s.

Should the applicant pass the prescribed examination, the deposit shall, in each instance, go towards payment of the fee for certificate; in the event, however, of the failure of the candidate to pass the examination, such amount shall be forfeited to the consolidated revenue.

No certificate shall be issued until full payment of the fee required shall have been made to the Secretary for Mines.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

2. The certificates of competency to be issued by the Board of Examiners shall be of two classes, namely, *first* and *second* :—

A first-class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used for mining purposes.

A second-class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used for mining purposes except a winding engine.

3. An applicant for a second-class certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—

(a) Of his respectability of character.

(b) That within a period of two (2) years prior to the date of examination he has, during not less than six months, been assisting in the working of engines used for mining purposes.

(c) That he is at the date of examination not under the age of eighteen (18) years, nor over the age of fifty (50) years.

(d) That neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any other mental or bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties.

A document signed by the mining manager and engineer or by the mining manager and legal manager of the company by whom the applicant is or has been employed, bearing on this clause, may be considered satisfactory evidence.

4. An applicant for a first-class certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—

(a) Of his respectability of character.

(b) That he has been the holder of a second-class certificate under these regulations, or that he has been the holder of a first-class certificate of competency or service issued under the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, for a period of not less than twelve months, and that he has had at least three months' experience during that period in assisting at a winding engine.

(c) That he is at the date of examination not under the age of eighteen (18) years, nor over the age of fifty (50) years.

(d) That neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any other mental or bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties.

A document signed by the mining manager and engineer or by the mining manager and legal manager of the company by whom the applicant is or has been employed, bearing on this clause, may be considered satisfactory evidence.

5. Provided, nevertheless, that at the first examination, held at any place, of candidates for certificates of competency, the Board may grant a first-class certificate to any applicant upon production by him of satisfactory evidence that he has had experience in driving, and is fully competent to drive any and every kind of engine used for mining purposes.

CERTIFICATES OF SERVICE.

6. An applicant for a certificate of service must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence that he has been in charge of and has efficiently managed, for a period of not less than twelve months prior to the 3rd November, 1883, winding, pumping, and crushing engines, with boilers and appendages, or any of them.

A document signed by the mining manager and engineer or by the mining manager and legal manager of the company by whom the applicant is or has been employed, bearing on this clause, may be considered satisfactory evidence.

(Forms of application for certificates may be obtained from any inspector of mines or from the secretary to the Board).

EXAMINATIONS.

7. Examinations will be conducted by the Board at such time and place as may from time to time be notified by the Secretary in the *Government Gazette* and in a newspaper published or circulated in the locality, and candidates will be examined according to priority of receipt of notice required by clause 1; a list of the candidates and the order in which they will be examined shall, if necessary, be published in a newspaper as aforesaid.

8. Candidates for certificates of competency will be examined as to their practical knowledge and working of machinery, including steam and other engines, boilers, furnaces, stampers, winding and pumping gear, or any other machinery used for mining purposes.

9. If a candidate shall fail to pass the examination prescribed, he shall not again present himself until a period of not less than six months shall have elapsed from the date of his last examination.

COPIES OF CERTIFICATES.

10. Whenever any person proves to the satisfaction of the Board of Examiners that he has, without fault on his part, lost or been deprived of any certificate previously granted to him under the provisions of the *Mines Act 1890*, such Board shall, upon payment of such fee, if any, as they may direct, but not exceeding the fee specified in the schedule hereto, cause a copy of the certificate to which the applicant appears to be entitled to be made out and certified by the secretary to the Board, and delivered to the applicant, and any copy so made and certified as aforesaid shall have the effect of the original certificate. The fee, if any, herein referred to shall be paid to the Secretary for Mines in cash or post-office order, and shall by him be paid into the consolidated revenue.

COMPLAINTS.

11. If at any time representations be made to the Board of Examiners that any engine-driver holding a certificate of competency or service is, by reason of incompetency or gross negligence, unfit to discharge his duties, or has been convicted of an offence against the *Mines Act 1890*, the Board may, if they think fit, inquire into the conduct of such engine-driver; and with respect to such inquiry the following provisions shall have effect :—

(1) The inquiry shall be held at such time and place as the Board may appoint, due notice of which shall be forwarded to the engine-driver.

