Where is by section 40 of The Marine Board Act 1887 it is amongst other things enacted that the Marine Board of Victoria may, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make regulations for prescribing the fees to be paid for the survey of steamships, and for determining the persons by whom and the conditions under which such payments shall be made:

And whereas by section 100 of the said Act it is provided that the owner of every steam-ship requiring a certificate under Part 3 of the said Act shall pay for every certificate granted by the said Board such fees as the said Board directs, not exceeding the fees mentioned in the Fifth Schedule to the said Act:

Now therefore the said Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make the following regulations, and doth direct that the fees hereinafter specified shall be payable for every such certificate granted by the Board, that is to say:—

1. These regulations may be cited as "The regulations for the payment of fees for the survey of steam-ships."

2. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of September, 1890.

3. The owner, master, or agent of any steam-ship requiring that such steam-ship shall be surveyed under the provisions of The Marine Board Act 1887, or any Act substituted for or amending the same, shall, except as hereinafter provided, make written application for survey to the Secretary to the Marine Board, Melbourne.

4. Every such application shall be in writing, and shall state the date and time when such survey is desired, and also the place

application for survey to the Secretary to the Marine Board, Melbourne.

4. Every such application shall be in writing, and shall state the date and time when such survey is desired, and also the place where the vessel in respect of which application is made will be lying on the date and at the time at which it is desired the survey will be made.

5. Applications for survey must be lodged at the office of the Marine Board at least forty-eight hours before the time therein specified for such survey.

6. Every application for the survey of a steam-ship shall be accompanied by the amount of survey fee estimated on the net registered tonnage of such steam-ship according to the scale prescribed in the schedule of rates attached hereto.

7. The fees to be paid for the survey of steam-ships having noncondensing engines shall be for each survey one-half of the fees specified in the schedule hereto.

8. Applications for the survey of steam-ships plying upon the River Murray, or tributaries, shall be made to the Sub-collector of Customs at Echuca.

ALTERATIONS IN THE REGULATIONS FOR THE VICTORIAN MILITARY FORCES.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fifth day of August, 1890.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

Mr. Gillies Mr. Deakin Mr. Wrixon Mr. Guthbert Dr. Pearson Mr. Bell Mr. Davies Mr. Patterson Mr. Balfour.

WHEREAS by the Defences and Discipline Act 1890 it is provided that the Governor in Council may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of Part I. of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out Part I. of the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Exceutive Council thereof, doth hereby order the following alterations in the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces made on the 3rd day of December, 1888, that is to say:—

PART III,-MILITIA FORCES. SECTION II.-DISCIPLINE.

In paragraph 30, Fines.—Clause j, "failing to become effective, s." is altered to read—

"Failing to become effective in any year after two years' service, 20s."

PART III.—MILITIA FORCES. SECTION III.—PAY AND ALLOWANCES.

In paragraph 13, after clause c, add new paragraph

n paragraph 1.8, atter clause c, aua new paragraph—
d. The sum of £1 5s. will be retained by Officers commanding from the first payment due to recruits. "This sum will, however, be returned to all men who make themselves effective during the first two years after enlistment. The amount so retained from men who fail to become effective, or who are discharged or dismissed during that period, will be forfeited, and will revert to Corps' funds.

PART III., SECTION IV.—MEDICAL STAFF.

Paragraph 4 is altered to read-

Medical officers will be detailed for duty with the various corps, and will, on the application of the Officer commanding corps to which they are attached, perform without further reference the undermentioned duty:—Examination of recruits on certain nights to be fixed by the Officer commanding in conjunction with the Medical Officer.

The following are the attendances for which pay will be allowed to be drawn:—

Camps. Reviews.

Inspections. Boards.

Musketry or Gunnery parades, when firing takes place. Mounted parades of Horse and Field Artillery.

No Medical Officer will be allowed to draw pay for other than the above parades or boards unless permission be given for such by the Principal Medical Officer.

Paragraph 6 is altered to read-

aragraph o is attered to read—.

In the event of an Officer being unable to attend to any of the foregoing duties, he will either with the sanction of the Principal Medical Officer make arrangements with some other Medical Officer to take his place (informing the Commanding Officer), or report to the Principal Medical Officer in sufficient time to enable him to provide for the duties. The amount of pay earned by a Medical Officer detailed as a substitute will be deducted from the pay of the Officer for whom such substitute was provided.

To paragraph 9 add-

(d) All claims for pay and horse allowance must be forwarded to the Principal Medical Officer for certification not later than the 15th January and 15th July in each year, otherwise they will not be admitted.

And the Honorable James Bell, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

THE subjoined Rules and Regulations and Scale of Fees, which have been made by the Trustees of the Neerim Public Cemetery, have, pursuant to the provisions of sections 9 and 16 respectively of the Cancleries Act 1800 (54 Vict. No. 1072), been submitted to and approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Rules and Reulations.

1. All the charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground is broken or vault reopened.

2. On application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery being made to the trustees, certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the proper foes.

3. Order for interment to be given to the trustees at least eight hours previous to interment, when a form of instruction must be filled up and given to the sexton.

4. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but when a brick or other grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person duly appointed by them.

5. The time fixed for the funeral to be at the cemetery must be punctually observed.

6. The usual hours for the performance of funerals shall be from sunrise to sunset until otherwise ordered.

7. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owner.

8. Plan of every monument or headstone must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.

9. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in or cemented or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

10. A plan of the ground and a register will be kept which may be examined.

11. According to the laws now in force no funeral will be allowed to take place in the cemetery without a certificate from a deputy registrar or coroner holding an inquest or inquiry on the body to be interred, or from a magistrate. Every such certificate must be delivered to the person in charge at the cemetery before the funeral enters the gates.

12. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alteration from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.


