THE Governor in Council has been pleased to order the following alterations in the Regulations for the Victorian Permanent Naval Forces, made on the 8th day of October, 1888:—

SECTION II.—CONSTITUTION AND GOVERNMENT.

Para. 2. (Entry of Officers) is altered to read:—

The Council of Defence shall, on the nomination of the Naval Commandant, or the officer appointed to perform the duties of Naval Commandant, recommend to the Governor in Council for engagement competent officers who have previously served in the Imperial Regular or Auxiliary Forces, or in any Colonial Naval Force, or in the British Mercantile Marine, who may be considered suitable for appointment in the Victorian Navy, and who have passed the medical examination.

SECTION VII.—COMMISSIONS AND PROMOTIONS.

Para. 1. (Examination of Officers) is cancelled, and the following is substituted therefor:—

Candidates for appointment as Sub-Lieutenants, having not less than four years' sea time, and under the age of 30 years, and who have previously served as Commissioned Officers in the Imperial Regular or Auxiliary Forces, or in any Colonial Naval Force, or who hold a Master's Certificate in the British Mercantile Marine, may be engaged as Sub-Lieutenants on probation for six months on the recommendation of the Officer commanding the Victorian Naval Forces, during which time they will be required to pass examinations in Gunnery, Torpedo, and other subjects as ordered by the Officer commanding the Victorian Naval Forces.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms; a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

NOTE.—During the second quarter of 1890 the excess of registered births over registered deaths was 4,916, viz., 2,291 of males and 2,625 of females. The excess of recorded arrivals of males over recorded departures of males amounted to 1,060, but as it is necessary to allow 1,383 for unrecorded departures of males, a loss is shown of 323. As regards females, after making an allowance of 372 for unrecorded departures, a balance remains in favour of arrivals amounting to 1,361. Applying these figures to those expressing the gain by excess of births over deaths, there remains a net gain for the quarter of 5,954, viz., 1,968 males and 3,986 females, as shown in the table.

The estimated increase of population during the first six months of 1890 has been 13,119, viz., 5,747 males and 7,372 females. The total increase was 300 less than that during the first six months of the previous year.

The total allowance for unrecorded departures since the census of 1881 was taken, has been 50,963, viz., 40,428 of males and 10,535 of females. Had no such allowance been made, the apparent population at the end of June would have been 1,182,110, viz., 639,973 males and 542,137 females.

The total excess of recorded arrivals over recorded departures during the quarter under review was 2,793; the greatest gain to the population being from Tasmania, 2,844; the next from the United Kingdom, 613; and the next from New Zealand and the South Seas, 583. On the other hand, there was a loss, by excess of departures over arrivals, to South and Western Australia of 967; to Foreign Countries of 279, and to New South Wales of 1. All the arrivals and departures referred to are by sea.

APPLICATION FOR REGISTRATION.

- Form A. 1. Every application to register a Trade Union shall be sent to the Registrar in Form A annexed
Form B. hereto, and shall be supported by a statutory declaration in Form B annexed hereto.

CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION.

- Form C. 2. The certificate of the registration of a Trade Union shall be in Form C annexed hereto.

IDENTITY OF NAMES FORBIDDEN.

3. The Registrar shall not register a Trade Union under a name identical with that of any other existing Trade Union known to him, whether registered or not registered, or so nearly resembling such name as to be likely to deceive the members or the public.

VERIFICATION OF CHANGES OF OFFICERS AND RULES.

- Form D. 4. The statement of changes of officers, and the copies of alterations of rules and new rules made by Trade Unions, and the copies of the rules of Trade Unions as they exist, transmitted to the Registrar in accordance with section 213 of the *Trade Unions Act 1890*, shall be verified by a statutory declaration in Form hereto D annexed.

MODIFICATION OF FORMS.

5. When anything is required to be in any of the forms hereto annexed, it shall be sufficient if it be to the like effect, and any of such forms may be modified by the authority of the Registrar to suit particular cases, and the Registrar may require further evidence by statutory declaration in addition to that expressly prescribed by the foregoing regulations in any case in which to him it may seem expedient.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF NHILL.

WE, John Bond, John William Trumble, John Young, Nicolaus Rauert, the younger, Robert Rintoule, Charles Frederick Taylor, and William Rodda Maddren, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for Public Recreation in the town of Nhill, have framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, athletic or other sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling (1*s.*) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a cord or chain, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. Orders for interment must be given to the person in charge of the cemetery seven (7) hours previous to the interment.
3. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.
4. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.
5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them, and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.
6. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
7. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered with a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.
8. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted the trustees for approval, who may withhold permission and prevent erection of any monument which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be preferred to be erected, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner.
9. Wooden picket fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair may be removed by order of the trustees without notice to the owner.
10. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected at the office of the sexton.
11. No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in any duty on behalf of, the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
12. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.
13. Three of the trustees to form a quorum.
14. No grave to be of less depth than 6 feet except in case of still-born children—3 feet.
15. The charge for digging graves to include filling up.
16. Family graves to be limited to 10 feet square.
17. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these regulations.

TOWN OF BALLARAT EAST.

