All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

IV. Or he must have completed the full course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and have served one year in the field as above.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with either of the above conditions will be eligible for examination.

ADJUSTMENT OF COMPASSES.

WHEREAS by section 40 of *The Marine Board Act 1887* it is amongst things enacted that the Marine Board of Victoria may from time to time, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make, alter, and repeal Regulations for the Adjustment of Compasses and the Transmission of Deviation Tables, and for affixing penalties to any breach of any Regulation made by the said Board under the authority of the said Act: And whereas the said Marine Board did, on the 11th day of October, 1889, make such Regulations as aforesaid: And whereas it is expedient to repeal Regulation No. 15 and Schedule 4 of "The Regulations for the Adjustment of Compasses," published in the *Government Gazette* of the 1st November, 1889, and also to make additional Regulations: Now therefore the said Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Governor in Council, repeal the Regulation and Schedule aforesaid, and, in lieu thereof, doth make and substitute therefor the following additional Regulations and Schedule respectively, namely:—

15a. The owner, agent, or master of any ship requiring that the compasses of such ship shall be examined and adjusted under the provisions of *The Marine Board Act 1887*, or any Act amending the same, shall make application for such examination and adjustment to the Secretary to the Marine Board, Melbourne.

15b. Every application as aforesaid shall be in writing, and shall state the date and time when such examination and adjustment is desired, and also the place where the ship in respect of which application is made will be lying immediately prior to proceeding to the Swinging Buoys.

15c. Every such application must be lodged at the office of the Marine Board at least 24 hours before the time therein specified for the examination and adjustment of the compasses of any ship.

15d. Each application shall be accompanied by the amount of adjustment fee according to the net registered tonnage of the ship in respect of which application is made, and as prescribed in the Schedule of Fees attached hereto.

15e. A list of the names of the adjusters of compasses, duly licensed by the Marine Board, shall be compiled by the Secretary thereto, and the names shall be arranged on such list, in the alphabetical order of the surnames of such adjusters, and on the receipt by the Secretary of any application for the services of an adjuster, he shall, by notice in writing under his hand, require the adjuster standing next in order for duty on such list to attend on board the ship in respect of which application is made, and such adjuster shall, on his being so notified, proceed on board in such time as shall cause no delay to such ship, and duly examine and adjust the compasses thereof in accordance with the regulations for the time being in force.

15f. In the event of any adjuster not attending on board any vessel, in respect of which he may have received the notice prescribed in clause 15e of these Regulations, or should any adjuster be unable from any cause to comply with any direction given in accordance with these Regulations, it shall be competent for the Secretary, as hereinbefore provided, to notify the adjuster next in order for duty, and such adjuster shall proceed and perform the service as by these Regulations required.

15g. Any adjuster receiving a notice from the Secretary to adjust the compasses of any ship, and unable to do so, shall immediately notify the Secretary to the Board to such effect.

15h. Every adjuster shall register with the Secretary to the Board the address to which notices may be forwarded in conformity with these Regulations, and any subsequent change in any such address shall be immediately reported to the Board by the adjuster.

15i. The adjusters shall be paid such fees or remuneration as may be from time to time approved of by the Board.

15j. These Regulations shall form portion of "The Regulations for the Adjustment of Compasses," and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1890.

The foregoing additional Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board held this 29th day of August, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety.

7A. There may be issued licences for the exclusive right of stripping and removing bark from wattle trees on lands leased under section 32 of the Land Acts 1884 or 1890. Every such licence shall be available for the season commencing on the 15th day of September in any year, and ending on the 15th day of January next following thereafter, and no longer; and shall be subject to the conditions specified hereunder. The fee shall be £2.

Conditions.

1. The holder of this licence shall be the lessee under section 32 of the Land Acts 1884 or 1890 of the block referred to herein.
2. The fee shall be payable in advance.
3. This licence is only available for block parish held under section 32 Land Acts 1884 or 1890 by
4. No tree of a less diameter than 5 inches at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be stripped of its bark.
5. No bark shall be stripped from a tree until after the same has been felled.
6. This licence is personal, and must be produced by the holder thereof to any Crown lands bailiff or police constable when called upon.
7. If the licensee shall strip or remove bark from any tree on this block, except in accordance with these conditions, he shall be deemed to have stripped or removed same without a licence.
8. This licence shall be available from the 15th September to the 15th January next following thereafter, and no longer.