(2) The secretary to the Board shall, before the commencement of the inquiry, furnish to the engine-driver a statement of the case upon which the inquiry is instituted.

(3) The engine-driver shall attend such inquiry, and may produce such evidence as may be considered necessary.

(4) The Board shall, upon the conclusion of the inquiry, forward to the Minister of Mines a report containing a full statement of the case and their opinion thereon.

12. If a candidate attempt to obtain a certificate of service by means of false testimonials, he shall not be allowed to again present himself until a period of not less than twelve months shall have elapsed from the date of his last examination.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

IV. Or he must have completed the full course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and have served one year in the field as above.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with either of the above conditions will be eligible for examination.

WIDE BAY BAR.—DIRECTIONS FOR NEW NORTH CHANNEL.

NOTICE is hereby given that, on and after the 20th July, the new North Channel may be used for crossing Wide Bay Bar in the daytime by keeping the two square beacons on Hook Point in a line bearing N. 70° W. (true magnetic) until the two triangular beacons on the Western side of the houses on Inskip Point come in line bearing S. 64° 30' W. (true magnetic), then haul up and keep them in that line until past the red buoy marking the spit off Hook Point, when proceed as usual.

By night, keep the two white lights on the square beacons on Hook Point in a line bearing N. 70° W. (true magnetic) until the red and white lights on the triangular beacons on Inskip Point come in line bearing S. 64° 30' W. Keep them in line until well between the two points. Vessels must not open this line to the westward until past the Hook Point Spit.

By following the above directions the bar may be crossed at present with a depth of 16 feet at low-water spring tides; but, as the channels are constantly changing, the lead should not be neglected, as probably after the next heavy weather further alterations may take place.

After crossing the Bar, the present directions for proceeding through Great Sandy Strait may be followed.

The lights at present exhibited in the South Channel will be discontinued after the 20th instant.

The births of 1,675 children, viz., 892 boys and 783 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of June. In the month of May, 1,612 births were registered, or 63 less than in the month under review. The births were 625 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 282 above that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in June numbered 651, viz., 352 of males and 299 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 1,024, or 157 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in May by 143, but were above the average of June during the previous ten years by 123. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been below that average by 41.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.65, and of deaths registered 1.42.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 66.0° on the 5th, and the lowest was 38.0° on the 30th. The mean temperature of the month (53.0°) was three degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (18.6°) took place on the 30th, and the least (4.8°) on the 25th. The mean daily range was 10.7°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.240 inches on the 1st, and the lowest was 29.433 inches on the 14th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.899 inches) was about the average.

Rain fell on 13 days, the amount of rainfall being 1.71 inches. The average rainfall in June during the previous ten years was 2.06 inches, or one-third of an inch more than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on 6 days during the month.

Males contributed 54 per cent., and females 46 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 33 per cent. to that mortality, as against 37 per cent. in 1889, 34 per cent. in 1888, 33 per cent. in 1887, 30 per cent. in 1886, 31 per cent. in 1885, 32 per cent. in 1884, 28 per cent. in 1883, 35 per cent. in 1882, 32 per cent. in 1881, and 36 per cent. in 1880.

Thirty-five deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these a female, aged 75, died of diarrhoea; a female, aged 75, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 75, was found drowned; an importer, aged 76; died of stricture of the urethra; a female shopkeeper, aged 76, of heart disease; a female servant, aged 76, of jaundice; a gentleman, aged 77, of intestinal obstruction; a squatter, aged 77, of Bright's disease; a female, aged 79, of hemiplegia;

a female, aged 79, of bronchitis; a male of occupation unknown, aged 80, of apoplexy; a female, aged 80, of syncope; a widow and a master mariner, aged 80 and 82 respectively, of valvular disease of the heart; a farmer, aged 82, of inflammation of the kidneys; a gentleman, aged 83, of valvular disease of the heart; a mason and a male cook, each aged 83, of bronchitis; a gold-broker, aged 84, of influenza; a female, aged 84, of suffocation, caused by rupture in the throat; a dairyman, aged, 86, of softening of the brain; a male, aged 90, of insanity; 3 females, aged 75, 76, and 77 respectively, a gardener, aged 78, a solicitor, a watchman, and a photographer, each aged 80, a commission agent, aged 81, 2 females, each aged 84, a wood carter, aged 85, a female cook, aged 90, and a female, aged 97, of old age.