By-Law No. 12.

A By-law of the Town Council of Ballarat East, made under the 40th Section of *The Public Health Act 1889*, adopted on the 27th day of June, 1890, and confirmed on the 8th day of August, 1890.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Local Government Act 1874* and *The Public Health Act 1889*, and in the interests of public health, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Ballarat East make the following By-law.

By-law No. 12.

Rubbish from Houses.

That rubbish from houses and yards be placed without delay in covered non-absorbent receptacles, into which a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be introduced when necessary.

That at least once a fortnight, or so much more frequently as the council may from time to time direct, the contents of these receptacles be removed and either rendered inoffensive or removed to a destructor.

That in future the receptacles be not placed in streets or lanes by the householders, but be taken from the yards and replaced by the scavengers.

That the householders be held responsible for the keeping of the receptacles in an inoffensive condition.

The foregoing part of this by-law shall apply to and have operation in the following streets, and portions of streets within the said town as hereinafter specified, viz., Bridge-street; Victoria-street from Bridge-street to Stawell-street; Main-street from Bridge-street to Lal Lal-street; Grenville-street; Willis-street; Eastwood-street; East Barkly-street; Princes-street; Humfray-street from Main-street to Stawell-street; South Humfray-street from Main-street to Grant-street; and Grant-street from Anderson-street to Wainwright-street.

The two following clauses to apply to the whole of the town of Ballarat East:—

Fowl Yards.

That all fowl yards shall, if possible, and where necessary for health, be at least twenty-five feet from any dwelling-house.

Spouting, Downpipes, and Drains.

That all buildings be provided with spouting, downpipes, and drains sufficient to carry off all storm or rain water.

Penalties.

Any person disobeying any provision of *The Public Health Acts 1866—1889*, or of any by-law thereunder, shall be guilty of an offence against the Act and shall be liable to pay all costs and expenses which may be incurred in taking proceedings against such person, as well as any costs and expenses that may be lawfully incurred in remedying the default of such person, and in addition to pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and a further penalty of not more than Five pounds or less than One pound for each day such offence is continued after any conviction, and such penalties shall be recoverable either after the exercise, or notwithstanding the non-exercise, of any power to remedy the default of such person.

GEE LONG PROTESTANT ORPHAN ASYLUM. ALTERATION OF BY-LAW.

At a Special Meeting of the Governors and Contributors of the above Asylum, held at the Mechanics' Institute, Geelong, Friday, 13th June, 1890, at 4.30 p.m., a special resolution was passed that By-law No. 7 should be altered so that it shall read as follows:—

All moneys given to the asylum under this clause shall on no account be considered or applied as income, but shall be invested by the Committee of Management as an Endowment Fund, in Government or real securities, municipal debentures in the colony of Victoria, or on deposit with any incorporated bank carrying on business in the said colony, and the annual proceeds only of such investment shall become part of the annual income of the institution.

At a Special Meeting of the Governors and Contributors, held at the Mechanics' Institute, Geelong, Thursday, 31st July, 1890, at 5 p.m., the above resolution was confirmed.

MARYBOROUGH HOSPITAL.

At a meeting of contributors of the above Hospital, held on the 24th day of July, 1890, certain alterations in the by-laws regulating the same, previously proposed by the General Committee thereof, were confirmed as follows, that is to say:—

Rule 18, to read as follows:—

The general committee shall direct the general business of the hospital, frame rules for its internal regulations (the same not being repugnant to the by-laws), alter, repeal, amend, and make new rules, enter into contracts for the supply of provisions and other articles for the use of the hospital, direct payment to be made for the same, fill up all vacancies in all ordinary offices, as those of president, vice-president, treasurer, secretary, medical officers, auditors, referees, and visiting committee, between the annual meetings in July, and appoint and discharge all servants and paid officers of the institution. They shall meet during the second week of every month, and on such other days as they may appoint by way of adjournment. As soon as a quorum shall be present, the chair shall be taken by the president, or in his absence by the vice-president, or in their absence by a chairman appointed by the members then present; but if no quorum shall be present within thirty minutes of the time named, such meeting, as well as every special meeting hereafter authorized, shall stand adjourned to the following week, at the same day and hour, and so on from week to week until the next monthly meeting. They shall superintend and give all necessary directions for the admission, discharge, and dismissal of patients in accordance with the terms and spirit of the by-laws.

Rule 30 to read as follows:—The number of honorary medical officers shall be three, who shall hold office for one year only, and shall go out of office (but may nevertheless be re-elected) on the last Thursday in the month of July in every year, at which time a fresh election shall be made by the contributors.

32. The resident surgeon shall receive the certificates from the applicants for admission, examine the nature of their cases, and decide on their fitness for admission, either as in-door or out-door patients, subject to the approval of the house committee; and he shall discharge all patients as soon as he considers them fit to be discharged. He shall visit the patients every morning not later than ten o'clock, and every evening not later than eight o'clock. Should the resident surgeon be absent on private practice, he shall make provision for being communicated with. The resident surgeon during his absence on private practice shall make arrangements with some other duly qualified medical man to attend to any cases of emergency which may occur.