WHEREAS by the 6th section of the Act of the Parliament of Victoria numbered 1059, intituled *An Act to Consolidate the Laws relating to the Aboriginal Natives of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to make regulations and orders for any of the purposes hereinafter mentioned, and at any time to rescind or alter such regulations, that is to say :—

- i. For prescribing the place where any aboriginal or any tribe of aboriginals shall reside:
- ii. For prescribing the terms on which contracts for and on behalf of aboriginals may be made with Europeans, and upon which certificates may be granted to aboriginals who may be able and willing to earn a living by their own exertions:
- iii. For apportioning amongst aboriginals the earnings of aboriginals under any contract, or where aboriginals are located on a reserve the net produce of the labour of such aboriginals:
- iv. For the distribution and expenditure of moneys granted by Parliament for the benefit of aboriginals:
- v. For the care, custody, and education of the children of aboriginals:
- vi. For prescribing the mode of transacting the business of, and the duties generally, of the Board, or any local committee mentioned in the said Act, and of the officers appointed thereunder:
- vii. For prescribing the conditions on which the Board may license any half-castes to reside and be maintained upon the place or places aforesaid, where any aboriginal or tribe of aboriginals now or hereafter reside, and for limiting the period of such residence, and for regulating the removal or dismissal of any of such persons from any such place or places:
- viii. For the supply to half-castes entitled to the same of rations, clothing, blankets, or other necessaries, or any medical or other relief or assistance:
- ix. For prescribing the conditions on which half-castes may obtain and receive assistance to enable them under and by virtue of the provisions of any law now or hereafter to be in force relating to the alienation or occupation of Crown lands, to select, acquire, hold, enjoy, and be possessed of any such Crown lands for any estate or interest therein, and the nature and amount of such assistance:
- x. For prescribing the conditions on which half-caste infants may be licensed or apprenticed to any person or persons:
- xi. For the transfer of any half-caste child, being an orphan, to the care of the Department for Neglected Children, or any institutions within Victoria for orphan children, subject to the provisions of any law now or hereafter to be in force for the transfer of orphan children to the said department or such institutions as aforesaid:
- xii. To enable the Board to exercise care and oversight in the management or condition of half-castes during a period of four years from the first day of January, One thousand eight hundred and ninety:
- xiii. For the furnishing of periodical reports on the condition and progress of half-castes during the said period.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth make the following regulations and orders, in which the words "Governor" and "Board" are intended to have the meaning attached to them by the Act, and the words "Prescribed Station" in Part VII. of such regulations shall mean "any place now or hereafter to be prescribed by the Governor as the place where any aboriginal or tribe of aboriginals shall reside.

(I.) PLACES OF RESIDENCE.

1. Provision will be made by the Board for the residence of aboriginals and tribes of aboriginals at the following places :—

Coranderrk.
Lake Wellington.
Lake Tyers.
Lake Condah.
Lake Hindmarsh.

(II.) CONTRACTS AND CERTIFICATES.

2. No contract with any aboriginal for any service or employment for a longer period than three months shall be of any validity as against such aboriginal, or as an exemption from the penalty imposed by section 13 of the Act, unless such contract shall have been approved by the Board, or the aboriginal shall at the making and during the continuance thereof hold a subsisting certificate, to be issued as hereinafter provided; but this regulation shall in no way affect the validity of any such contract as against the person entering into it with the aboriginal.

3. Any person desiring the approval of the Board for any such contract shall apply therefor by transmitting to the local guardian or other authorized agent of the Board in or nearest to the district in which the applicant resides, an application signed by him in the subjoined form (hereinafter referred to as the contract) :—

4. The local guardian or other authorized agent of the Board, after making such inquiries as he or they may think necessary to enable him or them to judge of the propriety of approving the contract, shall forward the same with his or their opinion thereon to the Board.

5. The Board, if satisfied of the propriety of approval, will cause their approval, signed by the secretary, to be indorsed on the contract, and will return the same to the local guardian or committee, and post a copy thereof with such approval indorsed to the address mentioned in the contract.