Forty-one deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 34 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 6 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A letter-carrier, aged 19, a seaman, aged 24, a ship's officer, aged 27, and a carter, aged 43, were passed over by railway trains; a tailor, aged 67, was killed in a collision between a tram and a cart; a blacksmith, aged 21, a carpenter, aged 23, two labourers, aged 30 and 33 respectively, a driver, aged 42, an engineer, aged 49, and a gardener, aged 56, died of injuries consequent on falls; a labourer, aged 25, was killed by a water-pipe falling on him; a boy, aged 8, by the overturning of a cart; a boy, aged 8, died of compound fracture of the arm, how caused not stated; a carter, aged 60, of injuries, the result of a kick from a horse; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 60, was shot with a revolver; a male child, aged 2, and a boy, aged 4, died of scalds; a female, aged 22, a fello-monger, aged 31, and a male, of occupation unknown, aged 50, were drowned in the River Yarra; a female, aged 64, was drowned in the South Melbourne Lagoon; and a gentleman, aged 75, at Brighton; three male infants, aged 16 hours, 1 day, and 4 days respectively, and three female infants, aged 11 days, 19 days, and 2 months respectively, were overlain; a male infant, aged 3 days, and a printer, aged 66, were suffocated with food; a labourer, aged 35, was suffocated during an epileptic fit; a female, aged 84, died of suffocation caused by rupture in the throat; and a baker, aged 37, of inhalation of chloroform properly administered. The homicidal death was that of a newly-born female infant, who was suffocated, a verdict of wilful murder being returned. The suicidal deaths were those of a female, aged 35, and a constable, aged 38, who shot themselves; a painter, aged 53, who cut his throat; a groom, aged 49, who drowned himself in the River Yarra; a charwoman, aged 50, a contractor, aged 52, a female, aged 53, and a saddler, aged 54, who hanged themselves.

One hundred and thirty-six deaths, or 21 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—55 in the Melbourne Hospital, 12 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Homeopathic Hospital, 7 in the Children's Hospital, 10 in the Lying-in Hospital 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 16 in the Benevolent Asylum, 10 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Austin Hospital, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, 3 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, and 5 in the Infant Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 218, of which 112, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 106, or 49 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 136 were under one year of age, 37 were between one and two, 20 were between two and three, 12 were between three and four, and 13 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 433. Of these, 240, or 55 per cent., were males, and 193, or 45 per cent., were females; 41 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between fifteen and twenty, 45 were between twenty and twenty-five, 29 were between twenty-five and thirty, 33 were between thirty and thirty-five, 29 were between thirty-five and forty, 25 were between forty and forty-five, 24 were between forty-five and fifty, 24 were between fifty and fifty-five, 26 were between fifty-five and sixty, 39 were between sixty and sixty-five, 27 were between sixty-five and seventy, 31 were between seventy and seventy-five, 14 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 21 were upwards of eighty.

In June as compared with May, deaths from typhoid fever fell from 36 to 20, the latter being the same number as in June, 1888, but 16 less than in June, 1889. Deaths from diphtheria however increased from 39 to 45, and in addition there were 10 deaths in June as against 8 in May from diphtheritic croup. Twelve deaths of child-bearing women were recorded in June, or a proportion of 1 to every 140 births registered.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in each of the first six months of the present and the two previous years:—

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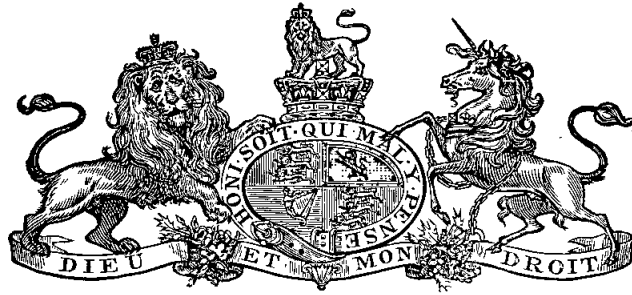