6. The Board may modify any such contract at the time of approving the same by directing all or any part of the money payment payable to the aboriginal to be made to some local guardian or other person specified in that behalf instead of to the aboriginal himself, and shall in such case indorse such direction in manner hereinbefore provided with respect to their approval; and after the time at which the approved contract so modified would in course of post have reached the address given in the contract, the contractor shall not be entitled to credit under the contract for any payment so directed to be made unless made as directed.

7. Any money to be received in pursuance of any such direction shall be applied at the discretion of the receiver for the benefit of the aboriginal or of any member of his family, subject to any express direction given by the Board, and shall in every case be accounted for to the Board as hereinafter directed, or upon application by the secretary at any time.

8. The Board may, at their discretion, grant to any aboriginal, able and willing to earn a living by his own exertions, a certificate in the subjoined form, signed by the secretary, which certificate shall not remain in force for more than six months from its date or the date of its last renewal; and any such unexpired certificate may be renewed for six months by the indorsement of the date of renewal and signature of any member of the Board, local guardian, or member of a local committee, who, in the exercise of his discretion; shall think fit to renew the same.

Certificate under the Aborigines Act 1890.

This certificate was issued on the _____ day of _____ 18 to an aboriginal named _____, aged about _____ height about _____, and known or distinguishable by the following peculiarities [state if any], he having represented himself as able and willing to earn a living by his own exertions.

The effect of this certificate, while in force, is as follows :—

It authorizes him to enter into a binding contract of service for any time during which this certificate remains in force.

It permits a European to harbour him without incurring any penalty.

It does not authorize any person to sell or give him any intoxicating drink or affect the penalty for so doing, or confer any other exemption from penalties under the said Act.

This certificate will not remain in force after the _____ day of _____ 18, unless renewed in the meantime by the date of renewal, and signature of some member of the Board for the Protection of Aborigines, local guardian, or member of local committee being written thereon; and it will not remain in force after six months from the date of the last renewal.

(III.) APPORTIONMENT OF EARNINGS.

9. Where a number of aboriginals are located on a reserve, and where they cultivate fields and gardens, or raise and keep live stock, or otherwise by their labours produce marketable goods, the Board may from time to time order the sale of any produce or live stock or goods, and out of the net proceeds of sale pay to the aboriginals who have laboured on the reserve such sums as the Board may deem right, having regard to the kind and amount of labour performed by each.

(IV.) DISTRIBUTION AND EXPENDITURE OF MONEYS.

10. In the third month of every year, or so soon after as practicable, the Board shall submit for approval by the Governor a statement showing in detail the quantities of the rations, clothes, medicines, live stock, and other things which they propose to distribute amongst or employ for the benefit of aboriginals for the ensuing twelve months; and an estimate of the amount to be expended in the purchase and carriage thereof, and of the amount to be expended in salaries and wages and travelling and other expenses for the like period.

11. Once in every year the Board shall submit to the Governor a statement for the past year showing in detail the quantities of the several things distributed and the quantity remaining on hand, and the amount of actual expenditure in salaries, wages, travelling, and other expenses for the like period.

12. Every local committee, local guardian, or other person intrusted by the Board with the distribution of any stores or other things, or the application of any moneys received from the Board, or from the employer of any aboriginal, shall furnish the Board with a monthly statement in detail of all stores and other things received and distributed, and of all moneys received and disbursed, and showing the balances on hand of stores or other things, and of moneys unexpended up to and inclusive of the last day of each calendar month.

(V.) CUSTODY OF CHILDREN.

13. The Governor may order the removal of any aboriginal child neglected by its parents, or left unprotected, to any of the places of residence specified in Regulation I., or to an industrial or reformatory school.

14. Every aboriginal under the age of fourteen years located anywhere in Victoria shall, when so required by the person in charge of the nearest station, attend any school at or near such station at such times as he may direct.

15. Every aboriginal male under fourteen years of age, and also all unmarried aboriginal females under the age of eighteen years, shall, when so required by the person in charge of any station in connexion with or under the control of the said Board, reside, and take their meals, and sleep, in any building set apart for such purposes.

(VI.) MODE OF TRANSACTING BUSINESS.

16. An ordinary meeting of the Board shall be held in the first week of every month, on a day to be named by the vice-chairman.

17. A special meeting may be convened at any time by the secretary.

18. Three members of the Board shall form a quorum.

19. The secretary, or one of the members acting as secretary, shall keep minutes of the proceedings at each meeting, which shall, if correct, be confirmed at the next meeting.

20. The directions of the Board to its officers shall be given to the secretary, or, in his absence, in such manner as the Board may think right, and the secretary, or acting secretary, shall conduct all correspondence.

(VII.) HALF-CASTES.

21. On the recommendation of the general inspector or the manager of a prescribed station, the Board may in cases of illness, infirmity, or other necessitous circumstances, issue a licence, signed by the secretary of the Board, to any half-caste or child of half-caste to reside for a period of three months upon any prescribed station; and the Board may renew such licence for a like period as often as it may think fit, and may at any time cancel such licence.

22. Any half-caste or child of half-castes who may be permitted under a licence to reside at a prescribed station shall be under the control of the manager of such station, and shall strictly adhere to the regulations of the Board for the management of such stations.

23. Any half-caste or child of half-castes may, with the approval of the Board, be dismissed and removed from any prescribed station for misconduct on the advice of the manager of such station or the general inspector.

24. Any half-caste who may be permitted to reside on any prescribed station shall receive the following supply of rations weekly:—7 lbs. of bread or 8 lbs. of flour, 2 lbs. of sugar, $\frac{1}{4}$ lb. of tea, 7 lbs. of meat when obtainable, and rice, oatmeal, and salt, in such quantities as the manager of the station may think necessary.

Children under ten years of age shall receive half of the above supply of rations.

25. Any half-caste or child of half-castes who may be permitted to reside on any prescribed station shall be supplied with clothing and blankets as heretofore, and medical attendance and comforts may be granted by special permission of the Board.

26. Every able-bodied half-caste and aboriginal residing on a prescribed station shall do a reasonable amount of work, and any one persistently refusing to do so when required shall have his supplies stopped until he resumes work.

27. If any half-caste having his supplies so stopped use the supplies of any half-caste child, or in any way deprive any half-caste child thereof, he shall be reported to the Board.

28. The granting of railway passes to half-castes shall be limited to urgent and needful cases only, and travelling discouraged and prevented as much as possible.

29. Before any half-caste can receive any assistance from the Board to select or acquire Crown lands or private property, or to improve the same, the Board must be satisfied that he is sober, honest, and industrious; and if living on a prescribed station, he must produce a certificate to that effect from the manager of such station, or from a respectable householder if not living on a prescribed station.

30. Loans may be made by the Board to any such half-caste on the security of such property for the purpose of enabling him to erect boundary fences, or houses, but such assistance shall not exceed half the cost thereof, nor £100 in the aggregate.

31. In exceptional cases the Board may advance money towards the payment of rent or purchase money of any land acquired by a half-caste on the security of such land, further security being taken that any money advanced by the Board shall be repaid with interest if required before any sale or assignment of such land shall be made by such half-caste.

32. All leases, licences, or titles of land upon which the Board has advanced money shall be in the custody of the Board.

33. The general inspector, with the approval of the Board, may license or apprentice, in a lawful manner, to any trade or occupation any male or female half-caste child over fourteen years of age to any person or persons of approved respectability.

34. Girls shall not be apprenticed or sent to service to single gentlemen, or hotel or boarding-house keepers.

35. Half-castes licensed to service and apprentices shall be provided with female protection and sleeping accommodation to be approved of by officers authorized by the Board to inspect them.

36. All persons to whom boys or girls are licensed or apprenticed shall properly feed and lodge them, and also provide them with medicines and medical attendance when necessary, and also see that their persons, clothing, &c., are kept clean and healthy.

37. One-half of the wages of every half-caste child licensed to service and of every apprentice shall be paid quarterly, viz:—on the 1st January, April, July, and October—and sent by the employer to the general inspector of the Board, who shall have such money placed to such child's credit in a savings bank, and paid to such child at the end of his or her service or apprenticeship, and the other half shall be paid to the child at the end of each quarter's service or apprenticeship.

38. Apprentices and half-castes licensed to service shall be allowed, when practicable, to attend divine service and Sunday school, and their moral training shall be duly cared for by their employer.

39. If within three months after the execution of any indenture the employer shall not be satisfied with the apprentice, the child may be returned to the Board, and the indenture shall be cancelled.

40. In the event of any change of residence by any employer, written intimation thereof shall be given by him at once to the general inspector of the Board.

41. Every employer shall forward to the general inspector as often as he shall require written reports on the conduct of any child in his service or apprenticed to him, and shall allow such child to write to the Board at such times as he may deem necessary.

42. In the event of any child becoming seriously ill, dying, absconding, leaving, or meeting with an accident, information shall at once be given by the employer to the general inspector of the Board, and in the event of a child absconding, information shall also at once be given by the employer to the local police, who shall take immediate steps to recover and return the child.

43. The Board shall provide a printed form of application for the use of those who desire to obtain children as apprentices or servants, and such form shall be filled up with the following particulars:—

- (a) Name, address, profession, or occupation of applicant.
- (b) Whether married or single.
- (c) Religious denomination and family of applicant.
- (d) Ages of male members of family.
- (e) Particulars of sleeping accommodation.
- (f) Name of child applied for.
- (g) Description of work to be performed or trade to be learned by child.
- (h) Reference to two reliable persons (one if possible a minister of religion) as to the respectability of the applicant.

46. Any member or officer of the Board may from time to time, for the purpose of inspection and report, visit those receiving assistance under section 6, sub-section ix., or those licensed out to service or apprenticed, or those in any way under the control of the Board.

On and after Monday, 15th September, the above-named station, between Lara and North Geelong, will be open for passenger traffic. The 6.30 and 11.5 a.m. trains from Melbourne and 1.25 and 6.25 p.m. trains (if running) from Geelong will stop to pick up or set down passengers as may be required.

One portion of the stamp is to be affixed to the parcel, and the other handed to the intending passenger. Stamps in any quantity can be purchased at the above-named stations.

If the vessel is not at the pier or not ready to ship the bales on their arrival, then the trucks may be brought back to Melbourne and unloaded there, all at the cost and risk of the owner.

Wool consigned from country stations to Melbourne, and then re-consigned to Williamstown or Port Melbourne without being removed from the sheds or trucks, will be charged 4d. per bale for warehousing in addition to the storage charges mentioned underneath.

Bags of wool are charged First-Class Rates as per Goods Tariff, but will not be entitled to any rebates.

Wool consigned for shipment, and requiring to be dumped, will be deliverable at the dumping sheds, where a receipt must be given on behalf of the ship.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

Bales over 4 cwt. will be charged 25 % additional upon the rate for a 4-cwt. bale for every cwt. or portion of a cwt. in excess.

The above rates are subject to minimum charges, as per By-law 28, dated 1st July, 1885.

Twelve hours will be allowed for the removal of wool after arrival of the trucks. From that time storage will be charged, and strictly enforced, at the rate of One penny per bale per diem until the wool is removed by the consignee, or sent to store by the Commissioners at the consignee's cost and risk. All wool is carried at owner's risk as to condition, and will be signed for accordingly. If detailed weight lists are furnished by the Commissioners for the use of consignees, the charge for weighing will be Fourpence per bale; if weighed by the owners, One penny per bale will be charged for the use of the scales. Consignors requiring weight lists must pay for same at sending station. Unless rebate sheets are rendered within two months of date on which wool is consigned no claim will be recognised.

CHARGES ON GOODS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—

1. The Special Goods Rates between Portland and Hamilton as set forth in By-Law 28 are hereby repealed and the ordinary Mileage Rates as set forth in the said By-Law will in future be charged.
2. "Off" Wines, Colonial, used solely for distillation, to be charged and carried under Agricultural Produce Rates and Conditions.
3. Eucalyptus Oil, in bottles, in cases, to be charged Third Class Rates, and empty bottles going to be filled with Eucalyptus Oil to be charged and carried under Special B Class Rates and Conditions.
4. Poisoned Wheat for Rabbit Killing to be charged the ordinary Wheat Rates.
5. Pigs Feed, including Rice Meal, to be charged Wheat Rates.
6. Carbon, for Rabbit Killing, to be charged First Class Rates.
7. The charge for Weighing Firewood in Melbourne and Suburbs to be 3d. for one horse loads.

8. REBATES ON GOODS FOR RIVERINA *via* SWAN HILL.

A. Goods forwarded from Melbourne, Williamstown, or Port Melbourne to Swan Hill, and conveyed thence by river or teams to any station on the Murray below the Murrumbidgee Junction, or to any station on the Darling or Murrumbidgee Rivers or their tributaries, or to a destination north of, or intersected by, an imaginary line drawn straight from Jingellie on the Murray to Gerogery on the New South Wales line; thence to the south-east corner of Coree Station, the following stations forming the southern boundary:— Table Top, Gerogery, Burgunderi, Burrumbuttock, Goombargama, Mahonga, Coreen, Wongamong, Narrow Plains, Burriagan-Momalong, and Boorobarily; thence in a northerly direction to Burrabogie blocks, to include in that line Coree, Mooolbrin, Steam Plains, Willural, Warwillah, Wagam, and Nyanga Stations; thence in a westerly direction along the south boundary of the River back-blocks to the intersection of the Murrumbidgee River at Balranald, will be allowed the undermentioned rebates, on production of certified bills of lading, or certificates, or such other proof as the Commissioners may deem sufficient that they have been duly received at their destination.

b. The ordinary rates will be charged in the first instance, and rebates allowed on production of rebate sheets, accompanied by bills of lading or certificates as above mentioned.

c. Rebate sheets must be rendered within one month of goods being forwarded.

LANG LANG PUBLIC CEMETERY.—REGULATIONS AND SCALE OF FEES.

THE subjoined Regulations and Scale of Fees, which have been made by the Trustees of the Lang Lang Public Cemetery, have, pursuant to the provisions of sections 9 and 16 respectively of the *Cemeteries Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1072), been approved by the Governor in Council.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE CONTROL AND MANAGEMENT OF THE LANG LANG CEMETERY.

1. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.
2. That any person desiring ground for a private grave or vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or for any other purpose in the cemetery, shall apply to the trustees therefor. If approved, the trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a "Certificate of Right of Burial," in the form specified in Schedule A.
3. That any person desiring to construct a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a plan, design, or drawing of such with full particulars for approval.
4. That any order for interment shall be given to the caretaker or the secretary six (6) working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed without said notice.
5. That the name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule B, shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.
6. That the trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same under directions of a surveyor, approved by the trustees, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
7. That no interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so.
8. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in the said cemetery without a certificate from a deputy registrar of deaths or a coroner. Such certificate shall be delivered to the gatekeeper or caretaker before the funeral enters the cemetery.
9. That the hours fixed for burial shall be as follows:—On week days: September to April inclusive, from Eight a.m. to Five p.m.; May to August inclusive, from Eight a.m. to Four p.m.; on Sundays throughout the year, from Two to Five p.m.

10. That no burial shall be allowed to take place between the hours of Seven p.m. and Seven a.m., except by special permission of the trustees.

11. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection, shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.

12. That any person desiring to place any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a copy thereof.

13. That any person putting up any erection or placing any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery, without the permission of the trustees, shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the Acts relating to Cemeteries for so doing, and to be further dealt with as a trespasser.

14. That the trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for reinterment either in said or other cemetery.

15. That before any such exceptional case can be dealt with by the trustees, a written application, setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased; and in the event of said application being granted, the permission of the Minister administering *The Coroners Statute 1865* and the Act 338, in addition to that of the trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight coffin prior to removal.

16. That any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or otherwise infringing any Act relating to Cemeteries, or any rule, regulation, or by-law made for protecting the cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.

17. That no person shall be allowed to take any flower or plant out of the cemetery.

18. That a plan of the cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, situations, and numbers of the graves, and a registry of all certificates of right of burial, shall be kept.

19. That every grave shall be at least six (6) feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four (4) feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground after such interment.

20. That any workman not employed by the trustees shall be under the supervision and control of the surveyor or caretaker, who shall have power to regulate his hours of labour, to see that his work is completed satisfactorily and with despatch, and to remove him summarily from the cemetery upon any cause of offence.

21. That the surveyor or caretaker shall exercise a general supervision and control, under the trustees, over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.
